



successful magazine together.





# blues just miss out

**Southend's under-18s did their part in the title race, as they overwhelmed Portsmouth 2-0, but in the end had to settle for second place in the Youth Alliance.**

With QPR beating Brighton in the last game of the season, it means the Blues finished just two points off top spot in a dramatic close to a productive season for the Club.

Southend were always in firm control during the first half at Boots & Laces, as James Lindie had a near post shot blocked to safety before he rose first inside the box to meet a cross, but could only head the ball on to the roof of the goal.

Lindie was becoming a heavily involved influence in attack, but it wasn't working in his favour, as Luke Thurlbourne's shot found its way to him from close range, only for a quick interception to block his route to goal.

The deadlock was finally broken in the 33rd minute when Johnny Herd's long throw-in was flicked on by Ronnie Jones and his fellow centre-back, Tom Hopkins was first to react with a deft touch that knocked the ball above the goalkeeper.

#### *Domination*

The Blues' domination didn't stop there and Lindie's left wing cross was planted perfectly into the path of Richard Priest, but he could only side-foot the ball off target from a few yards out.

Portsmouth had been largely anonymous in attack, but they supplied a scare on the stroke of half-time when they were awarded a free kick on the edge of the box and rattled the post.

The visitors certainly took some encouragement from that chance and they were much more of a force after the interval, but their main downfall was that their main threats did not come until after Southend had doubled their advantage.

Portsmouth's goalkeeper was kept busy during the opening exchanges and you couldn't say they had not been warned as to what was to come.

The second goal was scored seven minutes past the hour mark when Hopkins again arrived on cue to meet a floated free kick and with a crisp finish, arrowed the ball into the far corner of the net.

Portsmouth upped their game and it required


Southend to keep their composure at the back, but the one time they were able to breach the defence, they should have scored.

Joe Welch was called into action to deal with a one-on-one runner and managed to get a vital touch to knock the ball around the goal.

The danger wasn't over though and from the

resulting corner, Portsmouth caused panic in the penalty box and hit the crossbar, as Welch struggled to claim the ball.

Over the course of the 90 minutes though the Blues were comfortable winners and should be commended for allowing the title race to enter what proved to be an exciting finale.

# no win situation

**Lee Bradbury was on target for Southend's reserves, but his goal couldn't prove the difference, as they were held at home by Leyton Orient.**


The Blues took early control of the match at Roots Hall and created a high number of chances - twice hitting the woodwork - but in the end had to settle for a 1-1 draw.

Bradbury went close for Southend in the early exchanges, after turning his marker outside the box and arrowing a low shot wide of the post.

Franck Moussa tried his luck from long range with a 20 yard shot nestling into the arms of goalkeeper Glenn Morris.

Charles Ademeno looked to have made the vital breakthrough when he latched on to a threaded pass to get beyond the defence, but from just a few yards out, he saw Morris make an outstanding save low to his left.

Jason Demetriou supplied Orient's best response when he blazed over from just outside the penalty box, with Southend relatively comfortable in defence.



The opening goal duly arrived for the Blues after 31 minutes with James Lawson's attempted shot deflecting into the path of Bradbury, who couldn't miss from in front of goal, as he slotted the ball underneath the body of Morris.

Orient were still able to get back on level terms four minutes shy of half time, when Donny Barnard collected a loose ball from a corner and rifled the ball into the back of the net via a post and beyond a statuesque Steve Collis.

Southend did continue to pose problems after the interval with Lawson's shot bypassing Morris, but with Bradbury unable to stretch for the loose ball, it eventually rolled out to Ademeno, who could only sidefoot wide from an acute angle.

David Cowley brought the best out of Morris with a 25 yard free kick tipped over the bar before, from a similar position, the young winger saw a similarly positioned set piece cannon off the top of the crossbar.

Jack Page caused a late scare when he found space inside the box and fired wide of the post, as the match petered out to a stalemate.

**Southend United's reserves slipped to a disappointing 3-0 defeat against Norwich City this week at Roots Hall.**

Paul Brush's second string were 2-0 down at the break; but only after enjoying the majority of the early chances.

David Cowley went closest to opening the scoring for The Blues as early as the third minute when his effort from close range forced a reaction save from Canaries keeper Steven Arnold.

Blues then nearly found an opening through Franck Moussa but he screwed his shot wide of the far post inside the penalty box, before Matt Harrold headed over the bar from Cowley's left wing cross.

Former West Ham trainee Cowley was then back in the thick of the action midway through the first half when another shot nestled into the keepers arms.

However, Norwich struck back when Andrew Cave-Brown's shot hit the post and nestled into the far corner to put the Canaries 1-0 up after 30 minutes.

That was how it stayed until three minutes before half-time when the visitors doubled their advantage with a slick move inside the Blues penalty box.

Seb Muddel slipped past the Blues defence and his cross allowed Kris Renton to side foot past trialist Southend keeper Frankem Chamberlin.

United made a change at the break, Joel Ledigster back from a three month loan with Gravesend replacing Frenchman Ntolla Lucien, and should have pulled one back on the hour mark.

James Lawson found himself in a one-on-one with the City keeper but he was unable to beat the shot-stopper before Spencer Prior then headed over the crossbar from a Cowley corner.

However, the result was finally put beyond Southend when with four minutes remaining Robert Eagle's unleashed a confident strike from the edge of the box to beat Chamberlin in the bottom corner.



The Hatters may be lacking the burning desire to accompany matches, but there is no doubt they will be looking to end the season with some sort of optimism.

It is the least expected by manager Kevin Blackwell, recently appointed to replace the controversial departure of Mike Newell.

2-0 and he has since gone on to establish himself as a regular, despite being sent off at Brentford in the League Cup back in September.


## lewis emanuel

Were you happy with the appointment of Kevin Blackwell as manager?



forward thinking people. It was a big setback to be relegated, but I believe we can rebuild to move back into the Championship as soon as possible and further down the line build a new stadium.

What is your score prediction for the match? You don't seem to be coping too well in your home games and hopefully that pressure will work in our favour. I reckon we can sneak a 2-1 win.

## view from the other side...

**ever-eager to get an opposing view, we get the views of the hatters' boss Kevin Blackwell...**

**It may seem like Kevin Blackwell has only been in the Luton hot seat for five minutes, but he already has his work cut out building for the future.**

Blackwell has big plans for Luton Town and knows their relegation to League One will provide him with the chance to start from scratch to get the team moving forward.

Always looking for a positive angle, Blackwell insisted that their relegation to League One was not the end of the world and while ultimately disappointed, is upbeat about steering the club back up the football ladder.

He said: "I can only deal with the two games that we've got left and I want the team to go out and try to win them; that's for sure.

"But I think it's quite clear that I inherited a big problem when I came to this Club, and as much as I'd like to wave that magic wand and clear it, it won't happen overnight.

"It's a difficult job and I know how difficult it is for clubs to go down and then come straight back up again.

"I'll make no bones about it; it's going to be tough.

### Hurts

"Believe you me, it hurts to be relegated. I haven't come here to sit in the lower echelons of English football.

"It's the first time I've been down there for 12 years and I aim to get the Club back up there as quick as I can.

"The Chairman has high levels of expectation and demands. The players will have to accept that.

"What I've seen is that there is quality at this football club, although we will have to add some experience to help those players through."

The former Leeds' boss is clearly ambitious and even with two matches of the current season to play, he is looking for his players to fight for their right to remain at the club.

Blackwell clearly has the persona of not being swayed by reputations and even with such little time left, is looking for the players to demonstrate they can meet his viewpoint.


"Everybody is fighting for their position at this football club," he said.

"It's important that the players know exactly what I'm looking for and the standards that I'm trying to set.

