From the **Board of Directors**



Following the recent sales of Carlos Edwards and Rowan Vine there have been a number of supporters questioning the ambition of the Club. As a Board, we feel it appropriate to explain the following points.

At no time have we wanted to sell any players or put any pressure on our management to do so. The simple facts are that in the modern game external influences play a key part in determining player's futures. In both cases we had offers for the players concerned, which are first given to our Manager to determine if they meet his valuation.

The initial offers were turned down for the very reasons given, that we did not want to sell and in any event the prices offered were not acceptable. In both cases further offers followed, and as we all know from various reports in the national press other people - external to the Club - were trying to influence the outcome at the same time.

We then have the modern day dilemma, the prices being offered meeting the Manager's valuation and the player's are informed accordingly.

Thereafter it is very much in the hands of the player and his agent.

The only positive point from the Club's perspective is that we are now in a position to ensure no player is sold cheaply, as has happened in the past.

We all have to recognise the simple

facts are that the players have ambition, and at the end of the day everyone recognises that our current product offer does not match those of other clubs who have new grounds and higher attendances, which we understand is a significant attraction.

The simple economics of our current position endorses all the reasons for our commitment to expedite the Club's relocation to Junction 12. There are a number of examples that we would like to emulate. Bolton and Reading are two of them, both of whom secured fine new stadiums with increased revenues before they went on to secure Premiership status. So why can't Luton be the next?

Much comment has been made about where has, or will, all the money go. For starters, the Club loses circa £1.8million per annum. The football costs of retaining Championship status have increased over 100% from when the Club came out of receivership. Equally, when transfers occur, monies due are normally spread over a two, three or even four year period, and not paid all at once.

We also understand how difficult it is for our Manager to secure players from clubs in the Premiership, or some other clubs in the Championship, when you combine their salary expectations with their facilities expectations. However, we will continue to look to strengthen our squad prior to the closing of the January window, but as our Manager consistently says, "We will not be

drawn in to paying over the odds".

We were delighted when earlier in the week we signed Matthew Spring from Watford, who at the time had a number of clubs keen to secure his signature. At the time of going to press, the Manager was in discussions with other clubs to strengthen the squad prior to the January transfer window closing.

We fully understand and share our fans' passion for Luton Town FC to be in a position to compete in the Premiership. However, we all have to be realistic as to where we have recently come from, the economics of the business and where we all want to go. As a Board we won't jeopardise the Club's future, and we maintain our commitment to have a stable business rather than the peaks and troughs of recent years.

It was frustrating that the inclement weather saw the late postponement by the referee of Tuesday nights FA Cup Third Round Replay against Queens Park Rangers, which will now be played this coming Tuesday 23rd January, kick off 7.45pm.

Finally, a warm welcome to all our Supporters for today's Championship game at Kenilworth Road, and to our visitors Barnsley and their Directors, Management, Players and Supporters.

Enjoy the game and get behind the lads.

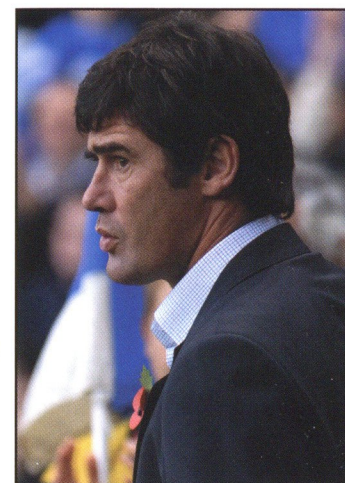

their service and wish them well

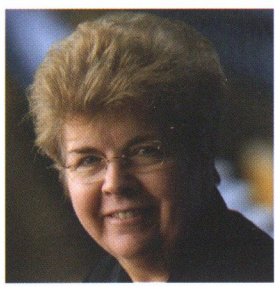
for the future.

Like all supporters I was very disappointed that last Tuesday's game had to be postponed, this being despite the valiant efforts of our ground staff and their helpers.

The amount of rain that came very late in the afternoon, simply made the playing conditions dangerous and therefore in the interests of safety, the referee made the decision to postpone the match, which will now be played on Tuesday 23rd January with a 7.45 pm kick-off. Welcome to Barnsley

Following their triumphant play-off final win against Swansea last season, Barnsley have endured a difficult time in the Championship. Following the departure of manager Andy Ritchie, Simon Davey is the man Barnsley hope will lead their team away from the relegation trap door, as JAMES MARSH explains.

Barnsley have endured a difficult season back in the Championship after a thrilling play-off final win against Swansea last May. Currently in 22nd place, and having been put out of the FA Cup by fellow strugglers Southend in midweek, Simon Davey's men will be looking for their first away win since August to boost morale and start moving away from the relegation zone.

The campaign started reasonably brightly with Davey's predecessor, Andy Ritchie, seeing his side secure two away wins in succession against Hull and Colchester. However, the 2-1 success at Layer Road was the last time the men from Oakwell won on their travels, and the subsequent dip in form eventually led to Ritchie's dismissal in November. Davey took

over in difficult circumstances, with many fans believing the man who had won them promotion did not deserve to be shown the door, and the former youth academy head will now be desperate for his side to secure a first win in five games at Kenilworth Road this afternoon.

Despite their current predicament, the Tykes - whose first ever league win back in 1898 came against the Hatters - are still capable of causing teams problems. Former Manchester United striker, Daniel Nardiello, scored in both the play-off final and semi-final last term and, although his career has been blighted by injuries, the pacy frontman remains capable of troubling defences. On the wing, young Brian Howard is his side's top scorer with six this term, and his

accurate crosses and skillful deadball delivery are undoubtedly one of Barnsley's chief threats.

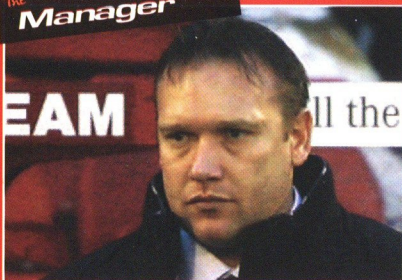
Although his men are enduring a poor run, captain Paul Reid will continue to inspire with his tough-tackling style at the back, while young Bobby Atkinson has impressed since returning from a loan spell at Scarborough earlier this season. Between the sticks will be Republic of Ireland international, Nicky Colgan, whose save in the penalty shoot-out against Swansea guarantees him lifelong hero status at Oakwell. Colgan, who previously appeared for Chelsea, has been beaten 30 times on his side's travels so far this term, and will hope his defence can tighten up for a game that has become something of a six-pointer for both sides.

