







Directors' Update



BOARDROOM NOTES

"Welcome to Prenton Park for the first of our Friday night home matches this season. Last season we had seven home Friday night games and this season we have five."

"Although many fans enjoy the start-of-the-weekend atmosphere under the floodlights, others find Friday nights hard to attend with work or other evening commitments and some suggest they're less child-friendly than a Saturday afternoon kick off. It goes to show that you can't please everyone - especially in football!"

However, whatever the merits or otherwise of this fixture time, the truth is that most of the games are moved following Police advice because of other pressures on their resources on Saturdays such as high profile Premier League games rather than at the whim of the club. So if you are one of those supporters who are pleased with the number of Friday night games, the board can't take the credit. It is perhaps one of the consequences of having other clubs on our doorstep. I came away from Carlisle feeling proud - not just with the result but with our unbeaten record on the road and the manner of the three results. There were no weak links or costly errors - a big improvement on last season when we only won five matches on the road all season. We've had a good start to the season and, although it's early days, Ronnie and the team deserve credit.

The fixture list often throws up strange patterns of fixtures and this season we seem to have an unusually high number of long distance away matches in the first quarter of the season. This makes the victories even more rewarding and I'm especially pleased for the fantastic travelling supporters. If you don't get to many away games you might be surprised by how vocal our support is away from home. What we lack in numbers we more than make up for in animation and noise level.

We announced earlier this week that we had negotiated a successful deal with the American group, Mirabilis, with which we entered into a £900,000 loan facility agreement last season.

The Club received approximately £150,000, but requests for the balance of the loan were refused. Under English law Tranmere would have had to create a legal precedent in order to force Mirabilis to advance the remaining payments. This would have been costly and risky. As there is no legal precedent, the Club's chances of success could not be gauged.

They will in effect give us a gift of £150,000 as we won't have to repay any of the amount we have borrowed. In addition, we won't pay any interest on the money we have borrowed for the last year and the charge over some of our land has been released.


Although it's not turned out as we originally expected, we have ended up with a very good deal. It's rare to get a gift of this significance in football - and it brings the matter to a close. The fact that we entered into an arrangement with a US group in the first place illustrates that we are taking part in the increasing globalisation of English football and developing contacts with overseas groups. Whether we like it or not, this is the direction the game is moving in and we need to investigate the opportunities for Tranmere.

A consequence of the deal with Mirabilis is that we have widened our profile and network of contacts in the States. With Man United, Aston Villa, Liverpool and Oldham in US ownership and with the arrival of David Beckham in the States, it seems that the appetite for US investment in English football is at an all time high. I hope you enjoy the game and will be back at Prenton Park when we play Northampton Town on Saturday, 29 September."

"We've got to be pleased with the start to the season we've had. We were a bit unfortunate against Leeds on the opening day, so we could have had a few more points with a bit of luck."

"I thought it was a tremendous performance at Carlisle in terms of grit and determination. It was a red hot day and the players did well to cope with the heat. We gambled on Calvin being fit. We told him to go out and play at three quarter pace to give us more strength and height, but after 17 minutes he chased one over the top and it injured his hamstring again, so it will probably be another fortnight before he is ready. Young Craig Curran came on and did what he is good at. It was a great goal that started from our box. We showed great movement, it was a very good ball in from Shakes and Craig did well to get on the end of it. After that we limited a very good side to a limited number of chances. The back four as a unit very sound, and Danny Coyne made some good saves when he had to."

Away

To have taken seven points from nine away from home holds us in good stead. We have tightened up more on the road. Last season we were gung ho at times. The two wingers stayed out wide and didn't really tuck in and do their defensive duties. But both of them have learned what we are looking for. They're never going to be a left back or right back but that's not what we're after. But they're performing their defensive roles better and we're looking stronger at the back.

Wingers

Shakes has got four assists now this season and that's

what we want. If Shuker and Davies are on form you can't live with them. They get lots of crosses coming in and lots of shots, and the strikers will have plenty of chances. I'm looking for Davo to get involved with the assists and add one or two more goals as well.

Midfield

Steve Jennings has come in and done everything we have asked of him and more. He has helped Paul McLaren who is a fantastic passer of the ball. Jenno compliments him by coming in, tackling, getting the ball back and doing the simple things. I'm pleased with his progress and I'm sure he's enjoying having a new lease of life playing in the first team.

