

Good afternoon and welcome to this afternoon's important Blue Square Bet Premier fixture against Grimsby Town.

I'd like to welcome our visitors, their management team of Rob Scott and Paul Hurst plus their staff, players and supporters to Kenilworth Road.

Before anything else, I feel the need to open by apologising sincerely for Tuesday night's 3-0 defeat at Forest Green Rovers. It was so bad there are few words to describe how I felt about the performance, other than how ashamed I was. I genuinely didn't think our team was capable of such a lacklustre display.

The last week has been so difficult, painful and tough on so many levels for us all. The hurt of losing to York on aggregate in the manner in which we did, having done so well to restrict them in the first leg, was a bitter pill to swallow, and I had hoped we could use the disappointment and frustration of not going to Wembley as a positive to take into the game at Forest Green - but it was not to be. You, the supporters, especially those loyal 300 who made the trip to the New Lawn, truly deserve better. I genuinely hate letting you down and cannot disagree with many of the comments made after the worst result and performance since I took control at the Club.

Whilst Tuesday was a disaster which we can't hide from we have to use this week as a turning point. We really can't dwell on the disappointment because that won't do us any good at all. So, we have to put it behind us, but we cannot do that without learning from the experience, understanding our mistakes and promising ourselves, and you, that a performance like that will never, ever happen again. For me personally, it was incredibly hard to take, and I felt embarrassed and let down. It was a real low, there's no getting away from that, but I know we have the ability to come back better, stronger and wiser for the experience. If I genuinely didn't believe that I would be here, managing this team today.

We've put in a lot of hard work this week. Much has been said to the players after Tuesday's defeat - they know it was totally unacceptable. I reminded them

how lucky they are to be employed by Luton Town and told them how lucky I felt to represent this Club.

We've had some real soul searching and some heart-to-hearts which have resulted in some constructive action. So let's dust ourselves down and keep positive and go again this afternoon against Grimsby.

We've also had lots of talks with board members this week. I am very grateful for their continued support in allowing me to add, in Andre Gray, another striker who I'd like to welcome into the fold and I am confident that he will give us all a lift.

As it stands we are fourth in the table, in the play-off places with games in hand on some. Promotion is in our grasp. It's that simple, and is something we all need to believe we can achieve.


We are all fighting for our futures and the pressure is on. Today's game is of huge importance and it's at times like these where you really get to know about the character of your players. Are they up for the fight, or will they shirk responsibility? Now is the time for us as a group to go out there and show everyone what we are made of; to prove to people we are a team worthy of success. At times, we've stood up in the face of adversity this season so it's imperative that we don't throw it all away now.

We're fourth in the league because we've shown we're a capable team. Consistency is needed to make us a very capable team. I know we should be higher in the table and playing better but we can't change anything that's happened in the previous 37 games. Now is the time we need to believe in ourselves, to finish the job, get into the play-offs and win promotion.

It's not going to be easy but we need to do this together. We all need to pull in the same direction for the mutual benefit of Luton Town Football Club.

So get behind us; keep believing and, together, we can conquer.

FROM THE BOARDROOM

WITH MANAGING DIRECTOR GARY SWEET

Welcome one and all to this afternoon's Blue Square Bet Premier encounter with Grimsby Town.

I'd like to extend a warm welcome to the supporters, players and officials from the Mariners who have enjoyed a remarkable turn in form since our televised evening win up at Blundell Park in October having only lost two league games since. Conversely, we have agonised over a run of poor league form which we are planning to put to a halt today.

These are my first programme notes for a couple of months, for which I apologise, even though I'm sure you have been suitably entertained by the words of my colleagues. I haven't been shirking my responsibilities, of that you can be sure. However, like all of us from time to time, I have had to attend to the kind of personal loss which puts the rest of life into perspective. For this reason I'd like to take this opportunity to apologise to those people who have written to me recently and who have been awaiting a reply.

Just as ever, we all look forward to our team performing on the day (or even the occasional night) to lift our spirits and instil a sense of positivity that no other pursuit or pastime could possibly do, when we need a diversion from life's stresses and strains. Unfortunately, just when I needed something to cheer about I've been left disenchanted and dejected after some dreadful league performances; just as I know you have been too.

I can't remember when I have ever felt embarrassed about my association with this wonderful institution that we are so fanatical about – indeed, come what may, I've always firmly maintained a sense of pride as a supporter of the Hatters, past or present.

