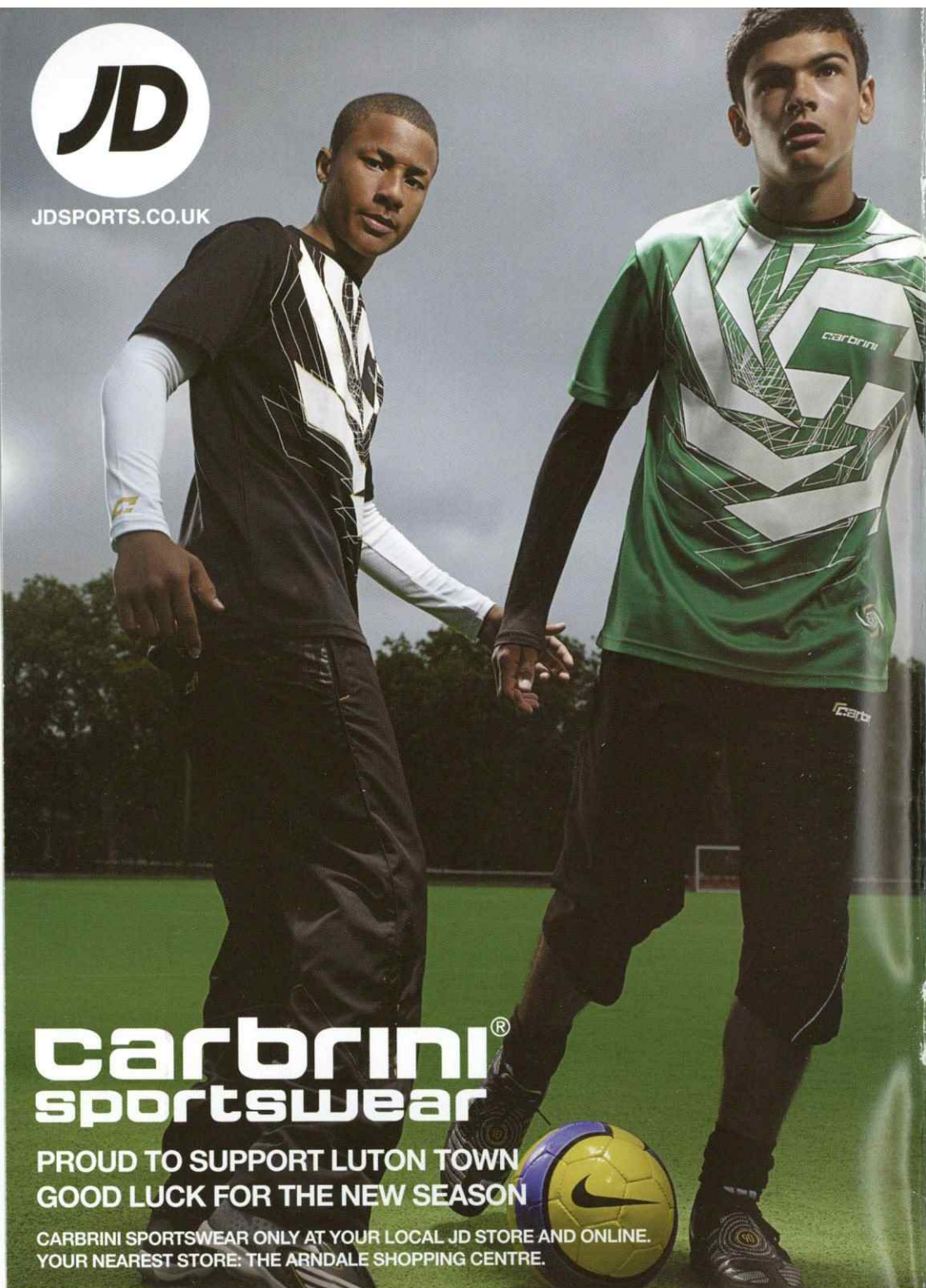

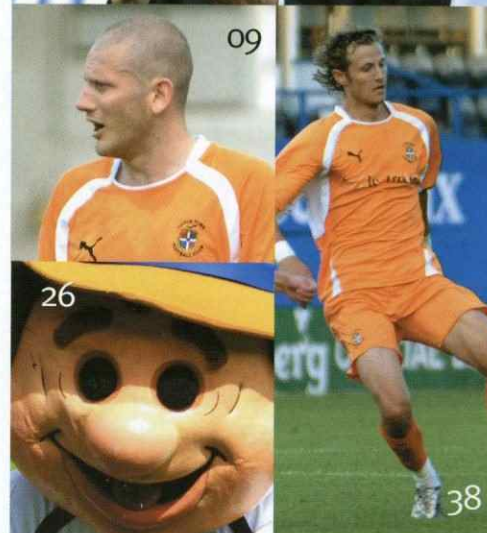

One of our new signings, Kevin Nichols has been made captain of the team. Kevin as you know has the fire and passion in him to lead this team to success.

