

With the transfer market now back open, Manager Garry Haylock will again be looking to strengthen the team for the busy periods ahead.

New dates for postponed matches

The home game against Rushden & Diamonds has been rearranged for Tuesday 18th January with a 7.45pm kick-off.

Our long away trip to Gateshead has been pencilled in for Tuesday 15th February, but this game will be brought forward to Saturday 15th January should Gateshead be eliminated from the FA Trophy when their game with Southport finally takes place.

The postponed Boxing Day clash with AFC Wimbledon will now take place on Tuesday 1st March with a 7.45pm kick-off

At the time of writing I am hoping that we will have been able to have played at AFC Wimbledon on New Year's Day otherwise we will have been nearly a month without competitive football and we have all been itching to get back to action, having begun to find some form.

This evening we welcome Richard Money and his Luton Town side who are obviously chasing for promotion back to the Football League this season. The fact that we held them to a draw at Kenilworth Road earlier in the season shows we are capable of derailing their ambition and I want more of the same this evening.

Unfortunately, the weather has halted our attempts to improve our league position before today's game but that simply means that good performances and results over these next few games are even more important. Against Ebbsfleet in our last competitive game we played well at times but circumstances counted against us. Going out of the FA Trophy was a big disappointment especially after the way we exited from the FA Cup. I thought we had a good opportunity to go on a long run in the competition, however taking what positives we can from it, perhaps the weather and backlog of games we now face may mean being forced to focus simply on our league programme may be a blessing. I still believe we have the ability and strength to climb the table for a respectable finish.

We showed signs in our last home game and league action against Eastbourne of the way we can take games to our opposition, dominate and get a result. Beginning today we have some very big games against sides who will all be chasing promotion come the end of the season and if we are to deserve a place in this division we need to be able to compete with them and get results against them. We have shown countless times this season that we are more than capable of that and we need to put that in action again beginning this evening.

Availability-wise I am writing this during the Christmas break but I would anticipate and hope that the only player unavailable will be Nathan Webb who is still waiting to serve his red card suspension. Otherwise on the injury-front we are looking strong. We obviously have a much smaller squad than many in this division and perhaps the weather playing havoc with the intended busy run of games over Christmas may have been of assistance to our longer-term success, providing we can get those games played to a sensible schedule.

Looking at the table, many may reflect that we are in our natural position, given the resources available compared to others in this division. However, I truly believe we have the nucleus of a very good side and already have a side capable of finishing the season in a safe and positive position. I hope and expect that when we look back in 12 months time to the table, that this is very much the low point in this club's short existence. To achieve more, we need to be strong and work together as a team on and off the field and look forward to the exciting developments that are set to come for this club.

I wish you all the best for the 2011 and let's start it off with a result and performance we can be proud of.



CLASSIC CAMPAIGN - 1987/88

Ray Harford plotted Luton Town's 1988 Littlewoods Cup final triumph. Danny Wilson replaced Peter Nicholas in midfield, while Micky Weir arrived from Hibernian and Mike Newell moved to Leicester. The Hatters won 5-2 at Oxford and Ian Allinson was signed from Stoke in October, with Luton losing just twice in 12 matches including a 7-4 win the return match against Oxford, finishing ninth in the top-flight. They defeated Wigan 5-2, Coventry 3-1, Ipswich 1-0, Bradford City 2-0 and Oxford 3-1 in the Littlewoods Cup before beating Arsenal 3-2 in the final. Luton were also FA Cup semi-finalists and Simod Cup finalists.



MANAGING TO SUCCEED

David Pleat

Articulate manager David Pleat guided Luton Town to the Second Division title in 1981-82. A former winger, he played for Nottingham Forest, Luton, Shrewsbury, Exeter and Peterborough before becoming Nuneaton's player-boss. He rejoined Luton as coach in July 1972 and became manager in January 1978, guiding the Hatters to the FA Cup semi-finals in 1984-85. Taking charge of Spurs in May 1986, he led them to the 1987 FA Cup final, then managed Leicester City before rejoining Luton in June 1991. He took the Hatters to the FA Cup semi-finals again in 1993-94, leaving in June 1995. Now working in the media.