Tuesday night, though, at Forest Green, truly dented my pride after witnessing one of the most abject and sterile performances I have ever seen from a Luton team. Earlier displays at Darlington and Wrexham

were only mildly better in patches. If they were retail products all three would be bundled up and returned to the supplier labelled as 'reject'. That's precisely how I felt as a fan.

As a Club official, and as someone who shares the responsibility for the product this company serves you, I feel unreservedly apologetic for letting every one of you down, in particular the 300 travelling Hatters who made the uneasy journey to Gloucestershire.

Ladies and gentlemen, what we have delivered recently has not been acceptable. It is unacceptable to you, to me, to every member of the board and especially by our manager and coaching staff. Ironically, for once, we are united in our opinion! However, the past cannot be changed and what decisions we make from herein are of paramount importance to us all. We are in control and know what needs to be done to ensure that these performances are not repeated.

Regardless of what methods our supporters use to voice their concerns, opinions and suggestions, perhaps contrary to certain belief, we certainly hear everything. Of course, we would prefer that protests are made without personal abuse, aggression and mistruths. It's only human nature to take more heed to points of view that are objectively made.

It would be fair to say that a short while ago we were just about satisfied with our league position – that is to say that we wanted more, anticipated more but given the multitude of challenges that have plagued the squad this season, we felt our status was an inch above acceptable.

Having gained only one point from the last three games you would be safe to assume that we feel that our standing is below the threshold of acceptance. Whilst any club can experience an uncharacteristic slip in football, what I was particularly disheartened by on Tuesday was the apparent lack of fight and drive from almost every member of the team and the evident lack of care and courage from too many.

We are lucky to have been the Club that appealed to Andre, who joined us from Hinckley on Thursday ahead of numerous other pursuers, including Grimsby. More will follow on Lil's appointment yesterday as Technical Director, but his immense expertise in the game, along with his passion for Luton Town, will add value to the board.

Please be supportive of your team today and enjoy the game! You deserve a great performance.

PILKS

To say it's been a bad week would be an understatement.

First we had the frustration of Saturday's exit in the FA Trophy and then we had the massive disappointment at Forest Green Rovers on Tuesday night.

Before Tuesday's game we had spoken about taking the pluses from the York game and using that as motivation for the match at the New Lawn.

Against York I thought we were excellent, especially in the first half and for the final 20 minutes. Understandably we were all gutted to concede a last-minute equaliser which denied us a crack at extra-time. The carrot of going to Wembley had been dangled in front of us and it was a case of so near yet so far in that competition for the second year running.

As I said, we attempted to take the positives from the performance against York into the game on Tuesday night but, for whatever reason, we just did not perform anywhere near the standard we are capable of.

I've been involved in only a few exceptionally disappointing matches in my time here at Kenilworth Road but I have to say that Tuesday tops the lot. Ebbsfleet at home in our first season in this division, and Southport away last season come to mind. After those results we realised that we needed to improve. We realised that we weren't good enough and that the performance was unacceptable.

As players we have to accept responsibility because it is us that cross the white line and onto the pitch for 90 minutes. We are the ones that ultimately make the decisions, whether to pass, shoot, head or clear.

Tuesday wasn't 'one of those days'. It wasn't a 'bad day at the office'. It was much worse than that and it's up to us to support each other, the manager and the coaching staff, at this crucial stage of the season. There simply were no excuses on Tuesday and the way in which we capitulated was something I had never thought possible.

As captain, I have to take some responsibility too. But this isn't about me, any particular player, or the manager, or board, or the supporters. It's about all of us, as a collective, as Luton Town Football Club.

As you can imagine the dressing room after the past two games have not been happy places. We need that to change come 5pm today.

Today's game is going to be tough but it's vital – absolutely vital – we all work together as one. Supporting each other on and off the pitch.

We dug deep to earn an excellent victory at Blundell Park against Grimsby earlier in the season – the same result and same kind of spirit shown that night would be fantastic.

Over the past month a lot has been thrown at us and maybe Tuesday saw all of these things catch up with us?


What I do know is that my team-mates and I need to stand up and be counted for this afternoon and repay you, the manager, and the board for the support you have given us.

AROUND TOWN

WELCOME ANDRE!

