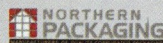

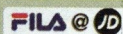

Welcome Back and a special welcome to Luton and in particular Gary Brabin who I and everyone here at Haig Avenue know rather well.

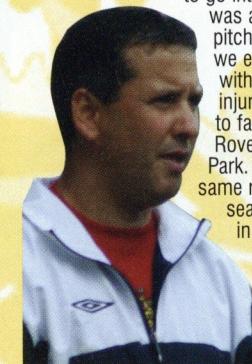

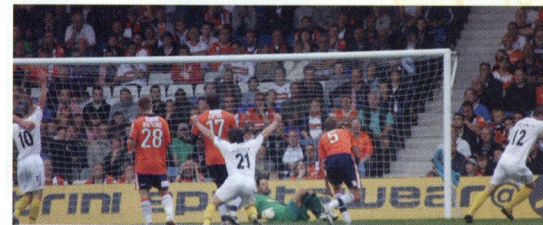


FROM THE EDITOR ROB URWIN

I'm sure given the two recent results at Kenilworth Road the Luton fans will understand why we would prefer to focus on the match here last season!

Kettering are due to visit us next on February 4th but two days later face yet another winding up order brought by HMRC (nothing to do with me-honest) we could face the scenario of beating Kettering but then just 48 hours later the three points would be taken away. It's this aspect of NL Football that I don't like and it's time for something serious to be done to put it right. It's the true followers of these clubs I feel sorry for. I know how I felt in 1979 when it looked like we wouldn't have a club to support, it isn't a very nice feeling at all. There is an element of hypocrisy in the Darlington situation. None of their supporters were complaining when George Reynolds was building them a stadium that was way too big for their status but now looking back they realise what a massive mistake it was. Filled only once...for an Elton John concert it has been the biggest white elephant of all time.

The big question is what happens to our Club Record eight away wins on the bounce if either of these clubs go pop? Strictly speaking the record will be taken away but I for one will never forget it and in my sentimental eyes that record will still stand. Nobody will take away the feelings we all had at Gateshead, Kettering and Stockport as the record took shape so as far as this writer is concerned even if the games are expunged we broke a club record!!

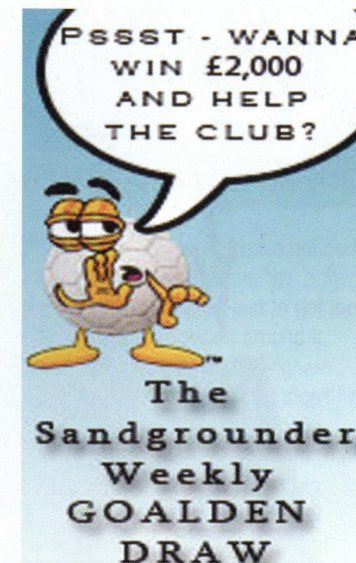
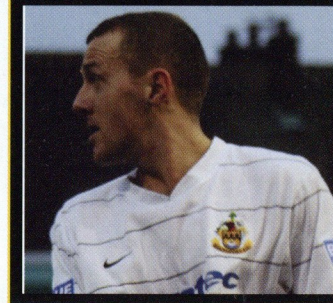

TALKS TO AARON TURNER



2011 will go down as one of the most eventful years in the history of Southport Football Club and within 15 hours of this year the roller-coaster has well and truly not been derailed.

There wasn't too much for the home fans to cheer about here on New Years Day but maybe the brightest note was before the match with the return to pre-match training for Aaron Turner. You may be forgiven to think 'Aaron who?' after everything that has happened since he was carried off late on the final day of the season at Kettering with anterior cruciate ligament damage to his right knee.

At half time against Fleetwood Town I had a chat with the Yorkshireman. "That was my first training before the match. I've been doing it (training) over the last couple of weeks, it's going slow but it's getting there." Anyone that

witnessed the midfielder train that day would have noticed it's still very early days in Aaron's rehabilitation. "It's only light running at the moment, the basic stuff, just to get the knee back working again and all the muscles around it."

We then remembered what happened at Rockingham Road. "I thought I had just gone over on my leg, I didn't think I had done anything to my knee. Then the physio came on and said it's worse than you think, I got into the dressing room and that was it; my knee was like a big balloon."

The 27-year-old made a big impact at the end of last season, making 19 starts despite only making his debut in February. He ended it in the worst of fashion but now targets the summer to be ready for selection again.

MEET OUR VISITORS... LUTON TOWN



Gary Brabin, John-Paul Kiscock, Godfrey Poku and Dan Walker all currently with Luton have all had an influence at Haig Avenue this season.

Results began to pick-up in December and a FA Cup second round replay victory over Nottingham Forest ensured the Hatters faced another cup clash with Liverpool at Kenilworth Road.

On Boxing Day the Hatters were involved in a highly-controversial match at Bristol Rovers where incredibly they held out to record a 1-1 draw despite having to play half the match with nine men and the last 13 minutes with only eight men on the pitch following three sending offs.

And in the last match of 2007 we saw the first away win of the campaign recorded courtesy of a last-minute strike from Matthew Spring.

With the administrator in charge however, the New Year saw the beginning of player sales which would go on to affect the team's performances later in the season.

But firstly the small matter of a game against Liverpool at Kenilworth Road in the third round of the FA Cup had to be settled and after going behind to a Peter Crouch goal, a John Arne Riise own goal 13 minutes from earned the Hatters a much needed money-spinning replay at Anfield.

At this point the administrator had been working on cutting the spiralling wage bill at the club and as a result club captain Chris Coyne was sold to Colchester United and midfielder David Edwards - only signed by Blackwell in the summer - was sold to Wolves.

Colossal Polish centre-half Jaroslaw Fojut returned to Bolton after his loan spell expired and would not return as the Hatters were unable to sign anybody while still in administration, which left the squad decimated, especially in defence.