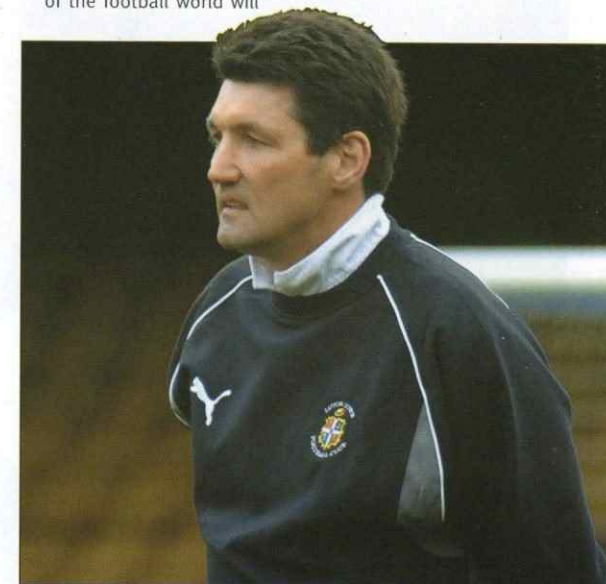
We find ourselves in a unique situation this year – the eyes of the football world will

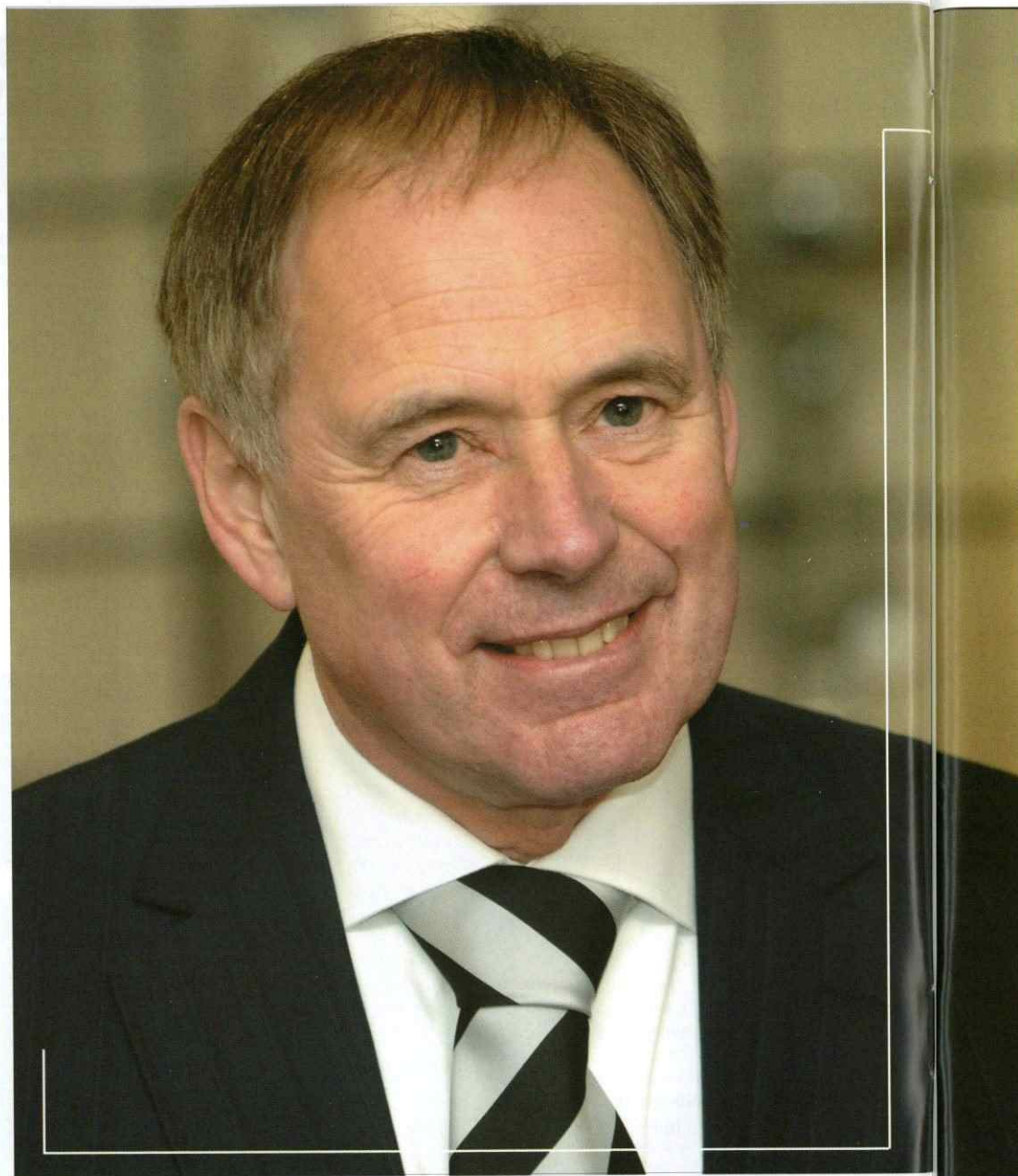
be upon us this season, but, I believe we have a task ahead which is not insurmountable and is a challenge we will face together as a club.

a winning start. 2020 have put in so much hard work behind the scenes and we will be looking to continue that with a strong performance and incontestable victory.

