Have a great day and a great summer

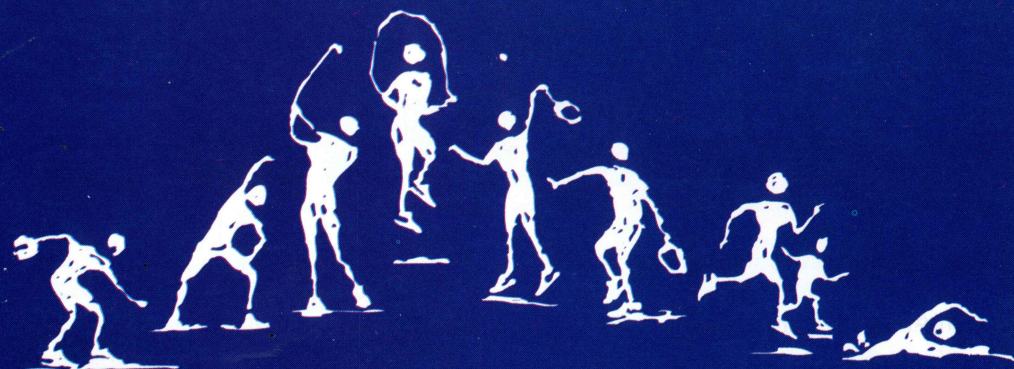

CLUB SECRETARY

Good afternoon and welcome to everyone for our last home league match of the season and what a magnificent season it has been.

I must start by thanking everyone who joined in the fun of "Hatters Day" at our last home game by wearing a hat. There were some stunning home made creations in the stadium.

The support, both in numbers and vocally at Wrexham was again superb and with only a handful of tickets remaining for Doncaster, it is incredible that we will be taking a magnificent 3,500 fans next Saturday.

Following the Doncaster match, Luton Borough Council are honouring the team with a Civic Reception at the Town Hall in Luton on Sunday 8th May. An open topped bus will take the players through George Street, from the Market Hill end at 12.30 p.m. arriving at the Town Hall at approximately 1.00 p.m. The players will acknowledge the supporters from the steps outside the Town Hall and then from the balcony, where Roberto Perroni from BBC Three Counties Radio will speak with the players.

It is anticipated that the team will be at the Town Hall for about an hour and leave at about 2.00 p.m. We have been asked to request that supporters do not arrive at the Town Hall until 11.30 a.m. so as not to disrupt a service taking place at the War Memorial (in front of the Town Hall) at 10.30 am to mark the 60th Anniversary of VE Day.

At the time of writing we have not had confirmation of when either of the reserve finals, cup or league, can be played due to other clubs' outstanding fixtures. We will keep you informed via the official website and local press. It does not seem right that having worked all season the finals appear as though they will be played as pre-season matches and this is something we have taken up quite strongly with the Pontin's League.

It is time to say a fond farewell to two long serving members of staff who are retiring.

Today is the last working day for Ken Everitt, our assistant groundsman, who has been with the club over ten years; and next Friday sees Jacqui Jenkins, who has given nine years service as one of my secretaries, retire. On behalf of everyone at the club I would like to thank them for their loyal service and wish them both a very happy retirement.

We also say goodbye to our Club Chaplain, Dave Steell, who is leaving to work in a church in London. We wish him and his family every happiness in their new location

Details of season ticket prices and arrangements for next season, including our proposed new seating in the Kenilworth Stand, will be with supporters shortly.

I am pleased to welcome here today representatives from both the League sponsors Coca-Cola and The Football League. They will be making the presentation to the players of the medals and trophy for winning League One after today's match. Following the final whistle the players will leave the pitch for a short period while the presentation podium is erected. They will then return for the presentation ceremony and to acknowledge the supporters. Once this is complete and the players have left the pitch, stewards and police will permit supporters to enter the playing area. When this happens we would ask everyone to proceed in an orderly and safe manner to allow everyone to enjoy the celebrations. The team will then re-appear in the directors' balcony.

Finally, can I thank everyone for all the emails and cards we have received over the past two weeks and wish everyone a very enjoyable Summer. We look forward to welcoming you back to Kenilworth Stadium in August for Championship football

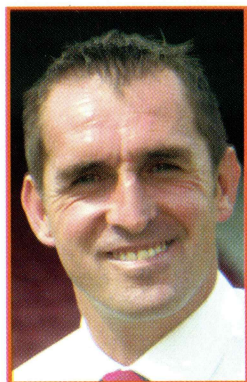

MANAGER

MARTIN ALLEN



FORMER Queens Park Rangers midfielder
Martin Allen took over from Wally Downes as Brentford manager in March 2004, leaving his post at Conference side Barnet to take up the

position.