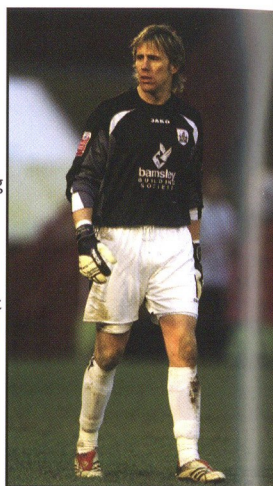
The Manager



Simon Davey was appointed as Academy Manager at Barnsley Football Club in the summer of 2006. The 35-year-old Welshman started his professional career with Swansea City in 1989, making 58 appearances for the Swans before joining Carlisle United three years later. A popular figure at Brunton Park, Simon skippered the Cumbrians during his 137 games, and his 23 goals, tempted Preston to splash out £125,000 to secure his services in 1995. Apart from a brief loan spell with Darlington in 1997, Simon spent the rest of his playing career at Deepdale, playing 122 times and netting 22 goals from midfield, before retiring through injury. Simon moved into coaching after hanging up his boots and worked with the youngsters at Preston under the watchful eye of current Everton boss David Moyes and former Scotland manager Craig Brown. He left Preston in the summer of 2005. One of the most highly-qualified young coaches in the English game, Simon picked up his UEFA 'C' Licence, UEFA 'B' Licence, UEFA 'A' Licence before taking the UEFA 'Pro' Licence in 2005. He also holds the Academy Managers Licence and UEFA 'Youth Licence'. Appointed caretaker manager at Oakwell on November 21, 2006 and handed the reigns permanently on December 31, 2006.

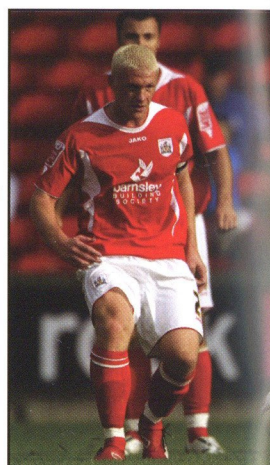
The Goalkeepers

Barnsley's number one goalkeeper is **NICK COLGAN** (pictured) who is in his third season at Oakwell. Nick started his career with his hometown club Drogheda in Ireland before moving to Premier League giants Chelsea in 1992. He made just one appearance for the Blues and had spells on loan with Crewe Alexandra, Grimsby Town, Millwall, Brentford and Reading. He joined Bournemouth in 1998 before moving to Hibernian in July 1999. He made his international debut for the Republic of Ireland in March 2002 against Denmark and has gone on to win eight full caps for his country. Colgan is a real fans' favourite at Oakwell and made a historic save in the penalty shoot-out which sent the Reds into the Championship following a play-off win against Swansea City. New recruit **DAVID LUCAS** was recently acquired from Sheffield Wednesday to put pressure on Colgan, whilst **KYLE LETHEREN** signed in early August 2006. Kyle started his career as a youngster with Swansea City and has won international honours with Wales at schoolboy and U21 level.



The Defenders

PAUL HECKINGBOTTOM is a vastly experienced defender, joining the Reds from Sheffield Wednesday initially on loan in January 2006. The 28-year-old started his career as a trainee with Manchester United and went on to enjoy spells at Scarborough, Hartlepool, Darlington, Sunderland and Norwich. Paul has made almost 300 appearances in total throughout his professional career, netting 13 goals. Former Barnsley boss Paul Hart drafted **BOBBY HASSELL** (pictured) in the summer of 2004, when he was released from Mansfield. Hassell joined the Field Mill side as a trainee in 1996 and made his first team debut for the Stags against Chester City in September 1997. An attacking right sided defender, Bobby made 181 appearances for Mansfield, netting three goals, and was a virtual ever present for Keith Curle's side last season. He played in the Division Three Play Off Final at the Millennium Stadium in May 2004. Barnsley agreed a deal with Crystal Palace to sign rising star **SAM TOGWELL** for an undisclosed fee in July 2006. The 21-year-old joined Palace as a youngster and came up through the ranks to make his debut during the 2002/2003 campaign. He has made four first team appearances for The Eagles. Togwell had spells with Oxford United and Northampton Town on loan before joining Port Vale on loan last season. Togwell put pen-to-paper on a deal keeping him at Oakwell until the summer of 2008. Young defender **NEIL AUSTIN** signed a professional contract at Oakwell in 1999 after impressing through the junior ranks. The Barnsley-born youngster has been a regular at youth level for the Reds and broke into the reserve team during the 2001/02 season. He is highly rated at Oakwell and by the English FA, winning caps for the national team through to Under 19 level. A young full back who progressed rapidly through the Academy and reserve set up, **ADAM ECKERSLEY** was recently signed by Barnsley in the January transfer window, arriving from Manchester United on loan.

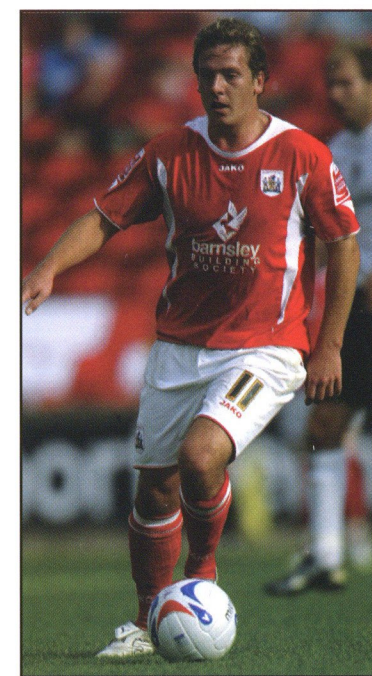


The Midfielders

BRIAN HOWARD (pictured) signed from Swindon Town in May 2005. He came up through the ranks at Southampton but failed to make the breakthrough at Saints and made the move to Swindon in 2003. Despite not making a first team appearance for Southampton, Brian was a regular in the England youth set up and made four appearances for the Under 20s in the 2003 Toulon Tournament. After recovering from a fractured metatarsal, Howard firmly established himself as a goalscoring midfielder throughout 2005/2006 and formed an outstanding partnership alongside Stephen McPhail.

