THE NAME IS BOND KEVIN BOND

Good evening and welcome to The Fitness First Stadium for tonight's match against Luton Town.

Luton Town have gone through a very difficult period and we could well be facing the same problems. If administration is what will happen here, then it will be a very difficult time. It has not been an easy time for Luton. They have had to suffer having points deducted and losing a number of players.

They do have a much bigger squad than us to be able to cope with losing players a little easier, something we could not cope with.

They have performed well under difficult circumstances and had two televised matches against Liverpool which raised their profile no end. As you all saw in those games, they are a very capable side with plenty of character about them.

Decisions were made for the long term future of Luton Town like decisions will be made for the long term future of AFC Bournemouth. We are the football people here, the money people here take the decisions off the field for the good of AFC Bournemouth.

What might not be good for me in the short term is irrelevant as we have to take care of the long term future of this football club, as the people at Luton have done for their club. They have had to ensure that in years to come, there is a Luton Town to support. Whatever we have to do, we have to ensure that AFC Bournemouth is still here to support.

I would like to welcome Mick Harford here who took over as manager of Luton Town last week initially until the end of the season, which he knows will not be an easy time. He is a good guy and he will be glad to get back on the training ground. He will be glad to be back in the game at a club he knows well and I wish him the very best of luck.

Saturday was a very disappointing day, particularly given that we had a host of chances, but only took one of them and conceded some awful goals. I expect better from the players, and I have made them fully aware of that. It is never easy when you go behind and in our position, confidence can be fragile. It can make a world of difference if you can get your noses in front and going behind certainly had the opposite effect on Saturday.

Before Southend scored, we were well on top and started the game brightly and even after they had a two goal lead, we created some really good chances.

We caused our own problems with our decision making, but always felt we had goals in us.

We had so many good opportunities throughout the game and should, not could, have made more than one count. I felt when we got the early goal in the second half that we could give ourselves a chance. The penalty miss by them gave us another lift, but we gave away another poor goal and that was demoralising.

We cannot and won't use what is going on around the club as an excuse. We were all looking forward to the game on Saturday and felt it was one we could win. We brought the defeat upon ourselves and we gave ourselves an uphill battle and there can be no excuses.

I shared your disappointments on Saturday and am as frustrated as you are. I can understand your reactions. But in what is such a difficult time for everyone at AFC Bournemouth, please give the lads all your positive support tonight as they need it now more than ever.

THE ANDERTON ANGLE

Welcome to tonight's match against Luton Town. You only have to look at the league table to see just how massive tonight's game is.

Saturday was a devastating result. After recent home performances, we really felt we could get the three points and in the cold light of day, if we had taken a couple of our many decent chances that we had and not given away such poor goals, then we could have got something from it. The key now is to remain positive as in the next four days we have two massive games against sides who are in trouble with us. Luton lost at Leyton Orient on Saturday and are three points above us and then on Saturday, we travel to Port Vale who are on the same points as we are.

The situation is not lost because we know we are capable of getting maximum points from these games and that would make such a difference. You only have to look at Cheltenham. We should have won there and gone above them, but totally against the run of play, they got the points and then won at Hartlepool and are now out of the bottom four. It shows the fine line there is in this league. We know we are capable of doing that and will remain positive.

Luton Town have had an awful time and it's a real shame to see that. They are a club that Russell Perrett knows a lot about. I've played against them a few times myself and they are a good football club who shouldn't be suffering the way

they have been. You never like to see any club in trouble, but hopefully, there seems to be light at the end of the tunnel at Luton as a deal seems to be sorted out which is great news for everyone not just at Luton, but in football. They had the massive boost of the games against Liverpool, not just financially, but it raised their profile. That was the sort of cup tie we could have done with!

At this time of the season, one of the major talking points in the game and one that sees rumours and speculation abound, is the January transfer window. I think it has its pros and cons. It's a good thing in some ways, because it means you can't go out and buy players willy nilly at any time you like. On the down side, if you have a horrific time with injuries, you can be stuck with a squad that is right down to the bare bones and it can make it very difficult. Not that we're not in the position to be going out and buying anyone anyway!

You look at the top end of the English game and there are some huge squads in the Premier League, but go down to our level, and there are some very small squads. I have mixed views on it really, mainly because teams can be desperate as the window is only open for a short period of time and are forced to pay big money for players.

For ourselves, we have a small squad and every time we seem to be getting players back and looking stronger, something happens and not only do we lose Neil Moss to a long term wrist injury, but then on Saturday, Gareth Stewart was forced off. Hopefully he will be OK for tonight, but it does seem to sum up our luck this season.

The key now is to remain positive as in the next four days we have two massive games against sides who are in trouble with us...