Blackwell then decided to call it quits by saying he would quit the club following the replay at Liverpool.

Before the cup replay at Anfield it was announced that the administrator had chosen Luton Town 2020 Ltd as the preferred bidders to take over the club.

The consortium was headed by famous Hatters fan and TV presenters Nick Owen and included former Hatters legends Steve Foster and Godfrey Ingram as well as other influential businessmen all of which were Town supporters.

Buoyed by this news it made for an extra-special night at Anfield where almost 6,000 Luton fans out-sung the

famous Kop for long periods before, during and after the game.

The team held on until the final minute of added on time in the first half before Ryan Babel struck the opening goal of the game to break the Hatters' hearts.

A Steven Gerrard hat-trick and a goal from Sami Hyypia in the second half cumulated in a 5-0 defeat but despite the scoreline the Hatters performance was far from embarrassing.

That was to be manager Kevin Blackwell's last match in charge of the Town as the administrator moved quickly to install legend Mick Harford as his replacement but despite a spirited display the team lost 1-0 in his first game in charge away to Leyton Orient on 19th January.

With the team struggling to find any form and with young players low on confidence, the side failed to win again until a 3-0 home victory over Oldham Athletic on 15th March, by which time they were already 12 points from safety.

But after picking five points from the following three games to give them hope the Town went onto lose all of their final six matches and relegation to League 2 was confirmed following the 2-1 home defeat to Brighton on 12th April.

With the new owners set to take full control of the club in the summer the only problem the Hatters prepared themselves for would have been beginning their League 2 campaign with 15 points

deducted for failure to agree to a CVA (Company Voluntary Agreement).

However the Football League decided that because the club had been in administration for the third time in nine years, they would punish them further by deducting a further five points.

But worse news followed.

The club were still being investigated by the Football Association for the past financial irregularities that had been made public during Mike Newell's time at the club two years previously.

As a result the club had a further 10 points docked by the FA which meant the club had to start the season with an incredible 30 point penalty.

Both Bournemouth and Rotherham suffered a similar fate for recent spells in administration and were hit with 17 point deductions by the Football League.

Once the club was officially taken over a week before the season started, the club only had six professionals on the books leading up to the home game with Port Vale.

Harford though pulled off one of the biggest transfer coups in the club's history when it was announced that former club captain Kevin Nicholls was resigning for the club.

Nicholls was joined by 10 other news faces either signed on a free transfer or brought in on-loan, as the manager pieced together a team fit for the campaign ahead.

Despite a slow and inconsistent beginning to the season the Hatters ended 2008 just one point away from wiping out the 30 point deficit and were only 15 points away from safety.

The season was also brought to life by the club's run in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy which was won in superb style at Wembley with a 3-2 victory over Scunthorpe United in April.

However, the burden of the points deductions proved too much to shoulder and relegation out of the Football League was confirmed following a goalless draw against Chesterfield on Easter Monday.

It means the club will start life in the Blue Square Premier in 2009/10 after 89 years in the Football League.

In their first season in non-league football the Town finished second behind champions Stevenage but lost in the Play-Offs at the semi-final stage to York City.

During that campaign Richard Money took over from Mick Harford where the Town also reached the third round of the FA Cup.

The Hatters again suffered Play-Off heartache in 2010/11 and again there was a change in manager - Gary Brabin taking over from Money in March.

After finishing third this time around and beating Wrexham in the semi-finals the Town lost on penalties to AFC Wimbledon in the Promotion Final at the City of Manchester Stadium after the game ended goalless after 120 minutes.

Kevin Blackwell signed eight players during the summer of 2007 in preparation for a tilt at promotion back to the Championship.

During the first month of the season it seemed that the Hatters stood a decent chance of doing so, after four wins from their first five league and cup fixtures including a 3-0 victory over Premier League Sunderland at Kenilworth Road.

However form began to tail off and had yet to win away from home but worse news was to follow when the club were deducted 10 points for falling to administration in November.

From being in a comfortable mid-table position the Hatters found themselves deep in a relegation battle but the first match following the points deduction the team rallied themselves to beat Southend 1-0 at Kenilworth Road.

PLAYER PROFILES

MARK TYLER

Hugely experienced goalkeeper who signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road in June 2009 to become Mick Harford's fifth signing of the summer following his release from Peterborough United. Mark made 483 appearances in 15 years at London Road and was rewarded for his loyalty with a testimonial against Liverpool in 2007.

After falling down the pecking order at Posh he found first team opportunities hard to come by and in 2008/09 he was loaned out to League 2 Bury where he made 11 appearances for the Shakers. A former England Youth international, Tyler was handed the number one shirt by the Hatters boss who admitted he'd failed in an attempt to sign the stopper the previous summer. After a hugely successful two years between the sticks at Kenilworth Road, Mark signed a new contract in the summer of 2011.



KEVIN PILKINGTON

Vastly experienced goalkeeper who joined the Hatters in May 2010 after his release from Notts County.

Pilkington began his career with Manchester United playing six times in the Premier League under Sir Alex Ferguson.

During his six years at Old Trafford Pilkington enjoyed loan spells at Rochdale, Rotherham and Celtic before a two-year stay at Port Vale. After 23 league appearances for the Valiants, he was on the move once more, with Aberystwyth Town and Wigan Athletic his next two ports of call. However, he found stability at his next club, Mansfield, joining the Stags in 2000 and went onto feature 167 times in league action over the next five years.

In 2005 the Hitchin-born stopper made the short hop down the M1 to sign for Notts County and another five year stay resulted in him making 141 appearances at Meadow Lane.

However, Notts began flashing the cash at the start of the 2009/10 campaign with goalkeeper Kasper Schmeichel one of many high-profile arrivals.

Frozen out of the County team, and with Mark Tyler injured, Pilkington joined the Hatters on-loan in November and went onto make 11 appearance between the sticks whilst at Kenilworth Road before injury curtailed his stay.