"The club needs overhauling and we'll try to do the best we can in the summer.

"As far as I'm concerned, if they do their job then they've got a chance to stay here - if they don't they won't.

"It's as simple as that because length of contract means nothing to me."

**The Head of Youth helped his Southend's under-18s run QPR a close second in the race for the Youth Alliance, with a marvellous spell of form keeping them firmly in the running till the very end.**

It was new territory from recent seasons for the youth team to reach such a lofty position, as Duncan allowed the youth team to excel upon the established groundwork built from the previous campaign.

With the raw potential of Franck Moussa and Charles Ademeno raising the biggest smile from Duncan, he is glowing about the prospect of seeing more players make the grade.

Having monitored the duo's expansion, Duncan will hope the professional contracts they earned will provide a stern platform that the other young players at the Club can themselves aim towards.

Although the end of the youth campaign has now arrived, in many aspects the hard work begins again with Duncan undoubtedly looking to set the stones in motion for further key developments at Southend and raise the bar even further.

*You must be pleased with the progress that has been made over the course of the season?*

The two players going through to the first team is the ultimate goal. As I said at the start, the job in hand for the youth department, all the way through from the centres, is to produce players for the first team. I look at the Centre of Excellence and what we've done there; things are going in the right direction.

*It has certainly been a solid league campaign in finishing runners-up?*

The players have put in such a lot of hard work along with the under-16s who have come in. I think we have used something like 56 appearances by the under-16s this year. In our last game of the season against Portsmouth we actually had an under-14, Julian Okai, make an eight minute appearance and it just shows the quality that we have got in the Centre of Excellence.

*Seeing Charles Ademeno and Franck Moussa earn professional contracts must inspire the other youngsters?*

The players know that seeing the likes of Charles and Franck step forward is a big encouragement for them because they can see there is a clear path. The players work hard, they come out and we do double

sessions. They want to learn and are desperate to progress and get into Steve Tilson's first team. As long as they have got that mentality, then you've got a chance. I am so pleased with how the season has gone and it's great to see Franck sitting on the bench for the first team.

*It must have been good for the players to see a big following attend their last match of the season at Boots & Laces?*

We hadn't had a successful youth set-up for quite a while and I think that is something that Ron Martin, Steve Tilson and Paul Brush highlighted once the Club started moving forward within the first team. It was an area that they felt they needed to strengthen and now the fans might come down a bit more on a Saturday morning if the first team is at home. It's great to have people on the sidelines and the first thing the players said to me after the game (against Portsmouth), was how good it was to have so many fans in attendance. It was great for them and I'd like to see a bit more of that next season.

*Purely on games, what would you pick out as your key moment this season?*

Purely on games it would be going up to Coventry in the FA Youth Cup. I thought that we played tremendous there and were unlucky to go out on penalties. That was a good highlight for us. And then the backend of this season, since Christmas, I think that we have turned a corner so well and the players set themselves targets in every game and they have overachieved by two points. That's a great highlight for me, that they've sat down and set their targets and, better yet, achieved them.

*Although the season has drawn to a close, how busy a time will the summer be for you?*

It's a massive time for us. We go on a lot of tours now and take the boys away, which is a big part of their development. The tour programme is vital to us to get the boys away for a week and take them to tournaments. We get them to play against different styles, different temperaments, different types of refereeing and also teach them to live away from home. The first few tours we had went really well and we have a nice building block with which to work on over the next couple of years. We then have to prepare for the new intake of the seven scholars that are coming in - it never ends. In one way the football bit shuts down, but now all the administration work kicks in again, so we will have a busy month to sort all that out.

## under 16's reach final in le portel

Following the success of last year's tournament, we found ourselves invited yet again to the prestigious tournament held in a small French coastal town, approximately 10 minutes from Bologne.

### blues 1 barnsley 3

**Southend's inconsistent end to the season continued after they slipped to a 3-1 defeat at home to Barnsley.**

Roots Hall was in expectant mood after the midweek victory at Preston, but the Blues could never perform to those same heights and lost vital ground at the foot of the table.

Southend found themselves behind after only 15 minutes when Daniel Nardiello cut in from the right, picked out his spot and then curled the ball into the opposite corner of the net.

Mark Gower blazed a free kick narrowly over and a fierce strike from Jamal Campbell-Ryce was parried above the goal by Nick Colgan, but nothing clear cut was presented the Blues' way.

Instead Barnsley were able to double their lead in bizarre circumstances after 29 minutes when Kyel Reid's corner went directly into the goal, as it sailed over the head of Darryl Flahavan and dipped in at the far post.

Southend's response was limited, with clear frustration breaching into their play, as they found no way through the visiting defence.

Campbell-Ryce's cross deflected into the path of Gower, but he could only steer the ball straight at Colgan inside the box.

In fact, Nardiello could have increased the Tykes' lead on the stroke of half time when he ghosted into the box, but with the ball played in front of his feet from just a few yards out, he scooped it over a gaping goal.

A last throw of the dice saw Steven Hammell crack the post from a free kick in the dying minutes, but there was to be no dramatic comeback.

The second half was much more intense, as Southend found greater range in their attack and piled everybody forward.

Of course, this was needed after Barnsley scored a third goal on 51 minutes when Nardiello nipped ahead of everyone from a corner and directed the ball above Flahavan at the far post.

More urgency came with Simon Francis' long range strike fumbled by Colgan, but no one could pick up the loose ball.


But Southend did finally hit the back of the net in the 68th minute after Lee Bradbury initially headed onto the crossbar and Adam Barrett had a goalbound shot blocked, but it was third time lucky with Mark Gower crashing the ball home via the post.

Bradbury rifled a shot goalwards that Colgan turned around the post, while Campbell-Ryce twisted his way outside the box before rifling the ball inches over the goal. Peter Clarke also miscued a free header wide of the target.


With Barnsley content to defend their lead, they resorted to counter attacks, but one such move nearly saw them add further woes to Southend when Grant McCann struck the woodwork from 20 yards.

# seasons to remember

## classic campaigns

**Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS selects ten Luton Town 'Classic Campaigns' from 60 post-war seasons.**



### 1954/55

Gordon Turner scored 32 goals as Luton Town won promotion to the top-flight for the first time in 1954/55. Dally Duncan's side had a hugely impressive season, slamming four goals past Hull City, Rotherham, Liverpool and Port Vale. Tom Aherne and Shay Dunne were ever-present as Luton pipped Rotherham to the runners-up slot on goal average with a 3-0 win at Doncaster.

### 1958/59

Luton Town were FA Cup finalists for the first and only time in 1958/59. The Hatters were unbeaten in their opening ten First Division games, trouncing Manchester City 5-1 and scoring four goals past West Ham and Preston. They recovered from a lean spell to beat Arsenal 6-3 and Burnley 6-2, then top scorer Allan Brown netted four goals in a 5-1 demolition of Nottingham Forest but poor results over the closing weeks saw them finish below mid-table. Syd Owen's side lost 2-1 to Nottingham Forest in the F.A. Cup final.

### 1973/74

Luton Town regained top-flight status after an absence of 14 years in 1973/74. The Hatters recovered from a 4-0 defeat at Nottingham Forest on the opening day to hammer Carlisle 6-1, embarking on an eight-match unbeaten run. Harry Haslam signed Alan West from Burnley and Jimmy Husband from Everton as Luton maintained their promotion challenge. Husband netted a hat-trick in a 3-1 victory over rivals Orient, then leading marksman Barry Butlin scored three in a 4-2 win over Preston. Alan Garner and Bobby Thomson were ever-present and other stars included Peter Anderson and John Ryan as Luton finished runners-up.