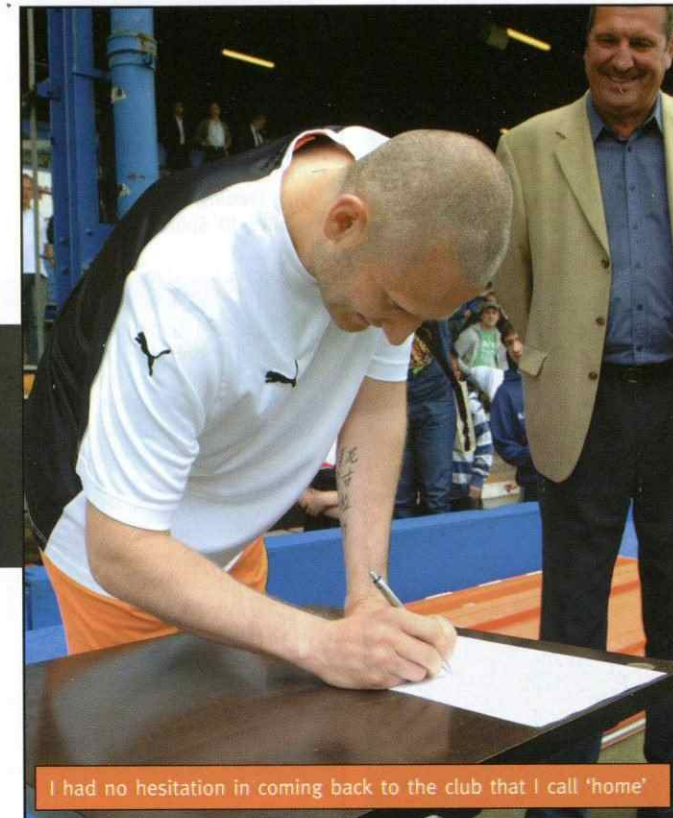
There are many new faces playing this afternoon and they are all completely dedicated to Luton. Please give them the same support as you gave me last week.

APOLOGIES FROM THE MANUFACTURERS

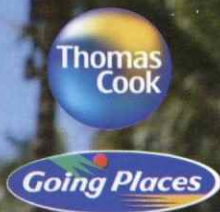
Due to delivery issues with our new shirt manufactures the squad will not be playing in the new kit, instead it has been agreed that we will play in last seasons kit until later in the month.

HARFORD PLEASED WITH PRE-SEASON EFFORTS



Hatters' boss Mick Harford has expressed his delight at the way his players have conducted themselves during the pre-season campaign.

Although off-the-field matters have made life slightly more difficult during the close season, it hasn't affected the players as they prepare for the season ahead.

"I'm delighted with the way pre-season has gone," said Harford. "Obviously it's mainly about fitness but the four games we've had at Kenilworth Road have been

about actually trying to implement the way I want the team to play.

"Before this week, we haven't done any work on set-pieces, defending or attacking, because I don't want to give anything away at this stage. It's been more about getting the players use to the ball and way I want to play this season - we have been working on set-pieces this week at the training ground instead.

"Overall I've been quite pleased with pre-season."

Welcome to Today's visitors

Port Vale were formed in 1876, following a meeting at the Port Vale House, from where the club took its name. The club moved to Burslem in 1884, changing its name to Burslem Port Vale in the process.

Vale reached their highest place in the League since 1931 in the 1996/97 season when they finished eighth in the Championship; just four points shy of the play-off positions.

However, the following season saw the start of future problems both on and of the pitch, ending in administration in 2002/03.

Port Vale started a new era at their club in 2003/04 when they came out of administration under a new board of fan ownership. Former playing legend, Martin Foyle spent almost four years as manager before being sacked on 4 November after Port Vale continued to slide deeper into the relegation battle.

Lee Sinnott took over for the final 35 games but was unable to prevent Vale slipping into League Two. Last time Port Vale were in the bottom tier of the Football League was almost quarter of a century ago.



The Ground: Vale Park

Vale Park became Port Vale's sixth ground in 1950 after the club moved from the Old Recreation Ground in Hanley. It had taken six years to build and was on the site of a giant marl hole, which still contains numerous pit shafts. There is no evidence of anybody actually falling down one, though supporters will tell you of many players who have "disappeared" during games over the years.

The new ground was a lavish project for the time with a projected capacity of 70,000, leading to it being dubbed "The Wembley of the North". Unfortunately, money troubles led to the cancellation of the grandstands on the Lorne Street and Bycars. Even so it had the most expensive pitch ever laid at the time and the whole project had cost over £50,000, covering an area of some 18 and a half acres.

Improvements over the years saw the ground capacity increase to 44,000 in 1956 and a high of 50,000 by 1959. Nowadays the official capacity is given as 18,947.

The grand opening took place on 24th August 1950, a Thursday night, with a kick off of 5.20pm and the name Vale Park was announced at the opening ceremony attended by numerous dignitaries from the football world. Admission cost 1/3d, the equivalent of 6p. A crowd of 30,042 saw the first game, a 1-0 victory over Newport County in Division Three (South) with Walter Aveyard scoring the historic goal.

Since then Vale have played over 1,400 competitive games here in all competitions. The largest crowd was 49,768 for an FA Cup Round tie against Aston Villa in 1960, although it has been declared full with over 42,000 crammed in for cup-ties v Blackpool and Liverpool in 1954 and 1964 respectively.

The Manager

Lee Sinnott (born 12 July 1965 in Aldridge, Walsall) is an English ex-professional footballer and manager.

He is currently manager of Port Vale, having previously achieved enormous success as manager of Farsley Celtic, most notably winning promotion three times in four seasons.

In October 2007, Sinnott was linked with the vacant job at League One team Port Vale, and on November 1, 2007 Farsley Celtic's chairman Andrew Firbank told fans that Sinnott would soon be leaving the club. However, hours later, confusion arose when Sinnott denied resigning. On November 5, 2007 he was named the new Port Vale manager ending the speculation about his future. On his first game in charge Sinnott lost to local rivals Crewe Alexandra.

Sinnott achieved his first win in charge of Port Vale at Morecambe in the FA Cup first round, with Port Vale winning 2-0. His first win in the league came on 8 December, winning 2-1 away at Gillingham. He was unable to keep Port Vale up, however, and they were relegated on 12 April 2008.