ANTONY KAY has been at Barnsley since junior school and has progressed through the ranks at the Academy. A member of the successful U15 team, he signed for Barnsley despite the interest of a lot of other clubs. Kay made his first team debut against Norwich in August 2000 and made a number of additional appearances throughout the 2000/01 season. His performances for both the reserves and the Academy saw him called up for England Under 18s, even though he was unfortunate

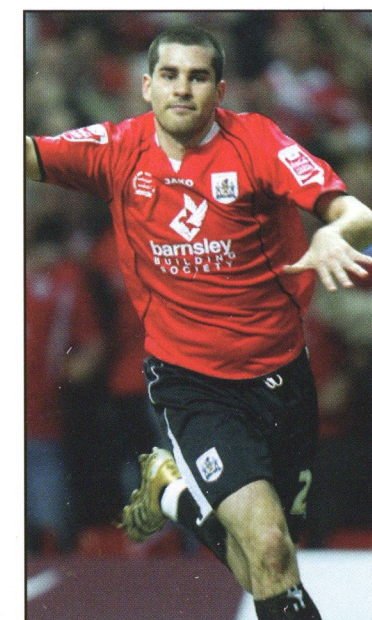
not to get a game in their friendly with Belgium. **NICKY WROE** was handed a first team squad number in late March 2003 after impressing for the Academy and reserves. The talented midfielder really made the breakthrough into the first team during the 2004/05 campaign as he forced his way into the starting eleven and kept his place through most of the campaign. He went on to make 35 first team appearances and established himself as a real star in the making for the Reds. **DALE TONGE** is a hardworking midfielder who joined the club as an Under 12. He turned in a string of impressive performances for the reserve team during last season and was rewarded with a professional deal for the 2004/05 campaign. He signed a new contract at the end of the season and looks to have a bright future in the game. Barnsley moved into the transfer market to sign Northern Ireland international midfielder **GRANT McCANN**, initially on loan from League One side Cheltenham Town, in November 2006 and the deal was made permanent recently. McCann came up through the ranks at West Ham United before enjoying successful spells on loan with Livingston and Notts County.



The Strikers

DANIEL NARDIELLO (pictured) was a prolific striker at youth level for Manchester United. In season 2000/01, he scored 14 goals in 11 starts and nine sub appearances for the Under 19s. He made his first team debut for Manchester United on 5th November 2001 in the Worthington Cup Third Round tie at Arsenal. Nardiello joined the Reds in January 2004 on loan, hitting two goals on his Barnsley debut. He was a massive hit on loan at Oakwell during the 2003/04, campaign netting seven goals in 16 games before returning to Old Trafford. He came back to Barnsley in 2004 on a season-long loan deal that delighted supporters. The striker was eventually released by the Old Trafford club last summer, when he signed a two-year deal at Oakwell in July 2005. Barnsley completed the signing of winger **MARTIN DEVANEY** from Watford on a free transfer in late August 2005. The exciting 25-year-old only signed for the Hornets the previous summer after leaving Cheltenham

Town. Martin came up through the youth ranks at Coventry City before making the switch to Whaddon Road in July 1999 going on to make 226 first team appearances for the Robins, netting 43 goals. Martin left Cheltenham in the summer to join up with Championship side Watford but things did not work out at Vicarage Road. **NATHAN JARMAN** arrived at the Academy in 2003 in a blaze of publicity and expectation after earning rave reviews during his time with the youngsters. He capped a fine season with his first start for the Reds in the 2004/05 campaign. He made a total of six appearances for the Reds as he established himself firmly in the first team plans. **PAUL HAYES**, who signed for Barnsley in 2005 from Scunthorpe, started his professional career with Norwich City but did not make the breakthrough at Carrow Road. He moved to Scunthorpe in December 2002 and became a cult hero at Glanford Park, netting 33 goals in 116 first team appearances. Highly-rated Scarborough youngster **MICHAEL COULSON** joined Barnsley in the summer of 2006.



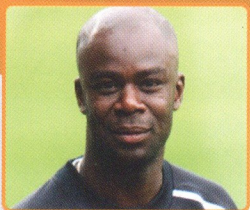

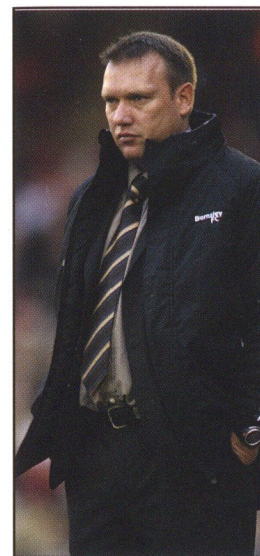

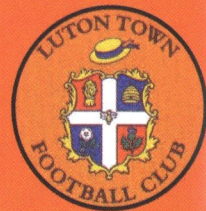
■ How have Barnsley found the first half of the season in the Championship?

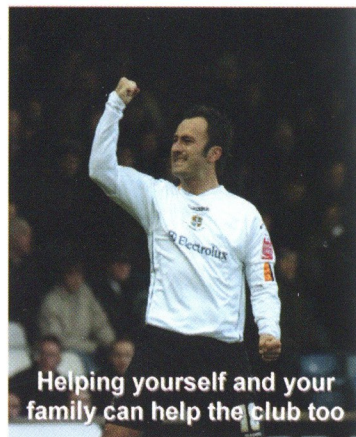

Five to *Remember*

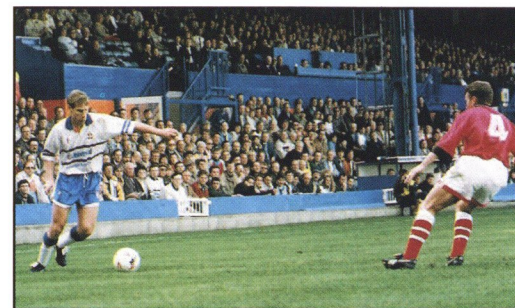
Roger Wash takes a look back at five classic encounters between Luton Town and Barnsley

7th April 1965
Luton Town 5 Barnsley 1
Attendance: 6,112

Although the Town were heading towards inevitable relegation they were making a fight of it as the season drew to a close and had won three games in a row before the visit of fellow strugglers Barnsley.

In a tense opening period veteran Ted Phillips had put the Town ahead only for John Bettany to level for the Tykes. Whatever was put in the Hatter's half-time tea certainly worked as they went goal mad after Tom McKechnie scored soon after the break.

Three goals in eight minutes sealed an incredible victory in a totally one-sided second half which made a mockery of the opening 45 minutes.

9th October 1966
Luton Town 5 Barnsley 4
Attendance: 5,948

The Hatters, in their first ever season in Division Four, had suddenly found out how to score goals, and on the Thursday evening prior to the visit of Barnsley had seen off Doncaster 4-3 in a pulsating contest. This win had the effect of putting 1,000 on the gate and the fans were not disappointed when Billy Stark, Tony Read, Ray Whittaker and John O'Rourke netted in the first half-hour. Thinking they had finished the job the players sat back and allowed Barnsley to pull two goals back by the interval.