It is a very difficult time at the club at the moment with some big decisions to be made. For the players, all we can do is to concentrate on the next game and for us, that is tonight's massive game with Luton and that is all we can think about. All the lads know how frustrated you all are, I can assure you that we share your frustrations. We need to show togetherness now, management, staff, players and supporters because unity is so important. Enjoy the game tonight, be positive to the team and give the lads your usual superb support. ■

At the next roundabout take the second exit into Newcastle Street and go up the hill to Burslem Town Centre and after a set of traffic lights by the Town Hall, turn left in to Hamil Street and the ground is on your left. The ground is around 191 miles from Bournemouth and there is parking at the ground for £4 per car.

TRAIN

The nearest railway station to Vale Park is Longport which is served by Stoke which is around two miles from the ground. It may be easier to get a train to Stoke and get a taxi from there to Burslem. The 06.45 from Bournemouth will get you to Longport at 13.23 and to return, the 17.28 from Longport arrives back in Bournemouth at 22.15. There is just one change, Stoke, for both these journeys.



On www.afcb.co.uk, the club issued the following statement, "The Directors of AFC Bournemouth have lodged a notice of intent to appoint an administrator. BDO Stoy Hayward is currently dealing with the Directors of AFC Bournemouth in an advisory capacity only. At this stage there has been no formal appointment of administrators.

The Chairman Jeff Mostyn commented that this action was taken to prevent our current negotiations being frustrated by

aggressive and unhelpful creditors.

We were professionally advised to serve a Notice of intention to appoint an Administrator which we have done. However, the Chairman stressed that the Club is not in administration and it is not a forgone conclusion that it will be."

SATURDAY 19 JANUARY 2008



It was a highly disappointing day for Bournemouth as Southend United cruised to a 4-1 win at The Fitness First Stadium. The Cherries made a decent enough start to the game, but against the run of play, Southend scored with their first effort on goal.

It got worse as the visitors doubled their lead, but after that Bournemouth had enough chances to get back on level terms. It wasn't to be and just before the break, United scored their third of the half. After the ten point deduction for going in to administration put them in the relegation zone, they had the massive boost of two cup ties with Liverpool, both games generating revenue as they were shown live on TV. After the draw at home, a number of players were sold and then after the brave performance at Anfield, manager Kevin Blackwell left the club having previously handing in his notice and was initially due to leave the club after the match against The Cherries on 9 February.

Whilst all that was going on, a consortium which involved lifelong Luton Supporter Nick Owen had been given the green light by the administrators to give light at the end of the tunnel.

Whilst all this has been going on, there has also been football to be played and despite having the ten point deduction and a number of key players being sold, Luton still have a very capable squad and one that can be confident still of climbing out

of the relegation zone to safety. Harford took charge on Saturday at Leyton Orient and despite a 2-1 defeat, saw enough to suggest that the side can get out of trouble. He took a lot of heart from a good performance and away from the scoreline, it gives him something to build on.

Luton do have a good chance of beating the drop mainly thanks to an excellent home record. In the league, they have beaten Hartlepool, Gillingham, Port Vale, Northampton, Nottingham Forest, Southend United, Tranmere and Yeovil. Away from home, they have recorded just one League win, a 2-1 success at Port Vale in the final away game of 2007.

In cup competitions, they have been mightily impressive. In the League Cup, they beat Dagenham & Redbridge before beating Premier League Sunderland 3-0 and then Championship side Charlton 3-1. They finally went out against Everton, but only to a goal in extra time. In the FA Cup, they won at Brentford in a replay before beating Nottingham Forest 1-0 to set up the tie with Liverpool. Tonight we welcome back to The Fitness First Stadium, one of the Bournemouth legends from the Great Escape season, Steve Robinson. 'Robbo' arrived at the club in October 1994 from Tottenham Hotspur on the same day as Neil Young and Steve Jones with the club in a pretty awful situation. He blossomed that season and grabbed a couple of the goals in that unforgettable match against Shrewsbury as a miracle was completed. For almost five years, he made himself a virtual ever present in the Bournemouth side, making 286 appearances for the club, scoring 60 goals and of course representing the club at Wembley.

He left Bournemouth for Preston in May 2000 and if anyone deserved the chance at a higher level, it was Steve. In two years at Deepdale though, he was given few opportunities and ended up at Bristol City on loan. He played for City at Bournemouth, the first time he faced his old club in March 2002 as the Cherries were battling against the drop. It was a real shame that he was booed by a section of the crowd for what? Taking the opportunity to play in a higher division after giving AFC Bournemouth such fantastic service? That summer he moved to Luton where he has given marvellous service and his form has earned him a recall to the Northern Ireland squad. He has of course worn the colours of AFC Bournemouth again since he left, playing for John Bailey's side in his testimonial. Like Neil Young who has remained here, 'Robbo' has enjoyed a long career in the game and has given people so much enjoyment, so welcome back Steve!

