

Ling Dynasty

We need to progress in the cups for financial reasons

GOOD evening everyone, and a warm welcome back to Brisbane Road for tonight's game against Luton Town as we launch our Carling Cup campaign, which gives us an ideal opportunity to try and get back on an even keel following Saturday's defeat by Rochdale.

Tonight's competition is one that we will be treating seriously because, the simple truth of the matter is, we need to progress in the cups for financial reasons. The Carling Cup is a financial vehicle that we can use to generate more revenue and any boost to our income can only help us in our push for promotion.

IMPRESSIVE

Luton are two divisions above us and have made an impressive start to life in The Championship, so the pressure of expectation on our players may be less tonight — but I feel we will find out a little bit more about them. enough character in the dressing room to bounce back and that Saturday's defeat was nothing more than a blip.

DISAPPOINTING

Perhaps the most disappointing aspect of the defeat was that we were out-thought and out-fought by Rochdale. There can be no escaping from the fact that it was a bad day at the office. Looking back, it was hard to find a player who turned in a good performance and it indelibly underlines the fact that there are still lessons to be learned and there is a lot of hard work still to be done.

ON THE DAY

Every league game in this division is won on the day. It's not about what you have achieved previously.

Like it or not, it's a fact that there are no outstanding teams in this division — everyone works hard and gives it a go. We had produced three workmanlike performances — they had been nothing spectacular but our work ethic helped win those games. The most disappointing thing on Saturday was that although we didn't play the sort of football I would have liked, we didn't work hard either.

WAKE UP CALL

Hopefully it's an early wake-up call, because we have nine points on the board from four games — and we would have settled for that at the start of the season. But we were reminded on Saturday that the way we get out of this league is by hard work and by refusing to be out-muscled. I hope you enjoy tonight's game a little more than Saturday's experience!

CAMPAIGN



Luton Town

IT was almost a case of déjà vu on Saturday as both Luton Town and ourselves went into the weekend as leaders of their respective divisions. Both sides were unbeaten, and while we crashed 4-1 at home to Rochdale, Luton slipped to a 2-1 defeat at Stoke City — a result which saw them tumble to sixth slot.

But while O's boss Martin Ling was unhappy with his side's performance, Luton Town manager Mike Newell was more upset with the referee than his players!

However, Newell had a reason to feel aggrieved — first Essex referee Andy D'Urso sent-off Hatters striker Steve Howard for allegedly spitting at Stoke defender Karl Hoefkens. Town led 1-0 at the time — and after a battling performance they looked on course for a point until they were rocked by a last-gasp wonder winner from Dave Brammer.

RESPONSE

Newell will be looking for a positive response tonight following the first defeat of the season...

Indeed, his side have raised a few eyebrows following their step up from League One last term as they picked up two wins and a draw from their first three games in The Coca Cola Championship to emerge as one of the early pacesetters. However, tonight's Carling Cup fixture is not the only thing that has been dominating Newell's thoughts this week as he planned to launch an appeal following Howard's controversial dismissal on Saturday.

"He has been sent off for spitting at Carl Hoefkens, who knows nothing about it,"

explained Newell after the game.

"I know Steve wouldn't do that. I asked 'Howie' and I only have to look in his eyes to tell that he didn't do it."

CONTINUE

Ironically, it looked as if Luton's serene start to the season would continue at Stoke as it took them just nine minutes to take the lead through Dean Morgan.

But after Howard's dismissal they were forced to play for more than two thirds of the game with 10 men and Stoke levelled on 63 minutes through Marlon Broomes.

It looked as if the Hatters would still take a point and keep their unbeaten start in tact. But in stoppage time Brammer lashed in that spectacular winner from 40 yards.

POSITIVES

However, while there were no positives O's boss Ling could take from Saturday's defeat — at least Newell was able to find some plus points from his side's first reverse.


"We have come away from home, played decent football and created plenty of chances. We didn't sit back and try and defend — we tried to increase our lead.

"Yet we got done by a world class shot at the end that was worthy of winning any game," he said.

Newell will, no doubt, be hoping for a similar enterprising performance tonight from his side — but with 11 men rather than 10 — while one man also keen to see Luton return to winning ways, will be former O's midfielder Ahmet Brkovic, now plying his trade with the Hatters.


MARLON BERESFORD

Signed in July 2004 from Barnsley, the 34-year-old is a vastly experienced goalkeeper with over 400 appearances under his belt and he returned to Kenilworth Road on a two-year contract after impressing during a successful three-month spell with the Hatters last year. Marlon has appeared for a handful of clubs during his career but the majority of his time has been spent with Sheffield Wednesday, Burnley and Middlesbrough. He was selected as one of six members of the Luton squad who were named in the PFA League One team of the season last year.



