# Goodbye 'the special one'

**S**O, there has been a chance for the dust to settle since Jose Mourinho's departure from Chelsea.

There were clearly many factors involved in the build-up to his exit but we, the general public, are unlikely to ever discover exactly what was going on.

It would appear though that relations between Mourinho and owner Roman Abramovich became more than a little strained towards the end of his tenure.

And it seems the Andriy Shevchenko signing may have driven a wedge between the pair.

All we do know for certain is

Love him or hate him, Jose Mourinho's departure will certainly leave a big void in our game

that the man from Portugal has given us plenty to remember in his three and a bit seasons managing in England's top-flight. Mourinho's departure from FC Porto and coming to the capital was, arguably, just the tonic the English game needed.

The 'special one's' quotes are just legendary. I spent most of the Thursday and Friday after the announcement trawling through the papers reflecting on some of his great one-liners.

That, strangely, appealed to me more than whether he was or was not sacked and whether

it was a case of mutual consent that brought an end to his reign.

My personal favourite was when he admitted that he was not concerned that Manchester United were breathing down their necks.

He insisted: "For me, pressure is bird flu. I am feeling a lot of pressure with the problem in Scotland. It is not fun and I am more scared of it than football."

Prior to his side's Champions League draw with Rosenborg, he said: 'The style of how we play is very important. But it is omelettes and eggs. No eggs - no omelettes.

"It depends on the quality of the eggs. In the supermarket you have class one, two or class three eggs and some are more expensive than others and some give you better omelettes.

"So when the class one eggs are in Waitrose and you cannot go there, you have a problem."

It is priceless stuff and love him or hate him I think it will be hard to find anyone who will not miss great quotes like those.

He has promised he will be back to manage in the Premier League again in the future and I for one hope that he sticks to his word.

**D**EFENDER Scott Guyett may be in the form of his life - but his team-mates are still confused about his true nationality.

The centre half was born in Ascot, Berkshire, but emigrated to Australia when he was just five and grew up in Brisbane.

It was Down Under that Guyett started playing football, representing local sides before moving to Brisbane Lions.

But he always harboured ambitions of playing in England and at the age of 19 - after spending 14 years in Australia - he moved back to Blighty.

The 31-year-old's been here ever since, starting out at Gresley Rovers and playing for Southport, Oxford and Chester before arriving at Yeovil.

So Guyett's spent more time in England than in Australia and was born in this country, but spent his formative years in the land of the Wallaby and speaks with a broad Aussie accent.

It's not surprising that the Glovers squad claim Guyett is English, but he is in no doubt as to where his allegiances lie.

"I may have been born in England but I moved to Australia when I was five and did all my schooling out there," said the defender.

"I lived in the Western suburbs of Brisbane and I class myself as Australian. When the lads say that I'm really English, it's probably the only thing that gets to me.

"They do have a dig at me from time to time, but I grew up there and my family are all out there.

"My girlfriend's Australian as well and I'll always go back there at the end of my career. I see Australia as my home."

# Don't call me a Pom!

Born in England but raised in Australia, centre-back **SCOTT GUYETT** is very sure on where his allegiances lie but whatever the case for Yeovil the Aussie is playing at the top of his game this season

It was while in Australia that Guyett became a big Manchester United fan, thanks to his dad's love of the Red Devils.

He recalled: "Dad went all over the country to watch United when we were in England and I support them as well.

"Since the Premiership started

you can watch loads of English football on television in Australia, but when I was growing up it was different.

"We just used to have a programme showing all the goals every Monday night, but it wasn't on until very late.

Guyett always knew he would have to move to England to further his football career and took the plunge as a teenager, when he lodged with relatives in the Midlands.

"I was always into football as a young kid and after I left primary school I thought about coming over to the UK.

"As the years went by it became more and more of a goal for me. I did alright at school but at the back of my mind I always wanted to come to play football in England.

"I worked in a shop after high school but that was just to fund my trip over here really and when I was 19 I came over to stay with relatives.

"For the first three months I didn't do much, but then I joined the local team, which was Gresley Rovers.