### 1967/68

Bruce Rioch netted 24 goals as Luton Town won the Fourth Division title in 1967/68. New captain Terry Branston made his debut as the Hatters kicked off with a 1-1 draw at Wrexham and Ian Buxton arrived from Derby in September. Luton lost just two of their first 18 matches and beat Charlton in the League Cup first round, scoring 27 goals in a run of eight successive wins. Allan Brown's side went top of the table with a 2-0 win at Brentford in February and Keith Allen, Max Dougan, Fred Jardine, John Moore and Ray Whittaker also starred as they remained in pole position, clinching the title with a 4-0 victory over Crewe.

### 1969/70

Malcolm Macdonald scored 25 times as Luton Town won promotion in 1969/70. The Hatters had narrowly missed promotion the previous season and Bruce Rioch was sold to Aston Villa for a record fee, with Alec Stock signing Malcolm Macdonald, John Ryan and John Collins. Luton were early leaders after remaining unbeaten in their opening 13 matches, recruiting

### 1987/88

Ray Harford plotted Luton Town's 1988 Littlewoods Cup final triumph. Danny Wilson replaced Peter Nicholas in midfield, while Micky Weir arrived from Hibernian and Mike Newell moved to Leicester. The Hatters won 2-1 at Oxford and Luton lost just twice in 12 matches including a 7-4 win in the return match against Oxford, finishing ninth in the top-flight. They defeated Wigan 5-2, Coventry 3-1, Ipswich 1-0, Bradford City 2-0 and Oxford 3-1 in the Littlewoods Cup before beating Arsenal 3-2 in the final. Luton were also FA Cup semi-finalists and Simod Cup finalists.

### 1988/89

Luton Town were Littlewoods Cup finalists for the second consecutive season in 1988/89. Luton's first home win was 1-0 against Liverpool and they beat Southampton 6-1 in January but First Division form was generally disappointing, with the Hatters narrowly avoiding relegation by winning three of their last four games. Luton defeated Burnley 2-1, Leeds 2-0, Manchester City 3-1, Southampton 2-1 and West Ham 5-0 in the Littlewoods Cup before losing 3-1 to Nottingham Forest in the final.

### 2001/02

Steve Howard scored 24 times as Luton Town won promotion in 2001/02. Joe Kinnear's side were early leaders after winning their opening two matches and newcomer Carl Griffiths netted a hat-trick in a 5-1 win over Torquay. The Hatters briefly regained pole position after beating Darlington 5-2 in October and a late run of 12 successive wins, slamming five goals past Halifax and Mansfield, took Luton back to the top with two games remaining but they finished runners-up to Plymouth.

### 2004/05

Mike Newell managed Luton Town to the League One title in 2004/05. The Hatters stormed to the top of the table, winning 10 of their first 12 games. They beat Bradford City 4-0 and Wrexham 5-1, then Steve Howard netted a hat-trick in a 4-1 win at MK Dons. The 1-0 victory over Port Vale in December heralded a 14 match unbeaten run and Luton bounced back from a 3-1 defeat in the return fixture to hammer Bristol City 5-0. Briefly displaced as leaders by Hull, they triumphed 4-1 at Torquay and secured promotion with four games remaining. Luton won the title with a record 98 points.



Let us roar our appreciation for them to the rafters and thank them for some fantastic memories from this season.

After all, none of us knows what the future will hold. When I started writing for the programme at the beginning of the 2004-05 season, the club's long term future was still very much in the balance. I remember watching a diabolical 0-0 draw against Cambridge early on

in that campaign and thinking that I had seen at least one, if not both, of that season's relegation candidates.

Unusually for me, that belief turned out to be entirely correct as Cambridge departed the league that season.


It is remembering games like that which makes you realise just how far Tilly and Brush have taken us in such a short space of time. **100 years ago...**

Having already secured the Southern League division two title at their first attempt the Blues ended their first ever season with another title. A 5-0 win over Tunbridge Wells in a South Eastern League division two encounter secured that title as well. The result meant that in their first ever competitive season Southend United had a record, over the two competitions they entered, of played 40 won 31 drawn 5 and lost 4 with 143 goals scored and just 29 conceded!

**50 years ago...**

This week 50 years ago saw United draw 3-3 at champions elect Ipswich in a division three south encounter. 20,012 fans at Portman Road saw United behind 2-1 at half time but goals from John McGuigan, Kevin Baron and Roy Hollis gave the Blues a share of the points. A final day 1-0 home win over Millwall meant United finished a creditable 7th in the table.

**20 years ago...**


Twenty years ago this week and a rearranged Thursday night fixture at lowly Wrexham saw Paul Clark's promotion chasing side well beaten 4-0 in front of just 935 fans. Two days later and a 2-1 reverse at relegation threatened Burnley meant United had to win their remaining two fixtures, at home to Cambridge and away at Stockport, which they did pipping Wolves for third place. The two nil Friday night win over Stockport saw Richard Cadette score his 31st and last goal for the Blues as he was transferred to Sheffield United in the close season. Manager Clark was subsequently replaced by Dick Bate and became assistant manager.

**10 years ago...**

Hudders Town visited Roots Hall and consigned Ronnie Whelan's side to relegation. Only 4,762 fans were inside Roots Hall to see a young Terriers side see off United 2-1 thanks to goals either side of half time from Andy Payton and David Beresford. Jeroen Boere (pictured right) did pull a goal back for United eight minutes from time but it was too little too late. United's disappointing season ended a week later with a 4-0 reverse at Grimsby meaning a bottom place finish and the end of a seven year tenure in the second flight of English football.

**5 years ago...**

A meaningless mid table division three south against Macclesfield Town saw United's 2001-02 season come to an end. The only incentive for the Blues was a top half finish an all too forgettable season. 2,415 fans, including a large contingent from Essex, witnessed a 0-0 draw that meant United finished the season in 12th place and their hosts one place below. The only real excitement of the entire 90 minutes was when a bout of pushing involving Damon Searle in front of the two dug outs resulted in a 20 man brawl that saw Phil Whelan for the Blues booked and home defender Dave Ridder sent off.

# 2006/07

...a season in review

The highs and the lows, the joy and the pain, we remember it all here as we take a look back at our League and Cup efforts...



## August

Southend opened their Championship account with a 1-0 win over Stoke City to help close out the perfect start to the new season, courtesy of a first half penalty from Freddy Eastwood.

But a madcap 10 minutes at Crystal Palace in the second half saw a dogged Southend performance leave Selhurst Park empty handed in a 3-1 defeat. The Blues were set-up strongly, controlling the opening 45 minutes and scored through Eastwood, only for a lack of concentration on corners to be their ultimate undoing, as the hosts scored three goals in quick succession.

Southend came unstuck on their travels again, as they endured a frustrating afternoon in a 2-0 defeat at QPR.

Rangers managed to gain a firm grip on the match from the start with two first-half goals and although the Blues were a much better outfit after the interval, for all their endeavour they failed to find the cutting edge they needed up front.

Southend went on to heap misery on Sunderland with an Adam Barrett double helping to seal a comprehensive 3-1 victory. The defender scored either side of the interval, while Lee Bradbury added a late strike to help secure the three points.

Southend put their name into the hat for the second round of the League Cup for the first time since 1998 after they enjoyed a 3-1 win at Bournemouth.

A thunderbolt shot from Mark Gower and two second half strikes from Freddy Eastwood helped the Blues knock out their League One opponents and progress.

The Blues crashed to defeat at Leicester, as they went in search of their first points on their travels this season with the winning goal coming just five minutes shy of half time and proving enough to settle the encounter.

