MANAGER

DANNY WILSON



MK Dons boss Danny Wilson needs no introduction to Luton supporters having spent a successful spell as a player at Kenilworth Road during some of the most triumphant times at the club.

Wilson was signed by Luton from Brighton in a £150,000 deal by manager Ray Harford and played a key role in the club finishing ninth in Division One during the 1987/88 season. However, many Luton fans will always remember Wilson for scoring in the clubs Littlewoods Cup victory over Arsenal at Wembley.

Wilson also gained a wealth of playing experience, having won the league cup with Sheffield Wednesday and also played for Northern Ireland.

Wilson took over at MK Dons in early December, replacing Stuart Murdoch as manager. He kicked off his reign with a 3-0 victory at home to Wrexham. Wilson has a wealth of managerial experience, having taken Barnsley to the Premiership back in 1997, winning the league manager of the season award.

Subsequently, Wilson went on to manage Sheffield Wednesday and then Bristol City, who he steered to the LDV Vans trophy and the play-offs two seasons on the trot.

GOALKEEPERS

MATT BAKER

Matt is a talented keeper who came through the youth ranks at Hull City. Joined MK Dons as Danny Wilson's first signing and has impressed in between the sticks this season. Made his name at Hereford United, playing 135 games for the Bulls before a transfer to Wrexham. Made his debut at Stockport County in December.

SCOTT BEVAN

At 6ft 7ins, Scott is the tallest player in the football league. Good on crosses, he is also a strong shot-stopper who commands his penalty area. Scott became a fans favourite after joining us on a free transfer from Southampton, where he had grown up through the Saints academy system. Found it difficult to break into the first team set-up at St Mary's, he took over as Dons first choice keeper from Steve Banks, making his debut in the 1-0 defeat at Walsall in March.

PAUL HEALD

Experienced keeper who is goalkeeping and reserve team coach at the club. Joined us from Leyton Orient in 1995, but was forced to play second fiddle to Neil Sullivan and then Kelvin Davis. Semi-retired last season after a run of games which saw him troubled by a long-standing knee injury, Heald has also played at Sheffield Wednesday, Swindon Town, Crystal Palace, Coventry City and Sheffield United.

DAVID MARTIN

David is a promising young goalkeeper who has a very bright future in the game. Son of West Ham United legend Alvin, David already has England caps at U18 and U19 level, and made his first team debut at the end of last season. Another product of the Dons academy, he is now on the brink of regular first team action.

DEFENDERS

HARRY NTIMBAN-ZEH

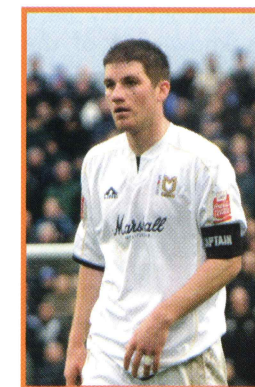
Harry joined the MK Dons towards the end of the 2003/04 season as a replacement for Mikele Leigertwood, who had left the club for Crystal Palace. He is a rangy centre-half, who has plenty of experience having played in both France and Portugal. He came through the youth ranks at Racing Club Paris, before spells at Calais, Bologne, Dijon and Sporting Espinho. Made his

debut in the 2-1 defeat at home to Ipswich Town in March.

DEAN LEWINGTON

Dean is the son of Watford manager Ray Lewington. He is a talented left-back who has come through the youth ranks and earned his professional contract towards the end of the 2002/03 season. He made his debut as a substitute in the 4-2 defeat at Sheffield Wednesday in April of 2003, but last season was his big break, turning in a whole host of solid performances which made him the first choice left back. Was named player of the season for 03/04 and scored his first senior goal in a 3-0 win at Reading on Boxing Day 2003.

BEN CHORLEY



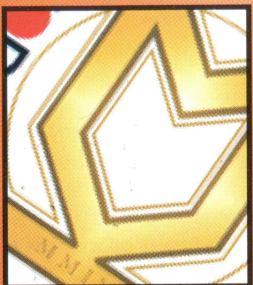
Ben is a tough tackling player with a lot of potential. A graduate of Arsenal's academy system, he signed for the Dons in March 2003 after a brief trial with the club. A good organiser with excellent distribution of the ball, Ben skipped Arsenal's youth team to FA Youth Cup glory in 2001. He initially joined the club as a centre-half, but was converted to a holding midfielder midway through last season.

