## In Conversation with **Sol Davis**

Having just kicked a ball in anger for the first time since suffering a stroke, Sol Davis is hungrier than ever for more action – and it's feeding time!

**S**ol! He's indestructable! Or so the song goes, but on that ill-fated coach trip to Ipswich back in October his body conspired against him and for a short while it left the Hatters defender in a specialist unit at Addenbrooke's Hospital, wondering if he'd ever kick a ball again.

Taking the positives from Luton's Boxing Day clash at Colchester may have been a slightly harder proposition had not a certain Cheltenham-born player returned to the fold to the delight of everyone at the Club.

"All any footballer is interested in is getting on the field and playing.

"I feel normal. I feel back to myself. Getting that first game under my belt was a weight off my mind, and I'm now waiting for my next game."

Now that the 27-year-old full back has made a full recovery, Sol can recall the chain of events in such a

relaxed manner that it almost betrays the seriousness of his condition at the time.

"I sat on the coach on the way to Ipswich. We'd departed Luton and after about 20 minutes I started to feel slightly sick. I expected it to pass but then pins and needles set in my hands.

"I realised that something was majorly wrong with me when I couldn't speak properly. I asked David Bell to grab the physio for me and I just slurred my words. Seconds later I couldn't use my arm or my leg and my mouth had gone as well."

It was a worrying time for everybody at the Club, but especially for Sol's family.

"I think it was probably more difficult for my family seeing me go through that. I've always felt fine throughout it, felt confident it would be okay."

The early medical reports were the most crucial, and Sol admitted to a period of

anxiety waiting for the results of his tests to come in.

"The first thing I wanted to know was would I be able to play again. That was all I wanted to know. As soon as I had the tests done and I knew I'd be back at some point, the next question was 'When can I get back on the field?'"

As news spread around the Club that he was out of danger, Sol kept himself busy by responding to his team mates' macabre sense of humour with a few distasteful texts of his own, making light of the potentially serious situation that he was in.

"The jokes have been coming out of me since the minute it happened."

The Hatters' official Club website [www.lutontown.co.uk](http://www.lutontown.co.uk) had set up an online 'Get Well Sol' message centre that almost reached meltdown within its first 24 hours, as literally hundreds of emails and letters flooded in from Luton supporters and football fans all over the world, giving Sol a bit more reading material while he was laid up.

**"I realised that something was majorly wrong with me when I couldn't speak properly. I asked David Bell to grab the physio for me and I just slurred my words. Seconds later I couldn't use my arm or my leg and my mouth had gone as well."**

"They definitely helped. I didn't expect any letters or any messages. I was just expecting to be in hospital on my own. But it helped lying in the hospital on my own reading messages of support.

"I've even had a few cards from Watford wishing me all the best, so I thank them for that."

Having made such good progress in such a short space of time, Sol decided that there was no point in hanging around at home and wasted no time in returning to Kenilworth Road on his release from hospital.

"I was so desperate to get back playing. They let me out of the hospital on the Wednesday evening and I was in at the Club on the Friday trying to jog. I was

told by the physio to go home and not to come back for a week or two!"

So what now for Sol? He's been back in full training and has been back in the squad for the festive programme, but has he had the all clear from his medical team?

"I've still got some tests to go. I've still got a heart scan to have, but all the other tests have come back negative and I've been told to get on with it, so there's no reason now to worry.

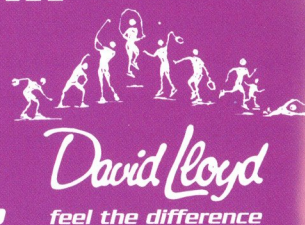
"I can't wait to get back in. I just want to get on with my job now, just get back to playing and get back in the team."

## Welcome to Cardiff City

**Cardiff City proved they are a force to be reckoned with in the Championship this season when they produced an impressive performance against Luton in September. Despite some alarm bells ringing after a dip in form, STEWART CURTIS tells us why the Welsh club is unlikely to be out of the promotion picture.**

Having begun the season in blistering form, manager Dave Jones had reason to cheer as his side went six points clear on October 17th. However, their recent form has seen them fail to win in their previous eight games heading into Saturday's fixture with Crystal Palace. This latest blip has seen the Welsh outfit fall to fifth position in the league, 11 points off top spot.

Speculation regarding the club's future was finally concluded during the week before Christmas. A unanimous consortium completed their £27m takeover of Lebanese businessman Sam Hammam's controlling stake in the club, just minutes before a deadline which would have forced the club into Administration.

Fears of a takeover collapse saw Jones' managerial position speculated about in the press, and the recently reported dressing room unrest this has caused. "I

was sold a dream (of a new stadium) and I'm sure one or two of the players were also, so they must be concerned as well with what's going on."

However with the club's future now secure, planning permission for the new 30,000 all-seater stadium was granted almost immediately, a project they hope will be completed in time for Christmas 2008. The increased finances have also relinquished extra funds for January's transfer window, allowing Jones to further strengthen the squad as the Bluebirds push for Premiership status.

A complete squad overhaul saw no fewer than 10 players leave South Wales in the summer, including league top-scorer Cameron Jerome's £3m move to promotion rivals Birmingham City. However, some astute transfer dealings have seen Jerome replaced with Newcastle striker Michael Chopra, arriv-

ing for just £500k. He made an instant impact on life in the Championship, scoring a goal every other game to take his tally for the season to 12.

Chopra's arrival was certainly not the only incomer to Ninian Park, with a further 13 players following suit. Other notable signings included Willy Flood's move from Manchester City, midfielder Stephen McPhail from Barnsley and defender Kevin McNaughton from Aberdeen, a player who was previously linked with a move to Kenilworth Road.

Following a 4-1 drubbing in the reverse fixture in Wales earlier this season, the Hatters will be out for revenge in this afternoon's game, and with both sides top goalscorers firing on all cylinders, we could be in for a repeat of last year's six goal thriller.

