



You played a huge part in the team's comeback and your support was greatly appreciated by all involved.


This afternoon will be a


WATCH ENGLAND VS. KAZAKHSTAN IN THE ERIC MORECAMBE LOUNGE

Welcome to Today's visitors

Darlington Football Club was founded at Darlington Grammar School in 1883. In 1889 it joined the new Northern League, winning it in 1896 and 1900, as well as reaching an FA Amateur Cup semi final. The club turned professional in 1908 and joined the North Eastern League.

In 1982, the club faced a financial crisis and almost folded, but survived thanks to the fundraising efforts in the town, raising almost £100,000 in just a few weeks.

In 1989, the team finished bottom of the league and was relegated to the Conference.

However, they were only there for one season before winning the GM Vauxhall Conference title under new manager Brian Little, and a second successive promotion followed in 1990-91, this time as Fourth Division champions.

Since then, they have reached the play-off final on two occasions, and are now the second longest serving club in the bottom division.

In 1999-2000, they became the first team to lose a tie in the FA Cup and yet still qualify for the next round. Manchester United's involvement in the FIFA Club World Championship meant they did not enter the FA Cup.

To decide who took their place, a "lucky losers" draw

A crowd of 11,600 watched the first game in the new stadium for a 2-0 defeat to Kidderminster Harriers.

Upon completion the arena was originally called the Reynolds Arena, after the club's then-owner, George Reynolds.

However, following Reynolds' bankruptcy and arrest on charges of money laundering, the name was changed to The New Stadium in April 2004.

Since then the club have sold the naming rights for the stadium to sponsors, firstly as the Williamson Motors Stadium and then the 96.6 TFM Darlington Arena between November 2005 and September 2007.

The ground has the theoretical potential to be expanded to a capacity of approximately 60,000 seats but the capacity of the stadium is currently capped at 10,000 for football matches due to poor access roads around the stadium, although the club are allowed to apply for an exception for certain occasions.

Currently the ground has averaged a gate of around 3,000-4,000 supporters, although certain fixtures such as derby match against local rivals Hartlepool United in March 2007 (10,121 spectators), have pulled in a significantly larger turnout.

was held containing the 20 teams knocked out in the second round; Darlington were selected but went on to lose their third-round tie 2-1 to Aston Villa at Villa Park.

In the summer of 2003, the club moved to its new stadium, Reynolds Arena.

However, a poor start to the season saw manager Mick Tait replaced by David Hodgson, returning for his third spell in charge.

In December 2003, Darlington went into administration and once again there were fears that the club would go out of business. At one stage there were rumours that the club would sell its new stadium and return to Feethams.

In January 2004, a fundraising game was organised featuring famous players such as Paul Gascoigne, Bryan Robson and Kenny Dalglish.

This match attracted a record crowd of over 14,000 – still the highest to watch a game at the new Arena - and helped keep the club going.

The end of the season saw George Reynolds formally hand over control of the club to the Sterling consortium with Stewart Davies taking over as chairman.

Quakers finished eighth for two seasons in a row, and the club also changed hands again, with George Houghton taking over.

Expectations were high for the 2006-07 season and Dave Penney joined Darlington as the manager in October 2006.

Quakers finished 11th in Penney's first season, and lost in the play offs to Rochdale over two legs last season.

This means that Quakers have finished in the top half of the table three seasons in a row for the first time since the 1920s.

The Manager

Whilst still working as a bricklayer, Dave Penney started his football career at non league Pontefract Collieries.

Dave was given his big chance in the professional game by Derby County in 1985, who paid Pontefract £1500 for the midfielder. He then went on to make over 300 appearances for the Rams, Oxford United, Swansea, Cardiff City and Doncaster, scoring 67 goals in the process. He became manager of 'The Dons' in December 2001 and guided them to two successive promotions, from the Conference to League One.

Dave quit as Doncaster boss in September 2006, and was appointed Darlo manager a month later. In the summer of 2007, he brought in several new signings – including striker Pawel Abbott for a record fee – and Darlo looked strong candidates for promotion. But The Quakers were badly hit by injuries, and they missed out on an automatic promotion spot, and then agonizingly lost in a shootout to Rochdale in the play off semi final.