Manager George Martin read the Riot Act at half-time, leading to Read putting the Town 5-2 up but defensive jitters allowed the Tykes to make the final score an unrealistic 5-4, although we supporters were not complaining.

28th August 1968
Luton Town 5 Barnsley 1
Attendance: 15,899

The Town had made a great start to the new season following their promotion from Division Four and had won their first two home games with an aggregate score of 7-1.

Next up were fellow promotion winners Barnsley, and on a wet

night the Tykes' close passing style looked likely to be favourite against the Hatters' more robust long ball game.

It was, however, the powerful Bruce Rioch who opened the scoring after surging through from his own half and blasting home. Mastery of the dead ball then gave the Town their next three goals, before Keith Allen smacked in number five from open play. Bob Earnshaw had netted Barnsley's consolation when the score was 3-0.

15th May 1982
Luton Town 1 Barnsley 1
Attendance: 14,463

With the championship of Division Two being confirmed four days before, following a 3-2 home win over QPR, the visit of Barnsley was always going to be overshadowed by the on field medal and trophy presentation, with the game of secondary importance.

The Tykes had other ideas, though. After patiently waiting for all the ceremonies to finish they were determined to spoil the day and went ahead when Alan Birch scored from the spot after he had been brought down by goalkeeper Jake Findlay. Barnsley were a good side that season and were one of only four teams to beat the Town, but they could not hold on for a win, with Hatters top scorer Brian Stein firing in a bullet with only three minutes to go.

2nd October 1993
Luton Town 5 Barnsley 0
Attendance: 6,201

A win on the opening day had been followed by only two points from the next six games, and the Town were one off the bottom by the time of the visit of Barnsley.

The game got off to a sensational start when full-back Julian James intercepted a pass and broke over the halfway line only to be upended by the Tykes' Gerry Taggart. The Barnsley skipper was ordered off and for once the Town made their numerical superiority count, with Ceri Hughes having the game of his life and pulling all the strings in midfield.

Efforts from John Hartson, Scott Oakes (2), James and Scott Houghton flew past David Watson in the Barnsley goal to kick-start the Hatters' season.

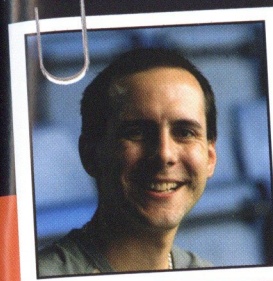

Stat Attack

Simon Pitts takes a look at some interesting stats between this afternoon's two sides.

Luton have entertained Barnsley 25 times previously, with the Hatters winning 14 and drawing five. Luton have scored 64 goals, to Barnsley's 32. The sides have also met twice here in Cup competitions, a 3rd Round FA Cup replay in January 1933, and a 4th Round League Cup fixture in November 1998, both of which were won by Luton.

As well as Beresford, three other players have made the move to Barnsley. John McCartney played in Luton's first league season of 1897/98, before his transfer. Two years later Frank Morrison made the same move after just 17 career appearances for Luton. David Lindsay only played the opening seven matches of the 1948/49 season for the Hatters, before joining Barnsley.

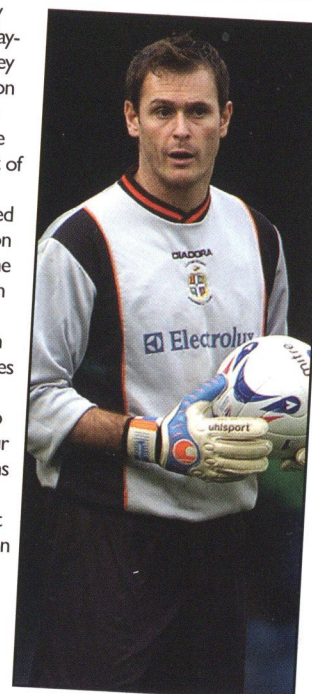
In Luton's second season in the league, 1898/99, they beat Barnsley 4-1, the first of seven consecutive home wins for the Hatters in this fixture. The Town hit 20 goals in these fixtures, and conceded just four. This run went into the 1950's, and after a 1-1 draw in 1950/51, Luton won the next two fixtures by an aggregate score of 10-2. Hugh McJarrow scored twice in a 4-2 win in 1951/52, before Mike Cullen and Gordon Turner also scored a brace each in the 6-0 thrashing of the visitors the following season. It was nearly eleven years before the sides met again in the league, and this time it was the visitors who came out 3-2 winners. They had to wait another 30 years and ten attempts to repeat the victory though.

Luton certainly enjoyed the two home matches against Barnsley in 1965, as they hit five goals in each game. Firstly in April when Tommy McKechnie and Ted Phillips both scored twice in a 5-1 win, and then again in October when forward Tony Read also notched a brace in a 5-4 victory. By the end of the season Read had switched positions though, and the following year was in goal when the sides met at Oakwell! The Hatters have scored five goals twice since 1965, in 1968/69 when Brian Lewis added his name to the list of players who have netted twice against Barnsley, and then again in 1993/94. After Barnsley were reduced to 10 men, Luton went on a goal scoring spree, with John Hartson, Scott Oakes (2), Julian James, and Scott Houghton all putting their name on the scoresheet in October 1993. Incidentally Luton haven't won this fixture at Kenilworth Road since, and have only scored four goals in the five meetings.

Edwin Birch scored a hat trick on January 7th 1899 in the 4-1 victory, a feat that no other Luton player has repeated against Barnsley, despite the Hatters scoring three goals or more in 14 of the other 50 league meetings.

And finally.....with an average of nearly four goals per game, it's perhaps no surprise that there has never been a 0-0 draw in this fixture at Kenilworth Road

Luton have only bought three players from Barnsley that have gone on to appear in the first team for the Hatters. The first of these was Ernie Simms who played for the Hatters on their return to the Football League in 1920/21. Simms scored 29 goals in just 40 appearances in the league, and added five FA Cup goals from just four appearances. Simms continued to find the back of the net the following season with 18 goals from 25 league appearances. Simms moved to South Shields with an excellent goals-to-game ratio whilst at Kenilworth Road. Harold Andrews' only appearance following a move from Barnsley, was a 2-1 defeat at home to Southend in 1935/36, before he moved to Accrington Stanley. Marlon Beresford moved from Bradford City to Luton in October 2003 and made 17 league and cup appearances, before he moved to Barnsley. Beresford was back in Bedfordshire for the beginning of Championship winning 2004/05 season and has gone on to make over 120 appearances for Luton.