GARETH EDDS

Gareth is an Australian U23 international defender who joined MK Dons in July from Bradford City. He came through the youth ranks at Nottingham Forest, before spells at Swindon Town and the Bantams. During his time at Forest, he became acquainted with then-reserve coach Jimmy Gilligan, who is now the first team coach at Milton Keynes Dons.

STEVE PALMER

Vastly experienced defender, who joined the MK Dons from Queens Park Rangers in the summer of 2004. Steve has made over 450 senior appearances in his career, which has taken him to Ipswich Town, Watford, QPR and now the MK Dons. He helped steer the West London club to promotion last season. It was

no secret that the Dons were interested in Steve, and they nearly signed him in the summer of 2003, before the club went into administration. Has already struck up a good partnership with Mark Williams, who he played with at Watford earlier in his career. Has been brought in as player-coach, and will undoubtedly be a major asset in sharing his knowledge of the game with the club's youngsters.

NATHAN KOO-BOOTHE

Nathan is a tall, strong centre-half who is destined for a bright future in the game. Signed from Watford in the summer of 2004, Koo-Boothe worked with MK Dons coach Jimmy Gilligan during his time at Vicarage Road, and the coaching staff at Milton Keynes hold him in high regard.

MICHEL PENSEE-BILONG



Michel joined the club in January from Japanese J-League side Sanfrecce Hiroshima. Has a wealth of experience, having played in the top flight leagues of Russia, Portugal, Mexico, Japan and South Korea. Has also picked up 35 caps for the Cameroon national side, having played in the 2000 World Cup in

France and helped Cameroon to the African Nation's Cup. Tall commanding centre-half who has a turn of pace and plenty of strength, Michel is sure to be a key component of Danny Wilson's side.

MIDFIELDERS

BEN HARDING

Ben is a young midfielder who came through the youth ranks at the Dons, making his debut midway through last season at Rotherham, where injuries and red cards to two goalkeepers meant he ended his first senior match in goal! Ben has plenty of skill and is a composed passer of the ball. Struck up a good understanding with Gary Smith at the end of last season, but missed a spell of games earlier this term with a knee ligament problem.

LAURENT HERVE

Laurent is a cultured midfielder who joined the MK Dons in the summer of 2004 from French club Guingamp. Laurent is good on the ball, has plenty of skill and thrives under pressure.

MALVIN KAMARA

Malvin is a talented young right midfielder who is good on the ball and strong in the air. Very versatile, he can also slot into the right side of defence. He made his debut for the first-team towards the end of the 2002/03 season, as a substitute in the 2-0 win at home to Preston North End. Another player who has come through the youth ranks and who the club's coaches have high hopes for. He was watched by Premiership scouts towards the end of the 03/04 campaign and became a firm favorite with the Milton Keynes crowd.

NICKY RIZZO

Nicky joined the Dons in mid-November. He comes to us from Italian side AC Prato. Started his career out in the academy set-up at Liverpool and then joined Crystal Palace under then-boss Terry Venables. The Australian international had two seasons at Selhurst Park, but left the Eagles when they went into administra-

tion. Went back over to Italy, where his parents live to play for Ternana in Serie B, but was dogged with injuries. Left sided midfielder who has plenty of skill and will be looking to resurrect his career at the Dons.

WADE SMALL

Wade is a highly rated attacking midfielder, who can also play as a striker. He possesses speed, skill and agility and was linked with a move to West Ham United before renewing his contract at the MK Dons in the close season of 04/05. Wade graduated from the club's academy, and after suffering a season of injuries, made his long-awaited breakthrough last season, playing on the left of midfield for much of the campaign before a brief stint as a striker.

GARY SMITH

Gary joined the MK Dons from Middlesbrough in the summer of 2004. A midfielder with a deft touch and plenty of determination, he came to the fore in a loan spell from Boro towards the end of the 03/04 season. He came through the youth ranks with the North East giants, but was never able to make the breakthrough to first team level at the Riverside. Stuart Murdoch was keen to secure his services though, beating off competition from Cardiff City and Sunderland. Gary scored three goals in his loan spell last term, including the first ever one in front of the West Stand at the National Hockey Stadium during the 2-1 defeat to Ipswich Town.

