





SAFETY MESSAGE



really only a save from Carlo Nash at the death denied us that.



“IT WAS MY FIRST TASTE OF CHAMPIONSHIP FOOTBALL AND ONE I REALLY ENJOYED. TO BE FAIR TO WAS NOT A DIFFICULT TEST REALLY AND I THINK I COPEd WELL. I WANT MORE NOW.”

REDS full back Neil Austin is fit again and looking forward to life in the Championship.

The 23-year-old made his Oakwell debut in League One at the start of the 2002/2003 campaign and has clocked up 141 first team appearances to date.

Neil said: “It was very disappointing to be out injured for a month. I was flying fitness-wise at the start of the season and really challenging for a starting place. The gaffer went with Bobby (Hassell) and I had my chance to come into the team against Wolves but did my ankle ligaments in training on the Friday before. It was a bitter blow.

“I was gutted but I am delighted to be back. It has been a long start to the season personally but I am back fit, in the team and determined to stay there.

“It was frustrating not to be in the starting eleven in the first few weeks but that’s football really. We had not added any defenders to our squad and I managed to clock up 45 games last year in a defence that had kept more clean sheets than anyone so it was disappointing but I know that I have to take my chance and make it impossible to leave me out.

“I played left back all season before Paul (Heckingbottom) signed and then had a decent run on the right hand side. I missed half a dozen games through injury and suspension but otherwise I had been ever present. That was a decent season.

“Personally I prefer playing in the middle of defence because that was where I started and had done well until switching out to full back three years ago. Obviously the gaffer believes I can do a job at right back but I will play in goal if I have to!”

He added: “We let everybody down against Milton Keynes last week and the second goal was especially disappointing. We should have done better on the first goal to be honest but we had a lot of young lads out and we have to learn from it.

“It could have been so different if I had hit the back of the net instead of the bar. I had struck the woodwork a couple of times in my first few seasons in the team but that was the closest I have come to scoring. I do not think it will ever come.

“The lads were inspired against Preston to be fair and we were by far the better team. Nick (Colgan) knew he had to go for handling outside the box but the lads were brave and put

on a fantastic display.

“We went down to ten men against Norwich and were well beaten in the end so I think everybody here has learned a lot from that experience. We looked a different team at Preston with ten men and did really well.


“It was my first taste of Championship football and one I really enjoyed. To be fair it was not a difficult test really and I think I coped well. I want more now.

“We now have a tough one against Luton Town coming up but we have to look to win our home games if we are to stay up or finish mid-table. We are more than capable of getting three points.

“We have had a great start to the season and have showed against Southampton, Wolves and even Preston that we are more than capable of competing well in this league. It will be tough and we will know more around Christmas time but it was been a confident start to life in the Championship.

“Everybody would take finishing fourth from bottom but we are looking higher than that’.


RISING Reds starlet Michael Coulson has adapted quickly to life at Oakwell and showed against MK Dons just why boss Andy Ritchie was so determined to bring the youngster to the club last summer.

Michael arrived in Barnsley in July after leaving Conference side Scarborough and has notched up two first team appearances to date in the Carling Cup as well as featuring for the reserves.

He said: "To be fair I have settled in really well and it helps when you get a bunch of lads like we have here. It has been great and I have felt really welcome.

"Everything about Barnsley Football Club is completely different to what I had experienced before. The training is harder, faster and more intense and it did take a while to get used to that. We used to train every day at Scarborough but it was nothing like the standard or intensity demanded here.

"It has taken a while but I think I am finally getting used to just what is required and hopefully people will see more from me because of that. I feel fitter than I have ever been.



was a little nervous before the game. When you think of all the great players who have run out here it made me realise just how far I have come in 12-months. Having said that I think I settled down well after a few touches.

"Playing in the reserves has been a massive learning curve for me because I have been lining up against quality. There have been players with a lot of Premiership experience and I have learned a lot from testing myself in those games. That can only benefit me.

"I want to push on now and really impress at Barnsley. I have to work hard and keep playing well so the gaffer has no alternative but to put me on the bench. That is what I want although I do not expect to be there. I have to work to get my chance.

"The supporters were brilliant after the MK Dons game and I was taken up to the Executive Suite to pick up my man of the match champagne. I hate speaking in public anyway so that experience was more terrifying than the game itself!!! It did let me see the other side of things and it was something I can look back on and want more".

"I have had to get to know the lads but there is a great banter between the players here in the dressing room and it really helps to take the pressure off. The gaffer has been great and, as a fantastic striker in his day, he has helped me along".

He said: "I thought I did ok against Blackpool in the Carling Cup but gave a better account of myself at Oakwell last week. I prefer playing down the middle and thought supporters saw more of me in the MK Dons game.

"Oakwell is a fantastic stadium and I






RALPH MARSH

REDS skipper Paul Reid could be in line for a shock recall to the squad this afternoon after shaking off an Achilles injury.


Paul said: "The injury has got a lot better over the last week and I was able to train for the first time on Thursday morning. Hopefully I will have done enough to give the gaffer something to think about for the Luton Town game.