RUSS PERRETT



A much more recent link between the two clubs is Russ Perrett, who joined Bournemouth in the summer from Luton. Russ started out in the local Wessex League and played for Portsmouth and Cardiff City before arriving at Luton in 2001. Included in his 108 appearances for the Hatters was one at Bournemouth on Saturday 9 April 2005.

Bournemouth were battling for a place in the play-offs and Luton were closing in on winning the Division Two title and a then record crowd of 9,058 saw the game. In a tight game, James Hayter burst through on 22 minutes and was blocked by Perrett and referee Tony Parkes decided it was a goalscoring opportunity and showed Russ a straight red card! If anything, it galvanised Luton and six minutes from the end, they grabbed the three points through an Enoch Showunni goal and Luton had virtually ensured promotion.

It's obviously been a frustrating time for Russ since he joined Bournemouth, but it's good to see him fit and back in the side now.

Both the games in the 04-05 season ended 1-0 to Luton, but in the previous season, there was an amazing game at Dean Court. Bournemouth were fifth in the table having won their previous two games.

Bournemouth took the lead on seven minutes through Steve Fletcher before Luton equalised when Stephen Purches scored own goal, but the defender was to continue his record of Bournemouth winning every game that he found the net in! That was in the tenth minute and by half time it was 4-2! Luton took the lead on 25 minutes through Paul Hughes and then Brian Stock equalised on 34 minutes. In the three minutes before the break, the Cherries had a two goal advantage thanks to another goal from Fletcher and one from Gareth O'Connor. After the break, Luton forced their way back in to the game thanks to an Adrian Forbes strike on the hour but two minutes later, Brian Stock restored the two goal lead. On 67 minutes, the scoring was completed when Wade Elliott scored to make it an amazing 6-3, the first of two times that season supporters at Dean Court witnessed six goals by Bournemouth!

Bournemouth then travelled to Luton on 2 March in 8th place and Luton in 5th place and a big crowd assembled on a cold night to see such a crunch game.

Hundreds made the trip from Bournemouth and at 7.45, were in full voice and waiting for the teams to come out when the announcement was made that the game had been postponed! That was certainly frustrating to say the least and a second trip to Luton was made on 20 April with little at stake for both sides, although both had outside chances of a play-off place. Steve Howard gave Luton an early lead, but future Luton player Warren Feeney equalised for Bournemouth in the 75th minute in an entertaining game, but not quite as entertaining as the night at Dean Court! ■■■

AUGUST

The season started with a 3-0 thumping at Derby, but new striker Colin Clarke was soon catching the eye with a terrific goal at Reading in the league cup as Bournemouth won 3-1. Bournemouth completed the job with a 2-0 home win in the second leg, the only defeat for Reading in their record breaking start to the season. Clarke scored a hat trick on his home debut against Bristol City in a 5-0 win, but the inconsistency that was to blight the season saw the next two games lost 1-0.

SEPTEMBER

Bournemouth had two fantastic games against Everton in the League Cup, at one stage leading 2-0 at Goodison Park before eventually going out 5-2 on aggregate. In the league, Chesterfield and Darlington were beaten, but the side suffered heavy defeats against Blackpool and Wigan.

OCTOBER

The month summed up Bournemouth in 1985-86. In six games, three were won and three were lost. The biggest win came against Bristol Rovers, where Colin Clarke and Colin Russell both scored two in a 6-1 win. Russell scored in four consecutive games as the side finished the month in 14th place.

NOVEMBER

The Cherries again showed inconsistency. The only win in the league came against a hapless bottom of the table Wolves side, but they gave Bournemouth a big fright before finally going down 3-2. In the FA Cup, the side overcame a tricky tie by beating Dartford in a replay.

DECEMBER

Further progress was made in the cup with a comfortable 4-1 win over Dagenham at Dean Court. The only win in the league was fortuitous to say the least. Bournemouth won 3-1 at Bristol City in a match that The Robins dominated throughout, but a couple of wind assisted goals saw the Cherries take the points. That was the only highlight in the league in a disappointing month that saw the side slip to 17th place.

JANUARY

Any dreams of a big cup draw were dashed as Bournemouth travelled to Wigan, the home side winning 3-0 after a highly disappointing Cherries performance. A battling draw against leaders Derby was a highlight and the month finished with a thrilling 3-2 win over Chesterfield at Dean Court. In the Freight Rover Trophy, an abject performance saw Bournemouth lose 3-1 at Orient before Clarke scored four against Reading in the other group game, although the 5-0 win was not enough to see Bournemouth through in the group.

FEBRUARY

Just three league games were played in the month. It started well with a 2-0 win over York at Dean Court, but Wigan completed a treble of wins over Bournemouth with a 2-0 success at Dean Court and the side lost by the same scoreline at Gillingham.

MARCH

The Cherries drew three and lost one of the first four games of the month and started looking over their shoulders at the bottom four. Clarke though showed great goalscoring form as the side finally hit form with four straight wins over Bolton, Swansea, Reading and also Bristol Rovers in our last game at Eastville to complete a 'double' double over the Bristol clubs, with a total score of 17-3!

