



From what we saw on the pitch to your support up in the stands, last weekend's game at Mansfield was a very enjoyable afternoon for us.

We've had some good performances away from home this season and some of the football we played at Field Mill was terrific. We went up against a good Mansfield side with a strong squad, and they were buoyant after reaching the Trophy Final at Wembley and winning at Histon in their previous game so we knew it would be a tough task, but the showing on the day was right up there with one of the best of the campaign.

When you have been on a good run of results like we have, having a break in the middle of that can disrupt things and we were cautious of that being the case going into the game and did speak about it. We made sure we used the time off as wisely as possible and went to Mansfield full of confidence.

We created a lot of chances, especially in the first half and if anything we were a bit disappointed to have not scored more than one at the break, because getting that bit of a cushion does cover you in the event of anything happening like a lapse in concentration somewhere. To get the second was important, and we have become resolute defensively over the last few months and we saw the game out well. Looking at that defence, you have to say there is a lot of experience there even though a couple of lads are still relatively young. Mike Williams, Danny Lewis and Lee Vaughan have played a lot of non-league football in their careers now, and the likes of Mark Albrighton and Michael Briscoe have competed at a higher level.

There was a terrific turnout by the Harriers fans at Mansfield and, without a shadow of a doubt, that was noticed by all of us and was very much appreciated. Sometimes an early kick-off can disrupt



things, but it goes without saying that the only noise we heard at the ground was that coming from the away end!

Moving on to today, and we can't wait for the game – I know the players are all looking forward to it. I would like to think we're going to see our biggest crowd of the season and kick-off can't come quickly enough. We of course have only played them just recently in the League and, if anything, I







JAMILLE MATT A HAPPY JAMMA...

FOOTBALL IS a wonderful, if strange game. We all know that here at Aggborough this season, but it seems Jamille Matt may realise it more than most.

The young striker is enjoying a fantastic start to life in professional football as part of the squad here at Harriers, but just months ago that would have seemed unimaginable.

The 21 year-old was a prolific striker for Sutton Coldfield Town last season, banging the goals in for fun. However, fresh faces at Town and an injury blip for big Jamma left him on the outside looking in, despite his obvious talent an eye for a strike.

Matt revealed to this week's D&A Interview that he had even considered giving up on the game at one stage - until a call from Aggborough saw his career take a surprise twist.

Steve Burr and Gary Whild threw the Walsall-born player a life-line; first the chance to impress in a closed-doors game against Harriers, then as part of their squad as they took him away from Sutton on non-contract terms.

Clearly he's not looked back since then - his hustle-and-bustle performances and tremendous work-rate have seen him adjust to life in the Blue Square Bet Premier with alarming ease. There was a permanent contract, too, until the end of the current season as the easy-going net-buster continues to progress.

"I'd come back from an injury when I got a

phone call saying that Kiddy wanted me to come and train," recalled Jamille, of how his whirlwind move came about.

"I was delighted and just wanted to get things moving as quickly as possible; I played in a friendly game for Sutton at Aggborough and I think within about a week I was in and signed, so it did move pretty fast.

"I was a bit down in the dumps at Sutton to be honest because I wasn't really getting a look in, despite the goals I'd scored there, and it sort of makes you question whether or not you actually have a future in football.

"All of that changed for me and I couldn't wait to get started here. I'm at a great club and I want to give it my best."

Most refreshing of all, though, is that the player is hardly likely to rest on his laurels now he's made the move.

He issued a somewhat chilling warning to Premier defences that there's still a lot more to come from this emerging talent.

For now it's a case of continuing to find his feet, he admits, and getting used to the level - he's happy to be playing a part. But it's hardly a shock to hear he has no plans on that being a bit-part role in the long term.

He went on to comment: "I'd like to think people haven't seen the best of me yet."

"It is a big step up. I know that myself and there is still a lot for me to learn and hopefully that will come over time if I'm given the chance."

"I want to improve and eventually I'm looking to be in the starting eleven week-in, week-out and if the gaffer chooses to sign me again I know I've got a lot still to show him."