"I do not expect to walk straight back into the team after good defensive shows against Wolves and Preston but I want to give the gaffer a selection problem.

"If I am fit for the game then it is down to Andy (Ritchie) whether he throws me back in. All I can do is make sure I am 100 per cent.

"I hate watching from the stand anyway but to see the lads play in the Championship has made it even harder for me.

"I was very impressed with what



I saw against Wolves and that result benefits me in the long run but I was bitterly disappointed to sit it out. It was hard to watch from the stands when the lads picked up a clean sheet.

"We are starting to put things right at the back and have been defending better as a team in

the last few weeks. The defence has come in for a lot of criticism this season – some of it justified and some a little unfair because it was the whole unit that has not done well.

"We are playing against better players and we did get away with a lot in League One. We still attacked teams but our defence was more than capable of withstanding whatever they could throw back. We are in the Championship and playing against better opposition so we will concede goals if we do not defend as a team.

"Luton are a good team and are established in the Championship now. It is a game at Oakwell and we expect to win our home matches no matter who we play.

"We have had a couple of good wins on the road and we now need to give our home fans something to shout about. We have played well and beat Wolves so we need to carry that on with a win today".

LUTON Town beware - Reds striker Daniel Nardiello is targeting a return to first team action against the Hatters after recovering from a fractured collarbone.

The former Manchester United hitman has been out of action for three months but is hoping to be unleashed on the Coca Cola Championship this afternoon.

Daniel said: "My collarbone feels fine and I feel strong, fit and raring to go. I am desperate to get some match time now although I think I will still be a little conscious of things for a while. That is getting less and less with each training session.

"I have been in full training for three or four weeks now and cannot wait to get back into the first team.

"It has been an awful three months because the injury was so restrictive and it has felt like an absolute age since I last played a real game. That was in Cardiff back in May so I cannot wait to get at the Championship.

"It is the worst injury I have ever had and has kept me out for three months, which have been so exciting around this club. I have spoken with Rick (Holden) and we are both targeting a return to the first team against Luton. That is something I am really, really looking forward to.

"I have spoken with Wales in the last few months but I have not heard anything about a call up just yet. We will have to wait and see but I have made myself available for them and it would be a massive honour if I am selected.

"It is the highest honour a player can have and I will be following in the footsteps of my father, who also played for Wales. It will be an extremely proud moment for him, my family and me if I get the call anytime in the future. I would be delighted to represent Wales".

Daniel has score 22 goals in 87 first team appearances since joining the Reds, initially on loan from Manchester United in January 2004.

treatment ROOM TALES

with Rick Holden



HEAD physio and assistant manager Rick Holden has been left cursing the English summer and hard ground as he looks to keep the Reds players on the field going into the winter months.

Rick said: "We may have to write off **Paul Reid** until the Sheffield Wednesday game because of his Achilles problem. We want to make sure he will be fit for the rest of the season and we are not prepared to risk him before such a vital few months.

"The problem at the moment lies with the fact that clubs are focussed on having beautiful looking pitches and groundstaff have to make the playing surface rock hard to get it looking its best. There is even a competition for the best pitch.

"When you couple that with the dry summer we have just had, it is a bad combination for injuries to the joints. We have seen an increase in Achilles tendonitis because of the hard ground and maybe boots have to be redesigned a little to protect players more.

"Paul needs complete rest although we expect him to be back in action at Sheffield Wednesday.

"We had a similar problem through the summer with **Richard Kell** and maybe pushed him a little too hard because of his contract situation. It has taken Richard more than ten weeks to get back somewhere near fit. We have not seen the best of Richard Kell at all although hopefully he will be able to push his claim for a new contract soon.

"**Dale Tonge** has also been ruled out until the Sheffield Wednesday match because of a problem with his big toe. He got a kick and aggravated his sesamoid bone – which is a small, pea sized calcium deposit just behind the big toe. Normally this is non-functional until it is aggravated and then can become very painful. We have to make sure that Dale is fully pain free and then he should be raring to go.

"**Daniel Nardiello** is now 100 per cent fit and could be included on the bench this afternoon. It is like having a new signing.

"**Nicky Wroe** is struggling a little at the moment and has problems with both knees. He compressed his right knee in a challenge and we have sent him for a MRI scan which, thankfully, showed only bone bruising. We suspect his left knee – on which he had an operation last season - has flared up again simply because he is not playing a lot of football.

"Again it is down to the hard ground and, when you are not involved every week, you do find that there are more problems with your joints. We were the same at Oldham when we had not played on the plastic pitch for a couple of weeks".



Who's Laikin For... LUTON TOWN

LUTON Town boss Mike Newell had to deal with the loss of two of the club's most influential and important players in the last three months but has rolled up his sleeves and dragged the Hatters up the league table in style.

When inspirational skipper Kevin Nicholls swapped Kenilworth Road for Leeds United in the summer and star striker Steve Howard defected to Derby County, many predicted Luton's return to the Championship would be short lived after just one season back in English football's second tier.

However, Luton have simply gone about their business in a professional manner without letting the loss of two of their recent favourites disrupt their assault on The Championship.