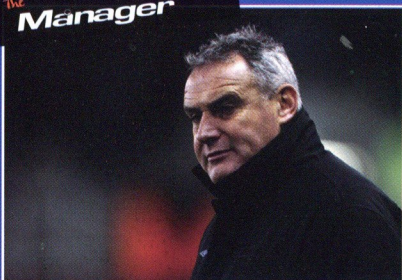




# The Opponents

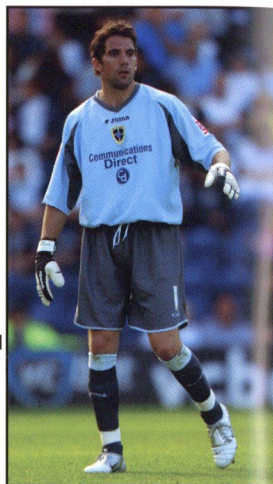
## The Manager



In July 1990, Dave Jones joined Stockport County as a manager for their youth team and took over as first team manager from Danny Bergara in March 1995. He took the team into the First Division (now the Championship) from an automatic promotion place in 1997. This promotion brought him to the attention of Southampton, who offered him their vacant managerial position. In January 2001 he found work at Wolves and finished 12th. In the 2001/02 season, Jones guided Wolves to a clear 11 point lead over their arch-rivals West Bromwich Albion, but managed to lose their promotion place by the end of the season. He took the team to a play-offs in the 2002/03 season and Wolves won a place in the Premiership, returning to top football for the first time in 19 years. However, the team did not prove strong enough to stay at that level and were relegated to the Championship just one season later. Following a poor run of form at the start of their first season back in the Championship, Dave Jones was sacked by Wolves on November 1st, 2004 and the following year took up the position at Cardiff City. During Jones' first season in charge of Cardiff they achieved a respectable mid-table placing in the Championship. However following a period of rebuilding over the summer of 2006, Jones has now forged a talented side.

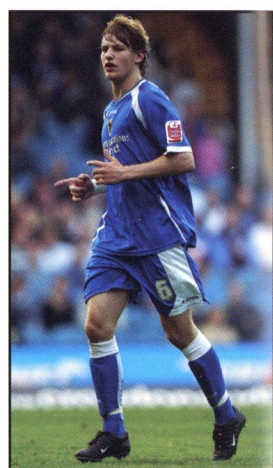
## The Goalkeepers

Cardiff's number one shot stopper is currently **NEIL ALEXANDER** (pictured), the former Livingston goalkeeper. Alexander signed for £200,000 in August 2001 and played in every Championship match during the 2005/06 season. It was a marvellous achievement for the former Scottish Under 21 international, as two years ago he began the season as third-choice goalkeeper and it looked as if he might have to go elsewhere to re-establish his career. But he was soon recalled to the first team, and did well enough to make himself clear first choice as well as achieving his long-term aim of a senior Scotland appearance. **MARK HOWARD** is an ex-Arsenal trainee, who has enjoyed a loan spell with Falkirk, whilst Luton fans will know **MARTYN MARGETSON**, having enjoyed a short loan spell at Kenilworth Road in 1995. Margetson has also had stints at Huddersfield and Manchester City.



## The Defenders

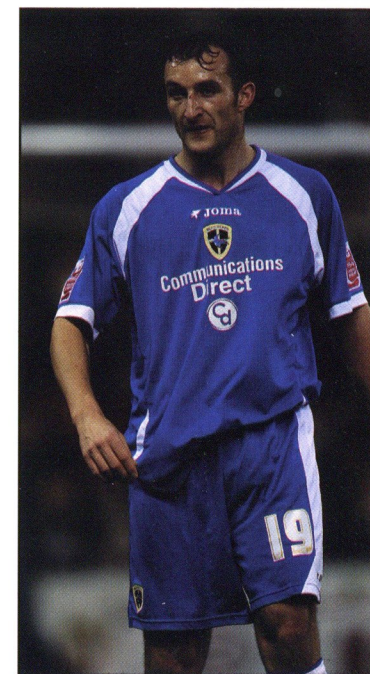
Cardiff swooped to take **KERREA GILBERT** on a seasons loan from Arsenal at the start of the season. The promising youngster made nine Premiership and Cup appearances last season and is one of a number of promising young Arsenal players quickly coming through the ranks at the North London club. Gilbert is a talented young player; just like **GLENN LOOVENS** (pictured), who signed for £180,000 in May 2006, after he impressed on a seasons long loan. Glenn made a great impact whilst on loan from Feyenoord, making tremendous progress, and the Club were always keen to sign him on a permanent basis. **DARREN PURSE** has enjoyed spells with Oxford United, Birmingham City and West Bromwich Albion and is a former England Under 21 international. Darren had a very consistent season last year in what was his first campaign with the club. He is the club's penalty taker, with five of his six goals last season coming from the spot. **ROGER JOHNSON** is a useful defender as he can operate at full back as well as a striker. On a number of occasions he moved into attack when playing for Wycombe and proved to be more than capable up front. **WILLO FLOOD** has failed to really establish himself in the Cardiff side, with most of his appearances for the club this season coming as a substitute. Flood joined from Coventry, as has also had spells at Rochdale and Manchester City. **CHRIS GUNTER** is a young player who has quickly progressed through the ranks at Ninian Park. He has already had a taste of first team football this season with three starts in the Championship. Cardiff currently have two defenders on loan with **CHRIS BARKER** at Colchester and **JOE JACOBSON** enjoying a spell at League Two newcomers Accrington Stanley.



## The Midfielders

Luton will be wary of the threat **PAUL PARRY** may bring this afternoon. Parry is a player with an eye for goal, with three already this season. He signed in January 2004 from Hereford, where he had an impressive scoring record, finding the net 30 times in just over 150 appearances. Parry, who is a Welsh international, operates on left side of midfield but can also play in a central attacking position. **STEPHEN MCPHAIL** joined from Barnsley and played a major role in their promotion to the Championship last season. The talented midfielder has also been on loan at Millwall and Nottingham Forest. McPhail has represented the Republic of Ireland at Youth, Under 21 and Senior level and it was little surprise when Cardiff came chasing for his signature. **JOE LEDLEY** played 42 Championship matches last season for Cardiff and is a current Welsh international. Joe is one of the up and coming young talents at Ninian Park and has been with the Club through its Centre of Excellence and Academy. Once he had made his first team debut, it was clear that he was in the squad

