





I must say Luton have been the best team we have met by some distance, so they do deserve to be the number one team in Coca Cola League One this year. When you think of the trials and tribulations Luton have had in the past, I must take my hat off to Mike Newell and his team.



This week sees the end of an era behind the scenes at Belle Vue with the retirement of the Secretary, Joan Oldale. Joan joined Doncaster Rovers in May 1984, working in the accounts section. When Les Holloway left the club at the end of the 1986-87

season, Joan stepped up to the position of Secretary, one of the most responsible jobs at any club. Although Mrs Sheila Louth and Mrs Irene Heeley had acted as Secretary in the interim period between Roger Reade leaving in 1983 and the appointment of Les Holloway as Chief Executive-Secretary in 1984, Joan was the first woman to hold the Secretary's post at the club on a permanent, full-time basis.

The post consists of maintaining the smooth running of the club in a multitude of ways together with attending to all F.A. and Football League requirements and liaising with the Chairman and the Manager about the affairs of the club. The Manager at the time of her taking up the post was Dave Cusack and the Chairman was Bernie Boldry. Since then there have been many more names in both posts, which has meant getting used to the many foibles of many different people. That Joan has been in the job for the past 18 years gives the measure of the success that she has achieved with the many, varied egos.



Managers have included Dave Mackay, Joe Kinnear, Billy Bremner, Steve Beaglehole, Tony Cunningham, Ian Atkins, Sammy Chung, Kerry Dixon, Danny Bergara, Mark Weaver, Ian Snodin, Steve Wignall and Dave Penney, a veritable "Who's Who" of English football. Chairmen, Managing Directors and Owners that Joan has served with include Mike Collett, Jim Burke, Ray Kennan, Charlie Dunn, Ken Richardson, John Ryan, Peter Wetzel and Trevor Milton.


Working at a football club is not a nine-to-five job. There are Saturday afternoon matches, weekday evening matches and even games on Sunday to oversee besides the many events outside normal working hours that help to keep a football club going. Joan has had strong backing from an understanding husband and family over the past 18 years to enable her to do a thoroughly professional job in running the affairs of a club that had plunged to the depths of despair and near closure in 1998 then to the depths of the Conference before seeing the rise from the Conference to present-day League 1. Thus she leaves the club, which has finished in the highest place in the League for 47 years, to join her husband in the joys of retirement.

As Luton collect their well deserved trophy, we, of course, relinquish ours today. Fans can have one last look at the Third Division Championship trophy on the front cover of today's programme. However, it is not for nostalgia that it appears there, but as a promise of what is to come. This time next season we confidently expect to be among the promoted clubs, and maybe even emulating Luton's impressive feat. Although last Saturday's match ended our mathematical chance of a play-off spot, it is truly remarkable that, after two successive promotions, we even kept this season alive until literally 90 minutes from the end! Indeed, a little more luck or a couple of draws that might have been wins, and we could still be heading for Cardiff. What is also encouraging for the future is the performances we have witnessed, including at Bristol City, when we showed we could not only play good football but also defend magnificently when the need arose, and we have built a team that is surely poised to go one better next time around. Despite just missing out, it is also worth remembering that the 65 points we have already accumulated is our highest points total EVER in Level 3 since a national Third Division (as it was then called) was first formed in 1958! Whatever today's result, we are also guaranteed to equal our highest ever finish at this level (matching the eleventh in 1969-70 and 1984-5) and could easily end the season in our highest EVER position within the Football League since we left the old Second Division in 1958! Not bad for a team languishing in the Conference only a couple of seasons ago, and surely a measure of what John Ryan, Dave, and Mickey have achieved for the club.

As yet another season closes may I remind fans that joined "Sponsor a Goal" that their pledges will be due after today's match, and I would be grateful if fans could contact me to arrange collection of their payments. The View from the Press

When Mayor Martin Winter stood up at the Rovers Rally recently and preached that he wants to see Doncaster win promotion next season to begin life in the new stadium as a Championship club, Dave Penney wore a look that said "easier said than done, pal!"

The manager is notorious for his 50-point target and that will again be the underlying blueprint for next season, but if Rovers are to achieve their promotion goal, then they can do no better than taking a leaf out of the book of today's visitors Luton Town.

They have dominated the league from start to finish and victory today will take them to 100 points for the season. And yes, they are represented in my League One team of the year, in a 4-3-3 formation.

Goalkeeper: Boaz Myhill, Hull's big American keeper, following in the footsteps of Kasey Keller, Tim Howard and Brad Friedel in crossing the Atlantic to build a fruitful career in English football.

Right-back: Set-piece specialist Ryan Taylor, at just 20, has had an outstanding season for Brian Little's side and is courting attention from Liverpool, Everton and Newcastle.