Newell spent the money raised by selling Nicholls and Howard well and

invested in two proven goalscorers from the lower leagues. In Sam Parkin and Adam Boyd, Newell brought goals to Kenilworth Road and still had money left over to tempt Richard Langley north from Queens Park Rangers to give an even stronger look to the Hatters this year.

Yes, the loss of Howard and Nicholls has been a blow but with Parkin and Boyd fighting it out with Rowan Vine and Warren Feeney to start up front, the Hatters have the firepower needed to make a real impact again this season.

It is in midfield where Luton can really turn heads with Langley joining Ahmet Brkovic and livewire winger Carlos Edwards together with Northern Irish international Steve Robinson in a mouthwatering blend of British steel and foreign invention.

Backed up by the likes of Chris Coyne, Sol Davis and former Reds keeper Marlon Beresford, Luton have a strong looking side and will be a firm test for Andy Ritchie's side at Oakwell.


Luton have started the season well and are comfortably in mid-table going into today's game. They held West Brom last time out and their performance left the tabloids claiming a Play Off push was on the cards.

The Reds ran riot the last time these two sides met when, in front of the SKY cameras, Chris Shuker and Michael Chopra cut Luton down to size at Kenilworth Road as the Hatters were storming towards the League One title. It was one of the Reds best performances in recent memory and more of the same will be needed if they are to make it back-to-back Championship home wins here this afternoon.

MIKE NEWELL



MIKE Newell was appointed as the Hatters boss in the summer of 2003, returning to the club he had previously served as a player in the mid-eighties.

Newell has been in football for more than 20 years, beginning as a striker at Crewe before joining Wigan. After three years at Springfield Park he moved to Luton for £80,000 in January 1986. He was recruited as a replacement for Mick Harford, who was on the injured list. Luton were then in the old First Division, now the Premiership, and Newell flourished at top level, with 19 goals in 68 matches for the Hatters.

He racked up a succession of big money transfers after that to Leicester, Everton, Blackburn, Birmingham, West Ham, Bradford, Aberdeen, Crewe again, and Blackpool were also grateful for his goal-scoring abilities before he moved into coaching at Tranmere.

In November 2002 he was given his first job as a manager, at Hartlepool.

1 Marlon Beresford - Goalkeeper

FORMER Barnsley keeper Beresford joined Luton in July 2004 after only half a season at Oakwell. The 34-year-old is a vastly experienced goalkeeper with over 400 appearances under his belt.

2 Kevin Foley - Defender

FOLEY is a talented full-back who came through the junior ranks at Kenilworth Road. He made his debut for the Hatters in October 2002 and has gone on to make over 100 appearance since then.

3 Sol Davis - Defender

IT was a huge disappointment to Swindon Town, and a coup for Luton, when the highly-rated defender decided to leave the County Ground after his contract expired at the end of the 2001/02 season. One of the best full backs in League One and now established at Championship level.

4 Chris Coyne - Defender

FORMER West Ham and Dundee United defender Coyne joined Luton Town in September 2001 and has never really looked back. A solid and dependable defender.

5 Russell Perrett - Defender

FORMER Cardiff City and Portsmouth defender looking for a better time on the injury front this season. He won promotion to the Second Division with Cardiff in 2001.

6 Paul Underwood - Defender

ANOTHER bargain buy, Underwood joined Luton from Rushden after impressing at Nene Park.

7 Carlos Edwards - Midfielder

FLYING winger Edwards signed for the Hatters at the start of last season from Wrexham on a free transfer. A Trinidad and Tobago international, Edwards played in last summer's World Cup.

8 Steve Robinson - Midfielder

ROBINSON is a hard working midfielder who has become a firm favourite with the fans at Kenilworth Road. He has enjoyed spells with Spurs, Bournemouth and Preston North End.

9 Rowan Vine - STRIKER

THE Basingstoke-born striker initially joined Town on a three-month loan deal from Premiership Portsmouth on the 2004/05 season but that arrangement was extended in September for the whole season after he had made an impressive start to life as a Hatter. Vine is now a Luton player having signed a three-year contract following his impressive season during the club's League One success.

10 Warren Feeney - STRIKER

THE Belfast-born striker started his career as a trainee at Leeds but failed to break into the first team before joining Bournemouth, initially on loan, and then permanently after he was released from Elland Road. He scored more than 30

goals in just over 80 games for the Cherries before moving to Stockport County. A Northern Ireland international.

11 Dean Morgan - STRIKER

MORGAN became an instant favorite with Luton fans after his 90th minute winner in the 3-2 victory over Southampton in August 2005. Morgan moved to Kenilworth Stadium from Reading in July 2005 after seeing his opportunities limited at the Madjeski Stadium.

14 Michael Leary - MIDFIELDER

LEARY enjoyed success on loan with Bristol Rovers and Walsall last season, impressing against the Reds in the FA Cup.

15 Stephen O'Leary - MIDFIELDER

O'LEARY is a skillful midfielder who spent most of last season on-loan with Tranmere Rovers.