But when the Magpies released him in the summer of 2010, Money was quick to snap up the veteran permanently, giving the Town the choice of two excellent goalkeepers.

GEORGE PILKINGTON

Highly experienced defender who joined the club on a free transfer in August 2008. Having began his career as an Everton trainee, Pilkington joined Port Vale in June 2003, after a loan spell at Exeter City. Having started 223 league games for the Valiants, the highly-regarded defender has been named Player of the Year twice.

Injury frustrated the centre-half in his first season at Kenilworth Road in 2008/09 but he still managed to pick-up a Johnstone's Paint Trophy winners' medal.

Pilkington hit the headlines for his goalscoring exploits in the Town's first season in the Conference, twice scoring braces in early season victories over Mansfield and Crawley.

His impeccable form on the pitch led to him winning a string of end-of-season awards and underlined his loyalty to the Hatters by signing a new contract at the end of the 2009/10 campaign.

DAN GLEESON

Tall and athletic defender, primarily a right-back, Gleeson signed for the Hatters in the summer of 2010 from his home town club Cambridge United. A product of the U's academy, Gleeson made his debut at 18 and soon became a regular at the Abbey Stadium making 61 league appearances before Notts County snapped up his signature in 2006.

Gleeson only lasted a season at Meadow Lane, featuring 17 times before he was back at the Abbey, firstly on-loan before resigning permanently in 2007. Recognised as one of the best right-backs outside the Football League, Gleeson's performances have seen him rewarded with seven England C caps.

GREG TAYLOR

Left-back signed from Darlington in November 2011 who made his Town debut in the 1-1 draw at Cambridge United. Started his career as a junior with Northampton before he signed for Kettering Town. He then joined Darlo, linking up with boss Mark Cooper at the Darlington Arena.

ALEX LACEY

Up-and-coming centre-half who made his first team debut as a 17-year-old in the FA Trophy first round tie against Welling, earning the man-of-the-match award for an excellent performance. Signed a professional contract to remain at Kenilworth Road until the end of the 2011/12 season.

ROBBIE WILLMOTT

Harlow-born winger who penned an 18-month contract with the Hatters in January 2011 after hitting 10 goals for Cambridge United. Capable of playing on either wing or behind the front two, Willmott came through the ranks at the Abbey Stadium and wowed the home faithful with his pace, dribbling, close control and eye for goal. His performances for the U's youth team saw him break into the senior squad, making his debut as a 17-year-old in September 2007. After signing his first professional contract two months later, the midfielder was mainly used as an impact substitute during 2007/08 but continued to impress: eight goals in his first season as a pro followed in 2008/09 while his level of performance and his assist tally soared last season as the U's finished in mid-table. But the youngster's talents during this campaign have really come to fore. Weighing in with 10 goals and eight assists from just 29 starts for Martin Ling's side, Willmott's turn of foot and delivery from set-pieces has also become a highly sought-after commodity.

JAKE HOWELLS

The young winger, who can also play at left-back or in central midfield, came through the ranks at Kenilworth Road and made his first team debut as a second half substitute in May 2008. He made his full debut in the Hatters colours away at Bradford City in October 2008.

After making 36 appearances for the Hatters in the 2008/09 the England C international was rewarded for his efforts with a professional contract in May.

In his first season as a pro, Howells made huge strides with impressive performances on the left-side of midfield, ending the 2009/10 campaign with six goals, including his first senior goal in the incredible 4-3 win over Cambridge in September 2009.

GODFREY POKU

A player we know all about!

Tenacious defensive midfielder who signed together with JJ O'Donnell from Blue Square South outfit St Albans City in January 2010 on an 18-month contract.

A tough-tackling and no-nonsense midfielder, the Town beat off competition from several Football League clubs for his signature. He featured and impressed in the Hatters' reserves in 2009/10 and was an unused substitutes in the Blue Square Premier but made his debut as a substitute in the 1-0 win at Barrow in October 2010.

ADAM WATKINS

Young midfielder, capable of playing in attack, who signed professional forms at Kenilworth Road in June 2010. A self-confessed Hatters fan, he made his first team bow in a 1-0 defeat at Southampton in the FA Cup third round in January 2010. He broke into the first team squad during 2010/11 campaign scoring twice on his full debut in the 4-0 FA Trophy win over Uxbridge. Watkins then scored his first league goal on his first league start in the 3-1 win over Braintree in August 2011.

ALEX LAWLESS

Former Wales Under-21 midfielder who signed in November 2010 initially on-loan from York City before a permanent deal went through in January 2011. A star of the Minstermen's campaign last season which saw them lose in the Promotion Final to Oxford United, Lawless featured prominently in all four of the meetings with the Hatters last term at the heart of midfield. He only joined York at the start of last season, impressing then boss Martin Foyle enough to prise the 25-year-old away from Forest Green Rovers where performances in a variety of positions - in defence and across midfield - had also caught the eye of Football League scouts. It's not just the 150 games experience in the Conference that Lawless has with Forest Green and York that he has on his CV. A former Cardiff City scholar he took-up non-league



football in Wales before he was snapped up to earn his first professional contract with Premier League Fulham in 2003. Without featuring for the Cottagers it was off to South West to Torquay United for the young Lawless but after just a year and 16 appearances at Plainmoor he was on the move again, to Forest Green in 2006 and in his three seasons he helped the Gloucestershire consolidate in the Conference. Arriving at Bootham Crescent in the summer of 2009, local media announced him merely as a "utility player" but that was far from the case, and alongside Neil Barrett he forged a formidable partnership in the centre of City's midfield, changing the Yorkshire club's relegation worries from one season to making them just one game away from promotion the next.

