



We need to get behind the team because we know that



games are coming thick and fast at the minute and that the opposition do not come any stronger.

Goodbye 'the special one'

So, there has been a chance for the dust to settle since Jose Mourinho's departure from Chelsea.

There were clearly many factors involved in the build-up to his exit but we, the general public, are unlikely to ever discover exactly what was going on.

It would appear though that relations between Mourinho and owner Roman Abramovich became more than a little strained towards the end of his tenure.

And it seems the Andriy Shevchenko signing may have driven a wedge between the pair.

All we do know for certain is

Love him or hate him, Jose Mourinho's departure will certainly leave a big void in our game

that the man from Portugal has given us plenty to remember in his three and a bit seasons managing in England's top-flight. Mourinho's departure from FC Porto and coming to the capital was, arguably, just the tonic the English game needed.

The 'special one's' quotes are just legendary. I spent most of the Thursday and Friday after the announcement trawling through the papers reflecting on some of his great one-liners.

That, strangely, appealed to me more than whether he was or was not sacked and whether

it was a case of mutual consent that brought an end to his reign.

My personal favourite was when he admitted that he was not concerned that Manchester United were breathing down their necks.

He insisted: "For me, pressure is bird flu. I am feeling a lot of pressure with the problem in Scotland. It is not fun and I am more scared of it than football."

Prior to his side's Champions League draw with Rosenborg, he said: 'The style of how we play is very important. But it is omelettes and eggs. No eggs - no omelettes.'

"It depends on the quality of the eggs. In the supermarket you have class one, two or class three eggs and some are more expensive than others and some give you better omelettes.

"So when the class one eggs are in Waitrose and you cannot go there, you have a problem."

It is priceless stuff and love him or hate him I think it will be hard to find anyone who will not miss great quotes like those.

He has promised he will be back to manage in the Premier League again in the future and I for one hope that he sticks to his word.

DEFENDER Scott Guyett may be in the form of his life - but his team-mates are still confused about his true nationality.

The centre half was born in Ascot, Berkshire, but emigrated to Australia when he was just five and grew up in Brisbane.

It was Down Under that Guyett started playing football, representing local sides before moving to Brisbane Lions.

But he always harboured ambitions of playing in England and at the age of 19 - after spending 14 years in Australia - he moved back to Blighty.

The 31-year-old's been here ever since, starting out at Gresley Rovers and playing for Southport, Oxford and Chester before arriving at Yeovil.

So Guyett's spent more time in England than in Australia and was born in this country, but spent his formative years in the land of the Wallaby and speaks with a broad Aussie accent.

It's not surprising that the Gloves squad claim Guyett is English, but he is in no doubt as to where his allegiances lie.

"I may have been born in England but I moved to Australia when I was five and did all my schooling out there," said the defender.

"I lived in the Western suburbs of Brisbane and I class myself as Australian. When the lads say that I'm really English, it's probably the only thing that gets to me.

"They do have a dig at me from time to time, but I grew up there and my family are all out there.

"My girlfriend's Australian as well and I'll always go back there at the end of my career. I see Australia as my home."

Don't call me a Pom!

Born in England but raised in Australia, centre-back SCOTT GUYETT is very sure on where his allegiances lie but whatever the case for Yeovil the Aussie is playing at the top of his game this season

It was while in Australia that Guyett became a big Manchester United fan, thanks to his dad's love of the Red Devils.

He recalled: "Dad went all over the country to watch United when we were in England and I support them as well.

"Since the Premiership started

you can watch loads of English football on television in Australia, but when I was growing up it was different.

"We just used to have a programme showing all the goals every Monday night, but it wasn't on until very late.

Guyett always knew he would have to move to England to further his football career and took the plunge as a teenager, when he lodged with relatives in the Midlands.

"I was always into football as a young kid and after I left primary school I thought about coming over to the UK.

"As the years went by it became more and more of a goal for me. I did alright at school but at the back of my mind I always wanted to come to play football in England.

"I worked in a shop after high school but that was just to fund my trip over here really and when I was 19 I came over to stay with relatives.

"For the first three months I didn't do much, but then I joined the local team, which was Gresley Rovers.

"They were in the Southern League and we had Paul Futcher as our manager. It was great for me because he was a former defender and really helped me develop.

"I was there for just over a

year and we ended up winning the league but couldn't go up because our ground didn't meet the requirements.

But Gresley's misfortune didn't hold Guyett back and when Futcher moved on to Conference side Southport, the Aussie followed him.

It was while at Haig Avenue that Guyett's career received another boost, with former England defender Mark Wright taking over from Futcher.

"I was quite lucky playing for two central defenders," added the Yeovil man. "First Paul Futcher took me under his wing because I was quite raw at that stage.

"English football is very competitive, especially in the lower leagues and I was a frail little Aussie coming over trying to get a career.

"Then halfway through my three years at Southport, Mark Wright came in and he was another big influence on me."

Guyett ended up playing for Wright at Oxford and Chester following their spell at Southport,

experiencing league football for the first time at the Kassam Stadium.

"I had some big decisions to make because it felt like I was moving all over the country, but I had to do it for the good of my career," said Guyett.

"In my first season at Chester, Yeovil beat us to promotion from the Conference and we lost in the play-offs to Doncaster, but the next year we went up as champions.

"I was offered a new deal at Chester, but felt I needed a different challenge and although it was another big move geographically, I chose Yeovil."

That was back in 2004 and Guyett has now clocked up more than 70 appearances for the Glovers, scoring two goals.

But this season marks the first time that he's started a campaign as a first choice – and is widely recognised to be in the best form of his career.