It's clear, too, that the duo of Burr and Whild have played a big part in his switch from the Southern League First Division all the way up to the top rung in the non-league ladder.

The gaffer and his right hand man have been commended for how they've handled the trickiest of terms here in DY10, and Matt couldn't praise the influence of his management team enough, adding: "We wouldn't be where we are without them, that's pretty obvious."

"Their preparation is meticulous and training every day is good and keeps you wanting to come in and enjoy yourself."

"You can't single them out enough, they have been absolutely fantastic and any one of the lads would agree that they're the reason we've done so well on the pitch this year."

ACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOUR AGREEMENT - ABA

During the 2008/09 season the Club received many complaints about the anti-social behaviour of a small group of our younger supporters at our home and away matches both at the grounds and in the local community.

The activities of this small group have harmed the reputation and good name of the Club and the majority of our supporters who never cause any problems at any of our home or away matches. In order to tackle this problem, in consultation and partnership with West Mercia Police and the club have introduced a procedure known as 'Acceptable Behaviour Agreement' or 'ABA' in short.

The small problem group have been identified and all are being asked to sign the ABA in which they agree that their behaviour at any of our games, either at home or away, will not be such as to damage the good name or reputation of the club or lead to complaints from anyone about their conduct.

If they should breach the agreement then this could lead to them being banned from attending any matches or be used as evidence in any Court proceedings relating to their anti-social behaviour.

The club is confident that the majority of our supporters will welcome this positive move by the Club in taking some pro-active action to prevent the present problem escalating and only further damaging our good name. The agreement is in effect a 'Yellow Card' which hopefully the supporters concerned will respect and comply with. If they are genuine supporters of the Club, the ABA will hopefully encourage them to continue supporting us, but in a positive and distinct from negative manner.

As we head towards the sharp end of the season Harriers further underlined their play-off credentials with yet another fine win as they came away from Mansfield Town with a 2-1 victory in their last outing.

I took a look at the remaining fixtures prior to that game at Field Mill and I was left thinking that potentially the matches at Mansfield and Grimsby were the tricky away fixtures Harriers had left - well, Mansfield didn't prove too much of a problem and so it is on to this afternoon and a home game against a Luton Town side that also has serious play-off aspirations.

Given that most people - including the league's sponsors - pretty much accept that Crawley are home and dry in terms of the title race, the play-off battle is a much more interesting affair. I think we can safely assume that AFC Wimbledon are likely to figure - they would need to implode spectacularly over the closing weeks of the season if they were to miss out while today's opponents, Luton, should also be in there. Not only are they six points better off than sixth-placed Fleetwood Town, they also games in hand over them as a result of their FA Trophy run.



Here's hoping this afternoon's game lives up to the billing - two of the league's top clubs meeting head on with play-off points at stake, it certainly has the ingredients.






The editor of "Programme Monthly & Football Collectable" magazine explains the joys – and financial rewards – of collecting football programmes.

In the last article, we looked at the distinction between commonplace and rare (and therefore more valuable) programmes from a similar era. A classic example of this is programmes from the first ever League Cup competition, in 1960/61. Due to the scarcity of some of these issues, the historical significance of clubs' first ever League Cup ties, and the unusual, abbreviated nature of some of the programmes, this has become a popular set to collect. As a result, prices are higher than for the equivalent League matches from that season, and in cases of genuine scarcity, markedly so.

For more than a decade, the Football League had gazed over the border in envy at the success, and large attendances, of the Scottish League Cup. In 1960, it was decided to introduce a knock-out competition, primarily as a fund-raiser for lower division clubs. The country's top clubs immediately decided not to enter. Champions Burnley did, but the next four highest placed clubs in the previous season's League Championship, Wolves, Spurs, West Brom and Sheffield Wednesday, declined the invitation, as did Arsenal.



Played in midweek, there was an immediate problem with the absence of floodlights at several clubs' grounds, and there was some confusion between first and second round fixtures, some of which were played simultaneously. Nottingham Forest, for instance, described their opening match in the competition, against Halifax Town at The City Ground on 6th October, as a "First Round" tie on the front cover of their programme, but it was in fact a second round match, both clubs having received byes in the first round.

