The Gaffer


Today we have a home tie with Luton Town in the FA Carlsberg Trophy to see who goes through to the quarter-finals of the competition – a big welcome to Gary Brabin and his team.

In any situation like this the one thing you can hope for is a draw on your home soil, so in that sense we are pleased with what we have – obviously, though, going up against Luton is going to be a big test for us but one we are looking forward to. The resources a club like Luton have; the tools at their disposal and the travelling support they take to games are going to provide a big advantage.

We met in the League earlier this season and although we feel we played very well, we didn't get the result we wanted and also lost two influential players on the day in Luke Jones and Mike Williams. I wouldn't call that game a turning point in our season but, certainly, since then we have certainly seen our campaign take off a little bit.

We are now in a serious position to go ahead and challenge this season. You have to say that to win the league with what we have available to us is always going to be very difficult but we are a good side with a genuine opportunity to get into those play-off places. Some of the young players who were with us last season have continued to improve and, from the beginning of this season, the lads we brought in have also stepped up to a point where they are playing really good football each week.

On the other side, you do always need that little bit of luck and when I look back on last weekend's game at Stockport, you have to say that this luck deserted us because I felt we did play some great stuff at times. We know it is all about putting the ball in



the back of the net, though, and the chances on the day just didn't go for us.

Looking again to today's game – people sometimes say that the FA Trophy is a bit of a distraction, but I have never looked at it this way and in the same vein I am always

amazed at how some Premier League sides treat the FA Cup. For example, you know that the likes of the top four each year are normally the only sides who are going to go on and win the title each and every year. One or two will always push in, but in the main, winning it is generally only an aim of very few sides, and those are also the ones who have squads big enough to challenge for other honours as well. The Cup, however, is a big opportunity for many other sides.

It is a fantastic chance for a number of other teams to get some silverware and get themselves into Europe so I am always surprised to see how a number of sides don't treat it the same way. For us, the FA Trophy is a realistic opportunity to get ourselves to Wembley Stadium and to win a trophy – you would always sooner be in that position than just having to see games out at the end of a season. To still be involved in the Trophy and the play-off race at that stage is something we'd definitely aim for.

So enjoy today's game. Get behind the boys and create another great atmosphere.

ACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOUR AGREEMENT - ABA

During the 2008/09 season the Club received many complaints about the anti-social behaviour of a small group of our younger supporters at our home and away matches both at the grounds and in the local community.

The activities of this small group have harmed the reputation and good name of the Club and the majority of our supporters who never cause any problems at any of our home or away matches. In order to tackle this problem, in consultation and partnership with West Mercia Police and the club have introduced a procedure known as 'Acceptable Behaviour Agreement' or 'ABA' in short.

The small problem group have been identified and all are being asked to sign the ABA in which they agree that their behaviour at any of our games, either at home or away, will not be such as to damage the good name or reputation of the club or lead to complaints from anyone about their conduct.

If they should breach the agreement then this could lead to them being banned from attending any matches or be used as evidence in any Court proceedings relating to their anti-social behaviour.

The club is confident that the majority of our supporters will welcome this positive move by the Club in taking some pro-active action to prevent the present problem escalating and only further damaging our good name.

The agreement is in effect a 'Yellow Card' which hopefully the supporters concerned will respect and comply with. If they are genuine supporters of the Club, the ABA will hopefully encourage them to continue supporting us, but in a positive and distinct from negative manner.



IN GOAL MARK TYLER

Hugely experienced goalkeeper who signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road in June 2009 following his release from Peterborough United. A former England Youth international, Tyler was handed a new 2-year contract in the summer of 2011.

IN DEFENCE DAN GLEESON

Gleeson signed for the Hatters in the summer of 2010 from his home town club Cambridge United. A product of the U's academy, Gleeson became a regular at the Abbey Stadium making 61 league appearances before Notts County snapped up his signature in 2006.



THE GAFFER GARY BRABIN

In his first - and eventually only - season at Cambridge, Brabin guided the U's to the Play-off final after finishing runners-up to champions Burton Albion, but lost to Torquay. Despite that set-back Brabin was awarded the BSP Manager of the Year award before behind the scenes differences at the Abbey led to him leaving the club in July 2009 and following the departure of Richard Money in March 2011, Brabin took control of the Hatters.

CURTIS OSANO

Lightning quick attacking defender who signed a six-month contract at Kenilworth Road following his departure from Rushden & Diamonds in July 2011 where he made over 150 appearances and enjoyed loan spells at Aldershot and Woking.

DEAN BECKWITH

Beckwith became the Hatters' second signing of the summer of 2011 following his release from Northampton Town. With almost 250 senior appearances to his name after starting his career as a junior at Gillingham, he will bring experience to the Hatters backline.

ED ASAFU-ADJAYE

After a loan spell with non-league side Walton & Hersham, Ed made his full debut in March 2008 at Kenilworth Road against Crewe Alexandra and has gone from strength to strength, including being part of the Town team that won the Johnstone's Paint Trophy at Wembley in 2009.