In the final seven games of last season he oversaw his side pick up eighteen points from their final nine matches to ensure their Second Division status. That form has continued this year and the Bees currently sit on the fringes of a play-off position, something they will be keen to build on over the coming months.

As a player Allen served QPR, West Ham United and Portsmouth before he took up coaching and held the position of assistant manager at Reading and Barnet, prior to his full-time appointment in the hot seat at Underhill.

GOALKEEPERS

ADEMOLA BANKHOLE

Nigerian International goalkeeper who signed for Brentford in February 2005 from non-league Maidenhead United. Kept a clean sheet in his first appearance for the club against MK Dons. He has also played for Shooting Stars FC (Nigeria), Doncaster Rovers, Leyton Orient, Crewe Alexandra, Grimsby Town (loan), Queens Park Rangers and Barnet (loan). A commanding goalkeeper in the area and a good shot stopper, Bankhole has the prospect of enjoying a successful career with the Bees and is highly rated at Griffin Park

STUART NELSON

Brentford signed Stuart from Unibond Premier side Hucknall Town in February 2004 for an eventual fee of £10,000. The former Cirencester goalkeeper forced his way into the first team after the departure of Paul Smith to Southampton. Has also been on the books of Millwall, Oxford City and Doncaster Rovers.

DEFENDERS

MICHAEL DOBSON

Michael, who has been with the Club since the age of ten, was handed the captaincy of the side two years ago. He has shown tremendous leadership qualities, and together with his insatiable appetite for the game he has the ability to progress still further.

SCOTT B FITZGERALD

Experienced centre-back who signed permanently for the Bees after a two-month loan spell from Colchester United. Has now made over 330 League appearances in a fifteen-year career which has spanned five clubs; Wimbledon, Sheffield United (loan), Millwall, the U's.

ANDREW FRAMPTON

A former Crystal Palace player, Andy joined the Bees in October 2002. Injury prevented him from staking a regular place in the side his first season at Griffin Park, but the left-sided defender or midfielder has made amends with a string of impressive performances.

LUKE MULDOWNEY

Luke is now in the third year of his scholarship, and is developing into a bright prospect. He displays good passing attributes and awareness.

ANDY MYERS

A summer signing from Colchester United, Andy returns back to his local roots, having been Hounslow born and bred. Won a European Cup Winners' Cup medal with Chelsea in 1997. After leaving Chelsea he joined Bradford, where he had a loan spell with Portsmouth before joining the U's. He is expected to fill the left-back role this season.

JAMIE PALMER

Jamie, a third year Scholar, is a strong and solid centre back, giving 100% to the cause and there when needed. He can also operate at right-back.

JERROME SOBERS

Athletic centre-back who is on loan from Ipswich Town. Jerrome signed for the Tractor Boys in February 2004 from non-league Ford United and is highly regarded as 'one for the future' by the East Anglia club. Jerrome has been a regular for Ipswich's reserve side before moving to Brentford and will be hoping to display his potential during his loan spell at Griffin Park

SAM SODJE

Sam signed in the summer from Conference side Margate. He has performed at centre-back regularly for the Kent side, and won player of the year in 2002/03. The 25-year-old is the brother of former Hatter and current Huddersfield player Efe Sodje.

MICHAEL TURNER

Centre-back who originally signed on loan from Charlton Athletic. Has since been signed permanently until the end of the 2007 season. Spent a successful loan period with Leyton Orient in 2002/03 plus a six-month work experience with Italian giants Internazionale in 2000/01.

MIDFIELDERS

CHRIS HARGREAVES



The hardworking midfielder spent four successful seasons at Northampton Town before being snapped up by the Bees in the summer. An experienced campaigner, Chris can operate on either the left or the centre of midfield. Prior to joining the Cobblers he has had spells with Grimsby Town, Hull City, West



BRENTFORD

Bromwich Albion, Hereford United and Plymouth Argyle.