The Hatters were delighted to welcome a new face to Kenilworth Road on Thursday following the capture of Hinckley United striker Andre Gray on loan until the end of the season.

The prolific forward arrives for a fee of £30,000 in a deal that will become permanent in the summer with the Town beating off stiff competition from a host of Football League sides for his signature.

Only 20, Gray impressed against the Hatters in two games in the FA Trophy this term and has bagged 23 goals in all competitions for the Knitters, including strikes against Blue Square Bet Premier opposition in Wrexham, Tamworth and Darlington.

The Wolverhampton-born striker began his career at Shrewsbury Town and made four appearances in League 2 before signing for Hinckley in June 2010. Last season he hit 16 goals in 39 games.



"He's just 20 and while he's ready now he's got an enormous amount of potential to be a very good player in the future."

"He was released by Shrewsbury and has bounced back to be an important part of the team at Hinckley. He's hungry to do well for us and test himself at a higher level."

"Along with our scouts, Alan Neilson, Paul Carden and myself have watched him several times since we played Hinckley in the Trophy and on numerous occasions we've all been incredibly impressed with him."

"It's not just his goal record and speed that stands out but also his work-rate: he never gives the defences a moment's rest."

His good form in front of goal has continued this season and, having been unlucky not to score against the Town this season, his performances in the two games were enough for several Hatters scouting and coaching representatives to monitor his progress several times over the past two months.

Suitably impressed, the Hatters were quick to jump the queue in the long line of clubs interested after he scored in Hinckley's 5-0 win at Colwyn Bay on Saturday and their only goal in a 2-1 loss against Solihull Moors on Monday.

Manager Gary Brabin told Talk of the Town: "Andre is just what we're looking for. He showed us in the two games against us what he's all about: he's quick, strong and direct."

"He gives us exactly what we are lacking right now; a real goal threat, and has proved that, despite Hinckley position in their league, he can still score goals."

SENIOR CUP SUCCESS

A superb seventh-minute strike from midfielder Charlie Henry won the Town a place in the final of the Bedfordshire Senior Cup after victory over Biggleswade Town on Wednesday night

The winger drilled home an unstoppable effort from the edge of the area having cut inside and, having bossed the majority of the 90 minutes, the Hatters held on to record a place in the final where they will meet Dunstable Town at Kenilworth Road on 8th May.

The Town named a strong side for the tie with Shane Blackett, John Paul Kissock and Godfrey Poku all playing 90 minutes. Craig McAllister featured for 65 minutes whilst attacker Dan Walker played his first 45 minutes in five months having recovered from an injury sustained while on loan at Southport.



**WELCOME
GRIMSBY
TOWN**



Grimsby Town come to Kenilworth Road this afternoon off the back of taking maximum points at Hayes and Yeading on Tuesday night.

After some impressive form at the end of 2011 and the beginning of 2012, Rob Scott and Paul Hurst's men have been propelled into major candidates for an end-of-season Play-Off push.

From the beginning of November until the end of February, the Mariners went 14 games without defeat in the league and, although there has been a recent stumble, they will take confidence from not only Tuesday's away victory but the Town's defeat at Forest Green.

The Mariners could go within a point of the Hatters with victory this afternoon. There are only five points currently separating the Hatters and ninth-placed Kidderminster and, as Mansfield have seen recently, a decent run could propel any one of the play-off chasing teams right into the fray.

The reverse fixture at Blundell Park saw the Hatters walk away with all three points with a solid 1-0 victory

and that is the same score that Luton won by last time these two met at Kenilworth Road in January last year.

This Friday sees the first anniversary since the managerial team at Grimsby took control at Blundell Park and they will be looking to acquire another three points to maintain their push and gain revenge for the defeat in the reverse fixture this season.

Grimsby have in Liam Hearn a player most clubs in the Blue Square Bet Premier would like in their ranks and he has been attracting interest from higher up the leagues this season and it is no surprise that with a 26 goal haul teams are interested. Hearn missed Tuesday night's win at Hayes through injury but the Hatters' defence will have to keep him quiet if selected.

Since their relegation to the Blue Square Bet Premier in 2010 Grimsby have finally found some form after a comfortable yet inconsistent season last year. This included a 1-0 victory at Crawley on the opening day.

With nine games remaining it would not be a surprise to see this as a potential dress rehearsal for the Play-Offs in May.