STRIKERS

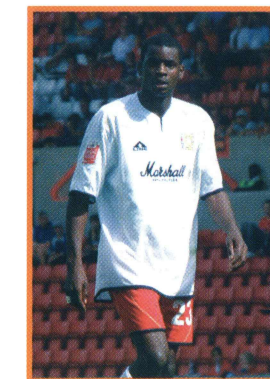

and is a hard working striker, who always creates problems for opposition defenders.

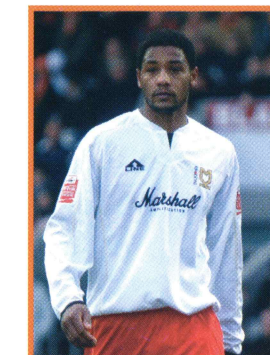
IZALE MCLEOD

HATTERS HISTORY

Twenty years ago this week saw the Hatters turn out in their first F.A. Cup semi-final since 1959 and, after a match of high drama, Luton went down to a bitter and undeserved defeat which still rankles!

The 1984/85 F.A. Cup campaign got off to a fairly inauspicious start when, despite being paired at home in the third round to lowly Stoke, the Town could only manage a draw courtesy of a late equaliser from skipper Steve Foster.

The replay was a different matter with the Hatters two up in the first twelve minutes through goals from Ricky Hill and Mick Harford. Stoke pulled one back straight after the interval from the penalty spot but Mal Donaghy netted a rare goal soon after to maintain the advantage. Despite Stoke scoring a further goal, the Town managed to hang on to win and earn a home tie against Huddersfield in round four.

The match against the Terriers was effectively over in the 34th minute when the referee dismissed Brian Laws for a second bookable offence leaving Donaghy and Harford to seal a comfortable victory.

Another home draw was the reward, with local

rivals and the previous seasons losing finalists Watford the visitors. After a couple of postponements the game was eventually played on a Monday evening and finished 0-0 with the replay date set for two days later.

This time the Town pulled back from 0-2 down to level just before the end of normal time. With no further score in the extra thirty minutes the second replay was scheduled for Kenilworth Road on the day the quarter-finals should have been played.

This time a solitary Wayne Turner goal ended the stalemate on the hour and the Town managed to hang on to secure a famous victory.

To complete a hectic nine day period, we had to play at home again the following Wednesday to Millwall from the old Division Three. For the record, the Town won 1-0 courtesy of a Brian Stein goal but for once the football was secondary due to the appalling scenes off the pitch.

The muted jubilation quickly turned to euphoria when it was learned that league leaders Everton were to be our opponents in the semi-final to be played at Villa Park.

Everton were odds on favourites but it was Luton who turned on the style but missed chances meant that we only had Hill's 36th minute goal to show for our first half supremacy.

The Toffees came more into it after the interval but the Luton defence held firm and with five minutes left a rainbow appeared over the stands which we all thought signalled a great Hatters win. Unfortunately it was not meant for us and Everton levelled a minute later following a free-kick which later T.V. replays showed should not have been awarded.

There was only going to be one winner in extra-time with the physically stronger Everton eventually scoring through Derek Mountfield's header to completely deflate gallant Luton and gain a totally undeserved win.

From Old Trafford to Kenilworth Road in the space of seven days was how new Luton striker Warren Feeney spent a hectic week after completing a £150,000 move from Stockport County.

On transfer deadline day, Feeney was finalising a contract to make the move to Kenilworth Road 200 miles away after joining up with the Northern Ireland squad for their World Cup qualifier against England.

Feeney spent that week on the substitute bench at Old Trafford, playing 60 minutes in Northern Ireland's defeat in Poland and then joining up with his new team-mates at Luton.

"It was a good week for me but the most important thing was signing a contract at Luton Town," admitted the former Bournemouth striker. "Everyone wants to play at Old Trafford and I was a bit disappointed that I never got on but it was nice to be a part of a big occasion, especially after being out of the international scene for a while.