STEPHEN HUNT

Steve, a former Republic of Ireland under-21 international, joined Brentford from Crystal Palace in the summer of 2001. His bubbly personality has enamoured him to team-mates and supporters alike. He ended last season as Brentford's top goalscorer.

EDDIE HUTCHINSON

Eddie, signed four years ago from Sutton United, is expected to feature strongly for the Bees this year, having played in most of Brentford's League games last season. A strong running midfielder, his ability in the air is rarely equalled. Runner up in last season's "Player of the Year" voted for by the supporters.

JAMIE LAWRENCE

The 34-year-old midfielder made his debut for Brentford against Port Vale, as a non-contract player. However since then he has been secured on a short-term contract. He began his career with Sunderland and then went on to play for Doncaster Rovers, Leicester City, Bradford City, Walsall, and Grimsby Town before signing for the Bees. He's a current Jamaican International having represented them in the World Cup qualifying stages earlier this season.

JAMES MORRISON

Jamie is a midfielder who shows good endurance and passing abilities. He is a third year scholar.

KEVIN O'CONNOR

Kevin has made tremendous progress since signing professional forms as a seventeen year old. He made over 50 appearances for the Bees last season and he has subsequently become a mainstay of the side. His performances earned him deserved recognition in the Republic of Ireland Under-21 squad.

RYAN PETERS

Ryan, a seventeen-year-old left winger, has performed admirably in his spells with the reserve team last season. Ryan played for both the under-17 and under-19 youth sides. He is quick and energetic and is tipped to make his first team debut before long. This is his second year as a scholar and he is currently gaining experience while on loan with Gravesend & Norfleet.

DARREN PRATLEY

Captain of the Fulham Reserve side for the 2003/04 season, 19-year-old Darren made his debut for the Premiership club in the Carling Cup game against Wigan in September 2003 and went on to make an appearance in the League game against Charlton at The Valley in November of the same year.

A central midfield player he is another Academy graduate who joined Fulham's youth set-up from Arsenal and is surely only being kept out of the First Team. Joined Brentford on-loan earlier in the season and has been ever present for the Bees.

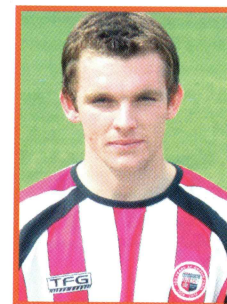
JOHN SALAKO

Ex-England International, who joined Brentford on a one-year contract in August. Worked his way through the youth ranks at Selhurst Park to represent England five times, making over 200 appearances for the Eagles. He then signed for Coventry, spending a time on loan with Bolton before moves to Fulham, Charlton Athletic and Reading followed.

MATTHEW SOMNER

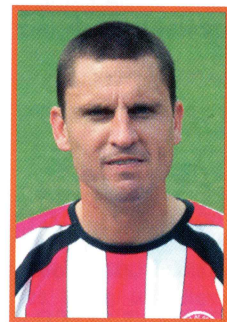
Matt, like a number of his teammates, has graduated through the Bees youth team. However his appearances have been limited and he is currently on loan at Cambridge United in League Two.

He has shown himself to be a player of tremendous ability and has now forced his way into the reckoning on a regular basis. A product of the Bees youth set up, he made his debut for the Republic of Ireland under-21 side in May, just days after being named as Brentford's "Player of the Year".

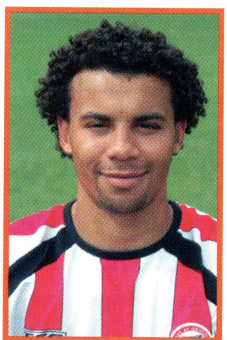
STEWART TALBOT



Stewart joined Brentford on a free transfer in February 2004 on a two-and-a-half year contract, making his debut against the Hatters in last season's league game at Kenilworth Road. A former club captain with Rotherham United, Stewart is a combative midfielder with long range shooting ability, who started out at Moor Green and then joined Rotherham from Port Vale.

STRIKERS

DEON BURTON



Jamaican International striker, who has recently represented the 'Reggae Boyz' in their 2006 World cup qualifying campaign. Deon signed a one-year contract with a further year's option from Premiership Portsmouth in the summer. Starting out there in 1993, he left Fratton Park in August 1997 for Derby County in a deal worth over a million pounds, re-joining Pompey in December 2002.