Luton

I'd like to welcome Kevin Blackwell, his players and staff and the Luton supporters to Prenton Park tonight. Luton came down last season, but you only have to look at their squad to see what they are capable of. I know Kevin and his head coach John Carver really well and we're in for another tough game. They've got some really talented players in there and some experience to call on as well. I wish them all the best for the season but after tonight. The game is a great opportunity for us to go top and if you want to do anything in football you have to take your opportunities. Let's hope there's a tremendous atmosphere here tonight. The supporters who went to Carlisle were magnificent. They got behind us from the start and made a great noise. There were drums beating out and the players appreciate the support we got."

Opposition

Luton arrive at Prenton Park in tenth place in League One, having won two of their opening five matches.

Under Kevin Blackwell, the Hatters made a host of summer signings, though several familiar faces remain from their promotion winning season in 2004-05.

Paul Peschisolido, Don Hutchinson and Paul Furlong added experience to the squad, while Paul McVeigh and Richard Jackson also arrived at Kenilworth Road. Chris Perry, Darren Currie, Alan Goodall and Dave Edwards made it nine new faces in total, with David Forde and Jaroslaw Fojut arriving on loan.

Luton began the season with a 2-1 home win over Hartlepool and followed it up with a victory by the same scoreline at Dagenham & Redbridge in the Carling Cup. Their first away league match ended in a 2-1 defeat at Swindon, but they then registered back to back victories against Gillingham in League One and Premiership side Sunderland in the Carling Cup.

Leeds United defeated the Hatters 1-0 at Elland Road, and after beating Northampton 2-0 in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy, Blackwell's side lost 2-1 at home to Bristol Rovers. After the match the manager said: "It's a case of could do better. It was a near faultless first-half performance, but I still felt we didn't create enough in the last third for all our dominance and possession.

"We went behind to a wonder goal, but the lads got back into it and kept playing. The penalty was a farce although Springy held his nerve, but fair play to Bristol Rovers - they kept going.


"Unfortunately for us we've come up against all the promoted sides. We played Hartlepool, Dagenham and Swindon when they were on a high after gaining promotion and it was the same again today against Bristol Rovers.

"When we played Leeds last week it was against a team who had won all their games - we just seem to be coming up against teams who are at their best at the moment." Tonight's match will be the 26th meeting between the sides. Luton have won 12 times to Rovers' nine, though Tranmere are unbeaten in the last four meetings. The last match at Prenton Park ended 1-1 after Ryan Taylor scored from the rebound of a twice taken penalty and Chris Coyne equalised.





After scoring an incredible eight goals in three games for the Under-18 side, including hat-tricks against Northampton and Rushden, Calvin Andrew made his Luton debut in September 2004, making 11 appearances.

Ed Asafu-Adjaye

Full back Ed Asafu-Adjaye is in his first year as a professional footballer having made significant progress through the Club's youth set-up.

Zac Barrett

Promising young goalkeeper whose performances for the Youth team during the 2005/06 season earned him a professional contract.

David Bell

Talented young midfielder who signed a three and a half year contract with the Hatters in mid-January 2006 after joining from Rushden & Diamonds. The Northamptonshire-born player rose through the ranks at Diamonds to quickly establish himself as a firm favourite at Nene Park.

Marlon Beresford

Former Luton boss Mike Newell strengthened his squad with the signing of Marlon Beresford at the beginning of July 2004 from League One rivals Barnsley. The 34-year-old is a vastly experienced goalkeeper with over 400 appearances under his belt and he returned to Kenilworth Road on a two-year contract after impressing during a successful three-month spell with the Hatters during the 2003-04 season.

Dean Brill

Luton-born goalkeeper Dean Brill is another young player of whom big things are expected. Dean won the goalkeeper's jersey when boss Hatters boss Kevin Blackwell took over the managerial reigns at Kenilworth Road and despite the

Club being relegated, he was named Young Player of the Season.

Ahmet Brkovic

Ahmet is a tidy and hardworking member of the squad who had an inspirational season during our Championship success in League One, scoring 16 goals from midfield. Believing a move would be good for his career, he refused new terms at Leyton Orient in the summer of 2001, to join Luton on a Bosman free transfer.