Bruce Rioch

Influential midfielder Bruce Rioch was capped 24 times by Scotland after leaving Luton Town. Signing professional for Luton in September 1964, he starred in the 1967-68 Fourth Division title triumph and netted 46 goals in 149 League games prior to joining Aston Villa for £100,000 in July 1969. He was a key figure in their 1971-72 Third Division title success and moved to Derby County in February 1974, helping to win the League Championship in 1974-75. He played for Everton, Derby again and Torquay, since managing Middlesbrough, Millwall, Bolton Wanderers, Arsenal, Norwich City and Wigan Athletic.



Ricky Hill

England international midfielder Ricky Hill was 'Player of the Year' when Luton Town won the Second Division title in 1981-82. Signing professional at Kenilworth Road in May 1976, he starred as Luton were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85. He featured in two consecutive Littlewoods Cup finals including the 1988 Wembley triumph and netted 54 goals in 436 League games before moving to Le Havre in July 1989. Reuniting with David Pleat at Leicester City in August 1990 and later as a coach at Sheffield Wednesday and Spurs, he briefly rejoined Luton as manager.



FAB 4

Brian Stein

England international striker Brian Stein scored twice in Luton Town's 1988 Littlewoods Cup final triumph. Moving to Kenilworth Road from Edgware Town in October 1977, he was leading marksman in Luton's 1981-82 Second Division success and also starred as they were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85 and 1987-88. He joined French side Caen in July 1988 and moved via Annecy back to Luton in July 1991. Voted 'Player of the Year' for the second time in 1991-92, he netted 130 goals in 427 League games overall for the Hatters before joining Barnet in August 1992. His younger brother Mark also played for Luton.



Malcolm MacDonald



Former Ace marksman Malcolm MacDonald was capped 14 times by England after leaving Luton Town. Initially with Tonbridge, he joined Fulham in August 1968 and moved to Kenilworth Road in July 1969. He was Luton's top scorer in two consecutive seasons including the 1969-70 promotion success and netted 49 goals in 88 League games before being sold to Newcastle United for £180,000 in May 1971. An FA Cup finalist in 1974, he joined Arsenal for £333,000 in August 1976 and was an FA Cup finalist again in 1978 before injury ended his career. He managed Fulham and Huddersfield Town and has since worked in the media.

Hugely experienced goalkeeper who signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road in June 2009


Mark made 483 appearances in 15 years at Peterborough and was rewarded for his loyalty with a testimonial against Liverpool in 2007.

1st XI Match Report: Newport County 2 HYUFC 1



United travelled to the frozen wastes of South Wales to face a high flying Newport County side who were looking to close the gap on the top three sides who were all in FA Cup action. The same starting line-up that had performed so well at Mansfield the previous week were called on again, with Adrian Patulea and Elliott Buchanan replacing Jack Pattison and Charlie Wassmer on the bench.

The pitch had been largely cleared of the snow which fell in South Wales on Friday afternoon, leaving a hard difficult surface which was never going to suit United's passing game seen in recent weeks. The home side were soon into their stride though, with Darryl Knights setting up former United loanee Ben Wright as early as the third minute, but Bulmer made a comfortable save. The warning to the United defence went unheeded in the fifth minute, when Wright this time turned provider finding Knights with too much time and space on County's left, and his low curled shot left Bulmer with no chance at his left hand post. Almost immediately, the home side should have added a second, a ball into the United box fell to Danny Rose, his goalward shot left Bulmer wrong footed on the icy surface, but fortunately Tom Cadmore was on hand to clear and save United further early embarrassment.