APRIL

The good form shown in March proved vital as the side slumped in April. The only win was gained at Wolves with a straightforward 3-0 success, with just over 3,000 in the famous old stadium. Apart from a 1-1 draw against Doncaster, that was as good as it got.

MAY

A 1-0 home defeat against Walsall ended the season watched by just 3,047. A very disappointing campaign for the Cherries, though Colin Clarke was called up for the Northern Ireland squad to travel to Mexico for the World Cup after his haul of 26 goals in the league.

AUGUST

Mark Stein scored the first goal of the season against Nottingham Forest to help the side to a point and they also drew against Arsenal and Newcastle. Mick Harford scored a penalty to help the side to a 1-0 win at West Ham.

SEPTEMBER

Home form was good with a draw against Chelsea and a 2-0 win over QPR, but both away games in the league were lost at Everton and Sheffield Wednesday. In the League Cup, Sheffield United were beaten 5-2 on aggregate.

OCTOBER

Mark Stein grabbed a hat trick as Luton hit the headlines with a 7-0 win over Southampton at Kenilworth Road. Ipswich were beaten and draws gained against Manchester United and Oxford United and the only defeat came at Anfield as they went down 3-2. Interest was ended in the League Cup as they lost 2-0 at Norwich.

NOVEMBER

Luton kept climbing the table thanks to an excellent month. A 2-0 home win over Birmingham was followed by a 3-1 win at Tottenham. A 1-0 home defeat against Coventry was the only set back and they bounced back with a 2-1 win at Watford and a 2-1 home win over Manchester City.

DECEMBER

Luton moved up to 7th in the table with a 2-0 win over Newcastle, before losing by the same scoreline at Nottingham Forest. During the month they also beat West Bromwich Albion at home and drew against West Ham and Ipswich.

JANUARY

Progress was made in the FA Cup with wins over Crystal Palace and Bristol Rovers. In the league, they kept up the good form with wins over Leicester and Aston Villa at home, but lost at Chelsea.

FEBRUARY

In the FA Cup Fifth Round, Luton had a titanic tussle with Arsenal. After a 2-2 draw at Kenilworth Road, the sides drew 0-0 at Highbury. In a second replay at home, Luton put in a stunning performance to win 3-0. It was a busy month against The Gunners as Arsenal beat Luton 2-1 in the league, but Luton were 6th by the end of the month as they completed the double over Southampton and drew at QPR.

MARCH

In the FA Cup, the side went out at the sixth round stage. After a 2-2 home draw against Everton, The Toffees won the replay 1-0. Some revenge was gained with a league win over Everton, and they also gained three points against Sheffield Wednesday.

APRIL

The month started superbly with a 3-0 home win over West Bromwich and a 2-0 success at Birmingham. After a 1-1 home draw against Spurs, champions elect Liverpool won 1-0 at Luton and they lost by the same scoreline at Coventry. The month finished on a high though with a 3-2 home win over Watford, Mick Harford scoring a hat trick.

MAY

A highly satisfactory season finished with a 1-1 draw at Manchester City. The successful campaign was to finish with some regret though as David Pleat left to take over as manager at Tottenham. ■■■



After a long time on the sidelines, he returned to the side at Cheltenham, but his first two games back have ended in bitter disappointment, "The Cheltenham game was my first game back for so long, but regardless of me as an individual, we conceded late again and it seems to have happened a few times to us now. We played well though and that was a positive that did come from it.

"It showed that there is something there that we can work and build on. We did that at the start of the Southend game when we had them on the back foot, but conceded two goals from their first two shots and it was an uphill battle from there. Again we had to take it on the chin and again we had to just pick ourselves up and get on with it and keep going."

Saturday's highly disappointing result against Southend has made Russ and his team mates even more determined to put things right here at Dean Court, "It's vitally important now that we have good home form. We need to make Dean Court a fortress and make sure we are solid here. We need to put Saturday behind us now, stay positive and pick up all the points we can here. Then we can try and get as many away from home. We're going to give it a great go from now until the end of the season. Everyone is giving it a great go, everyone is totally committed to the cause.

"No one here will give up, there is none of that attitude at all. We had yet another last minute set back the week before and that was hard to take. To be honest, if the game had ended 0-0 at Cheltenham, we would

have thought that at least we've played good football and done our jobs. We've had plenty of chances to score but we haven't. The least then you expect to get is a point. We would have been disappointed with that, so to lose was a gut wrencher. We had to start again, but it didn't go for us. We now have to pick ourselves up again and move forward and put things right."