16 Lewis Emanuel - DEFENDER

DEFENDER Emanuel arrived at Kenilworth Road in the summer of 2006 after deciding to leave his hometown club Bradford City.

17 Richard Langley - MIDFIELDER

RICHARD Langley signed for Luton Town in July 2006 after being released by former club QPR. A hard working midfielder, Langley started his career at Loftus Road after progressing through

their youth ranks and went on to make nearly 150 appearances for the club before a spell with Cardiff.

18 Ahmet Brkovic - MIDFIELDER

BRKOVIC is a tidy and hardworking member of the squad who had an inspirational season during Luton's championship success in League One, scoring 16 goals from midfield.

19 Sam Parkin - STRIKER

EX-Chelsea trainee Parkin is a forward with a prolific goalscoring record, and chose Kenilworth Road as the place to further his career in August 2006 despite strong interest from other Championship clubs. He has enjoyed spells with Swindon Town and Ipswich Town after coming through the ranks at Stamford Bridge.

21 Keith Keane - MIDFIELDER

ANOTHER of the youth team who regularly appears for the Republic of Ireland at schoolboy level, he joined the Hatters at the age of nine having been scouted in local football, and has made a rapid progression through the club's centre of excellence and youth teams.

22 Danny Stevens - MIDFIELDER

A YOUNG midfielder with a big future in the game, Stevens is an easily recognisable player because of his size.

25 Leon Barnett - DEFENDER

LOCAL lad, Barnett became the first player to represent the club at Under-17, Under-19, Reserve and First Team level within one season during his breakthrough in 2002.

26 Markus Heikkinen - DEFENDER

MIKE Newell pulled off a real coup with the signing of Aberdeen central defender Heikkinen. Although born in Sweden,

Heikkinen is a Finnish international and in August 2005 he partnered Liverpool's Sami Hyypia during their World Cup qualifying win over Macedonia.

27 Peter Holmes - MIDFIELDER

A TWO-footed midfielder, Holmes came to Luton as one of former boss Ricky Hill's first signings after impressing while he was coaching at Sheffield Wednesday. Holmes has a good pedigree, he is a product of the FA's School Of Excellence, from the same year as Michael Owen.

28 David Bell - MIDFIELDER

TALENTED young midfielder David Bell signed a three and a half year contract with the Hatters in mid-January 2006 from Rushden & Diamonds.

29 Calvin Andrew - STRIKER

AFTER scoring an incredible eight goals in three games for the Under-18 side, including hat-tricks against Northampton and Rushden, Andrew made his Luton debut in September 2004.

33 Dean Brill - GOALKEEPER

LUTON-born Brill is another young player of whom big things are expected. Having enjoyed a taste of first-team football last season he will provide healthy competition for the goalkeepers jersey and keep Marlon Beresford on his toes.

34 Zac Barrett - GOALKEEPER

PROMISING young goalkeeper whose performances for the youth team last season earned him a professional contract.

35 Chris Pendleton - MIDFIELDER

PENDLETON is a youngster who has progressed through the youth ranks at Luton Town and is awaiting to make his senior debut.

STRIKER

LUTON splashed out £500,000 on striker Boyd from Hartlepool United in July 2006, signing a three-year contract.

Boyd is a skillful striker who scored 60 goals in six years at the Victoria Ground.

Hatters boss Mike Newell knows plenty about the striker having worked with him when he was the manager of Hartlepool earlier in his career.

Boyd's most prolific campaign for Hartlepool was in the 2004/05 season when his 29 goals helped the club reach the League One play-off final, before losing to Sheffield Wednesday. Boyd has also played for Boston, making 14 appearances whilst on loan.



DREAM

MITCHELL THOMAS

Versatile England U-21 international left-back who had two spells at Luton Town. Born locally, he signed professional at Kenilworth Road in August 1982 and starred as Luton reached the FA Cup semi-finals in 1984-85. He followed David Pleat to Tottenham Hotspur for £275,000 in July 1986 and featured in the 1987 FA Cup final, moving to West Ham for £525,000 in August 1991. Returning to Luton in November 1993, he netted six goals in 292 League games overall for the Hatters prior to joining Burnley in July 1999 and was an experienced figure in their 1999-2000 promotion success.

**BRUCE RIOCH**

Influential midfielder who was capped 24 times by Scotland after leaving Luton Town. Signing professional for Luton in September 1964, he starred in the 1967-68 Fourth Division title triumph and netted 46 goals in 149 League games prior to joining Aston Villa for £100,000 in July 1969. He was a key figure in their 1971-72 Third Division title success and moved to Derby County in February 1974, helping to win the League Championship in 1974-75. He played for Everton, Derby again and Torquay, since managing Middlesbrough, Millwall, Bolton Wanderers, Arsenal, Norwich City and Wigan Athletic.

Football historian **LEIGH EDWARDS** selects a post-war Luton Town 'Dream Team' with the help of several Luton supporters and club officials.