First Division Forest was one of several competing clubs who had yet to install floodlights. However, in an attempt to bring in the crowds, they arranged the match on "Goose Fair Thursday", and were rewarded with a decent crowd, which justified their decision to produce a full-sized, 16 page programme.

Bournemouth's 1-1 draw with Crewe Alexandra in the second round had a mid-day kick off and was watched by just 3,208 loyal

supporters (less than half their previous average). This programme is harder to obtain than the Gillingham v Preston 1-1 draw, which was also played on a midweek afternoon. Unlike the first match, the replay at Deepdale took place under floodlights. Preston (who won 3-0) issued a single sheet programme, as was their practice for reserve games and the occasional re-arranged League match, and fewer of these single card programmes have survived.

The second round saw the debut of Manchester United in the competition, and the programme for their 1-1 draw at Exeter City is much sought after by United collectors, while Leeds United's 3-1 replay win at Blackpool saw a single sheet produced by the Tangerines. This is now very rare, and fetches a considerable sum when it appears on the market.

I know it's not just the Premier League players, it happens right through the footballing pyramid in various degrees.

What I do find quite humbling are those players that simply turn their back on football, not through a career ending-injury but quite simply because they no longer feel comfortable in the football environment for whatever reason. As fans, we look up to our boys and, to us, they are almost god-like. They are the heroes we worship on Saturdays (and mid-week games) they represent our town, city and sometimes country. So why, if they have it all – or so it seems – would any football player simply walk away from the great game?

Back in 2008, LA Galaxy player Ty Harden decided that he could do more than just play soccer (he



meant football), so he turned his back on the game to 'help and do things for others'. Sounds strange perhaps but don't most of us get to work some days to think 'there must be more to life'? You'd think making it as a professional football player would be enough for some, wouldn't you? I'd certainly have settled for that career had it not been for the knee twinge which sadly prevented me making it any further than the Sunday morning sides' subs bench (it may well have been that I was rubbish, but I prefer the knee twinge story).

Even stranger than the Ty Harden tale is that of Portsmouth striker Rory Allen, who in 2002 decided that rather than be a Pro footballer, he preferred to hang up his boots and join the 'Barmy Army', following the England cricket team around the world. Perhaps, in both these cases, there was a little more to it than each player let on – who knows why they'd do it?

Let's hope all eleven of our lads are 100% up for it today. Now we need to do our bit and show them that we're 100% behind them!

SO underrated were his side by some back in the summer, Steve Burr has made it clear there is no pressure on his squad as they battle for the play-offs. Over at Luton Town, things aren't as relaxed.

Fair play to the new boss himself, who presided over a 0-0 draw at home to Barrow in midweek – he knows his remit. He told the official Luton Town website: "I think the most important thing at the moment is getting this good group of players performing to the best of their ability - that's my main aim.

"I've got ten games now to get all those players firing on all cylinders and get the best XI in my head for the play-offs to hopefully win promotion."


Brabin at least has another ally in the battle to satiate crushing expectation – the omens. Harford's departure left the Hatters with upheaval in the management office when they came to Aggborough last season. Luton surprisingly parted company with Richard Money earlier this week, as they set assistant Gary Brabin a ten match task to deliver promotion, although, in reality, there seems too much ground to make up on Crawley at the summit, and they will hope that the play-offs offer better fortune than last season.

Back in the close season, the side which reached the play-off semi-final was refreshed with a number of new additions.

Kevin Pilkington added competition in goal following his arrival from Notts County, whilst Dan Gleeson switched from Cambridge United alongside Zdenek Kroca who arrived from Tescoma Zlin in the Czech Republic. In midfield, Andy Drury made the short journey from Stevenage, but was sold on to Ipswich at the end of the transfer window. The array of attacking talent was augmented by Cambridge United's Danny Crow and Bedford Town's Dan Walker.