Chris Coyne

The centre-half was playing for Perth Soccer Club when he was selected for the Australian Under-17 squad for the 1994 youth World Cup, and came to the notice of Harry Redknapp, then manager of West Ham. Coyne signed for the Hammers as a teenager, and after loan spells at Brentford and Southend, Coyne then went to Dundee. A £50,000 cheque persuaded the Scottish Premier League club to let the defender move to Kenilworth Road in September 2001 and Coyne rapidly became a crowd favourite in the promotion run that followed and since then he has firmly established himself as a formidable rock at the heart of the Hatters defence.

Darren Currie

Darren Currie became Kevin Blackwell's third signing of the summer when he signed a two-year deal at Kenilworth Road in July 2007. The experienced midfielder started his career at West Ham and has played for Shrewsbury, Plymouth, Barnet, Wycombe, Brighton, Ipswich and Derby.

Sol Davis

It was a coup for Luton, when the highly-rated defender decided to leave Swindon after his contract expired at the end of the 2001/02 season.

Sol was unfortunately involved in a serious incident during the 2006/07 season when he suffered a stroke on the team bus prior to the Club's visit to Ipswich Town. He was taken into the specialist unit at Addenbrookes Hospital in Cambridge. The squad had been on their way to the Belstead Brook hotel in Ipswich on Saturday when Davis lost feeling in his left side and this was affecting his speech. Sol however made a miraculous recovery and despite being told by doctors it will take months for him to return, he was back in action and started in the game against Cardiff City on New Years Day, 2007.

Dave Edwards

Dave Edwards became Kevin Blackwell's first ever signing at Luton Town joining in July 2007 from Shrewsbury Town. The energetic midfielder is a product of Shrewsbury's youth system and has gone on to make 101 starting appearances for the Shropshire outfit, scoring 15 goals.

Lewis Emanuel

Lewis Emanuel arrived at Kenilworth Road in the summer of 2006 after deciding to leave his home town club Bradford City, the place where the defender started his career. Lewis is a pacy full-back but can also play on the left side of midfield.

Paul Furlong

Paul Furlong became the fourth signing by Hatters boss Kevin Blackwell, following the arrival of Darren Currie, Alan Goodall and David Edwards. The striker has played for clubs including Coventry, Watford, Birmingham and Sheffield United.

Alan Goodall

Alan Goodall arrived at Luton Town just 24 hours after Dave Edwards joined from Shrewsbury Town. Alan, who signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road, started

his career at Welsh club Bangor City in 2001, spending four years at Farrar Road, where he scored ten goals in 91 games.

Don Hutchison

Don Hutchison became Kevin Blackwell's seventh signing of the summer after he impressed on a trial at the Club during a pre-season tour of Norway. The experienced midfielder signed a one-year contract at the Club as Luton became his ninth club of his illustrious career.

The capture of Paul McVeigh, the ninth and final signing of Kevin Blackwell during pre-season, came somewhat of a surprise to many Luton Town. At the time of his signature, Luton were in desperate need of a centre-half and talk in the local media was linking defenders with a move to Kenilworth Road. However, Blackwell managed to sign this free scoring striker to add further competition to his forward line.

Dean Morgan

Dean Morgan became an instant favourite with Luton fans after his 90th minute winner in the 3-2 victory over Southampton in August 2005. Morgan moved to Kenilworth Stadium from Reading in July 2005 after seeing his opportunities limited at the Madjeski Stadium.

Stephen O'Leary

Stephen O'Leary is a skillful midfielder, who has spent time on-loan with Tranmere Rovers. Brian Little, the boss of the League One club at the time of O'Leary's arrival, became an instant fan of the central midfielder and went on to become a regular in the side, scoring three goals in 22 appearances. He was rewarded for his displays at the end of the 2006/07 season when boss Kevin Blackwell handed him a one-year contract.

Sam Parkin

Ex-Chelsea trainee Sam Parkin is a forward with a prolific goalscoring record, and choose Kenilworth Road as the place to further his career in August 2006 despite strong interest from other Championship clubs.

Chris Perry

Chris Perry brought plenty of experience with him when he signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road. In 1991 Perry started his career at Wimbledon and went on to make more than 200 appearances for the club before

moving to Tottenham Hotspur in 1999 and then on to Charlton and West Brom.

Paul Peschisolido

Experienced striker Paul Peschisolido joined Luton on a one-year deal in July 2007, becoming manager Kevin Blackwell's sixth signing of the summer. Blackwell knows all about Peschisolido, who was at Sheffield United from 2001-04 when the Hatters boss was No 2 to Neil Warnock at Bramall Lane.