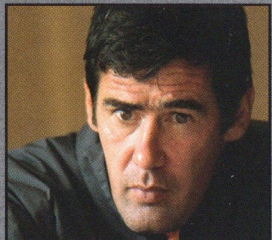

Taylor clung on to a low drive from Warren Feeney, who then stunned the home side by putting Luton ahead with 13 minutes remaining with his first league goal in 2006.

Luton goalkeeper Dean Kiely kept his side in the game with a wonderful save from Danns late in the game, but the substitute salvaged a share of the spoils with just seconds remaining.

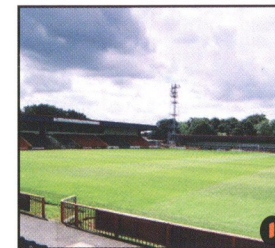

Derby County have completed the £750,000 signing of Celtic midfielder Stephen Pearson.

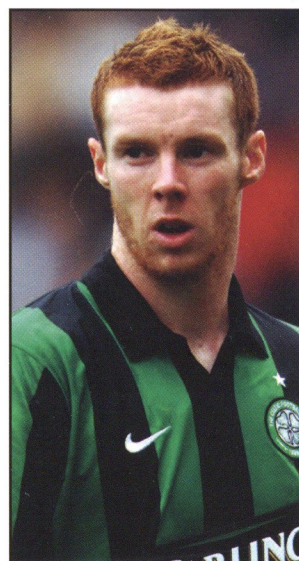
Pearson, 24, told the club's website he was looking forward to playing for the Championship side after signing a three-and-a-half-year deal.

Pearson joined Celtic from Motherwell in a £350,000 deal in January 2004 but he has never been a first team regular with the Scottish champions.

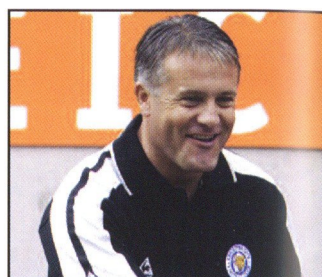

Boss Micky Adams said: "We're delighted Michael opted to join us.

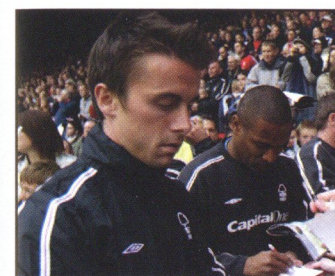

League probe Blues postponement

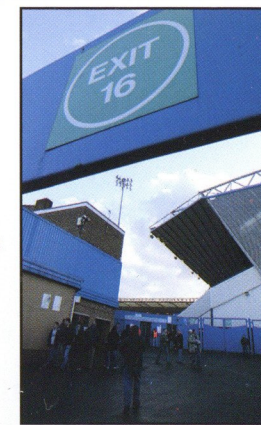
The Football League says it will investigate the circumstances of Birmingham postponing their home game against Leeds on Saturday.

Even Stephen

With his League One Championship medal sitting proudly on his mantelpiece, Stephen O'Leary has a burning desire to add more silverware to his collection. The Matchday Programme staff caught up with the Harlesden-born midfield dynamo earlier this week and discovered a young man who just wants to play.

Breaking into the Hatters' midfield and staying there presents his next challenge, but Stephen has self-belief in abundance and is willing to work as long and as hard as it takes to achieve his ambition.

"My ideal situation is to stay and break into this team. As any player will tell you, you want to play at the highest level possible, and I think I can play at this level.

"That is my main objective, to break into this team."

The times they are a-changing at Kenilworth Road, and Stephen has seen many comings and goings since he signed as a trainee in October 2001.

The latest players to leave the Club, Carlos Edwards and Rowan Vine, will not have had much of an impact on the training ground, but it does open up an opportunity or two for some players who may feel they've been under-used on a Saturday afternoon.

"Obviously you are going to be disappointed to lose two of your better players. Both of them have been on fire this year and we knew that come January that there were going to be bids coming in for them, and with the money being offered we couldn't really turn it down.

"It creates an opening for you. It's not good news for the team but if there's a place up for grabs then you've got to push yourself and make it your own. You've got to do that anyway, no matter who's at the Club."

The nucleus of the Youth Team he excelled and the likes of Stephen, Leon Barnett, Kevin Foley and Keith Keane have been up and down the divisions together, creating a special bond amongst them.

Despite the recent disappointing loss at West Brom, Stephen and the boys still had to endure the crowding of

Keane all the way home from the Black Country as he relived his (admittedly) great goal on the team bus.

"It's probably the best goal Keane has ever scored – even in training – but I think he would have rather got three points than score.

"He was happy about it but we were all disappointed not to get the win."

Having to compete with each other for places is all part of the job description, and Stephen enjoyed a spell in the side earlier in the season when he played in five games for the First Team – without ever being on a losing side.

After helping the Hatters through the first two rounds of the Carling Cup with wins at Bristol Rovers (albeit on penalties) and Brentford, Stephen had done enough to convince Mike Newell that he was ready for a return to league action. He featured in the victories over Birmingham City and Leeds United, and the goalless draw at Hull City.

"I've played a few games and then came on in another two and then I was out of favour again. But you've just got to keep your head down. You can't let it frustrate you."

Despite the squad numbers being stretched at times, competition for places is always fierce, and Stephen has realised how important it is not to mope around at training.

According to the Harlesden-born midfielder, the key to future success is listening to advice from the coaching staff and good old fashioned hard work.

"They do take you aside sometimes and tell you what you've got to work on. But as a player you can get better



at everything. I don't think you can stop working at things just because you think they are the best parts of your game.

"You should be working at everything on the training pitch just so you keep improving."

Having made the bench for the last four Championship matches without being involved, it's been a case of so near yet so far for O'Leary, recently.

The midweek postponement of the FA Cup replay against QPR was a massive disappointment to everyone, and Stephen shares his Manager's view that the most famous club competition in the world should not be regarded as an inconvenience, as it is to some clubs.

He also has a 100% FA Cup record to preserve. Two of his 32 Hatters appearances have been in the great competition, and he helped the Town to 3-0 away wins at Southend United and Wycombe Wanderers in the 2004/05 season.

"It takes you away from the league a bit. You are still looking to put in a good performance and win the game because the FA Cup is a great competition. If you get a good cup run it helps your season."

Stephen made his Hatters debut during the season before.

After making a mandatory appearance in the LDV Vans Trophy at Rushden & Diamonds in November 2003 - which was also as memorable for Keith Keane and Curtis Davies, who also made their Luton debuts that night - Stephen had to wait until much later in the season before he made his league debut in a home match against Brentford.