With the season underway, former Ilkeston striker Amari Morgan-Smith signed for the club, whilst midfielders Alex Lawless and Charlie Henry joined on loan from York and Newport County respectively ahead of a full-time move in January, as well as Barrow forward Jason Walker. In the New Year, defender Luke Graham signed on loan from Kettering, whilst winger Robbie Willmott made a permanent move from Cambridge United, and subsequently fellow midfielder Paul Carden has signed temporarily from the Abbey Stadium club. Lloyd Owusu provided yet another option in attack following his return to England from Australia.

It was a good start to the season, with

three straight wins. Kroca and Matthew Barnes-Homer produced a 2-1 home win over Altrincham, whilst Barnes-Homer scored in an excellent 3-1 win at Kettering, and Town hit three more goals away from home as Barnes-Homer, Claude Gnakpa and Tom Craddock secured a 3-0 victory at Fleetwood. Kroca secured a 1-1 home draw with Newport County, but a surprise 3-1 reverse at Tamworth was followed by a 1-1 home draw with Hayes & Yeading United, in which Drury equalised.

September started with a 2-0 loss at Grimsby, but the rest of the month was positive as Drury and George Pilkington set up a 2-0 home success over Cambridge United, which Pilkington, Kroca and Barnes-Homer earned an important 3-0 home win against AFC Wimbledon. Gnakpa and Jake Howells claimed a 2-2 draw at Darlington, before a 1-0 defeat at Gateshead. However, a debut goal from Morgan-Smith, alongside Crow meant the slide was halted as Town stood in sixth spot.

October got underway with a 1-0 victory at Barrow through Barnes-Homer, ahead of a significant 2-1 home defeat to Crawley, but the trip to Eastbourne Borough yielded a 4-2 win through Crow's

brace, as well as Pilkington and Barnes-Homer. Back at Kenilworth Road, Forest Green Rovers were humbled 6-1 with two more from Crow, and contributions from Drury, Morgan-Smith, Barnes-Homer and Walker. In the FA Cup, a local derby with St.Albans was won 4-0 through Morgan-Smith's treble and one from Crow, and the month was rounded off by a 3-1 home victory against Bath, as Crow, Pilkington and Taiwo Atieno scored.

Moving into November, and Barnes-Homer's equaliser prevented an upset in the 1-1 FA Cup draw at Corby, but a 1-0 Blue Square Premier defeat followed at Wrexham, corrected by a 1-0 success at Altrincham, secured by Lawless. Progress was earned in the Cup as Corby were beaten 4-2 through Barnes-Homer, Atieno and Gnakpa. The goals continued to flow as Histon were seen off 5-1 by Gnakpa, Howells, Walker, Drury and Atieno, whilst Drury levelled twice in an impressive 2-2 FA Cup draw at Charlton. The replay was lost 3-1, before the Trophy opened with a 0-0 home draw with Welling and a 2-1 away win, thanks to Walker and Lawless in the closing minutes.

An undefeated January saw the Bedfordshire side move to within two points of the top, although Crawley had two games in hand. Barnes-Homer scored twice, alongside Gnakpa in the 3-0 home success over Rushden, with the latter

netting the winner in the 1-0 success at Hayes. 0-0 draws were collected at Bath and AFC Wimbledon, with advancement in the Trophy through a 4-0 home victory against Uxbridge in which Atieno and Adam Watkins both scored twice. They hit five without reply against York, as Drury, Gnakpa, Owusu, Kroca and Atieno scored, whilst Crow and Gnakpa brought a recovery from two goals down in the 2-2 home draw with Gateshead. Gnakpa continued his fine form by scoring the winner in the 1-0 home victory against Grimsby.


He scored for the fourth game in a row in a 4-0 home win over Darlington, alongside Owusu's brace and Lawless' goal, whilst Graham scored in the 1-0 home victory against Gloucester City in the Trophy. As the Hatters closed in on Wembley, league results slipped as a 3-1 home defeat was suffered to Fleetwood, whilst Willmott scored in a 1-1 draw at Newport. However, a 1-0 win at Guiseley, thanks to Barnes-Homer, put the Bedfordshire club into the Trophy semi-final.