## September

September began with Southend and Sheffield Wednesday playing out a goalless stalemate in a match that saw both teams in effect cancel the other out.

What followed though was a feverish event at Roots Hall and some of the most exhilarating game of football you are likely to see, as Southend came back from the brink in a six-goal thriller against Norwich City.


Mark Gower's last minute strike helped turn the screw on Norwich in front of a vigorous atmosphere and handed Southend a point from a 3-3 draw that looked like slipping away, after the Blues found themselves 3-1 behind at the start of the second half. It was a sensational end to a remarkable game.

Matt Harrold chose the perfect occasion to score his first goal for Southend, and in the process help claim the Club's first away point of the season in a 1-1 draw at West Brom. The Blues grabbed a dramatic equaliser just eight minutes from time when Steve Hammell's right wing cross was headed in by the alert Harrold.



Southend went on to book their place in the third round of the Carling Cup for the first time since 1987 following a stunning conclusion to their 3-2 win over Brighton. Trailing 1-0 with just four minutes on the clock, the Blues turned the game on its head with goals from Billy Paynter, Lewis Hunt and Freddy Eastwood.

Yet Southend suffered stage fright in front of the cameras and allowed Cardiff to bask in the sunshine at Roots Hall on their way to a comprehensive 3-0 win in the presence of SKY.

Southend cut a further figure of frustration after suffering more toil on their travels in a 3-0 defeat at Derby. Further disappointment came from seeing the team drop into the bottom three of the Championship, as the Blues missed their usual rhythm and found goalscoring opportunities at a minimum.

### October

The harsh realities of Championship football continued to descend over Southend on the back of their third straight loss against Coventry City. Roots Hall had turned into a solemn silence by the end, with Dele Adebola hitting the decisive goal in the closing stages, to hand the visitors a narrow 3-2 victory.

A performance of steely determination helped Southend claim a much needed point at high flying Burnley after a goalless end to proceedings. In one of the longest journeys of the season, the Blues travelled home with a real boost to morale against a Clares side who were second in the Championship before kick-off.

Southend went on to blot their own copybook and endured a day they will quickly want to forget, after crashing to a 3-1 defeat at home to Ipswich, as the Club lost for the third successive time at Roots Hall.

Southend powered their way past Leeds United to record a 3-1 victory and in the process rewrote their history books to secure a place in the fourth round of the Carling Cup. This was new territory after a depleted team delivered an assured performance at Elland Road to make the last 16 of the competition for the first time.

It was another hard luck story for Southend in the Championship; the cruel twist of fate seeing them crash to a 2-0 defeat at Leeds United. The Club contested their second match at the Yorkshire outfit in the space of five days but, unlike the midweek Cup tie, there was to be no bliss and just pure frustration.

Halloween pulled out a trick for the Blues, after they crashed to the bottom of the Championship with a 3-2 defeat at home to Hull City. Yet again for the fourth match at Roots Hall, Southend conceded three goals and, even worse, to a Hull side who scored their winner whilst reduced to 10 men.

### November


November was a highly significant month to remember even though the opening fixture gave no hint of what was to come.

Southend were caught off guard against Wolves, as three goals in the space of just 13 first half minutes sent them crashing to a 3-1 reverse at Molineux.

But there was bedlam in Southend, as the Club recorded the biggest giant killing in their history with a stunning victory over Manchester United in the Carling Cup.

Freddy Eastwood left Roots Hall rocking with a wonderful free kick to book the Blues' place in the quarter finals of the competition.

Not only are Manchester United the Premiership leaders and current holders of the competition, but they fielded a galaxy of stars in



the shape of Wayne Rooney and Cristiano Ronaldo.

Southend ended a run of four consecutive league defeats in a goalless draw at home to Preston, but failed to gain the win that perhaps their endeavour deserved. Roots Hall was expectant on the back of the Blues' triumph over Manchester United, but it was always going to be a tough ask against a North End side scaling a different end of the Championship.

A resurgent second half performance from Southend helped them come from behind to claim a point in a 1-1 draw at home to Plymouth. It took a while for the Blues to get going, not least when Alan McCormack - just a day after signing on loan from Preston - took to the field after the interval.


He was a bundle of energy in midfield and just two minutes after he entered the fray Roots Hall was up in arms, as Mark Gower was on target.

Colchester stole local bragging rights after a 3-0 win over Southend in a match overshadowed by a card happy referee.

It was the first time The U's had beaten their Essex counterparts since 1989, but the Blues were left dismantled by the second half dismissals of Kevin Maher and Mark Gower, while the game was still goalless.

And it was the controversial circumstances, which really left a sour taste to proceedings, as the numerical disadvantage eventually put paid to Southend's brave efforts to hold out.

Southend then endured more travel sickness, as they fell to a 2-0 reverse at Barnsley, suffering their fourth straight defeat on the road in the Championship.



### December

For the second time this season, Wolves took all three points off Southend. In a match that never really sparked into life with limited activity in either goalmouth, it was still the visitors who went on to claim a 1-0 win.

It had been a long time coming, but Southend stood tall to win an enthralling game of football against Southampton. Roots Hall was up in arms following two stunning strikes from Freddy Eastwood and Alan McCormack that helped pave the way for a 2-1 win - their first triumph for 18 games in the Championship.

Twice denied by the woodwork, Southend still left on their travels from Luton with a worthy point in the bag following a goalless draw. Neither side could break the deadlock, yet for the Blues it was a case of what could have been, especially when Eastwood hit the post in the closing stages.

There was plenty of positive attributes to Southend's performance at Tottenham, as they made a gallant exit from the Carling Cup. Jermain Defoe scored the only goal of the game in the closing stages of extra time to settle a nip and tuck contest at White Hart Lane.

With only five minutes left on the clock and penalties looking on the cards, Tottenham managed to find the decisive goal. Mido's left wing cross was bundled home by Defoe on the goalline and brought relief as much as joy to the home crowd.

That it did owed much to the dogged nature of Southend's non-stop resilience, which allowed them to come close - yet again - to causing another ripple of a cup shock.

Southend saw their mini-revival cut open at the seams by a ruthless Birmingham outfit.

This was hardly the ideal Christmas filler, but the Midlands outfit justified their standing at the top of the Championship with a 4-0 victory at Roots Hall.

Having found themselves down to 10 men when Efe Sodje was dismissed after the interval at Norwich City, a point was the least the Blues deserved to take from Carrow Road with a goalless draw.

Southend battled the elements and came away with a credible point against Coventry City. A cold afternoon played under torrential rain saw the Blues come from behind and make it a third straight draw on their travels in the Championship with Mark Gower on target.

### January

Southend began the New Year in style, as they gave West Brom a severe hangover at Roots Hall.

An exhilarating first half performance brought about three goals from unlikely sources, to put the seal on a 3-1 success and allow the Blues to

cut the gap to safety at the bottom to six points. Jamal Campbell-Ryce scored his first two goals for the Club, while Lewis Hunt ventured forward to head home a corner.

Southend left themselves with it all to do in the FA Cup after Barnsley stunned Roots Hall in the last minute with a goal that appeared to be suspiciously offside.

The Blues looked set to have safely negotiated their passage into the fourth round of the competition, having opened the scoring through Mark Gower in the second half and taken a firm grip on proceedings, before Barnsley were offered a last gasp chance.

It had been over 10 months coming, but Southend finally enjoyed league success on the road at Cardiff.

The Club made the long journey back south safe in the knowledge that only goal difference kept them from moving off the foot of the Championship, courtesy of a wonder strike from Lee Bradbury.

Any sense of injustice at the way Southend were forced to endure a replay at Barnsley in the FA Cup was noticeably pushed aside in spectacular fashion with a 2-0 win at Oakwell. By producing a performance that easily contrasted with the confidence and consistency with which the team were playing, a place in the fourth round of the FA Cup beckoned for the first time in 14 years.