Left-back: Rovers' own Tim Ryan, consistency, consistency, consistency. And rumour has it, he's got a bit of a shot on him!

Centre-back: Sol Davis of champions Luton, a rock at the back for the champions, the type of defender you need to get out of this division.

Centre-back: Michael Jackson, goal-scoring defender with Championship experience, he's been a major factor in Tranmere's third-place finish this season.

Centre-mid: Stuart Elliott, has to be. The Hull City star has topped the goal scoring charts this season from left-wing, and even missed a month or so with injury.

Centre mid: Iain Hume, Tranmere's Canadian-born attacking midfielder, can play up front or in the centre of midfield. Has a wicked shot.

Centre mid: Luton's Kevin Nicholls was voted the champions' players' player and supporters' player of the season. Need I say more?

Striker: Dean Windass, back to goal there's no-one better, predatory instincts, at 35, still the best in the division. He'd be an ample foil for the main goalscorer and would still bag 20-plus goals.

Striker: Juan Ugarte, I haven't actually seen him play, but this guy came to the division late and still managed to rattle in the goals for a struggling team. Don't expect him to stay at Wrexham this summer.

Striker: Free-scoring Leroy Lita edges the final spot in the team ahead of Pawel Abbott of Huddersfield and Steve Howard of Luton.

So that's it for the team of the year, and for the season. Enjoy today's game and the close season, and here's to August and everything starting all over again.






This was a good home win for the Rovers in what proved to be an excellent contest before a reasonable attendance of over seven thousand spectators, including a handsome following for the visitors, who were looking to cement their place in this seasons play-offs. Hartlepools began in good form, and the Rovers looked to have quite a bit to do to repel their early attacks, but eventually these were safely quashed and the home team began to dictate the pace of the game. Coppinger and Green began to take control in midfield, and Guy looked especially dangerous in front of goal.

Little was seen of Boyd in the visiting attack, with the Rovers defence settling well to their task after some early pressure, and the Doncaster attack often looked the likeliest of the two to open the scoring as the first half drew to a close. However, the interval arrived without a goal to show for either side, but the early play in the second period suggested that there were goals to be had, and the first arrived on 59 minutes. Guy seized on a headed pass from Fortune-West, and, after bustling his way past two defenders, picked out Ravenhill, who drove the ball home from ten yards.

A raft of substitutions from both sides changed the

personnel on the field, but the Rovers remained the more inventive of the teams, and Blundell failed by inches to convert a low cross from McIndoe as the Rovers looked for a second goal that would effectively close the game out. A pleasing aspect of the game at this stage was the introduction of Rovers starlet, Adam Brown, for his home debut. The youngster produced a series of neat touches, and he was involved alongside Green in a delightful move that created the opportunity for Fortune-West to bundle the ball home in injury time. This, after Green's effort had rebounded back off the Rovers midfielder.

Other results on the afternoon left Rovers still within range of the play-off places, although the odds were still against it – Rovers needed six points from two games, whilst needing several results in the final two weeks to go in their favour. The Rovers & The “Hatters”

A Potted History by Paul Gilligan



ACTION FROM ROVERS V LUTON, DECEMBER 1953

In contrast with our previous visitors, Hartlepools, Luton Town pay only their tenth visit to Belle Vue this afternoon, and their first since October 1970. Indeed, the two teams did not meet for the first time until December 1947, following the Rovers' promotion to the old Division Two at the end of the previous season. That first meeting, at Kenilworth Road, saw the Rovers lose by the odd goal in three, with Caverley their scorer. The return fixture in April 1948, provided the league "double" for the Hatters as they won by two unanswered goals at Belle Vue.


The decade of the 1950's saw the teams met in five consecutive seasons, beginning with two games within three days in March 1951. The first featured a fine 5-2 Rovers victory at Belle Vue, with Harrison (2), Tindill (2) and Lawlor the men on target before a "gate" of over 32,000, but the return fixture just three days later saw the "Hatters" record a 3-1 victory. The following season saw the Rovers enjoy their best result in

Luton when they stormed to a 4-1 win at Kenilworth Road, thanks to goals from Lawlor, Adey, Jones and Tindill, and they went one better during the 1952-53 campaign, when they registered their first league "double" over Town. The last four meetings of the 1950's saw four consecutive victories for the "Hatters", with only a single goal from Lawlor acting as a reward for the Rovers in that period.