February 21st, 2004 is the date that will forever be etched in his mind, and Stephen remembers his modest contribution with pride.

"I'd just turned 18 at the time, so it was a great feeling. I only came on

for three minutes and I only touched the ball once, but we won the game 4-1 and I was just buzzing!"

A longer substitute appearance followed against Oldham Athletic some weeks later, again at Kenilworth Road, and he then earned a starting place in the team for the trip to Wrexham a few weeks later.

Stephen was starting to feel at home. Having played the full ninety minutes at the Racecourse Ground, he then had to sweat it out all week to see if he had kept his place in the team.

The following Saturday was no ordinary game. It was Luton's last home game of the season, and he had yet to start a match at Kenilworth Road.

After what was undoubtedly a restless Friday night, Stephen arrived at the ground to be informed that he was playing.

However, by the half time interval his dream was starting to become a nightmare as the visitors, Sheffield Wednesday, raced into a 2-0 lead.

A Steve Howard goal in the 54th minute reduced the arrears, though, and then Stephen spooned in the equaliser with just 12 minutes to go.

"I think I shanked it, to be honest! I think Kev's played a cross in and Howie's just nodded it down for me and it was my left foot. I don't score too many goals with that but it went in the bottom corner, so I was happy.

Question Time

Stephen has notched two goals for the Hatters in his career so far. One was in a 3-2 win against Sheffield Wednesday, but against whom was the other one?



"It was my full home debut when I scored my goal. We were 2-0 down at half-time and I thought 'This isn't going to be a great debut', but we turned it around and we won 3-2 and I got my first goal, which was a great feeling."

Since then, Stephen hasn't looked back, and has matured as a player, and refuses to be fazed by some of the big names currently on show in the Championship.

"When I've been playing no-one's really stood out that I've come up against. I don't feel inferior against anyone when I'm playing. They are just another player."

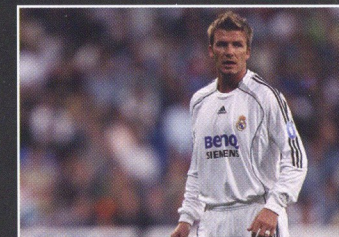

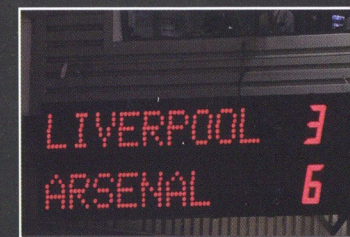

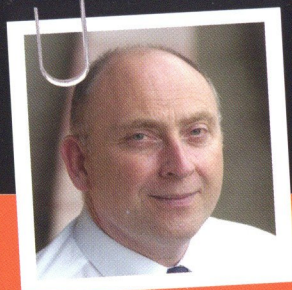
Liverpool's weak side in the Carling Cup

Lewis James EMANUEL

Bradford-born Lewis joined Bradford City as a Youth Trainee before making his debut for the Bantams in a Worthington Cup tie at Macclesfield in August 2001.

A tough tackling, speedy left-sided player, Lewis soon became a mainstay in the City side but decided to try his luck in the Championship with Luton Town in the summer of 2006, signing a two-year contract after a successful trial period.

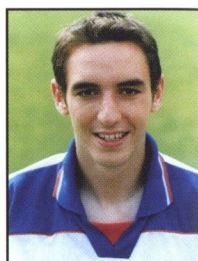
Since joining the Hatters, Lewis became an instant crowd favourite when scoring the only goal of the game at Sheffield Wednesday in only his second outing. He has also now added a Republic of Ireland 'B' cap to the Youth caps already won.

Sean Anthony EVERS

A tremendous 'box-to-box' player with superb stamina, Sean signed professional forms for the Hatters in May 1996, shortly after making his League debut in a Luton side that was just about to be relegated from Division One.

It was, though, two years later that Sean saw scouts flock to Kenilworth Road, due to his displays in a long Worthington Cup run and a sparkling performance for the Nationwide League representative team in Italy. Cash-strapped Hatters reluctantly accepted a £500,000 offer from Reading in March 1999, but Sean was beset with injuries at the Madejski. After a loan spell at St Johnstone he joined Plymouth on a free transfer, where further injury put paid to his League career.

Since leaving Plymouth, Sean has turned out for Stevenage and Woking.



Michael (Mick) Peter FAIRCHILD

Born in Northampton, went to school in Gt Yarmouth and spotted while playing for Lowestoft, Mick came to Kenilworth Road in November 1960 and made a scoring debut for the Hatters at a wet Southampton the following April.

As the Town dropped through the divisions, pacey winger Mick had difficulty in winning a regular place and moved to Reading in 1964, where his chances were still limited. After a short spell at Cambridge United, Mick joined Hillingdon where he found his niche. Mick's main claim to fame at Hillingdon was in being part of the side that knocked the Hatters out of the FA Cup in 1969. An embarrassing afternoon for Luton supporters!

Mick returned to Lowestoft in 1972 and still resides in the area.

Sean Paul FARRELL

Big, strong striker Sean was probably too brave for his own good as he missed a large chunk of his footballing career due to injury.

Watford-born, but signing on for Luton Town from school, Sean made his debut for the Hatters in the top flight, and during the 1990/91 campaign made 20 appearances, and seemed to have carved out a regular slot in the side. A change of manager saw David Pleat transfer Sean to Fulham for £100,000, and from there he moved to Peterborough and Notts County, scoring plenty of goals along the way but always beset with injury.

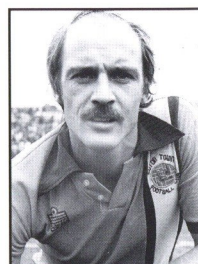
After leaving Meadow Lane, Sean moved on to Burton Albion.

John Gilbert FAULKNER

'Maxie', (to all at Kenilworth Road) decided to qualify as a Quantity Surveyor and play non-league for Sutton United rather than join Charlton. A commanding performance at centre-half against Leeds in the FA Cup saw him succumb to temptation and join the professional ranks at Elland Road, but in only his second start he broke a kneecap.

With Luton Town selling Chris Nicholl a vacancy arose at Kenilworth Road in March 1972, and John accepted the offer with both hands and with it over 200 league appearances, a promotion to Division One and cult status amongst the Hatters fans.

A spell in the USA followed before he returned to Luton as Youth Team Coach and then First Team Coach under Jim Ryan. After Ryan's departure, John went to Norwich under Mike Walker and latterly has been scouting for; amongst others, ex-Town star Danny Wilson.



