



WHY, MR LEVI, WHY?

Never slow to jump on a popular bandwagon Messrs Blair, Brown and Richard Caborn have added their voices to the campaign to reduce admission prices for Premiership matches following the new TV contract which will add millions to the clubs' already large war chests.

What about the clubs outside the Premiership? Well, the Government could put their money (well, yours actually) where their collective mouths are and abolish VAT on admission prices. So far this season Leeds United have been charged a total of £1,217,876.

In rough figures the kids prices would come down from £8 to about £6.80, the £31 price down to £26.40, the £26 ticket to £22.10 and the £15 ticket to £12.75 (all the calculations are in my head as I write but you get the general idea). On top of that business rates (which the Council mostly pass on to the Government) cost us about £700,000, which if abolished would knock off another £1.40 across the board and police charges another 50p.

We can now turn our attention to our own ticket pricing policies and our recent experiments to date. Here are the comparative figures:

GAME	REVENUE

Sheff Weds	25,299 paid cash of £299,613
Luton (as of Weds night)	22,400 paid cash of £143,000

Of course, if the prices were permanently reduced the season tickets would have to come down, too, and the estimated reduction in income would be about a million pounds. Note that the attendance figures quoted above includes season ticket holders and corporates. The conclusion? Too early to tell. That reminds me of the story of Chou En-Lai (the Chinese communist president) when he was

asked if he thought that the French Revolution 200 years earlier had changed the course of history, he replied that it was too early to tell.

I certainly touched a raw nerve when I took the lid off the Melvyn Levi scandal. He promptly rang his pet columnist who writes in a national newspaper and followed it up with a TV interview in the spacious gardens of his magnificent house. Apart from a lot of hot air he avoided the whole central issue and never was he asked any questions by the interviewer Harry Gration, who is certainly no Jeremy Paxman. Harry also introduced him as a life-long Leeds fan, although I have never met anybody who can confirm that. Come on Mr Levi, why won't you answer the questions...

1. Why did you refuse to complete the share option in 2005?
2. Why are you trying to frighten off would be investors?
3. Are you trying to blackmail me into paying you money to go away?
4. Why won't your wife's first husband pay Leeds United the £190,000 he admits he owes?
5. Why do you keep telling the few people who still listen to you that I am anti Semitic?
6. What did I write in my column that you thought was written in "Nazi" language?

You are just playing the race card again. Everybody knows that I am not anti Semitic, just anti Levi!

Three weeks ago, the CEO of Alamo Rentacar introduced me, at his request, to a man with £100 million cash in the bank. The man flew down to see me in Monte Carlo. We had a pleasant lunch which was repeated last Sunday with detailed discussions about the way forward. All very enthusiastic. involved in when it closed down and the pitch was redeveloped for housing?

Times are tough, that's when the men separate from the boys. Let us get behind the team for the next 10 games starting today. If there are to be recriminations let's leave them until May. All is not lost and our monstrous injury list will decline in the next few weeks.

The question of the ownership of Elland Road is topical again. The straight answer is that neither I or anybody else at Leeds United knows who it is. The previous board sold Elland Road and Thorp Arch to a Mr Jacob Adler, who is based in Manchester, for a total of £12 million in 2004. The rent is paid to an English, Manchester-based company as the landlord's agent. Our buy-back option is attached to the land itself. Consequently, it doesn't matter who owns Elland Road, when we come up with the option money we get the ground and the option does not expire until 2029.

I see that Leeds United fan Colin Burges MP has had a pop at me in the course of a long rambling article recently. The only problem is that we have no record of him ever coming. The box office computer records go back seven years. His name has never come up so unless he comes on somebody else's ticket or he buys under another name or at the last minute, I don't know how he supports us and he's not even a Club Member. Furthermore Colin, if I have a tendency to pontificate, I learnt that ability from people like you.

Closing, a personal thank you from my wife Suzannah, to Chris and Ian, who were so kind and supportive to her when she sat so disconsolate after the game last Saturday. She did pass on your message to me for which I thank you.

LEEDS UNITED OWNERSHIP – THE FACTS

The Forward Sports Fund is a fund incorporated in the Cayman Islands. The Fund's UK representative is Ken Bates but the Fund is administered from Switzerland.

In January 2005, Mr Bates was approached by Leslie Grayling and John Owen and was informed that Adulant Force Limited, the ultimate holding company of Leeds United Association Football Club Limited was within days of going into liquidation.