Tonight's opponents Luton have endured a traumatic time of it this season and although Perrett has a great deal of sympathy for his former club, he knows where his priorities lie now, "When I left Luton, a new guy had come in and it seemed like he had lots of money. A whole new load of faces came in to the squad and they were my pick to go straight back up. Obviously things haven't gone well for them for whatever reason. They've no money, they have had points deducted and lost a number of players. It does seem that they are turning the corner now and the situation is getting better there. I don't know how they've managed to get into that situation because they have sold a lot of players in the past for a lot of money.

"It is a shame, but when the game starts, we can only think of ourselves and I will be looking to put one over on them for our cause. I spent a few years there and won a championship winning medal, but a lot of the players I was there with have now moved on, and it's just another opponent tonight and a game I want to win. I did have a good time at Luton and I'd like to thank Luton Town supporters for accepting me and I had a good rapport with them. Now though, it's



time for me to do it for AFC Bournemouth and try and get us away from the bottom of the table."

Despite the Cherries perilous League position, Russ is certainly not giving up hope for Bournemouth and can take positives from the last two games and still has a belief that the side can turn things round, "I do believe we have what it takes. I hadn't played since September 15th and coming back in against Cheltenham, I felt we were comfortable on the ball.

We need to put Saturday behind us now, stay positive and pick up all the points we can here and then get as many away from home...

"We looked composed, we tried to play football and everything we did I thought we did very well. Against Southend, we looked OK until we conceded. We can talk and talk but it's no good if you don't get any points. We have to go again and there are positives to be taken and lots of points left to play for. It is a difficult time for the club both on and off the pitch, and none of us like the situation we are in.







FOREST NEXT AT FITNESS FIRST



The next visitors to the Fitness First Stadium will be Nottingham Forest, who arrive in 11 days' time on Saturday, 2 February - for the reverse fixture from the opening day of the season. Boss Colin Calderwood has promised to strengthen his squad while the transfer window is open, but has had two bids for former Bournemouth loan player Leon Best knocked back by Coventry.

The 21-year-old striker began the 2006/07 season on loan with the Cherries from Southampton, but left Saints last summer for the Ricoh Arena - with a transfer tribunal ordering Coventry to pay an initial fee of £650,000, with more payable on appearances. Meanwhile, several players have left the City Ground on loan, with midfielder Felix Bastians moving several hundred yards across the River Trent to join neighbours Notts County on a month's loan, while defenders Brendan Moloney and Tom Sharpe have gone to Chesterfield and Halifax respectively for a month. Goalkeeping coach David Watson has joined Birmingham, and been replaced by Barry Richardson who had been keeper coach under Sean O'Driscoll at Doncaster.


HARFORD REPLACES BLACKWELL AT LUTON

Today's visitors Luton have barely been out of the news in the last fortnight. Manager Kevin Blackwell had previously announced that he was giving a month's notice of resignation and would quit after their game with Bournemouth on 9 February, after the club's administrator authorised the sale of players without consulting him (see Southend programme for details).

It was then announced a week ago, prior to their FA Cup replay at Liverpool, that the administrator had agreed a deal in principle to sell the club to a consortium called Luton Town Football Club 2020 Limited, fronted by BBC TV presenter (and lifelong Luton supporter) Nick Owen. Owen's group have made an immediate loan to the cash-strapped Hatters, and have been given a period of exclusive bidder status with the administrator - while the Football League and FA would also have to approve any purchase. Luton were then beaten 5-0 at Anfield that night - and the following morning, Blackwell and his assistants Sam Ellis and John Carver were all sacked by the administrator. Later that day, Hatters legend Mick Harford was appointed as manager for the rest of the season, with ex-Portsmouth defender Warren Neill as his assistant.

HAWKS BEAT SWANSEA IN CUP THRILLER

Havant & Waterlooville wrote their names into FA Cup giant-killing history last Wednesday by beating League One leaders Swansea 4-2 at Westleigh Park in their third round replay. Former Bournemouth goalkeeper Kevin Scriven was one of the Hawks' heroes, saving a penalty from Leon Britton when they were leading 3-1 and the Swans - 83 league places above the hosts - were threatening a fightback. But the Welsh side's manager Roberto Martinez admitted: "We only have ourselves to blame. If you concede

four goals out of five chances, you are not going to win a football game." The following day, Martinez signed teenage Manchester United striker Febian Brandy on loan for the rest of the season. Among the other League One sides still involved in the FA Cup, Tranmere bowed out at League Two side Hereford, losing their replay 1-0, while Millwall - who had beaten Bournemouth in round two - beat Walsall 2-1 in their replay.

Meanwhile, Bristol Rovers and Swindon will face Fulham and Barnet respectively tonight, after their replays last Tuesday fell victim to the weather. The other League One teams who made it through to Saturday's fourth round are Oldham and Huddersfield (who play each other) and Southend, who host Barnsley.