Newport's fluid forward line continued to cause no end of problems to the United defence, Knights again collecting from a

long free-kick. His ball into the box found Craig Reid but fortunately Bulmer was on hand to collect. County's next move saw Wright feeding Knights once again, but Reid's final touch came to nothing. Midway through the half Danny Rose was left unmarked from a County corner, but thankfully for United he put his free header over the bar.

Bulmer was still by far the busier of the two keepers, and he was called upon again in the 34th minute. Alan Goodall's excellent pass found the busy Reid and his top-corner bound effort was tipped away to his right by the United keeper. The visitors finally created a half-chance a couple of minutes later. Lewis Ferrell's low cross was met by Jake Hyde, and his looping effort was tipped away by Glyn Thompson in the County goal. On the stroke of half-time Bulmer again saved well low to his left, as Sam Deering's effort only went to emphasize what a one-sided half the crowd had witnessed.

Wright then began to ask more questions of his former colleagues, shooting wide four minutes after the re-start, and then seeing Bulmer save with his feet on 52 minutes after outpacing the static United defence. Jamie Hand's long ball on the hour found Hyde but he couldn't bring the ball under control on the awkward surface, and County comfortably cleared the danger. Reid then tested Bulmer again in the 64th minute, with the United keeper this time palming the ball away to his left.

The move which sealed the points for County wasn't far away though. Eddie Odhiambo's pass found an unmarked Reid in acres of space on the County right. Bulmer advanced to try and meet him but Reid skipped past him, and as his cross back into the box caused all sorts of problems which United failed to deal with and Adam Bygrave's clumsy challenge on Goodall saw referee Atkin point straight to the spot. Reid fired into the bottom right corner, sending Bulmer the wrong way to put the home side 2-0 up.

County missed the opportunity to add a third with fifteen minutes to go. Knights again found an unmarked Reid and he somehow managed to skew his shot wide with only Bulmer to beat. Substitute Robbie Matthews also had an effort just a moment later which Bulmer saved. Knights then fed Matthews, who clipped the ball onto Reid who again shot wide.

Yet it would be United who created the game's final chances as the home side relaxed. With two minutes to go Hyde cut in from the right and fired in an effort which saw Thompson saving high at his near post. Deep in stoppage time Hyde was still running down the United right, and his ball into the box was swept home by the oncoming Bradley Pritchard to finish with a 2-1 scoreline which flattered a United team who had been comfortably outplayed. To compound United's miserable display, Lewis Ferrell and Jamie Hand appear to have both collected their fifth bookings of the season, ruling them both out of Tuesday's scheduled home game with Eastbourne.

In Part three of a new regular Programme Feature, FEDO goalkeeper Alex Tokarczyk interviews players and coaches of the FEDO scheme. Next up, Alex speaks central defender/midfielder Cameron Gilmartin.

Hello Cameron, congratulations on making your debut for the reserves a few weeks ago, how do you think you did?





 **AROUND THE GROUNDS**

As I look out of my window at six inches of snow on the roof of my summer house (shed), I wonder if these notes will ever see the light of day.

Still we have had worse times at Church Road because of the weather, as those who remember the winter of 1962-63 will testify.

On a wintry Boxing Day morning 1962 my dad and I legged it up to the bus-stop to travel to Ealing Common and on to Craven Cottage. It had been a frosty and smoggy month, the last of the great London smogs before the Clean Air Act took effect. Elsewhere the country had experienced gales and the odd snow shower. Christmas Day had been sunny in Hayes however, although Glasgow had a White Christmas, the snow reaching northern England by midnight. There was a faint trickle of snow in the air as we walked from Hammersmith tube. By the time Albert Quixall scored for Manchester United we couldn't see the far goal through the blizzard. Little did we know it was the start of what was to be known as 'the Big Freeze'. By the time we got home it was settling and starting to freeze. When I awoke the next day the snowfall had drifted four feet up to our front door. Over much of the country snow lay for the next 67 consecutive days and the Thames froze. Parts of our region had a fall of 18", in the west of the country drifts of up to 18 feet were recorded.