"They were in the Southern League and we had Paul Futchner as our manager. It was great for me because he was a former defender and really helped me develop.

"I was there for just over a

year and we ended up winning the league but couldn't go up because our ground didn't meet the requirements.

But Gresley's misfortune didn't hold Guyett back and when Futchner moved on to Conference side Southport, the Aussie followed him.

It was while at Haig Avenue that Guyett's career received another boost, with former England defender Mark Wright taking over from Futchner.

"I was quite lucky playing for two central defenders," added the Yeovil man. "First Paul Futchner took me under his wing because I was quite raw at that stage.

"English football is very competitive, especially in the lower leagues and I was a frail little Aussie coming over trying to get a career.

"Then halfway through my three years at Southport, Mark Wright came in and he was another big influence on me."

Guyett ended up playing for Wright at Oxford and Chester following their spell at Southport,

experiencing league football for the first time at the Kassam Stadium.

"I had some big decisions to make because it felt like I was moving all over the country, but I had to do it for the good of my career," said Guyett.

"In my first season at Chester, Yeovil beat us to promotion from the Conference and we lost in the play-offs to Doncaster, but the next year we went up as champions.

"I was offered a new deal at Chester, but felt I needed a different challenge and although it was another big move geographically, I chose Yeovil."

That was back in 2004 and Guyett has now clocked up more than 70 appearances for the Glovers, scoring two goals.

But this season marks the first time that he's started a campaign as a first choice – and is widely recognised to be in the best form of his career.

Glovers fans everywhere – including those Down Under – will be hoping the big Aussie can maintain those high standards.

He runs his own business based in Fleet called Source Office Supplies and due to the amount of travelling has left Bognor to play for Burgess Hill.

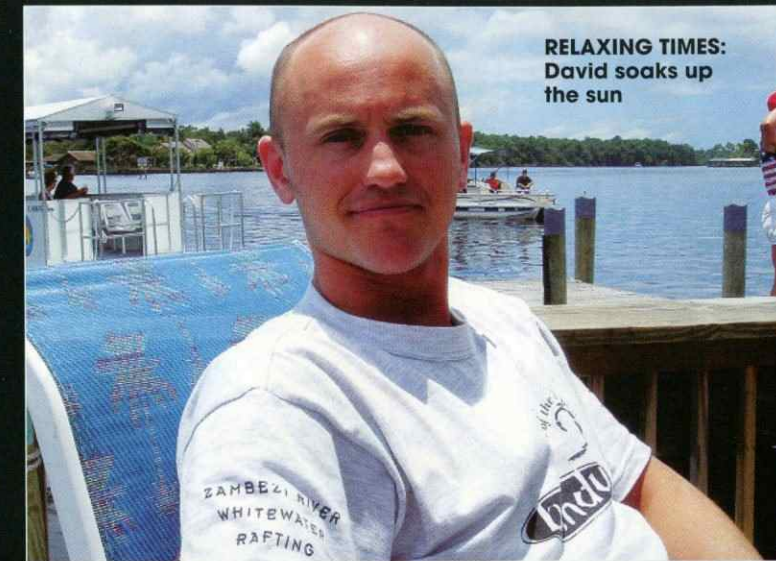

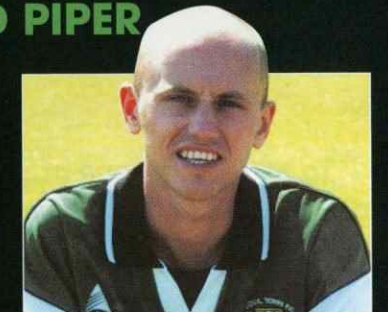

To be considered a fellow Skippy (white Australian) is recognition indeed that we are part of the community.

