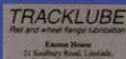

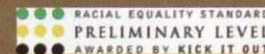

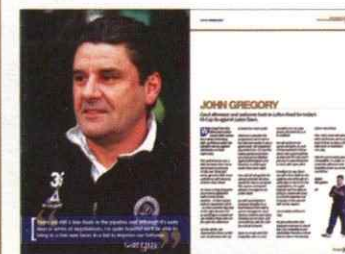

programme. Unfortunately we didn't have enough room for all of them, but you can see them all by logging on to www.qpr.co.uk.

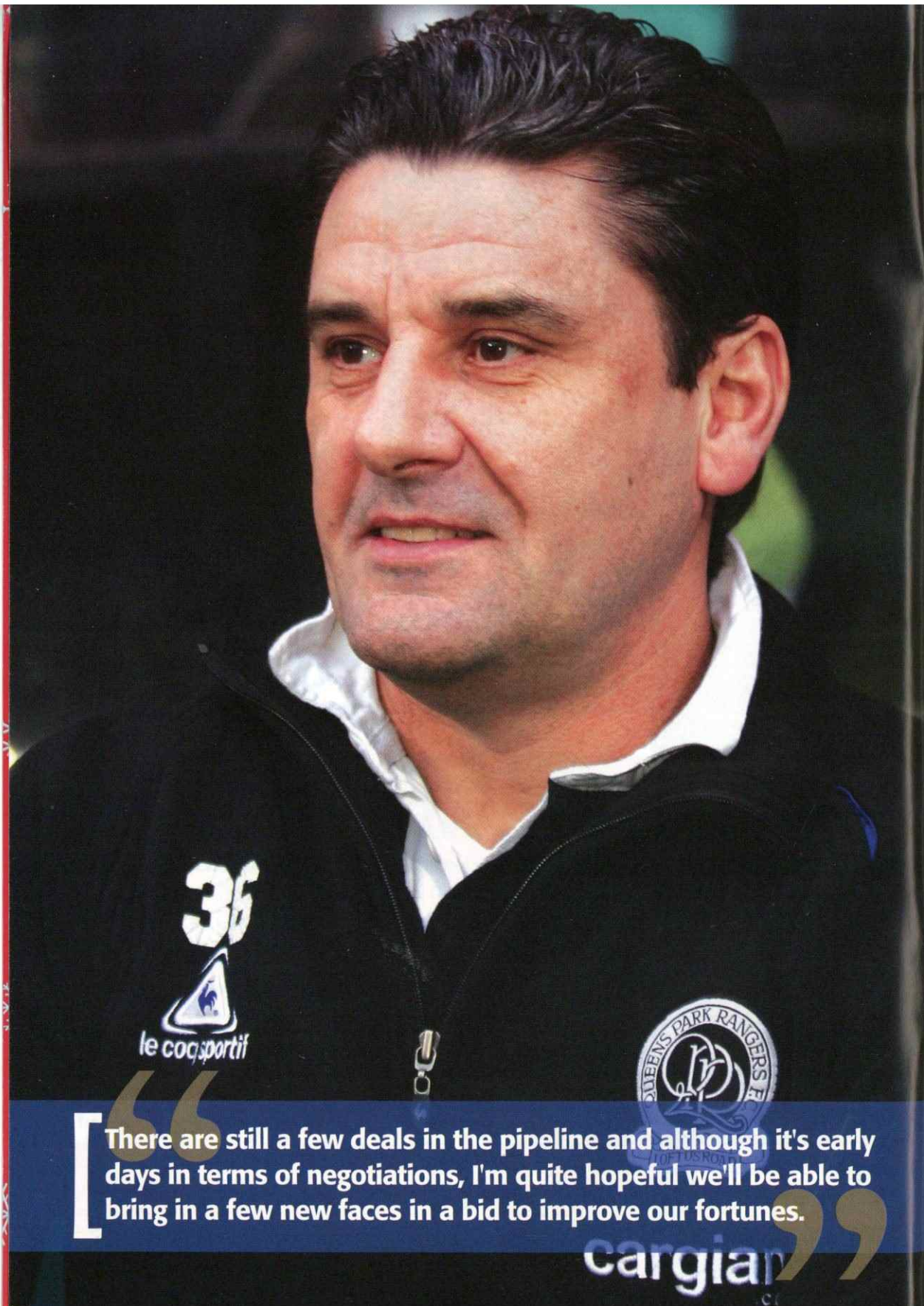
Elsewhere in today's edition of Hoops, John Gregory and Kevin Gallen speak about Monday's win over Colchester and we have all the latest news from the transfer window.

We head into this afternoon's third round clash versus the Hatters brimming with confidence after the valuable victory against Colchester on New Year's Day.

The performance was a little bit better than those we've been producing of late and obviously we've gained a little more confidence with keeping another clean sheet.

It's been a long, long time since we've registered back to back home victories - in fact it dates back to September 2005 - so that's another big step in the right direction for us and fingers crossed we can make it three wins on the spin this afternoon.

Needless to say, there are still a few deals in the pipeline and although it's early days in terms of the negotiations, I'm quite hopeful we'll be able to bring in a few new faces in a bid to improve our fortunes in the second half of the season.

It's about time this club enjoyed a nice run in one of the Cup competitions and what better incentive is there than to draw a Premiership

club in round four.

The 1982 Final will remain with me forever and a day and I'd love to take a QPR side back to Wembley one day.

QPR SIGN SAMPSA TIMOSKA

Q PR have completed the free transfer signing of MyPa utility-man Sampsa Timoska.

The 27 year-old Finland international has put pen to paper on an 18 month contract with the Club.

Rated highly in his homeland having accrued a wealth of experience in the UEFA Champions League, UEFA Cup and Finnish Veikkausliiga,

Timoska is set to go straight into the R's squad for the FA Cup third round tie against Luton Town on Saturday afternoon, subject to receiving international clearance.

Gaffer John Gregory revealed his delight at securing the services of the versatile international: "He's a neat and tidy footballer, who is very versatile and can play across the back four, or in midfield.

"He will enhance our squad and gives us a bit of improvement in those areas. He's a good athlete as well."

A centre half by trade, Timoska - who has built a healthy reputation with his performances in the Finnish Veikkausliiga over the past few years - is also capable of playing at full-back and midfield.

Timoska will wear the number 27 shirt vacated by Adam Czerkas.



TRANSFER TALK



Q PR have parted company with defender Ian Evatt by mutual consent.

The 25 year-old - who has spent the last five months with League One outfit Blackpool - joined QPR from Chesterfield on a three year deal in the summer of 2005.

The no-nonsense defender

put pen to paper in Majorca, after Bill Power and Gianni Paladini flew out to meet up with their man.

An undisclosed fee was agreed with the Spireites and Evatt signed a contract with the R's until 2008.

However, after falling out of favour with former boss Ian Holloway, Evatt fell down the pecking order in W12 and after being placed on the transfer list by Holloway's replacement, Gary Waddock, he eventually joined Blackpool on loan.

