Good afternoon and a warm welcome to Kenny Road and a special welcome to our guests from Dagenham and Redbridge FC who recently regained their league status, a feat that deserves recognition.

As the squad regeneration program continues, we are delighted to confirm Tom Craddock's extension to his loan period at the club even though he won't

feature in today's line up as he took a knock in training this week.

Tom is a player identified and recommended by Mick to the board as a valuable acquisition for the club. I'd like to go on record to thank Middlesbrough, and in particular Gareth Southgate, for their co-operation and understanding during the renegotiation and transfer process.

Since 2020 have been custodians of the club a total of 36 players have either been recruited or have departed; far more than any other club in this league.

busy Christmas period and every game is a must win match.







Simon Pitts looks back at the Hatters previous fixtures on this day

1967 Swansea Town were the visitors in this year, but it was the Hatters who ran out 4-0 winners. All the goals were scored in a six minute spell late in the game! Graham French scored the first with 76 minutes on the clock, before Ian Buxton netted two minutes later. Bruce Rioch scored within 60 seconds and then Buxton netted his second of the match.


8 The number of league matches played previously at Kenilworth Road on this day. Luton have won five, drawn one and lost two, scoring 23 goals and conceding 11.

0 The only draw was goal-less, against Walsall, back in 1930, when the sides met in Division Three South. This was the first League match to be played on this date at Kenilworth Road, and it is also the only time the Hatters have failed to score on this date in a home league match. Amazingly the only away league game to be played on this date also ended goal-less, at West Ham in 1947!

6 Luton scored six goals against Blackburn on this date in 1952, with Jesse Pye netting a hat-trick. Bert Mitchell, Roy Davies and Bernard Moore were the other scorers as the visitors failed to find the net.

23,592 The biggest attendance was for the fixture in 1958 when Tottenham Hotspurs were the visitors. Billy Bingham scored the Luton goal as the Hatters were beaten 2-1.

5 There were five goals in the fixture in 1975, but unfortunately for the Hatters it was the visitors Oldham Athletic who scored three of them! Jimmy Husband and Brian Chambers netted for Luton.



■ Brian Stein confirmed Luton's victory over Nottingham Forest in 1986

2 It was a Division Two (today's "Championship") match in 1980 when West Ham United were the visitors. Luton were the only team to win at West Ham in the league that season, and they duly completed the "double" with a 3-2 victory at Kenilworth Road. Brian Stein scored twice before Trevor Booking netted either side of half time to level for the visitors. David Moss, who had scored both goals at Upton Park on the opening day, netted the winner with five minutes remaining.

4 Luton scored four against Nottingham Forest in 1986, and Mark Stein, like his brother six years earlier, scored twice early in the game. Steve Foster made it 3-0 before Forest pulled one back, all with less than 25 minutes on the clock! Brian Stein wrapped up the victory in the second half before Gary Birtles netted for the visitors.

5 It's five years since Luton last played at Kenilworth Road on this date, and Wrexham were the visitors. This time it's the Hatters who found themselves two goals down, before Adrian Forbes scored just before half time. Steve Robinson netted the equaliser soon after the break with Lee Mansell scoring the winner for Luton.


Welcome to today's visitors

Despite only being in existence for 16 years, Dagenham & Redbridge Football Club have had their fair share of highs and lows culminating with their biggest high in 2007 when they won the Football Conference title and with it, promotion to the Football League.

The Club came about following a series of mergers which saw Leytonstone, Ilford and Walthamstow Avenue form Redbridge Forest who in turn merged with Dagenham FC in 1992 to form the current Club. All four had proud histories as amateur clubs in the past but due to dwindling attendances, had fallen on hard times.

The first season of Dagenham & Redbridge FC saw them finish third behind Wycombe Wanderers in the GM Vauxhall Conference and reach the 1st Round proper of the FA Cup, where they were defeated 5-4 in a thrilling game against Leyton Orient.

Unfortunately after this things began to go downhill for the club especially off the pitch. Firstly manager John Still attracted a lot of interest and when Peterborough made an approach which was too good to turn down, he moved on and this was followed by a Trustee of the Club illegally removing half a million pounds which he was later convicted of. Money was now tight and the 1995/6 season saw the Daggers finish bottom of the GM Vauxhall Conference and suffer relegation to the Isthmian League.



The Ground: **Victoria Road**

Victoria Road has existed as a football ground since 1917, when the Sterling Works side, whose factory was situated alongside, used it. It was not fully enclosed until the summer of 1955, when Briggs Sports moved out to Rush Green Road, and Dagenham FC moved from the Arena. During that summer they levelled and re-seeded the pitch, and removed the stones from the playing surface. They then extended the banking and the terracing.