ALEX LACEY


Up-and-coming centre-half who made his first team debut as a 17-year-old in the FA Trophy first round tie against Welling, earning the man-of-the-match award for an excellent performance. Signed a professional contract to remain at Kenilworth Road until the end of the 2011/12 season.

JANOS KOVACS

Hungarian defender who signed on-loan for his second spell at the club in September 2011. Formerly with Chesterfield and Lincoln, Kovacs first signed in January 2010 before signing for Hereford United in the summer of that year.

GREG TAYLOR

Left-back signed from Darlington in November 2011 who made his Town




ONE TO WATCH GEORGE PILKINGTON

Highly experienced defender who joined the club on a free transfer in August 2008. Having began his career as an Everton trainee, Pilkington joined Port Vale in June 2003, after a loan spell at Exeter City. Having started 223 league games for the Valiants, injury frustrated the centre-half in his first season at Kenilworth Road in 2008/09 but he still managed to pick-up a Johnstone's Paint Trophy winners' medal and the highly-regarded defender has been named Player of the Year twice.

debut in the 1-1 draw at Cambridge United. Started his career as a junior with Northampton before he signed for Kettering Town. He then joined Darlo, linking up with boss Mark Cooper at the Darlington Arena.

IN MIDFIELD ROBBIE WILLMOTT

Harlow-born winger who penned an 18-month contract with the Hatters in January 2011 after hitting 10 goals for Cambridge United. Capable of playing on either wing or behind the front two, Willmott came through the ranks at the Abbey Stadium and wowed the home faithful with his pace, dribbling, close control and eye for goal.



STUART FLEETWOOD

Prolific striker who signed for an undisclosed fee from Hereford United on deadline day in August 2011. The Gloucester-born frontman, who scored 28 goals the last time he played at Conference level whilst with Forest Green Rovers, signed a two-year deal at Kenilworth Road. After hitting the post on his debut against Stockport, Fleetwood scored on his full debut in the win over Darlington.

JAMES DANCE

Energetic, tricky winger who joined the Hatters from Crawley Town in July 2011. Able to play on either flank or as a central striker, Dance began his career as a trainee at Birmingham City but made his name in non-league circles in the West Midlands before catching the eye of Kettering in 2009.

ALEX LAWLESS

Former Wales Under-21 midfielder who signed from York City in January 2011. He only joined York at the start of last season, impressing then boss Martin Foyle enough to prise the 25-year-old away from Forest Green Rovers.

JOHN PAUL KISSOCK

Creative attacking midfielder John Paul joined from Southport in August



AMARI MORGAN-SMITH

Striker or wide man who arrived at Kenilworth Road following a two-year spell at Ilkeston Town. The fast and skilful frontman's impressive form for the Robins earned him a call-up to the England C squad at the end of last season.

DANNY CROW

A nippy poacher of a striker, Crow joined the Hatters from Cambridge United in May 2010 where the energetic forward's strike-rate of 22 goals in 43 league starts won him many admirers and his 19 goals during 2009/10 saw him scoop the U's online Player of the Year award.

CRAIG McALLISTER

Although born in Glasgow, McAllister was raised on the South Coast of England and began his career with Eastleigh. In 2002 he signed for

Basingstoke Town, scoring 53 times in 96 appearances at the Camrose which earned him a move to Stevenage Borough. Stints at Grays, Oxford and Exeter followed - the latter coming in 2008. The front man has signed on loan for the rest of the 2011/12 season from Newport County.

DAN WALKER

Quick young forward capable of playing down the flanks who signed a one-year deal in July 2010 after impressing in pre-season in games for and against the Hatters.

AARON O'CONNOR

Striker, who arrived at Kenilworth Road after signing a two-year contact following the expiry of his deal with Rushden & Diamonds. He scored 27 times in two seasons at Nene Park after arriving from Mansfield Town and went on to be a huge favourite at the Northamptonshire club.



MEMORABLE ENCOUNTERS:

SKY BLUES END CUP DREAMS

On a day where the FA Trophy takes centre stage, we take a look back on another thrilling ride to the Third Round of the world's most famous Cup competition....

Harriers have a rich history in both the FA Trophy and the FA Cup and in the 2008/09 season they wrote another memorable chapter to this tale with a fine run.

The action started in earnest over in Norfolk in late October 2008, Brian Smikle among the goals as Harriers thumped King's Lynn at the Walks on a day which saw defender Luke Jones sent off.

A far tougher test awaited in the First Round proper; Harriers paired against Conference rivals Cambridge United – a well-taken Justin Richards penalty was enough to secure a valuable 1-0 win at Aggborough.

It was home again once more on 29 November – Northern League side Curzon Ashton were dispatched at Aggborough thanks to a 2-0 win in front of a crowd of more than 2,000 – Stefan Moore's first goal for the club among the highlights.

And so the attention turned to the draw for the Third Round – the cameras of Sky Sports News packed



into the Harriers Arms. Just four teams remained in the hat – Coventry, Aston Villa, Gillingham and Harriers as fans began to dream of a huge date with the men from Villa Park.