Q PR have extended the loan deal of Tommy Doherty to Wycombe Wanderers until the end of the season.

The midfield terrier will remain a Chairboy until May 5, but will still have a year to run on his initial three year deal with QPR.

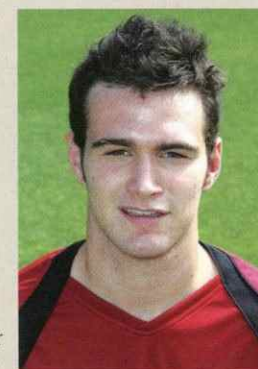
Doherty has made 11 starts since joining Wycombe in September, but also amassed two red cards.

The deal means that Doherty will be available for Saturday's game against Rochdale.

DAMION STEWART

Jamaican-born defender Damion Stewart is only too aware of the tradition and history associated with the FA Cup.

After a brief spell of believing 'the magic of the FA Cup' was little more than a myriad of clichés mixed with hazy nostalgia, the symbolism of the prestigious competition finally hit home for football fans all around the globe last season.

Rafael Benitez's Liverpool side - inspired by the magnificent Steven Gerrard - conjured up the sort of comeback that will be forever associated with the greatest domestic Cup knockout competition in the world.

It was a point not lost on the ever-improving Rangers defender.

"Last seasons final was a classic," Stewart told Hoops.

"Gerrard's goal was brilliant

and the penalties at the end were nail-biting for both sets of supporters.

"That's what FA Cup football is all about."

'Stew Peas' as he's affectionately known to his team-mates, grew up watching the coveted competition in his homeland of Jamaica.

"I remember sitting in front of the TV and watching the Cup.

"There was always a huge interest in Jamaica when the football came on, but the FA Cup was extra special."

Yet despite having lived the dream of playing in the FA Cup - for former club Bradford City in November

2005 - this afternoon's third round clash with Luton has an added ingredient for the no-nonsense defender.

"The FA Cup is an amazing competition and getting a home tie in round three is all we could ask for.

"It's a huge competition and gets much more interest than the Carling Cup.

"It doesn't matter who you draw in the Cups, because they are one-off games and anything can happen - although having said that, it will be nice to get one over Richard Langley."

Indeed, Langley and Stewart - despite not crossing paths at club level - are good friends from the time the pair have spent together with the Jamaican national team.

Stewart joked: "My job as a defender is to defend, but I love a battle and i'm relishing the challenge that playing against Richard will pose for me today."

"We're not having the best of seasons in the league, so a nice Cup run would provide a decent distraction from the Coca Cola Championship."

Since putting pen to paper on a three year contract last summer, Stewart has made 28 appearances in all competitions for the R's, scoring two goals.

And although he readily admits he found life in the Coca Cola Championship tough early on, he's finally beginning to flourish in an ever-improving centre-back partnership alongside Michael Mancienne.

"For me personally, I'm pleased with my own form, but the focus is on the team getting positive results."

"It took me a while to settle into the Championship. It's far more competitive than League One - anyone can beat anyone on their day - and there's a lot more football played."

"But I feel I'm improving all the time and Michael and I compliment each other very well. It's still very early days in terms of our partnership, but we're working on it in training and the best is yet to come from us."

R's fans will be praying that Stewart and Mancienne get the chance to prove their worth in round four.

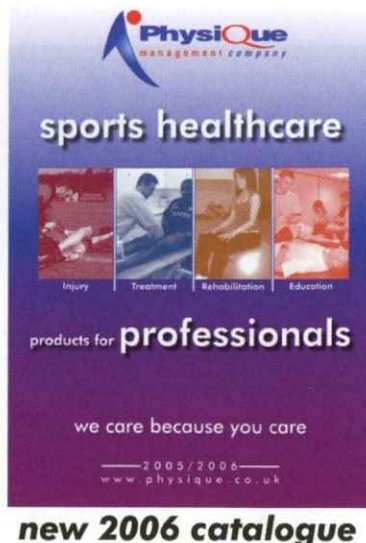

We decided to rest him for the New Year's Day fixture against Colchester United at Loftus Road and at the time of writing, he's responding well to the intensive treatment

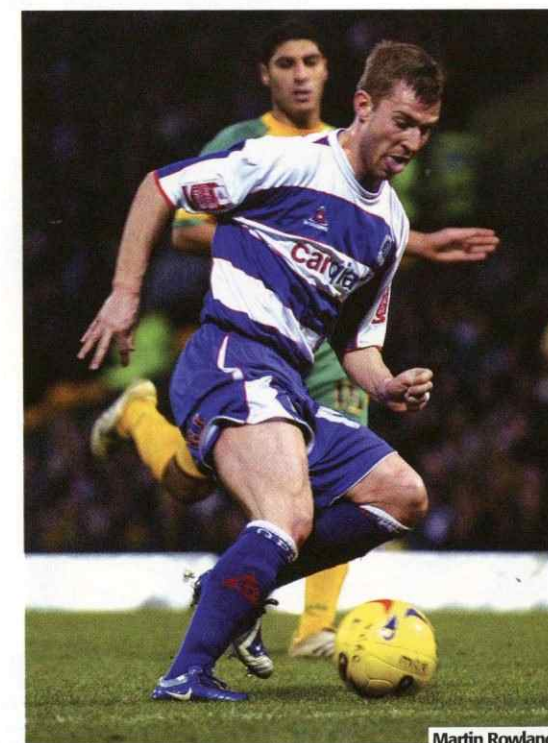
he's receiving.

LUTON TOWN

It's FA Cup time again today - as the R's lock horns with Luton Town in third round proper of the greatest Cup knockout competition in the world.

The Hatters Championship campaign has taken more twists and turns than a white-knuckle rollercoaster ride - so who knows what's in store this afternoon?

If the previous meeting between the two sides is anything to go by, you can guarantee one thing - there will be goals, goals, goals!

Trailing 2-1 at half-time at Kenilworth Road in mid-November, the R's produced a stunning second half comeback to win 3-2.

The last FA Cup meeting

between the two clubs in 2000/01 also produced a hatful of goals, with the R's eventually booking their place in round four after a replay at Loftus Road.

The first tie ended 3-3, after Gavin Peacock held his nerve to notch a last gasp penalty for the R's.

Two goals down at the break, Rangers responded in style in the second half,

with Peter Crouch bagging a brace inside five second half minutes.

Undeterred, the Hatters hit back courtesy of a Stuart Douglas goal, only for Peacock to have the final say from the spot in stoppage time.

There were more late heroics from the R's in the replay, when - trailing to

Lee Mansell's first minute goal - Chris Kiwomya sent the tie into extra time with a 90th minute equaliser.

Buoyed by his goal, Kiwomya was in the right place at the right time again in extra-time, sending the R's into round four and in doing so, breaking Luton hearts.

The fairytale ended

in round four though, when free-scoring Arsenal hit Rangers for six, in a season which ended with the R's being relegated from the Championship.