Moving into March, Owusu was on target as Luton won 1-0 at Forest Green, but a lead provided by Barnes-Homer was lost in the 1-1 home draw with Kidderminster. Owusu and Barnes-Homer combined in the 2-0 home success against Tamworth; however, the first leg of the

Trophy semi-final brought a 1-0 reverse at Mansfield. A 0-0 draw at Cambridge United divided the two legs, with Owusu levelling the tie at Kenilworth Road, but a late extra time leveller denied the Hatters a penalty shoot-out. Back in the Blue Square Premier, Willmott netted the winner as they won 1-0 at Rushden, but a shock 2-1 loss at Southport ended Money's spell at the club.

THE MANAGER



GARY BRABIN

Brabin took up the reins as Manager of Luton Town on Monday of this week following the departure of Richard Money by mutual consent.

Originally brought to the club as Chief Scout at the time Money was appointed manager in October 2009, Brabin was reassigned in the new role as assistant manager in the summer of 2010 before making the step up.

After playing over 275 times in League football as a tough-tackling midfielder, Brabin moved into management firstly with Southport - guiding them to the Conference North Play-offs - before moving south to manage Cambridge United in 2008.

In his first - and eventually only - season at the Abbey Stadium he guided the L's to the Blue Square Premier Play-off final after finishing runners-up to champions Burton Albion, but lost to Torquay United at Wembley.

Despite that set-back Brabin was awarded the BSP Manager of the Year award before behind the scenes differences at the Abbey led to him leaving the club in July 2009 before arriving at Kenilworth Road.

His first game in charge was a 0-0 draw with Barrow at Kenilworth Road on Tuesday night.

Zdenek KROČA
Centre-half who impressed in assured display alongside George Pilkington in two pre-season fixtures in 2010 to earn a one-year contract. Kroča made 169 league appearances belt in 10 years with hometown club Tescoma Zlín in his native Czech Republic. Last season the imposing 6ft 5in defender was in fine, commanding form, scoring four times in 27 league appearances.



Mark TYLER

Tyler is a hugely experienced goalkeeper who signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road in June 2009 after leaving Peterborough. Mark made 483 appearances in 15 years at London Road and was rewarded for his loyalty with a testimonial against Liverpool in 2007. The former Bury man is an ex-England Youth International.



George PILKINGTON

Having began his career as an Everton trainee, Pilkington joined Port Vale in June 2003 and went on to make more than 200 appearances for the club before joining Luton in 2008, an injury-hit first season still ending with a Johnstone's Paint Trophy winners' medal. His impeccable form on the pitch last term led to him winning a string of end-of-season awards.



Dan GLEESON

Tall and athletic defender, primarily a right-back, Gleeson signed for the Hatters in the summer of 2010 from his home town club Cambridge United. A product of the U's academy, Gleeson made his debut at 18 and soon became a regular at the Abbey Stadium. One of the best right-backs outside the Football League, Gleeson's performances have seen him rewarded with seven England C caps.



Jake HOWELLS
The young winger, who can also play at left-back, came through the ranks at Kenilworth Road and made his first team debut in May 2008. In his first season as a pro, Howells made huge strides with impressive performances on the left-side of midfield, ending the 2009/10 campaign with six goals, including his first senior goal in the incredible 4-3 win over Cambridge in September.



Robbie WILLMOTT

Robbie is a Harlow-born winger who penned an 18-month contract with the Hatters in January 2011 after hitting ten goals for Cambridge United, for whom he made a senior debut at just 17. Capable of playing on either wing or behind the front two, Willmott came through the ranks at the Abbey Stadium and wowed the home faithful with his pace, dribbling, close control and eye for goal.



Claude GNAKPA

A defender capable of playing centre back or full back, who joined on a free transfer in August 2008, Claude plied his trade across Europe with Montpellier HSC, Racing de Santander, Deportivo Alaves and FC Vaduz of Liechtenstein before spells in England with Swindon, and Peterborough, winning promotion with the latter. A favourite with the Kenilworth Road crowd.