RON BAYNHAM

England international goalkeeper who was a key figure as Luton Town were FA Cup finalists in 1959. He impressed with Worcester City before moving to Kenilworth Road in November 1951 and contested a first-team slot with fellow England keeper Bernard Streten as Luton gained top-flight status for the first time in 1954-55. Missing just one match in both 1955-56 and 1957-58, he was capped three times and also represented the Football League. He made 388 League appearances for the Hatters until injury ended his career in May 1965 and subsequently worked as an interior decorator in Bedfordshire.

KIRK STEPHENS

Attacking right-back who was ever-present in Luton Town's 1981-82 Second Division title triumph. Initially with Nuneaton Borough, he helped them finish Southern League runners-up in 1974-75 and followed David Pleat to Kenilworth Road in June 1978. He was voted Luton's 'Player of the Year' in 1978-79 and 1983-84, scoring twice in 227 League games for the Hatters before moving to Coventry City in exchange for Ashley Grimes in August 1984. Later rejoining Nuneaton as player-manager after a knee injury ended his top-flight career, he also had a spell at Barnet and worked for his father's building firm.

SYD OWEN

Long-serving England international centre-half who skippered Luton Town in the 1959 FA Cup final. Signing professional for Birmingham City in October 1945, he moved to Luton in June 1947 and starred in their 1951-52 FA

Cup run, 1952-53 promotion near-miss and 1954-55 promotion success. He was 'Footballer of the Year' in 1958-59 and netted three goals in 388 League games before becoming Luton's manager for a year in May 1959. Subsequently Leeds United's chief coach under Don Revie until October 1975, he then coached at Birmingham, Hull City and Manchester United. He died in August 1998.

RICKY HILL


England international midfielder who was 'Player of the Year' when Luton Town won the Second Division title in 1981-82. Signing professional at Kenilworth Road in May 1976, he was 'Player of the Year' again in 1982-83 and starred as Luton were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85. He featured in two consecutive Littlewoods Cup finals including the 1988 Wembley triumph and netted 54 goals in 436 League games before moving to Le Havre in July 1989. Reuniting with David Pleat at Leicester City in

MAL DONAGHY

Northern Ireland international central defender who gained a club record 58 caps while at Luton Town. He moved to Kenilworth Road from Larne in June 1978 and was ever-present as Luton won the Second Division title in 1981-82 and were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85. Voted 'Player of the Year' in 1985-86, he was an FA Cup semi-finalist again in 1987-88 and starred in that season's Littlewoods Cup final triumph. He netted 16 goals in 410 League games for the Hatters prior to joining Manchester United for £650,000 in October 1988, then returned on loan before moving to Chelsea in August 1992.



August 1990 and later as a coach at Sheffield Wednesday and Spurs, he briefly rejoined Luton as manager.

BRIAN STEIN

England international striker who scored twice in Luton Town's 1988 Littlewoods Cup final triumph. Moving to Kenilworth Road from Edgware Town in October 1977, he was leading marksman in Luton's 1981-82 Second Division success and also starred as they were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85 and 1987-88. He joined Caen in July 1988 and moved via Annecy back to Luton in July 1991. Voted 'Player of the Year' for the second time in 1991-92, he netted 130 goals in 427 League games overall for the Hatters before joining Barnet in August 1992. His younger brother Mark also played for Luton.

MICK HARFORD

England international striker who played for Luton Town in consecutive Littlewoods Cup finals

including the 1988 Wembley triumph. Signing professional for Lincoln City in July 1977, he had spells with Newcastle United, Bristol City and Birmingham City prior to joining Luton in December 1984. He starred as the Hatters were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85 and 1987-88, moving to Derby County in January 1990 and returning to Luton in September 1991. Joining Chelsea in August 1992, he later played for Sunderland, Coventry and Wimbledon. He later coached Luton, then managed Rotherham.

MALCOLM MACDONALD

Ace marksman who was capped 14 times by England after leaving Luton Town. Initially with Tonbridge, he joined Fulham in August 1968 and moved to Kenilworth Road in July 1969. He was Luton's top scorer in two consecutive seasons including the 1969-70 promotion success and netted 49 goals in 88 League games before being sold to Newcastle United for £180,000 in

May 1971. An FA Cup finalist in 1974, he joined Arsenal for £333,000 in August 1976 and was an FA Cup finalist again in 1978 before injury ended his career. He subsequently managed Fulham and Huddersfield Town.

PAUL WALSH

England international striker who was capped five times while at Luton Town. Signing professional for Charlton Athletic in October 1979, he starred in their 1980-81 promotion success and moved to Luton in July 1982. He was 'Player of the Year' in 1982-83 and leading marksman in 1983-84, netting 24 goals in 80 First Division games for the Hatters prior to joining Liverpool in May 1984. Helping to win the League Championship in 1985-86, he joined Tottenham Hotspur in February 1988 and was an FA Cup winner in 1991. He later played for Portsmouth and Manchester City until injury ended his career.

Classic CAMPAIGNS

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS selects ten Luton Town 'Classic Campaigns' from 60 post-war seasons.