Town were promoted to the old First Division at the end of the 1954-55 season, and did not cross swords with the Rovers again until October 1965, when each was back in the old Fourth Division. Sadly, the Rovers' luck was still out and, although the sides shared seven goals in their meeting at Kenilworth Road, the visitors lost out by the odd goal. The return game at Belle Vue, some six weeks later, was also a close run affair, with Jeffrey scoring the Rovers' goal in a 1-1 draw. Town enjoyed their biggest victory over the Rovers during the 1967-68 season. The

teams first met in early September 1967, and a sparkling performance from the Rovers gave them a 2-0 win, thanks to goals from Gilfillan and Watson, but the return at Kenilworth Road saw the Rovers given their comeuppance as the "Hatters" romped to a 3-5 victory.


There was more of the same in the following season. The Rovers won well at Belle Vue in October, 1969, when goals from Briggs and an "o.g." from Slough gave them a comfortable win, but Luton won by four clear goals on their own ground in February 1970, and that proved to be the last league meeting between the two sides until this season. The Rovers proved tough opposition at Kenilworth Road back in November, and despite the fact that Luton return to Belle Vue this afternoon as worthy Champions of League One, one suspects that they would have preferred any number of alternative venues at which to play their last match. Today's game is not without interest for both sides – we anticipate it with some relish.

The Visiting Manager

Mike Newell



A long and successful playing career began in Liverpool's junior sides, before moves to Crewe and Wigan Athletic, where he established his credentials. A move to Luton Town for £100,000 in January 1986 was successful but following a move to Leicester in 1987, it was two successive £1m+ transfers – to Everton and then Blackburn, that established his reputation. It was at Ewood Park that he was part of Kenny Dalglish's successful challenge for the Premier League title, although it was the SAS partnership (Shearer and Sutton) that was the first-choice partnership. Even so, Newell weighed in with over 110 starts for the club before leaving for Birmingham City in 1996. Loan moves to West Ham and Bradford followed, before joining Aberdeen in July 1997. A brief return to Crewe in 1999 preceded his surprise move to Belle Vue in June 1999, and although he scored 3 goals in 16 games for Rovers, he is unfortunately mostly remembered by Rovers fans for a glaring miss against Dover. A short stay in Blackpool ended his playing career which had seen him feature in over 600 first team games with international recognition for England's U-21 and "B" teams along the way. Mike's first opportunity into football management followed in November 2002, when he was


appointed as manager at Hartlepool United when he succeeded Chris Turner, who had left for Sheffield Wednesday (and we all know what happened there!). Whilst inexperienced, successfully guided Pool to promotion from Division Three in May 2003 as runners up. Hartlepool's board decided that they needed someone more experienced for their Division Two campaign, and declined to renew Newell's contract. However, he was not out of work for long, as Luton Town appointed him as manager following an unprecedented and controversial vote by supporters, following the departure of ex-Rovers boss Joe Kinnear. Since then, he has won over half of the games Luton have played, with this season eclipsing all, as his side swept to six successive victories at the start of the campaign, and whilst Hull City occasionally got close, his side have looked down from the pinnacle for all but one week since achieving top spot in the fourth week of the season.

Mike continues to take his UEFA coaching badges and also began the Certificate of Applied Management at Warwick University in the summer 2003 as he further develops his knowledge and experience in a profession that he is still relatively new to.

Connections

Kerry Dixon was born in July 1961 in Luton. He was originally a Tottenham apprentice, scoring 27 goals as the youth team won the South East Counties Division One title. Released by Spurs, in August 1979 he moved to non-league Dunstable before again moving club to Elm Park, home of Reading Football Club for a price of £20,000. He played in a 116 games, scoring 51 times for them, 26 of those coming in the 1982/83 season when he was top scorer in the old Division Three. Kerry scored four times in 7-5 defeat at Belle Vue in September 1982. Then in August 1983 he moved again, this time to current Premiership champions Chelsea and helped them to the Second Division title with his 28 goals. Dixon remained at Stamford Bridge for nine seasons, clocking up 420 appearances and scoring 193 goals making him the second highest Chelsea goal scorer of all time. During his time at Chelsea he appeared eight times for England scoring four times. Two of those goals were scored on his first start in June 1985 in the 3-0 win over West Germany. He left Chelsea and moved out of London and went to play on the south coast for Southampton signing for them for a fee of £575,000. He then played just eight games and another one as a sub before joining today's opponents Luton Town on loan. This signing was made permanent in February 1993. Playing 75 league games, Kerry scored 19 goals for the Hatters under the

management of David Pleat and kept current Celtic star John Hartson out of the team. Dixon's best memory in football apart from his England matches, was playing for Luton in the FA Cup semi-final against Chelsea in 1994. He left Kenilworth Road for Millwall in March 1995 for £5,000 in 1995 and later for Watford in January 1996 for £25,000. On 17th August 1996 he was appointed player/manager of Doncaster Rovers. This came as a shock to existing boss, Sammy Chung, who had arrived at the ground for the first game of the season, against Carlisle United only to be told on his arrival that Dixon was the new manager. Dixon was very popular with Rovers fans but as Ken Richardson took more control over the first team Kerry's position became impossible. After leaving Belle Vue he moved to Non-league Boreham Wood as player/coach where he was joined by Rovers team mate Simon Ireland. At the same time he took on the lease of The Distillery public house in Dunstable. From Boreham Wood he left to manage Letchworth Garden City and later became manager of Hitchin Town in November 2003. These days he can be found back at Stamford Bridge doing ground tours. He is also a summariser for Sky Sports and runs the Icknield Youth Under 12's team.