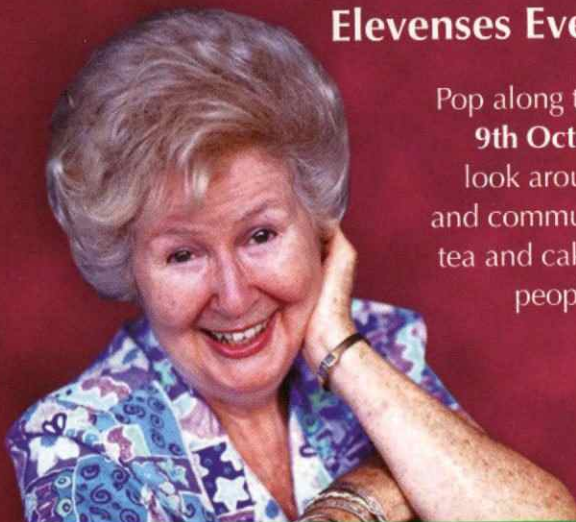

**I** was great to get my first start of the season last week against Brighton.

being able to slot into the side after my time out was not a problem, because Scotty and I have played together for four or five years now and he has been in fantastic form this season.

We have got a lot of competition for places now as Lynchy or Craig Alcock could have come in at right back, so when you get your chance to play you have to take it and play well.

We are having a real tough run of games at the moment, starting with the defeat to Nottingham Forest at the weekend, then tonight's game with Luton and away to Leeds next Saturday.

It was good to see Chris Cohen back at Huish Park last Saturday for Nottingham Forest.

Both he and Arron were fantastic when they were with us

and both got the good moves they deserved. They helped us get to the highest position in the club's history and go to a major final at Wembley.

They are both good professionals who really look after themselves. And for two young lads, they really had the enthusiasm, courage and determination to get on the ball and always created something positive for us.

Between the two of them they made a major contribution to last season.

Now tonight we have Luton Town, who we have only played once before I think in the Carling Cup a few years ago.

They have got a very good manager in Kevin Blackwell who has been there and done it all.

# 'I definitely think there is more to come from us'

They have a strong side, with some very experienced players including Paul Furlong and Paul Peschisolido who seem to have been going for years.

But our lads are in confident mood and we are looking forward to the challenges that these dif-

ficult games bring us. We know we will have to be at our best to get anything from them.

Who would have believed it a few years ago that we would be playing the likes of Nottingham Forest, Luton and Leeds in such quick succession in the league.

We are competing on a level par with these bigger clubs now and we are enjoying the challenge.

It is going quite well so far this season, and I definitely think there is more to come from us.

Skipper Josh White provided the third from the penalty spot when a Dorset defender could not handle under pressure from Conner Watts.

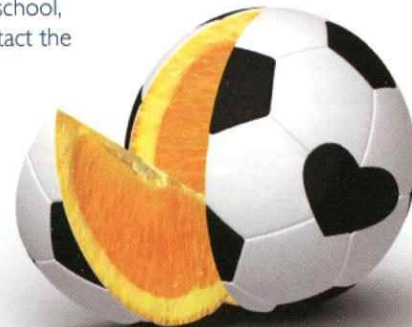
Some good performances from Rosser & Houghton provided effective width and Baker the craft through the centre.

**T**ONIGHT we are talking to 45-year-old Roger Holdstock who has supported Luton for nearly 40 years.

Currently living in Shropshire he has recently taken voluntary redundancy and now runs his own video production company - [www.oldstockvideo.co.uk](http://www.oldstockvideo.co.uk).

**What has been your favourite game?**

In my time supporting we've had 10 years in the top division, two League Cup finals, three FA Cup semi-finals and a few last day escapes.

But my favourite was the opening day of the 2003/04 season at home against Rushden & Diamonds.

It was a lovely sunny day, everybody was happy and we won 3-1.

**Your all-time Luton XI?**

**Your club's greatest manager?**

I'd have to say David Pleat in his first stint. We knew from the start what a good manager he was going to be, and his teams always played good football.

**Your greatest player?**

I'd have to go for one I never saw, Joe Payne. He scored a record 10 goals in one game against Bristol Rovers in 1936.

**The worst moment supporting Luton?**

I'm living through it at the moment! The club say they are about to put in planning permission for a new stadium but many are sceptical that it will ever get through and it's a part of what is dividing our supporter-base.

I will not go to any more home games until this, and other issues have been resolved.