It became the coldest winter since 1740. In the following four days the temperature stayed at -21 C. And all we had was a coal fire, no central heating. The third round of the FA Cup, due to commence the first week of January, took 66 days to complete. The Cup Final itself was put back three weeks.

Many of the bigger clubs cleared the snow from their pitches

reasonably quickly. They then covered the surface with tons of straw in an attempt to counter the severe frost. The non-league clubs could do little but just sit back and wait for the thaw. In February Barnet copied Hounslow Town by dragging burning car tyres around their pitch to enable a game to be played.

Hayes had played their Christmas games, sharing the spoils with Wealdstone. They didn't play again until March 2nd when Maidenhead ceded home advantage so that the Amateur Cup tie could take place without further delay. Hayes won 4-0 but their next seven matches were all cup games, their first league match since Boxing Day coming on April 24th.

This led to fixture congestion of the highest order, despite an extended season. Also having played eight consecutive cup games since the resumption of football Hayes now entered May with 11 games still to play in 25 days. Six games were played in the final ten days, four of which took place in the last six days of the season. Fans had to endure a run of five defeats on the trot during this spell. If you hadn't seen enough snow though you could join the Hayes squad on their end of season tour - to Switzerland!

Back to recent times (these notes were written before the Xmas break), however, and the brave souls that did see some football action just before Christmas

Fleetwood Town moved up a place to fifth in the Blue Square

Bet Premier table - just behind opponents **Newport County** - after being one of only a handful of clubs throughout the country to get their game on after the dreadful weather even put paid to the majority of the Barclays Premier League matches on Saturday.

Just down the coast, even **Blackpool** were unable to get their massive game against **Manchester United** on, so all credit to Fleetwood for their efforts, and also to **Newport** for making the journey north! A shivering crowd of 1,142 saw Magno Viera give the Cod Army something to shout about with the opening goal after 21 minutes. Top scorer Craig Reid should have equalised after Jon Worthington had fouled Darryl Knights in the area, but Scott Davies saved Reid's penalty. But with 14 minutes remaining, substitute Robbie Matthews levelled after good work from Reid had set up the former Salisbury City striker. Living where I do I was surprised to hear the match at Kenilworth Road was being played. Around about kick-off time we had a massive snowfall that caught out many shoppers, including myself, in Aylesbury. An easy journey into the town turned to a nightmare just an hour later going home. The heavy snow forced **Luton Town's** clash with **York City** to be abandoned 10 minutes into the second half. The game was initially given the go-ahead following a pitch inspection but a deterioration in the weather made conditions unplayable. It was goalless at the time the referee called a halt to proceedings.





Fleetwood Town v Hayes & Yeading United

Saturday 22nd January - 3pm Kick-Off

Our first encounter with Fleetwood Town will take place at their Highbury home. The fact we've never met before is hardly surprising. It was just two years before the merger of Hayes and Yeading that Fleetwood escaped the North-Western Counties League. They immediately won promotion from Northern Division One in 2006, before achieving promotions every other season to end up in the Blue Square Bet Premier for the first time in their history this season. Last season they had to go through the drama of the play-offs, being pipped to the Conference North title by bitter local rivals Southport.

Their meteoric rise has not gone un-noticed locally, with crowds at Highbury comfortably topping 1,000 this season. One of the highest attendances came in the FA Cup, where Fleetwood held Walsall at home, only to gracefully bow out 2-0 in the replay away from home. In the league though, they have lost just three times as we write, including bizarrely a defeat to basement side Altrincham.

Despite that though, Haylock and his men would be foolish to head to Lancashire to take on Micky Mellon and his "cod army" without a little recognition that, Fleetwood are, as it stands, very firmly in the chase for a Football League place.