Derby are a strong bet for promotion this season, but it still took an almighty effort for them to claim all three points against Southend at Roots Hall.



Steve Howard's first half header was the only difference between the two sides, but the resurgent performance the Blues showcased in the second half could easily have brought about a different scoreline.

Southend left London on the back of a second defeat to Tottenham this season, but will again hold their heads up high at another lionheart display from the team in their FA Cup tie.

It was always going to be hard to top the midweek victory after the local Council's backed the Club's application to build the new stadium and training ground, but the Blues' endurance in this clash was never found wanting despite a 3-1 reverse.

Southend fashioned their best Championship result of the season at Birmingham and - most importantly - climbed themselves off the foot of the table.

Trail back just over a month ago and this was the same Birmingham outfit who strolled to a 4-0 win at Roots Hall, but on this showing the Club are now made of sterner stuff after achieving a 3-1 success at St Andrew's with goals from Kevin Maher, Freddy Eastwood and Mark Gower.



score his first goal for Southend, as his injury time strike secured a 1-0 success against Burnley and - more significantly - lifted the Club out of the bottom three of the Championship.

This encounter was lacking in drama until an opportune Foran was decisive enough to make the most out of Wade Elliot's mistake at the back, to lift Roots Hall into raptures with the Club's second win in the space of just four days.

The twists and turns at the foot of the Championship continued, with Southend dealt a late sucker punch at Roots Hall after Leeds snatched a 1-1 draw.

In the light of circumstances, the result will be seen as two points lost with the Blues dropping back into the bottom three after David Healy cancelled out Mark Gower's earlier strike with a goal just two minutes from time.

Southend crashed to their first defeat in five at relegation rivals Hull City, as they endured an afternoon to forget at the KC Stadium.

The performance was sorely lacking all the key ingredients the team had recently been producing, as they found themselves surprisingly forced on the backfoot for most of the match and allowed Hull to coast to a 4-0 win.

**April**  
Colchester did their best to curtail Southend's survival hopes with a resounding 3-0 victory at Roots Hall. The fact it took the Us just 36 seconds to sink the opening goal told the story in itself.

Yet Southend set a marker for how they would need to perform for the remainder of the season with a sensational 3-2 win at Preston North End. Captain Kevin Maher secured the vital three points with a brilliant winner in the third minute of injury time to bring a close to a truly extraordinary match.

Sadly that benchmark wasn't followed after Southend crashed to a 3-1 defeat against Barnsley at Roots Hall.

Southend never looked close to repeating the dizzy heights of their win over Preston and found themselves three goals behind just six minutes into the second half. Although Mark Gower went on to score his 10th goal of the campaign, it proved to be in vain.

Plymouth then left the Blues on the brink with an injury time winner aiding them to a 2-1 victory. Although Argyle took the lead inside seven minutes, Peter Clarke was on target to head home before the interval, but the second half proved to be a heavy mixture of frustration.

As the team pushed forward, Plymouth were able to steal a march at the other end of the field and Barry Hayles was on hand to score with the seconds ticking down to leave the Club four points from safety in the Championship.

With two matches left of the season, Southend are also left truly fighting for their lives.

## February

Southend's impressive sequence of making progress on the road continued with a praiseworthy 1-1 draw at Stoke City. The result extended their unbeaten run as the visiting team to six matches following a late strike from Freddy Eastwood - his third goal in three games.

Southend supplied the perfect tonic in their bid for survival, as they stormed to a stunning 5-0 victory over QPR.

It was another team performance, although Captain Kevin Maher grabbed the headlines with two eye-catching strikes in injury time.

A sullen mood escalated over the Stadium of Light for Southend, as they experienced rare displeasure on their travels at Sunderland. Having built up a six-game unbeaten run on the road, the Blues had not tolerated a more troublesome afternoon of football this year than against a Sunderland side who firmly backed up their promotion credentials with a 4-0 victory.

A lack of finesse in front of goal put paid to Southend's chances of bringing the daylight ever closer in their battle for survival at home to Crystal Palace. The Blues had plenty of opportunities, but instead it was Palace who profited from a rare sight of goal with a swift second half attack to win 1-0.

It was then a case of rough justice for Southend after they suffered a sickening late blow at Hillsborough, when Sheffield Wednesday were awarded a penalty deep into injury time.

The Blues looked set to return south with another precious point in tow, but controversy surrounded the final moments when Lewis Hunt was adjudged to have handled the ball inside the box.

It was invariably a game of two halves, but having reawakened themselves after the interval, Southend left Wednesday hanging on for most of the second half with constant forays in attack and deserved better reward.

## March

Alan McCormack's timely contribution brought elated joy to the Roots Hall faithful after he came off the bench to score a last minute equaliser against Leicester City.

With five of their closest rivals at the foot of the Championship all losing, the Blues did their best to make up vital ground and close the gap to safety to three points, as they twice had to come from behind to force a 2-2 draw.

Southend left Portman Road with the bit between their teeth after a compelling 2-0 victory over Ipswich Town. Having come into the match with just a point on board from their last four encounters, the inclination for the Blues was to start proceedings with purposeful intent and first half goals from Mark Gower and Peter Clarke emphasised the point.

## A Century United – The Centenary History of Southend United

Peter Miles and Dave Goody have been writing books about Southend United together for eight years now, but they really wanted to do something special for the club's centenary.

Having written "Potted Shrimps" for Yore Publications, and "Images of Sport", "100 Greats" and "50 Classic Matches" for Tempus, Peter and Dave decided to really push the boat out this time and produce a completely new centenary history book that would chronicle the full 100 years, from the humble beginnings in the Blue Boar pub, right through to the League One Championship of 2006...and beyond. But rather than do it the easy way, by writing the book and handing it over to another publishing company, they decided to form their own and do the whole book themselves.

"We have had a very good relationship with Tempus Publishing, but we decided that to produce a book that really reflected the full 100 years of the club, we needed to be in complete control of every aspect, rather than putting it into the hands of someone else" said Dave. "So, we set about setting up a limited company, and then we set about learning all the skills that go into writing, typesetting and printing a book."

### Information

After forming Shrimper Publishing Limited last year, Peter and Dave then set out on the long journey of pulling together all the information required for a book of this complexity. "We spent days at Southend Library, poring over microfilms of old Southend Standards, trying to compile full results and line-ups for every season in the club's history" said Peter. "The pre-First World War seasons were the hardest to complete, as the reports were very long-winded, and often didn't actually contain the line-ups and scorers, so we had to get that information from other sources."

Once this task was completed, Peter started the task of writing the text, whilst Dave learnt the skills required to typeset the book, using the industry-standard software Adobe InDesign. "It seemed very daunting to start with, but once we got into the swing of things, it started going along quite smoothly" said Dave. "Peter emailed me the text, and I laid it out, adding photos and illustrations where I thought necessary."

The majority of the photos used came from Peter and Dave's own collections, but they also

got help from many other Southend United fans they know, who were only too willing to help. Because of this network, the book is now profusely illustrated with over 500 photographs, stretching from the very beginnings of the club in 1906, right through to the present day.

"We are especially indebted to the Evening Echo, who gave us the run of their photo library, and also Dave Scriven at Southend United, who allowed us to use his photos from the past four seasons" said Dave. "Without them, the book would have been harder to illustrate."

The task of producing the book wasn't helped by the fact that both Peter and Dave have full-time jobs outside of book publishing, meaning they had to find the time to do all the book work in evenings and at weekends. They are also season ticket holders at Southend United, so that gave them a great insight into just what the book should be like.