Keith KEANE
Having made his debut as a 16-year-old in November 2003, Keane is another product of the youth system who regularly appeared for the Republic of Ireland at schoolboy level. He joined the Hatters at the age of nine, and made a rapid progression through the club's centre of excellence and youth teams. Truly versatile, he's quickly racked up around 200 games for the club.



Alex LAWLESS

A former Wales Under-21 mid-fielder who signed in November 2010 initially on-loan from York before a permanent deal went through in January. He only joined York at the start of last season, impressing then boss Martin Foyle enough to prise the 25-year-old away from Forest Green where performances in a variety of positions had also caught the eye of League scouts.

The Ghanaian international arrived at Kenilworth Road after a spell in Australia with Adelaide United and signed a deal with the Town until the end of the season. The front-man enjoyed a prolific career in England prior to his move Down Under having netted 144 times in 350 starts for a number of Football League clubs.

- **Adam WATKINS** - Mid-fielder, capable of playing in attack, who signed professional forms in June 2010.
- **Charlie HENRY** - Signed from Newport before Christmas, netted nine as the Exiles won promotion last season.
- **Danny CROW** - A nippy poacher of a striker, Crow joined the Hatters from Cambridge United in May 2010.
- **Amari MORGAN-SMITH** - Striker or wide man who arrived at Kenilworth Road as a free agent following a two-year spell at Ilkeston.
- **Jason WALKER** - England C international striker signed in November from Barrow. Netted in last year's FA Trophy Final.

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS looks at Luton Town's leading lights...

CLASSIC CAMPAIGN 1987-88

Ray Harford plotted Luton Town's 1988 Littlewoods Cup final triumph. Danny Wilson replaced Peter Nicholas in midfield, while Micky Weir arrived from Hibernian and Mike Newell moved to Leicester. The Hatters won 5-2 at Oxford and Ian Allinson was signed from Stoke in October, with Luton losing just twice in 12 matches including a 7-4 win in the return match against Oxford, finishing ninth in the top-flight. They defeated Wigan 5-2, Coventry 3-1, Ipswich 1-0, Bradford City 2-0 and Oxford 3-1 in the Littlewoods Cup before beating Arsenal 3-2 in the final. Luton were also FA Cup semi-finalists and Simod Cup finalists.

MANAGING TO SUCCEED DAVID PLEAT

Articulate manager David Pleat guided Luton Town to the Second Division title in 1981-82. A former winger, he played for Nottingham Forest, Luton, Shrewsbury, Exeter and Peterborough before becoming Nuneaton's player-boss. He rejoined Luton as coach in July 1972 and became manager in January 1978, guiding the Hatters to the FA Cup semi-finals in 1984-85. Taking charge of Spurs in May 1986, he led them to the 1987 FA Cup final, then managed Leicester City before rejoining Luton in June 1991. He took the Hatters to the FA Cup semi-finals again in 1993-94, leaving in June 1995. Now working in the media...



FAB FOUR

BRUCE RIOCH

Influential mid-fielder Bruce Rioch was capped 24 times by Scotland after leaving Luton Town. Signing professional for Luton in September 1964, he starred in the 1967-68 Fourth Division title triumph and netted 46 goals in 149 League games prior to joining Aston Villa for £100,000 in July 1969. He was a key figure in their 1971-72 Third Division title success and moved to Derby County in February 1974, helping to win the League Championship in 1974-75. He played for Everton, Derby again and Torquay, since managing Middlesbrough, Millwall, Bolton Wanderers, Arsenal, Norwich City and Wigan Athletic.



RICKY HILL

England international mid-fielder Ricky Hill was 'Player of the Year' when Luton Town won the Second Division title in 1981-82. Signing professional at Kenilworth Road in May 1976, he was 'Player of the Year' again in 1982-83 and starred as Luton were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85. He featured in two consecutive Littlewoods Cup finals including the 1988 Wembley triumph and netted 54 goals in 436 League games before moving to Le Havre in July 1989. Reuniting with David Pleat at Leicester City in August 1990 and later as a coach at Sheffield Wednesday and Spurs, he briefly rejoined Luton as manager.