1 - JOE ANYON

A former England Youth international, Joe has already attracted interest from Premier League clubs and is predicted to have a bright future in the game. A confident young 'keeper, he has matured since being given his chance at the end of 2006 and looks to have a good future in the game.

2 - SAM STOCKLEY

An experienced defender, Sam was brought to Vale Park in the summer of 2008 and can be a huge help to what is essentially a young Port Vale squad. He is a player who shows leadership qualities on and off the pitch.

3 - ROBERT TAYLOR

Signed from non-league Nuneaton Borough following a trial period at Vale Park, Rob is equally at ease whether playing on the left side of defence or in midfield - his adaptability making him an important member of the squad.

4 - ANTHONY GRIFFITH

A tough-tackling, ball-winning midfielder who can also operate in defence, Anthony spent the 2007-2008 season on loan at Halifax, but was snapped up from Doncaster Rovers by Lee Sinnott in the summer.

5- JOHN MCCOMBE

Strong and comfortable on the ball, John was another who was signed up in the summer of 2008 after he was surprisingly released by Hereford United. John is expected to do well at the heart of the Vale defence.

6- LUKE PROSSER

A former skipper of the Port Vale youth team, Luke has impressed for the reserves and now needs to push on and gain league experience. Essentially a centre back, Luke can also operate at full back and has the ability to make his mark this season.

7 - SHANE TUDOR

Shane joined the club in the summer of 2007 after leaving promoted Leyton Orient. Shane was dogged by injuries last season, but with a bit of luck will become a regular in the side this season. Has pace and trickery and can deliver the ball into the right areas.

8 - DAVID HOWLAND

David did exceptionally well for Birmingham Reserves and played on a regular basis at Under 21 level for Northern Ireland in midfield last season. Joined Vale on loan last year before signing a permanent deal in the summer of 2008.

9 - MARC RICHARDS

works the channels well, Marc has

the type of work rate admired by the manager and is expected to be amongst the goals this season after suffering from injury last season. Tipped by many to top the goalscoring charts.

10 - LUKE ROGERS

Joined Vale South Cheshire neighbours Crewe Alexandra, where he didn't manage to pin down a regular first team place. Previously with Shrewsbury Town, where he showed a good eye for goal and soon showed similar form for Port Vale.

11 - PAUL EDWARDS

Paul joined Vale from Oldham Athletic at the beginning of the 2007-2008 season. A left sided player who prefers a midfield role, he can also operate effectively at full back when required and certainly does not look out of place there.

12 - CHRIS MARTIN

Former youth team 'keeper, Chris was added to the first team squad

during the 2007-2008 season, making his first team debut at Swindon. He is well thought of within the club and could have a bright future in the game.

14 - LOUIS DODDS

Louis joined Vale in July 2008 from Leicester City. Described as a natural finisher, he spent last season on loan at Lincoln City, where he was employed in midfield, but he still managed a highly respectable nine goals for the Imps.

15 - CHRIS SLATER

Signed in January 2008 from Chasetown after impressing against Vale in the FA Cup. Chris started off with Walsall, before eventually ending up with his home town club where he enjoyed FA Cup success last season before making his way to Vale Park on a permanent deal. A central defender, who can also play in midfield, he has the ability to play the ball out of defence.

16 - KYLE PERRY

Kyle spent some time with Wolves before being released and he

slipped into non-league football. Played for Chasetown in their terrific FA Cup run last season, before being snapped up by Lee Sinnott at Vale in January 2008 and soon became a favourite with the Vale fans.

17 - STEVE THOMPSON

Snapped up from Middlesbrough during the summer of 2008 after impressing whilst on trial. Steve will be hoping to play regular first team football with the Valiants, and if his goal scoring in the Vale reserve team whilst on trial is anything to go by, he could get his wish sooner rather than later.

18 - DANNY GLOVER

Danny signed professional this season after impressing in the Youth Team. The club has high hopes for a hard working and talented youngster, who now has a handful of first team appearances under his belt and who is expected to push hard for a place in the starting line-up.

19 - SIMON RICHMAN

After impressing in the youth team

got his chance in the first team and has caught the eye with an industrious attitude, along with what appears to be an old head on young shoulders. He looked completely at home in the first team last season and will surely have a good future in front of him.

20 - ROSS DAVIDSON

Another product of Vale's successful youth team, Ross impressed enough to be given his chance as a professional at the end of last season. A talented midfielder, Ross may have to be patient in what is his first season as a pro, but has the talent to succeed once he gets his opportunity.

21 - JAMES LAWRIE

James is another youngster who has impressed enough to be called up to the first team squad last season after a successful campaign in the youth team. A prolific goalscorer, James has represented Northern Ireland and is certainly a name to watch out for in the future.

22 - DANNY EDWARDS

Yet another product of Vale's successful youth team which lifted the Midland Cup at the end of the 2007-2008 season, Danny is a no-nonsense player who can adapt in either midfield or defence and will be pushing for a place as the season progresses.

23 - LUKE CHAPMAN

Luke did enough in the Vale youth team to get called up into the first team and made his first team debut in the final game of the 2007 - 2008 season. Has been impressive in the reserves and will no doubt be hoping to push on this season and will be putting pressure on the manager to include him on a more regular basis in the first team.