THE VISITORS

■ HISTORY

The club was formed in 1878 after a meeting held at the Wellington Arms public house in Freeman Street. Several attendees included members of the local Worsley Cricket Club who wanted to form a football club to occupy the empty winter evenings after the cricket season had finished.

The club was originally called Grimsby Pelham, this being the family name of the Earl of Yarborough, a significant landowner in the area.

The name was changed the following year to Grimsby Town. In 1880 the club purchased land at Clee Park which was to become their ground until 1889 when they relocated to Abbey Park, before moving again in 1899 to their present home, Blundell Park - named after Peter Blundell, whose money enabled Sidney Sussex College to buy the land in 1616. The club brought two stands with them from Abbey Park, although the players had to change at the Imperial Hotel.

Last season was the club's first outside the Football League following their relegation from League 2.

The Mariners' history is crammed with success: twice champions of Division 2 (now Championship), two Division Three (North) champions, once Division 4 (now League 2) champions as well as FA Cup semi-finals on two occasions, in 1936 and 1939.

■ MEET THE MANAGERS

Rob Scott and Paul Hurst


Former Sheffield United and Rotherham defender Rob Scott became the Mariners' joint manager, alongside former Millers' team-mate Paul Hurst, in 2011. The duo's first taste of management came at Ilkeston Town in January 2009 where they immediately made an impact on the Derbyshire outfit, leading them to ninth in the league to promotion to the Conference North through the Northern Premier League Play-Offs.

Financial uncertainty at the New Manor Ground led to Hurst and Scott's departure from the club, dropping back down to the Northern Premier League with former Football League side Boston United.

Again the managerial pair obtained instant success, a second successive Northern Premier League Play-Off Final win, along with victories in the Northern Premier League Challenge Cup and the Lincolnshire County Shield. Hurst and Scott led the Pilgrims into the Conference North where the side spent the majority of the season in the Play-Off places.

After Neil Woods' departure from Blundell Park in February 2011, Scott and Hurst were named the new managers of the Mariners following their resignation from their York Street posts.

The duo have used their vast knowledge of the lower leagues to assemble a squad capable of restoring the Mariners' Football League status at the end of the season.



IN OPPOSITION

MIXED WEEK FOR MARINERS

Joint Grimsby boss Rob Scott was frustrated with his side's failure to beat Tamworth last Saturday.

The Mariners were held to a goalless draw against the Lambs and Scott was critical of prolific front pair Anthony Elding and Liam Hearn after firing blanks at Blundell Park.

"I'm disappointed with our lads," the joint manager said afterwards. "It might sound harsh, and it's the first time in a while we have pointed the finger, but I question whether they wanted to win the game enough.

"I was disappointed with the front two that started the game; I thought they were both off their usual standards. I told them afterwards and am not saying anything different to the press.

"Too many players we ask to be our match-winners were not at it, and that's the pressure that goes with their positions. They are the go-to players and they weren't at it. I don't think people wanted to get in the positions to get hurt enough to try and score.

"We put plenty of crosses into the box – the stats show 22. We also had around 57 per cent possession, but that's no good if you don't put the ball in the back of the net. We hit the post but most of the time we waited for things to fall to us rather than make it happen.

"It was almost like no-one wanted to make a mistake. You have to want it if you want to achieve things in your career. We didn't do that in offensive areas."

The draw against Tamworth was quickly forgotten, however, when the Mariners beat Hayes & Yeading 2-1 on Tuesday night.

Joint boss Paul Hurst said: "I'm pleased with that. Hayes have picked up of late and were only in the bottom four on goal difference."



"It's a long way to come on a Tuesday evening so credit to the players because I thought we deserved it."

The Mariners held on at the death after having Anthony Church red carded in the final minutes in an incident that led to Hayes pulling one back from the penalty spot from former Town loanee Jamie Hand.

Hurst said: "The lads have said that it probably was a penalty. A sending off? I'm not too sure. I couldn't see clearly what had happened. There seemed to be a lot of bodies around there, but it is one that you've got to live with."

Stopper who made the switch to Blundell Park after a short spell in Dutch football with RSKV Leonidas. A former Coventry trainee, the 22-year-old was on the books of Peterborough where he gained rave reviews but found first team opportunities hard to come by. Playing under Rob Scott and Paul Hurst last season at Boston, McKeown had a tremendous record of 14 clean sheets in his 17 outings for the Pilgrims.

