





I extend a warm welcome to Gary Waddock, directors, staff, fans and players of Aldershot to Kenilworth Road and I hope you have a safe journey home.

I celebrated an anniversary last week.

Fifty years exactly since my father brought me to my first game here at Kenilworth Road, Luton v Leeds, early in the 58-59 season.

Since that momentous day for me, I reckon we've had seven promotions, nine relegations (plus some dramatic near-misses!), four Wembley finals, three FA Cup semis and we've plummeted from top division to bottom twice -

never dull!

I've been reflecting on the highlights of those fifty years.

Reaching the FA Cup Final in 1959 has to be the first, plus all the excitement on the way, but the Fourth Division title year of 67-68 takes some beating, with Bruce Rioch rampant. The start of our return to the top after three quick relegations.

The seventies were thrilling at times with Malcolm

Macdonald scoring some sensational goals, including a hat-trick I witnessed away to Sheffield Wednesday, when we beat them 5-1.

It was televised too, so it alerted the wider world to the talents of our exciting converted left back!

Of all our dramatic last day escapes from relegation, Maine Road in 1983 has to be the best remembered by football fans at large.... David Pleat's beige-suited jig across the pitch leaving a lasting memory of pure

joy, relief and, of course, high fashion!

The eighties were wonderful at times, culminating in that magnificent Littlewoods Cup win over Arsenal in April 1988.

What a superb team we had at that time!

I'll never forget that glorious cup run in '94 either, nor the scintillating promotions under Joe Kinnear and Mike Newell.

We have certainly had our fair share of excitement and we have to be grateful for that. Some clubs have never been to Wembley...nor even ventured out of the lower divisions.

But right now, we are best known for our bewildering points deductions.

Shortly after he emerged from the general anaesthetic, he asked if I was going to Exeter.

Yes, still on the ball at 93, loving Luton Town from his hospital bed, but his recovery would be that little bit quicker if we could win today.

Once again, I'd like to thank those that travelled to Exeter. You truly were the


12th man and I hope you all had a good journey back.

Last week at Macclesfield was disappointing. No disrespect to teams such as Macclesfield, but we need to be beating teams like them if we are to stay in this division.



# Aldershot Town

Welcome to Today's visitors

After clinching the Blue Square Premier title last season, Aldershot Town have finally made it to the Football League 16 years after they reformed in the place of the original Aldershot FC.

Last season's success was the Shots' fifth promotion since they were reformed.

They began their life as a new club in the Isthmian League Third Division at the beginning of the 1992-93 season, going on to win the title in their inaugural season.

A further promotion followed a year later and another in 2003, ensured their place in the Conference.

In their first season in the Conference, the club finished in fifth place, which culminated in a play off final appearance against Shrewsbury Town.



**The Ground: Recreation Ground**

Aldershot F.C. adopted the "Rec" as their home ground upon formation in December 1926.

The Recreation Ground was owned by the local council and situated on Aldershot High Street.

The first stand, the south stand, was opened at the beginning of the 1929-1930 season and still remains today. A crowd of 3,522 witnessed the shots record a 2-1 victory over Norwich City on the day of it's opening.

The North Stand is the main stand of the Recreation Ground running along one side of the pitch.

It houses players changing rooms and the clubs directors box and media center. Adjoined to the North stand is the club offices which were used by both Aldershot F.C. and Aldershot Town F.C. directors.

The East Bank is the largest stand of the Recreation Ground capable of holding several thousand fans. The design of the stand is unusual as it is not like most stands that have a flat roof, instead the stand roof is a Barrel shaped roof towards the rear, with a flat roof covering the lower parts of the East Bank.

The south stand is the only all seated stand at the ground. It accommodates both Home and Away fans.

However it wasn't their time and they were eventually beaten on penalties following a 1-1 draw at Stoke City's Britannia Stadium.

The club then appeared in the Conference play-offs a year later and were unfortunate to lose in the semi finals to Carlisle United who went on to be promoted in the final.

In 2007 former Hatters midfielder Gary Waddock was appointed manager and in his first season he guided the Shots to the Conference title which was achieved following a 1-1 draw at Exeter.


Waddock was rewarded for his efforts with the Blue Square Conference Manager of the Season.

On the opening day of the 2008-09 season 9 August, Aldershot Town won their first league game since returning to the Football League at Accrington Stanley, winning 1-0 thanks to a Scott Donnelly free-kick.