Marlon Beresford (goalkeeper)

Marlon joined Luton last summer from Barnsley, and received a "Special Achievement Award" at last Sunday's award ceremony. With over 400 games under his belt, Marlon names Sheffield Wednesday, Bury, Northampton, Crewe, Burnley, Middlesbrough, Wolves, York and Bradford as his former clubs.

Kevin Foley (defender)

Kevin is one of the success stories of last season, as he progressed from the Hatters' youth team to the Irish under-21 squad, comfortably adjusting to each level of football. Now a regular member of the first XI.

Alan Neilson (defender)

A former Welsh international, Alan joined Luton from Grimsby in 2002, when the Mariners were forced to release players as a cost-cutting exercise. He is equally comfortable anywhere in the back four or midfield.

Warren Feeney (striker)

Signed from Stockport County on transfer deadline day for £150,000, Warren has scored 17 League goals so far this season, but had to wait until last Saturday for his first start for the Hatters. A current Northern Ireland international.

Russell Perrett (defender)

Injury meant that Russell played only six games last season, but when fit is an important member of the Luton squad. Formerly at Portsmouth and Cardiff, he moved to Kenilworth Road on a free transfer in 2001.

Paul Underwood (defender)

Paul joined the Hatters from Rushden & Diamonds on transfer deadline day last season. During his time at Nene Park he became an England semi-professional international.

Paul Hughes (midfielder)

A serious groin injury kept this talented midfielder out of the game for nine months when at Southampton. Hughes left the club to join Luton for the 2001/02 season after a change of management at The Dell, but a broken leg brought last season to an early close.



CHRIS COYNE

Kevin Nicholls (midfielder)

A tough tackling midfielder, Kevin began at Charlton as a trainee, going on to skipper England at U18, U19 and U20 levels. He joined Wigan in 1999 for £250,000, but was surprisingly released in summer 2001 to join Luton for £150,000. Kevin won the supporters' "Player of the Season" and "Website Player of the Season" last Sunday.

Rowan Vine (striker)

Rowan initially joined Town on a three month transfer from Portsmouth, but that was extended to the whole of this season by September. He has spent similarly long periods on loan at Brentford and Colchester. Currently struggling with a back injury, but still managed to come on as a substitute last week.

Steve Robinson (midfielder)

Capped five times by Northern Ireland, Steve joined the Hatters from Preston in 2002. He made his name scoring 60 goals in 286 games for Bournemouth, and has also played for Spurs and Bristol City.

Chris Coyne (defender)

Born in Brisbane, Chris was a centre-half for Perth before his selection for the Aussie U17 squad in the World Cup brought him to the attention of West Ham boss Harry Redknapp. He also played for Brentford, Southend and Dundee before his arrival at Kenilworth Road in September 2001. Chris has been named as League One player of the month for April.

Michael Leary (midfielder)


A graduate from the Luton youth team, Michael has mainly appeared for the Hatters as a substitute. A central midfielder, he had to wait patiently for his chance at senior level.

Stephen O'Leary (midfielder)


Another skilful midfielder who graduated from the youth team last season. Despite being born in London, Stephen is a Republic of Ireland schoolboy international.

Enoch Showunmi (striker)

A Nigerian international who was born in London, Enoch is a popular figure on the terraces having signed for the club in September 2003, after Luton's transfer embargo had been lifted.

Lee Mansell (midfielder)

An injury crisis saw Lee, then in the youth team, thrust into the first team for an FA Cup replay against QPR in January 2001 – and dramatically he scored after less than a minute on the pitch!

Ahmet Brkovic (midfielder)

A tidy and hard working member of the Luton squad, Croatian-born Ahmet is Luton's second most prolific goal scorer this term. He signed for Luton on a Bosman free transfer from Leyton Orient, and has since become a regular on the Luton right flank. Ahmet won "Goal of the Season" at last Sunday's award ceremony.

Curtis Davies (defender)

A central defender, Curtis has progressed from the youth squad to improve noticeably since making his debut. Mobile and strong both in the air and on the ground. This season's "Young Player of the Season".