Alan White


Former Hatter Alan White, became the eighth signing for the club when he joined in the summer of 2007, and is close to the 400 full appearances mark.

In the summer of 2007 "Fozzie" decided to turn his back on League One promotion winners Scunthorpe in favour of dropping down to League Two and playing for his old Doncaster boss Dave Penney at Darlo. Stephen, who was made club skipper as soon as he arrived, was part of the Doncaster team that won promotion from the Conference and League Two in 2003 and 2004.

Ian Miller

Ian initially joined



Darlington on loan in February 2007 from Ipswich Town. He finally made his move permanent in January 2008.

Ryan Valentine

Ryan is now in his second spell at Darlington. He started his first spell when he joined Quakers from Premiership club Everton in the summer of 2002. He left Darlo in the summer of 2006 for his hometown club Wrexham, but returned again in January 2008.

Clayton Fortune

Clayton arrived at Darlington during the summer after being released by League One side Leyton Orient, where he had been plagued by injuries.

Ricky joined forces with his old Doncaster boss Dave Penney in January 2007 following a brief spell with Grimsby Town. He is Darlo's longest serving player.

David learned his trade at Manchester United, but was freed after only a year as a pro. He was released in the

He showed his ability by scoring the winner at Walsall in the first round of the Carling Cup, and then he became the first Darlo player for 33 years to score four goals in an away game.

Liam Hatch


Liam arrived at the Darlington Arena on loan from Peterborough United, where he couldn't force his way into the first team after he'd been transferred from Barnet for £150,000. He made his Quakers debut at Macclesfield on August 30th, and set up the first goal in the record 6-0 win, he then scored the winner on his full home debut against Port Vale on September 13th.

Simon Pitts looks back at the Hatters previous fixtures against Darlington

3 The number of previous league meetings between the sides at Kenilworth Road. Luton have won on each occasion, and have scored ten goals, the visitors have netted three times.

2 The number of players to have played for Luton following a transfer from Darlington. Harold Briggs made just two appearances in 1927/28, whilst Lee Nogan scored two goals in eleven appearances for the Hatters in 2000/01 before joining York City.

2 Is also the number of players to have moved to Darlington from Luton. Barry Hawkes played nine times in two seasons in the late 1950's having joined from Shotton Colliery Welfare. Brian Johnson moved from Sunderland to Luton, and after twelve appearances in two seasons, 1966-68, he transferred back up north to Darlington.

13,948 The biggest attendance for this fixture saw Luton win 3-1 in February 1968. Bruce Riach and Keith Allen gave the Hatters a 2-0 lead at half time, before John Moore

put the ball in both nets in the final few minutes. Luton were three points clear at top of the League after this victory, and by the end of the season this had been extended to five, as the Hatters were crowned Champions.

5 The most goals scored by Luton came in the last league encounter at Kenilworth Road, seven years ago. Both sides held the lead in this match, as first Matthew Spring equalised the visitors' opener and then Steve Howard scored to put Luton 2-1 up. Darlington equalised almost

immediately, but further goals from Dean Crowe, a Kevin Nicholls penalty, and Jean-Louis Valois sealed the win. Both keepers saved penalties in this match, as first Carl Emberson denied Barry Conlon, (yes the same Barry Conlon who scored against the Hatters last week for Bradford!) before Andrew Collett saved a late Spring spot kick.

0 Darlington failed to score in the fixture in April 1966, as Luton won 2-0. John O'Rourke and Ray Whittaker were the scorers in that match.

1 There has been one Cup match at Kenilworth Road, a FA Cup second round replay, which the Hatters won 2-0. The first match had ended goal-less, and it took an hour for Lee Nogan, against his former Club, to score his first goal in a Luton shirt. Paul McLaren wrapped up the win with twelve minutes remaining.

6 Luton have played six previous League fixtures on this day, with three here at Kenilworth Road. Five years ago the Hatters beat Wycombe 3-1 with a brace from Gary McSheffrey and a goal from Russell Perrett. Today's match will complete a set of having played in every level of the league on this day!

Worley hopes to gain match experience

The 19-year-old joined the Town on a month's loan from Coca-Cola League 1 leaders Leicester City in time for the Hatters' trip to Rotherham United.