JAMES DANCE

Energetic, tricky winger who joined the Hatters from Crawley Town in July 2011. Able to play on either flank or as a central striker, Dance began his career as a trainee at Birmingham City but, after being released, he made his name in non-league circles in the West Midlands before catching the eye of Kettering Town in 2009. After a string of fine performances on the wing for the Poppies - including a man-of-the-match performance against the Town in August 2009 - he signed for Crawley in January 2011. However, after picking up a Blue Square Bet Premier winners' medal last term, Dance found himself out of the Red Devils' starting XI and, after the Hatters' bid was accepted by the League 2 club, the Coleshill-born man was quick to agree a two-year deal.

JOHN PAUL KISSCOCK

Creative attacking midfielder John Paul signed a two-year contract for an undisclosed fee joining from Southport in August 2011. The former England Under-16 and Under-18 international began his career as a trainee at Premier League Everton. He was a regular in the Toffees' youth and reserve teams where he surpassed Wayne Rooney's record as the youngest ever player to feature for their second-string. In January 2008, he signed on loan for then Scottish Premier League Gretna, earning rave reviews before he returned to Goodison Park. With first team opportunities limited - despite being named as an unused substitute nine times in the Premier League - he was released at the end of the 2008/09 campaign before he signed Hamilton Academical. A short spell with Accies followed and, after attempting to find a new club, he dropped down to Cheshire county league level in a bid to resurrect his career. His performances for firstly Newton, and then Formby, alerted the attention of Southport manager Liam Watson who signed the Liverpoolian in December 2010, where he had an immediate effect for the Yellows. He scored his first goal for the club in a 5-1 win over Gateshead in January and his dynamic performances continued to catch the eye, none more so than in two appearances against the Hatters, especially in Port's 2-1 win at Haig Avenue in March. He started the 2011/12 campaign where he left off last season, scoring a fantastic free-kick in the Sandgrounders' 2-2 draw with Lincoln City on the opening day which remains a contender for the Southport Goal Of The Season, then having a hand in the Southport goal at Kenilworth Road and set-up Tony Gray's goal in the Yellows' 3-1 defeat to Gateshead before his move to LU4 three days later.

DANNY CROW

A nippy poacher of a striker, Crow joined the Hatters from Cambridge United in May 2010 following the expiry of his contract at the Abbey Stadium. The front man started his career as a trainee with Norwich City and made his senior bow in the Premier League for the Canaries in December 2004. A loan spell at Northampton followed towards the end of the 2004/05 season before he was released by Norwich and signed for Peterborough in the summer of 2005, notching 17 goals in his debut season at London Road. Following a short loan spell at Notts County, Crow was released by Posh and was snapped up by Cambridge in September 2008.



The energetic forward's strike-rate of 22 goals in 43 league starts won him many admirers and his 19 goals during 2009/10 saw him scoop the U's online Player of the Year award.

AMARI MORGAN-SMITH

Striker or wide man who arrived at Kenilworth Road as a free agent following a two-year spell at Ilkeston Town. He put pen to paper on a two-year deal after two years with the Blue Square Bet North side in which he scored 34 goals in 77 starts. The fast and skilful frontman's impressive form for the Robins earned him a call-up to the England C squad at the end of last season, earning his first cap against the Republic of Ireland in May. Wolverhampton-born Morgan-Smith started his career as a trainee with Wolves. He then signed for Crewe and then Stockport where he made one Football League appearance before moving to Ilkeston. Before the 2009/10 season began the striker impressed in a trial for Championship side Derby County and has since gone on to score three goals in seven appearances for Ilkeston. Earlier this season his former boss Kevin Wilson hailed the striker, who scored 23 goals last season, as the "hottest property in non-league football". With huge interest in the forward, Town boss Richard Money was delighted to beat off competition from a number of Championship and League One sides for Morgan-Smith's signature. And, hours after completing the paperwork, Morgan-Smith was thrust into action for his debut against Mansfield and scored in the 2-0 victory.

AARON O'CONNOR

Striker, who picked up a plethora of end-of-season awards at Nene Park, arrived at Kenilworth Road after signing a two-year contract following the expiry of his deal with Rushden & Diamonds. He scored 27 times in two seasons at Nene Park after arriving from Mansfield Town and went onto be a huge favourite at the Northamptonshire club. Aaron started his career on YTS forms with Derby County before moving to Ilkeston Town. He then had spells at Scunthorpe United and Nuneaton Borough before returning to Ilkeston. He then joined Gresley Rovers where between 2004 and 2007 he scored 80 goals in 127 games which saw him pick up the Player's Player of the Year, Manager's Player of the Year and Supporter's Player of the Year awards two seasons in succession. O'Connor nearly signed for Rushden in 2006 when Paul Hart was in charge, however, after playing in pre-season friendlies, he returned to Gresley, later moving to Grays Athletic, where he played under Justin Edinburgh. Aaron went from Grays to Mansfield in 2008 where he scored eight times in 39 games at Field Mill prior to his switch to Rushden in the summer of 2009. Known for his strength and turn of pace the Nottingham-born front man can also play wide.

STUART FLEETWOOD

Prolific striker who signed for an undisclosed fee from Hereford United on deadline day in August 2011. The Gloucester-born frontman, who scored 28 goals the last time he played at Conference level whilst with Forest Green Rovers, signed a two-year deal at Kenilworth Road. He began his career as a trainee at Cardiff City, making the grade to feature eight times for the Bluebirds between 2003 and 2006. In January 2006, Fleetwood signed for Hereford for the first time scoring eight times before he signed for Forest Green in June 2007. And it was his spell with Rovers that saw people sit up and take notice after plundering 32 league and cup goals in a season that saw the Gloucestershire side earn their highest league placing. The Wales Under-21 international turned down a new contract at FGR to sign for then Championship Charlton in June 2008 but was loaned out Cheltenham, Exeter and Brighton.

Fleetwood returned to Edgar Street last summer and scored 18 goals as he helped the Bulls avoid the drop in League 2. After hitting the post on his debut against Stockport, Fleetwood scored on his full debut in the win over Darlington.