**You were relegated last season, how do you think you will do this season?**

Undoubtedly, but it is a complete myth that the lower divisions are all kick and rush.

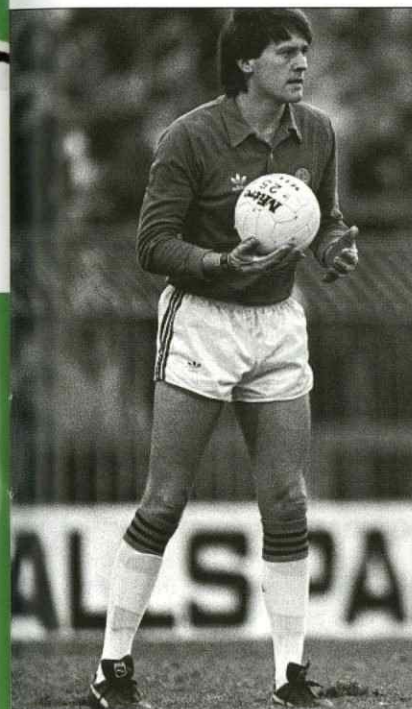
The decent footballing team will always come out on top. Yeovil, like Luton, have a reputation for playing good football, and any team with the right manager and backing should be able to make the step up.

## 6 - CHRIS COYNE

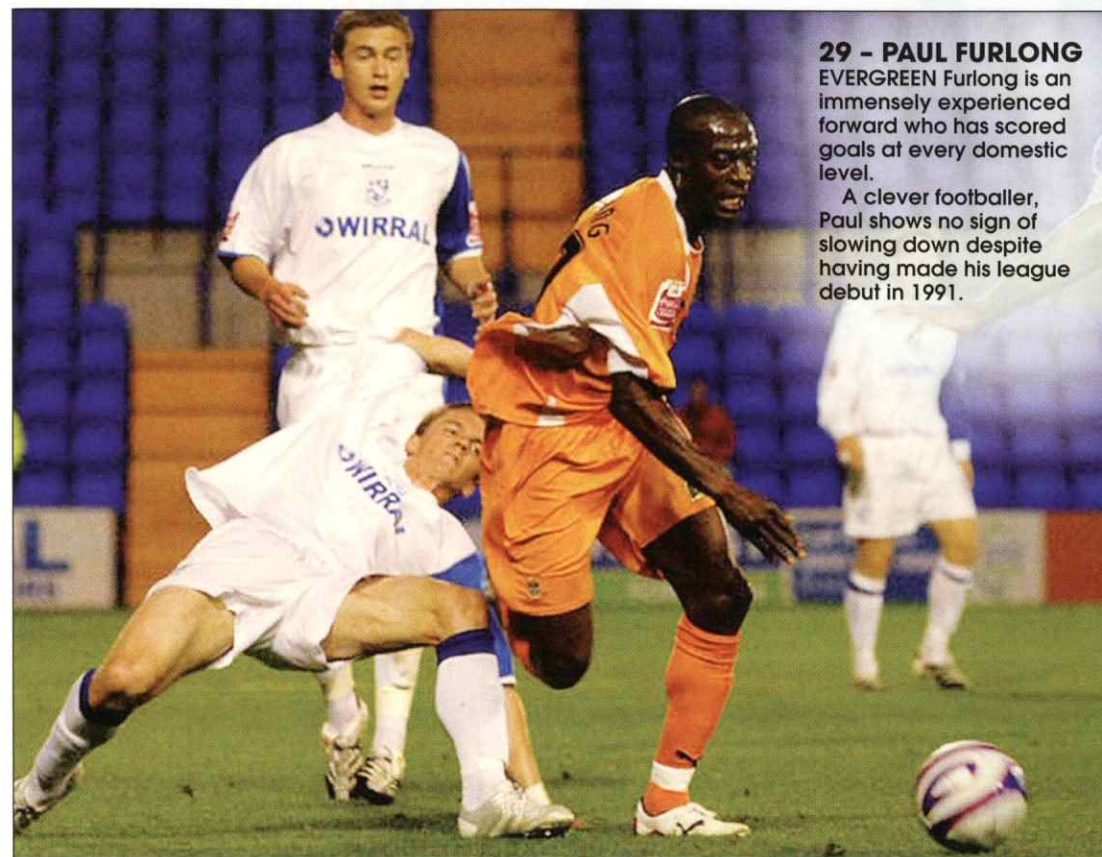
FORMER West Ham defender Coyne came to Luton in 2001 after a spell north of the border with Dundee.