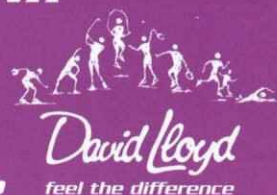

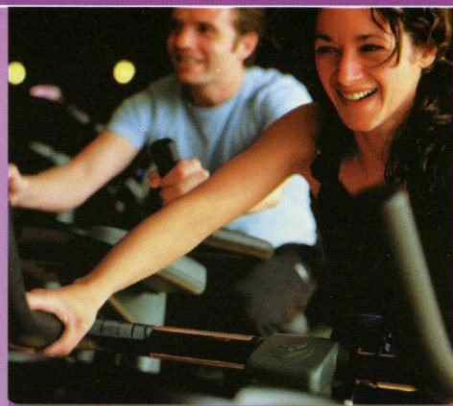

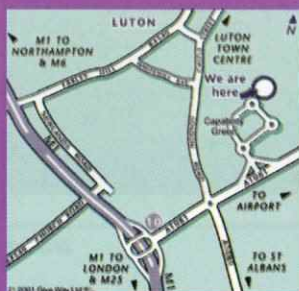

New skipper Kevin Nicholls is glad to be back at Kenilworth Road, a ground he is happy to call home and having enjoyed many successful seasons in the past with the Hatters, he wouldn't be back if he didn't think he could add to those years.

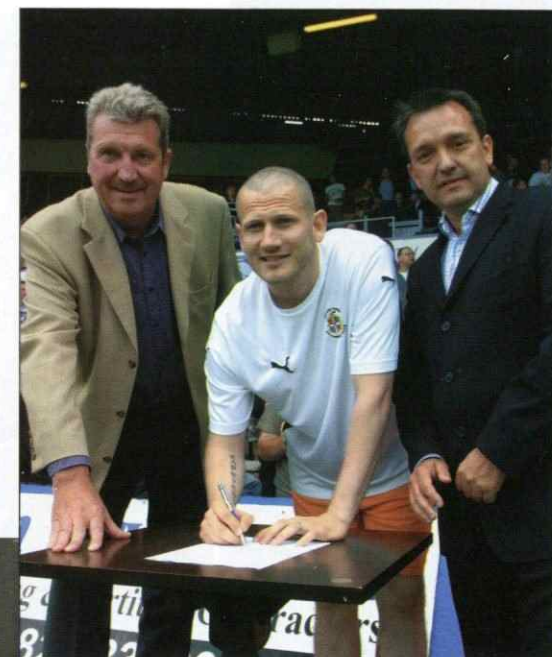
Nico isn't fooled by the size of the task that he and his team-mates face this season, but he genuinely believes that it is a mountain that can be conquered.

"I'm glad to be back and feel that this is where I belong", said the 29-year-old. "The thirty point deficit reminds me of how we used to be with the old

squad; everything was against us and everyone always used to slag our stadium off, calling us 'small' Luton and saying that we're a selling club. That team got to the Championship so there's no reason why we can't do that again with Mick in charge and the right players."

Since leaving the Hatters to move north to Leeds United in 2006, Nicholls hasn't featured in as many games as he would have liked. Despite being given the captains armband at Leeds, his very public fall-out with then manager Dennis Wise led to him leaving the club and moving to Preston North End for 750,000 in July 2007. He was a regular in the team under Paul Simpson at the start of last season;

however a change in the management team led to limited first team opportunities for the talented midfielder.

Preston's loss though was once again Luton's gain and he is delighted to be back. The former England youngster explained: "It's been tough because when you're contracted to another club you can't just walk out and join another club. I've wanted to come back to Luton for a long time now. Obviously it was made public that when I was at Leeds I wasn't happy and unfortunately when I left there I couldn't sign for certain reasons but I feel like I'm back home now.

"It's a club where the fans are so loyal and

get behind everyone. With the new directors and with a manager like Mick hopefully we can do what we need to do and get back the thirty points as soon as possible and start getting up the table.

"When I signed in 2001 Joe Kinnear was in charge but Mick did a lot of the groundwork then and a lot of the coaching so I've worked with Mick before and I've always kept in touch with him wherever he's been and wherever I've been. I've got a lot of respect for him and I'm just glad that he's got me back now and I'm looking forward to putting things right and getting us going back in the right direction.

"I know the club inside-out and I know exactly what the fans want. They want passion, drive and people who care. Obviously they want to win football matches and I think we can do that with my help."

There have been a number of changes at the club in the two years since Nicholls left, and to a larger extent the current team is still getting to know each other. With only days to go until the beginning of the new season, Nicholls understands the importance of the team settling in as quickly as possible.



Speaking after the friendly defeat to Brighton, he said: "Playing today there were some young players out there with a lot of potential, we now need to gel together because it's been a tough time for the club.

We've got a lot of new players and we'll probably be adding more players before the Port Vale game or even after, so it's going to take time to gel but we need to do it sooner rather than later. It's going to be interesting but I'm really looking forward to it."

The new Hatters' captain is

thrilled to have been given back the armband, although he is keen to point out that he wasn't expecting to be re-instated as skipper:

"It was out of my hands when I came back, it's not in the contract and I wasn't going to not sign if I wasn't made captain. That's what the manager has chosen and he asked me if I wanted to do it. I had six successful years doing it before, and I believe that with the players that we had and the team that I was part of when I was captain it was a successful time. If you ask any Luton

fans if they could have that again I think they would."

Nicholls was unveiled to the Luton Town faithful at half-time during the pre-season friendly game against Brighton. He walked out to chants of 'Super Kev', which by his own admission was very moving. He commented, "It was amazing and brought a lump to my throat. People who know me and some of the

Both our U14 and U15 squads rounded off their seasons in style by lifting their respective League Cups.