KIRK SWAPS COBBLERS FOR GLOVERS

Having lost the services of on-loan Charlton striker James Walker who has joined Southend, Yeovil bolstered their forward line last week by signing former Northern Ireland international striker Andy Kirk from fellow League One side Northampton. Glovers boss Russell Slade explained: "He is a proven

goalscorer - you only have to look at the stats, he scores goals regularly and at every single club he has been at. He's a poacher - he has scored most of his goals between the goal-line and the penalty spot." Another striker on the move in League One is Aston Villa's Swedish teenager Tobias Mikaelsson, who has joined Port Vale on a month's loan - becoming their sixth signing of the transfer window. However, less good news for boss Lee Sinnott was the announcement that midfielder Robin Hulbert is facing six weeks out with a broken collarbone.

BRIGHTON AND POOLS HANDED FA FINES

Hartlepool and Brighton have both been fined £500 by the Football Association in relation to their game at Victoria Park on 27 October, which Brighton won 3-1. Both sides had been charged with failing to ensure their players and/or officials conducted themselves in an orderly fashion. The two teams were also warned as to their future conduct, as was Pools goalkeeping coach George Wood, who had been handed a separate charge of improper conduct but was not fined himself. Back on the pitch, Brighton had lost the services of several players since Christmas, but boss Dean Wilkins last week signed Falkirk captain Steven Thomson for an undisclosed fee. The former Crystal Palace and Peterborough midfielder has signed a two-and-a-half-year contract at Withdean. He has since been joined by Ipswich midfielder Matt Richards, who had a three-month loan spell with the Seagulls earlier this season and has now returned on loan for the rest of the campaign.

WARD TIES UP HORWOOD DEAL

Carlisle boss John Ward has strengthened his defence by signing Sheffield United defender Evan Horwood on a free transfer. Hartlepool-born Horwood, 21, came up through the youth ranks at Bramall Lane but only made one brief substitute appearance in the Carling Cup for the Blades - while spending time out on loan at Stockport, Scunthorpe, York, Chester and Darlington. He spent the first half of this season on loan at Scottish Premier League newcomers Gretna, but has now signed a two-and-a-half-



Whilst I hope we don't get taught any lessons on the pitch tonight, it may be that Luton Town could offer us some friendly advice about the pros and cons of administration. Luton recently went into administration and hopefully are now through the pain barrier, and starting to build a new future.

The 'pain' that they have been through has been quite public. Managers and players have left their club, and they have taken the hit of a ten point deduction. At the time of writing it looks as though they will have new owners.

That then gives us an indication of what our club might have to go through should administration be the best option. Certainly the administrator would be the key decision maker. From a supporters point of view we get to become familiar with terms such as 'pre-pack' agreements and insolvency.

Whilst administration may be the answer for AFC Bournemouth, as supporters we perhaps should give some thought to the clubs creditors who may now receive just a fraction of what they are owed. The irony being that top clubs today are signing footballers for 2-3 times our total debt whilst many smaller clubs struggle. The essence of football is competition. Despite the financial equalities, recent FA Cup matches involving Luton, Bury and Havant & Waterlooville

remind us why the game still holds such appeal.

Ownership of AFC Bournemouth has historically been fraught with difficulties. Private ownership by a succession of owners who repeatedly spent more than we could afford brought AFC Bournemouth to the brink in 1997. We emerged from that threat supposedly as 'Europe's first Community Club'. In reality, the ownership of the club remained an almost closed shop, we ended up with a huge debt, and on top of that, built a new stadium. Eventually the CM became a democratic organisation and was able to elect representatives to the Board.

Having been 'advised' for years that the 'Golden Share' was the key factor in preventing significant investment, the then Community Mutual relinquished the golden share, and Jeff and Steve took over. ■

Despite that freedom, there have been no new investors willing to take on the debt. Equally disappointing is that

some still choose to claim that the Trust is a barrier to investment.

It will then remain to be seen what, if any, Supporters Trust involvement will be following this very difficult period. Needless to say I believe that our two main Board representatives, Ernie Battey and David Musker, have provided invaluable support to the club Board, and have demonstrated that Trusts still have a role to play.

Whoever ends up running AFC Bournemouth, the supporters will still be here. And as long as they wish, the Supporters Trust will do what it can to see that your interests are still represented.

For now though, let's forget about club rivalries, and hope that both sets of supporters still have a team to follow. ■

THE NUMBERS GAME

3 – The number of different divisions that goalkeeper Chic Brodie played in, in three consecutive matches in 1961. He made an appearance for Aldershot in Division Four and was then sold to Wolves. He made one appearance for Wolves in Division One and then moved to Northampton in Division Three! He was the Margate keeper when Bournemouth beat them 11-0 in the FA Cup in 1971.

4 – The number of years that Alec Stock was manager of Luton Town. He was in charge from 1968 to 1972. In 1979, he took over as manager of AFC Bournemouth before handing the reins over to David Webb in 1980.