Steve Robinson




Steve Robinson is a hard working midfielder who has become a firm favourite with the fans at Kenilworth Road. Looking to add experience to a young midfield department, Luton snapped up a man who had earned respect wherever he played. They paid £50,000 to Preston North End in the summer of 2002 for a player who had been capped five times by Northern Ireland.

Drew Talbot

Drew Talbot signed for Luton Town in a £250,000 deal in January 2007 from Sheffield Wednesday as former Hatters boss Mike Newell looked to strengthen his options in attack. He made an immediate impact, making one and then scoring the winner against his old club at Kenilworth Road on his home league debut.

Paul Underwood

Luton Town fought off competition from a number of clubs to complete the free transfer signing of Paul Underwood from Rushden & Diamonds on transfer deadline day 2004. Paul's career with Luton has been put in some doubt when he contracted a blood infection after undergoing a routine operation last summer and as a result missed the entire 2006/07 season.







The Manager

Kevin Blackwell

Blackwell's reputation as a coach was built at Bramall Lane where he worked alongside Blades boss Neil Warnock.

In fact, he spent much of his playing career under the boisterous Yorkshireman. The Luton-born goalkeeper signed for Scarborough from Barnet in 1986, and then followed Warnock to Notts County and, after a spell with Torquay, joined him again at Huddersfield, Plymouth, Bury and finally Sheffield United, where he became first-team coach. He remained at the Steel city club until July 2003, when his long association with Warnock ended as he made the move to west Yorkshire to join the Leeds coaching staff. After serving two seasons as Leeds manager, Blackwell left the club in September last year. He was appointed number one at Luton Town in March 2007.

Chris Shuker has started where he left off last season.

The winger topped the League One assists chart with 12 in 2006-07, and he already leads the way in 2007-08 with four in five games, three of which have led to goals for Chris Greenacre.

He said: "I think I've had a good start to the season, particularly because I've only been fully fit for one game because of my hamstring injury. To have four assists and a goal already is great for me.



Following this and amidst all the jubilation and national pride surrounding Christine Ohuruogu's gold in the 400 metres I then found myself accused of judging by double standards. If I agreed with Kelly's comments, then how should I judge our golden girl's performance?

Christine has never tested positive for drugs but she has just returned from a year's ban for missing three doping tests....and like Blonska had just recorded a personal best.

With Steven Gerrard and 'Freddie' Flintoff only able to play for club and country after taking pain-killing injections it left me with the question 'are they using performance enhancing treatments too?' Could they have performed as well or indeed at all without them? Perhaps that's taking the debate a little too far but hopefully you can see my point.

There's no doubting that professional sportspeople can be 'misery guts' too when they are injured and can't perform but just where should we draw the line about the use of performance enhancing drugs.

Which in a roundabout way brings me back to my young colleague's suggestion of an 'injection of optimism.' This would surely be the safest of all treatments.

Those of you who travelled to Carlisle or listened to my commentary on 'Radio Merseyside' or 'Tranmere World' will no doubt have received your own 'injection of optimism' following Rovers excellent 1-0 win. Even just five games into the season promotion is a certainty isn't it when we're still on 'Cloud Nine'!

So just remember how you felt last Saturday night as you start cheering the side on this evening because your unconditional support is the best drug you can supply to any sportsperson or team.

It's the professional moaners that can turn us all to drink and drugs and leave your favourite player feeling very lonely."

Factual Friday Night Football




*Friday night football at Prenton Park stems back to the **1960-61 season**. Following the first televised coverage of the Grand National by the BBC in March 1960, this became - and still is - a regular feature. In line with this the following season, Rovers took the decision to alter their Third Division home game with Hull City. Liverpool also moved their Division Two home fixture with Plymouth Argyle to the Friday evening, as did Cardiff City who entertained Blackpool. **Rovers won their match 1-0.**

*The switch proved a great success, as Rovers hoped to move further games towards the end of the season. In one instance they planned to move their fixture with Coventry City to a Friday in April to avoid a clash with the Rugby Union Championship final being played at Birkenhead Park RUFC between Cheshire and Devon. The Football League, however, objected, stating that they required at least three weeks notice before the intended fixture.