### Obstacles

There have been other obstacles along the way: Dave says "As well as receiving a lot of great help and support, from people such as Geoffrey King at Southend United, and also all the technical staff at printers HSW Print, who we have chosen to print the book, we have also met up with some people who have tried to make out that we wouldn't be able to do what we set out to do – to produce the best book on Southend United ever, due to our lack of knowledge of the print industry. We will be dedicating this book to them!"

## doubling up as champions

Unfortunately, it currently looks like Southend United's first season back in English football's second tier will end in relegation, however few of us will forget how we got here! We close our Centenary Review by looking back at last season's title-winning campaign.

Following promotion, at long last, out of League Two courtesy of a 2-0 play-off final victory over Lincoln City at the Millennium Stadium in May 2005, Steve Tilson's Southend side were immediately established as favourites to make a swift return to the basement division.

Indeed, following a 2-1 opening day home defeat to Port Vale, the predictions may have looked good, but Tilson had been particularly shrewd in snapping up Grays Athletic winger Mitchell Cole and, even more so, former Manchester City frontman Shaun Goater from Reading.

The Shrimpers quickly bounced back from their opening day reverse to clinch a 2-0 win at Bradford City before Goater came off the bench on his debut to grab a late leveller in a 2-2 draw at Walsall.

Hot-shot Freddy Eastwood got himself off the mark for the season with a simple tap-in against Huddersfield Town in a 1-1 Roots Hall draw, but Eastwood controversially saw red late in the first half, and following appeal had his ban extended from three to four games!

### Soared

Eastwood's suspension didn't deter Southend though, as a Goater-inspired 3-1 win over local rivals Colchester United set the Shrimpers up for a fantastic run of eight consecutive victories. Oldham Athletic (2-1), Swindon Town (2-1), Tranmere Rovers (3-1), Rotherham United (4-2), Yeovil Town (4-1), Gillingham (2-1) and Nottingham Forest (1-0) were all seen off as United soared to the top of the table.

The run ended with a 2-0 reverse at Doncaster Rovers, knocking Southend off the summit, but a 1-1 home draw with Barnsley saw Tilson's men return to the top, and that was following by an impressive 3-0 win at Bristol City, with Eastwood grabbing a hat-trick.

However, a seven-match winless streak had seen Southend slip to sixth before a morale-boosting 2-1 win at Hartlepool on 28th December.




● Joy as the League One title was won last season

A home win over Bournemouth and a last-gasp 2-1 win at Blackpool saw Southend quickly return to top spot and apart from one week in January, following a goalless draw with Tranmere, the Shrimpers remained as leaders for the rest of the season.

United's home form was solid, but some fantastic performance on the road set them up for the title. Few supporters will forget the incredible 4-3 in at Chesterfield where Southend twice came from behind to win, with Eastwood grabbing another hat-trick.

## jamie forsyth's championship review

### A topsy-turvy encounter at Molineux saw Birmingham climb back to the top at the expense of West Midlands rivals Wolves.

Blues took the lead in the second half when Andrew Cole netted from close range. However, two headers in four minutes from Wolves' Michael McIndoe turned the game on its head, before Niclas Bendtner levelled with a header on 77 minutes. Cameron Jerome looked to have won it when he raced clear to score for Birmingham on 88, but the visitors were indebted to keeper Colin Doyle, who saved an injury time McIndoe penalty.

Today's visitors Luton were relegated at Pride Park on Friday night as Derby kept up the pressure on the top two with a narrow victory. The only goal of the game came through Lewin Nyatanga, who scrambled the ball over the line in the first half.

The big losers in the top three were Sunderland, who fell victim to Colchester's incredible home form. Defender Wayne Brown opened the scoring for Colchester on the stroke of half time, but Dwight Yorke levelled on 55 minutes. However, late goals from Richard Garcia and a penalty from Jamie Cureton sealed the win for the Essex outfit and condemned Roy Keane's side to their first defeat in 18 games.

#### Danger

Live on Sky TV, Albion threw away a lead to lose at rejuvenated Burnley. The visitors were 2-0 up within eight minutes thanks to goals from Jason Koumas and Nathan Ellington. However, Andy Gray pulled a goal back on 15 and levelled the match on 48 minutes after Paul McShane had been dismissed for Albion. With three minutes left, Chris McCann nodded home for the winner for Burnley.

A late winner for Southampton saw off battling Leeds at St Mary's. Bradley Wright-Phillips hit a rising shot into the roof of the net after 84 minutes after Leeds had done well to hold out since Alan Thompson was sent off on 32 minutes for grappling with John Vlafara.

Leeds' relegation rivals Hull benefited from a similarly late effort at Stoke, who would have

been heading into the playoffs had Liam Lawrence's deflected effort been enough. However, Nick Barmby netted in the last minute after a flick-on from former Stoke loanee Jon Parkin to level.

#### Fantastic

Sheffield Wednesday are also in with a chance of a top six berth thanks to a 2-1 win over Coventry. Marcus Tudgay opened the scoring for the Owls but Maltese international Michael Mifsud equalised with a fantastic solo effort, running 60 yards before finishing past Ian Turner. However, Steve Maclean netted a close range effort on 70 minutes to give the Owls victory.

Cardiff and QPR will be looking to next season after Rangers ended Cardiff's chances of the playoffs. The only goal at Loftus Road was headed by Dexter Blackstock on 23 minutes.

Southend have a real battle on to stay in the division after a last minute Barry Hayles goal

cruelly denied them a draw at Plymouth. The hosts led when Peter Halmosi crossed for Sylvain Ebanks-Blake to stab the ball home on six minutes. However, Peter Clarke headed a leveller, but Southend couldn't hold on and Hayles slotted past Flahavan in the very last minute.

Unfortunately for Southend, Barnsley were putting themselves five points clear of the drop zone at home to Crystal Palace thanks to Daniel Nardiello. The Welshman scored a deflected drive in the first half and followed it up in the second when he had to retake a penalty after the first was saved by Julian Speroni.

There was only pride to play for in the East Anglian derby, and it was honours even at Carrow Road. Norwich led when Darren Huckerby crossed for Dickson Etuhu to head home. However, David Wright squeezed a shot in at the near post midway through the second half to ensure a draw for the Tractor Boys.



## head-to-head

how the two sides have fared in previous meetings...

**Already-relegated Luton Town arrive in South Essex for the 43rd time this afternoon, and the Hatters arrive looking for a victory to help them climb off bottom spot.**

Shrimpers striker Freddy Eastwood was guilty of a stoppage time miss, hitting the post with the goal gaping, as Luton and Southend played out a goalless draw in front of the Sky Television cameras at Kenilworth Road back in mid-December.

It was the first league encounters between the two sides since the Hatters completed the double over United in the basement division during 2001-02. A late Carl Griffiths goal earned Luton a single goal victory at Kenilworth Road in August after Kevin Maher had missed a first half penalty for the visitors who had also seen Mark Rawle sent-off.

Goals from Town's Dean Crowe and Matthew Taylor cancelled out Carl Hutchings goal for

Southend as 5,943 turned up to see the Hatters, heading for promotion, take the spoils four days after Christmas.

Roots Hall had also witnessed an FA Cup first round clash in December 2001, with Tes Bramble's bicycle kick earning the Shrimpers a dramatic 3-2 victory. More recently, Sky Sports were again on the scene as Luton ran out comfortable 3-0 victors in Essex at the same stage of the competition in November 2004.

### Victors

Southend and Luton last met at Roots Hall in the second tier of football in November 1993, with United 2-1 victors thanks to strikes from Ricky Otto and Jonathan Hunt. Kerry Dixon grabbed a consolation for the visitors.