AHMET BRKOVIC

Hardworking player who had an inspirational season during The Hatters championship success in League One, scoring 16 goals from midfield. Believing a move would be good for his career, he refused new terms at Leyton Orient in the summer of 2001 having been bitterly disappointed when the O's failed to win promotion via the play-offs and joined Luton on a Bosman free transfer. The O's had signed him on a free from HNK Dubrovnik in the autumn of 1999.




CHRIS COYNE

He was playing for Perth Soccer Club when he was selected for the Australian Under-17 squad for the 1994 youth World Cup, and came to the notice of Harry Redknapp, then manager of West Ham. Coyne signed for the Hammers, but Premiership chances were few and far between, and after loan spells at Brentford and Southend, he went to Dundee. Signed for Luton in September 2001 and has firmly established himself as a formidable rock at the heart of the Hatters defence.



STEVE HOWARD

Rarely can £50,000 have been better spent in football than the fee Luton paid Northampton Town on deadline day in March 2001 and he has been the Hatters leading marksman for the last four seasons. A huge favourite at Kenilworth Road — he was the fans player of the year in 2002, and the players' player of the year 12 months later. Howard had cost Northampton a then record fee of £120,000 when they recruited him from Hartlepool two years previously.





IRISH INTERNATIONAL

Republic of Ireland international midfielder Tony Grealy was capped while at both Orient and Luton Town. Signing professional at Brisbane Road in July 1974, he featured prominently as Orient reached the FA Cup semi-finals in 1977-78 and netted ten goals in 171 second division games prior to joining Luton Town for £150,000 in August 1979. He missed just one match as the Hatters finished sixth in the second division in 1979-80, scoring twice in 78 League outings for this evening's opponents before being sold to Brighton for £100,000 in July 1981.

PROMOTION PLAY-OFFS

Former Luton Town winger Scott Houghton scored for Leyton Orient in the 2000-01 third division play-off final. Moving to Kenilworth Road from Tottenham Hotspur in August 1993, his solitary goal in 16 first division games came in Luton's 5-0 victory at home to Barnsley two months later and he was sold to Walsall for £20,000 in September 1994. IN SAFE KEEPING

England U-23 international goalkeeper Mervyn Day played for both Orient and Luton Town. Moving to Brisbane Road from West Ham for £100,000 in July 1979, he was ever-present three times and made 170 League appearances for Orient before being sold to Aston Villa for £25,000 in August 1983. He joined struggling Luton on loan from Leeds United in March 1992 and played four consecutive first division games in place of Alec Chamberlain while at Kenilworth Road. Fellow keepers Murdo Morrison and George Ramage also played for both clubs.

TITLE TRIUMPH

Former Orient wing-half Jock Finlayson was a key figure in Luton Town's 1936-37 Division Three (South) title triumph. Moving to

Orient from Cowdenbeath in July 1933, he made 11 Division Three (South) appearances prior to joining Luton with Billy Fellowes in June 1935. He helped the Hatters reach the FA Cup fifth round in 1937-38, scoring nine times in 157 League outings before the second world war. Fellow wing-half Fellowes netted once in 78 League games for Orient, also starring in Luton's 1936-37 title success and scoring three times in 110 League outings for this evening's visitors.



CUP HERO

Former Leyton Orient midfielder Scott Oakes starred as Luton Town reached the FA Cup semi-finals in 1993-94. Moving to Kenilworth Road from Leicester City in October 1991, the England U-21 international featured in successive relegation battles and netted 27 goals in 173 League games for Luton before being sold to Sheffield Wednesday for £425,000 in August 1996. He joined Orient from Cambridge United in July 2001 and made 11 third division appearances while at Brisbane Road until sidelined by a knee injury, moving to St Albans City in July 2002.

LEADING MARKSMAN

Ex-Luton Town forward Ted Phillips was Leyton Orient's leading marksman in 1964-65. Moving to Orient from Ipswich Town in March 1964, he netted 17 goals in 36 League games prior to joining Luton in February 1965. He scored eight times in 12 third division outings while at Kenilworth Road before moving to Colchester United in September 1965. Ahmet Brkovic, Bill Boyd, Jimmy Bradley, Vic Halom, Harry Higginbottom, Billy Jennings, Joe Johnson, Gordon Riddick, Joe Roberts, Dave Sexton, Barry Silkman and Jimmy Yardley have also played for both clubs, while Alec Stock managed both.


ORDINARY





BOUNCE BACK

I'm sure that Luton also want to bounce back after they lost their unbeaten record on Saturday at Stoke and, like us, were knocked off the top of the table. So both sets of players will have something to prove tonight. All credit to Luton, it's not that long ago they were coming here for a league game, and they still have a nucleus of the squad who went up from this division in 2002.