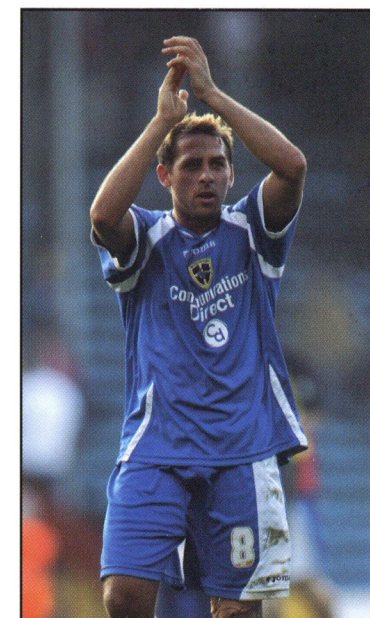
to stay, and it did not take long before he made his senior Wales debut. **RICCARDO SCIMECA** (pictured) is an ex Aston Villa trainee who enjoyed successful spells with Nottingham Forest, Leicester City and West Bromwich Albion. Scimeca signed in January 2006 and played 18 Championship matches following his arrival. **KEVIN COOPER** is a player who has enjoyed a distinguished career with spells at Derby, Stockport, Wimbledon, Wolves, Sunderland and Norwich. Kevin was a vital member of Manager Dave Jones' playing staff at Stockport and Wolves and he was amongst the manager's first targets when Jones took over at Ninian Park in May 2005. **MALVIN KAMARA** was known to Bluebirds' assistant manager Terry Burton from his days at Wimbledon, and it was his influence that brought the midfielder to Cardiff City. Malvin is quickly proving he was worth the chance at a higher level, with a few eye catching performances already this season. **NICK MCKOY** was another player brought in from MK Dons and is currently waiting patiently for his chance after sealing a move in July.



## The Strikers

The goals of **MICHAEL CHOPRA** (pictured) has undoubtedly gone a long way to helping Cardiff push for promotion this season. The talented striker is a former Newcastle United trainee, who enjoyed a very successful loan spell at Watford in 2003, scoring four goals in one game against Burnley. Chopra also spent spells with Nottingham Forest and Barnsley. He played in 20 Premiership and Cup matches for Newcastle during the 2005/06 season before penning a deal with Cardiff in June for an initial £500,000 fee. **STEVEN THOMPSON** could not have had a better start with Cardiff City, scoring twice on his debut in a 3-0 home win over Burnley. However a hand injury restricted his progress in the team after joining in January in 2006 from Glasgow Rangers. Thompson is an experienced striker who started his career with Dundee United and has amassed over 15

appearances for Scotland. Former Arsenal and Everton striker **KEVIN CAMPBELL** signed for Cardiff after being released by West Bromwich Albion following their relegation from the Premiership. The experienced striker made over 160 appearances at Arsenal, scoring 46 goals before being transferred to Nottingham Forest. Campbell tried his luck in Turkey where he played for Trabzonspor, before returning to join Everton on loan in March 1999. His impact on the side was immediate as he scored nine goals in eight games, making him Everton's top goalscorer that season despite spending barely a month with the club. 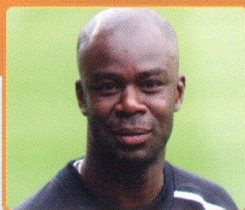

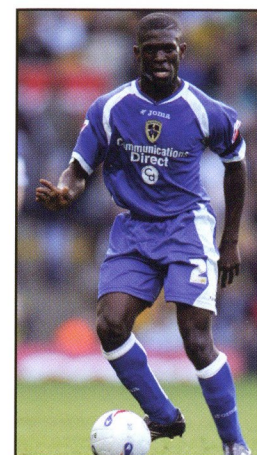

Cardiff supporter Michael Robson talks to today's matchday programme.

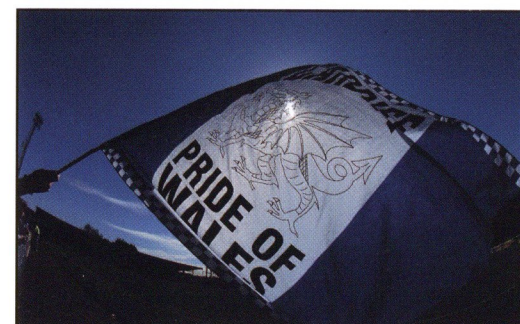


**What (or who) has contributed to the improvement in Cardiff's fortunes after finishing last season in 11th position?**

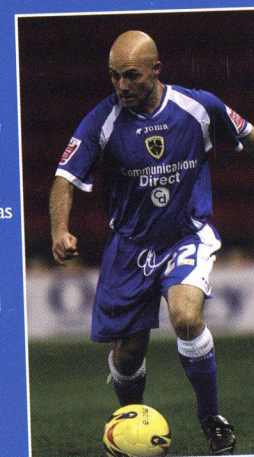
**What are Cardiff's aims for this season?**

# Five to Remember

Roger Wash takes a look back at five classic encounters between Luton Town and Cardiff City

## 2nd January 1937 Luton Town 8 Cardiff City 1 Attendance: 12,368

The Town had not enjoyed a good Christmas, having lost two of their three games over the festive period, and looked to bounce back against mid-table Cardiff.

With veteran centre-half Hugh McGinnigle making his first appearance for nearly a year in place of Jack Nelson, supporters could be excused for thinking that the defence would be less than secure but they need not have worried as he had little to do.

Cardiff levelled Joe Paynes' 20th minute effort, but from then on it was one way traffic with goals coming at regular intervals and only George Poland in the Bluebirds goal prevented a cricket score.

Amazingly, Cardiff were on the end of a similar 8-1 thumping at Kenilworth Road in 1932!

## 4th May 1971 Luton Town 3 Cardiff City 0 Attendance: 10,784

Both the Town and Cardiff had narrowly missed out on promotion from the old Division Two but the Hatters had something to play for in this the last game of the campaign – if they won by two clear goals they would qualify for the following season's Watney Cup, which was open to the two clubs in each division who had scored most goals but had won nothing.

In true 'Roy of the Rovers' style, the soon to depart Malcolm Macdonald netted goals two and three of his hat-trick in the final five minutes to send the crowd into raptures and also reputedly add £20,000 to his eventual transfer fee.