BRIAN STEIN

England international striker Brian Stein scored twice in Luton Town's 1988 Littlewoods Cup final triumph. Moving to Kenilworth Road from Edgware Town in October 1977, he was leading marksman in Luton's 1981-82 Second Division success and also starred as they were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85 and 1987-88. He joined French side Caen in July 1988 and moved via Annecy back to Luton in July 1991. Voted 'Player of the Year' for the second time in 1991-92, he netted 130 goals in 427 League games overall for the Hatters before joining Barnet in August 1992. His younger brother Mark also played for Luton.

MALCOLM MACDONALD

Ace marksman Malcolm Macdonald was capped 14 times by England after leaving Luton Town. Initially with Tonbridge, he joined Fulham in August 1968 and moved to Kenilworth Road in July 1969. He was Luton's top scorer in two consecutive seasons including the 1969-70 promotion success and netted 49 goals in 88 League games before being sold to Newcastle United for £180,000 in May 1971. An FA Cup finalist in 1974, he joined Arsenal for £33,000 in August 1976 and was an FA Cup finalist again in 1978 before injury ended his career. He managed Fulham and Huddersfield Town and has since worked in the media.

HARRIERS 1-2 LUTON TOWN

Harriers were defeated by two Luton goals in the last fifteen minutes, including a last-minute winner, that left them ruing missed chances in a dramatic and controversial first half.

The first half was initially good for Harriers, the visitors allowing them plenty of time and space to knock the ball around. It was Luton, however, who had the first good chance to open the scoring; Chris McPhee, still in the heart of the defence in an unchanged Harriers side, made a poor clearance that was played back in to Ben Wright who hit his shot on the turn over the bar.

A minute later Harriers were ahead; Duane Courtney's cross from the right found Matt Barnes-Homer at the near post on the edge of the penalty area, he chested the ball down and spun and hit a low shot across Mark Tyler in The Hatters' goal to record his seventh goal of the season.

Harriers should have built upon their lead, and could have had the game wrapped up long before the drama kicked-off; Lee Baker's cross from the left was flicked on by Barnes-Homer just out of the reach of Robbie Matthews shortly after the goal. On the half-hour Barnes-Homer's cross from the right picked out Brian Smikle whose goal-bound header was well saved by Tyler and when Barnes-Homer fired the loose ball back across goal there was nobody there to apply the finishing touch. Five minutes before the interval Baker's corner from

the right was not cleared and McPhee saw his shot cleared off the line.

Moments later the game was turned upon its head. Luton midfielder Rossi Jarvis made a needless, reckless, challenge on McPhee on the touchline near midfield and was shown the red card. McPhee hobbled on for a short while but had to be substituted by Gavin Caines. In stoppage time at the end of the half Harriers themselves were reduced to ten men when Matthews was adjudged to have stamped on Tyler as he leapt over him as the keeper saved at his feet, the referee possibly influenced by the reaction of Tyler and the baying Luton fans just a few yards away behind the goal.

After the interval Luton began to take control of the game and kept Harriers penned back inside their own half for extended periods of the game. Ten minutes in, Adam Newton's cross from the right was headed wide of the far post by Asa Hall. At the other end Smikle had a great chance to double the lead on the hour, set up by Dean Bennett he lashed at his shot and blasted it over the bar from a narrow angle.

Freddie Murray set up another chance for Luton as the visitors continued to press but his cross from the left was headed weakly at Dean Coleman by substitute Ryan Charles. It was no surprise, then, when Town drew level with fifteen minutes still to play; a cross from the left was not cleared properly and fell to Newton who hit a blistering volley that gave Coleman no chance before going in off the bar.

Despite being pegged back for most of the half it seemed that Harriers would at least hold on to take a point but in the last minute they were sunk when Charles met Newton's cross from the right and lifted it past Coleman to send the visiting support into raptures.