Warren James FEENEY

After being watched by many clubs while playing in his native Belfast, Warren decided to opt for Leeds, then one of the powers in the land. Working his way up through the youth system at Elland Road, Warren was frustrated by big money imports being introduced and so decided to try his luck elsewhere and joined Bournemouth in March 2001.

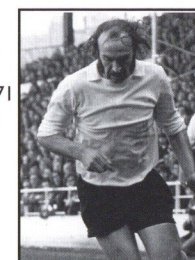
Warren enjoyed a successful time with the Cherries where his speed and persistence brought him a clutch of goals. Finances dictated that Warren be transferred to Stockport where he finished as top scorer in a relegated side, but he was then rescued by Luton manager Mike Newell who remembered him as a thorn in the side of various Hatters' teams. Northern Ireland international Warren has started the year in blistering form. Long may it continue!

Rodney Alan FERN

Capable of the sublime or the ridiculous, quite often in the same game, Rodney was a playmaking inside forward who joined Leicester in 1966 eventually winning a regular place and finishing top scorer for the Foxes in 1969/70. A superb display at Luton in a 3-1 Leicester win over Easter 1971 was remembered by all at Kenilworth Road leading to a £45,000 transfer a little over a year later.

Rodney did not enjoy the best of times at Luton and was glad to accept a cut price move to Chesterfield in 1975 where he netted regularly and then four years later to Rotherham who he helped to the brink of the top flight.

Rodney now runs pubs and a fuel business in Leicestershire.



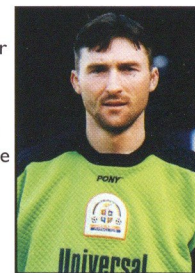
Ian Anthony FEUER

Giant American goalkeeper Ian was playing for West Ham's third team when Luton Town manager Terry Westley invited him to Kenilworth Road on loan to take the place of another American, Juergen Sommer.

Quickly becoming a favourite, Ian was eventually signed for £580,000 and was virtually ever present as the Hatters were relegated from Division One in 1996 and then almost bounce back at the first time of asking the following year.

At the start of the 1997/98 campaign Ian badly injured a shoulder, was out for a long time and then struggled to regain his form leading to him leaving the club and returning to the States.

Subsequently Ian made brief attempts at comebacks in the U.K and, according to his website, is now available for personal coaching in the USA.



Gordon Richard FINCHAM

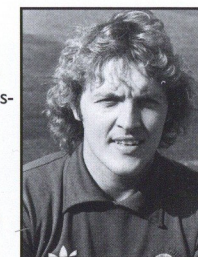
Tough, uncompromising centre-half Gordon joined Leicester as a 17 year old in 1952 and after working his way up through the ranks at Filbert Street seemed to have claimed a regular first team spot three years later only for serious injury to strike.

By the time he gained full fitness others had overtaken him in the pecking order so he accepted a move to Plymouth where he enjoyed five good seasons before joining Luton Town in 1963.

Gordon battled manfully as the Hatters escaped relegation in 1964 but following the inevitable drop a year later he emigrated to South Africa where he turned out for Port Elizabeth and ran a sports shop. Gordon is now retired and back in his native Peterborough.

John (Jake) Williamson FINDLAY

Aston Villa manager Tommy Docherty fought off a shoal of clubs to sign goalkeeper Jake as a 15 year old but although he starred in the Villans 1972 Youth Cup triumph he found it difficult to displace Jim Cumbes and Jimmy Rimmer. It took a lot of pestering by Luton manager David Pleat though, to get Villa to release Jake to replace Milija Aleksic in 1979 but once he came to Kenilworth Road he became a terrace favourite and starred as the Hatters won promotion to Division One in 1982. A badly broken thumb then effectively ended his Luton career as by the time he was fit the Town had signed Les Sealey and after a brief spell at Swindon he hung up his gloves. Jake is now assistant manager at Stourport Swifts.

Managers up and down the country will be looking to strengthen their squads for the season's run-in with millions of pounds already being spent by club's at every level.

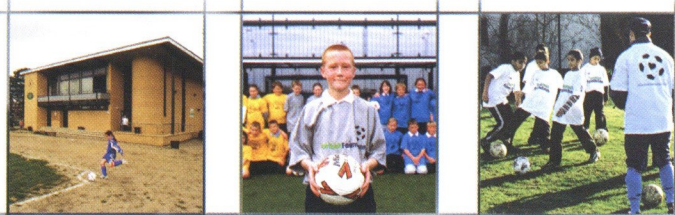
But for every Micah Richards or Peter Crouch, there will be a dozen players who will hope to persuade prospective buyers they can do a job for them at a fraction of the cost.

Calvin is progressing well and he is full pace running at present. Over the next two weeks we will be progressing with some ball work and he will be back in training sometime in February if no problems arise.

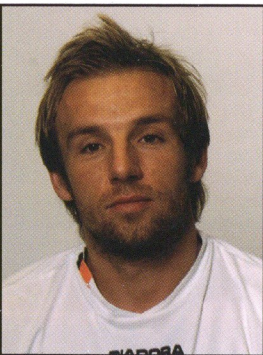

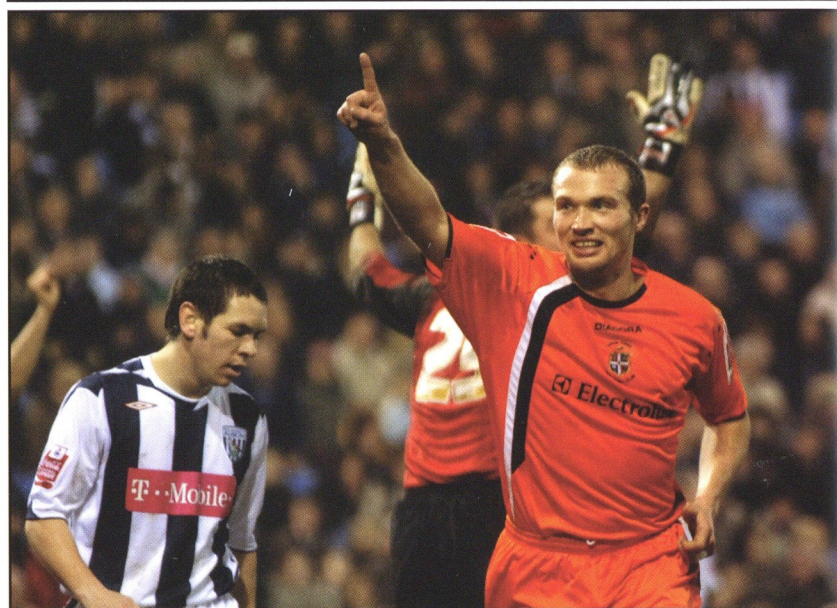

home side.