## The Manager

Gary was appointed manager on May 19th 2007. He originally joined the Shots on a two year agreement. Gary arrived after an extensive football career where he made over 500 senior appearances. The former midfielder includes periods at QPR, Luton Town, Millwall, Bristol Rovers and at Charleroi (Belgium). In addition he made 21 international appearances for the Republic of Ireland. When former QPR manager Ian Holloway took charge of the west London side he appointed Gary to head the Academy section of the club and, eventually, Gary took responsibility of the reserve and youth team structure too. He also served as first team manager at the Championship club. Gary impressed during his interview and expressed his ambition to take the club back to the Football League. His ambition was fulfilled just 11 months later as he clinched the Blue Square Premier title and the Setanta Shield in an incredible first season. Delighted Aldershot's loyal fans when he signed a new three year contract in the summer of 2008 along with Martin Kuhl.


## Anthony Charles

## Chris Blackburn


Signed from Swindon in the May of 2008 after his release from the Robins. Solid defender who is equally at home playing in the middle or the right side of the defence.


## Scott Donnelly

## Junior Osborne



## The Numbers Game

Simon Pitts looks back at the Hatters previous fixtures against Aldershot

**6** The most number of goals scored by Luton in this fixture, as they ran out 6-1 winners. It was in February 1935 and goals from Frederick Roberts, Sam Bell, with a brace for both Jack Ball and George Stephenson giving the home side a comfortable victory.

**2** The number of draws in this fixture. The first, on Boxing Day 1933, ended 1-1 with Andy Rennie netting. In March 1936 the match ended 2-2, with Frederick Roberts and Willie Boyd scoring.

**15,505** The biggest crowd for this fixture, back in April 1937, were treated to a goal fest, as the Hatters won 5-2! There was a brace each for Bert Dawes and Joe Payne, with Frederick Roberts netting for the third consecutive time in this fixture. The lowest attendance of 4471 came in September 1966, and those that did bother to turn out saw the Hatters run out 4-0 winners with goals from Ray Whittaker, Alan Slough and a brace from Tony Thear.

**40** The number of years since the last league meeting at Kenilworth Road. It was 30th March 1968, and Luton won 3-1. Bruce Riach scored twice in the first twenty minutes, before Luton allowed the visitors to pull a goal back. The match was settled with Mick Brown scoring what was to be his last goal for Luton.

**7** Amazingly in only eight matches between the sides at Kenilworth Road, seven Luton players have netted twice in a fixture! Jack Ball, George Stephenson, Bert Dawes, Joe Payne, Tony Thear and Bruce Riach's strikes are all reported elsewhere, so that only leaves John O'Rourke to mention. He scored twice in a 3-1 win, with Tony Read also netting.

"Ultimately you are judged on what you do on the pitch and it's up to you to make sure you are physically right and mentally right and go out


and perform. That's what we are all here to do and hopefully we can go out and get the results needed for Luton Town."

#### THE GAME.

Luton Town 2-1 Northampton  
October 26th 1968

For the first time in the 1968/69 campaign, the Town had dropped off the top of the Division Three table following a 0-2 defeat at Plymouth on 19th October.

A blistering start to the season, which had seen the Hatters go eight games unbeaten, had come off the rails a little with

First to the rebound was Sheffield who swept the ball home.

The Town seemed home and hosed but Northampton, forced to abandon their defensive formation, came more into the game and pulled a goal back through John Fairbrother just after the hour mark.

The Hatters then stepped up their game but could not increase their lead although they always looked the more likely to score which left the final scoreline looking less close than it actually was.

four successive away defeats leaving manager Allan Brown desperate to freshen up his side.

Injuries to left back Fred Jardine and stalwart skipper, and ex-Cobbler, Terry Branston as well as misgivings with reserve goalkeeper Bill Taylor more or less forced Brown's hand and over the space of 48 hours, £18,000 was spent on goalkeeper Sandy Davie from Dundee United and Jack Bannister.

## AN INTERVIEW WITH JANE LEDSOM BY LUTON FAN ANDREW BARRINGER

When I was the first to break the news that copies of her CD had arrived at the club, Jane Ledsom could barely contain her excitement.

"I will probably scream when I see them for the first time and although it will feel strange, I'm really excited," says the Kenilworth Road end season-ticket holder.

As today, Jane, 32, celebrates the release of her first record 30 Down to Zero (Here Come the Hatters), at a time where she is delaying the release of her other material to concentrate promoting the song

about the club she loves.

And what's more, as well as highlighting the Hatters' plight, all of the profits from the record are going straight into the club's coffers, something which Jane admits were the main reasons for embarking on the project.

"After the FA hearing at Soho Square I was getting really fired up and boring people to tears about how unfair the decision was," she says.

"As fans, although we don't have the powers to over-turn any decisions, we have an important

role to play this season.

