

We are back on home turf for the second time inside five days and if we could get all three points today, I think we could look back on a decent start to our League One season.

I would like to extend a warm welcome to Kevin Blackwell and his players. "Blackie" and I have been adversaries in the past and he has done very well at most of the places he has been at. He had a very difficult job at Leeds United and will now be looking to make progress with Luton. They have won both of their opening games of the campaign and I am sure they will provide us with a stern test this afternoon.

Kevin Blackwell has added a lot of experience to his Luton squad. I am expecting a very difficult game today because the combination of youngsters with pace, and older experienced players can be a dangerous concoction. Luton managed to sell a few players and have certainly strengthened through the summer.

On Tuesday night we faced an experienced Charlton Athletic side in the first round of the Carling Cup. It was always going to be a tough draw against an ex-Premiership team but we didn't let ourselves down. Unfortunately we didn't make it through into the hat for the second round draw but I was impressed with our first half performance and there were several positives to come out of the game.


Ben Tozer made his first team debut on Tuesday night and in my opinion he had a solid game, even when playing out of position at left-back. Ben is a centre-back by trade but can use both feet and showed his versatility with a

sound performance against a team who included several former Premiership regulars in their own starting line-up. Tozer is a big lad and for seventeen, he has tremendous potential. I am very excited about him and there are several Premiership teams taking a look at our youth players at present which shows we are going in the right direction as far as bringing through talented youngsters. In the end we have to get service out of these players and that's what we are looking to do.

We come into the game still short of firepower and that's something we are working to rectify. Since I arrived at the club we have struggled in front of goal and until we find that elusive player who can unlock a few doors then it could be a difficult few games. Once again I would stress that we will not be rushing into bringing in players just for the sake of it. I would ask for your patience for a little while longer and hopefully we will be adding to the squad before too long.

Keep up the tremendous support because you were superb, as ever, on Tuesday night against Charlton Athletic. I hear that tickets have gone very well and at the time of writing we are hoping for an 8,000 plus crowd.





Swindon Town have teamed up with www.textappeal.co.uk to give fans the chance to vote for their favourite player throughout the season. The vote will take place at each home game, starting with today's game.

Votes will be cast by mobile phone text message and the Man of the Match will be announced at the end of the game and included in the match report on the Swindon Town website, www.swindontownfc.co.uk.

To vote, fans will need to text the word PICK, followed by H for Home, followed by the players squad number.

For example if your favourite Swindon Town player is wearing shirt number 9, you would text PICK H9 to 60777.

Texts will be charged at 25p each, plus normal operators rates.

Luton Town fans can also vote for their favourite player by texting their normal texting operator.

The vote will close 10 minutes before the final whistle and the results will be announced on the scoreboard at the end of the match. Any entries received after the competition has closed will not be charged.



luton town

kevin blackwell

Kevin Blackwell, 48, and born in Luton, took over in March 2007 but it proved to be too late to keep the Hatters in the Championship.

Kevin was manager of Leeds United for just over two years, and has also been Assistant Manager at Sheffield United and Bury.

He said on his appointment: "I've come here for the long term. There's a vision at this football club that excites me and it's something I'm looking forward to. There are things happening at Luton that could turn the club into a major player again and I want to be a part of that."

Blackwell is widely respected in football and thought of as the best-qualified coach in the UK. After he left Leeds he studied new coaching techniques at Real Madrid, Inter Milan and in Brazil.

As a player, Blackwell was a goalkeeper who saved a penalty at Wembley in the 1985 FA Trophy Final, although in a losing cause as his Boston team went down 2-1 to Wealdstone. He also helped Barton Rovers reach the 1978 FA Vase Final.


In 1986, he was signed by Scarborough manager Neil Warnock - the beginning of a relationship that was to see the two work together at Notts County, Torquay, Huddersfield, Plymouth, Bury and Sheffield United. Blackwell played 59 games for Scarborough, 20 for Torquay, 10 for Huddersfield and 27 for Plymouth.

He has worked under some notable managers in his time, going right back to Ron Atkinson when he was a young apprentice at Cambridge United. He was then signed by Barry Fry at Barnet in 1985. And he was taken to Leeds by Peter Reid in 2003, before

working under caretaker Eddie Gray and then getting the manager's job himself in 2004.

As Leeds manager, Blackwell took his side to 14th in the Championship in his first season and then 5th in his second, 2005-06. Leeds beat Preston 3-1 in the Play-Off semi-final but lost 3-0 to Watford in the Final, a scoreline made worse by an own goal on the hour and a late penalty.