The Revenue was owed £1.2m that had to be paid by January 21. It was agreed between Bates, Grayling and Owen that a New Co (LUFC) would be set up to acquire Adulant Force Ltd. FSF would hold 51 per cent of the equity of LUFC, with Grayling/Owen holding 26 per cent. The remainder of the equity (23 per cent) would be placed with investors to be introduced by Grayling/Owen. To date, no investors have been introduced.

Bates' lawyer Mark Taylor, Gerald Krasner and Melvyn Levi of 'the Yorkshire Consortium' met on 17 January 2005 at Mark Taylor's offices in London. The initial proposal was that LUFC would buy the whole of Adulant Force Limited for a nominal consideration but would make up to £5m available for future working capital for LU AFC, including the payment of the Revenue which was fundamental.

It was discovered that a change of control prior to May 2005 would trigger a payment of £5m by LU AFC to the Trustees of a bond previously issued by Leeds United plc. The requirement to make such payment would scupper the deal and so it was agreed that:

- i) LUFC would purchase 50 per cent of Adulant Force Limited
- ii) LUFC would purchase 50 per cent of LU AFC
- iii) LUFC would gain board control of both Adulant Force and LU AFC
- iv) LUFC would be granted a call option over the remaining 50 per cent of Adulant Force
- v) LUFC would procure a loan of £5m available to LU AFC.

There were loans due from Adulant Force Ltd to members of the Consortium as follows: Levi and Simon Morris were both paid sums in excess of £200,000 with the balance of the loans being discharged by the issue of secured loan notes. Loan notes were issued to Morris for in excess of £2m and Levi for £1,439,734. A loan note was also issued to David Richmond, who did not receive any payment on completion.

Since issue, the notes in favour of Morris and Richmond have been redeemed.

The 50 per cent shareholding in Adulant Force Limited was acquired for £81,000 in cash and £2m unsecured loan notes payable to £1m two years after issue and to £1m when the Club returns to the Premier League.

LUFC, via Mr Bates, took control of the Board on 21 January 2005. It was apparent from the outset that further injections of loans/equity would be required. Many millions of pounds were immediately made available to LU AFC by discounting future receipts such as Premier League revenues and transfer fee entitlement. Cash flows showed that the Club would need cash injections of £4.4m by August 2005 and a further £2.5m by September 2005.

In May 2005, LUFC exercised the call option in respect of the remaining 50 per cent of Adulant Force Limited. Melvyn Levi claimed that the option had been incorrectly exercised.

As a result of the failure of the Yorkshire Consortium to complete the option both Grayling and Owen refused to support the rights issue though both said they would have done if the option had been completed. In such circumstances FSF felt unable to take up its rights. The Yorkshire Consortium has now received advice from leading counsel, which advises that the Trustees should not have opposed the exercise of the option. Despite this advice, no move was made by the Trustees to complete the option.

The real reason why the consortium refused to honour its obligations arises out of a dispute between Mr Levi and Mr Bates. He led most of the negotiations with Bates. During negotiations it was suggested that Levi may retain his position as a director of the club following the "Bates" takeover. However, the whole board felt behaviour was such that he was an inappropriate person to have on the board.

Negotiations took place but at this time Robert Weston appeared on the scene. It appears that Weston may have acted as banker to Levi although Levi always claimed the funds invested in Leeds were his own.

Weston saw the option as a way to gain advantage from Leeds. He made various demands but ended up demanding a payment of £250,000 plus 10 per cent of LU AFC to complete the option.

Without the injection of funds that were to be raised by the



rights issue, LU AFC would have a negative bank balance of £2,453m as at the end of September.

LUFC had no funds and Adulant Force's only asset was its shares in LU AFC. In the circumstances, the Board of LU AFC decided to approach FSF to invite them to invest directly in the Club. FSF had already lent LU AFC £4.4m. It therefore had a major interest in seeing the Company survive. FSF offered to subscribe for 2.5m shares at par (one pound each) and convert £2.5m of FSF's loan to equity.

The directors of all the Companies involved genuinely believe that the placing of the shares was the only realistic way to raise the required funding. If the YC had not delayed completion of the option the LUFC rights issue could have been completed which would have raised more than adequate funds, to provide for both LU AFC and LUFC and a direct placing with FSF would not have been necessary.

The Advice of Leading Counsel was taken and he confirmed that the Directors had acted correctly.