The main stand was built that autumn and was opened on 7th January 1956 by JW Bowers who was then, the chairman of the Essex County FA. It was reported that the new stand had a capacity of 800.

During the summer of 1956, the turnstile block at the Victoria Road side of the ground was added, and the men's toilets situated at the Victoria Road end were also built. In the summer of 1958, the cover over the far side was erected, at a cost of £1400 - a substantial sum in those days.

The first floodlight match at Victoria Road was Dagenham v Woodford in the FA Youth Cup on 26th September 1957 and the first senior match was friendly against Rainham Town on 19th March 1958.

The attendance record was set in 1967 with the visit of Reading in the FA Cup when 7,200 crammed into the ground.

To ensure the Club didn't continue a downward trend Ted Hardy was appointed to stabilise it. At 67 years of age, Ted worked the same magic as he'd worked in the seventies with Enfield and Dagenham FC and against all odds took the team to Wembley in the FA Trophy final.

The Daggers installed Garry Hill into the hot seat and in his first season they returned to the Conference having romped to the Isthmian League title recording 20 victories and a draw from their 21 home league games and an outstanding 101 points.

The success story continued into the 2000/01 season as the Club captured the National headlines on the Sports Pages as they first defeated Lincoln City in the FA Cup then came within four minutes of defeating Premiership Charlton Athletic at the Valley in the FA Cup third round. By the end of their first season back in the Conference they achieved third place.

The 2001/2 season saw the Club rise to top of the Conference on September 11th for the first time ever. After the previous season's exploits in the FA Cup, there was a high level of expectation and the team didn't disappoint. The Conference championship turned into a two-horse race with Boston United and the Daggers heartbreakingly missing out on promotion to the Football League on goal difference. The disappointment was made even worse when the Lincolnshire side were found guilty of illegal payments to players but the points deduction was carried into the following season.

The following season saw the Club miss out on promotion to the football league for the second season running again by the closest of margins. A Conference record breaking eleven match winning run took them from 15th place in January up into the promotion play-off places which they qualified for.

Dagenham & Redbridge's first Football League game ended in a 0-1 defeat at Stockport County.

The Manager


John has proved his ability at spotting young raw talent and nurturing them to become winners by taking a side with an average age of 24 to the Nationwide Conference title in 2007.

At semi-professional level, his record is second to none with Isthmian League and Southern League title successes at Leytonstone Ilford and Dartford.

In League football John has also managed Barnet, had a spell coaching at Lincoln City and was assistant manager of Bristol Rovers.

He returned to the Daggers in April 2004 and used the experience gained in the ten years he was away to outstanding results.

As a player, John's career was cut short by a knee injury after playing for Orient, Dagenham and Bishops Cleeve, where he won an Amateur Cup winners medal in the last ever final.

Capped at five levels by Wales including two Full International Caps, Tony joined the Club during the 2000 Close season having spent the previous six months coaching in the States.

MAGNUS OKUONGHAE

The 6'3" defender started the 2006/7 season with Aldershot Town but moved around the Conference to St Albans City and Crawley Town during it.

MATT RITCHIE

Matt arrived at the Club on loan from Portsmouth in late September. He was included in the Portsmouth squad that played Portuguese side Braga in the UEFA Cup earlier this season and is rated highly by the Pompey management.

JONATHAN BOARDMAN

Jon is now in his second season

with the Club having joined in January 2007 from Rochdale.

SHANE HUKU

Shane began his career as a youth at Peterborough where he progressed through the ranks making 18 league starts, scoring once against Torquay.

SAM SAUNDERS

Sam joined the Daggers from Nationwide South side Carshalton Athletic in May 2005. Sam has also played for Welling United, Hastings Town and Ashford Town during his career and has represented the England Semi-Pro side.

GLEN SOUTHAM

Having won the Bishops Stortford player of the year honour in 2001 and 2003, John Still made Glen his first signing upon his return to the Club, paying an undisclosed five figure fee.

JON NURSE

Born in Bridgetown, Barbados Jon started his career working his way through the ranks at Sutton United. Jon won his first International cap for Barbados in their World Cup qualifier in Dominica and is now a regular in their side.

RICHARD GRAHAM

Newry born Richard, 27, impressed Daggers manager John Still when he tore the Daggers apart and inspired Barnet to a 5-0 victory in 2004. The winger, twice capped at Under-21 level for Northern Ireland, began his career as youth at Queens Park Rangers.

SCOTT GRIFFITHS

Mark joined Dagenham & Redbridge in May 2008 from Staines Town where he scored 34 Ryman League goals last season.