Blackwell's record at Leeds was played 114, won 44, drew 33, lost 37.



Sam Parkin

Sam Parkin will today miss out on a playing return to The County Ground.

The striker aggravated his ongoing ankle problem during the 2-1 win over Dagenham & Redbridge in midweek.

For the day job Ian Robertson is the BBC Rugby Correspondent covering both Radio and TV. In the evening he is a very amusing, entertaining and highly articulate after-dinner speaker. His rugby career ended with a bad knee injury at the age of 25 but by that time he had won "Blues" at both Aberdeen University and Cambridge University, had played for London Scottish and the Barbarians and had won 8 international caps for Scotland, he was vice-captain of Scotland. He joined the BBC as a rugby commentator in 1972 and has covered almost all major matches all over the world for the past 20 years. A prolific writer he is author or co-author of over 20 books including several best sellers.

Phil Bennett's wizardry entertained crowds throughout the seventies. His mercurial skills included a devastating sidestep and swerve. His unique hunched running style proved deceptive and he had an uncanny ability to unlock defences with his twinkling feet. He made his Welsh debut in 1969 against France, gaining caps as a fullback and centre, and in 1972 finally settled into the fly half berth. His form earned him a place on the British Lions tour of South Africa in 1974, where he would reach new heights as the star of the tour, scoring 103 points. His 50 yard try in the 28-9 second test victory in Pretoria, ranks as one of the supreme examples of individual brilliance on a rugby pitch. He retired from international rugby in 1978.




13 years on and **Luc Nijholt** returned to The County Ground – STFC took the opportunity to 'tackle' the Dutchman and catch up with one of Town's most **fearsome midfielders...**




"The **Manchester United** game, when I scored the equaliser [2-2], was the highlight. I still think about that a lot and it was a great moment for me."

Luc Nijholt shakes my hand and looks me firmly in the eye. His grip is vice-like. I imagine it's as assured as he used to be in the tackle. His piercing blue eyes look stern and even now, 13 years following his departure from The County Ground, the Dutchman likes to be in control, whatever he's doing.

Back in 1993/94 many midfielders felt the same way. Nijholt was signed for £175,000 in the summer of 1993 following Town's promotion to the top-flight. John Gorman hoped he would help bolster his team's defence along with the capture of Adrian Whitbread, both brought in as a result of Colin Calderwood's move to Spurs.

Nijholt by reputation was a tough-tackling defender, or sweeper. Yet such was his presence that Gorman later deployed the then 31-year old in midfield to help snuff out such middlemen as Paul Ince, Jamie Redknapp and Paul Merson. He continued playing in midfield when Town were relegated back into the Championship – the Dutchman cut from a similar job to his second manager, Steve McMahon. Town may have come off worse in most of the encounters in both seasons – Nijholt rarely did. The likes of Martin Ling, Kevin Horlock and John Moncur were able to pick out a killer pass, or link play, but Nijholt gave Town a presence the others couldn't offer, and few got the better of the man




with the crew cut. It probably comes as no surprise that he carried a poor disciplinary record in the two years he spent here – yellow cards as frequent as goals against and he was suspended for Town's trip to Anfield.

A goliath on the pitch he was a different person off it. Affable, friendly and honest, despite Town's lack of success during his stay he will always be remembered fondly by Town fans. Someone that would sweat blood for the shirt on the pitch, yet give fans the time of day off it – he also had an element of self-restraint – the Dutchman once holding McMahon back from doing undue damage to Bolton's John McGinley following Mark Robinson's seemingly unjust sending off against the Trotters in the Coca Cola Cup semi-final in 1995.

Only Town fans with a keen eye on action north of the border had heard of Nijholt preceding his arrival in 1993 from Motherwell. With 13 seasons already under his belt, including three in Scotland and nine in Holland – he had the necessary experience to deal with Town's top-flight challenge, more so than many of his teammates, but his name raised more than a few eyebrows when Gorman parted with almost two hundred grand. Few of Town's squad had played top-flight football, let alone in three countries (as well as Holland and Scotland, Nijholt spent a season in Switzerland).

Old school in his approach Nijholt was a 'busy' player. Confident on the ball, probably as a result of his Dutch schooling, he was as competent going forward as he was getting stuck in at the back – he was a rare mix of brain and brawn – something he admits he's keen to take into his managerial career.

"There's not as much passion in Holland as there is in England," he says. Currently managing




Telstar of the Dutch Division 1 (not the Eredivisie) – he will be looking to build on an opening draw away from home (sounds familiar).