Since then they have gone on and reached The Championship — and it just shows what can be achieved if you are prepared to work hard.

QUIET

As you can imagine, the dressing room was pretty quiet after Saturday's disaster. Everyone was sick at the result and it really was a wake-up call. I don't think it had anything to

do with the pressure of being at the top of the table, it was just a bad day all round.

POSITIVES


It's hard to think of any positives to come out of the game — I don't think there were any. We all let ourselves down and I just

Gone But Not Forgotten

**We continue our series of articles recalling
matches from bygone days against clubs
who, for one reason or another, are no
longer members of the Football League.**

South Shields

The north-east club existed for only 11 years as a Football League club before they disbanded at the end of the 1929/30 campaign to be replaced by Gateshead. Crowd levels were encouraging in the early years and in their inaugural term in the league (1919/20), a crowd of more than 15,000 turned up at the Horsley Hill Ground to witness a 2-0 victory over Clapton Orient.

That was just seven days after the two teams had met for the first time with the O's marking the occasion with a 4-0 victory thanks to a hat-trick from Ben Ives and one from Arthur Layton. That proved to be our best performance in the 18 matches whilst a 3-0 home success for South Shields the following season was our heaviest defeat.


Games between the sides though attracted some controversy and also the occasional newsworthy items. That initial meeting between the clubs at Millfields Road in 1919 occurred on the very day a national railway strike began. Having arrived in East London by train, the South Shields team found there were no trains available for the return.

However, a sea captain learned of their plight and already committed to setting sail to the Tyne, he offered the club transportation back to the north-east. The whole of the following day was spent on the choppy North Sea with the somewhat reluctant sailors disembarking from the ship 'Dalton' at 4.30 a.m on Monday morning.

In a clash at Horsley Hill on December 23 1922, there was little friendly festive spirit in evidence after home keeper Willis Walker had to put up with some harassment from O's forward Jack Tonner who then apparently kicked out at Shields centre-half John Hardy and was promptly sent-off. Dismissals were rare at this time but another followed five minutes later when the home side's captain Alf Maitland received his marching orders after he lashed out at Orient's Dan Bailey who was also harassing Walker.

The O's were then reduced

further when John Galbraith was injured and forced to leave the pitch with the ten men beating their nine strong visitors 3-0. A subsequent FA enquiry into the match found that a caution was sufficient for Maitland but Tonner was suspended for a month and Clapton Orient warned about crowd hostility towards South Shields in the return fixture that took place a week later.



Whaddon Road has greatly improved since Cheltenham entered the League in 1999, with half the ground being re-developed. The latest addition is the In2Print Stand, opened in November 2001. It is a covered, all seated, single tiered stand containing 2,034 seats and part of this stand is given to away supporters. On the other side of the pitch is the UCAS Main Stand, which has seating to the rear and terracing at the front. At one end is a small, covered, terrace while opposite, the Whaddon Road End is given to away supporters. This end has a small covering on one side of the terrace.

The improvements made to the ground have also benefited away supporters. Seating is now available to away supporters on one side of the covered In2Print Stand where up to 900 seats can be allocated. Entrance to the seated area first involves walking through the away terrace, as there is no separate away entrance to the seated area. Facilities and view of the

playing action are good. A further 1,162 fans are housed in the Whaddon Road terrace at one end of the ground. The views of the playing action are not as good from this section as from the seated area and it is only partly covered on one side. Facilities have been improved in this area with a new toilet block being built, plus better catering is on offer with burgers, hot dogs, pies and bacon baps on the menu.

DIRECTIONS:

M40 then onto A40 into and through Charlton Kings. At traffic lights where Cirencester road joins from left, go straight on. At next set of lights, turn right into Hales Road, keep on this road for 1.5 miles. After 1.0 miles, road bears round to right, then left. Turn left into Whaddon Road and go straight over small roundabout, continue for about 0.5 miles and ground and car park are on right.

PARKING:

Available in the Club car park for a reasonable charge whilst there is also street parking in the adjoining streets. The Parklands Community Association in Wymans Road also has limited spaces.

PUB GUIDE:

There is a club bar at the ground called the Robins Nest which allows in small numbers of away fans for a small admittance fee.

Sudeley Arms in Prestbury Road welcomes away supporters. Kemble Brewery Inn situated in Fairview Street is a friendly back street pub where lunchtime food is available.

Fox and Hounds in Prestbury

Road in close proximity to the ground but away fans are welcome.

The Conservatory Café bar in Winchcombe Street is a popular stop-off point halfway between the Town Centre and the ground.