1954/55

Gordon Turner scored 32 goals as Luton Town won promotion to the top-flight for the first time in 1954/55. The Hatters began with a 3-0 victory at home to Nottingham Forest and soared up the Second Division table with six straight wins. Gordon Turner grabbed a hat-trick as Luton trounced Blackburn 7-3 and they triumphed 5-1 at Nottingham Forest. Dally Duncan's side maintained their challenge, slamming four goals past Hull City, Rotherham, Liverpool and Port Vale. Tom Aherne and Shay Dunne were ever-present as Luton pipped Rotherham to the runners-up slot on goal average with a 3-0 win at Doncaster.

1958/59

Luton Town were FA Cup finalists for the first and only time in 1958/59. The Hatters were unbeaten in their opening ten First Division games, trouncing Manchester City 5-1 and scoring four goals past West Ham and Preston. They recovered from a lean spell to beat Arsenal 6-3 and Burnley 6-2, then top scorer Allan Brown netted four goals in a 5-1 demolition of Nottingham Forest but poor results over the closing weeks saw them finish below mid-table. Luton defeated Leeds 5-1, Leicester 4-1, Ipswich 5-2, Blackpool 1-0 and Norwich 1-0 in the FA Cup before Syd Owen's side lost 2-1 to Nottingham Forest in the final.

1967/68

Bruce Rioch netted 24 goals as Luton Town won the Fourth Division title in 1967/68. New captain Terry Branston made his debut as the Hatters kicked off with a 1-1 draw at Wrexham and Ian Buxton arrived from Derby in September. Luton lost just two of their first 18 matches and beat Charlton in the League Cup first round, scoring 27 goals in a run of eight successive wins. Allan Brown's side went top of the table with a 2-0 win at Brentford in February and Keith Allen, Max Dougan, Fred Jardine, John Moore and Ray Whittaker also starred as they remained in pole position, clinching the title with a 4-0 victory over Crewe.

1969/70

Malcolm Macdonald scored 25 times as Luton Town won promotion in 1969/70. The Hatters had narrowly missed promotion the previous season and Bruce Rioch was sold to Aston Villa for a record fee, with Alec Stock signing Malcolm Macdonald, John Ryan and John Collins. Luton were early leaders after remaining unbeaten in their opening 13 matches, recruiting Chris Nicholl from Halifax and Matt Tees from Charlton. Malcolm Macdonald grabbed hat-tricks in 5-0 wins over Bradford City and Reading, with Luton unbeaten in their last six matches and clinching promotion as Third Division runners-up with a 0-0 draw at Mansfield

1973/74

Luton Town regained top-flight status after an absence of 14 years in 1973/74. The Hatters recovered from a 4-0 defeat at Nottingham Forest on the opening day to hammer Carlisle 6-1, embarking on an eight-match unbeaten run. Harry Haslam signed Alan West from Burnley and Jimmy Husband from Everton as Luton maintained their promotion challenge. Husband netted a hat-trick in a 3-1 victory over rivals Orient, then leading marksman Barry Butlin scored three in a 4-2 win over Preston. Alan Garner and Bobby Thomson were ever-present and other stars included Peter Anderson and John Ryan as Luton finished runners-up.

1981/82

David Pleat guided Luton Town to the Second Division title in 1981/82. The Hatters had narrowly missed promotion in the previous two years and Tony Grealish was swapped for Brighton's Brian Horton. They raced to the top by winning their first three games and hammered rivals Watford 4-1, then Steve White scored four times in a 6-0 demolition of Grimsby. Richard Money arrived from Liverpool and was an influential figure as Luton were unbeaten in their last 14 matches. Leading marksman Brian Stein, Mal Donaghy, Kirk Stephens and Steve White were all ever-present as Luton won the title with 88 points.

1987/88

Ray Harford plotted Luton Town's 1988 Littlewoods Cup final triumph. Danny Wilson replaced Peter Nicholas in midfield, while Micky Weir arrived from Hibernian and Mike Newell moved to Leicester. The Hatters won 5-2 at Oxford and Ian Allinson was signed from Stoke in October, with Luton losing just twice in 12 matches including a 7-4 win in the return match against Oxford, finishing ninth in the top-flight. They defeated Wigan 5-2, Coventry 3-1, Ipswich 1-0, Bradford City 2-0 and Oxford 3-1 in the Littlewoods Cup before beating Arsenal 3-2 in the final. Luton were also FA Cup semi-finalists and Simod Cup finalists.

1988/89


Luton Town were Littlewoods Cup finalists for the second consecutive season in 1988/89. Departures were Brian Stein, Mark Stein and Andy Dibble, while newcomers included Roy Wegerle, John Dreyer and Steve Williams. Luton's first home win was 1-0 against Liverpool and they beat Southampton 6-1 in January but First Division form was generally disappointing, with the Hatters narrowly avoiding relegation by winning three of their last four games. Luton defeated Burnley 2-1, Leeds 2-0, Manchester City 3-1, Southampton 2-1 and West Ham 5-0 in the Littlewoods Cup before losing 3-1 to Nottingham Forest in the final.