After graduating through the ranks at Chelsea the 6' 4" defender's search for first team-football prompted the promising youngster to make the decision to drop down the divisions in search of the opportunity to show regularly what he can do and he signed permanently

at Walkers Stadium in the summer after the Foxes fought off competition.

"There were a couple of clubs interested in me in the summer, I went to Preston for a week at the time as well and it was a choice between the two," explained the centre-half.

On his move to the Hatters, Harry commented, "Things aren't working out for me at Leicester at the moment therefore I wanted to come to a club who would give

me the opportunity to get some games under my belt.

"Mick's given me that chance here and I am really happy about it.

"It is a difficult situation for me at Leicester, because a different manager brought me in to the one who is in charge now and he has understandably brought his own players in.

"I am at a stage of my career where I want to play games and Luton have provided me with that chance."

Given the race to sign him in the summer it's fair to suggest that plenty were watching his lack of immediate chances at Leicester with a close eye and Hatters boss Mick Harford moved quickly when news broke of the injury sustained by George Pilkington to snap up the man who was an unused substitute for Chelsea in the 2007 Community Shield at Wembley.

Worley didn't need to think twice about making the move:

"I was aware of the interest for a few weeks and I think the manager was looking for the right time to bring me in.

"With the sad injury to George, the move came at a perfect time for me and for the club."

After previous loan spells

with Doncaster Rovers and Carlisle United whilst with Chelsea, the Warrington born defender is no stranger to quickly making friends in a new dressing room:

"It has been good for me coming here,

"I knew a couple of lads before I arrived and that always helps.

"They are a bunch of lads who are easy to get on with, but there is also a lot of quality here and I think we are going to be fine; we just need to keep plugging away.

"I spoke to a couple of people after my debut because I thought I might be struggling fitness wise but I was really happy with my performance.

"Obviously the result was disappointing but personally it was pleasing that my fitness and

performance were good and I am looking forward to getting fitter and building on that start."

With four starts under his

belt with the Hatters, Worley is focussed on helping Luton wipe away their points deficit as quickly as possible and it is a challenge he is confident can be achieved – once they start converting draws into wins.

He added:


"If we can get two or three wins in a row we'll be flying.

FlashBack

Club Historian Roger Wash looks back at a previous Luton v Darlington fixture

At the start of the 2001/02 season the Town had found themselves back in the bottom division for the first time since 1968, following relegation with the poorest team that any supporter could remember.

Manager Joe Kinnear had spent the summer getting rid of the old guard as well as wheeling and dealing in the transfer market.

Although seven new players were brought in over that hectic period, most Luton fans reckoned that the best signing made by Kinnear was that of Mick Harford as his number two!

Five players, Carl Emberton, Russ Perrett, Kevin Nicholls, Paul Hughes and Carl Griffiths made their debuts in the opening day win at Carlisle while two more, Ian Hillier and Adrian Forbes were included as the Town started their home campaign with a 2-1 victory over Cheltenham.

Quite understandably, it took a few games for the team to gel with a defeat at Bristol Rovers and draws at

Exeter and at home to Oxford and Lincoln not setting the heart racing but all this altered with the introduction of an unknown

Frenchman for the home clash with Torquay in late September.

Given the Town's recent forays into the foreign transfer market with some less than inspiring signings, the presentation of Jean-Louis Valois did not attract much

interest amongst the Hatters

faithful but that soon changed as his ball control, close skills and vision woke the crowd from its slumbers and an incredible long range shot that arrowed into the top corner of the net, during the 5-1 win, brought the house down. A star was born.

The season was now ready to take off and over 2,000 Luton supporters made their way to Leyton Orient in the following mid-week to see Valois steal the show again in a 3-1 win.

Although the next game, away to eventual champions Plymouth was lost, word of the mercurial Frenchman had spread and a crowd of 7,219, the best of the season at that stage, turned up for the next home game, against fellow promotion hopefuls Darlington.

The game Luton Town 5 Darlington 2 5th October 2001

Due to England's World Cup qualifying game against Greece being played on Saturday 6th October the Town's home game with Darlington was switched to the previous evening.

Darlington were sitting in sixth spot in the table, with the Hatters three places higher, and had gone four games without defeat.

They showed their promotion

credentials by opening the scoring after 25 minutes after a terrible mistake from re-called goalkeeper Carl Emberton.