STAR MAN: SOL DAVIS - Defender

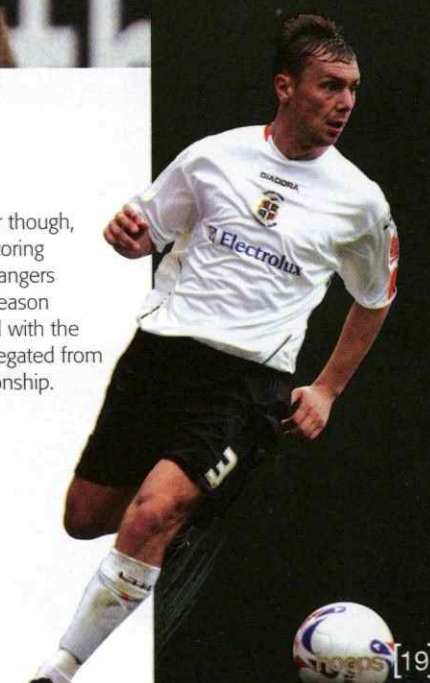
Less than two months after suffering a stroke, defender Sol Davis is back in the Luton starting XI.

The 27 year-old had a stroke on the Luton team coach on the way to a game at Ipswich in late October.

It was initially thought it could take him up to six months to fully recover, but he's defied the odds to return ahead of schedule.

Davis signed for the Hatters in the summer of 2002, after his contract with Swindon Town expired.

It proved to be a superb signing for the Hatters, with Davis going on to make over 150-plus appearances in all competitions.

BEST OF THE REST:

**MARLON BERESFORD** > Goalkeeper

Mike Newell strengthened his squad with the signing of 6'1" goalkeeper Marlon Beresford from League One rivals Barnsley in July 2004. The 34-year-old - who has over 400 professional appearances under his belt - has recently fallen behind Portsmouth loanee Dean Kiely in the Hatters pecking order. However, Kiely is unavailable this afternoon.

KEVIN FOLEY > Defender

A talented full-back who came through the junior ranks at Kenilworth Road, Kevin Foley made his Hatters debut in October 2002 and has since gone on to make over 100 appearances for the Club. Foley - who is a Republic of Ireland Under-21 international - was a key member of the Luton side that won the League One Championship in the 2004/05 season.

**LEON BARNETT** > Defender

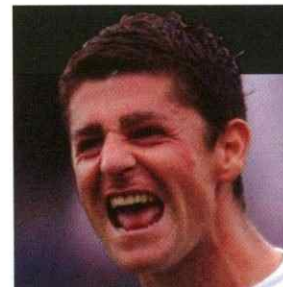
Local lad Leon Barnett made a great impression in a record breaking first season of full-time training at the club, making his senior debut at the tender age of just 16. A versatile player, his preferred position in centre half, although he is adept at full-back.

**LEWIS EMANUEL** > Defender

Lewis Emanuel arrived at Kenilworth Road in the summer of 2006 after deciding to leave his home town club, Bradford City. A pacey full-back who can also operate on the left flank, Emanuel made over 150 appearances for the Bantams, scoring four goals.

**RICHARD LANGLEY** > Midfielder

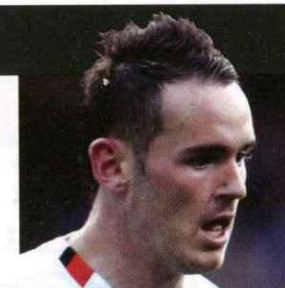
Former Hoop Richard Langley signed for Luton Town on a free transfer in July 2006. A hard working midfielder, Langley figured in the previous FA Cup tie between the two sides in 2001. Langley required three stitches to a head wound after the New Year's Day draw with Cardiff City at Kenilworth Road, but should be fit to face his former side today.

**STEVE ROBINSON** > Midfielder

Hatters fans favourite Steve Robinson continues to flourish in the heart of the Luton midfield engine room. Looking to add experience to a relatively young midfield, Luton splashed out £50,000 to Preston North End to secure his services in the summer of 2002. And he's repaid that fee in style, producing one solid display after another for Mike Newell's side.

DAVID BELL > Midfielder

Talented young midfielder David Bell signed a three and a half year contract with the Hatters in January 2006, after penning a deal from Rushden & Diamonds. A Republic of Ireland international at Under-19 and Under-21 level, Bell is earmarked for a very bright future at Kenilworth Road.

**AHMET BRKOVIC** > Midfielder

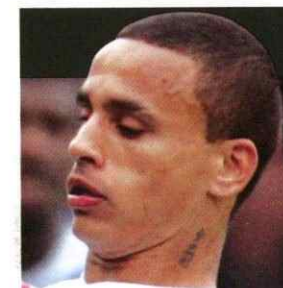
A tidy and hardworking midfielder, Ahmet Brkovic was an inspiration in the Hatters' success in League One two years ago. Ideally suited to a right midfield berth, Brkovic is equally comfortable on the left, a position he filled on many occasions last season.

**ROWAN VINE** > Striker

The Basingstoke born striker initially joined Luton on a three month loan deal from Premiership outfit Portsmouth, before penning a three year contract. A prolific goalscorer throughout his career, Vine has already hit double figures this season.

**DEAN MORGAN** > Striker

Dean Morgan became a firm favourite with the Hatters faithful after his 90th minute winner against Southampton in August 2005. Morgan moved to Kenilworth Road in July 2005 after seeing his opportunities limited at the Madjeski Stadium.

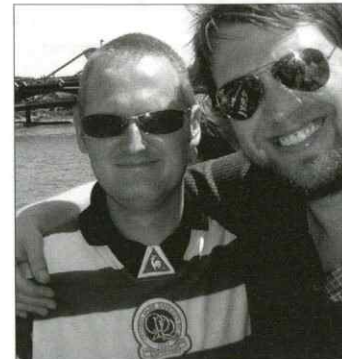

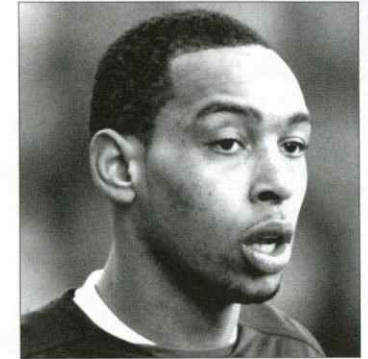

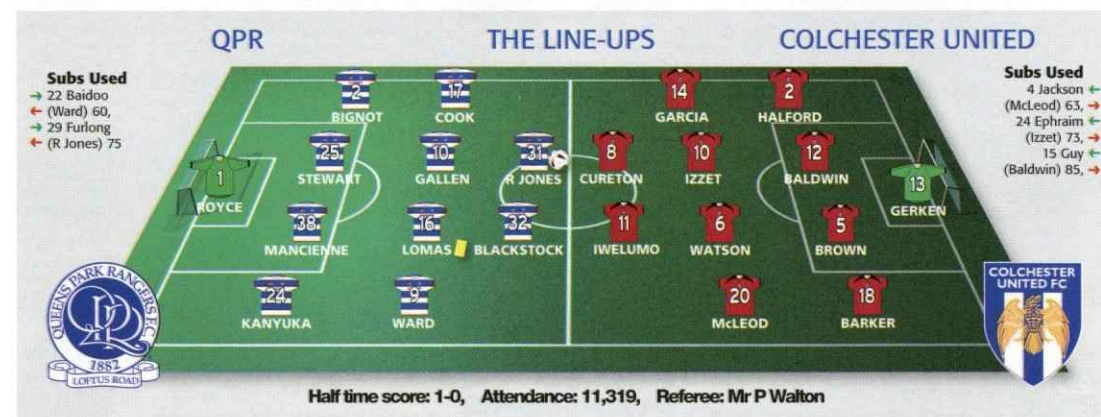

Rangers hit the woodwork and had numerous shots saved by U's custodian Dean Gerken, in what was an encouraging start to 2007 for the R's.