The U14's faced difficult opponents in Tottenham Hotspur and were initially pinned back but not really threatened as the defensive unit held strong. Thea Fraser made an outstanding diving stop to keep the scores level at the break but the game was largely played out in midfield.

Town took the lead when the ball fell to Maisie Wyatt on the left and she struck a dipping volley from 35 yards which dropped over the keeper into the net. Spurs responded and grabbed a scrambled equaliser but Town kept pressing to the

end and were rewarded when Terri Petit's searching right wing cross eluded all except skipper Wyatt who smashed the ball in at the far post to bring the cup to Luton.

It was the second leg of the Under 15's attempt on the treble and they found themselves up against M1 rivals Watford in the final. The first 25 minutes were evenly contested until Claire Howe produced a moment of brilliance, turning on the corner of the box and striking a swerving dipping shot which found the top corner. Amazingly, having completed the trick once she proved that it was no fluke by repeating the strike within five minutes to make it 2-0. Town's tails were up as the prolific Leyah Maddix added a third and then turned provider

to cross to the far post where Claire Howe volleyed in to complete a first half hat trick and later claimed the match ball. With the tie all but over Town laid siege to the Hornets goal and were only denied further goals by a superb show from the keeper. But even she could do nothing to prevent Robyn Wilfort's left foot strike finding the corner to make it 5-0. With the cup won Luton took their foot of the gas and allowed their opponents a couple of late consolation efforts but two trophies were now on the shelf.

The unique treble was completed ironically in Watford and this time the scoreline was even more emphatic with goals from leading striker Stephanie Anes with a hat trick, four from midfield via Nicola Henman and Claire Howe in an 8-1 win to complete an unbeaten season.

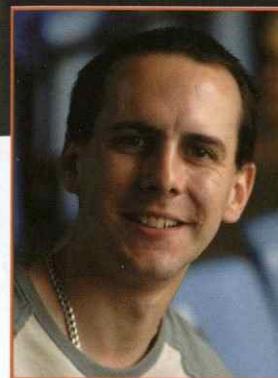

Simon Pitts looks back at previous opening day home fixtures.

against Norwich, but the Hatters lost 3-1.

45 Previous opening day matches at home, Luton have won 25 of these, drawing 14 and losing just six! There have been a total of 128 goals scored, with 87 of these by the Hatters.

8 The most number of goals scored in an opening day home fixture. This has actually happened twice, firstly in an amazing 4-4 draw against Oldham Athletic in 1953, and then in a 6-2 win against Sunderland three years later.

3 The number of hat tricks scored. The first came in 1946 against Sheffield Wednesday, when Mel Daniel scored three in a 4-1 win. The other two players to repeat this feat did so in the two matches mentioned above. Johnny Downie scored his hat trick against Oldham, whilst Gordon Turner hit four of the six goals against Sunderland.

5 The number of penalties converted by Luton on the opening day at Kenilworth Road. Gordon Turner scored the first in 1958 in a 1-1 draw against West Brom. Ten years on and Mike Harrison scored from the spot to open the scoring against Oldham. Don Givens netted in 1971, in a 1-1 draw against Norwich City, with Lil Fuccillo scoring from 12 yards in 1978, in a 6-1 win against Oldham. It was 17 years later that Bontcho Guentchev netted

1968, 1978 and 2004. Three of these matches have previously been mentioned, mainly because of the number of goals scored, and that both a hat trick and a penalty have been scored in these fixtures. The remaining fixture, in 2004, saw the start of Luton's League One Championship winning season. Steve Howard and Paul Underwood netted the goals in a 2-1 victory. This means a staggering 22 goals were scored by the two sides in these four fixtures, with Luton netting 16 times!

24,425 The highest attendance for an opening day match at Kenilworth Road came against West Bromwich Albion in 1958. The lowest "official" attendance was 6149 in 1966 when Halifax Town were the beaten visitors. Gerry King and Bruce Rioch were the scorers as the Hatters won 2-0.

FlashBack

Club Historian Roger Wash looks back at Brian Horton's first game for the Hatters

By the time Brian Horton came to Luton 1981 he had played over 450 League games, despite not making his debut until he was 21, and could truly regard himself as a seasoned professional. After starting at Port Vale in 1970, Brian was 'given away' to Brighton in 1976 and in five years on the south coast had skipped the Seagulls from Division Three to the top flight.

"I had no reason to leave Brighton, where I enjoyed a tremendous rapport with the supporters, especially as they were by now in Division One, but after manager Alan Mullery left in the summer of 1981 his replacement Mike Bailey wanted to bring in his own players."

One player that Bailey coveted was the Hatters' Irish international midfielder Tony Grealish but wily Luton boss David Pleat wanted ready made inspirational captain Brian Horton as a swap.

"Alan Mullery tried to get me to sign for Charlton but I had already committed myself to David which probably proved

the best move of my career," recalled Brian. "I went straight into the side as captain and could immediately see the depth of skill at Kenilworth Road. I can remember my debut against Charlton vividly as we tore into them from the start and I soon formed a great understanding with the likes of Ricky Hill and Brian Stein."

Brian took the Hatters to the championship of Division Two that



season and then presided over a roller-coaster 1982/83 campaign that ended with the heart-stopping win at Manchester City on the final day which saved the Town from the drop from the top flight.

After leaving Luton in 1984, Brian has coached and managed at the top level in a long career and is currently assistant to Phil Brown at Hull where the Premiership new-boys are just about to embark on a trip into the unknown.

David Pleat was hoping for third time lucky as he put behind him the disappointments of the two previous campaigns when his talented side had narrowly failed to win promotion back to the top flight.