The Hatters keeper smacked his attempted clearance straight at Quakers striker Danny Mellanby, who accepted the gift opportunity with a low shot from ten yards.

The lead did not last long, though, as Matthew Spring smacked in a 25 yard pile driver ten minutes later, but the game was still too close to call as the players trooped off at the interval.


Whatever was said by manager Kinnear over the half-time oranges certainly worked as Steve Howard headed the Town into the lead three minutes after the re-start from a corner by Valois.

Darlington would not lie down, however, with Neil Wainwright seeing his shot take a deflection off Nicholls and go in off the bar.

Back came the Town with Spring seeing an effort cleared off the line before on-loan striker Dean Crowe netted on 67 minutes.

The excitement was constant with the Hatters pouring forward and scoring again when Nicholls slotted home a penalty after Steve Howard was upended in the box.

Then came another Valois moment

with the ex-Lille forward firing in a howitzer from 25 yards to bring the score to 5-2 and seemingly over as a contest.

Darlington, still game, saw a Barry Conlon penalty saved by Emberton and at the other end Valois was fouled just as he was about to pull the trigger after a 60 yard run.

Nicholls had been substituted by then and the penalty taking responsibilities were assumed by Spring who saw his effort saved by the feet of Quakers goalkeeper Andrew Collett.

That was the last piece of action on a breathless night and it was left to Joe Kinnear to have the final say. "It certainly beat a night out at the dogs" or words to that effect!

GOALKEEPER

Ian Feuer
A very tough spot to fill but Feuer just gets the nod in goal. Between 1995 and 1997 the giant 6ft 7" American just seemed un-beatable but a shoulder injury ended an impressive run of 90 consecutive league appearances. I often wonder whether that nightmare day against 'them' down the road would have been different with Ian between the sticks.

RIGHT BACK

Tim Breacker
Marauding full back Tim was an integral part of Luton's success in the 1980's and is the obvious choice for this position. An old school overlapping full back, Tim scored my favourite ever Luton goal in my favourite ever Luton game, a screamer from 40 yards against Derby on the last day of season 1989/90 to keep us up.

CENTRE BACK

Steve Foster
A "no-brainer" really, Steve would get picked just for being the skipper on that great day in 1988 alone, but he contributed much more as along with Hill and Harford he formed the backbone of Luton's most successful period. Alongside Mal Donaghy, Foster formed arguably the best centre half pairing in the country at the time.

CENTRE BACK

Curtis Davies
It takes some player to break up a pair like the one I've described above, but Curtis certainly is a bit special. He is the modern centre half using his pace and excellent reading of the game to get himself out of trouble, rather than relying on physical presence.

LEFT BACK

Matt Taylor
We knew we were watching someone special when Matt burst onto the scene during

pre-season 1999/2000 with some all action displays. Equally comfortable at left back or as left-winger, he formed a fantastic partnership with Jean-Louis Valois during our promotion season from the basement league.

RIGHT MIDFIELD

Ricky Hill
No all-time Hatters 11 would be complete without Ricky Hill. I was brought up on the legend of Ricky Hill, but only got to see the tail end of his Luton career and I wish that I were a few years older to be able to truly appreciate Ricky's talents. My favourite Ricky moment came on his first game as manager, just before kick-off a high ball was kicked off the pitch; Ricky in his loafers, pulled the ball out of the air nonchalantly and stopped it dead in front of him. You never lose it do you?

CENTRE MIDFIELD

Kevin Nicholls
Heartbeat of the team for 5 years and the first player in a long time that the crowd felt a genuine affinity for, "Nico" further cemented his status amongst the Hatters faithful through his "second coming" this summer. A vastly underrated footballer, Kevin always wants the ball and will never hide when things get difficult which is the perfect recipe when we are the situation we are in. It also seems that "Nico" is immune to pain given his numerous advertising hoarding clatterings/Oak Road stand falls only for him to carry on regardless.

CENTRE MIDFIELD

David Preece
"Mini" made Luton tick for years, plain and simple. His ability to never give the ball away and always play the sensible pass, created the platform to allow everyone else around him to play to their best. Many say that

Kinsley Black

He played a massive part in my favourite ever Luton game, scoring the last minute winner at the Baseball Ground in 1990 to send five thousand travelling Hatters mad. I lived away from Luton as a kid, and due to Luton's unfashionable status, I had what seemed to be about a thousand Kingsley Black Panini "swapsies" but I couldn't have been happier.