*Although some Rovers supporters objected to Friday nights, a request by Rovers to have **all their home games played during the 1963-64 season** on a Friday was rejected by the Football League. Undeterred, Rovers pressed the issue, and eventually managed to switch **15** of the games to Friday nights. In later seasons the Football League were more lenient, but still did not take kindly to the switch due to the Football Pools.

*Since then **376** home matches have been played on Friday nights, a record which consists of **199 wins, 86 draws and 91 defeats.**

*This includes a string of memorable

victories, involving **two 7-1 wins, three 6-1 wins**, alongside **four 6-2 scorelines**. The most consistent scoreline has been however **1-0** - and on **38 occasions** overall.

*Of the **86 draws, 32 of these have been 0-0 draws, 36 1-1 draws, 16 2-2 draws, with just 2 matches resulting in a 3-3 draw.**

*The **heaviest recorded Friday night home defeat** was a **0-5 reverse in September 1979, versus Bournemouth**,

and in which the famous 'hooligan' incident took place. Pensioner Charlie Lindsay entered the field of play, from the Cowshed terrace, to challenge Cherries keeper Kenny Allen with a whack on the backside with his walking stick for 'time wasting'.

*The **50th Friday night fixture** was a 1-2 defeat to Barrow in the old Third Division in April 1966. The **100th fixture** was marked with a 5-2 win over Bristol Rovers in April 1970, while the **200th** saw both Tranmere Rovers and Swindon Town draw 1-1. Rovers celebrated their **300th** with a crushing 5-1 win over Birmingham City.

*The Grand National itself has been an important factor in Tranmere games being switched to Fridays, mainly on advice from the police. All in all, **18 races have caused the switch since 1961**.

*There have been **47 Friday night home matches postponed** since 1961, and for a variety of reasons. Weather has taken precedence on most occasions, such as waterlogged pitches and snow, while Tranmere's involvement in the FA Cup has had cause for fixtures to be moved. In the early part of 1974, evening games were switched to both Saturday and Sunday afternoons during national power cuts, and in later seasons when clubs experimented with Sunday afternoon kick offs.

International call-ups for players can also be mentioned. The most notable occasion though was when the floodlights failed just 27 minutes in versus Hartlepool United in December 1986, with the score at 0-0.

***17 hattricks** have been notched up during Friday night matches. The highlights include the first which came during Tranmere's 7-1 demolition of Southport in September 1962, as Alan Arnell netted three.

George Yardley achieved the feat twice in the same month and season - September 1967-68 - scoring four goals against Shrewsbury and three versus Colchester. Ronnie Moore bagged **four goals** against Brentford during the promotion season of 1975-76 against Brentford, while both **Frank Worthington** and **John Clayton** scored **three-a-piece in the same game**, as Tranmere trounced Cambridge United **6-2** in August 1985. The last was **Stuart Barlow's three goals** against Wrexham in **September 2001**, during a **5-0 whitewash**.

*The team we have faced the most of Friday nights is **Port Vale**, on **13 occasions**. Torquay United (**12**), Halifax Town (**11**), Stockport County (**10**) and Bradford City (**10**) have also been frequent Friday night visitors. We have faced tonight's visitors **Luton** on just the one Friday night occasion - this during the 1968-69 season, and which we lost 0-2.

*The **biggest attendance** for any Friday night fixture at Prenton Park came against Southport, when **15,555 spectators** turned out for our Division Three fixture **April 1967**. The lowest is just **984**, when Exeter visited Prenton Park in March 1979. Additionally the abandoned fixture with Hartlepool in December 1986 attracted just **843 spectators!**

*The most Friday night games won in just one season is **12**, and which came during **1964-65 and the Division Four promotion seasons of 1966-67 and 1975-76**. Rovers were also undefeated in **14 seasons** of Friday night football played.

*There have been **eight Friday live matches** in front of the TV cameras. The most notable was in fact the first Friday game to be televised live - a thrilling 4-3 victory over Portsmouth in October 1996. Since then however, most live matches have not proved successful on the field!

*Since 1961, there have only been three seasons where **Friday night home matches have not taken place - 1981-82, 1995-96 and 2003-04**. The most Friday night games played in one season is 16 - this during both the 1965-66 and 1972-73 seasons.

*Other memorable Friday nights have included a breath-taking **5-2 victory** over **West Ham United** in **1992**, while previously of course, our last-gasp **1-0 win over Exeter City in 1987** which did enough to preserve our Football League status.