Keith Keane (midfielder)

Keith made his debut last season as a 16-year old, deputising whilst Kevin Foley was injured, but his form kept him in the

squad despite Foley's return to fitness. Mainly a right-sided midfielder.

Sol Davis (defender)

Sol, a highly rated tough tackling left back, left Swindon Town on the expiry of his contract at the end of the 2001/02 season, although he cost Luton a £60,000 fee. His career began at Swindon as a trainee in 1997.

Dino Seremet (goalkeeper)

A tall 6ft 4ins goalkeeper from Slovenia, Dino arrived on trial at Luton last summer, and earned a two-year contract. He had a decent run in the side last autumn, but has not featured recently.

Peter Holmes (midfielder)

A product of the FA's School of Excellence, Peter arrived at Luton as one of Ricky Hill's first signings after impressing whilst he was coaching at Sheffield Wednesday.

Calvin Andrew (striker)

Prolific youth team striker Calvin burst onto the scene this season to be handed a first team squad place, and made his league debut last December.

Celebrating his 29th birthday next week, Steve will also be able to celebrate his club's promotion to the Championship, as he bids to end the season as Luton's top goal scorer, currently being two ahead of Ahmet Brkovic. Having scored a goal in each of the Hatters' opening five games of the campaign, the £50,000 spent to prise him away from Northampton Town on transfer deadline day in March 2001 is looking to be a most shrewd piece of business. He has been Luton's top marksman for the last three seasons, and unsurprisingly is a huge fans' favourite at Kenilworth Road, having won a number of "Player of the Year" awards. Beginning his career at non-league Tow Law Town, he moved to nearby Hartlepool United in 1995, going on to make over a hundred appearances, with a respectable goals/games ratio of almost a goal every four games. This success persuaded Northampton Town to pay out £120,000 for his services, although they were forced to accept a fee of less than half that two years later, when faced with the prospect of losing Steve for nothing under the "Bosman" ruling at the end of the 2000/01 season. At the end of last season he was seventh in the Luton all-time goal scorers list.




The Rovers enjoyed the better of the exchanges in the first half, with McIndoe, Coppinger and Fortune-West always looking dangerous as the visitors swung the ball around in good style. City, in contrast, seemed devoid of any constructive attacking ideas, and Turner in the Doncaster goal dealt capably with any number of crosses that came his way. The opening goal of the match came on thirty four minutes, when Fortune-West beat Turner with a good header from twelve yards. The big Rovers striker was marked on the day by his nephew, Clayton, so this was definitely "one up" for Uncle Leo as the Rovers continued to look the better side up to half-time. Shortly before the break, Murray was stretchered from the field following an aerial collision, and was taken to hospital with a suspected fractured cheekbone.

The home team looked a different outfit as the

second half got under way, and the Rovers were often under severe pressure as the half progressed. It came as no surprise, therefore, when Brooker latched on to a long clearance from Coles, and outpaced the visiting defence to drive the ball past Turner. The Rovers goal survived a number of near misses, and things looked even blacker when Ravenhill was sent off for pulling back Anyinsah, but Fortune-West looked to have pinched the points when he volleyed home after Blundell and Green provided the opportunity with just two minutes left. Even at this late stage, the Rovers slim play-off hopes were still intact, but Brooker was adjudged to have headed home in injury time, although this may well have been an "own goal" from a Rovers defender, and the spoils on the day were shared. In the event, the Rovers have eventually missed out on a play-off place, although, as a result of the games played later today, that final margin may be as little as a single point. Disappointing as that may be, we can all look forward to the summer and then the new season, happy in the knowledge that we as a club have continued to improve, and that the future is one of great promise.

THE STORY OF DONCASTER ROVERS


Back in August we began a look at the history of Doncaster Rovers as part of the celebrations of the 125th anniversary of the formation of the club. Today we finish the long tale, with John Coyle taking a look at the events from 1998 to date – from the first Conference season, right up to the 2004/05 season.

Part 25 – The Conference Years, and the triumphant return to the Football League

Rovers began the 1998-99 season in the Nationwide Conference. That in itself was somewhat miraculous, given the state of the club over the preceding months, with Westferry buying the club from Dinard Trading on 1st August – just two weeks before the new season. With Ian Snodin installed as player/manager and only five registered players, a frantic search for players began. Only by scouring Snodin's contact book were Rovers able to find enough players for the opening game at Dover Athletic on 15th August 1998. Rovers lost 0-1, but put on a competitive performance, as they did a few days later when losing 0-1 to Southport at Belle Vue in front of an encouraging crowd of 3,663. Snodin's new signings included Simon Shaw (Darlington), Mark Hume

(Barnsley), Shaun Goodwin (Rotherham), Tommy Wright (ex-Leeds), Dave Penney (Cardiff City), the returning Scott Maxfield and former Wales and Everton goalkeeper Neville Southall, although he departed after nine games.