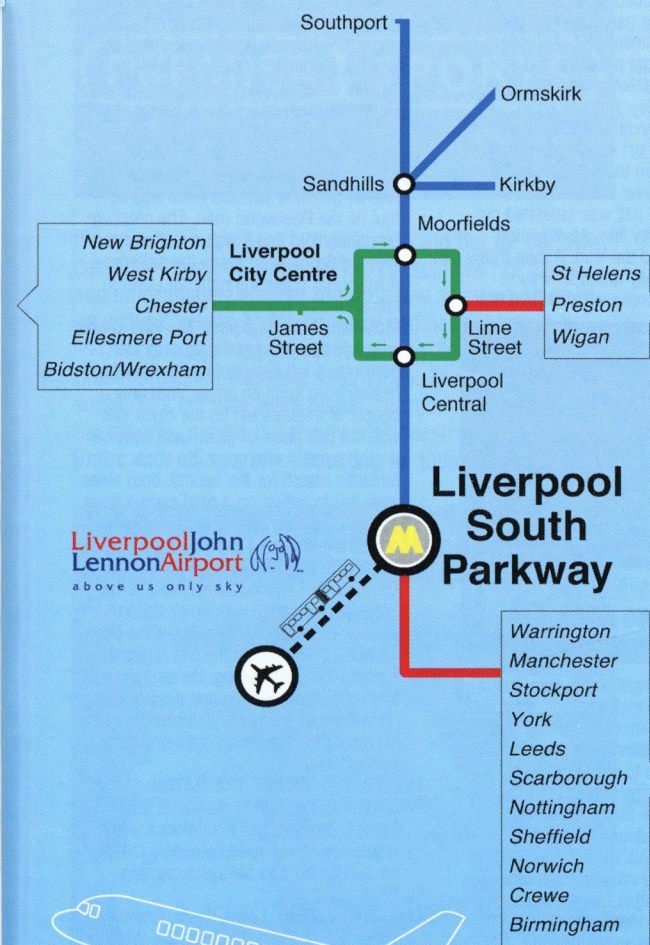

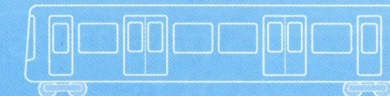
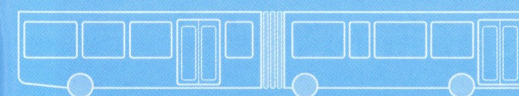

MATCH REVIEW

FLEETWOOD TOWN V SOUTHPORT

MATCH HIGHLIGHTS: Southport have put in a series of memorable away day victories this season, and if it hadn't been for a cruel late equalizer, this would have risen straight to the top of the list. A point, nonetheless a good reward for a battling and largely resolute display. As you would expect Fleetwood settled the quicker, and playing four strikers in an almost 4-2-4 shape were keen to get off to a good start. The much talked about Jamie Vardy saw much of the ball down the right in the opening minutes and it was his cross which flew across the Port penalty box and out for a goal kick, begging for a touch to divert it past McMillan. Another of Fleetwood's front four Gareth Seddon had the next chance, his well hit shot fizzed just past the far post. It was with their first meaningful attack of the game that Southport opened the scoring. A fantastic freekick from Shaun Whalley was met by the head of Tony Gray, and as ever this season Gray was in lethal form. An expertly directed header put the ball out of reach of Fleetwood keeper Scott Davies. The referee then took centre stage as he awarded Fleetwood a hotly disputed penalty. Magno Viera was allowed to run all of 30 yards into the heart of the penalty area. He ran into Chris Lever before falling in a heap a couple of yards inside the box. The linesman who was nearer to the incident didn't flinch, however the referee deemed it a penalty. Former Wrexham star Andy Mangan sent McMillan the wrong way with his spot kick. Southport had the next major chance of the afternoon, Andy Parry who was starting in place of the injured Karl Ledsham hit a shot a yard over after good work from Gray and Whalley down the left. If Parry's chance was only a snuff, then Tony Gray's next chance was a nailed on goal. A short back pass let Gray in, and he attempted to chip the keeper, only for Davies to get a hand to it. The ball

came back to Gray, and with Davies marooned on the floor he had the simple job of placing it either side of him. Gray's effort however clipped the post and bounced wide. The game started for the second half in a similar vein. Southport were applying all the pressure and a shaky Fleetwood defence was this time exploited by Whalley. Another short back pass this time by veteran McNulty was picked up by the Port winger, he rounded the keeper and tried to find Gray to the right of him. However Fleetwood recovered and the ball was smashed out towards the halfway line. As expected Southport regained the lead. A long throw by Owens eventually found its way to Gray at the back post who smashed the



ball home from a tight angle. Gray had a chance for his hat trick not long after, with a sight of goal he knocked the ball past Davies, however defender Nathan Pond cleared off the line to stop Port going further ahead. Things should have been a whole lot easier for Southport when Fleetwood were reduced to ten men. McGuire received his marching orders for a second bookable offence. This time he slid in late on Moogan to earn himself an early bath. Magno Viera was the first to test McMillan in the second period, after a 20 yard shot had been parried into the path of the Brazilian, McMillan made a fantastic save to deny the on rushing

Viera. The momentum was now with Fleetwood, and despite having one less man it made little difference, and the hosts went on to dominate the final 20 minutes. Junior Brown wasted a good opportunity by skying the ball out of the ground, before a set piece freekick found its way to McMillan causing little damage. Fleetwood then had a much bigger shout for a penalty than the one which was given. Mangan looked to have been hacked down from behind, however the referee this time decided there was no foul on the Fleetwood man. The pressure eventually told and it was substitute Richard Brodie who made the difference. A mazy run down the right left Lever in knots, and he placed the ball past McMillan at the near post. The Port keeper who had been one of Southport's star performers left disappointed to have been beaten from such an angle. With only a couple of minutes left on the clock that was the last piece of goalmouth action in a very eventful afternoon. No doubt a fantastic match for the neutral, both sides were left to reflect on a hard earned point, and for Southport it was a case of what could have been.