"I then got a chance in the game against Poland and it was great to come on and show what I can do. I got a good hour, which is something I really needed and I thoroughly enjoyed the experience."

Feeney, who was born in Belfast, has enjoyed a prolific scoring

record throughout his career. The striker scored 32 goals in just over 80 appearances at Bournemouth and during Stockport's difficult season, scored 17 goals in 33 appearances.

Now Feeney is hoping to get himself amongst the goals at Kenilworth Road but knows he faces a fight for a regular first-team spot.

"I heard at the start of last season that Luton were interested, added Feeney. "Unfortunately things had already developed with Stockport and I thought I had a good season with a team that are bottom of the league.

"I had no regrets joining Stockport but as soon as I heard about Luton's interest I stated that I wanted to come here quite clearly and I'm so glad that the gaffer sorted everything out.

"It's a big thing that I could be playing in the Championship next season because every player wants to play as high as they can. The boys have been at the top all season and they have thoroughly deserved it.

"I know I have to fight my way into the team. All places are up for grabs but I want to play football and score goals because that is what I'm paid to do. You can't take nothing for granted and I know I will have to battle my way into the team.

LEAGUE ONE ROUND-UP

As we are sure everyone inside Kenilworth Road will already be aware, Brentford's victory over Tranmere Rovers on Tuesday night meant Luton became the first club in the top four English leagues to achieve promotion.

Rovers travelled to Griffin Park still in the hope of attaining a top-two finish in League One. However, Brian Little's side were beaten 1-0 by Martin Allen's Brentford, courtesy of a single goal from Michael Turner 21 minutes from the end.

Tranmere can still secure the second automatic promotion spot, although it will take an almighty collapse from Hull City, who have a ten point cushion in second with just four games to go.

Stockport also became the first team to be relegated from the top four divisions and their miserable season is now winding down to a close, and it was no surprise to see Blackpool come away with a 1-0 win at Edgeley Park with a goal from Keigan Parker.

Over the weekend, play-off hopefuls Sheffield Wednesday had to come from a goal down to earn a 1-1 draw at Oldham Athletic.

On-loan striker Luke Beckett gave The Latics the lead on 28 minutes before Glenn Whelan levelled matters for The Owls nine minutes after the break. The visitors would finish the match with ten men, as Whelan was sent off just moments from the end for a second bookable offence.

Hull kept their League One title hopes alive with a 2-0 win at Yorkshire rivals Bradford. Goals in each half from Stuart Elliott and Nick Barmby were

enough to give Peter Taylor's men all three points. Hartlepool United missed the chance to move into fourth place after being held to a 1-1 draw at Colchester United. Gavin Johnson gave The U's the lead six minutes before the break before Pools earned a point at Layer Road through Antony Sweeney nine minutes after half time.

Huddersfield Town are making a late charge for the play-offs after Peter Jackson's side defeated Yorkshire rivals Doncaster Rovers 3-1 at The Galpharm Stadium.

Pawel Abbott gave The Terriers the lead a minute into the match before Leo Fortune-West equalised for Donny on the quarter hour mark. Andy Booth restored Huddersfield's lead just before the break and Chris Brandon made sure of the points with a second half strike.

Swindon Town succumbed to a late 2-1 defeat against Paul Merson's Walsall at The County Ground.

Julian Joachim gave The Saddlers a half time lead before a Sam Parkin penalty with six minutes left looked to earn Swindon a point. However, Mark Wright popped up to snatch the win for the Black Country club, as Swindon now look to be out of the play-off reckoning with this defeat.

Finally, Torquay United's hopes of getting out of the relegation places were boosted when Zema Abbey's late strike gave The Gulls a crucial 1-0 victory over fifth from bottom Milton Keynes Dons at Plainmoor.

HOW TO GET TO WREXHAM



By Road: Luton's penultimate away game of the season sees us make the journey to Wales as we face Wrexham. The journey to the Racecourse Ground is a relatively simple and will take approximately three hours via the M6 and M54. From the M6 (Jct 10a) take the M54 to Telford and then the A5 onto Shrewsbury and Oswestry. Then pick up signs for A483 Wrexham. Leave the Wrexham bypass at the A541 Mold exit and follow the 'Town Centre' signs to the ground.