SCOTT P FITZGERALD

Striker who signed for Brentford from Watford for an undisclosed fee on transfer deadline day in March after an initial loan spell. He joined the Hornets in March 2003 from non-league Northwood where he had scored 105 goals in 236 first team appearances. Quick on the ball

and strong in the air, Fitzgerald has a good strike rate and has made an immediate impact on the Griffin Park faithful by scoring in the clubs 2-1 win over Stockport. Fitzgerald has had loan spells at Swansea and Leyton Orient.

MARCUS GAYLE

Jamaican International in his second spell with Brentford who returned to Griffin Park on transfer deadline day in March exactly eleven years to the day after leaving for Premiership side Wimbledon in a £250,000 move. He spent seven years at Selhurst Park, representing Jamaica in the 1998 World Cup in France. After a short spell with Glasgow Rangers, Marcus joined Watford for 900,000 in August 2001. He won a Third Division Championship medal in 1992.

MATT HARROLD

Matt was signed from Ryman's League side Harlow Town in the summer of 2003, having impressed in two reserve outings for Brentford. He hit the headlines when scoring a hat-trick in the Bees F.A. Cup 1st Round tie last season against Gainsborough Trinity, in only his third start for the Bees. He is currently on loan with Dagenham & Redbridge.

SAN LEE

San, a former Korean under-20 International, joined Brentford this summer on a one-year contract from West Ham United. The striker made his Bees' debut in the 3-0 pre-season behind-closed-doors friendly win over Hornchurch.

ISAIAH RANKIN

26-year-old Isaiah joined Brentford in the summer on a one-year contract from Grimsby Town, where he scored four goals in twelve starts for the Mariners. A former Arsenal striker, he moved to Bradford City in 1998 for over a million pounds and had loan spells at Birmingham City and Bolton Wanderers while with the Bantams.

ALEX RHODES

Signed by Brentford from Newmarket Town in November 2003 having scored twenty goals for the Eastern Counties Premiership club last season, including four hat-tricks. Netted the winner against for the Bees against AFC Bournemouth on the last day of the season.

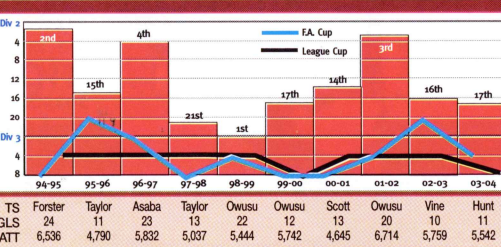

HATTERS HISTORY

By supreme coincidence the Bees were the visitors to Kenilworth Road in 1968 when the Division Four trophy was presented to Allan Brown's record breaking squad.

The difficult job had already been completed at the end of a glorious season which, for a whole generation of Luton Town supporters, including this writer, was the first time they had seen the Hatters win anything.

After a fairly slow start to the season the Town had built up a head of steam but then suffered the jitters over Christmas which had many fans wondering whether it was about to be another disappointing campaign.

After losing at Hartlepool in January the team settled down and went on a 17 game unbeaten run which culminated in a 1-0 win at Halifax to finally clinch promotion and begin the slow journey back to the top flight.

The championship was then secured in the following game, a mid-week fixture with third placed Crewe, when a jubilant crowd of 18,904 saw the Town smack in four goals without reply in a first half of spellbinding football. That no more goals were scored did not matter as the players went on a lap of honour at the end, carrying skipper Terry Branston as they went.

After such a brilliant performance it was perhaps inevitable that the next two games would end in defeat (the trend must be reversed this season!) and so a little bit of the glitter had been lost by the time of the final game of the campaign against Brentford.

All the magic returned though when Branston and the squad were presented with their medals and the Division Four trophy ahead of the game and then embarked on another lap of honour which was captured by the ATV cameras for broadcast the following afternoon.

The crowd of 14,643 lapped it up and then settled down to watch a game with little at stake

played on a pitch that had been underwater at lunchtime after a morning deluge.

That both teams tried to put on a spectacle for the fans was to be applauded but with the teams cancelling each other out the game looked to remain scoreless.

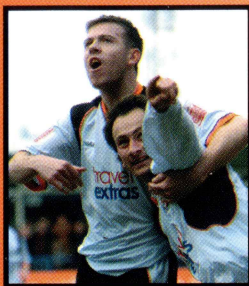
Fans favourite Bruce Rioch lit up proceedings though when, after 55 minutes, he picked up a ball in his own half and outstripped the whole defence before slipping it under the goalkeeper.