The issue of shares to FSF has diluted the shareholdings of LUFC and Adulant Force to about 6 per cent. That 3 per cent holding was the only asset of LUFC and it had no prospect of raising funds elsewhere.

The name of the Company was changed to Roman's Heavies (RHL) on 2 December 2005 and Mr Bates and Jayne McGuinness resigned in the Spring of 2006. Taylor met with insolvency practitioners to decide the best way to liquidate RHL. The liquidation was made when Levi presented his own petition to wind up the Company.

The Company went into liquidation on 23 August 2006 with Astor its biggest creditor. The Official Receiver investigated the insolvency and said there was nothing adverse to report to the DTI.

BKL were appointed as liquidators and are close to finalising the liquidation.

It must be stressed that if the consortium had honoured the option then the rights issue would have proceeded. In trying to be greedy the consortium shot themselves in the foot.

Welcome all to another big, big game for us.



A wonderful strike from Chris Brunt proved the decisive moment in last weekend's derby clash at Elland Road. Despite trailing to an early Marcus Tudgay goal, United were dominating the contest against the Owls. Ian Moore, David Healy and Eddie Lewis were all denied by visiting goalkeeper Iain Turner, while Rui Marques had a shot cleared off the line by Frank Simek. Healy also had a penalty appeal waved away, and Owls defender Richard Wood escaped without caution after an apparent tug on the Ulsterman.

But, eight minutes before half-time, Chris Brunt unleashed a superb strike from fully 45 yards to leave Graham Stack with no chance, and the goal proved a decisive blow.

Wednesday were reduced to 10-men on 49 minutes when Tudgay was

dismissed for kicking the ball away, but the Owls still managed to conjure up another terrific goal when Jermaine Johnson finished off a sweeping move.

At 3-0 down with 36 minutes left, it could have been the cue to give up, but the lads battled hard and got back on the scoresheet with two minutes remaining when Lee Bullen sliced through his own goal. Within 60 seconds it was game on when Richard Cresswell bagged his second of the season, but time ran out on hopes of a dramatic comeback.

Boss Dennis Wise said: "I'm disappointed with the result, but I was chuffed with the players. I thought they did great. We ended up with two wonder goals scored against us that might not happen again. We showed a lot of spirit. At 3-0 down they wanted the ball and they kept going. We didn't have one player hiding and I was pleased with that. They showed a lot of character to try and get back into it."

ALL SYSTEMS GO AS CRESSY PREPARES FOR 'DOGFIGHT'



Stepping into the heat of a relegation battle when you've spent most of the season fighting to recover from a serious knee injury is hardly the ideal situation. But it's the one that Richard Cresswell has found himself in.

"No, it's not the best thing to be facing and it has been difficult for me coming into a team that has not been getting good results but I am just glad to be able to play football again," he said during a break from preparations for today's crunch clash against Luton Town.

Whatever the circumstances, however, Cresswell is right back in it. *"We are in a dogfight, there's no doubt about that. We are bottom of the league with 10 games to go and in a bit of a mess. It would be the great escape if we got ourselves out of it."*

"But the lads still believe we can do it and as far as I am concerned I just hope that I can play my part to the full in keeping Leeds in the Championship."

"The lads will not lie down. We'll be giving it everything we have got until the end of the season. There are still 30 points to play for and we have got to keep our heads up," he added.

United's current situation is one that Cresswell is experiencing as a senior player for the first time in his career.




"When I was at Sheffield Wednesday about seven years ago we were relegated from the Premier League but I was more of a squad player then and didn't play many games.

"So this is really the first time I have gone through this sort of thing as a senior player and it is difficult. For me, though, it is all about playing for Leeds United and playing as many games as I can," admitted the 29-year-old.

Results at Elland Road have not been as productive as hoped for and with time running out for United in their fight to avoid relegation is it a question of the players feeling added pressure when playing at home?

"I think you put yourself under pressure because you want to get that result so badly for everyone involved



and when it doesn't happen it is very disappointing. It's disappointing for everyone, not just the fans, but for the players.

"It ruins your weekend and your week afterwards. My wife doesn't get many words out of me if we don't get the right result," he added.

Cresswell got off the mark – for the second time this season! – when he scored in the 3-2 defeat by Sheffield Wednesday. "I think I have done alright since I came back in but I now need to get a few more goals. It's been stop-start for me this season and I think I 'scored' against Birmingham the other week, though it wasn't given."