Highly-rated defender who followed managers Rob Scott and Paul Hurst to Blundell Park from Boston in 2011. The York-born defender made his name in the lower leagues of Lincolnshire and impressed at York Street in the past two seasons with his leadership qualities and attacking prowess from set pieces.

Bradley Wood

Versatile defender who joined at Under-16 level from Leicester City. The teenager has impressed at youth level with his ability to slot in across the midfield or defence. The teenager was rewarded with a four-year contract after impressing whilst deputising for Robbie Stockdale. Bradley was awarded the club's Young Player of the Year Award for 2009/10.

Conor Townsend

Young left-back who joined the Mariners on loan from Hull City in October 2011. A calm and cultured defender for such a young age, Conor has impressed with his performances at full back and his link-up play down the flank.

Ian Miller

Experienced defender who joined on New Year's Day 2012, in time to lead the side to victory over local rivals Lincoln City. The 28-year-old centre half played 150 league games for previous club Darlington, having joined the Quakers from Ipswich, and led the North

East outfit to the 2011 FA Trophy. A commanding presence at the heart of the defence, Ian is a real leader on the field.

■ MIDFIELDERS

Michael Coulson

Hard-working midfielder who joined the Mariners from Barnsley in May 2010. The 23-year-old settled quickly on his Mariners' debut at Lincoln during his initial loan spell in Cleethorpes. The former Scarborough man is comfortable up front or on either wing and netted some spectacular goals last term.

Craig Disley



Experienced midfielder who joined the Mariners from Shrewsbury in summer 2011. Coming through the ranks at Mansfield, the 29-year-old saw his career nurtured by former Mariners' caretaker boss Stuart Watkiss, winning promotion with the Stags in 2001/02. A stalwart

FOOTBALL HISTORIAN LEIGH EDWARDS LOOKS AT GRIMSBY'S LEADING LIGHTS

CLASSIC CAMPAIGN

1997/98

Grimsby Town achieved a memorable Wembley 'double' success in 1997/98. Grimsby defeated Chesterfield, Hull City, Scunthorpe, Blackpool and Burnley en route to the Auto Windscreens Shield final, beating AFC Bournemouth 2-1 with an extra-time golden goal. They returned to Wembley in the Second Division play-off final and regained First Division status at the first attempt with a 1-0 win over Northampton Town.

MANAGING TO SUCCEED

Lawrie McMenemy

Lawrie McMenemy managed Grimsby Town to the Fourth Division title in 1971/72. A former guardsman, he played for Gateshead before managing Bishop Auckland, then coached Sheffield Wednesday and became Doncaster Rovers' boss in December 1968. He took them to the Fourth Division title in 1968/69, then managed Grimsby from May 1971 until joining Southampton in July 1973. Plotting Saints' 1976 FA Cup final triumph, he led them to promotion in 1977/78 and the League Cup final in 1979. He managed Sunderland, then was England's assistant-boss, Saints' director of football and Northern Ireland manager.

FAB FOUR

Kevin Drinkell

Striker Kevin Drinkell was leading marksman in the Mariners' 1979/80 Third Division title triumph. Signing professional at Blundell Park in June 1978, he also starred in the Mariners' 1978/79 promotion campaign and successive cup runs. He netted 89 goals in 272 League games for Grimsby prior to joining Norwich City for £105,000 in June 1985 and was top scorer and Player of the Year in their 1985/86 Second Division title triumph. Joining Glasgow Rangers in July 1988, he moved to Coventry City for £800,000 in October 1989 and later played for Falkirk. He subsequently managed Stirling Albion and Montrose.

Tony Ford

England B international winger Tony Ford was a favourite during two spells at Blundell Park. He was the Mariners' youngest League player at 16 years 143 days against Walsall in October 1975 and starred in their meteoric rise from the Fourth Division to Second. Ever-present as Grimsby reached the Milk Cup fifth round in 1984/85, he joined Stoke City in July 1986 and moved via West Brom back to Grimsby in November 1991. He netted 58 goals in 423 League games overall before joining Scunthorpe United in August 1994, then assisted Steve Parkin at Mansfield Town, Rochdale, Barnsley and Rochdale again.