In the dugout

Scotsman Micky Mellon has been at the helm at Highbury since September 2008. In his first full season, he was successful in guiding the club to the top tier of non-league football. Previously assistant manager at Lancaster City and youth coach at Burnley, Fleetwood is his first and remains his only job as first team coach at any level. The Football League is in sight now, and that won't scare a man who spent a solid 12 years there as a player with five different clubs, including three separate spells with Tranmere Rovers.

A hardworking midfielder in his day, at 38 years of age, he is one of the younger managers in the Conference National division - a few months past a year younger than our own Garry Haylock.

Key man watch

Fleetwood's squad is jam-packed with talent from non-league and higher, with several players experienced both at this level and above. Former Kettering man Gareth Seddon can be relied upon to find the net, whilst Steve McNulty arrived at the back having been a rock for former club Barrow.

But the key man picked out today is one we might just recognise, and certainly one our own captain will. In the eventually relegated Ebbsfleet side of last season, Magno Vieira still found space to net an

impressive 16 times, including against us at Stonebridge Road. And there's been no let up this season for the 25 year old Brazilian at his new club, with 13 league goals already notched as we write. After a somewhat nomadic early few years to his career, consistency has finally arrived it seems for a man United would do well to take heed of.

We've met before

Well actually, we haven't! This will be the first ever meeting between the two sides.

The venue

Fleetwood's current ground holds 3,663 at its capacity, but there are plans afoot to increase that in the coming years, in line with planned progress on the field. Home of Premier League Blackpool's reserve team, the ground has been open since 1934 and has previously even been home to speedway team, the "Fleetwood Flyers"! It has spent long periods of its history in disuse though, and it was only five years ago that it became the permanent home of Fleetwood Town FC.



At some point in today's match it may be appropriate for the crowd to burst into song to celebrate the 40th birthday of our manager. To be absolutely precise, Garry Andrew Haylock was born in Bradford on 31st December 1970.

Garry started his playing career at Huddersfield Town early in the 1989-90 season, but soon moved to Shelbourne in the League of Ireland. He made his Shelbourne debut on 14th January 1990, and immediately endeared himself to the faithful by scoring a hat-trick in his second match. Note that in this 1991-92 Huddersfield Town team photograph a young Garry Haylock appears at the left end of the middle row.

Garry then embarked upon an extensive tour of Irish football clubs that included Shelbourne, Linfield, Portadown, Panionios, Glentoran, Dundalk, Ards and Shamrock Rovers. How many of you spotted the odd team out? Correct. In 1999-2000 Garry played for Greek side Panionios under former Liverpool stalwart Ronnie Whelan, when they reached the quarter final of the UEFA Cup Winners' Cup.



The image above shows Garry from the 2001-02 season in a card issued by the Glentoran Gazette, which I believe is their equivalent of our ChurchRoader programme, rather than a local newspaper. Card number 12 (of 21) is a bit of a collector's item, as Garry's loan spell at Glentoran ended before the card was issued.

During his time in Irish (and Greek) football the Haylock trophy cabinet can boast three league championship medals, with Shelbourne (1992), Linfield (1994) and Portadown (1996). They hang alongside also five Cup Winners medals with Shelbourne (1993 & 2000), Linfield (1994 & 1995) and Dundalk (2002).

In 2004, after fourteen years in Irish (and Greek) football. Garry embarked on a brief tour of the English non-league scene at Basingstoke Town, Sutton United, Team Bath, Walton & Hersham and Cove. Then in December 2006 he was then appointed manager of Yeading and helped them retain their Conference South status.

In May 2007 Garry was appointed as the first manager of Hayes & Yeading United. He received the Manager of the Month Award from the Blue Square South League for September 2008 when his team topped the Division, and again for March 2009 after another winning run as he lead the club to the league play-offs and promotion to the Blue Square Premier.

How are you now after that injury?

Yes, I know. I've come close a


few times, one in the Histon game and a couple that have gone over the bar. It is long overdue. Hopefully soon I can net one.

We get a lot of stick for our lack of fans but our hardcore go home and away and it's nice to see the players acknowledge them at the end of games. Do they play a part?