The close season transfer merry-go-round had left many supporters scratching their heads when popular local lad and Wales international, Paul Price, was allowed to go to Tottenham for £250,000, while former skipper Alan West, certainly not over the hill, went to Millwall for £45,000.

To top it all the swap deal with Brighton involving Republic of Ireland international, Tony Grealish, and veteran Brian Horton smacked of stupidity according to the fans. Pleat, however, knew best and Horton

turned out to be the final piece in the jigsaw. Horton immediately slotted into the holding midfield role where his abilities as skipper, forceful tackler and cunning user of the ball, allowed Ricky Hill to get further forward where he formed an almost telepathic understanding with ace goalscorer Brian Stein.

Clever winger David Moss was absent from the opening game of the season and his place on the wing was taken by Godfrey Ingram, the Dunstable boy who had been predicted to go all the way to the top after a series of scintillating performances for the England schoolboys team.

The Town's opponents on a sunny afternoon were newly promoted Charlton, along with their new manager Alan Mullery,

back in Division Two after a twelve months absence. Six players, John Phillips, Steve Harrison, Don McAllister, Leighton Phillips, Billy Lansdowne and Phil Ferns were making their debuts for Charlton and it was no real surprise that they took some time to tune in with each other. The Hatters opened the scoring after 22 minutes when Donaghy headed a rare goal from Horton's left wing corner and when, only nine minutes later, McAllister put an Aizlewood cross into his own net the game was as good as over.

Charlton had a good spell early in the second half with ex-Hatter Derek Hales hitting a good chance wide and future Hatter Paul Walsh firing against a post, but the Town's third on 57 minutes finished the match as a spectacle. Horton, who had a brilliant first outing, threaded an inch perfect pass through to White who held the ball up waiting for the goalkeeper to advance before slotting it home.

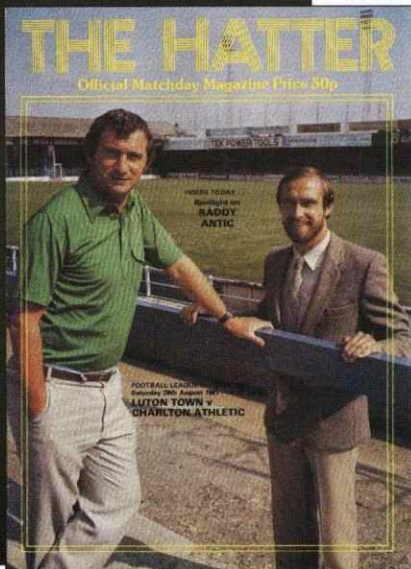
Although the Luton fans in the crowd of 8,776 went away happy, manager Pleat refused to read too much into one result suspecting that the Town would face much stronger opposition as the season progressed.

The week before the season starts, with most players who will form part of team's plans for the season already secured, a manager's attention often turns to the loan market as he looks to bolster his options by bringing in any players he believes will strengthen his squad. In many cases the loan signings are young players who are looking to gain experience playing first-team football, but this year that task could prove to be more difficult than in previous campaigns.

With the seven substitutes being used in the Premier League for the first time this season it is unclear what impact that will have on a club's plans for those players in and around his first-team squad; whether they will still prefer to let them go out on loan to get games under their belt, or hold them back and bed them into the senior environment as part of their allocation of substitutes.

Hatters boss Mick Harford made no secret of the fact that he is hoping to use the loan market before the season begins, but the challenge of negotiating last minute deals could prove a tough one.

He commented, "If all goes to plan, by midweek we will have signed four or five players permanently and hopefully we will also have been in a position to have used the loan market too and then we can get a picture of what the team will be for the first game of the season."

"Everyone is aware of our plight and we'll try and beg, steal and borrow from other clubs to try and boost the squad up. I'm sure some deals for loans have already been arranged for several players so we'll have to see what is available to us."

"Managers go for their number one targets initially and then they move onto their next option if those moves fall through. If they get hold of their targets then they will let some of their fringe players go out on loan or young kids who need experience and that's where I'm hoping we can benefit."

"You're obviously not going to get the very best young players but we believe that with the way we scour the market and the number of games we watch, we can bring the right type of player to the club."

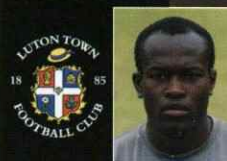

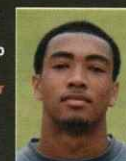

Profile – Alan Neilson (Youth Team Coach)

Alan Neilson returned to the Club at the beginning of July as Youth Team coach after retiring as a player at the end of the 2006/07 season. In the previous twelve months he had been working as a scout for Southampton under John Gorman as well as coaching the U18 Academy based at Barnfield College and Luton Town's U16 Development side.

Born in 1972 in Wegberg, Germany, Alan grew up in Stamford and as a youngster attended the Centre of Excellence at Peterborough United. His professional career began at Newcastle United where he played under both Ossie Ardiles and Kevin Keegan.

After making 35 appearances for the Toon, and helping them secure promotion to the Premier League, Alan was sold to Southampton for £750,000 where he played under Graeme Souness and Dave Jones. Alan was involved in the team that famously beat Manchester United 6-3 at the Dell. He also came up against his hardest opponent during this spell, being asked to mark Eric Cantona at Old Trafford. Alan played 42 games for Southampton, scoring 13 goals.