When Johnny King's Superwhites travelled to Luton for this Spring encounter 12½ years ago they led the division and looked on course to reach the top flight for the first time in their history.

Both manager David Pleat and skipper Trevor Peake used their columns to highlight our strengths. The boss talked about the "Pedigree and quality" of players like Gary Stevens, Liam O'Brien, John Aldridge and Pat Nevin, but also pointed out the homegrown talent in our squad. Ged Brannan, John McGreal, Kenny Irons and our current Reserve Team Manager, Shaun Garnett, were amongst those he no doubt had in mind.

Trevor Peake looked back to the official opening of the re-developed Prenton Park, which had taken place the week before and thought that Rovers had every chance of rounding off a memorable year with promotion. However he remained confident that the Hatters recent good home record could see them pull off a shock win and edge closer to the play-off places themselves.


Back in 1995, of course, the pointless transfer windows hadn't even been thought of by meddling UEFA officials, so the Thursday after this fixture, being the third in March, marked, as it had for so many years, the traditional transfer deadline day and David Pleat was hoping to bring at least one new face to Kenilworth Road. Chairman David Kohler remained determined to move the club to a new stadium to ensure its future and pointed out that, with time and alternatives in Luton rapidly being exhausted, they may have to look further afield. He had already held informal talks with Milton Keynes Borough Council, but his plans failed to materialise and so our visitors today remain as Luton Town rather than the MK Hatters!

The "Those Were The Days" double-page feature turned the clock back just three years to a six-goal thriller when the corresponding fixture had ended in a 3-3 draw. Remarkably seven of the Rovers team which took to the field in that September 1992 clash were still in the line up for this match, underlining the continuity which was a feature of our success-laden years in the 1990's.

The back cover of the 40-page programme (cost £1.50) was another throwback to a simpler age with both teams numbered 1-11 and not even three permitted substitutes listed.

On the day it was the eleven players in the white of Luton who held the upper hand as they ran out 2-0 winners and helped to end Tranmere's promotion dreams. As we lost to Reading in the play-offs, The Hatters slumped to sixteenth place to share our end of season disappointment. With all due respect to our visitors, let's hope that the only disappointed people inside Prenton Park today are sitting in The Cowshed!

Our support on the road is averaging 492 at the moment (including Stockport in the Carling Cup) - not bad considering the attendances across the board in League One. Currently only Leeds are attracting above average totals in our Division so far, due to their status.

Somewhere New?...

Talking of travelling, those ground hoppers amongst us, can even extend the field of dreams to a variety of new venues, thanks to Tranmere's Ladies and Men's Reserve teams, as most if not all the opposition chose to stage their home matches at alternative venues.

The advantage with the Ladies team this season include Maltby Main FC (Sheffield Wednesday), Heybridge Swifts FC (Colchester United), Woodley Sports FC (Stockport County), Dunkirk FC (Nottingham Forest), Washington FC (Sunderland), Bamber Bridge FC (Preston North End), Parkgate FC (Rotherham United), Flixton FC (Manchester City) and Sutton Coldfield Town FC (Aston Villa). All this for the price of a coach trip (£10 everywhere), plus a £2 admission fee, capped with a £1 programme. The men's Reserves too visit Buckley FC (Wrexham), Fleetwood Town FC (Blackpool), Radcliffe Borough FC (Bury) and Accrington Stanley twice (alongside Burnley).

"How can so few people make so much noise?"

This was a quote I just had to add here, having heard it made by a Carlisle United steward at the front of the visiting supporters section during the game last Saturday. Both he and his colleagues had endured almost 90 minutes of deafening and continuous vocal support by those Rovers fans at Brunton Park.

All very encouraging really, as it had been a rather topsy-turvy week. Seven days earlier we'd maintained our good record at Huish Park with Steve Davies' dramatic injury-time free kick, to then see us disappointingly bow of the only cup competition we had a realistic chance of winning, and this even before you could say 'Johnstone's'.

True, by taking into account Morecambe's great cup record since entering the Football League in August, the final outcome at Prenton Park might not have surprised some within the game as a whole. Once again, Rovers didn't disappoint. An all-round solid performance blocked out the hosts to the point of sheer frustration for the home supporters, who in the process were left to watch Craig Curran put Rovers into a deserved 1-0 lead just before the break.