A memorable game took place on the final day of the 1992-93 season, with Stan Collymore bidding farewell to Roots Hall in a crucial 2-1 Division one victory that ensured Southend avoided relegation.

Collymore, although mobbed at the final whistle, didn't find himself on the scoresheet,

though, with Andy Sussex and Brett Angell the Blues heroes. Earlier in the same season, second half strikes from Chris Powell and Kevin O'Callaghan saw Southend come from two goals behind to draw 2-2 in Bedfordshire.

The first meeting between the two sides took place as early as the 1907-08 campaign, but it was only the Hatters reserve side that competed in the South Eastern League. United managed a 2-1 away win, as well as a 1-1 draw at the old Roots Hall.

The following season saw both first teams clash for the first time, and Southend triumphed 2-0 at Roots Hall in the Southern League, although were defeated, 3-1, away from home.

## pressing matters

**Our final game of the season here at Roots Hall sees us speak to a different face from the Press Box**

This week we have been chatting to Nick Watts from local weekly paper the Southend Times as we get his views on the final few matches of the season, and where we head next season...

*This is Southend's final chance to stay up against Luton Town, are you confident we can get the three points we need?*

It's another one of those matches where you almost expect a victory on paper. Obviously the record in these kind of games has not been good though and it's a big reason why the club is struggling down the wrong end of the table. However, the management will have emphasised to the players just how important it is to go out on a high at home. Even if results go against Blues today, the Roots Hall crowd deserve to see their side put on the kind of performance we all know they're capable of - and of course a win might yet spark a Championship miracle.

*The team were written off long ago, so in a way would you say they have done well to still be in with a chance of survival with just two games remaining?*

By the start of December everyone had Southend as dead certs for the drop, but they've since proved they can compete at this level. At one point it really looked like they would escape thanks to their 2007 revival, which was an amazing feat bearing in mind they were so far adrift earlier in the campaign. Although it's great to have seen them make a real fight of matters, you can't help feeling they had safety within their grasp a month ago and probably should have taken it.

*If the worst happens, how do you predict the team would fare in League One next season?*

If Steve Tilson can keep the bulk of the squad together, I would expect this side to make a real go of a quick return to

the Championship. There will inevitably be comings and goings, and I think another goalscorer could be top of the target list, but the current defence and midfield would make for a formidable line-up in League One. Sometimes teams struggle with the psychological side after relegation, but if Tilson and Brush can get the guys playing to even 80% of their ability, there won't be many opponents that can live with them in the lower tier.

*It has still been an exciting and eventful season in the Championship, hasn't it?*

There's no question it's been a season to remember for so many reasons. Beating the likes of Sunderland, Birmingham and Preston were highlights, but overall it's just been great to be back at this level. There is a definite feeling about the place that Southend United belongs here and hopefully we won't have to wait too long to experience it again! Away from the Championship, the League Cup win over Manchester United will go down in Blues folklore, and the - albeit delayed - steps towards a new stadium point to an exciting future.

*Southend will be announcing the winner of the player of the season vote before kick-off, but who has impressed you most this season?*

Strangely enough, I actually think there are more candidates for the award this year than last, despite the struggles in the league. Skipper Kevin Maher looks the favourite and I expect him to pick up the award for his incredible consistency across the campaign. He sets the tempo for the team and leads by example, and has proved he can compete with the best the Championship can offer. For me, Darryl Flahavan has had another incredible season despite the team's defensive record. Rarely can the goals conceded be pinned on him and I can't even imagine how many points he must have earned Blues with his heroics at times. Alan McCormack (pictured) also stands out since he joined in November, not to mention Mark Gower, Jamal Campbell-Ryce and inevitably top scorer Freddy Eastwood.

## where are they now?

as southend united enter their centenary season, leigh edwards traces an a-z of past southend players concluding today with the letter w and y...

### frank walton

One of Southend United's most notable post-war figures, long-serving left-back Frank Walton later became the club's chairman. Locally born, he turned professional with Southend in December 1937 and made his League debut in the 3-1 victory at home to Cardiff a month later. He made 144 Third Division (South) appearances before displaced by Sandy Anderson and moved to Dartford in July 1951, then joined Cittall Athletic. Building a successful insurance business, he was a Southend United director and succeeded Bill Rubin as chairman from May 1978 until March 1983. He resided locally until his death in December 1986.

### peter watson

Tall centre-half Peter Watson was a popular member of Southend United's team in the early Sixties. He started with Nottingham Forest and helped regain top-flight status in 1956-57. Eddie

Perry paid £5,000 for him in July 1959 and he netted three goals in 249 League outings for Southend before injury ended his playing career in 1965. After coaching at Charlton Athletic and Cambridge United, he was a decorator in Southend, then returned to Nottingham, becoming a teacher at Basford Hall College and a supervisor for Derbyshire Probation Service. Now living in Ilkeston, his brother Dave was an England international.

### malcolm webster

Ex-England Youth goalkeeper Malcolm Webster featured prominently as Southend United reached the FA Cup fifth round in 1975-76. Signing professional for Arsenal in January 1968, he appeared in the top-flight and joined Fulham for £10,000 in December 1969. He starred in the 1970-71 promotion campaign and Arthur Rowley paid £12,000 for him in January 1974. Making 96 League appearances for Southend, he moved to

Cambridge United in September 1976 and was a key figure in two consecutive promotion campaigns. He has since been a goalkeeping coach, involved with Uhlsport National Goalkeeping School.

### shane westley

Central defender Shane Westley was a key figure in Southend United's 1986-87 promotion success. Signing professional for Charlton Athletic in June 1983, he moved to Southend in March 1985 and helped beat Derby County in the 1987-88 Littlewoods Cup second round, netting ten goals in 144 League outings before joining Wolves in June 1989. Sold to Brentford for £100,000 in October 1992, he helped them reach the Second Division play-offs in 1994-95. He rejoined Southend on loan in February 1995, then played for Cambridge United and Lincoln City, where he later had a brief spell as manager.

### phil whelan

Former England U-21 central defender Phil Whelan (left) was an Alan Little signing for Southend United. He turned professional with Ipswich Town in July 1990 and helped them clinch the Second Division title in 1991-92. Sold to Middlesbrough for £300,000 in April 1995, he gained further Premiership experience and joined Oxford United for £150,000 in July 1997 and was loaned to Rotherham before moving to Roots Hall in July 2000. He became Southend's captain and formed an effective partnership with Leo Roget, then Carl Hutchings in the heart of the defence, netting six goals in 100 League outings before retiring in June 2003.

### ronnie whelan

Republic of Ireland international midfielder Ronnie Whelan was Southend United's 'Player of the Year' in 1994-95. The son of a former Republic of Ireland international of the same name, he impressed with Home Farm before joining Liverpool in October 1979 and scored on his League debut in April 1981. He amassed a vast collection of domestic and European honours, becoming captain at Anfield, and his 53 caps included two World Cup tournaments. After a spell with Millwall reserves, he joined Southend in September 1994 and became player-manager in July 1995, scoring once in 34 League outings before leaving in July 1997.



### arthur williamson

Scottish right-back Arthur Williamson was an influential figure as Southend United beat Liverpool in the 1956-57 FA Cup third round. Harry Warren signed him from Scottish Cup winners Clyde in May 1955 and he was ever-present for Southend in four successive seasons, helping take Liverpool to an FA Cup third round replay in 1957-58. He formed a notable full-back partnership with record appearance holder Sandy Anderson and scored twice in 269 League games while at Roots Hall before joining Romford in September 1962. Later returning to Scotland, he became a butcher, then a greenkeeper, settling in Methven, Perth.