Rovers struggled for much of the season and at Christmas they were bottom of the table. A revival was sparked by Ian Duerden, signed from Burnley, who notched 18 goals in all competitions. Rovers eventually finished 16th, just above the relegation zone but that was an achievement in itself. Unusually for Rovers, the main excitement came in the Cups. In the FA Cup, Rovers saw off Flixton and Guiseley in the Qualifying Rounds before defeating Southend United in Round One, thanks to a Dave Penney goal. This took Rovers into Round Two for the first time since 1989-90, with 5,398 seeing Rovers draw 0-0 at Belle Vue with Rushden and Diamonds. With Leeds United awaiting the winners in Round Three, Rovers went down 2-4 in the replay, hampered by the early dismissal of Hume. Consolation came in the Endsleigh Trophy, the Conference's League Cup. Rovers sailed through the early rounds and after defeating Morecambe in a two-legged semi-final they faced Farnborough Town, also over two legs. Penney's late goal secured victory in the away leg, with a crowd of

7,160, a competition record, pouring into Belle Vue to see the second leg. Goals by Colin Sutherland and a brace from Duerden secured Rovers' first silverware for many years.

Rovers began 1999-2000 tipped by many for promotion. New signings included Dean Walling, Andy Warrington and former Blackburn Rovers striker Mike Newell. Rovers made a rather patchy start and were soon adrift from the leaders, and from February Rovers' form dipped dramatically, with only one win in 11 League games. With the threat of relegation looming, the Snodins were relieved of their duties. Dave Penney and Mark Atkins were placed in temporary charge, engineering a revival to enable Rovers to finish in a rather flattering 12th place, with Dino Maamria being top scorer with 11 goals.

In the Cups, Rovers made early exits in the FA Cup and FA Trophy, but they did retain the Conference Cup, now named the Nationwide MacMillan Trophy. Wins over Nuneaton Borough, Scarborough and Telford United secured a final with Kingstoneian at Belle Vue which Rovers won 2-0.

Former Rovers defender Steve Wignall was appointed as Rovers' new manager just before the end of the 1999-2000 season. Experienced in non-league football, Wignall was seen as the man who could lift Rovers back into the

Football League, with his close season signings, ex-Rover Tim Ryan, Jimmy Kelly and Jamie Paterson. Prolific striker Carl Alford appeared to be the jewel in the crown, but like Rovers' season as a whole, he was to prove a massive disappointment, and was loaned out to try and regain some form. Rovers began the season poorly, with only two points from the first four games and finished 9th, with average home League gates falling to 2,281,

round. Rovers did, though, win the Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Challenge Cup, goals from Tristram Whitman and Mike Turner securing a 2-1 win over Emley in the final at Hillsborough. With Alford gone, manager Wignall brought in experienced strikers Paul Barnes and Mark Sale for the 2001/02 season, along with midfield men Gareth Owen and Paul Carden. In September, after three wins from the opening five games, Rovers splashed out a club record fee to secure Justin Jackson, another England semi-pro international, who had just helped Rushden & Diamonds to the Conference title. Jackson missed many matches through injury, and Barnes also missed a number of games with a foot injury, but Rovers managed an improved run of





with Paterson finishing top scorer with 14 goals in all competitions. Useful signings, including Barry Miller, Francis Tierney and Dean Barrick, failed to result in improved form, with Rovers failing to make the First Round Proper of the FA Cup for the first time since 1923 after losing a Fourth Qualifying Round replay at Southport. The same club knocked Rovers out of the Conference League Cup in the first

form late in the season which was only ended when eventual Champions Boston United won 1-0 at Belle Vue in front of 4,027. Rovers went on to finish the season in an encouraging fourth place and there were signs of a useful forward partnership developing between Barnes and the young Robert Gill, although Jamie Paterson (14) was again top marksman.

John Ryan stepped down as chairman following a dispute with the Council over the proposed new stadium and the club was forced to make budget cuts. One victim was Wignall, who was replaced by first-team coach Dave Penney. The first round FA Cup tie with Scunthorpe United saw Rovers unlucky to lose 2-3, with 6,222 in attendance. Rovers also retained the Sheffield & Hallamshire Cup, again beating Emley in the Final, this time by a convincing 3-0. Penney opted to strengthen his defence in the close season, bringing in Mark Albrighton (Telford United), Dave Morley (Oxford United) and Steve Foster (Bristol Rovers). A second promotion place into the Football League, by way of end of season play-offs, was introduced for the first time.