John McDermott

Long-serving right-back John McDermott holds Grimsby Town's all-time appearance record. Initially a trainee at Blundell Park, he made his League debut in Grimsby's 4-2 defeat at Bradford City four months before turning professional in June 1987. He featured prominently as the Mariners reached the FA Cup fifth round in 1988/89, 1992/93 and 1995/96, also winning promotion in two consecutive seasons under Alan Buckley. An experienced figure in the 1997/98 Wembley 'double' success, he became club captain and netted 11 goals in 647 League games before retiring in May 2007. He became their Academy director.

Clive Mendonca

Popular striker Clive Mendonca twice topped Grimsby's goalscoring charts. Signing professional for Sheffield United in September 1986, he moved to Rotherham United in March 1988 and helped win the Fourth Division title in 1988/89. He rejoined Sheffield United in August 1991 and moved to Grimsby in August 1992, finishing top scorer in 1993/94 and 1996/97. Netting 60 goals in 166 League games for the Mariners, he joined Charlton Athletic for a record £700,000 in May 1997 and starred in their 1997/98 First Division play-off final success and 1999/00 First Division title triumph before injury ended his career.


However, Fleetwood popped up in the 90th-minute to bring the Town level following Jake Woolley's cross and it seemed it would finish all square.







"We have to build on that now and bounce back stronger. It was a good performance. We need to lift the lads - they know they've missed an opportunity but we've now got to concentrate on the last 10 games and go a run."

"At the end of the day we'll be stronger as a result of today's disappointment."



"I've hit a good run of form coming towards the end of the season and the Play-Offs are around the corner."







NLP VIEW WITH STUART HAMMONDS



I'd just finished my report of the Luton v York FA Trophy semi-final second leg when I turned on the car radio to find normally exuberant 6-0-6 host Mark Chapman in sombre tone.

David Pleat was interviewed, then Phil Brown – the ex-Bolton and Hull City manager – came on the line.

They were discussing the shocking events that had unfolded at White Hart Lane less than an hour earlier, when Bolton Wanderers midfielder Fabrice Muamba collapsed with no-one around him.

The fact that a 23-year-old professional footballer – an athletic Premier League and 33-times capped England Under-21 one at that – can suffer a heart attack in front of 35,000 people, not to mention millions watching on TV, is unfathomable to many.

At the time of writing, his condition at the London Chest Hospital thankfully appears to be improving. Whether we are religious or not, everyone in the football family – a phrase that has been brought back into the sport's conscience in recent days – will pray that recovery continues.

Because having seen pictures of Muamba with his fiancée, Shauna, and three-year-old son Joshua in all the papers this week, no-one wants to see another family tragically ripped apart by the loss of a supremely fit young man who went to play football and never came home.

The army of medical staff on hand at Tottenham last Saturday will have hopefully helped ensure that's not the case.

As we delve down into the grass-roots, that isn't always so and we have seen in recent years several collapses just like Muamba's end in tragedy.

In April 2005 Folkestone Invicta striker Paul Sykes, 28, died playing in a cup final against one of his old clubs, Margate, leaving behind wife Carly and nine-month-old son Thomas.

Then in September 2006, ex-Mansfield and Forest Green centre-half Matt Gadsby collapsed soon into a Conference North game for Hinckley at Harrogate and never recovered.

A year on, I interviewed his widow, Sarah, on what would have been the defender's 28th birthday.

"We've just been up to Matthew's grave," said Sarah of her and 20-month-old daughter Amelia's morning trip to the cemetery in the Warwickshire village of Newton Regis. She always kisses his headstone, but out of the blue she said 'Love you Dad' for the first time. It breaks my heart."

Gadsby suffered, unwittingly, with a heart condition known as Dysplasia. Such a defect would be picked up in modern-day scholars, as it was with ex-Stevenage winger Mitchell Cole when he was screened as a teenager at West Ham.

But as Sarah Gadsby told me nearly six years ago, these tests need to be done throughout a player's career "like a car has an MOT", and not just at the very top of the game. The charity CRY (Cardiac Risk in the Young) continues to campaign for this end.

As the T-shirts and tweets have said in recent days, we 'Pray4Muamba' – and every other family that's been affected by the strain football can put on seemingly the healthiest of hearts.



In the same amount of matches, 18, then Tuesday's night's shock reverse at Forest Green Rovers means Luton have amassed a mere 19 points from a potential 54.



some way off the likes of Fleetwood and Wrexham, who are both looking pretty unstoppable this season.