### che wilson


Versatile left-back Che Wilson (right) featured prominently in Southend United's 2004-05 League Two play-off final triumph. A former Norwich City trainee, he signed professional in July 1997 and made his League debut in their 1-1 draw at Swindon Town in December 1998. He joined Bristol Rovers in July 2000 and moved to Cambridge City in July 2002. Steve Wignall signed him in July 2003 and he played in two LDV Vans Trophy finals, then starred as Southend won the League One title in 2005-06. After scoring in the 4-1 win at home to Brentford in January 2006, he added another in the 3-0 victory at Colchester in March 2006.

### derek woodley

Former England Youth winger Derek Woodley had two spells with Southend United. Signing professional for West Ham in April 1959, he scored twice on his First Division debut six months later and followed Ted Fenton to Roots Hall with Mike Beesley in August 1962. Joining Charlton Athletic in June 1967, he rejoined Southend four months later and netted 23 goals in 170 League games overall before swapped for Gillingham's Howard Moore in January 1968. Later with Folkestone and Pegasus Athletic, he was an insurance agent, then worked for Ford and Access, residing locally until his death in January 2002.

### dave worthington

Experienced right-back Dave Worthington played alongside his younger brother Bob at Southend United. Initially with Halifax Town, he followed Don McEvoy to Barrow in August 1964. He moved to Grimsby Town in June 1966 and was ever-present in four successive seasons, skippering their 1971-72 Fourth Division title triumph. Arthur Rowley signed him in December 1973 and he helped Southend take QPR to an FA Cup third round replay in 1974-75, then reach the FA Cup fifth round in 1975-76. He made 95 League appearances before becoming Cambridge



City's player-boss, then ran a removals firm in Halifax.

### steve yates

Popular left-back Steve Yates featured in Southend United's 1977-78 and 1980-81 promotion successes. He turned professional with Newcastle United in September 1964 and appeared in the top-flight before joining Sunderland for £20,000 in January 1973. Non-playing substitute in their 1973 FA Cup final triumph, he joined Charlton Athletic for £25,000 in August 1974 and skippered their 1974-75 promotion success. Dave Smith signed him in September 1976 and he made 60 League appearances prior to becoming Dartford's player-coach in December 1979. He has since worked in sports centre management in Kent.





## q&a

**The final Blues' player to answer your questions in our Question and Answer session is Charles Ademeno who recently signed a professional contract with the club.**

Thanks for all your contributions to this feature over the course of the season and we hope you've enjoyed being able to ask your Blues favourites exactly what you wanted to know.

*Who inspired you to play football when you were growing up?*

I used to play football with my friends regularly and that obviously got me involved in the sport.

But I used to love watching Ian Wright and he really inspired me, especially because he came from the same part of south London as me.

*You must be delighted with the progress you have made at Southend and very proud to have been handed a professional contract at the Club?*

It was a good moment for me because you work hard to earn a professional contract and to get two-year deal is a great achievement. I was really proud of that and so were my parents, but the hard work is just beginning.

At the start of my scholarship the idea was to always try and see if I could get a professional contract at the end of it, so I'm happy that all the miles on the pitch weren't in vein.

*How big a role did the loan spells you had earlier in the season play in your development?*

I believe that they played a very big part in my development. Youth football is not the best to develop certain aspects of your game like strength, so playing for Cambridge in the Conference against people who are older and more experienced than you really helped me in my education in football to improve my own game.

*What are your personal targets for next season?*

I will be aiming to try and be a regular in the team and will be working hard to achieve that. I was very happy when Franck Moussa got his professional contract because we are really close and now that I have got mine, I can't wait to start the season with him. Both of us will be doing our best to get in the first team and I'm sure it's going to be a good season ahead for both of us.

*How did your move to Southend come about?*


I had been at West Ham for a year beforehand, but it didn't work out for me. I then went on trials around the country at different clubs to Leyton Orient, Crystal Palace, Leicester City and Aston Villa. But I then went to Cambridge for two weeks with Ricky Duncan (Southend's Head of Youth) and when Ricky then went to Southend he invited me back there. I had a month's trial at the Club and played in a reserve game and scored, which was in front of the gaffer. From there everything kicked off for me and I ended up at Southend, which I'm very happy about.

*Who did you support as a kid?*

I supported Arsenal, but liked to watch Manchester United as well. I liked watching Andy Cole scoring all those goals and he inspired me in the same way that Ian Wright did to try and become a footballer. I never really got the chance to go and watch those teams live, but I saw them on TV and wished that one day I would have the chance to play in those sort of stadiums.

I like taking the glory for scoring goals. Whenever I used to have kickabouts with my friends and scored, all my friends would celebrate with me. I realised that I liked the spotlight of playing as a striker and knew that was the position I wanted to play in.



**Southend were left fearing the worst after suffering last minute agony in a 2-1 defeat at Plymouth Argyle.**

Barry Hayles picked up on a threaded pass and after shaking off his marker, he was able to send the ball the wrong side of Darryl Flahavan to supply a cruel twist of fate to an otherwise gutsy Blues' display.

With just two matches left to play, Southend are four points from safety and know that they will need a small miracle if they are to hold on to their Championship status.

Southend gave themselves a mountain to climb when they fell behind with just seven minutes on the clock, as Plymouth drew first blood in registering the first shot at goal.

Peter Clarke was robbed in possession on the byline by Peter Halmosi and his cross in front of goal was buried by Sylvan Ebanks-Blake past the despairing dive of Darryl Flahavan.

The Blues did respond gamely when Lee Bradbury was a whisker away with a header from a corner, before Freddy Eastwood charged forward and forced Luke McCormick to push his angled drive around the post.

Matters were made worse when Mark Gower limped off after 13 minutes to be replaced by Richie Foran, but Clarke was soon to make amends for his error when he equalised on 26 minutes.

The defender was first to react to Steven Hammell's free kick and from a position virtually on the goal line, he supplied a deft touch to

knock the ball into the bottom corner of the net.

Simon Francis advanced forward from defence and his clever technique to try and catch McCormick off his line resulted in the ball agonisingly drifting the wrong side of the left-hand post.

Ebanks-Blake was proving to be a real livewire for the hosts and he caused a scare at the other end when he cut inside the defence and from an acute angle, drilled the ball on to the outside of the post.

The spotlight fell on Flahavan and he showed his quality in quick succession to make two first-rate saves.

He initially dived at full-length to push Akos Buzsaky's long range shot around the post before, moments later, Barry Hayles was put through on goal, only for Flahavan to stand up tall and make another imperative stop.

Buzsaky skimmed the top of the woodwork when he rifled a 20 yard free kick at goal and although the Blues had more than held their own, the half time whistle perhaps came at the optimum moment.

Southend came out after the interval with the bit between their tails with Paul Connolly heading over a dangerous Jamal Campbell-Ryce cross in front of goal, which resulted in Clarke winning another header from a set piece, but


directing the ball a few yards wide of the post.

Buzsaky went close again with another set piece sailing just wide of the right-hand post and Marcel Seip forced Flahavan to tip his darting header around the opposite side of the goal.

As we reached the halfway point of the second half, the match was on a knife edge for Southend and Connolly certainly provided some panic when he smashed the ball into the side netting, with half the crowd believing he had scored.

Ebanks-Blake ballooned the ball over from just two yards out, as he slid in to meet Halmosi's centred cross before, with time ticking over, Hayles was able to finalise a 2-1 win for Plymouth in the 90th minute.

The last time Southend played Southampton back in December they managed to register their first win for 18 matches in the league with a 2-1 victory.

Depending on the outcome of today's match, it may well be that Southend need an even more significant triumph in the very last game of the season next Saturday.