As it was, Villa were sent to Gillingham and Harriers were left with

the not-too-shabby prize of making the trip to Coventry to tackle Chris Coleman's Sky Blues at the Ricoh Arena.

On the day, Harriers had to withstand plenty of first half pressure with Freddy Eastwood, Robbie Simpson and

Leon Best all forcing saves from Adam Bartlett, the latter a particularly good one as the ex-Blyth Spartans man tipped the striker's shot around the post.

It took until the 25th minute for Harriers to get the ball into the City area but the home defence snuffed out the danger quickly as Matthew Barnes-Homer took the ball down well and shaped to shoot.

With things even at the break Mark Yates would have been the happier of the two managers with the home crowd showing their frustration that none of their side's efforts had been put away, but in truth Mark Creighton and his defence deserved all the credit for comfortably keeping them at bay.

Seven minutes later, Penn was causing Coventry trouble and his driving run from midfield saw him charge some 40 yards, the ball was re-worked to him for another effort on goal that went just high of Marshall's upright.

After the hour mark the home side had a couple more chances on the counter as Harriers threw men



forward in search of an equaliser, Freddy Eastwood shot wide when he perhaps should have done better, and Simpson forced another good stop from Bartlett.

On 72 minutes Harriers had their

own little spell of pressure with successive corners, but Riley's header from Brittain's ball in was the pick of the bunch and that was blocked wide by Eastwood.

Sadly from a Harriers perspective the tie was all but settled as City broke again, Brian Smikle did superbly to hold off Best as he charged down on goal but his eventual shot was well-placed and sailed past the goalkeeper.

The visitors never gave up and had late chances through Penn once more and sub Darryl Knights but in the end it was the home side who made their opportunities count.

Speaking after the game Yates admitted that the game plan was always to try and frustrate Coleman's men, and after the first-half finished 0-0 things seemed to be working a treat.

Talking to...

James McQuilkin

LOAN man James McQuilkin admits he's looking to use his stay at Aggborough to sample some of the FA Trophy's magic ahead of a Third Round tie with Luton today.

THE wide-man, with us on an initial one-month loan from League 2 side Hereford United, has already enjoyed one outing in non-league football's most prestigious competition.

His Harriers debut came in the last round - a 5-1 home win over Droylsden on home soil sending Harriers through to today's match-up with Gary Brabin's Hatters; a place in the quarter-finals up for grabs.

He took time to speak in this afternoon's BIC Interview where he casts his eye over all things Trophy, life over at Edgar Street and his switch to this side of the two counties.

This competition is unique in that you're about five or six games from Wembley - that's quite unique in the game and must be quite a motivation!

Oh yeah, it's a great feeling to know that you aren't far from a realistic chance of playing at Wembley. You are always going to need the usual luck of the draw and perhaps a bit of fortune to go with playing well but it is a competition everyone is going to want to win and, certainly, we're no different.

Do you keep thoughts of winning it to the back of your mind and take it as it comes or is it always there as the driving force?

Well Kidderminster are obviously expected to do well in this competition so that is always going to be there but you do just have to take each game as it comes. There are no easy games along the way because anyone left in is capable of winning it so you have to treat them as you would any League game.

Let's talk about you for a moment - do you feel well settled here now after a few games?

Yeah, I am just finding my feet and the lads here have been very welcoming to me. I just want to keep playing as many games as I can and play as many minutes as I can and go from there.

I know you were very much settled at Hereford; did it come to a point where you felt you had to get out and get games?

As a footballer you just want to play as often as you can and, unfortunately, this season I haven't have featured as much as I would have liked there so I knew I had to look at other opportunities to play and this is a place I've been able to do that.

Given their league position and a need to scrap points out, do you feel you perhaps weren't suited to that style, being more of a luxury in that situation, an attacking player?

Possibly, yeah. The way we were playing probably didn't suit my style because we were right down there near the bottom of the league and in many games were scrapping just to get something. They said I wouldn't fit into the way they had to play and Kidderminster is a club that gets the ball down and play and that really fits me.

We talk about your 'style' - how do you sum yourself up as a player to those still getting to know you?

I'd say I am quite a technical player who likes to get on the ball and pass it; and potentially chip in with

a few goals as well. Obviously the more games I play, the better I am hopefully going to get because I am still building that fitness and sharpness that you get from playing.

Moving on... if there was going to be a game that advertised this level of football to you as a Hereford player, that might well have been the York City match recently...

Yeah, there was a great atmosphere here on the night and everybody got behind the lads. Fortunately we managed to get back into it and I thoroughly enjoyed being a part of it. I was over the moon to have scored a goal as well.


And what about the difference between this end of the BSBP and the bottom of League 2...

To be honest, I don't think there's very much at all. The gap is very small between the bottom half of League 2 and the top half of the Conference and, certainly, Kidderminster are a lot better than a number of sides in League 2.

We mentioned the big game against York... Another one here today, Luton Town in the Trophy.

Yep, they're a massive club and a lot of resources at their disposal so I am sure it is going to be a tough game. They've got a number of good players and I know one or two of the boys there from Hereford as well and I'm sure it'll be an entertaining afternoon.