## 8th October 1977 Cardiff City 1 Luton Town 4 Attendance: 8,726

An unfortunate own goal from Cardiff's Gerry Byrne after 25 minutes set the Town up for their first win at Ninian Park since 1936.

Although Cardiff levelled through Phil Dwyer, just before the

interval, they are unable to make their dominance count in the second period leaving the Town to attack on the break for a classic 'smash and grab' raid.

Goals from Lil Fuccillo, Ron Futchter and Ricky Hill broke the Bluebirds hearts and forced their manager, and former Hatters coach, Jimmy Andrews to keep his players in the changing room for an hour after the match.

## 16th September 1978 Luton Town 7 Cardiff City 1 Attendance: 7,752

David Pleat's new look Hatters had already scored nine goals in their first two home games and the supporters were a shade disappointed that the Town were only two up at the interval against the Bluebirds.

In the second period it all came right though, as the Town piled on the pressure and goals flew in from all angles leaving the Cardiff defenders chasing shadows. Winger David Moss' 30 yard curling shot was probably the pick of the bunch.

Spare a thought for ex-Luton goalkeeper Keith Barber. On loan with the Bluebirds from Swansea he decided to hang up his gloves after the game, but probably wished he had a retired a week earlier!

## 26th December 2002 Luton Town 2 Cardiff City 0 Attendance: 7,905

Promotion favourites Cardiff were made to look second best throughout. Ex Luton manager Lennie Lawrence was not given a warm reception on his first return to the club but had no complaints afterwards as he saw his new side taken apart.

The Hatters pushed three players up front and had the chances to sew the game up by the interval, but saw three efforts cleared off the line. Tony Thorpe finally broke the deadlock on 80 minutes after the Cardiff defence failed to cut out a Dean Crowe pass, leaving top scorer Steve Howard to make the points safe at the death with a pearler into the top corner.

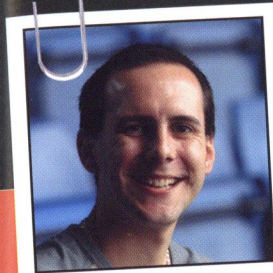

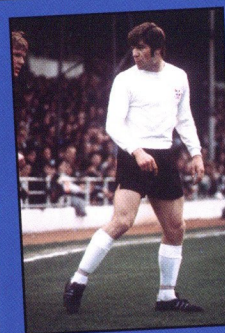


## Stat Attack

Simon Pitts takes a look at some interesting stats between this afternoon's two sides.

Luton have entertained Cardiff City 27 times in the league, and have won 15 of these fixtures, with just three defeats. The nine draws have seen each of the scorelines from 0-0 to 3-3. Luton have scored 72 goals, and conceded just 29. This means this fixture averages 3.74 goals. The 0-0 draw in March 1950 is the only time the Hatters have failed to score when Cardiff have been the visitors.

The three players that have moved to Cardiff from Luton had all spent less than two seasons playing at Kenilworth Road prior to their transfer: Iorwerth Hughes had become the fourth post war Luton player to win international honours, prior to the Welsh keepers move to Cardiff in August 1951 for £15,000. Hughes made 36 appearances and kept 11 clean sheets over two seasons. Roger Hoy only played during the 1970/71 season for the Hatters after a move from Crystal Palace, and went on to make 37 appearances for Luton. Adrian Alston played in the top flight for the Hatters in 1974/75, scoring eight times in 23 appearances. He made eight more appearances and scored one more goal the following season prior to his move to Wales.

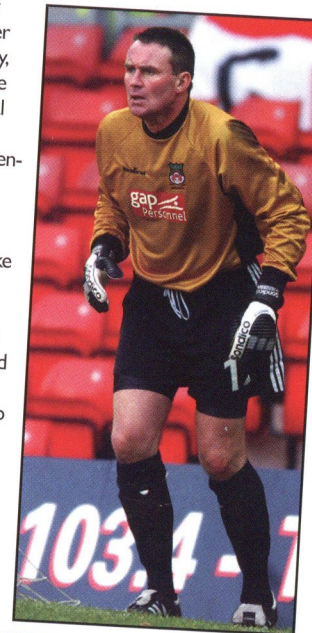


Luton have scored eight goals in a home league match six times in their history, and two of these fixtures were against Cardiff City! In 1932/33 the Hatters won 8-1, and this scoreline was repeated in 1936/37. Tommy Tait netted his third hat trick for Luton in the first fixture, with Joe Payne netting four goals, and his fifth Luton hat trick in 36/37.

George Stephenson also scored a hat trick in this fixture, and despite scoring 59 league goals for the Hatters, this was the only time he netted three times in a league match. A further two players, Joe Arnison and Malcolm MacDonald (pictured), have celebrated hat tricks against Cardiff. Both players scored all of Luton's goals in 3-0 wins, with Arnison netting his hat trick in just his fourth appearance in August 1948.

MacDonald left Luton in style as he netted the fourth league hat trick of his Luton career on his final appearance for the club in 1971.

Luton have only signed one player from Cardiff City, Andy Dibble. The League Cup Final hero made his debut on the opening day of the 1984/85 season, keeping a clean sheet against Stoke City. Dibble had cost Luton £125,000, and this fee almost doubled four years later when he moved to Manchester City, despite only making 37 appearances for the Hatters during this time. Dibble returned to Luton for just three appearances in the 1997/98 season, although it wasn't a happy home coming as he conceded ten goals in these games.



The sides have only met in the top flight for two seasons, between 1955-57. Luton won both home games 3-0, but failed to score away, losing 2-0 and drawing 0-0. Gordon Turner, Bob Morton and Jimmy Adam scored in the first game, with Morton scoring twice in the second, with Tony Gregory also on the scoresheet.

Luton have completed the double over Cardiff three times in 1933/34, 1977/78, 1999/2000. The sides actually both finished on 38 points at the end of the 77/78 season, but amazingly Luton were in 13th position and Cardiff 19th! Goal difference put the Hatters at the top of seven teams sharing the points, with 4-1 and 3-1 wins over the Welsh side certainly helping this statistic!