"We are more technical and tactical – but we lack the team spirit you have in England and we're certainly not as physical. We like to play, build-up slowly – I used to love the physical side – it suited me as a player and I like my team to be the same, with a bit more technical ability."

Town fans used to love seeing him get involved in a hefty challenge, or rampage forward not knowing what he was going to do next – but such was his understanding of the game that he's already carved out a decent coaching career for himself, one that saw him linked to the vacant Swindon manager's position last season before Paul Sturrock assumed the reigns.

"I would love to come back, perhaps in the next three or four years," he told STFC Magazine. Granted, the recent all-star game may have evoked fond memories, but it's clear that Swindon is a place Nijholt holds close to his heart. "One day I would love to come back to the County Ground as manager because I love it here – my family liked it here when I was playing. I liked the country, as did my family, and it's a lovely club to work for."

There's no doubting Town fans are happy with the eventual outcome of last year's managerial merry-go-round – Sturrock is a popular

figure. Yet the mention of Nijholt's name as a candidate did pull at the heartstrings of many fans harking back to the days when, well when Swindon were more of a footballing power. Whether or not Nijholt will return one day remains to be seen, but the memories he has already left will live long in the annals of many Reds. Take his shooting skills, for example...

"The Manchester United game, when I scored the equaliser [2-2], was the highlight. I still think about that a lot and it was a great moment for me." Town fans won't remember many of Nijholt's other strikes, there were five in total, but his looping deflected effort Peter Schmeichel will never be forgotten. Had it not been for Eric Cantona's stamp on John Moncur in the game – it probably would be more universally well known.

13 years on and Nijholt was back gracing The County Ground turf. Thanks to Phil King's tireless organisation, Nijholt took time out from his own preparations at Telstar to attend the Legends charity match. He's still got it, too.

Like many of his teammates, Martin Ling and Jan Aage, for example – Nijholt hasn't lost his ability to pick a pass, to pass and move or control the tempo of play. And when a 50/50 loomed, just like when Jan Aage was through on goal,

the crowd looked on in anticipation – would he come out on top? Yes, was invariably the answer.

"It was an easy game for us tonight," he laughs at the final whistle, embarrassingly not as out of breath as I am having sprinted down the Arkells steps to greet him.

"Jan, Shaun, Lingy – it was great - they've all

still got it," he says in praise of his teammates, many of which, like him, are now respected coaches in their own right.

"You knew in the Premier League that a few of the lads were going to be going into training [coaching] – it's good. They all played at a high level and so they know the game well – the higher the level of football the more coaches you're likely to get. "I still talk to them on the phone, or through the internet now and again. But it's good to see them in the flesh. We are very busy back in Holland because it's pre-season, but I managed to get a day and a half off and it's nice to see some good friends, as well as do something for charity."




The fact that the likes of Luc and Jan took the time to visit Swindon once again goes to show how much their time in SN1 meant to them. You could also see on the pitch, with the banter and the fluency of play, just how good and close a side it was – even if it wasn't good enough for England's elite division.

"We all had a great time playing in the Premier League. It was only for one year, but it was a great experience playing against the likes of Manchester United, Arsenal, Newcastle. These days the Premier League is big money and teams that get promoted have a bit more to spend. We didn't have that, but hopefully Town can reach that in the next few years."

Nijholt admits he still casts an eye over his former club's results, and that with Sturrock now at the helm, they have every chance of getting back to the Championship at least.

"Unfortunately they were struggling for a few years, but with last season's promotion they can now look to build again, and perhaps in a year or two climb the league again and go into the Championship. This is a tremendous club – it has a good support, nice people – they deserve to be in a higher league."

1 Curtis Davies

A precocious talent who started out his career with Luton Town as a trainee, Davies went on to make a total of 54 league starts for The Hatters after making his debut in November 2003 against Rushden & Diamonds. Went on to make six further appearances during the 2003-04 campaign.

The 22-year old attracted the attentions of West Bromwich Albion after an impressive 2004-05 campaign and left Luton in a £3 million move in the summer of 2005 and he has since racked up 65 league starts for The Baggies.

2 Rory Fallon

A popular New Zealander who joined Town during Andy King's time at The County Ground in November 2003. Often used as an impact substitute as his 32 appearances from the bench would suggest.

21 goals in 43 league starts tempted Swansea City to part with £300,000 for his services but after failing to settle at The Liberty Stadium, he made a similar switch to Plymouth Argyle. He began the season well for Ian Holloway's side and was on the scoresheet in a 3-2 opening day victory at Hull City.