SOUTHPORT MAN OF THE MATCH: Alan Moogan - The midfielder epitomized the Port's performance with an all action display. Putting out fires all over the pitch as well as distributing the ball forward and keeping the team ticking. He also showed a more disciplined side and despite being on the end of some rough tackles, he kept his head to outshine his opposing centre midfielders.

FLEETWOOD MAN OF THE MATCH: Shaun Beeley - Put in a good display at right back, and helped out his defence well. When other Fleetwood defenders faltered on the day he was always a calming influence.

On Saturday 28th April 2012, Southport FC are scheduled to play Grimsby Town in their final Blue Square Premier game of the season.

On Wednesday 25th April at 8am Colin Aindow will leave Haig Avenue, Southport and run to Blundell Park, Grimsby with the intention of arriving in time for kick-off at 1:00pm. Thank you Conference for making it even harder by bringing the kick off forward!

PRESS CUTTINGS

Despite finishing last season in the bottom four, Southport registered a respectable nine home wins during the course of the campaign.

Among the teams beaten at Haig Avenue were Fleetwood Town and York City - the latter of whom suffered a 4-0 hiding - but arguably the most memorable home win was against today's opponents Luton Town.

Trailing to Matthew Barnes-Homer's goal midway through the second half, the Sandgrounders hit back with two goals in the closing eight minutes to claim the points on a memorable afternoon.

Luton's visit last season was their first to Haig Avenue in over 40 years. At the time, they were still chasing the runner's-up spot in the Blue Square Bet Premier and arrived here on the back of a good unbeaten run.

In the relegation zone at the start of play, Southport produced one of their best all-round performances of the season, with the quality of the display belying their lowly league position.

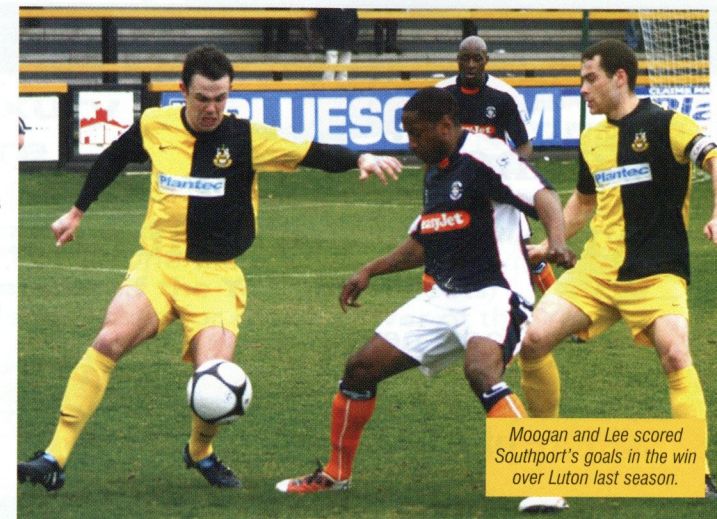
Having been the more productive side for a large part of the afternoon without capitalising on their superiority, the Sandgrounders' good work looked to have been undone as the visitors edged in front with the closing stages approaching.

But going behind served only to galvanise Liam Watson's side, as they continued their impressive work to finish with a real flourish.

Having been the game's outstanding player in the centre of midfield, Alan Moogan drew Southport level by nodding in a Shaun Whalley cross.

And it was with another headed goal that the Sandgrounders completed the turnaround, Kevin Lee converting Paul Barratt's free-kick with two minutes remaining.

While Southport looked on the win as being a major boost in their quest for safety, the result ended up having bigger implications for Luton, prompting the departure of Richard Money, with Gary Brabin stepping up to become manager.



Moogan and Lee scored Southport's goals in the win over Luton last season.

With the season entering the final month, Luton got their revenge a fortnight later as they rattled in six goals to win the reverse fixture, yet the campaign ended in disappointment for both. While Southport were unsuccessful in their battle to finish outside the bottom four, Luton were pipped to a place in League Two by AFC Wimbledon.

Since then, the two clubs have got to know each other well. While Luton captured John Paul Kissock at a time when his performances for Southport were attracting plenty of interest, the arrival of Godfrey Poku in the opposite direction proved more successful than anyone at Haig Avenue could have expected.

Brabin, of course, is someone who needs no introduction here, and with Poku having now returned to his parent club, the Luton squad list features some familiar names.

Unlike last season, Southport's home record has not been a stand-out feature so far this campaign.

But as with the win over Luton, late goals have been a regular thing, and with Brabin's team the visitors again today, the Sandgrounders will be hoping for a repeat of one of last season's highlights this afternoon.

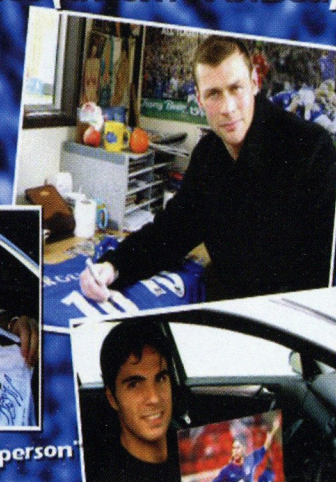
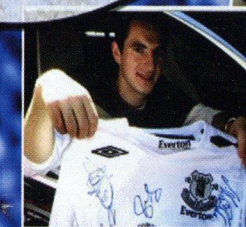
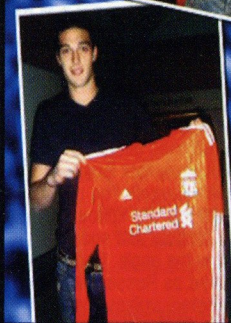

HAVEN'T WE MET BEFORE?