"So I thought about wanting to do something positive, through music, to tell a tale of our situation and, at the same time, raise money for the club."

And three weeks after first approaching Halo Records owner Mike Masler with the idea, Jane – along with a group of her friends affectionally known as The Shouty Boys – was in and out of the recording studio and the record was born.


The recording of the track was squeezed into a week in which time The Shouty Boys had added their distinguished voices to the song, something which Jane says gives the track the terrace vibe she was after.

"The track was inspired by the song Town Called Malice, a track often heard at Kenilworth Road, which is a favourite song of mine," she says.

"So I was looking to produce something similar by creating an uplifting but match-like atmosphere."

And when the track made its first airing at Kenilworth Road, she admits she didn't even realise it was her.

"At first I didn't think it was me! And to be honest I was



a bit surprised as I didn't know it was going to be played. It was a bit surreal," Jane says.

The song has already received the thumbs-up from Town manager Mick Harford and Captain Kevin Nicholls and Jane has also had plenty of positive feedback from supporters of other clubs, including one fan from the club down the M1.

Jane says: "It shows the football world is fully supportive of our situation so if they can help by buying the record to help the club, then more the better."

And what about the chances of a follow-up song to celebrate the greatest

football recovery of all time when the Hatters have successfully staved off relegation come May?

"Maybe. A victory song with the Shouty Boys again would be fun!" Jane says, grinning.

The CD is available now from the club shop and ticket office and will be available to download on iTunes from October 6.

Town extended their lead to 3-1 when Jade


McEntaggart weaved her way into the box to cross and found Yasmin Hickling arriving in typical style to score.

Holly Sheridan poached a hat trick and their were goals for Jessica McKay and Milly Glean.








#### What's the Ground Like?

After 101 years after playing at their Millmoor ground, the club have moved to the neighbouring city of Sheffield. The club who were tenants at Millmoor, were unable to agree acceptable future rental terms from their landlords and so have moved to the Don Valley Stadium. They have agreed to play at the Don Valley for the next four years. The Don Valley stadium, is primarily an athletics stadium that was built to host the World Student Games 1991. It is mostly an open bowl type stadium, with a large covered Main Stand on one side. As a stadium, it is

unusual in two respects; firstly the Main Stand has a rather unusual roof, that resembles more of a soft material canopy that than a hard standing roof. Secondly, the Main Stand has a separate block of seating on each side of the main section, which almost look as a bit of an afterthought by the stadium designers.

#### What Is It Like For Visiting Supporters?

Away fans are housed in a separate block of seating on one side The Main Stand. The club charge more to sit in the upper tier of the stand compared to the lower tier. It may be an idea to

pay the £2 extra as the view will be better and also you are under cover unlike most of the lower tier.

#### Where To Eat & Drink?

The closest pub to the stadium is the Britannia on Worksop Road, which runs up to the back of the Stadium's main stand. There is also the Cocked Hat on Worksop Road right at the side of the stadium. They serve some decent beer and good food but it is only a small place and it won't take a lot for it to get packed. There is also the Wentworth (on the left hand side of the road on the way back towards the motorway and Meadowhall) which also serves decent beer and food.

#### How To Get There By Car?

Turn onto the A505 towards the M1. Join the M1, heading towards Milton Keynes. Continue on the M1 until you reach junction 34, here branch left, then at the roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A6178 (signposted Sheffield Centre). Continue forward onto unnamed road. At Arena Square continue forward and then turn left when you reach the traffic lights onto Worksop Road (B6085).

#### Car Parking

There is matchday car parking available at Pic Toys, which is on Worksop Road. The car park, which costs £3 per car, is clearly sign posted.

After being signed from Manchester United for £200,000 by Lennie Lawrence in the summer of 1997, the Welsh international went on to make 22 appearances for the Hatters before leaving for Moss Rose in 1998.

Davies joined the coaching staff at the Deva Stadium in 2006 and was later appointed caretaker manager following Mark Wright's departure a year later.

The former midfielder was given the job on a full time basis at the end of last season.

Chester could not have wished for a worse start to this season.

A 6-0 opening day defeat

at Dagenham & Redbridge, was followed with a 5-1 home defeat to Leeds in the Carling Cup.


They continued in this manner with defeats at home to Wycombe and away to Rotherham before finally getting their first victory of the season with an emphatic 5-1 victory over Barnet on August 30.

There have only ever been

seven meetings between the Hatters and Chester, the last coming during an FA Cup tie in the 1976/77 season, which City won 1-0 at Sealand Road.

In the league the Town are undefeated in six meetings, winning three and drawing three.

The Hatters biggest victory came with a 5-2 win at Kenilworth Road in 1966.