6 – The number of goals Luton scored against Bournemouth in the first ever meeting between the two clubs. That came in Division Three (South) on Saturday 1 December 1923 at Luton with The Hatters winning 6-2. Seven days later they made the trip to Dean Court and won 3-2. Bournemouth may have taken there time, but gained revenge on that mauling in October 2003, winning 6-3 at Dean Court. In the late seventies, Luton won 6-1 at Bournemouth in a pre-season friendly.

6 – Luton were hit for six by Denis Law in 1961 as Luton faced Manchester United in the FA Cup Fourth Round. Law scored all six goals as United went 6-2 up, but the game was abandoned. In the rearranged game, Law was again on target, but Luton won 3-1!

7 – The position that Luton finished in the top flight in the 1986-87 season. That was their best ever position and also that season, Bournemouth finished in their highest ever League position at the time, first in Division Three.

10 – The amount of games played in Division Two on 18 October 1980. Seven were draws and three were

away wins. It was the first time in Football league history that so many games in one division had been played without a home win.

11 – The number of goals scored in three games by Walter Hunt for Carlisle in 1938. He scored four against Lincoln and Accrington and then three against Rochdale. All of the opponents were his former clubs.

55 – The number times that Bournemouth have met Luton in competitive matches. Bournemouth have won 21, Luton 20 and 14 have ended as draws. Luton completed the double in the first season we met, but Bournemouth turned the tables in the 1924-25 season, winning 2-1 at Dean Court and 2-0 at Kenilworth Road. The game at Luton on 3 January was the first away win for The Cherries that season.

58 – The number of Northern Ireland caps that Mal Donaghy won whilst a Luton Town player.



85 – The number of appearances made by Warren Feeney for Luton Town from March 2005 to March 2007. He left Luton last March to join Cardiff on loan, making the deal permanent in the summer and quickly joined Swansea on loan. Warren joined Bournemouth from Leeds on loan in March 2001, signing in the summer and after 125 appearances, joined Stockport in July 2004.

99 – The number of League appearances made by Russell Perrett for Luton Town. He played for The Hatters the last time they played at Bournemouth and was sent off. ■



124 – The number of miles from Kenilworth Road to Dean Court. Luton Town have played at Kenilworth Road for 103 years, having previously played at Dallow Lane and Dunstable Road.

152 – The number of appearances made by Richard Cooke in two spells at AFC Bournemouth. He signed from Tottenham in 1986 and then moved to Luton in 1988, before returning to Bournemouth in 1990. He was forced to retire from professional football in March 1993 because of a knee injury and joined Bashley.



286 – The number of appearances made by Steve Robinson for Bournemouth from 1994 to 2000.

30069 – The record attendance at Luton is 30,069, set in 1959 against Blackpool in an FA Cup Sixth Round replay. The current capacity is 10,260. ■





and it was a fantastic pick-me-up. We have scored a lot of goals from midfield and we've done that again. This result will hopefully get us going again."







MURDOCH TURNS DOWN CANARIES



Cherries goalkeeping coach Stuart Murdoch has left Bournemouth. Stuart was appointed as manager of

Wimbledon in May 2002 and guided them to tenth place in what is now the Championship and was in charge during the difficult times when virtually the whole squad was sold and they moved to Milton Keynes. He remained in charge as Wimbledon changed their name after relegation, but was sacked in November 2004. In July 2005, he became goalkeeping coach at Bournemouth and in October 2006, alongside Joe Roach, he became caretaker manager. He left the club for a spell before returning as goalkeeping coach and initially left to take up that role at Norwich. However, after attending training at Norwich's Colney training ground last Monday and travelling with the squad to Bury a week ago, he has now reversed his decision due to family reasons.

'FORGOTTEN' MAN AT RUSHDEN



When recalling our 5-2 win at the Millennium Stadium in the 2003 Third Division Play Off Final, many people forget that Phil Gulliver played a major part in that success. He had signed on loan from Middlesbrough in March 2003 and before signing for Bournemouth, he had tasted first team action during loan spells at Blackpool and Carlisle. He played in the final six games of the 2002-03 season and all three play-off matches before returning to Middlesbrough.

Bournemouth had beaten Bury in the Play Off Semi Final's and Gulliver went to Gigg Lane to play for them for his next loan move and later that season he went to Scunthorpe on loan. He was released that summer by Middlesbrough before making a first team appearance and signed for Rushden & Diamonds.

After they went out of the league, he moved to Hereford United where he spent a season and in the summer, he returned to Rushden & Diamonds. ■

HAVERSON AT GRAYS



Centre half Jack Haveron, who was a non contact player at Bournemouth last season and was involved in pre-season this term, is now in the Conference at Grays Athletic.

Jack started his career at Ipswich and went through their academy. After his time at Bournemouth, he joined Grays Athletic in August and in November, joined Sutton United on loan. He made three appearances for Grays and has been a regular in the Sutton side and has scored twice.