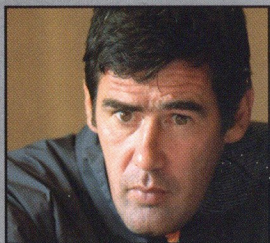

His double save on 31 minutes had Luton fans on their feet when the former Charlton goalkeeper first blocked a powerful header from Stern John before getting to his feet to stop the rebound from Colin Cameron.

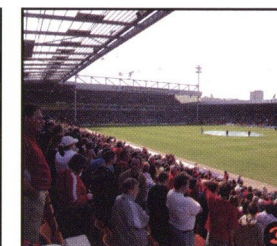

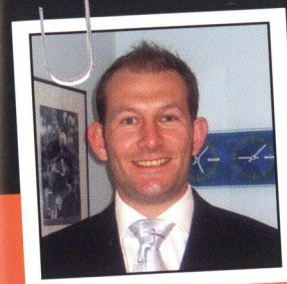

## Leeds hit with League fine

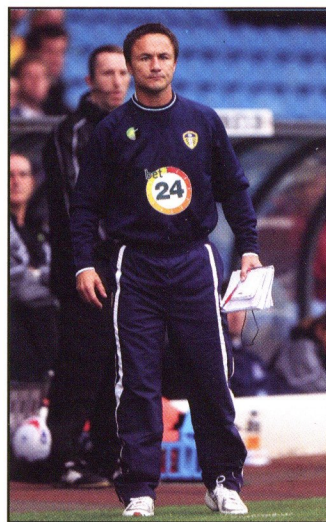
Leeds United have been fined £2,000 after they included six loan players in their squad for the game at Burnley on 28 November.

## Lupoli to consider Derby future

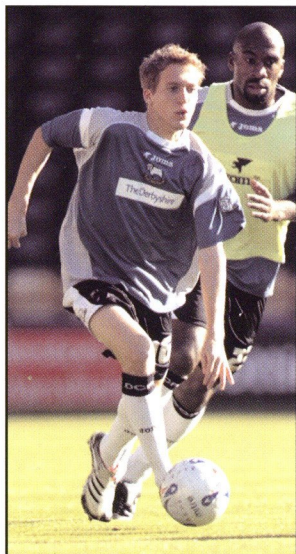
On-loan Arsenal striker Arturo Lupoli has told Derby he will consider staying with the club if they are promoted.

The 19-year-old is in talks with the Gunners over a new deal, but is free to talk to other clubs after 1 January.

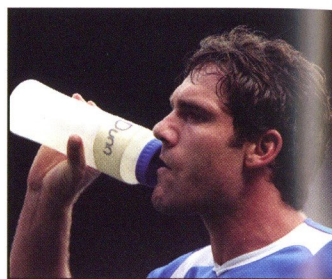

Dunn, 26, has been capped once by England but his three years with Blues have been blighted by injury and he has made only 12 appearances this season.

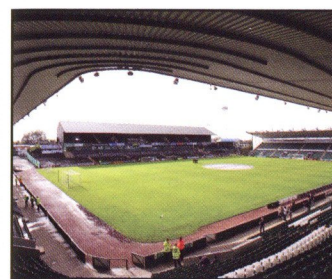
Birmingham paid £5.5m when they signed Dunn from Blackburn in July 2003.

## Simpson agrees new Preston deal

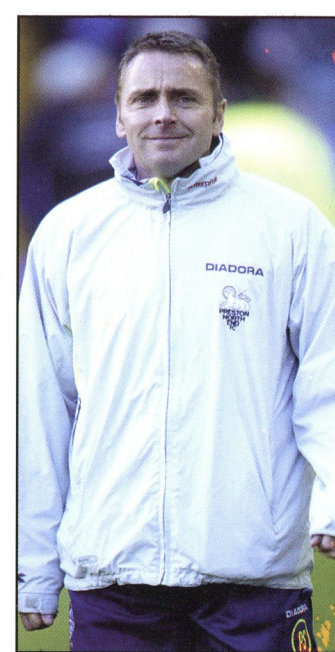
Preston manager Paul Simpson has agreed to extend his contract at the club by two years until 2011.

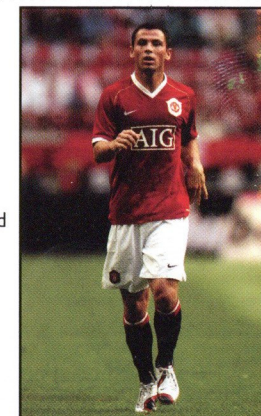
## Bardsley set for Sunderland move

And manager Roy Keane is also keen to sign fellow Old Trafford defender Jonny Evans for the remainder of the season.

But United manager Alex Ferguson has yet to decide whether he will allow Evans to move to the Stadium of Light.

"We could decide to keep him here but if he does go on loan, Sunderland would present the right type of challenge for him," Ferguson told MUTV.

# The other side of the Coyne

**Although always the consummate professional, having to put in extra shifts in the PR department whilst not being able to let off steam on the pitch in the heat of battle must have tested Chris Coyne's patience, lately. Our matchday programme staff caught up with the Aussie just ahead of his return to action**

After meeting the Club captain during the hectic pre-Christmas period, a time in which his already burgeoning schedule of Club commitments goes into overdrive, it was refreshing to meet Chris Coyne in such fine form, as in the last few weeks he has been interviewed, photographed, modelled and then interviewed over and over again to within an inch of his sanity.

And don't forget the extra training he's had to do after missing three months of the season.

Chris's return to the first team over the holiday period has been his well-earned reward for the suffering he's endured by sitting out the majority of this season as he recovered, slowly but surely, from a series of knee operations to correct some problems that flared up last season.

Ever since the dust settled following Luton's fabulous title-winning League One campaign two seasons ago, niggling injuries have prevented the Championship from seeing the best form of the Aussie defender, which must have been a huge source of frustration for him.

"I've been very fortunate throughout my career that I haven't had any serious injuries. I've missed a couple of weeks here and there but it's just been this year where I've had the ongoing problems and I've never had the chance of being fully fit.

"It was frustrating, especially when you are sat in the stands and you hear people starting to moan and you just feel that you're not helping out in any way.

"Now, touch wood, it's a chance to go and prove myself and show what I can do week in, week out at this level."