By Rail: Wrexham General Station is a two-minute walk away with services to Chester (northbound), Shrewsbury (southbound) and Birkenhead.

Parking: None available at the ground and street parking is limited. Cars can use the NEWI College next door, but beware parking on the Plas Coach Retail Park, as wheel clamps are in use. Town centre car parks are a 10-minute walk away.

What's the ground like: For a number of years the ground had only three sides, with one side being open, following the demolition of the old Mold Stand. In 1999 this situation was rectified with the opening of the Pryce Griffiths Stand. This is a single tiered all seater stand that has greatly improved the overall ground appearance. It is semi circular in design with a capacity of 3,500 seats. The other side is a fair sized two tiered covered stand, which is now all seated, having previously had terracing at the front. One end, the Kop End, is a medium sized covered terrace, partly covered (to the rear) and is for home supporters. The other end, the Roberts Builders Stand, is covered and again is two tiered and all seated. There is an electric scoreboard on the roof of this stand.

Where to drink: There is one pub right on the corner of the ground at the Kop End called 'The Turf'. It is a Marstons pub which does allow in away supporters, but only in small numbers. It can get extremely busy, so arrive early. Otherwise the town centre is about a ten minute walk away, where there are plenty of good pubs to be found. A favourite haunt of away supporters is the Wetherspoons pub in the town centre, called the Elihu Yale. To find it, walk along the road from the ground towards the town centre. After about half a mile, go through the double set of traffic lights. After the next road junction it is in the row of buildings on your left, in Regent Street.

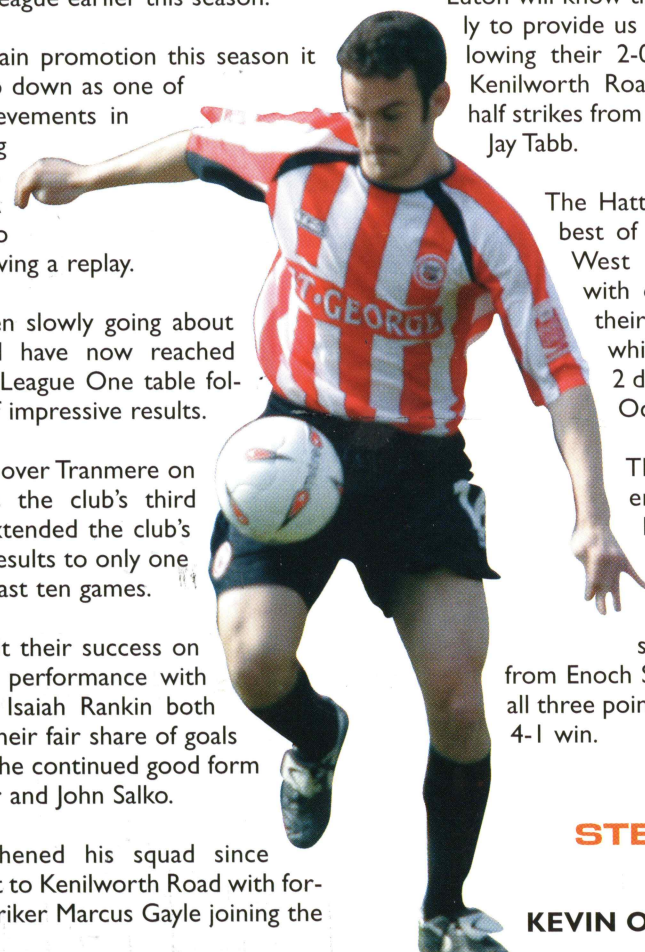

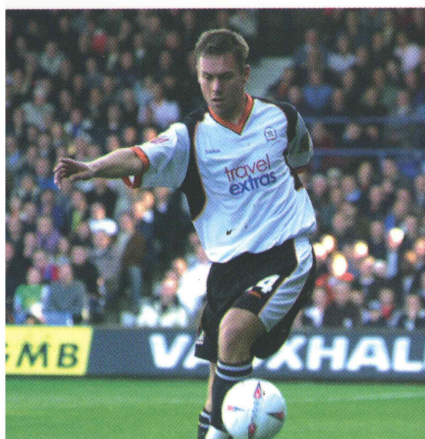