When Cresswell joined United at the start of the 2005-06 season in a

£1.1 million transfer from Preston, he came here in preference to Sheffield United to join the club he has supported since his childhood. It was a dream move for him but things quickly turned sour when he picked up his first knee injury. And, once recovered from that, to pick up a very serious injury to his other knee was devastating.

"You could say it has been a bit of a rollercoaster for me ever since I joined Leeds.

"I think I played some good football over the Christmas period during my first season with the club and then I injured my right knee and had to have another operation, before breaking down again in the build-up to this season," he said.

Ironically, Cresswell had been a player who had managed to steer clear of major injuries before joining United. "I played for five years at Preston without really having a bad injury. I tore my hamstring once in that time but the physios hardly ever saw me in the treatment room.

"I actually told the chairman that when I signed for Leeds so in view of what has happened to me since, I bet that hasn't gone down too well!

"The trouble I have had with my knees has been horrendous for me but hopefully all that is behind me now. I had three operations on the right knee but it feels great now," he said.

When he underwent the third operation, there were doubts in his mind that things might not turn out right for him. "You do think like that because it was a bad injury. It was very similar to what Ole Gunnar Solskjaer had and he was out for two and half years. Jamie Redknapp had to retire with it.


"But there are people who come back from it and that is what gave me hope. I played with a guy at Preston who had the same op and it worked for him. The surgeon who operated on me has done a great job to get me back to full fitness."

The importance of today's game against Luton is what he has been concentrating all his efforts on. He knows only too well that United missed out on a chance to close the gap when they failed to beat Sheffield Wednesday.

"The other results went our way that day and that made it even more disappointing because we had the chance to lessen the gap and we didn't take it.

"We have got to keep our heads up, keep on training hard and giving 110 per cent when you pull that white shirt on. If you do that I think the fans will see it and hopefully we can turn things around," he added.





If you could ban a TV programme which would it be? Some of those reality programmes are good but those where people just make a fool of themselves, get drunk and mess around, are just so boring to watch.


If you could star in any film or stage role, which would it be? Probably one of those movies like Braveheart or something similar that tells a really good story.

PLAYER TALK SHAUN DERRY

Tottenham's 1991 FA Cup final victory over Nottingham Forest is a game that United midfielder Shaun Derry singles out as a particular memory, not because he was supporter of either team but solely because he idolised Paul Gascoigne.

"When I was a kid I was a big fan of Paul Gascoigne, as I'm sure every other young lad was at the time. He was my hero and I had watched him have an unbelievable World Cup in 1990, although it did end in tears for him," Shaun recalled.

Gascoigne, of course, was in the Tottenham side that went on to win the FA Cup 2-1 after extra time and Shaun was there with his Forest supporting brother Rob.

"My brother was very much behind Forest, of course, but being a Notts County fan, I had no allegiance to either of the teams at Wembley. But as a massive fan of Paul Gascoigne I was really looking forward to seeing him play in the final."

"But I remember that he completely lost his rag in that game. He two-footed Garry Parker after about a minute and should have been sent off and then he did a silly tackle on Gary Charles and he snapped his own cruciate ligament and got stretchered off," said Shaun.

That was after 14 minutes. Nayim took Gascoigne's place and Spurs were soon trailing to a 15th minute goal from Stuart Pearce's free-kick. They had to wait until the 53rd minute for the equaliser scored by Paul Stewart. The game went to extra time and was settled in Spurs' favour in the 94th minute with an own-goal from Des Walker.

Shaun said that he had tears in his eyes as he watched Gascoigne being carried from the field. *"He was only about 22 years old but he had done so well in a World Cup finals and I thought that he was at the top of his game,"* he added.

Coincidentally, Shaun suffered a similar injury to Gascoigne's only three weeks after taking up his YTS scholarship at Notts County but went on to make a full recovery.

OUR STRIKERS NEED TO START STICKING THESE CHANCES AWAY

This is it. We've definitely reached crunch time now.

There is no good beating about the bush. We are in a hole and it is getting to the stage now where if we don't do something about it we will be in it too deep to climb out.

It is strictly down to the players and they have to stand up and be counted during the remainder of our matches. They have to display confidence, a belief in themselves and a will to win.

And if they can do that then they definitely have the quality to get us out of trouble.