What is particularly exasperating was that Chris had been struggling with his knees throughout the pre-season programme and then played a series of games through-

out August before one of them flared up again, forcing him out for another few weeks. And after one more attempted comeback in the 4-1 defeat at Cardiff, Chris succumbed to the surgeon's knife once again, knocking him out of action for the best part of three months.

However, Chris is not convinced that the situation could have been handled any better at the time, despite its lack of success.

"I think it would have happened anyway whether it was two or three games or two or three weeks down the line, irrespectively, because there was already damage done from the previous operation not going well for me.

"Hindsight is a wonderful thing but you are never to know with something like that. Now I feel that the right thing has been done and I feel 100%, which is great because I haven't felt that for a while.

"The hardest thing was I had to put the reins on, because I couldn't rush back too soon after what happened last time. It was a matter of doing things right and doing things properly, consulting with the medical team and making sure that I'm back for good, and not back for a quick three games and then out again."

This land of nine month winters may be a far cry from Chris's hometown of Perth, in Western Australia, but he is very much settled in the area these days, and English blood runs through the family generations either side of him, threatening to dilute his true blue Aussie-ness, although Chris admitted that he does get homesick, especially at this time of year.

As much as he loves his game of football, when he signed his first professional contract as a raw 17-year-old there were times when he would have given plenty to swap the freezing fog of London for the freshening breeze of the





Fremantle Doctor.

"It was enjoyable, apart from the homesickness for the first three or four years. I did find it a long way from home and there were massive phone bills coming in every month but I've enjoyed every minute football-wise. It's just the family you miss."

Playing at the youth international level of football (that's our rules, not Aussie) and at state level of youth cricket, Chris was still contemplating which direction in life to take when he was spotted by an intrepid West Ham scout and invited over to London so that the Hammers could take a closer look at him.

"I went away with the Australian Under 17 team and was spotted playing and was asked to go to West Ham for a trial. I was over there for three weeks just before Christmas twelve years ago. Harry Redknapp called me in and said they wanted to offer me a pro contract and I had to move over; and it's been great fun ever since."

Having uprooted and made the move, it was now it was all about getting games – not the easiest thing to do for a rookie defender at a Premiership club packed out with some of the finest young emerging stars of world football, and with a few living legends throw in for good measure.

After a short spell out on loan in League Two, Chris was in the West Ham squad for a crucial match against Leeds United. Just to make it more interesting there was a UEFA Cup place at stake.

Ian Wright, Di Canio, Hasselbaink, Lampard, Joe Cole and Harry Kewell were to name but a few of the quality players on the pitch that day.

It wasn't a great afternoon for the Hammers. They lost 5-1 on their home ground to their bitter rivals and had three players sent off. It was a great day for a young Chris Coyne, though, as he made his Premiership

debut by coming on for the last ten minutes.

Chris wasn't at all fazed being in such esteemed company. It was just business as usual on the training ground after that as far as he was concerned.

"Frank and Rio were in both in my youth team with Joe Cole and Michael Carrick. We had a hell of a youth team, but when you're working week in week out with these players you get on with them and they are your mates.

"They were always superb pros at West Ham. I don't think there were any big time charlies there, just honest, decent hardworking pros. They are household names, yes, but when you work with them they're just your work mates and colleagues."

As is usual when playing for a big club with a big squad, a lot of players have to move on to find regular first team football, and before you could say 'G'day from WA' he had shipped north of the border and was turning out for Dundee in the Scottish Premier League.

"I wasn't sure what I was getting into. I just saw it as another stepping stone, just to stay playing in the game and forge a career for myself.

"When I did eventually get up there I really enjoyed it. Dundee is a fantastic place to live and they were a good bunch of lads, and we were all of a similar age so we all mixed socially together well.

"The football side of it was an experience. Very fast, very hectic but some of the stadiums were magnifi-

cent. It was a great place to play."

A change of management the following season meant that Chris was on his way again, and the rest is history.

"We played Luton pre-season when Joe Kinnear and Mick Harford were here. I came on after about ten minutes and they wanted to bring me down, so they came up and watched another game up there and that was that. I was down in two or three weeks.

"You follow your own path and make your own decisions."

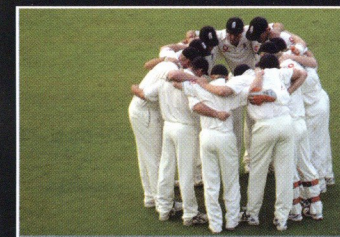

## George Edward DUKE

Southwick born George signed professional forms for the Hatters just before the outbreak of the war whilst still a teenager and built up his experience guesting for several London teams during the hostilities as well as turning out for the Town.

A sound goalkeeper, George was the Town's acknowledged number one at the start of the first post-war season but was then called up for overseas service in the Army. By the time of his return George found that Bernard Streten had made the goalkeeping position his own so he had to be content with reserve team football.

A move to Bournemouth was accepted in 1949 and from there on he went to Guildford, Snowdown CW and Ramsgate. George passed away in 1988.

## Douglas (Dally) DUNCAN

Scotsman Dally had already crammed in a full career by the time he came to Luton as player/coach in October 1946. A pre-War Scottish international, he had starred for Derby as a mercurial winger picking up an FA Cup winners medal along the way. When Luton manager George Martin went to Newcastle in 1947, Dally was asked to take over at Kenilworth Road but soon hung his boots up to concentrate on the job full-time.

He oversaw the Town's rise to Division One in 1955 with a young, keen and talented side and then left in controversial circumstances three years later to join Blackburn who he guided to the 1960 FA Cup final. Following his dismissal from Ewood Park, Dally ran a guest house in Brighton for many years. He died in a Brighton hospital in 1990 aged 80.

## Seamus DUNNE

After a glittering youth career in his native Ireland, Seamus was playing for Shelbourne when the Hatters managed to snap up his services from under the noses of a host of bigger clubs.

After one season in the reserves he earned his first team debut on Boxing Day 1951 and from then went on to break the 300 appearance barrier for his only league club. A fast and strong right back he became a fixture in the Town side for ten years and picked up 15 caps for his country.

After finally leaving Kenilworth Road, Seamus played for three years at Yiewsley and was then player/manager at Dunstable whilst working at Vauxhall. In 1970 a chance to move back to Ireland to work in a chemical plant was too good to turn down and Seamus now lives in retirement in Bray.