3 Kevin Nicholls



The founder of Swindon Town Football Club.
By Peter Lupson



When I began exploring the church roots of famous football clubs for my book 'Thank God for Football' I could never have guessed that my research for the chapter on Swindon Town would lead to the Robins changing the date on their club badge.

You can imagine my delight when Director Mike Bowden invited me to the Community Day at The County Ground to talk about my discovery and the club's founder William Pitt. Pitt's story is told in full in the Swindon Town chapter of my book (available in the club shop) and it's a great pleasure to be invited to write something about him for this magazine now that the date in which he formed the club is clear.

Pitt arrives at Christ Church

William Pitt, an Exeter man, was appointed curate of Christ Church in Swindon's Old Town at the age of 23. He soon became very popular in the parish, especially among young people. He related easily to others and had the gift of bringing together people who didn't get on. It was a valuable gift at a time when there was mutual suspicion between the residents of Old and New Town. Pitt was keen to build a bridge between the two communities and it was football that gave him the opportunity.

The Club is Born

In autumn 1879 he invited some young lads from New Town to meet with him to discuss the formation of a football

club. They were quickly won over by his contagious enthusiasm and the club was born. However, the name proved to be a problem as Pitt explained years later 'we decided to call our club the Swindon Town Football Club. But we found that that was rather a large mouthful to shout out, and we afterwards changed the name to the Spartan Club.'

The Ongoing Spirit

Pitt played in the first ever match on 29 November 1879 and continued to play until 1882 when he left Christ Church to become rector of All Saints, Liddington. But he never lost his affection for the club and he was proud to be invited to speak at The County Ground in September 1911 at the Southern League Championship celebration. In front of thousands of supporters he was saluted as the father of the club. In his speech he summed up the spirit in his day, saying 'I cannot say that we ever achieved any great results. We always played for the love of the game, and we always played a straight game.'

He then attributed the success of the championship side to the strong Christian spirit that prevailed at the club, no doubt with players such as the legendary Harold Fleming in mind. How delighted he would have been, therefore, to know that there is an official Christian presence at the club today in the form of club chaplain Simon Stevenette and how appropriate that Simon should be Vicar of Christ Church where it all started.



Talking of the youth team squad, I am over the moon with our new intake and although expectation levels are high following last year's FA Youth Cup and league successes, I feel this year







Once again the Under 14 team will play in the Wiltshire County League with Sarah Maisey managing the


side. Fixtures are played Saturday or Sunday mornings at 10-30. No home ground has been fixed yet.




to play their part. And where is Nigel Turner? Nigel is on holiday but will be picking up his microphone very soon.



A lot has happened within the club during the close season with players moving on and new ones arriving, a trip to Austria, the takeover and the Community Open Day.





Cast your mind back to 21st October 1995 and with Swindon chasing promotion back into what was then Division One, Crewe Alexandra were the visitors to The County Ground. 12,633 packed into SN1 that day for what was a memorable encounter. Goals from Wayne Allison (The Chief) and Steve Finney (there's only one) secured a 2-1 victory and ensured the vocal Town contingent went home happy. Swindon went on to win the Championship title that season.

12 years on and Dario Gradi is now Director of Football at Gresty Road. Steve Holland has now been appointed as First Team Coach and will no doubt be benefiting from Gradi's experience gained from well over 1,000 games in charge.

Crewe made a winning start to their own league season with a 2-1 victory over Brighton & Hove Albion. Goals from

The home side were dealt a real blow on the opening day though with 20-year old front man



Nicky Maynard (pictured) breaking a leg against The Seagulls. Maynard could be out of action for up to four months with a fractured fibula and ankle ligament damage. At the time of writing, Crewe were rumoured to be eyeing up loan moves for Spurs striker Lee Barnard (a former Swindon target) and Charlton's Chris Dickson, who made his first team debut at The County Ground on Tuesday night in the Carling Cup. Meanwhile, Crewe's own Carling Cup adventure came to an abrupt end with a 3-0 defeat to Hull City.

Swindon currently tip the balance in terms of games won between the two sides. There have been a total of 20 encounters between the two sides with Town having won on ten occasions, with just one draw between the two teams.

The last meeting between the two came in April 2003 with Stefani Miglioranzi's 75th minute deflected effort handing Town all three points away from home. The midfielder then celebrated a rare goal with some sort of celebratory jig – much to the delight of his teammates.

The combination of a 2-1 home win and a celebratory jig on Saturday 1st September would do just nicely.