2001/02


Steve Howard scored 24 times as Luton Town won promotion in 2001/02. Joe Kinnear's side were early leaders after winning their opening two matches and newcomer Carl Griffiths netted a hat-trick in a 5-1 win over Torquay. The Hatters briefly regained pole position after beating Darlington 5-2 in October, signing Chris Coyne from Dundee, Jean-Louis Valois from Lille, Dean Crowe from Stoke, Ahmet Brkovic from Orient and Dave Bayliss from Rochdale. A run of 12 successive wins, slamming five goals past Halifax and Mansfield, took Luton back to the top with two games remaining but they finished runners-up to Plymouth.

2004/05

Mike Newell managed Luton Town to the League One title in 2004/05. The Hatters stormed to the top of the table, winning 10 of their first 12 games before three successive defeats. They beat Bradford City 4-0 and Wrexham 5-1, then Steve Howard netted a hat-trick in a 4-1 win at MK Dons. The 1-0 victory over Port Vale in December heralded a 14 match unbeaten run and Luton bounced back from a 3-1 defeat in the return fixture to hammer Bristol City 5-0. Briefly displaced as leaders by Hull, they triumphed 4-1 at Torquay and secured promotion with four games remaining. Luton won the title with a record 98 points.

The Match
 AN exciting, closely fought game provided a fitting climax to a memorable season in English football. The opening stages of the game featured dangerous attacks from the Villa right wing pairing of Athersmith and Devey, and an outstanding performance by Bell in the Everton vanguard. Near-misses at both ends were the prelude to a remarkable 25 minute spell before the interval, in which all the goals were scored. Everton had been well warned of the danger down Villa's right wing before Campbell took a pass from that direction to curve the ball past Menham in 18 minutes. Bell equalised with a break through the Villa defence. He drew the goalkeeper

before slipping the ball between the posts. More Everton pressure resulted in Boyle putting them ahead from a free kick, and it seemed that the men in blue had taken control of the game. Back came Villa, however, showing great resolution and no little skill as their rapid attacks led to two goals. Wheldon scored the equaliser, and a clever header by Crabtree restored their lead on the stroke of half time. Villa probably had the edge in the second half, but there were no more goals and the Birmingham side added the FA Cup, presented by Lord Rosebery, to the League Championship they had won for the second successive season. They had emulated the achievement of the "Invincible" Preston side of eight years earlier, and it took until 1961 before the feat was repeated.

The Programme
 PRIOR to being staged at Stamford Bridge, and then Wembley, there were a number of "Official" or "Authorised" programmes produced for the FA Cup Final, by then commanding attendances of increasing scale. More than 60,000 sports fans congregated in one place for an afternoon was a captive audience for advertisers, so it was little wonder that team sheets, subsidised by heavy advertising, were distributed. F.M. Evans & Co. Ltd., Printers of Crystal Palace, produced a large single sheet, dominated by an advert for "The People" newspaper. This sheet,

described on one side as "The Only Authorised Programme", and on the other as "Official Programme One Penny" was a familiar sight at Finals staged at the Crystal Palace. Accompanying The People on one side were adverts for Benetfink & Co, Sports Outfitters of Cheapside, and A.W. Gamage, of the same trade in Holborn. On the reverse, Team selections in 2-3-5 formation (100% accurate to those who took the field of play) were surrounded by various small advertisements, mostly aimed at active sportsmen. John Piggott of Cheapside and Milk Street produced a Cup Tie Football (at 9/3d) and a Surrey Driver Bat for 15/9d. Mansfield's Boots had not yet developed the Hotspur, but Elliman's Embrocation would ease aches and pains. Sports newspaper only cost 1d, while Grant's Morella Cherry Brandy was "the best Tonic for Football Players (most comforting in chilly weather). The Bertram Blend of Scotch Whisky made no such claim. This programme, and its contemporary, would fetch several thousands of pounds if they were to appear at auction or on offers lists.





"We did not perform against Sheffield United but we scored goals and came away with a point. If you look at the last two matches then I think everybody would be happy with a point from Liverpool and beating Sheffield United at home if it had happened the other way.

"We have worked with the lads for three months now and I think each and every one of them know



Away Supporters' Facilities:

Away supporters will be housed in the West Stand, also known as the Leppings Lane End. Its upper tier contains 4,194 seats while the lower tier seats 2,464 spectators. There are also 1,337 seats in the north-west corner of the ground which are used on big occasions.

Away tickets are sold for the upper tier of the West Stand first, priced £17 adults and £10 under-16/over-60 in advance or £18 adults and £11 under-16/over-60 on the day of the game..

How To Get There:

Hillsborough is situated three miles north of the city centre, but visitors are advised to avoid this route and approach the ground from the north instead. Parking is possible in the area just north of Hillsborough.

By Car:

From The North/South/East:

Exit the M1 at junction 36 and follow the A61 towards Sheffield. Continue along the road for approximately four miles until the 2nd roundabout. Take the 3rd exit (Leppings Lane) - the ground is situated on the left-hand side.