## Sean Mark DYCHE

Unable to make the grade at Nottingham Forest, the Kettering born central defender went on a free transfer to Chesterfield in 1990 and soon became a mainstay in the Spireites rearguard and had made over 200 appearances for the Derbyshire club before a £350,000 move to Bristol City in 1997.

Sadly injury problems at Ashton Gate meant the Robins faithful never saw the best of the powerful stopper and he was loaned to Luton in January 1999 and at Kenilworth Road he was able to regain his fitness, confidence and form as well as help the Hatters to escape relegation. With the Town in receivership the funds to purchase Sean could not be found and so he went to Millwall and from there to Watford. Sean is currently turning out for Northampton.

## Akenhaton Carlos EDWARDS

Already an established international for Trinidad and Tobago, Carlos was signed by Wrexham, along with Hector Sam, for £125,000 from Defence Force (Trinidad) in 2000.

Due to skill, pace and trickery, Carlos is able to unsettle the strongest of defences and it was for this reason that Luton manager Mike Newell enticed him to Kenilworth Road in the summer of 2005 just as the Hatters were promoted to the Championship.

Carlos instantly became a crowd pleaser at Kenilworth Road, proving virtually unplayable on occasions, and continues to play regularly for his country with whom he enjoyed a memorable World Cup finals in 2006.



## Richard (Dick) Leonard EDWARDS

Dick was playing for Addmult (Hemel Hempstead) in the South Midland League when the Hatters spotted him and signed him on amateur forms in October 1963. The tough tackling full-back then signed part-time professional forms in June 1964 before making his full debut for the Town on the final day of the 1964/65 season just as the club was relegated to Division Four for the first time in its history.

During the following season Dick signed a full-time contract and was able to make 16 appearances, plus score a goal in the 2-2 draw at Colchester, as the Town tried for promotion at the first attempt. Released at the end of that campaign, along with many others, Dick then signed on for Kettering Town. Dick now lives back in Hemel Hempstead.

## Paul Marcellus ELLIOTT

Paul failed a trial at Luton Town as a striker and signed forms for his local club Charlton instead and converted to a central defender.

With the Hatters needing a strong and commanding centre-half to bolster their defence as they attempted to avoid relegation from the top flight in 1983 they paid a cut price £95,000 to cash strapped Charlton to achieve their aims. Unfortunately Paul broke his leg in a League Cup tie with Leicester in 1984 and by the time of his return the Town had signed Steve Foster. Unable to keep both players happy the Hatters sold Paul to Aston Villa for £400,000 and from there he sampled life in Italy with Pisa and then turned out for Celtic and Chelsea where another bad injury ended his career.

Paul is now a football pundit regularly seen on television.

## Stephen (Steve) Blair ELLIOTT

A true journeyman striker, Steve started off as an apprentice at Nottingham Forest but to get regular football accepted a move to Preston where his career took off.

Managing 70 goals in over 200 League appearances for Preston, Steve hankered after a move up the football ladder but was surprised when a bid from top flight Luton took him to Kenilworth Road in 1984.

Steve knocked in six goals in 15 starts for the Hatters but became surplus to requirements when Luton wanted David Preece from Walsall and the Saddlers insisted on Steve as part of the deal. This move then became one of many for Steve as he continued to bang in the goals for Bolton, Bury, Rochdale and Guiseley. Steve is now a Leisure Centre manager for South Ribble Borough Council.

## Lars ELSTRUP

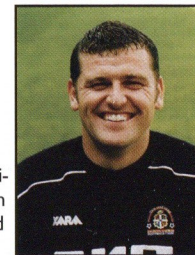
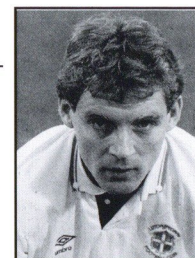
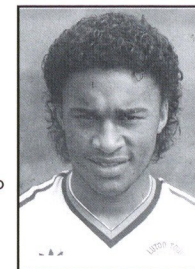
Although Luton Town had dipped into the foreign player market before, the signing of an established Danish international for a club record fee in 1989 took transfers up to a completely different level.

Lars had played for Feyenoord, but established himself with Odense from where he was signed by the Town. His first season at Kenilworth Road was beset by injury but in the 1990/91 campaign supporters could finally see that he was a class act with his speed, intelligence and finishing ability. Sadly, a row over money saw him return to Odense in controversial fashion and within two years he had dropped out of football altogether, changing his name to Darando and joining the anarcho-Buddhist Wild Goose sect. Lars apparently now offers seminars on new age topics!

## Carl Wayne EMBERSON

Epsom born Carl was unable to make an impression at first club Millwall and signed on for Colchester in July 1994 where he became a crowd favourite. At Layer Road he was first choice for most of his five years there as well as being voted 'Man of the Match' in the 'U's play-off final win over Torquay in 1998.

A move to Walsall a year later did not work out and he accepted a transfer to Luton in 2001, initially as understudy to Mark Ovendale, but he soon took over the number one spot as the Town won promotion from Division Three at the first attempt. A good shot stopper, Carl was allowed to move to Southend in 2003 and from there he has appeared for Grays and latterly Sutton.

STEVEN DOVE looks into whether the Premiership has just become so predictable or if the fight for the championship keep the watching public on the edge of their seats.

As the gulf between rich and poor widens in the game, as the elite clubs become bigger and better, we are left with a scenario where the top and bottom of the table are almost a foregone conclusion.

But, the general feeling among most football fans is one of a resigned pessimism - the state of the game is beyond repair having lost the magic and spontaneity which made it so popular and famous.

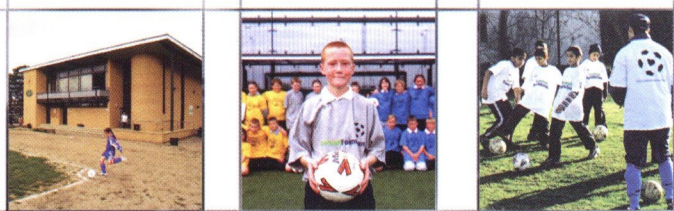

The Red Devils may have swept Aston Villa aside but the 3-0 scoreline certainly flattered them and merely illustrated the ruthless streak that has made Sir Fergie's sides so

As for Arsenal, Arsene Wenger's side have been out gunned by Fulham recently. They conceded again from a corner, tried to create the perfect goal themselves by passing the ball into the net, but were denied by the Cottagers who defended doggedly.