Ray Whittaker doubled the lead five minutes later when he finished off a goalmouth scramble but with a few minutes to go nerves started to jangle after John Moore deflected a shot past Tony Read in the Luton goal to put the Bees back into the game.

Read had to be at his best with flying saves to a couple of Brentford efforts as they laid siege on the Luton goal but the game seemed to be over when the Town were awarded a late penalty only for Whittaker to see his spot kick saved.

Luckily the final whistle came soon after to signal the end of a memorable season.

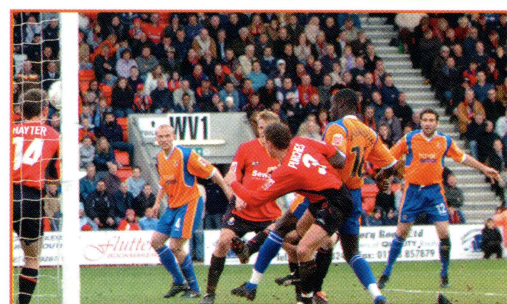

The most impressive performance of the season came in a recent fixture over Bournemouth when Enoch Showunmi's goal virtually guaranteed Luton's promotion. of the game with ten men after Russell Perrett was shown a straight red card for denying a goal scoring opportunity but the visitors continued to limit the home side to long range efforts. On leaving the stadium, you will find some roads closed to pedestrians, to enable swift and unobstructed access for the emergency services. Please leave the area of the ground as quickly as possible, by the route directed. Your co-operation will be most appreciated.

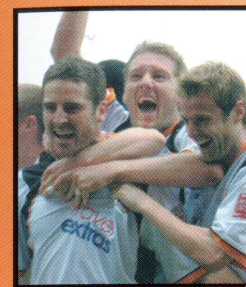

The Under 13's needed just a single point from their remaining league fixture against Tottenham

Hotspur but claimed the title in style with a fine 3-1 win. An intricate passing move gave Belles a 1-0 half-time lead when Jasmine Hall netted after good work from Yasmin Hickling and Lauren Bruton.

An excellent defensive display from the young Hatters reduced Spurs to long range efforts and it was no surprise when Livi Robinson leapt into the air to head home a Jade Mansfield corner through the second half. Spurs pulled a goal back with two minutes remaining but it was left to Lauren Bruton to seal the title with an excellent break-away and shot in injury time to bring the championship to Luton.

The Under 11's were also in action in back-to-back encounters with Tottenham and also sealed their league title with a late goal from Bethany Smith in a 1-0 win. They returned to Spurs last weekend for a cup semi final which proved just as close this time the tie going to penalties with the Town squeezing through 4-3 in the shootout after a 1-1 deadlock in extra time.

As we enter the final weeks of the season we have again been very successful with the First Team pushing for promotion all season and reaching the League Cup final and the Reserves winning their league championship. The Youth section has brought league titles in the Under 11, 12 and 13 (Herts and CJS) age groups and there are forthcoming cup final appearances for the Under 11, 13, 14 and 15 age groups.

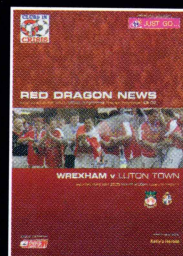

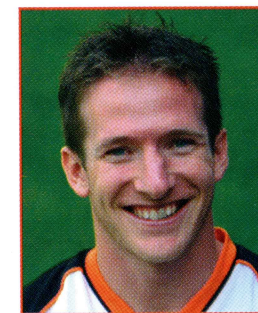
On a personal note, I would like to offer my thanks to all the staff in the Community Department and the players for the appearances they have made throughout the season, all this effort has helped in making this year so successful.

With their play-off rivals all suffering defeat, Bristol City pulled themselves back into the chase with a 2-1 win at Danny Wilson's Milton Keynes Dons.