John Gregory made three changes to the side which succumbed to a 1-0 defeat at Carrow Road two days earlier.

Pat Kanyuka, Nick Ward and Dexter

Blackstock were all recalled to the starting XI, as Mauro Milanese, Martin Rowlands (injured) and Paul Furlong made way.

The Hoops led 1-0 at the break courtesy of Jones' towering header.

Arriving on to Lee Cook's inviting cross, the teenage striker directed a superb glancing header into the top right hand corner of the net.

Jamie Cureton - playing against his former club - twice went close at the end of the first half, but it was Rangers who came out all guns blazing at the start of the second period.

BBC London 94.9's Tom Watt cast his eye over this week's Capital football.

I'll spare you the clichés about this competition. And that's not an easy promise to make, I assure you. I get as misty-eyed as the next sentimental old git about the first weekend in January and the third round of the Cup.

Suffice it to say, we're the only country in the world with an occasion anything like it. We might, these days, undervalue the thing ourselves but it's worth remembering that, everywhere else, they get more excited about the old tin pot and its history than they do about their own domestic knock-out tournaments.

It's pretty obvious where the headline writers will be looking for their material this weekend: at the Keepmoat Stadium, where Doncaster

play Bolton; at the Lamb Ground, where Tamworth play Norwich; at Plainmoor, where Torquay play Southampton; at the City Ground, where Forest play Charlton; and at Stamford Bridge, where Macclesfield will be paying all their bills thanks to a game against the wealthiest club in the world.

There are a clutch of fixtures which guarantee Premiership clubs will fall by the wayside, too. Not least the televised game at Anfield where Arsenal and Liverpool will field their first teams before the reserves and youths meet each other in the Carling Cup in midweek.

Rangers Luton? Hands up if it wasn't a draw that exactly got your pulse racing. When it comes to the Cup, all you ask for is a tie against someone from

outside your division, isn't it? Premiership opponents offer the chance of an upset and a guarantee you'll make a few bob. You go into a game against a team from a lower division, on the other hand, believing it's one you can win on the way to a money-spinning TV date next time around. A third round tie against another team from the Championship just promises to be hard work. Why should a game against one of your peers in the Cup be any different from one against them in the league? It's not as if winner-take-all promises a different kind of contest: one of the qualities of the Championship is that everybody has a proper go against everybody else anyway.

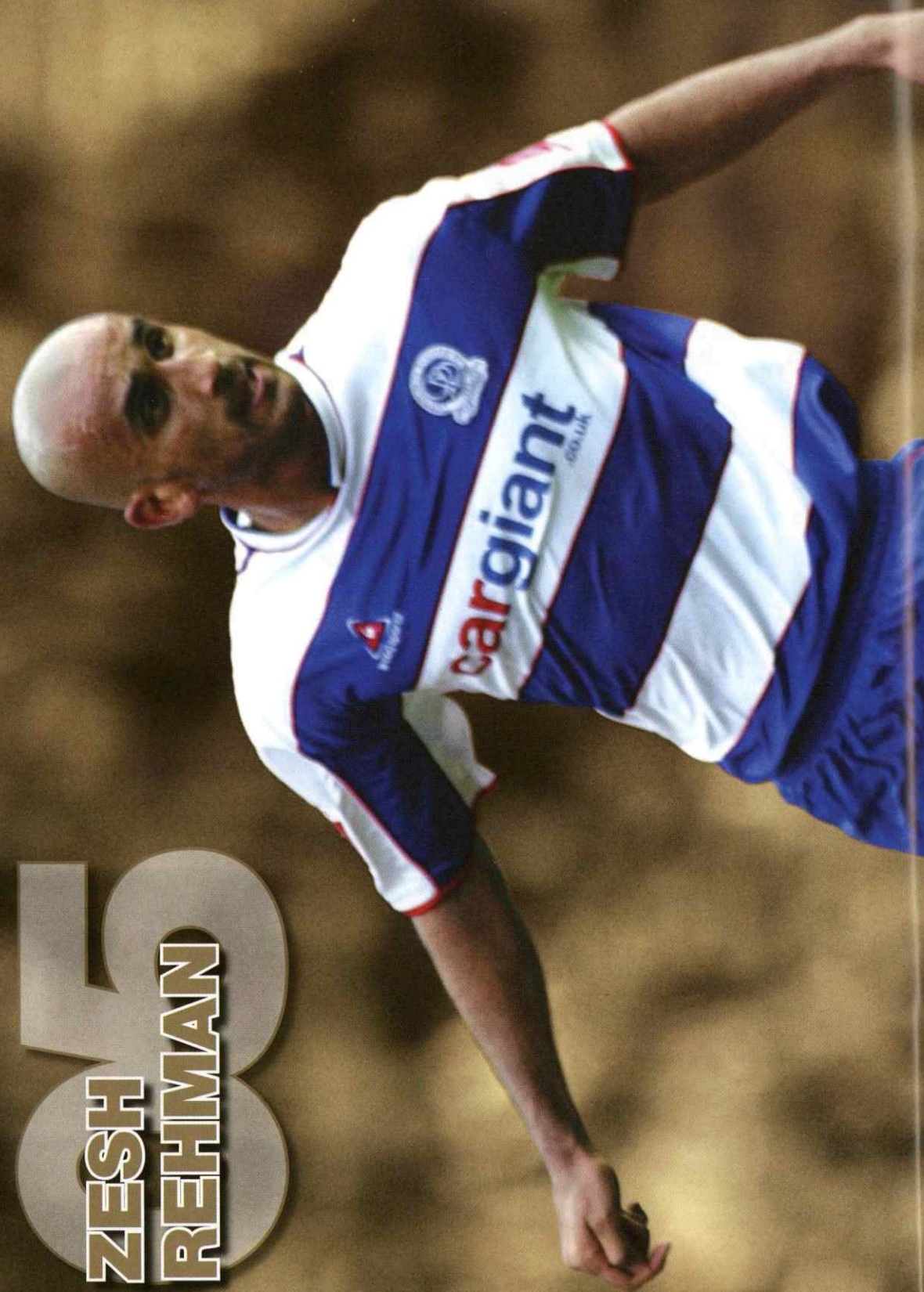
Today at Loftus Road might be different, though.