It wasn't long until his old boss Kevin Keegan came knocking on the door and signed Alan for Fulham for £250,000. Alan was involved in winning promotion with Fulham, and despite injuries, also played under Keegan's successor Jean Tigana. During this spell Alan was also a regular for Wales.



After a brief loan spell at Grimsby, Joe Kinnear and Mick Harford signed Alan for Luton in February 2002. Alan made 63 appearances for Luton, scoring 1 goal and was involved in the promotion to League One. Alan finished his playing career with Tamworth and Salisbury in the Conference.

Alan completed his UEFA A Licence in 2008, and has already made his mark as Youth Team coach. His coaching philosophy is based on hard-work, technical ability and fitness, and Luton's young players are already flourishing under his management.

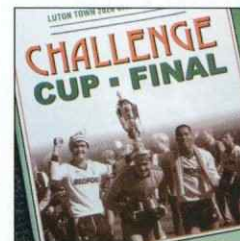

What's The Ground Like?

Priestfield Stadium has been virtually re-built since the current Chairman Paul Scally took over in 1995. On one side of the ground is the impressive two tiered, Medway Stand, opened in 2000, with a row of executive boxes (the type which you can sit outside of) running across the middle. Opposite is the tidy all seater Gordon Road Stand. Unfortunately though, it contains a number of supporting pillars, which may hinder your view. In a corporate sponsorship deal with the Kent Reliance Building Society, the stadium has been renamed the KRBS Priestfield Stadium.

What Is It Like For Visiting Supporters?

Away fans are housed in part of

the Brian Moore Stand where around 1,500 supporters can be accommodated. Unlike most temporary stands though the facilities are surprisingly good, being of a permanent nature behind the stand. However it is uncovered, so although the Club hand out free rain macs if it rains, still be prepared to get wet!

Where To Drink?

The ground is walkable from the town centre, where there are a fair few pubs to be found.

The 'Livingstone Arms' on Gillingham Road is known as an "Away Supporters" pub and is situated approximately 100 yards from the away turnstiles. The atmosphere within the pub is both warm and friendly and there is

even complimentary bar food laid on for fans.

How To Get There By Car & Where To Park

Leave the M2 at Junction 4 and take the A278 towards Gillingham, going straight across two roundabouts. At the 3rd roundabout turn left onto the A2 towards Gillingham town centre. At the traffic light junction with the A231, turn right into Nelson Road and passing the small bus station take a right turn into Gillingham Road, the ground is down on your right.

There is a residents only parking scheme in operation around the ground, so if you want to street park, this will mean driving a bit further away to do so. There is a cheap pay and display car park (£1 for 3 hours) on Railway Street near Gillingham station, which is less than 10 mins walk from the ground.

By Train

The ground is about a ten minute walk away from Gillingham railway station, which is served by trains from London Victoria (every 15mins) and Charing Cross (every 30mins). To get to the home areas, turn right at the crossroads and then first left into Gordon Road for the Gillingham End Terrace home area, the Gordon Road Stand and the Rainham End. For the Medway Stand or an alternative route to the Rainham End, turn left at the crossroads and then first right. At the far end the road turns right and then left.

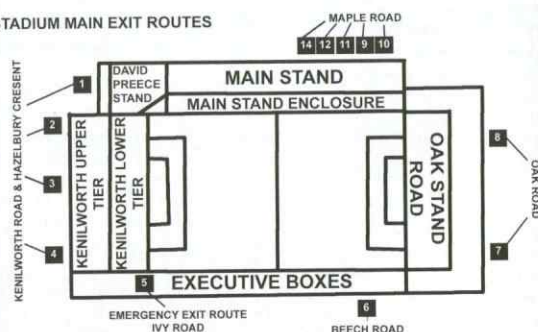

In an evacuation of the main stand you will be instructed to use the pitch. Stewards will direct you to the nearest exit. It may be that your normal exit route will not be available.

On leaving the stadium, you will find some roads closed to pedestrians, to enable swift and unobstructed access for the emergency services. Please leave the area of the ground as quickly as possible, by the route directed. Your co-operation will be much appreciated.

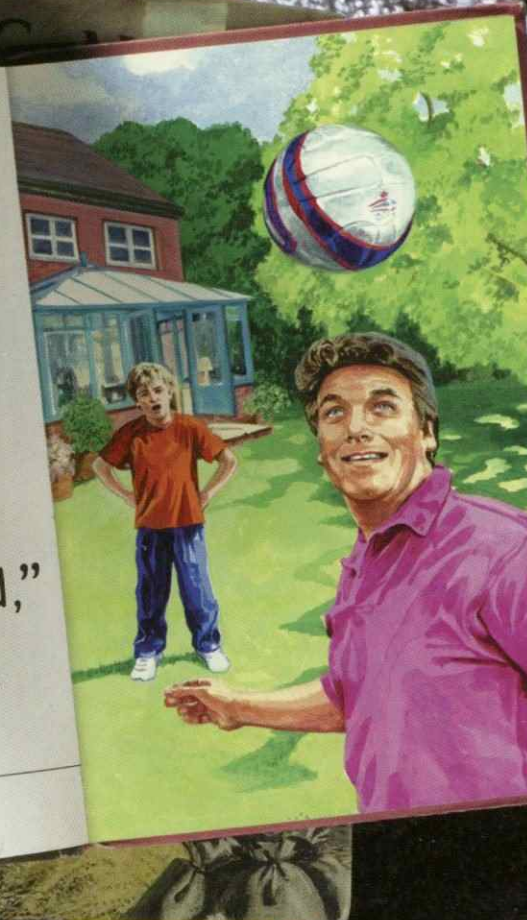