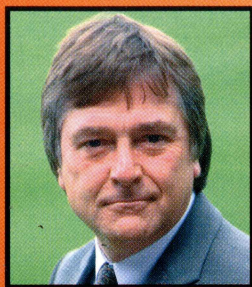

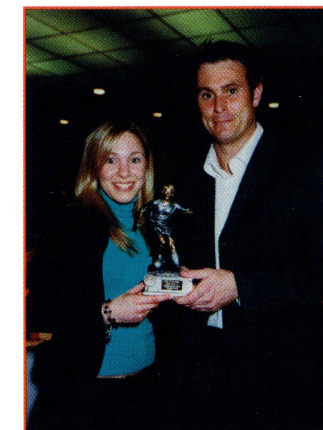
COMMERCIAL MASCOT DARREN PULLEN

HOW TO GET TO DONCASTER ROVERS



By Road: Our final game of the season sees Luton supporters make the trip up the M1 to South Yorkshire to face Doncaster Rovers. A trip to Belle Vue is a relatively simple journey and takes approximately two hours should the motorways be clear of heavy traffic. From the M1 join the M18 Eastbound at Junction 32. Once on the M18 leave at junction 3 taking first exit (left) at top of slip road signed Doncaster (A6182). Go over the first roundabout and at the second roundabout leave the A6182 going straight ahead onto a new road passing a McDonalds. Bear right at the next roundabout, then straight over the next two, before taking a right (2nd exit) at the next traffic island, which takes you onto a dual carriageway. Go straight over the next roundabout (where there is another McDonalds) and at the next roundabout turn left onto the A638. The entrance to the fair sized club car park is just down on the left. Should you get lost, pick up signs for Doncaster Racecourse as the ground is next to this venue.

By Rail: Doncaster Station is just under two miles away, so you are probably best jumping in a

taxi down to the ground.

Parking: There is a car park situated at the ground.

Around the Ground: There are two pubs in short walking distance from the ground, both situated at hotels. The Park Hotel, on Carr House Road and the Rockingham Hotel on Bennethorpe Road. There is a McDonalds and Asda at side of ground.

What's the ground like: The ground itself looks a little tired, but with promotion back to the Football League in 2003, some much needed improvements have taken place. The ground is largely open, with both ends being open terracing. On one side is the old covered Main Stand, with seating to the rear and terracing to the front and at either side. It runs about half the length of the pitch and straddles the half way line. It seems to be a fairly old wooden structure, with a number of supporting pillars along the front. Opposite, the Popular Side is a small covered terrace with a TV gantry perched on its roof.

Visiting Supporters: Away fans are housed in a portion of the old Main Stand. This consists of 241 seats, plus a portion of the terrace to the side and at the front of the stand, which houses a further 876 away fans. There are a number of supporting pillars at the front of this stand that could hinder your view, plus part of the terrace adjacent to the Main Stand is also uncovered.

COMING NEXT

The final match of the season sees Luton take on Doncaster Rovers as the Hatters make the trip to Belle Vue for their first visit there since 1969.

Matches involving the two sides have been few and far between with our 1-1 draw over Rovers earlier in the season becoming our first meeting with the South Yorkshire club for over 33 years.

Doncaster's slide down the league pyramid and into the Conference saw the club suffer some of their worst times with problems behind the scenes. However, Doncaster is now a totally transformed club moving in the right direction.

Unfortunately a play-off position looks to be just out of reach this term, which could have resulted in a third straight promotion, but Rovers can be proud of their achievements this season.

A top half finish combined with one of the most impressive home records in League One (ten wins, two draws and two defeats) means Luton will certainly not have everything their own way when they make the trip to Belle Vue.

Former Luton striker Michael McIndoe, who played for the Hatters between 1998 and 2000, is the top marksman at the club with 12 goals from midfield but Doncaster have been grateful for the contributions around the team.

Leo Fortune-West is another player whose goals have contributed to Doncaster's rise up the League One table. The tall striker, who has had a

distinguished playing career at Rotherham and Gillingham, scored a vital goal, which kept Rovers' slim play-off hopes alive in a 2-0 win.

Had Doncaster's form on their travels matched their impressive reading at home then Dave Penny's side could have been challenging Luton for one of the two automatic promotion places this season.

However the club have still gone on to record impressive wins on the road, especially the 4-2 victory over Tranmere, a result that helped Luton's promotion bid.

Doncaster are already planning themselves for next season after confirming in midweek the arrival of coach Micky Lewis, who will be joining the club as first team coach from the pre-season.

Lewis is an experienced coach with Oxford United, Oxford University, Slough Town and Reading's Academy and made over 300 appearances for Oxford as a player and will undoubtedly bring some wealth of new ideas to the squad.

The foundations are certainly in place for Doncaster to continue their push up the leagues and will undoubtedly be looking for a higher finish next season.