The half-time sights of concrete and fencing directly in front of the stand, with the pitch area moved to one side, does offer one of the division's most strange views - not the fault of the Club mind, but it's bizarre nonetheless. This however had little or no effect whatsoever toward the superb vocal support, especially as Rovers then had to endure the second-half pressure cooker, taken to boiling point, but doing enough professionally to not allow the contents to spill from the pan.

Having weathered the onslaught, there was almost a sense of justice about the whole affair at full time, as while having not won there since 1998, the previous run of defeats at Brunton Park had been pretty close to say the least - so winning here by any scoreline was sweet enough indeed.


Thoughts of the previous week's game at Yeovil also were taken into account on the trip home, as having gone a goal down at Huish, our perseverance once again shone through.

Marcus Stewart once again made every effort to score against us for the umpteenth time, and for a while, he looked to have succeeded having found the back of the net midway through the second-half.

Having won and drawn on our last two visits to Huish, the game then entered injury time, and a first-ever defeat looked to be on the cards - although as previously mentioned, that changed as soon as Steve Davies stepped up to take his free kick.

There was sheer joy to be had both on and off the pitch, not only following the goal, but at the final whistle, and in some way rewarding a long and arduous trip to Somerset, especially for the coach travellers.

We'd come pretty close during that 2-0 win over Brighton - so how about more of the same?...


"Despite a second first round cup exit, this time at the hands of Morecambe, last week, the league form (dare I say it) seems to be consistent and we have had some great results."

"Defeats do show up things you have to work on."





We started the match without Gareth Taylor, John Mullin and Adnan Ahmed and with Ian Goodison, Chris Greenacre, Chris Shuker, Paul McLaren and Calvin Zola all carrying significant injuries. Add to that Steve Davies being in a big car crash a couple of nights before and Robbie Stockdale not training since Thursday due to sickness at both ends and still throwing up at half time, and you can see what a good performance and result it was from the lads. For the whole of the 2nd half Goodison and Shuker were running around like a slightly odd couple of Douglas Bader's but both gritted their teeth and got on with it. I know you are probably rubbing your eyes in disbelief that I'm actually praising the lads but, as I said before, they were magnificent. I suppose the down side was the gentle giant having to come off.

Calvin wasn't far off ready and had trained normally for 2 days so we decided to take a chance on him.

Unfortunately, he went to twist and sprint but he felt his hamstring go again. We realised it was a big gamble but so were the other 5 players who all got through 90 minutes. I liked the way Ian Goodison was laughing at Calvin and pretending to shoot him in the back of his leg when he was hobbling off, no doubt he'll get his own back one day. Calvin will have had a scan by the time you read this so we'll know a bit more then.


John Mullin is having an operation on his ankle next Tuesday to chip off a sticky outy piece of bone at the back of his ankle. I know the terminology is a bit basic but that's about the level of my knowledge. All of our surgeons keep things simple when they are talking to me and use words like 'picky wicky' instead of x-ray, and 'naughty Mr. Needle' instead of injection, it helps the players understand as well. John had an injection in it in an attempt to get his ankle to settle but it didn't so Mr Hennessy will take the hammer and chisel to it next week. He should have had it done last Thursday but the hospital weren't able to get the specially made gas mask done in time. They tried a normal one but John's nose kept the mask so far off his face that the gas wasn't reaching his mouth and he wouldn't drop off to sleep. Anyway, as you can see from the picture, we were able to get a bespoke one done eventually and he'll go under the hammer and chisel next week. I just hope he doesn't frighten the nurses to death.

Depending on how much work Mr. Hennessy has to do when he goes in, John will be out for 4 to 6 weeks. So John Mulls and Calvin are definitely not available for tonight and the other 12 carrying injuries will be tested on Thursday to see if they are ok. You'll just have to wait for Richie to announce the team."





Ward has put his faith in younger players as he looks to consolidate the club's position in the division for another season, especially with talented ex-Everton trainees Stephen Gillespie, a striker, and midfielder Scott Brown.

At the other end of the scale, Ward can call on the vast experience of one of The Robins' longest serving players. Defender Jeremy Gill, 36, joined the club in 2004 after having spent six years at Birmingham City - where he played in the League Cup semi-finals and play-off matches - and has been a virtual ever present since his arrival.

Rovers have yet to gain a point from our previous two visits to Cheltenham. When we visited there last season Kayode Odejayi's ninth minute goal was enough to give The Robins all three points.

Hopefully our current good form on the road will change our luck at Whaddon Road.