I fully appreciate that we are fast running out of matches. The Sheffield Wednesday game was another that



came and went without us being able to take advantage of it. Another home disappointment.

A few weeks ago we had plenty of games but now we are down to 10 – five at home and five away. That's 30 points at stake.

You have to say that our last few home games have, by and large, been very disappointing. We had a couple of good results – against Coventry City and Crystal Palace – but we couldn't beat Barnsley, Hull City, QPR or last week Sheffield Wednesday. Realistically, these were all games I fully expected us to win.

I thought there were 12 points there for us but we managed to take only three from them so it is now becoming pretty critical. We really have to start winning our home games. Certainly this one today against Luton is a 'must win' because if we don't manage that, and they beat us, then the gap would widen still further. They would be eight points ahead of us and that would be a big gap to close with only nine games then remaining.

We have got to win and if we do, we drag them into it. We would be right back in the pack – though, obviously, one or two of the other teams down at the bottom might win also. When you saw what the other results affecting teams down near the bottom were we clearly missed a wonderful opportunity

last week against Sheffield Wednesday. Had we got a win against Wednesday then we would have been right in among it. But we didn't, so we are where we were.

The pressure is obviously on the players but to be quite honest we have been creating lots of chances. The problem has been that the strikers have not been putting them away.

Once they start doing that we will win matches. But the longer they go missing chance after chance, the opposition take confidence from that and can break away and stick another one in and then you are in trouble, as happened last week against Wednesday.

Putting the ball in the back of the net has been one of our big problems all season. Our goal tally of 36 in as many games is poor. In fact it's very poor.

What I can't understand is that when you look at our strikers – David Healy, Ian Moore, Robbie Blake and Richard Cresswell – you have players who have all been 20-goal a season strikers at times in their careers so it is hard to accept that none of them at this particular time are getting goals.

The worrying thing about it is that these are not young and inexperienced strikers. They are strikers with proven track records. They need to have a belief in themselves and to start sticking these chances away.


After today's game we've two away matches – at Leicester City and Southend – and a win against Luton would send us into those games with a bit more optimism. We could then go to Leicester on Tuesday and do ourselves big favour.

Southend have been struggling lately, and Leicester are below mid-table so both these games are winnable as far as we are concerned.

One of the fortunate points for us is that we still have to play one or two teams who are down there near the bottom and it is up to us to beat them and that would get us out of trouble.

Although we haven't managed to win our recent away fixtures we have looked a better side. We looked quite good against Birmingham at St Andrews and for periods of the games at Norwich, Wolves and Cardiff we looked the better side.

We should have a reasonably big crowd here today following the price reductions and it will be nice to see a big crowd get behind the players. I just hope the lads will put up a better performance for the fans than they did against QPR. So here's hoping...

JONNY MISSES OUT



GREATEST GAME SOUTHAMPTON 1972

MEMORIES ARE MADE OF THIS...

Don Revie's United side were at their brilliant best and it was no surprise to find that this 7-0 thrashing of Southampton in March 1972 is among the front runners for the fans' choice as United's greatest ever game.

United's class shines through in seven-goal spree

Current United director Peter Lorimer notched a hat-trick as Don Revie's side turned on the style and went goal-crazy with a scintillating display of attacking football.

This was the season when Revie let his players off the leash and gave them the freedom to express themselves - and express themselves they certainly did in a display which saw plenty of individual flair as well as teamwork and a burning desire to bulge the back of the net.

Everyone played their part to the full and, frankly, the Saints didn't know what hit them once United had taken the lead.

Lorimer's three goals came in the 42nd, 64th and 70th minutes and took his tally in the League to 18. The first of those strikes in this game made the score 2-0 and came two minutes after Allan Clarke had hammered the ball into the Saints net following a superb pass from Eddie Gray.

That was the foundation for victory but at the interval few of us at the game could have envisaged quite what would happen in the second half. Such was United's supremacy that they knocked in five goals in a devastating 18-minute period.

Clarke scored his second in the 62nd minute to make it 3-0, then Lorimer scored his second and third goals while Jack Charlton (right) got his name on the scoresheet in the 74th minute, to mark his 599th

league appearance for the club, before Mick Jones finished off the scoring 10 minutes from the end.

Billy Bremner's partnership in midfield with Giles was a major factor in United's dominance but there were, also, some classy touches from Gray while United's forwards demonstrated lethal and clinical finishing. The goal that Charlton scored proved to be a popular one and it was set up for him by his central defensive partner, Norman Hunter. The pair of them had had very little to do in defence, especially in the second half and they were both fed up.