Rovers won six of their opening seven games, the only points being dropped in an amazing game at Telford, where Rovers led 4-0 at half-time but allowed the home side to come back and level the game. On 7th September 2002 Belle Vue hosted its first live televised game, as Sky TV arrived to cover the match with Dagenham & Redbridge. Rovers turned on a scintillating display to win 5-1 and establish themselves as title contenders. After five matches without victory they were subsequently always in the pack trying to catch up with leaders Yeovil Town. Despite consistent goal scoring from Paul Barnes, Rovers never managed to regain pole position and the play-offs became their best route of progress. Rovers signed midfielder John Doolan from Barnet and striker Gregg Blundell from Northwich Victoria on transfer deadline day to strengthen the squad. On the last day of the season, with third place and a play-off slot

confirmed, Chairman John Ryan played in the final minutes of the game at Hereford United, thus fulfilling a lifelong ambition, as well as becoming the oldest player to appear in a senior game. The play-offs pitted Rovers against fourth-placed Chester City, with the first leg at Belle Vue. Rovers trailed to a goal by ex-Rover Kevin McIntyre until Tristram Whitman snatched a late equaliser. At the Deva Stadium, Rovers trailed again before Barnes levelled, and the match progressed to a tense penalty shoot-out. Rovers scored four of their five kicks and fine work by goalkeeper Andy Warrington ensured that Chester managed only three. The final, on 10th May 2003 was against Dagenham & Redbridge at the Britannia Stadium, Stoke. Rovers led 2-0 with goals from Paul Green and Dave Morley but Dagenham levelled to send the game into sudden-death extra time and with ten minutes remaining Francis Tierney scored the "golden goal" that sent Rovers back into the Football League. It had been an excellent season, with League attendances averaging 3,540 and 6,857 attending the Chester play-off game. Barnes' 28 goals had been the best return by a Rovers' striker for over 25 years and


earned him the Conference Golden Boot. Cup matches had taken a back seat, although Rovers beat Wigan Athletic in the LDV Vans Trophy and also gave a good account of themselves in a 1-2 FA Cup defeat at Bournemouth. In preparation for a return to the Football League, Dave Penney brought in experienced Leo Fortune-West from Cardiff and, on the eve of the season, captured Yeovil Town's star winger Michael McIndoe, a major coup for the club. On the season's opening day, Rovers travelled to Leyton Orient and in sweltering heat they recorded a 3-1 win, Blundell and Fortune-West twice notching the goals. Rovers were languishing in 16th place after eight games, but a win over League leaders Oxford United sparked a run of eight wins from nine games to put them near the top of the table. Striker Chris Brown joined on loan from Sunderland and he proved a vital signing, remaining with Rovers till the end of the season. On 19th December a 3-1 win over Swindon Town put Rovers top of Division Three and although they lost that position, it was regained in February 2004 with a 2-1 win at promotion rivals Mansfield Town. Rovers then held on to top spot till the end of the season, clinching promotion on Easter Monday with a 2-0 win over Cambridge United in front of a crowd of 9,644, and securing the title with a game still to play. The Championship trophy was presented after Belle Vue's final game of the season against Carlisle United, a 1-0 win watched by 9,720, the best home attendance of the season. Rovers had won their first Divisional title since 1968-69. Attendances averaged 6,947, brought in by success and by some excellent football by a side that lost only twice at home. Gregg Blundell's 18 League goals (plus two in Cups) made him top scorer, but Fortune-West (11), Brown (10) and McIndoe (10) also made big contributions to an overall total of 79 League strikes. In the League Cup, Rovers recorded an excellent win over Grimsby Town, winning 3-2 after being two goals down before an unlucky defeat at Crystal Palace, but the FA Cup

offered disappointment with a 0-1 defeat at Conference side Scarborough. It was, though, a small blot on an almost perfect season. Dave Penney made several new signings for the 2004/05 season in the renamed Coca-Cola League One, including Nick Fenton, Chris Beardsley, Guy Ipoua, James Coppinger and Jermaine McSporran. Despite a shaky start and some inconsistency, Rovers have established themselves in the League and came close to a play-off place before settling for mid-table respectability. Highlights included a 1-0 home victory over promotion chasing Hull City and excellent away wins at Barnsley and Tranmere, although a FA Cup Second Round exit at Conference side Exeter City denied the club an opportunity to play against Manchester United. Rovers continued to play exciting attacking football and pull in the crowds, and with a move to the new community stadium only just over 12 months away, the club's prospects look brighter than ever after a sensational few years. Whilst Rovers narrowly missed out on the chance of a third successive promotion, the future's certainly bright – it's red and white!