TERRY FENWICK 1980 - 1988

Ian Taylor takes a step back in time to the 1982 FA Cup Final with QPR legend Terry Fenwick

He will forever be remembered for scoring *that* goal in the 1982 FA Cup Final.

Terry Fenwick achieved legendary status when he became the first full-back to score from open play at Wembley, when he headed past Ray Clemence in the 115th minute on May 22nd 1982.

The rest of the script might not have gone quite according to plan, but for Fenwick, it's a moment he'll cherish for the rest of his life.

As I interview him on the phone from his home in Trinidad & Tobago - where he is now a coach at Jabloteh FC - it becomes blatantly apparent that he remembers each and every fine detail of the R's

fairytale run to the Final. "We did it the hard way in the first two rounds," he told Hoops.

"From recollection, Middlesbrough was viewed as a tough third round draw.

"They were a hardworking side. The first game was a real battle, but after grinding out a draw, we eventually triumphed in the replay."

Rangers were drawn away against Blackpool in round four.

A goalless draw in the first match resulted in a replay at Loftus Road, which the R's won 5-1 thanks to goals from Clive Allen (4) and Simon Stainrod.

"Blackpool was a tough place to go in those days too and we were quite content with a 0-0 draw

at their place.

"The conditions were dreadful that afternoon. The wind was so strong - it was a dreadful game spoilt by the conditions.

"We got them back to our place and gave them a good hiding, with Clive scoring four. It was nice to score five and give the fans something to cheer."

Rangers' fifth round opponents were Grimsby, who coincidentally had visited Loftus Road seven days earlier in the league.

John Gregory got the only goal of the game that day and buoyed by that result, the R's made short work of the Mariners in the Cup, winning 3-1 thanks to goals from Allen, Stainrod and Eddie Howe.

"Grimsby was one we expected to win and we did.

"Clive and Stan (Simon Stainrod) were in fantastic form and when they scored, we generally won games."

The fifth round draw was kind to Rangers, with Crystal Palace making the short journey across London to Loftus Road.

Allen continued his fantastic form in front of goal with the only goal of the game - booking the R's place in their first ever semi-final and edging Rangers one step closer to Wembley.

"Palace was a typical local derby - hard fought and gritty, with the added ingredient of it being against my former club.

"Budgie (John Burridge), Clive and I had all played for

Palace in the past so we were obviously keen to get one over them.

"Palace were flying at the time, but we were the better side on the day and deserved the victory."

The semi-final against West Bromwich Albion at Highbury - the home of Arsenal - was a mouth-watering prospect.

"The semi-final was a very hard, physical match, but tactically we got it spot on," recalls Fenwick.

"They had a few big-hitters, but we fought like lions and defended superbly on the day.

"Tony Currie played in a different role than usual, but he was outstanding. Big Bob Hazell was top class too up against Cyrille Regis."

With the clock ticking towards the 76th minute mark and the match seemingly destined for extra-time, Albion defender Ally Robertson tried to clear the ball from his six-yard box, only for Allen to interject and deflect the ball into the back of the net.

"The goal was maybe a bit fortuitous, but we won our battles all over the park and that proved to be the difference between the two sides."

And so on to Wembley and a meeting with Spurs,

who had eased past Leicester City in the last four.

"Spurs had been there the year before and won it, so they were massive favourites on the day," Fenwick told Hoops.

"We were underdogs in the extreme and anything we achieved on the day was a bonus really."

Trailing to Glenn Hoddle's deflected extra-time goal, Rangers looked down and out, but there was still life in them yet.

"We matched ourselves up well against very good opponents.

"I thought the goal we conceded was a fortunate one. We could have maybe done a bit more to close Hoddle down, but the deflection killed us.

"We showed a lot of resolve thereafter though, and thank god we got that goal."

'And it's there, and it's Fenwick, and it's 1-1' - the dulcet tones from commentator Brian Moore will remain with QPR fans forever and a day.

'A great leap there by Hazell and there's the goal. Terry Fenwick, only his sixth goal of the season, but what a jump it was in the first place by the big number five, Bob Hazell.'

Fenwick recalls the moment

as if it were yesterday.

"Stan wound up for the big throw in and he just got that little bit extra to it and I remember Bob rising and getting that all so important flick on.

"I slipped in between the centre-back and Paul Miller to head it over Clem and between his arms.

"He was gutted and tried to give me a dig before I wheeled away in celebration."

The celebrations which followed will remain with Rangers fans forever and a day - and Fenwick is no different.

"It was an incredible feeling to score at Wembley, especially at such a crucial stage in the Cup Final.

"It was amazing. It was as if the script had already been written, because as I raced away to celebrate, I was running straight to the area of the ground where all my family and friends were sitting.

"It was the perfect place to score. It was just a natural reaction to scoring and to celebrate with my family was excellent.

"I cried my eyes out at full-time. I was only 21 and I was proud of myself. I thought I stood up very well against a superb Tottenham side."

Unfortunately, there was to

be no crowning glory for the R's in the replay five days later, as a sixth minute Hoddle spot-kick gave Spurs the Cup.

"I thought we were by far the better side in the replay and should have won the game.

"Their failure to finish us off in the first game was a mental blow to them. The press got on their backs as soon as the first match finished.

"But Glenn never misses from the spot and the rest is history."

It could have been a far different story though, had Fenwick been awarded what he still describes to this day as a 'blatant' second half spot-kick.

"I'm convinced that had it been at the other end, the referee would have listened to his linesman and given the penalty.

"There was never any doubt in my mind, but the referee thought otherwise."

Any regrets then?

"It was a huge highlight in my career - not many players get the opportunity to play in the FA Cup Final.

"At that time the FA Cup Final was the be all and end all in the sporting calendar, both here and abroad, and it's a period of my life I recall with great fondness."

MEMORABLE MATCHES

Queens Park Rangers from the Second Division responding to the brave excellence of a 22 year old goalkeeper who began this season in the reserves, refused to be broken by a goal sickeningly deflected into his net in the second half of extra time, and came back to claim an equaliser that sends them forward to contest this FA Cup Final all over again at Wembley next Thursday.

Peter Hucker is 6 ft 4 in tall and weighs 13 stone, and he deployed his bulk to such athletic and inspired purpose between the Rangers posts, that Spurs found themselves in need of deadly finishers on a day when they had none. That combination of Hucker's resistance and the last-stride aberrations

of the attackers crowding in on him, particularly the flawed shooting of otherwise splendid Steve Archibald, kept the teams level for 109 minutes on an afternoon that Tottenham's greater depth of experience and ability might have turned into a parade.

When they did score, their goal had so much of the fortuitous about it that it could have shattered Rangers. Not only was the referee an accidental but serious obstacle to Waddock, but when Hoddle shot (after exchanging passes with Roberts) the ball spun off the inside of Currie's leg and took a course that ruined Hucker's chances of interfering.