Parklands Community Association in Wymans Road is a pleasant drinking establishment that also serves food.

Food outlet: There is a highly recommended fish and chip shop approximately 500 yards from the ground.

Tales Of The Century

Continuing our series of memorable matches involving the club in their 100 years as members of the Football League

Leyton Orient 2
Tottenham Hotspur 0
Brisbane Road
Monday September 23



A Milk Cup second round first leg match provided us with one of the biggest cup shocks in the competition. The O's were a fourth division club at that time and playing auspicious, star-studded neighbours boasting a talented squad costing in excess of £2 million – a considerable sum in those days.


A crowd of 13,827 saw Tottenham dominate the early stages of what proved an enthralling contest and it took one particularly outstanding save from Peter Wells and a disallowed 'goal' to keep the O's on level terms at the break.

Yet, there was a transformation in the second-half, a fact acknowledged by Spurs manager Peter Shreeves. "Orient seemed to find an extra yard," he stated. A brave save from Wells in a one-on-one situation with Tottenham winger and former Orient man John Chiedozie was followed by another worrying moment for the home side before John Sitton came to the rescue

with a goal line clearance to prevent Glenn Hoddle from scoring. O's countered with a couple of promising attacks before Kevin Godfrey gave us the lead on 62 minutes when he squeezed the ball home off the foot of the post to give us a welcome boost.

Then, with 15 minutes remaining, Colin Foster, who was playing only his third game of the season and all within a six days spell, broke down the right and delivered a perfect cross for Godfrey to double our lead. Now oozing confidence, the O's almost scored a third when Paul Shinnens narrowly failed to grab the opportunity.

In marked contrast to the wealthy visitors, the Orient team cost not one penny with all 11 players either the product of the youth system or signed on free transfers.



"The result was an occasion for everyone connected with Orient to savour," commented manager Frank Clark. He continued, "Our players later confessed that the opening ten minutes had been played at a pace that was totally unfamiliar to them, which makes the way they coped all the more commendable. After 45 minutes with the score 0-0, I challenged the players to go out and improve in the second-half. Cup football does not always follow expected patterns and that continues to be one of the great attractions of it, even when ties are contested over two legs," he concluded.

Tales Of The Century

Great Men Of The Orient

John Chiedozie (1976-81)

Born in Owerri, Nigeria, his family moved to London to avoid the Nigerian civil war when he was 13 years-old and he was soon spotted by the club's scouting network when playing for Newham Schools and London Schools having attended St.Bonaventure's School, Forest Gate. He attended training at West Ham for a while before joining us as an Associated Schoolboy at the same time as Kevin Godfrey and then becoming a full professional in April 1977.

Manager George Petchey was always prepared to give talented youngsters their chance and John made his debut against Millwall in March 1977 just before his 17th birthday.

By the following season, his pace and tricky wing play ensured he was a first-team regular but his career was put on hold when he suffered a broken leg in a Youth Cup tie against Ipswich Town. He recovered though and continued to show outstanding form on the wing totalling 131 League appearances in an Orient shirt and netting 20 goals. Attracting the attention of a number of first division clubs, newly promoted top-flight Notts County came in with a bid of £600,000 to secure the transfer of the player although it was reported that O's manager Jimmy Bloomfield tried to veto the deal.

In August 1984, he moved south to Tottenham Hotspur for £350,000 but his career at White Hart Lane was blighted by a series of injuries and he made only a further 45 League appearances scoring 12 goals. However he did continue to win international caps for Nigeria. He was eventually released by Spurs and completed his career with brief spells at Derby County, Notts County and Chesterfield before hanging up his boots because of another injury in 1990.

He always retained his fondness for Leyton Orient. "I had some great days there, particularly when we were going well in the second division and dreaming of promotion – and the club will always have a special place in my heart," he said. "We had some marvellous gates in those second division days and played in front of 25,000 and more for our derby games with West Ham. The Orient were my first love and you always have a special affection for your first ever professional club and that is how will always feel, they are a lovely club."

"Neil is coming into the final year of his three-year YTS and this experience at such a big club will certainly hold him in good stead for the future."


PERMANENT


The pair have penned one-year deals with County after initially joining the East Midlands outfit on non-contract terms.

Rochdale's result would have given Kitchen the perfect tonic as their win here last weekend moved them into the top six and boss Steve Parkin believes both Orient and Dale will be involved in the promotion shake-up.

"Some of the football we played was fantastic — but we needed to be at our best. When we were 2-0 up I knew that if Orient scored they would be right back in it," he said.

"The players worked hard and deserved the win. But it's a very tight division and there are 10 or 12 teams who are very evenly matched."