SCOTT GRIFFITHS

Former Southend youth player, Scott continues to attract scouts to every game he plays. Capped by Essex for their County Football Team he missed out on a place in the England Under 19's team when he was injured before the final trial.

PAUL BENSON

Paul really is a rags to riches story. He was spotted by John Still playing in the Essex Intermediate league with White Ensign where he scored 96 goals in two years. He had a two-week trial at Southend United but before they could offer him any further trials he opted to sign a contract with Dagenham & Redbridge in July 2005.

ANWAR UDDIN

Anwar started his career at West Ham United where he spent seven

years playing alongside the likes of Joe Cole and Michael Carrick.

WESLEY THOMAS

Wesley signed for the Daggers on a three year contract on September 1st 2008 from Blue Square South Fisher Athletic. He made his daggers debut in the 2-0 victory at Rochdale in October 2008.

BAI MAS LETTEALLOW

Bai Mas was signed by the Daggers in February 2005 from Harlow. As a non contract player, Max is also registered to play for Thurrock FC in the Blue Square South League where he spent the whole of last season.

BEN STREVSNS

Ben began his career at Barnet where he scored 46 goals for the Club and was a part of the Bees side that won the Conference title in 2005. Last season he ended the season as top scorer.

DANNY FOSTER

Danny joined the Daggers during the 2004 close season and made his first appearance for the Club in the game at Northwich Victoria in October that year. Prior to the

We were passing the ball well after the break and continued to create chances.


On 68 minutes Richard Owusu played a great ball down the side which Jordan Patrick ran on to.


A lot of players might look at Luton 's situation and be put off joining but for one player the current plight was something of a draw.

FlashBack

Club Historian Roger Wash looks back at a memorable game played on this day in 1986.

The summer of 1986 had produced the normal number of bombshells at Kenilworth Road.

After their highest League position since 1958, the Town saw manager David Pleat poached by Tottenham, to be replaced by John Moore in keeping with the club's recent policy of promoting from within.

Moore, who had joined the club as a no-nonsense



defender in 1965, had firstly to contend with an approach from Chelsea for Northern Ireland international Mal Donaghy.

He succeeded in persuading him to stay but was not so fortunate with full-back Mitchell Thomas who joined his former manager at White Hart Lane following a tribunal.

David Pleat had previously manipulated the tribunal system to the benefit of the Hatters many times but when he managed to take Thomas for only £250,000 Luton supporters were up in arms!

The new manager also had to contend with a plastic pitch, which was now in its second season, and a newly imposed blanket ban on all away supporters.

On top of this he had to start the new campaign without influential midfielder David Preece and iconic striker Mick Harford, both suffering with long term injuries.

It was against this backdrop that the Town started the new campaign slowly, soon earning a reputation for solid defending but with a lack of goalscoring thrust at the other end.

This all changed at the end of October when champions Liverpool visited Kenilworth Road and were thrashed 4-1.

On a day when everything went right, Mick Harford's understudy Mike Newell, a previous season signing by David Pleat, weighed in with a hat-trick against the side he supported as a boy.


Newell, so often the whipping boy of the crowd because of unfavourable comparisons to Harford, was suddenly elevated to super-star status.

The win pushed the Town up to tenth spot which changed to seventh when QPR were seen off the following week, courtesy of a bizarre own-goal from Rangers' Warren Neil (now of course assistant manager at Kenilworth Road).

In the next game, our first ever visit to Plough Lane, Wimbledon, a first ever goal from Mark Stein separated the sides and set up a fascinating clash with Nottingham Forest, who were level top with Liverpool, and the next to visit Kenilworth Road.

Since the Town's return to the top flight in 1982, Nottingham Forest were fast becoming

one of our bogey sides as we had beaten them only once from eight starts in the intervening period.

A crowd of 11,097 turned up to see if this sad sequence could be broken and were treated to a sensational start with Mark Stein netting after only 35 seconds, latching on to a flicked header from Mike Newell and then beating Des Walker for pace before forcing the ball home.


The Town were two up in the eighth minute when Stein was the sharpest to react to a Newell header that came off the bar and with the crowd still not properly settled, skipper Steve Foster made it three by getting on the end of a Peter Nicholas corner in the 16th minute.

To their credit, Forest refused to lie down and reduced the arrears on the half-hour when

Ian Bowyer took advantage of a rare slip by Foster to slide the ball home.

Forest manager, Brian Clough, obviously had words at the interval with the result that the Reds attacked with a vengeance as the second-half got underway and it was only several smart saves from Les Sealey that prevented Forest from clawing their way back.