Yet Rangers, in spite of being aware that they had come near to being killed

off earlier in the first Cup Final they have ever played, now rose above a blow that would have demoralised much bigger battalions.

When Fenwick powerfully headed in the equaliser after a long throw by Stainrod and a back header from Hazell, it was a fine reward for the defiant spirit of Hucker, and for the exemplary leadership of Roeder, who hardly deserves the frustration of missing the replay because of suspension. Micklewhite took special honours along with Waddock, but praise was due to all who battled on against growing evidence that losing was their destiny. The draw was good news too, of course, for the veteran Currie, who made himself more relevant in midfield after the interval, and for the appealing Manager of Rangers, Terry Venables, whose chirpy assertion that his men would win on Thursday surprised no one.

Roberts was hustling aggressively in the middle of the field and, although the little red-haired Irishman Waddock was effectively reducing Hoddle's dramatic talent on view, that disappointment for Spurs was balanced by Currie's tendency to drop so deep that Hazzard was able to thrust forward as an additional menace to Hucker.

Rangers were spurred by Micklewhite's arrival in the 52nd minute into producing their best



attacks of the match so far. Gregory was right to castigate himself after his header squandered a fine centre from the substitute and both Flanagan and Waddock shot too high after excellent approach play initiated by Currie.

When Archibald steered the ball to Crooks's feet on the left, that usually efficient finisher should have done much better than hoist it over the crossbar.

Crooks sought to compensate by releasing Archibald even more comprehensively but Hucker, sprinting off his line, lunged to his right and pushed the shot wide for a corner. The goalkeeper was equally marvellous soon afterwards when he saved painfully at Perryman's feet after another splendid pass by Hoddle.

There was still more outstanding work from Hucker to thwart Hoddle

but as the 90 minutes ended it was Stainrod's volley that forced a diving interception from Clemence.

The second half of extra time had scarcely begun when Brooke announced his presence with a 25-yard drive that Hucker edged over his crossbar. Much worse was to come for the goalkeeper and everyone identified with Queens Park Rangers in the 109th minute of action. Waddock's challenge for the ball against Hoddle was impeded by the proximity of the referee and as the Rangers player fell injured, Hoddle was able to move on and exchange passes with Roberts. After collecting the return Hoddle had to reach in a hurry for the shot and was almost on his haunches when he delivered it with his right foot, but a deflection off Currie's leg made the blow deadly and the ball skidded beyond

Hucker's right side. Few teams could have kept a belief in a good result after that but Queens Park Rangers, to their immense credit, certainly did. Within six minutes they were level and Wembley was looking forward to its second Cup Final replay in two years. The goal that took Rangers towards that extra chance had its beginning in a long throw near the corner flag on the left. Stainrod's throw was back-headed at the near post by Hazell and the ball rose in a high arc across the six yard box and into the path of Fenwick whose header slammed the ball into the top of the net and everyone knew that the day's decisive work had been done.

The first half was exciting,

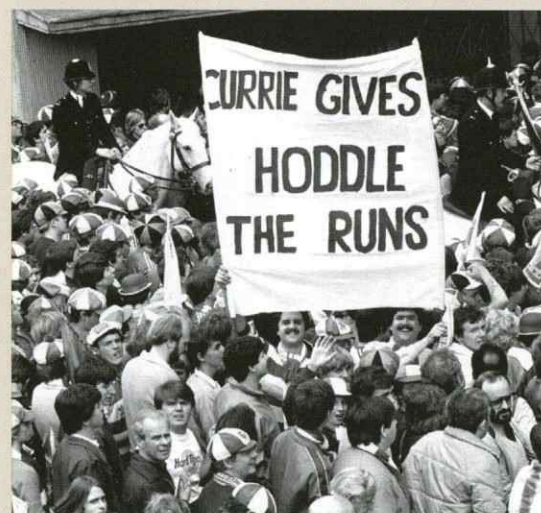

He then turned to me and said: "That's enough, I was going to save these for the end of the day," and pulled out two tickets each for the big day. We were both gob smacked and could only say thank you as we left the office with red faces.

I will always be thankful to Ron Phillips. I took my dad to Wembley that May, we had a great time and I will never forget it.