Glovers fans everywhere – including those Down Under – will be hoping the big Aussie can maintain those high standards.

He runs his own business based in Fleet called Source Office Supplies and due to the amount of travelling has left Bognor to play for Burgess Hill.



Sam at this point asked me 'why have we come to Australia'; my response was 'to find a better way of life'. Probably a bit hard for him to understand at the time!



We are competing on a level par with these bigger clubs now and we are enjoying the challenge.


It is going quite well so far this season, and I definitely think there is more to come from us.



iser with a quicksilver run down the left side followed by a fizzing shot which the 'keeper failed to hold.


After the interval Yeovil's superior movement caused many other opportunities.


Unfortunately another error from Burridge gifted Orient their second goal as well.

Indeed Yeovil did have chances to win it. Liam Horder who had a terrific game up front, broke through and saw his chip narrowly sail wide.


Omar Simpson, who came on as sub with fifteen minutes to go, beat a few players and brought a great save from their 'keeper.

ASK almost any of your sport loving friends if they are enjoying the World Cup, and if they have seen any of England's matches, and you are likely to hear the following.

"Oh yes. A bit disappointing against the USA, and awful against South Africa. Looking better now that Johnny Wilkinson is back....."

No, hang on. I meant the FIFA Women's World Cup, being held in China. The one that the England ladies played in.

"Oh, that one. Yes – I did hear something about that. How are we doing?"

Unfortunately it would appear that the spectacle of the Women's World Cup seems to have well and truly passed most people by.

There are perhaps some acceptable reasons for this - a clash with the Rugby Union World Cup, a clash with the Cricket Twenty20 World Cup, and the unfortunate timing of some of the allocated kick offs due to the location to name just three.

Don't forget the Ladies!

The past month has been filled with different sporting tournaments but did the Women's World Cup get the coverage it deserved?

The elimination of the England team at the quarter final stage now means that interest in the tournament will disappear entirely outside of the small number of keen followers who watch or participate in this particular sport.

This is a great shame, as it seems to me that a fantastic opportunity to emphasise the strength of the ladies' game has now gone by with seemingly little effort to give the event the promotion that it deserved.

It should also be remembered that the England team did very well to reach the final eight.

After suffering the disappoint-

ment of a stoppage time equaliser for a 2–2 draw in their opening fixture against Japan, the ladies really came good with an excellent goalless draw against reigning World Champions Germany in their second match.

A 6–1 demolishing of Argentina in the final group match set England up for a quarter final against the USA, but it was the highly rated Americans who proved stronger beating England 3–0.

So will the efforts of our national team have helped to raise the profile of women's football here in England?

One can only hope so, but I think I can be fairly certain that the modest coverage will not have helped in the same way that earlier national sides have inspired participants and spectators alike.

Here in Yeovil we have a fine ladies' side, and after their League and Cup double last year, they now sit proudly in the third tier of women's football, playing in the South West Combination along sides such as Southampton, QPR, Luton and Bournemouth.

Entry to their games at Somerset is free of charge, and I can unreservedly recommend watching them as a very pleasant way to spend a Sunday afternoon.



I'd have to say David Pleat in his first stint. We knew from the start what a good manager he was going to be, and his teams always played good football.

Your greatest player?

I'd have to go for one I never saw, Joe Payne. He scored a record 10 goals in one game against Bristol Rovers in 1936.

The worst moment supporting Luton?

I'm living through it at the moment! The club say they are about to put in planning permission for a new stadium but many are sceptical that it will ever get through and it's a part of what is dividing our supporter-base.

I will not go to any more home games until this, and other issues have been resolved.

You were relegated last season, how do you think you will do this season?

I'm not optimistic. Kevin Blackwell has completely rebuilt the team and it will take time to gel.

We've lost four of the first six games and his stated ambition of promotion straight away is looking very ambitious.

Is there a difference in quality between League 1 and the Championship?

Undoubtedly, but it is a complete myth that the lower divisions are all kick and rush.

The decent footballing team will always come out on top. Yeovil, like Luton, have a reputation for playing good football, and any team with the right manager and backing should be able to make the step up.

Did you have many ins and outs during the summer?

Too many new players to mention. Unfortunately the sale of Curtis Davies, Kevin Nicholls, Steve Howard, Rowan Vine, Carlos Edwards, Leon Barnett and Kevin Foley for nearly £14million over the last two years has taken its toll.

Your prediction for tonight's game?

Home win. Our away results have been disastrous.



6 - CHRIS COYNE


FORMER West Ham defender Coyne came to Luton in 2001 after a spell north of the border with Dundee.

LEWIS arrived at Kenilworth Road in the summer of 2006 after deciding to leave his home town club Bradford City, the place where the defender started his career. Lewis is a pacy full-back but can also play on the left side of midfield.

3 - ALAN GOODALL

ALAN who signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road, started his career at Welsh club Bangor City in 2001, spend-

ing four years at Farrar Road, where he scored ten goals in 91 games.

4 - DON HUTCHINSON

DON signed for Luton in the summer after he impressed on trial at the club during a pre-season tour of Norway.

The experienced midfielder signed a one-year contract at the club as Luton became the ninth club in his illustrious career.







FA bring Leeds saga to an end

LEEDS UNITED have been told there will be no further inquiry into their 15-point penalty.

LUTON TOWN have signed goalkeeper Ben Alnwick on a three-month loan deal from Tottenham Hotspur.


The former Sunderland goalkeeper had a brief stint at the Stadium of Light when he took over from Kelvin Davis.