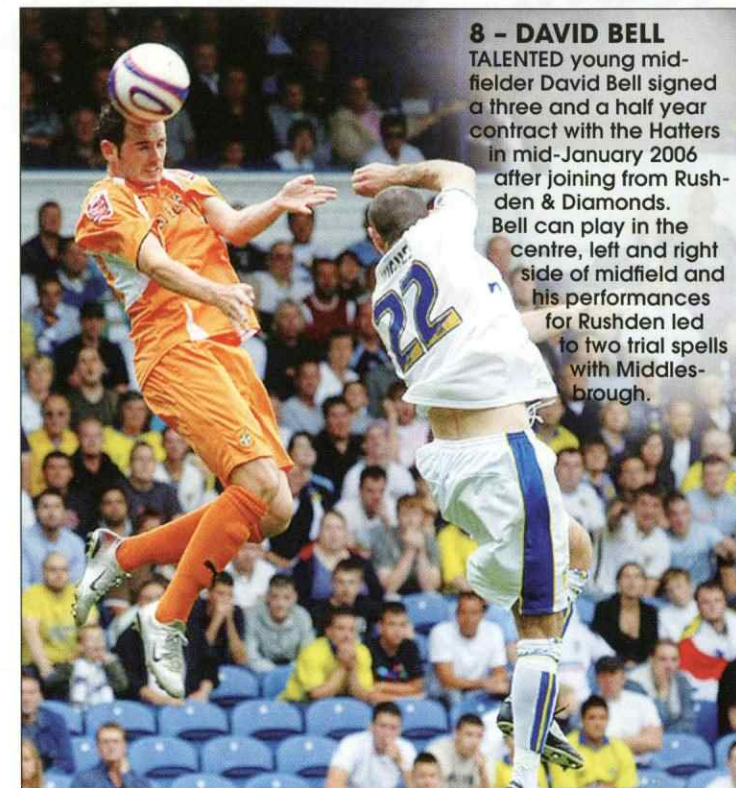

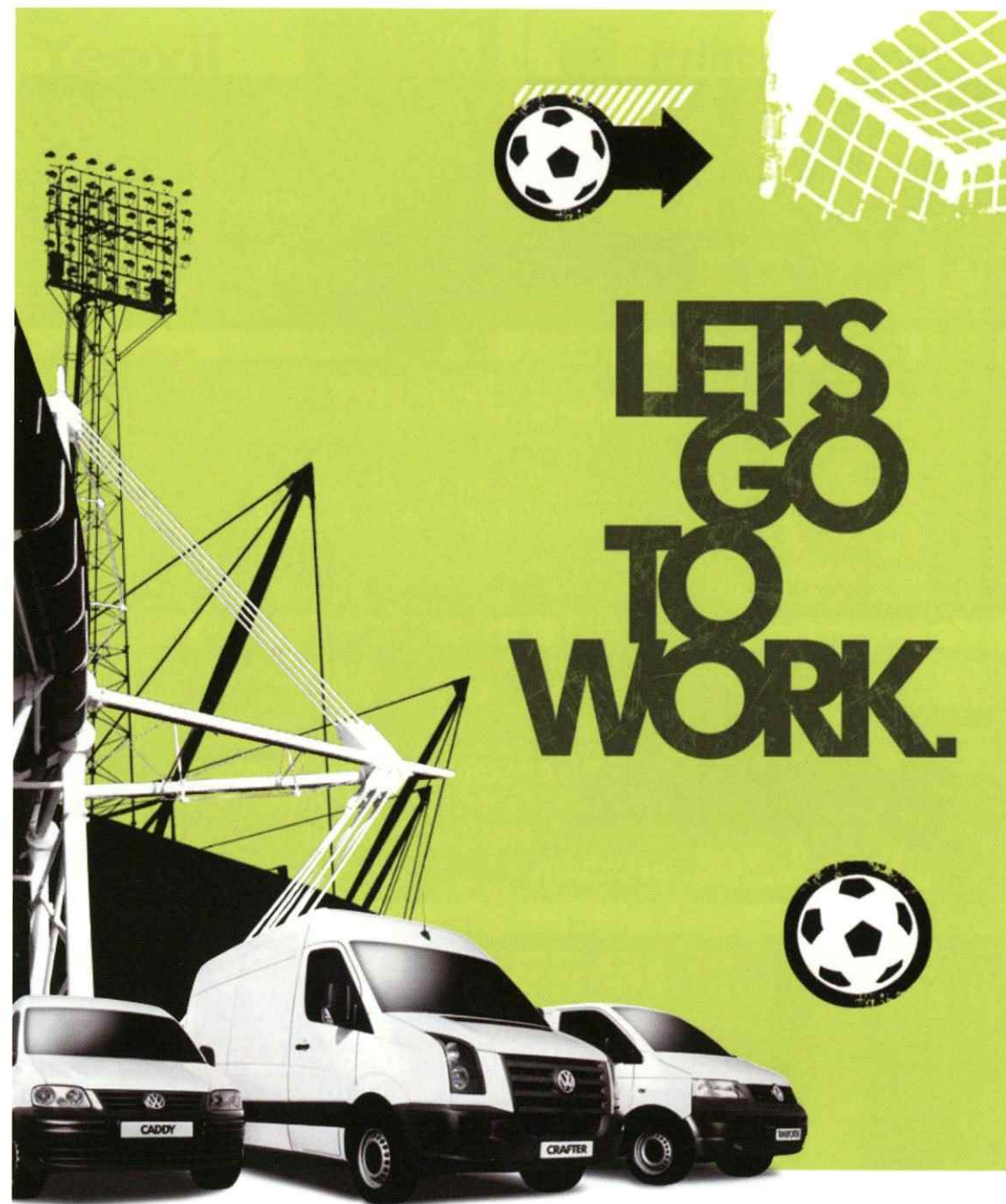

# FA bring Leeds saga to an end

**L** EEDS UNITED have been told there will be no further inquiry into their 15-point penalty.

The Yorkshire club were told at the end of a turbulent summer that they must accept the punishment in order to take their place in League 1.

They lost an appeal against the Football League's decision but had vowed to fight on.

A statement on the club's website read: "Leeds United have been informed by the Football Association that they do not believe it appropriate for there to be any further inquiry into the decision and the process adopted by the Football League surrounding the club's 15-point deduction."

Chief executive Shaun Harvey added: "We are amazed that the Football Association do not feel it is appropriate to intervene in a matter which we believe is fundamentally wrong and sets a dangerous precedent for the future."

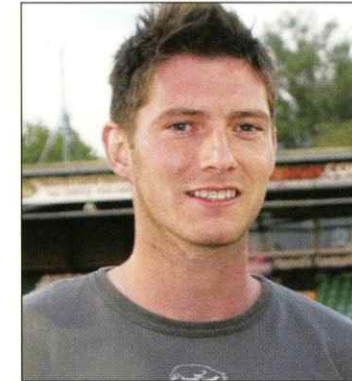
**LUTON TOWN** have signed goalkeeper Ben Alwick on a three-month loan deal from Tottenham Hotspur.

But Ashton Gate boss Gary Johnson has confirmed he turned down the approach as he does not want to lose any more members of his squad.

"There has been contact with Crewe, but I've told them I don't want anyone else going out on loan at the present time," said Johnson.

**SOUTHEND UNITED** are looking to extend Eric Odhiambo's loan spell beyond the initial one-month deal.

Odhiambo joined The Shrimpers from Leicester at the end of August and is due to head back to The Walkers Stadium after Tuesday's game against Bristol Rovers.

Southend would like to hang onto the young striker, despite his lack of playing time since arriving at Roots Hall.