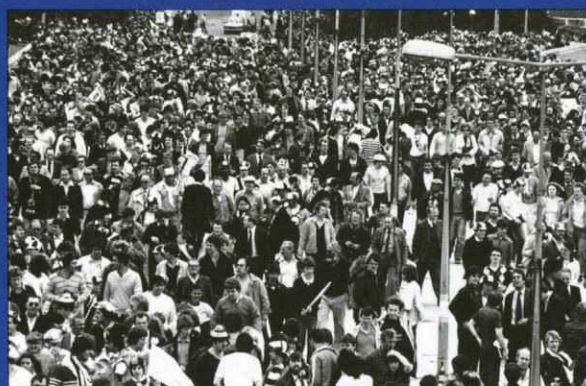

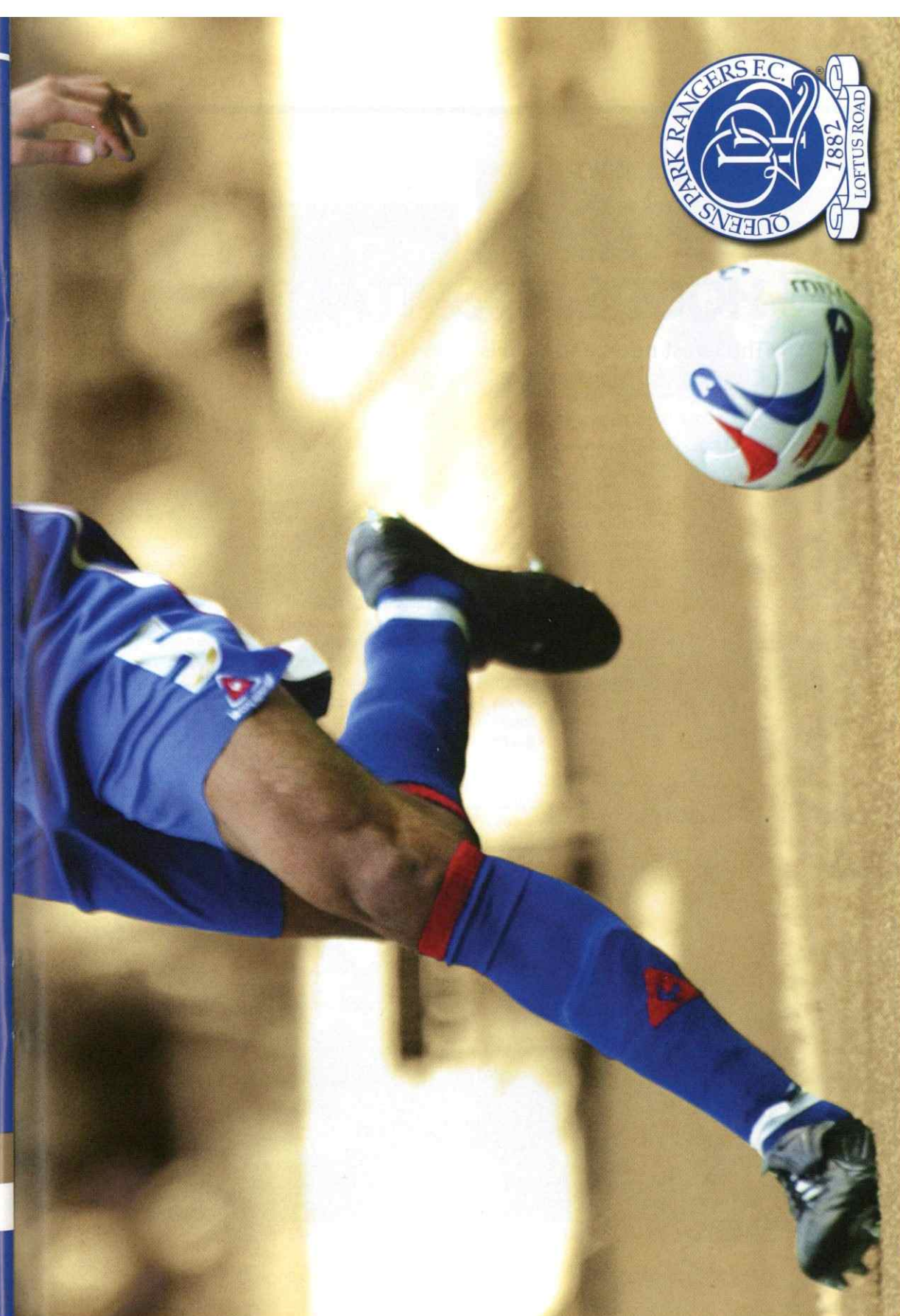

A HALFWAY POINT REVIEW OF THE SEASONS PROGRESS

This week we caught up with manager Martino Chevannes to get his thoughts on the team's season to date, along with assessing the ladies chances of gaining promotion to the Premier League.

He said: "On the whole, I feel that we have had a very good first half of the season, bearing in mind that we have started with a new squad who to their credit have gelled remarkably well and quickly.

"A lot of people thought that I was taking a massive gamble by making wholesale changes to the squad just prior to the start of the season, but I think that our achievements so far along with our current league position justifies my decisions."

"The league table doesn't lie; we are top of the league on merit. The players have worked extremely hard and put in some great performances to get us there, now they are going to have to work even harder in the second half of the season to stay there.

"Neither I nor my assistant Anthony Smith could have asked any more of them or could have wished to be in a better position at this stage, although we were both very disappointed at the manner in which we lost our unbeaten record in the game against Swindon Town.

"It was a performance where the whole team let themselves and us down badly and I make this point as I want them to learn from it and ensure that we never play like that again for the remainder of the season.

"We have eleven games to go and it is going to be a big ask of the players to remain top until the end of the season. But I sincerely feel that we are more than capable of doing it if we go out there with the right attitude, work rate and desire week in week out.

"It's in our own hands and we need to keep it that way by taking one game at a time and not thinking too far ahead. It's important for us to remain committed, focused and consistent as well as coming away from games with three points in the bag.

"It will be important that we get off to a good start after the Christmas break as it can sometimes have an adverse effect on performances in those first few weeks. The players need to remain confident and believe in each other as well as in their own ability.

"As we speak I am actively trying to bring in another couple of new faces to improve the squad and add that much needed strength in depth that every manager likes to have at his or her disposal."

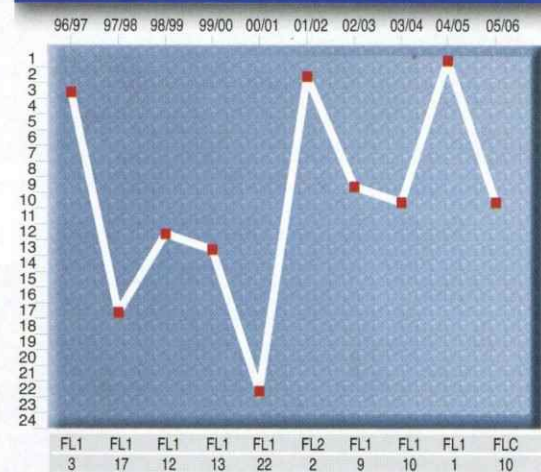

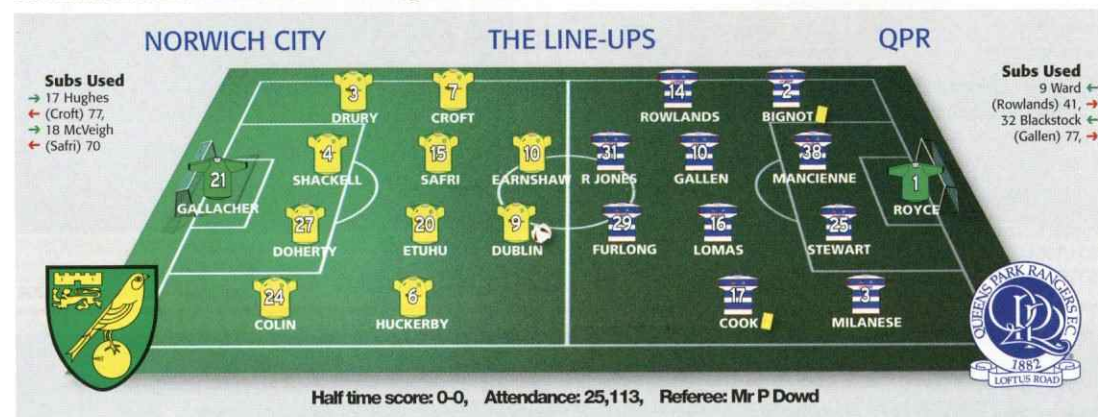

Dion Dublin bagged the winner, as Rangers' poor form on their travels continued at a rain-soaked Carrow Road.

The evergreen striker notched the only goal of the game midway through the second half, as the R's succumbed to a seventh defeat in eight Championship outings.

Defeat was perhaps a little harsh on Rangers, who did more than enough throughout the 90 minutes to warrant a share of the spoils.

With one eye on the hectic New Year schedule, John Gregory made three changes to the starting XI and also opted for a return to the tried and tested 4-4-2 formation.

Kevin Gallen, Steve Lomas and Ray Jones all returned to the side, as the R's went gunning for their first away victory since the 1-0 win at Ninian Park on November 17th.

Despite their poor form on the road, the R's made an encouraging start at Carrow Road, with the experienced duo of Gallen and Lomas orchestrating proceedings from the middle of the park.

Indeed, in a first half of few clear-cut chances, Rangers carved open the Norwich defence on 16 minutes, only for Paul Furlong to head straight at Paul Gallacher.

Norwich were by no means second best though, with Robert Earnshaw stinging the palms of Simon Royce as the half drew to a conclusion.