I remember Norman telling me that he had had enough and that he decided to have a run down the flank. To his surprise the ball was passed to him and in turn Norman crossed to the far post where, upon looking up, he

saw Big Jack with a huge grin on his face as he headed the ball into the net.

Well, Revie had told his team to express themselves so the defensive duo had a ready-made excuse when they got back onto the dressing room!

The fans lapped it up and as United began to keep possession late on there were chants of 'Ole!' from the crowd every time the ball was passed from one United player to another without any Saints player being able to get near the ball.

When, later, I asked Big Jack how he felt about his approaching 600th league game he replied: 'A bit sick really, I suppose. Seriously, though, I haven't given it a lot of thought. It will be just another game for me.'

That, typically, was Big Jack.



This season's meetings with The Hatters would rank high on any list of pivotal fixtures. For Luton the difference between October and now is almost the length of the division. For Leeds the return match is a double-edged opportunity to bury an unpleasant memory.

The two clubs have gone through many emotions in the five months since Leeds lost 5-1 at Kenilworth Road. In the north it has been a long haul at the wrong end of the table. In the south there was a huge mood swing as Luton plunged towards the danger zone.

The fans dared to think about a promotion challenge when Luton went up to fifth place in the autumn but within two months they were down to 20th after seven consecutive league defeats – the worst run in Mike Newell's 24 years as manager or player.

"It's been a horrible time for us," he said of a losing sequence that began with a 5-0 defeat at Ipswich and only stopped one match short of the bleakest spell in over a century. In 1900 they lost eight in a row and failed to secure re-election in their third season in the Football League.

Re-admitted in 1920, they eventually planted their flag at the summit with an FA Cup Final in the first of three spells in the old First Division

and finally a golden decade until relegation in the last season before the formation of the Premier League.

By 2001 they had fallen back to the lowest level but the recovery was satisfactorily swift with a first promotion under Joe Kinnear and then a League One championship at the end of Newell's second season in 2005.

Shrewd management is essential within the constraints of a stadium with a capacity of only 10,000. Newell has often said that a new ground is the only way forward but until one is built – probably close to the M1 – the club has to juggle its resources.

The management team can only wonder what heights might have been reached had they been able to develop a successful squad. In two seasons since coming up, five players, who cost under £300,000 in transfer fees, were sold for almost £9 million.

The defence was shorn of a potential England player when Curtis Davies went into the Premiership with West Brom, and the damage to scoring power was incalculable with the departures of Steve Howard and Rowan Vine. They shared 51 league goals in the past two seasons and Vine was this season's top scorer when he left in January.

Midfield also took a double hit with the loss of Kevin Nicholls and Carlos Edwards. Suffice to say that Edwards and Vine shared three of the goals against Leeds in the match that preceded the appointment of Dennis Wise at Elland Road.

Other experienced players joined the long-term casualty list. Former England semi-pro international PAUL UNDERWOOD, who played for Rushden

Et Diamonds against Leeds in 1999, has been out all season and Australian defender **CHRIS COYNE** has made only intermittent contributions.

October was perhaps a typical example of the misfortunes. In the weeks on either side of the win against Leeds, they lost the services of two players. New striker **SAM PARKIN** has not featured since undergoing ankle surgery but full-back **SOL DAVIS** was back in a couple of months after a health scare on the journey to Ipswich.

Both players put down roots at Swindon Town. Davis played for the Wiltshire club for four years before joining Luton for £600,000 in 2002 and Parkin left Chelsea to score 73 goals for the Robins until he was bought by Ipswich for £450,000. The Hatters then paid £340,000 for his second move in a year.

Even with the return of Davis and Coyne at Christmas, the defence caught for the worst of new problems in

January. Three-quarters of the back four in the early-season rise to the play-off positions missed a battling performance against West Brom at The Hawthorns. As at Birmingham a fortnight earlier, the Hatters were denied a point by a last-minute goal.


A legacy of the Birmingham match was a badly gashed leg keeping **MARKUS HEIKKINEN** out of the side for seven weeks. The former HJK Helsinki player arrived at Kenilworth Road from Scotland last season and he is now a regular in the Finland team at the top of their qualifying group for Euro 2008.