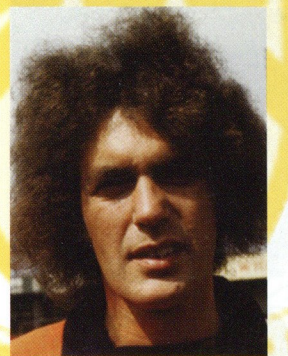
Despite both clubs being formed in the 1880's Southport and Luton Town never played each other competitively until September 1962 when Luton, then a Division 2 side, visited Haig Avenue and won a Football League Cup tie 3-1.

The first ever league meetings between the teams were played over the Christmas period of 1965, with Southport winning 3-2 at Haig Avenue on December 27 but losing 2-0 at Kenilworth Road the following day.

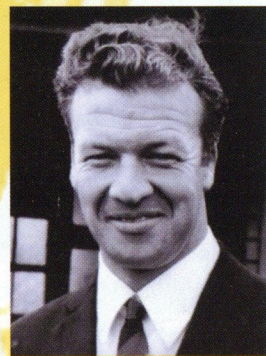
For our look back today we go to the following season, 1966/67. By the time of Luton's visit on October 8, we had slipped out of the promotion places following three successive defeats, into 7th place. Luton were eight places but only three points lower, and had a game in hand. They had lost their opening four away games but won four times out of five at home. Southport were of course managed by Billy Bingham, who represented Luton in the 1959 cup final whilst Luton included winger Graham French, who played a couple of football league games for us (as Graham Lafite) a decade later.

From The Guardian

Luton Town's infamous Graham French aka Graham Lafite, a former England youth international. "In 1970 he got a three-year prison term for firing a shotgun inside a pub," writes Mark Francome. "After serving his sentence he returned to Kenilworth Road but failed to hold down a regular place in the team and he drifted out of the game. That was assumed to be the end of his career." However in 1976 my family relocated from Luton to Southport. To be fair to Mr French he probably did not expect to find too many ardent Luton fans in the stand at Haig Avenue, but my father watched Southport's new signing, Graham Lafite, and knew there was something very familiar about the way he skipped down the wing and turned the full-back inside out. After a couple of matches my father approached the player as he walked towards the tunnel and said 'Well played, you remind me of Graham French, the Luton winger.' Mr Lafite was never seen again."

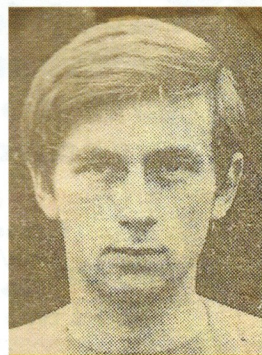

Luton also had full back Bobby Thomson in their ranks. Thomson had suffered a broken leg playing in a Senior Cup game for Liverpool at Haig Avenue some years earlier. And their goalkeeper Tony Read doubled up as a centre forward and had scored 12 goals for Luton the previous season. Future manager David Pleat was on the bench. Southport handed a football league debut to 17 year old right winger Ian McKinlay.

The game kicked off with a flurry of Luton attacks that came to nought and Southport took the lead in their first real raid. A Ron Smith throw was worked back to Kevin Cairns who fed Alan Spence. Spence cleverly pushed the ball into the area, where Colin Alty timed his run perfectly to fire home his first goal of the season. Shortly afterwards, Spence was again the provider as his centre from the left was met first time by Jim Fryatt but his shot hit the advancing 'keeper Read and was cleared. At the other end, Ray Whittaker came close to an equaliser with a first time shot that Brian Reeves brilliantly turned onto the post.

Fryatt limped out of the action on 16 minutes with a groin strain and was replaced by John Price. McKinlay slowly came into the game and from one inch-perfect cross Spence headed narrowly wide before Price missed a great chance when through on goal only to shoot tamely at Read. Luton were deploying an offside trap to quell the Southport attacks but it was breached again by Alty just before the break. This time his shot just missed the target and crashed into the Blowick end wall.

A quiet opening to the second half burst into life as Southport increased the lead in the 51st minute. Cairns' free kick was headed out of the goalmouth to McKinlay who controlled the ball instantly and found the unmarked Alty, allowing him all the time in the world to pick his spot with a cool finish. The attacks were now relentless and another strong run by Alty was halted by a rash challenge on the edge of the box. Russell dummied the resultant free kick that was hammered goalwards by Alty. Read made a splendid save but was unable to gather the ball and the ever-alert Spence snaffled away the rebound for number three on 53 minutes. Southport's all out attacking continued despite their increased lead and in the next minute full back Alex Parker charged forward and attempted a 1:2 with Russell. The pass was intercepted by Freddie Jardine and hoofed into the space vacated by Parker where Bruce Rioch advanced on goal and squeezed his shot home as Reeves came out to narrow the angle. One minute later the three goal advantage was restored as Russell picked up a loose ball in midfield and made ground before unleashing an unstoppable left-foot shot past Read from 20 yards. The four goals in six minute burst concluded the scoring but the game continued to entertain the crowd as McKinlay and Russell both went close, as did Spence, whose spectacular scissors kick was

superbly turned around the post by an overworked Read.

Southport followed this splendid win with another 4-1 home success, just two days later, against Barrow. Alty added another goal to his tally and McKinlay netted his only ever goal in the Monday evening encounter. Smith and a recalled Eric Redrobe, fresh from a four goal haul for the reserves against Clitheroe, completed the scoring. The Barrow win lifted Southport into third place and we remained in the top four for much of the season, dipping out briefly in February (which included a goalless draw in the return game at Luton) and early March. We eventually finished as runners up to Stockport County and were promoted for the very first time in our history, 46 years after being elected to the league. The icing on the cake was a final day home game against Southend United, where a crowd of 8,999 saw George Andrews strike the only goal of the game and lift us into second place. Luton finished a disappointing 17th.