It therefore came as great relief when Brian Stein, capitalising on some

unselfish play from his brother, hit a curling shot from the edge of the box with 20 minutes to go to give the Town an unassailable 4-1 lead.

There was still time for Gary Birtles to notch a late consolation, but by this time the Forest fire was doused.

The heady heights of fourth position in the top flight as well as laying to rest the Forest bogey in emphatic style, made me miss the Newmarket turn off the A11 on the way home!


Views & Opinions: I think the current owners have got some good ideas but it is going to take a while for them all to be put into practise.



What's the Ground Like?

The ground has benefited greatly with the construction of three new stands over the last ten years and is quite picturesque, with a number of trees being visible behind the stands. The latest addition is the smart looking Westrose Leisure Stand at one side of the pitch, which was opened during the 2000/01 season. On the other side is another single tier, the all seated Horners Main Stand. This has a number of supporting pillars and some executive boxes at the back. At one end the W.M.G (Pearl Street) Stand is the third of the new stands. This is also all seated and serves as a Family Stand. It has a couple of supporting pillars that are right at the front of the stand. The Thwaites Beer (Sandy Lane) end is the only terraced area

remaining. This small terrace has in recent seasons had a roof erected.

What Is It Like For Visiting Supporters?

Away supporters are housed in the Willbutts Lane Stand, where the view of the action and the facilities are pretty good. Up to 3,650 supporters can be accommodated in it and normally away fans are confined to the centre of the stand. The acoustics are excellent, so away fans can really make some noise from within it.

Where To Eat & Drink?

At the ground there are two bars to choose from, Studds & the Ratcliffe Arms. Studds is located underneath the Pearl Street Stand and the Ratcliffe Arms is located at the car park

entrance to the ground, on Sandy Lane. This pub has SKY TV. Otherwise alcohol is available inside the ground, although it is cans poured into plastic glasses.

How To Get There By Car?

Join the M1 motorway (signposted The North). Continue forward and then branch left and join the M6 motorway (signposted M6, The North West, Coventry (North), Birmingham.) Continue forward onto the M42. At Junction 9 continue forward onto the M6 TOLL (signposted The North West, Cannock, Lichfield). Continue forward onto the M6. Branch left, then join the M62 motorway (signposted Leeds, Bolton, Manchester North). Leave the M62 at junction 12, then join the M60 motorway (signposted Ring Road North, Leeds, Bolton). Continue forward onto the M62 (signposted Leeds, Huddersfield, Rochdale). Leave the M62 at junction 20, then at the roundabout take the 1st exit onto the A627(M) (signposted Rochdale). At the traffic signals turn left onto the A664 (signposted Rochdale, A664). At the roundabout take the 2nd exit onto Roch Valley Way - B6452 (signposted Blackburn). At the traffic signals continue forward onto Sandy Lane.

Car Parking

Car Parking at the ground is now for permit holders only, so it is a case of either street parking or using the matchday parking facility at Oulder Hill School. The school is located on the way up to the ground, on the left hand side, along Sandy Lane.

Brentford have had an impressive start to the season, with just two league defeats since the opening day of the season.

In his first full season in management, Andy Scott seems to have turned things around from last season and turned the Bees into real promotion contenders.

The former Brentford player took the reigns almost 12 months taking over from Terry Butcher, who managed just five win in 23 games.

Last season he guided them to a respectable 14th, some 17 points off the drop zone but after some clever wheeling and dealing in the summer Scott has a side who have equipped themselves well so far.

Out went eight players in the summer including Reuben Reid (Rotherham), former Bolton player Ricky Shakes and John Mousinho (Wycombe Wanderers) while in came 6 players including former Arsenal youngster John Halls, Adam Newton from Peterborough and former QPR and Blackpool midfielder Marcus Bean.

All three players have been key to the Bees so far, making 44 appearances between them.

Charlie MacDonald was another summer signing, joining from Southend on a

free transfer.

The striker has already scored seven goals so far including the second goal in last weekend's FA Cup win over Havant & Waterlooville, which they went on to win 3-1.

Glenn Poole is another for the Hatter's to keep an eye on with the former Grays and Thurrock striker also on seven goals for the season, including one when the two sides met earlier in the season.

The meeting at Kenilworth Road in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy last month saw there was little between the sides as goals from Hall and

Martin cancelled out the visitors two goal lead before the Hatters went through 4-3 on penalties.

The game in two weeks time will be the 74th time the two sides have met since the first meeting in 1921, when the two sides were in the old Third Division.

Back then Luton won the first match, at home 2-0, before going down 1-0 in the return match just seven days later.

So far Luton have the edge over their opponents with 34 wins compared to Brentford's 23, while 16 games have ended in draws.