Yet again Monsieur Wenger insisted the Gunners deserved better as if his side's romantic - and wholeheartedly naive - approach somehow merits a win more than the pragmatic style of their rivals.

As they say, the first step to being cured is admitting that you have a problem.

The predictability continues.

Onto Liverpool, whose real failing has been their woeful away form - they have won twice on the road this season, losing five of their nine matches away from Anfield.

Predictably, Benitez's squad have done better in the Champions League as his Spanish brigade seem far more suited to the European game than the hustle-and-bustle of the Premiership.

Yet despite all Arsenal and Liverpool's failings, they are still undoubted favourites to finish in the top four, which merely illustrates the vast chasm inherent in the English game. Tottenham, Aston Villa, Portsmouth and Bolton will all challenge but expect a lack of experience and consistency to halt them.

The middle half of the table does offer some respite from the predictability as the likes of Fulham, Wigan, Manchester City and Newcastle could all find themselves embroiled in a relegation battle or challenge for a European spot.

However, that is heavily down to the fact that there are so few points separating sides in the two halves of the table. Prior to going into the Boxing Day fixtures, only eight points separate Sheffield United in 16th spot and Tottenham in seventh, meaning a few good results can quickly spark a charge up the table.

At the bottom, things are very much the same as at the top. The current bottom two of Charlton and Watford are expected to be the very same two that will head down to the Coca-Cola Championship come May.

Yes, the Addicks' slump has been something of a surprise, but many tipped them to struggle following Alan Curbishley's departure and there is nothing to suggest that they are about to stop the rot.

Of course, nothing is set in stone.

Who knows? We could well be in for a whole store of surprises in the months to come.

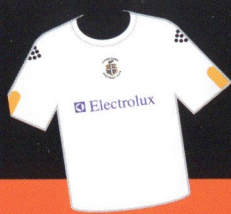
Because while teams like Reading and a resurgent Aston Villa have certainly been a breath of fresh air, their mere presence only serves to underline how stale the Premiership has become.

Luton skipper Chris Coyne said: "It was nice to put a smile on the faces of the children, and the players always look forward to the visit to the hospital each year.

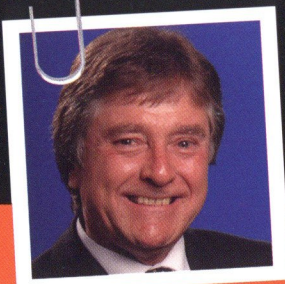
"It is a difficult time of the year for these children and we are happy to help make their Christmas celebrations a little bit special."

## From the *Media*

**When Luton made the trip to Cardiff in September, it wasn't a happy day for Luton supporters as reporter Bill Cole explains.**

**T**he trip to Cardiff in September was bad enough for Hatters followers with the M4 closed, but the day became even worse for Luton's recent recruit, Lewis Emanuel.

Released by Bradford in the summer, he earned a contract by impressing Mike Newell and Brian Stein in pre-season training with his hard working performances, which has proved to be a real asset in the Championship this season.

However, Emanuel's visit to South Wales was to last a mere eight minutes, through no real fault of his own.

City's first attack produced a Joe Ledley corner and a Ricky Scimeca bullet header that was blocked on the line. Referee Paul Melin waved

play on, but a flag-waving assistant much further away from the incident, insisted on a penalty and off trudged Emanuel as a consequence.

Looking the player straight in the eye after the game, I am sure he was truthful in saying that the powerful, close range header took a deflection off Sol Davis onto his forearm as he instinctively protected his face. And Scimeca himself sportingly said in an interview that he appealed more in hope than expectation.

A goal and a player down, Luton's plight got worse with Sol Davis (their only other left sided player on view) pulling up lame. After a scare or two, it was no surprise when Paul Parry stayed out wide right to collect and neatly shoot across Marlon Beresford for 2-0.

But the Hatters refused to wilt and deserved Rowan Vine's fine run and shot that sent them in a single goal adrift at the interval. And they went on to do so well after the break that Cardiff journalists near me commented that it was the Blues that looked a man short - not Luton.

Perhaps the Town became a bit too ambitious because they were caught short at the back by a hopeful ball forward, that Steve Thompson headed back across goal and Michael Chopra did the necessary.

Amidst some very strange decisions from Mr Melin, two close efforts each from Carlos Edwards, Leon Barnett and Richard Langley really should have closed the gap, but instead a fast break saw Malvin Kamara centre for Chopra to add another and it finished 4-1.

When I asked City Manager David Jones what he thought about Luton collecting one red and four yellow cards from Mr Melin, when committing just nine fouls in the whole game, none of them malicious, his advice was "I can see why you're sick, go home and kick the dog".

My dog hopes that the luck evens out today.

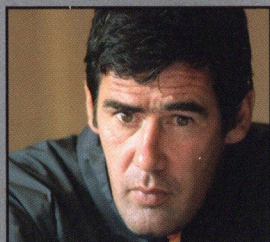

Barnsley make the long trek south to Luton for an all important six pointer in January, with both clubs desperate to pull away from the relegation zone. After a promising start to the season with two away wins in their first three matches the Reds have failed to win away since August.

Barnsley were 3 - 0 up at half time with Chris Stuker, Curtis Davies (og) and Michael Chopra all finding the net. Enoch Showunmi scored a consolation goal and Marlon Beresford saved a penalty, but to rub salt into the wounds Chris Coyne was sent off after a rash challenge.

The players to watch include the Reds top hitman this season Brian Howard who has scored six from midfield so far. Michael McIndoe, currently on loan at Wolves, has five under his belt, as does journeyman striker Marc Richards and ex-Norwich player Paul Hayes.

With both teams looking to add as many league places between them and the drop zone, it should prove to be an interesting afternoon's football. Let's hope the Hatters repeat their earlier success!

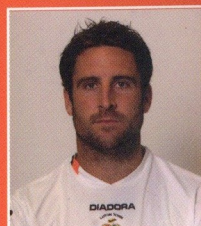