Rovers had to come from behind to complete victory over bottom club Stockport County, in a game notable for the goalscoring debut of youth team midfielder Adam Brown. The right-sided player, only allocated a squad number on the eve of the game, notched Rovers' fourth goal in a game which may have lacked quality but did not want for excitement.

Dave Penney made several changes from the side that lost at Huddersfield, the most notable being a first start for right-back Jon Maloney following a successful loan spell at York City. Rovers got the perfect start when Tim Ryan's deep cross was headed back across goal by Dave Mulligan for Ricky Ravenhill to stab home. There were only two minutes on the clock and Rovers were 1-0 up against a team who had lost their last seven games. Rovers did not capitalise on their early advantage, although both Leo Fortune-West and Ravenhill went close and they were pegged back by a fortunate Stockport equaliser after 28 minutes. Briggs' long range effort seemed to be covered by Iain Turner but the ball struck Allen and deflected past the Rovers' keeper. At this point Brown replaced Mulligan, who appeared to be struggling with an injury. Rovers might have regained their lead just before the break when Gregg Blundell was fouled on the edge of the area but Michael McIndoe's free kick was blocked by the wall. Worse was to follow in stoppage time. Briggs' throw-in was helped on by

Barlow and Le Fondre, who looked to be offside, headed past Turner from close range. The goal stood, and Rovers were behind at the break.

Rovers might have gone further behind early in the second half when Barlow's header from a corner was scrambled to safety by Nick Fenton. Play became rather scrappy, with the home side happy to hold onto a rare lead, although Paul Green almost levelled on the hour when his low shot hit a post. This proved to be a portent of things to come as on 72 minutes Green equalised with a goal of high quality. He took a pass from Brown, a constant threat down the right in the second half, and dribbled through the home defence before shooting wide of Cutler. The goal seemed to drain the confidence from the home side and eight minutes from time Rovers were ahead, Fortune-West's neat lay-off finding McIndoe who drew the keeper before slotting into the empty net. With three minutes on the clock Rovers sealed the victory and Brown scored the debut goal his enterprising performance had merited. Substitute Lewis Guy got to the byline and pulled the ball back for Brown to convert from close range. So Rovers completed their fourth and final "double" of the season in a game that at one point threatened to offer them only an embarrassing defeat.

Meet the Fan

with Alan Smith

As we are at the end of the season, and it's the last home game, we thought that we would 'turn the tables' on our regular 'Meet the Fan' interviewer and columnist.

Dr. Alan Smith – to give him his correct title – has been supporting Doncaster Rovers since 1956. He vividly remembers his very first game at Belle Vue – in February of that year – Rovers losing 2-0 to Tottenham Hotspur in the 5th Round of the FA Cup, on a snow-covered pitch and in front of over 30,000 spectators.

Alan's involvement at Belle Vue over the years has been varied to say the least. In the mid-1970's, although refereeing at the time and being Secretary of Doncaster Youth Football League – he still took every opportunity to attend Rovers' matches whenever he could. When he finished 'whistling' in 1978, he eventually became the BBC Radio Sheffield reporter, following Rovers all over the country – a position that he held for twenty years until the club dropped out of the Football League in 1998.

He was also the Match Day Programme Editor for three years in the mid-1980's during which time the Rovers' programme was voted in the 'Top Ten' best programmes in the Football League – and of course in those days that included all 92 professional clubs, as the FA Premiership hadn't been formed. Which games have stuck in Alan's mind over the years? "Well, I remember (and with great pride) all of the promotion seasons, particularly the last two, and whilst it's not something that I often care to recall, I will never forget the last home game in the Football League in 1998 prior to

dropping into the Conference – a 1-0 defeat against Colchester United. Of those present that day, who will ever forget the march from Doncaster town centre down Bennetthorpe to Belle Vue with the mock coffin?"

During Rovers' five seasons in the Conference, Alan became more involved in TV and video work – he provided the narration for the Rovers' video 'Reason to Believe' and could regularly be seen kitted out with headset and microphone up on the TV gantry on the 'Pop Side' helping out with the club video. His broadcasting

experiences have now gone full circle and this season he has returned to the Radio Sheffield microphone at Belle Vue whilst retaining his involvement in TV and the club videos. Alan is naturally delighted with Rovers' current success, as he says, "I honestly thought that it was the end of the road when Rovers dropped into the Conference – OK, "Oh ye of little faith and all that" – but the double promotion coupled with the current position of the club has restored my faith in human nature."


What does he think of the impending move to the new stadium? "Of course it will be tinged with sadness to some extent, I've been coming to the current ground for almost 50 years – but I accept that we must progress and I will of course always have my own little bit of Belle Vue. I paid my £25 (back in the dark days) for a piece of the hallowed turf, when the club came up with the idea to quickly generate much-needed income – and this will become mine when the current ground is dismantled."