From The South/East (non matchdays only) - Leave the M1 at junction 33 and turn left towards Sheffield City Centre on the "Sheffield Parkway" dual carriageway. Continue until the end of the Parkway, when you will come to Park Square roundabout. Turn right and continue to follow signs for the A61 towards Barnsley. Signs for Hillsborough are also prominent. The stadium is situated three miles from the city centre and is on your left-hand side after Hillsborough Park.

From The South/East (non matchdays only) - Leave the M1 at junction 33 and turn left towards Sheffield City Centre on the "Sheffield Parkway" dual carriageway. Continue until the end of the Parkway, when you will come to Park Square roundabout. Turn right and continue to follow signs for the A61 towards Barnsley. Signs for Hillsborough are also prominent. The stadium is situated three miles from the city centre and is on your left-hand side after Hillsborough Park.

From the West:

Take the A57 for Sheffield. As you approach the city the road splits in two - take the left fork onto the Rivelin Valley Road (A6101). Continue for approximately 3.75 miles, turn left (onto one way system) and follow the road round to the right onto Holme Lane. This road then becomes Bradfield Road. At the junction with the A61 Penistone Road, turn left towards Barnsley. Hillsborough Stadium is on the left-hand side after Hillsborough Park.

By Train:

Sheffield Railway Station (Contact Midland Mainline on 0845 712 5678) is situated in the town centre, three miles from the ground.

By Supertram:

Take the South Yorkshire Supertram (signposted from the Railway Station) towards Middlewood Road (yellow route). Exit at the Leppings Lane stop, which is a short walk from the ground.

By Bus:

From the Railway Station, Flat Street Bus Terminus is a one-minute walk - cross over at the pedestrian crossing, and follow the signs. Bus numbers 53, 77 and 80 all run from Flat Street to Hillsborough. From Angel Street, buses 74 and 74a run to Hillsborough.

From Snig Hill, buses 85 and 86 run to Leppings Lane. From the Sheffield Transport Interchange, bus 57 runs past the ground towards Stocksbridge. On matchdays, bus frequency should be roughly every 15 minutes.

Parking:

The best place to park is in the Owlerton greyhound stadium. This is about a ten minute walk to Hillsborough, but usually gets full quite early. Some local schools often open for parking, such as the Chaucer School (located on the A61). There are side streets around Hillsborough but these tend to be full on matchdays.

Around The Ground:

The two main pubs frequented by away fans on the A61 are the Norfolk Arms & The Red Lion in Grenoside. Both are some distance from the ground, but welcome away fans, and due to their location there is rarely any trouble.

Other good pubs for away fans are the Horse and Jockey on Wadsley Lane (leads uphill from the Leppings Lane end) which does hot pies and a good pint. Just off Halifax Road (A61) before the railway bridge is The Pheasant (Trafalgar Road) while just past the railway bridge on Halifax Road is the New Bridge Inn.

On the A61 nearer to Hillsborough are pubs such as The Park, The Gate and The Travellers which are no-go areas for away fans. They have a strict 'Home Fans Only' door policy and any away fan who enters may get a less than welcome reception from home supporters who drink in these pubs.

If you're a real ale enthusiast check out The New Barrack Tavern on Penistone Road (A61) going towards town from the ground just past McDonalds. This is a CAMRA pub with great ales and a clientele who are very

benny hill's STOP PRESS

FOOTBALL, in the words of one Championship manager, has "gone analysis mad." Few clubs now - especially at the top level - seem to accept that the sport is about players and coaches, and the team with the best players and best coach will generally win the most matches.

Sports psychologists, dieticians and analysts of every description are employed by modern football clubs, each of them seeking to gain the tiniest edge in the quest for success. But do these relatively new techniques really allow clubs to achieve a decisive advantage in a promotion race or a fight against relegation?

Mike Newell, the manager of Barnsley's opponents today, has managed notable success on a small transfer budget, a low wage bill, and without the luxury of a modern stadium or training facilities. His team won the league one title by a 12-point margin in the 2004/05 campaign, and competed strongly in the Championship last season, when they finished tenth.

But more importantly, Newell has proved that it is possible to prosper by adhering to the virtues of astute coaching, man-management and sound tactical judgement, which have stood the test of time. You would be hard pressed to find a sports psychologist at Kenilworth Road. By his own admission, Newell is from the old school, but his players speak highly of his honest attitude, his approachable demeanour and his coaching ability.

Before dismissing modern methods as nonsense,

however, it is worth looking at what Luton's great rivals Watford have achieved during the last 12 months. Tipped for relegation at the start of last season, they finished third in the Championship and reached the Premiership via the play-offs. Their young manager, Adrian Boothroyd, refers to the club as a "learning environment", and often sounds more like a business executive than a football manager. But his results speak for themselves - and his players love him to bits.



Last season, Boothroyd staged a mock penalty shoot-out after a home match against Ipswich, with the fans still present, to prepare his players should it happen in the play-offs.

But after scoring five penalties out of five to beat Bristol Rovers in the Carling Cup last month, Newell confessed Luton had not even practised spot-kicks. "You can't recreate it," he insisted. "You either have the bottle, or you don't."

Boothroyd would doubtless disagree, but the different routes to success in football are why the game continues to fascinate us.