The second period followed a similar pattern, but it was the Canaries who clinched maximum points, thanks to Dublin's textbook finish.

The hosts could, and probably should have doubled their advantage late on, only for Damion Stewart to deny Earnshaw with a superb last ditch tackle.

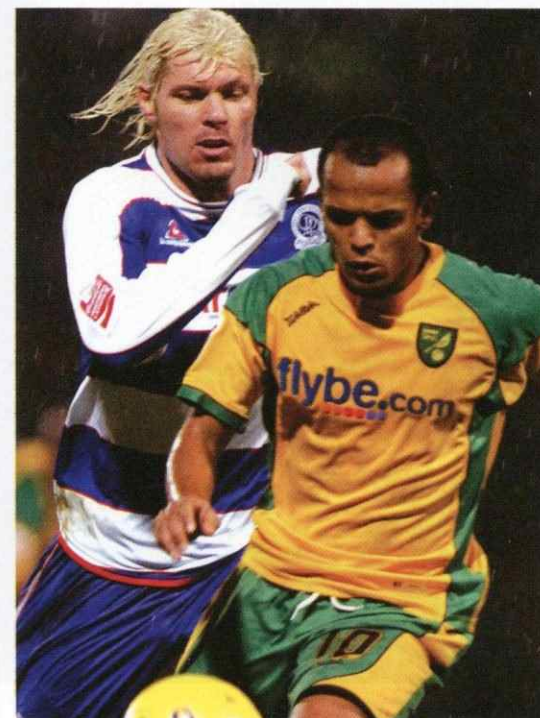

in a position where we have to sell. However, he is out of contract at the end of the season and it is going to be very difficult to hang on to him."

The gaffer also gave his thoughts on the future of Cooky. "If someone offers us serious money we have to consider it on behalf of QPR and on behalf of Lee Cook," he said. "If he has got an opportunity to play for a big Premiership club we don't particularly want to have to stand in his way. So clubs have to compensate us in whatever way we see fit. We are in a process now where we will be doing some building work of our own right throughout the team."

And that building work started with the capture of Finnish defender Sampsa Timoska, who signed an 18-month deal with the R's earlier this week. QPR World spoke to the versatile 27-year-old, and he said he was looking

forward to challenging for a place in Gregory's first-team, insisting that such a task would bring the very best out of him.

Let's hope this afternoon sees the lads continue their good form at home with another victory.

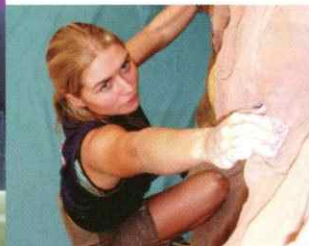

In their first year in the Championship, Hull just managed to achieve their target of survival, but this year is shaping up to be just as tough.

Battling it out at the bottom along with Rangers, the Tigers will be facing a tough six pointer up at the Kingston Communications Stadium next week.

Their 2-1 win over Sheffield Wednesday on New Year's Day meant that the R's failed to pull away from the chasing pack at the bottom of the Championship.

Now next Saturday's game will be a tense affair as both sides look to move away from the bottom three.

The successful stint at Hull City saw Peter Taylor's name linked with the Charlton Athletic manager's job, before it was eventually given to Iain Dowie. On June 13th 2006, Taylor left Hull to take up the job vacated by Dowie at Crystal Palace, a club at which he had enjoyed considerable success as

a player, with Phil Parkinson being confirmed as his replacement on June 29th. Hull agreed to pay Colchester (with whom Parkinson was still under contract) £400,000 compensation.

Defender Leon Cort became Hull's first ever million-pound player when he followed Taylor to Crystal Palace for a fee of £1,250,000. Parkinson wasted no time in spending the majority of this money on strengthening the City squad in readiness for the 2006-07 season.

Chairman Adam Pearson has stated his ambition to take the Tigers into the top flight for the first time in their history - and he believed Parkinson was the manager to do it. However, their dismal start to the season was hardly the form of a team attempting to achieve a safe mid-table finish, and on December 4th Parkinson

was sacked as manager after spending £2 million on players with little indication of improvement.

Now Phil Brown is the latest man in the hot seat having been confirmed as manager until the end of the season following a successful stint as caretaker manager.

After having been publicly backed by his players and having picked up some decent results of late, it comes as no surprise that he was given the difficult task of ensuring survival. But his form speaks volumes: a 4-1 shock win over Cardiff was followed with a tight 0-0 draw with fellow strugglers Leeds, before narrowly losing out 2-1 to Leicester. But two wins over Burnley and Sheffield Wednesday before going into today's FA Cup tie with Middlesbrough will certainly have Hull flying high.

Important Information

QPR FC would like to remind supporters that the Club faces heavy sanctions from the Football Association should there be any repeat of the mindless actions of a small minority of spectators.

Behaviour of this kind has no place at Loftus Road and we urge all supporters to support the Club in identifying and excluding anyone involved in criminal acts. Missile throwing, entering the field of play, racist/indecent/abusive language, consuming alcohol within view of the pitch are all against the law within football stadiums.

The Club, in conjunction with the Police and Local Authority will have no hesitation in enforcing these regulations; resulting in prosecution and a lengthy ban from Loftus Road.

The following information is for the benefit of spectators and to ensure all who attend games at Loftus Road do so in comfort and safety.

Evacuation message

In the event of an emergency evacuation, the following message will be played over the stadium public address system. Please listen carefully and follow all instructions given to you by the stewards.

"Ladies and gentlemen, due to unforeseen circumstances, it is not possible to continue this event. Please leave the stadium as quickly and as quietly as possible using exits indicated to you by the stewards."

Please note that should an evacuation be carried out, refunds will not be considered at the time. However - retain your ticket and await further information from the club.

Behavioural policy

In the interests of public safety we would ask all supporters to co-operate with the following policy.

1. Under no circumstances are people allowed on to the pitch. This is an offence under The Football (Offences) Act 1991.
2. Supporters must not use racial chants or indecent or abusive language whilst in the stadium. This is an arrestable offence under The Football (Offences) Act 1991.
3. The throwing of any items on to or towards the pitch or in to an area for spectators is strictly forbidden. This is an arrestable offence under The Football (Offences) Act 1991.
4. Consumption of alcohol in view of the pitch is contrary to licensing regulations and will lead to ejection. This is an offence under the Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol) Act 1985.
5. You are asked to observe ground regulations by not bringing in to the stadium any objects that might cause injury to others.
6. This is an all-seater stadium and persistent standing in the seated areas will lead to you being asked to leave or ejected.
7. In the interest of public safety you are required to refrain from standing, blocking or sitting in any gangways, exits or stairwells.
8. A reminder that no camera or recording devices of any type may be brought in to the stadium without express licence.



Should you require medical first aid during your visit, contact the nearest steward who will arrange for qualified first aiders to assist you. First Aid teams are located at all four corners of the playing area.

The medical First Aid centre is situated under Block T at the rear of the Ellerslie Road Stand.