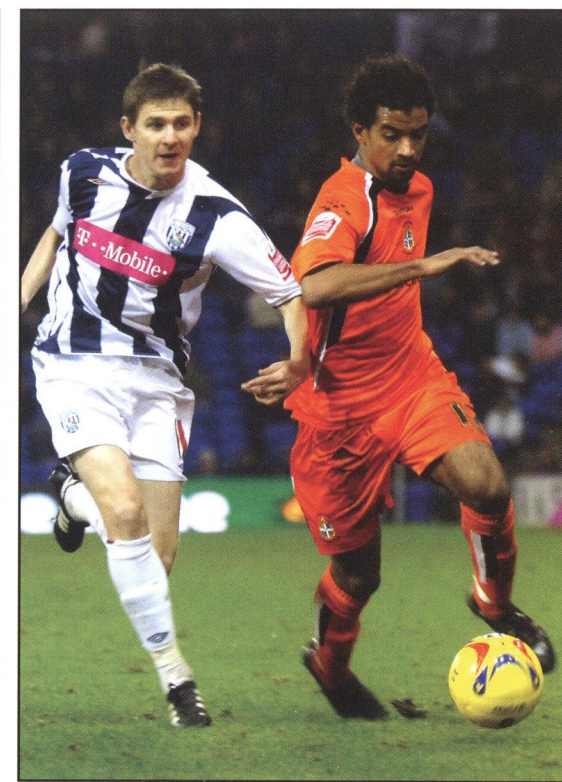
Luton looked to have bounced back from the disappointment of going a goal down minutes before the interval through Koumas' fine individual effort.

Their first away win in the Championship since late September seemed secure when Warren Feeney put them in front with 20 minutes remaining after Keith Keane had made the score 1-1.

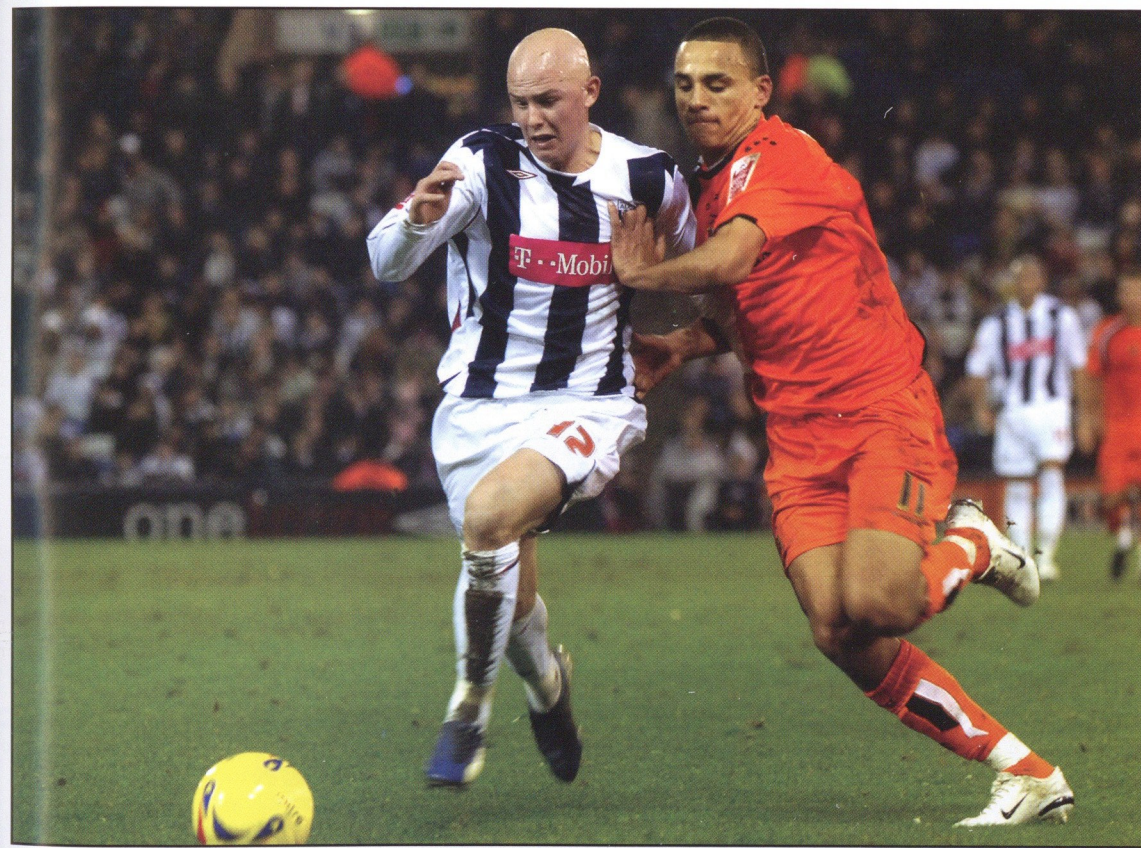



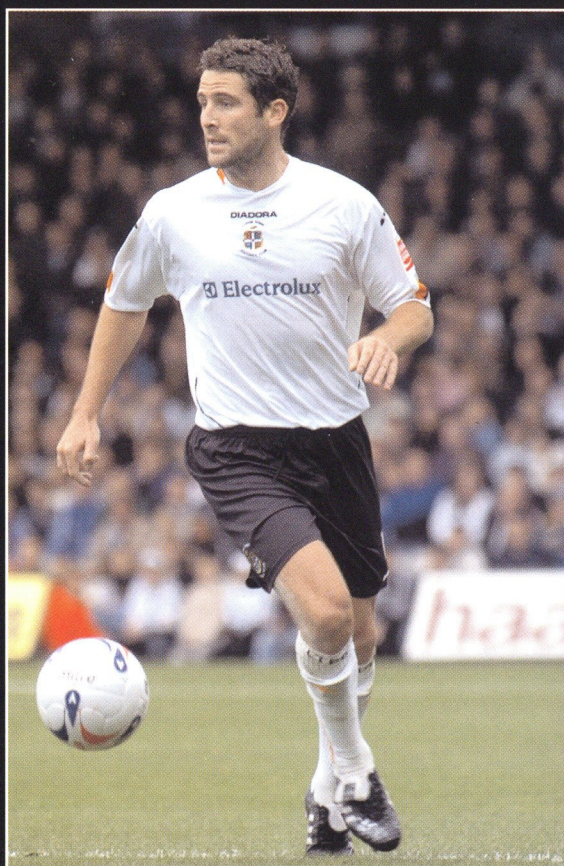