KEVIN FOLEY, who missed the first four games in January, is a younger player making progress on the international ladder. Capped at B level in November, the Republic of Ireland full-back was called into the senior squad in February.


With Heikkinen and Foley back in the club side, Luton secured a hard-earned point at Stoke but their resources were again stretched. Davis faced suspension after a red card and they were without **LEON BARNETT**, an impressive young centre-back with 31 consecutive league and cup appearances up to January.

Irish U-21 international **KEITH KEANE** had a run of starts when the injuries decimated the defence and was needed again at Stoke when a more experienced deputy, **RUSSELL PERRETT**, had to drop out at half-time. Perrett, now 33, came out of non-League football to play for Portsmouth and Cardiff.

Four goalkeepers have been named in the squad during the season,

although the shuffling here was not attributable to injuries. **MARLON BERESFORD** crammed more than half of his 500-plus appearances into six seasons at Burnley in the 1990s. Now 37, he was Luton's No 1 from the promotion year until serving a one-match suspension this season.

DEAN BRILL, who made his debut three seasons ago at the age of 17, stepped in on that occasion, with teenager **ZAC BARRETT** on the bench, and then Dean Kiely spent two months on loan before Beresford reclaimed his place in the Championship side in February.

The turnover of strikers underlined the scale of the selection issues facing manager Newell. By last month he had none of the trio who started league games in the first part of the season. With Vine sold and Parkin injured, **WAYNE FEENEY** was the one survivor until the Northern Ireland international sustained a knee ligament injury.

The £500,000 summer signing, **ADAM BOYD**, eventually came into contention, though not up to the speed of his career at Hartlepool, where he won promotion under Newell in 2003 and scored





TIGHT CHAMPIONSHIP MARGINS STILL OFFER HOPE



Paul Butler, Leeds United's former captain, could not have been more astute when back in August he described this season's Championship as "the height of competition".

His comments were perhaps a sensible attempt to restrain expectation at Elland Road so soon after the Play-Off final, but Butler's assessment was no mere diversion. With 10 games of the season still remaining, the Championship is a long way from resolution, at either end of the table.

On the final day of last season, the deficit between top and bottom was 68 points, a huge margin and greater than the 2004-05 term when Rotherham United limped home with only five wins, 14 draws and 29 points to their name.

Last May, Reading's tally reached three figures, easing them to the title, and Sheffield United were only 10 points short of their century when they completed the season and won automatic promotion. Runaway winners – and losers – emerge with inevitable regularity in the Championship, but this season has been a break from tradition.

At the start of the final straight, there are 10 clubs in a position to top the division. As many as 11 are still twitching in the bottom half of the table, wondering if the relegation places will suck them in. The standard of football in the Championship may have been poor this season – an opinion shared by most people who have watched the league at length – but the league has not been found wanting in the competitive stakes.

One other point is worth making. The

points accrued by Reading and Sheffield United with 10 games remaining 12 months ago would have allowed both clubs to lead this season's Championship by a comfortable distance today. Watford, meanwhile, would be tied for second place. The fact that


Watford are preparing to drop out of the Premiership while

Reading and the Blades make good their survival should remind the three clubs who enter the top flight not to get too comfortable.

It is to Leeds United's advantage that the division is so tight. The club are without a victory in five games, and have won three of their last 17 league matches. In a different competition, or a different season, the wall might already be covered in ink. But the Championship has so far failed to shake United.

Last weekend, every one of the Championship's bottom six clubs failed to collect a victory, and only Southend United improved their points tally at all. Had Hull City beaten Ipswich on Tuesday evening, six points would have separated Leeds from safety, a margin worsened by an appalling goal difference which is becoming increasingly relevant to their league position and future status.

As it was, Ipswich rattled five goals past Hull, and a win over Luton this afternoon will move United to within

two points of escaping the bottom three. Wise is not necessarily clutching at straws when he discusses the importance of small margins. The most significant small detail, however, is that the number of United's remaining fixtures will be in single figures at 5pm this evening.

Much has been said, written and argued about over the course of the season. Most of it is now immaterial, at least until May 6 when Leeds as a team and a club can be properly and sensibly dissected. At this point, Wise's players should look at the make-up of the division and realise that the contests at both ends of the table are there to be won and lost. If United's worst-case scenario is realised, they can only blame themselves.

Enjoy the game.

That was Dennis and Gus's first away game since coming to the club, and the manager admitted afterwards he had learnt a lot from the game.