Mark joined Bournemouth from Chelsea in 1998 initially on loan, and made the move permanent at the start of the 98-99 season. He made 91 League appearances for The Cherries, scoring 30 goals. ■



UNUSUAL TIMES

For the first time since the inception of Playershare, we are not helping to fund a single member of the squad! You might think, therefore, that we have gone past our sell-by date. Not a bit of it; the directors have no doubt that the need for players - especially loan players - will see us called upon before too long!

In any case, whilst the company is not supporting an individual player, Playershare has made significant contributions to the whole of the playing squad through the re-lending of our share of the proceeds from the James Hayter transfer. Taking the

season as a whole so far, we are well ahead in terms of loans when compared with any of the five previous seasons.

What is also worth remembering is the part Playershare has played in bringing some long-term stalwarts to the club. Without Playershare support during the loan periods, neither Neil Moss nor Warren Cummings would have been as likely to join the club on a full-time basis.

What Playershare has learned over the five and a half seasons that it has been in existence is that the

company needs to be flexible. Initially it was thought that the funding would go towards transfer fees, but the outcome has been that this has only been a small part of the support. The overwhelming majority of the funding has been used to bring in loan players, and this year to increase the squad budget over what had originally been budgeted.

There is one constant, though; all the loans have been used to improve the playing squad, and no money has been lent for any other purpose. ■

JO TESSEM PULL TOGETHER

It has been a difficult start to life at Bournemouth for new signing Jo Tessem. The experienced midfielder had the disappointment of a last second defeat at Cheltenham and then the blow of a 4-1 home reverse on Saturday and his experience will be vital as the Cherries look to turn things round.

Saturday was a massive blow, but Jo admitted that the opposition played well, also acknowledging that mistakes helped towards the Cherries downfall. "We played a good side and we didn't help ourselves with the mistakes we made. I think that after you are punished for mistakes, it can impact on the game and you make more mistakes, get more stressed and give yourselves less time on the ball. When we pulled the goal back, we thought we had a chance to get back into it. Of course it's not easy when the opponents have three in the bag, but you always have belief. We did have a lot of chances and we should have scored a few more, but I believe they won it because they were clever in the first half."

Jo has come in to Bournemouth with the side bottom of the table and he has urged his new team mates to have a belief that things can be turned round. "The situation that the club is in is never going to help. Whether the uncertainty surrounding the club has had an impact is difficult to say. The team is struggling and there are problems in other areas and that may be a factor, but the lads here now have to dig in and play football. Whatever happens at the club, we must all have the belief that we can get out of this. I have never played in this League before and from what I have seen, there are some very good clubs and the rest are very even. The football is good and the players here at Bournemouth are very good, good enough to compete. This is a very big game tonight and we need to take belief in to it."

As well as the on the pitch problems, there are plenty of well documented ones off it and Jo is confident that any

decisions that are made will be good for AFC Bournemouth, "It is a major decision for the club because if it goes in to administration, it will be difficult to overcome losing the points. Whatever decision is made, it will be for the good of the club and one that will enable it to move forward and start to get some stability. I believe the area needs a club and it should be at least League 1 and maybe it needs to take this big step to get stability and move forward in the future. It is a major decision and it is a difficult time for all the staff, players and supporters."

Jo last played in the Norwegian top division, that finished in November and I asked him what he felt was the main differences he has found since joining up with The Cherries? "It is difficult if you play in a different country. I played in England before, playing in the Premier League and the Championship, and there is a difference in the pace and at the higher level players seem to think quicker. I think the main difference I have noticed is the decisions that players make. In Norway, football is more tactical and the approach to games is very different to what it is here. There is a different attitude towards the game in England. I would say that the differences are all very small, but they can add up to a great deal of difference."

Despite all the problems here at Bournemouth, Jo believes that the quality is here to get out of the situation and urged the supporters to get on the teams side from the start, "There are some very good players here at Bournemouth. I thought the way we played at Cheltenham was really good and it surprised me just how good the



team is. On Saturday, I think we met a very good side. We now have to concentrate on tonight for what is a very big match, and I believe that the players here are good enough to win the game. Things have been going badly here, we all know that, but the players all need to pull together now. There are some very good young players here who can have a very good future in the game and as one of the experienced players in the squad, I will do my best to help them. I have things to learn from them as well, so it is difficult and the key is to all pull together.

Whatever decision is made, it will be for the good of the club and one that will enable it to move forward and start to get some stability...

"It is a cliché, but we need some positive results now and I believe we have what it takes here to achieve that. Of course there is a reason why we are at the bottom of the league and that is the results. In this situation we do need all the help we can get. It's a small squad with young players and they need the crowd on their side. I can understand why the supporters are disappointed, but we will go in to tonight's game and do our best and that is all we can ask from ourselves and for the supporters." ■


Clubs like AFC Bournemouth and Luton Town are what football is all about and long may it stay that way.