STRIKER

Mick Harford
Another "no-brainer" as Big Mick is a true hero as a player, coach and manager. Anyone who saw him play understood just how good he was, and the fact that Sir Alex Ferguson rues the fact he didn't manage to sign him speaks volumes. Amazing he never got more England caps, and how England could do with a player of his type now. My favourite Mick Harford moment is attending his Soccer School as an 11 year old and being completely awe struck by this giant of a man, but was impressed even at that age at what a gentleman he was.

STRIKER

Lars Elstrup

What's the Ground Like?

At one side of the ground is the Carlsberg Stand, which is the tallest stand and is two tiered and covered. However this stand only runs half the length of the pitch, straddling the half way line. Opposite is the old Main Stand, which is small covered all seated stand and has a large number of supporting pillars running across the front of it. Part of this stand dates back to 1901, possibly making it the oldest surviving stand in League football. Both ends are small covered affairs. Home fans are located in the Pontoon Stand at one end, away fans at the opposite end in the Osmond Stand.

What Is It Like For Visiting Supporters?

Away fans are located in the Osmond Stand, at one end of the ground, where 2,200 supporters can be accommodated. One downside of this stand is that there are a number of supporting pillars which could impede your view of the game.

Where To Eat & Drink?

There is not much choice for a pint for away supporters close to the ground. The Rutland Arms is recommended for both home and away fans to mingle, however this is some distance from the ground and doesn't allow in

children. There are a number of pubs along Cleethorpes sea front but this is around a 20 minute away. The Imperial pub by the ground is not recommended for away fans.

How To Get There By Car?

The first thing to remember is that the ground is not actually in Grimsby, but the neighbouring town of Cleethorpes.

Take the A6 towards Bedford. Continue on the A6 until you reach the A421, here merge onto the A421 and then join the A1 signposted The North. Continue onto the A1(M) signposted The North, Peterborough. Branch left, then at roundabout take the 1st exit onto the A46 signposted Lincoln, Sleaford. Continue on the A46, following signs for Grimsby then Cleethorpes. At Isaac's Hill Roundabout take the 1st exit onto the A180. Turn right onto Neville Street, then turn left onto Harrington Street and then left again.

Car Parking

There is no car park at the ground, therefore only street parking. As you drive along the A180 towards the ground, the home end appears first, then after the McDonalds is the away end. From there, continue towards Cleethorpes and try any of the side streets to the left or preferably the right and you should find a parking spot okay.

Accrington Stanley are the next visitors to Kenilworth Road on Saturday 18th October and it is not often that we get to report on what will be the first meeting between the two clubs at this level.

Stanley's return to League action two years ago marked a 44 year absence from the fourth tier of English football and at the start of the campaign everyone connect with the Fraser Eagle Stadium side would understandably have been happy to retain their league status for another season, something that they subsequently managed to achieve a year after winning the Football Conference League in 2005/06.

Showing signs of a steady improvement on their first year back in the Football League, last season they finished 17th in the division, nine points above relegated Mansfield Town.

The challenge that now faces Accrington is building on that platform and with a win already under their belt at Port Vale – also relegated with the Hatters – they will arrive at Kenilworth Road keen to prove that result wasn't a one-off.

One of the scorers in their 2-0 win at Vale Park was Paul Mullin, who in his eight year spell at the club, has been one of the major factors in their climb up the leagues.

The former Radcliffe Borough striker is Accrington's record

appearance maker of all time – despite initially being released by the club at the start of his career.

He now has nearly two hundred goals to his name in just over 400 appearances, unsurprisingly with that success he has won the Players' Player of the Season award four times in the last five seasons and will prove a real threat to the Hatters.

John Coleman's side are currently 18th in Coca-Cola League 2 and like Luton are looking to get their season up and running by acquiring points in threes rather than ones.

There is enough evidence to suggest an entertaining game should be on the cards because statistically both sides are amongst the top teams in the division for shooting.


The Hatters have rattled 121 shots at the opposition's