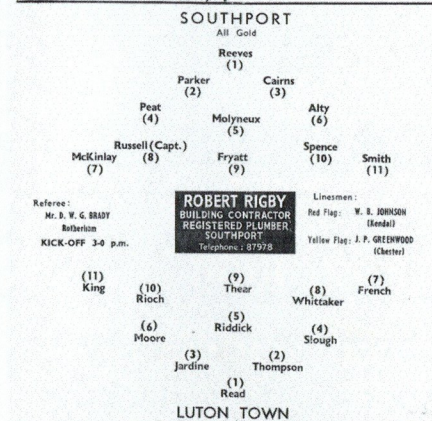

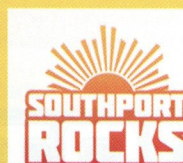

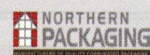

You mentioned about the staff then, what is your opinion on Liam Watson?

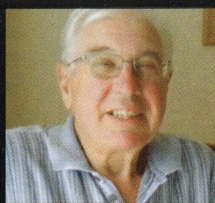
He'd been great, always been looking after me, texting me and making sure I'm ok, the whole backroom staff have been great too, giving me lots of great advice.

FRODSHAM'S THOUGHTS

FOOTBALL IN JANUARY

January is my least favourite month of the year. The Christmas and New Year Celebrations are over and three more months of Winter lie ahead. It is invariably cold and dark and the credit card bills start coming through the letter box. Indeed I read somewhere that the third Monday of the month is the most gloomy day of the year. True the holiday period was splendid in our house give or take the odd football result and we went to the Pantomime in Cheltenham. Jack and the Beanstalk since you ask. So, what nice things can we remember from the last few months? Our long run of away wins. I was at Forest Green and Newport County. I also enjoyed the Barnet Cup-tie despite the narrow defeat. Barnet are a better side than many had suggested and we ran them very close indeed. It was one of my regrettably few visits these days to a home game and I confess that it was the first time that I had stood under cover behind the goal since Netherfield on April 14th 1979 when we won. That was the last time I saw a home victory despite a number of visits since when I have either stood at the half way line or sat in the Stand. One of the pleasures of being a Southport fan was being packed under cover at the Scarisbrick New Road End in the 1960's and 70's with the floodlights on, the muddy goalmouth and watching Big Eric, Alan Spence or Jim Fryatt to name just a few smashing the goals in. Anyway on that lovely late Autumn afternoon of November 12th I relived my younger days to a certain extent by standing right at the back of the Jack Carr and enjoying every moment. I was fortunate to have a real Port supporter standing next to me that afternoon. Thank you Mike, your company was appreciated. Thursday September 15th is also a day I remember fondly. I was at Taunton for the final day of the cricket season when Lancashire defeated Somerset for the Championship title. I had waited for that day since 1950 when my unwavering support of the Red Rose began.

January weather can be shocking and over the years often played havoc with my travel plans at work when I was expected to journey all over the Lake District by car. I have never forgotten though a certain late January afternoon in 1958 when snow caused me all sorts of problems getting to an RAF posting at

Valley on Anglesey. There was a great deal of snow and ice and our game at Crewe arranged for January 25th was not played until April. I was on the train from Chester to Holyhead late on a Friday afternoon. In those days the trains to Holyhead stopped at the place with the long Welsh name then Rhosneigr and Valley before they terminated at Holyhead. Of course I left the train at Valley Station in the dark and snow only to be told that I should have got off at Rhosneigr, walked alongside the track and climbed over a wall into the camp well before Valley village. Security non existent. That is what everyone arriving on foot did. Receiving absolutely no help from the Station staff and fearing a night in the waiting room I managed to hitch a lift from a passing motorist in a jeep and we just about got through to camp. Things did improve greatly though as there were fine beaches nearby for the Summer and interesting shift work in Air Traffic Control. The Airfield was open 24 hours but nothing much ever happened after Midnight so we kept the radio frequencies on under supervision of one airman by rotation throughout the night. Quite often that person fell into a doze and if the Russians had known what was going on they could have easily captured Anglesey.

Our Anniversary game to-day is from January 21st 1967 versus Lincoln City. We were second from top in Division 4. They were rock bottom. This was our first home game since the Boxing Day fire. We had won at Lincoln in the previous September but we had never beaten them twice in one season. At half time we were a goal down. I like to imagine now that for the second half we were packed under cover and willing the lads to come good and send the Imps back to Lincolnshire empty handed, as the rain beat down on the muddy pitch. Whatever the conditions we won the game 2-1 with goals from Dickie Marshall and Alan Spence. The two points for the win kept us tucked in behind Stockport County who would be our opponents here on February 11th 1967 when we absolutely ran all over them with 2 goals each from the above mentioned Alan and Jim. Those goals of Jim Fryatt's were scored on his last appearance for us and he was off on his travels around the Football League again. We were glad to welcome him back in 1971.

(This means that you cannot bring any type of glass bottle or can into the ground).

ANY SPECTATOR ACTING IN CONTRAVENTION OF THE ABOVE CONDITIONS IS LIABLE TO ARREST!

FIRST AID:

First aid and medical facilities are available at the Scarisbrick New Road end of the ground. In the event of medical attention being required the assistance of a steward should be sought.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURE:

In the event of an emergency, instructions will be given via the public address system. Please listen carefully to the instructions given and comply immediately if it affects your area. Stewards and

police officers will direct you to safe areas. Above all remain calm.

If a match is abandoned before half-time, supporters will be re-admitted to the re-arranged game at a reduced admission charge.

SPECTATORS ARE ASKED TO APPRECIATE THAT STEWARDS ARE VOLUNTEERS AND ARE ASKED TO COMPLY WITH STEWARDS INSTRUCTIONS AT ALL TIMES.
