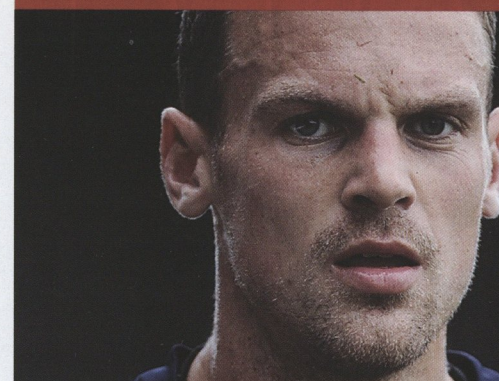

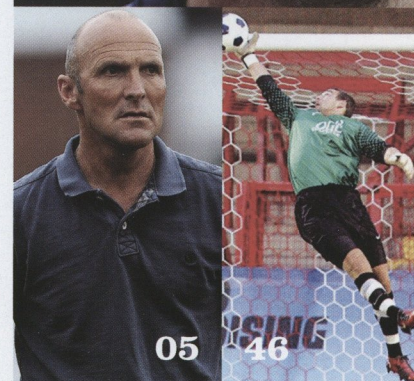

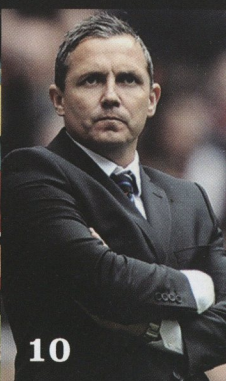

With the new season well underway I can bring you up to date with a number of players who've been in my company over the last couple of months.



Most recently, we were without striker Steve Guinan for the opening day trip to Lincoln City. He suffered an inversion sprain of his ankle in the pre-season game against Stourbridge and will probably miss a total of two weeks' action. He also had an unfortunate accident with some shears, but the less said about that the better!

Seriously, though, our aim will be to have him back in contention for the game against Mansfield this weekend but that will be dependent on how things settle down over the next couple of days.

Against Lincoln, Callum Gittings took an absolute battering in one tackle quite early in the game and both of his shins took a nasty impact. They'll be quite sore for a little while and coming into the game tonight but he should be okay to play.

Anthony Malbon played the final 20 minutes of the game on Saturday having missed the last couple of weeks with a chest infection. Luckily there was no reaction to that and, keeping fingers crossed, he should be okay to be available for selection again tonight. The games keep coming thick and fast so building up his fitness shouldn't be an issue.

Kyle Storer and Jack Byrne both picked up minor injuries recently. Stores still has a bit of a niggle in his knee but it isn't troubling him too much in training and he's down to just a bit of an ache afterwards. He's itching to get back into the team and will be available to the gaffer again tonight.

Jack came into the side at half-time on Saturday and is okay, though he did take a kick to the hip and the mouth in the same incident which has damaged his boyish looks which is a massive shame for him!

Just by way of a quick recap, Chey Dunkley missed the first couple of weeks of pre-season after having surgery on both of his big toenails. He is back and available for selection now, though, and is doing well in getting back up to fitness.

Tom Sharpe continues to work with us in progressing his rehabilitation from ACL surgery. The knee itself is now quite secure and strong so it is a case of trying to get Tom in as much as possible so we can work on football-specific stuff.

We also have a new team Doctor in place in Kev O'Connor - I'm sure he'll do a fantastic job for us and I'm looking forward to working with him.

that was a great achievement and we have brought players in here who we think will be able to improve us.

Saturday's game at Lincoln proved that, tonight's match will be incredibly tough as well and then we welcome Mansfield here at the weekend which is another big one for

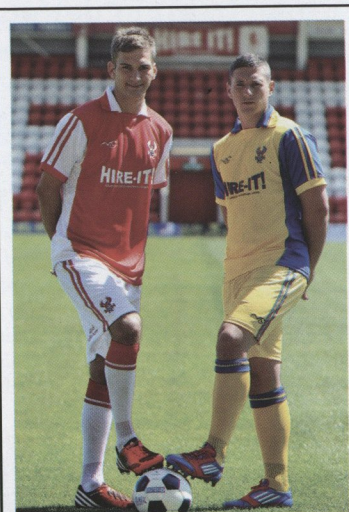

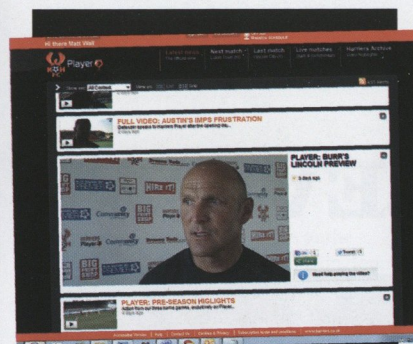

Romulus 2-1 Harriers XI

14.07.2012

Harriers kicked off their scheduled pre-season campaign of friendly matches with this narrow defeat at Romulus.

Steve Burr fielded a number of trial players and Academy prospects for this fixture with a number of his squad having featured in a training ground match earlier in the day.

The first real chance of the day came for the hosts and from the penalty spot – with just 26 minutes gone Charlie Jones was penalised for handball in the area.

Nicky Campbell stepped up to take the effort from 12 yards but was denied by a strong save from on-trial goalkeeper Ed Baldy.

Around ten minutes later midfielder Jack Byrne put Harriers ahead with a close range header after another trialist, Justin Nisbett, saw a shot saved.

Just after the break the home side turned things around as former Harrier Paul Devlin levelled matters before setting up Nathan Jackson to make it 2-1, all in the space of about five minutes.

Harriers had further chances to have snatched an equaliser – Nisbett carving out the best of those – but the Roms stood firm to take the friendly victory.

AFC Wulfrunians 1-3 Harriers

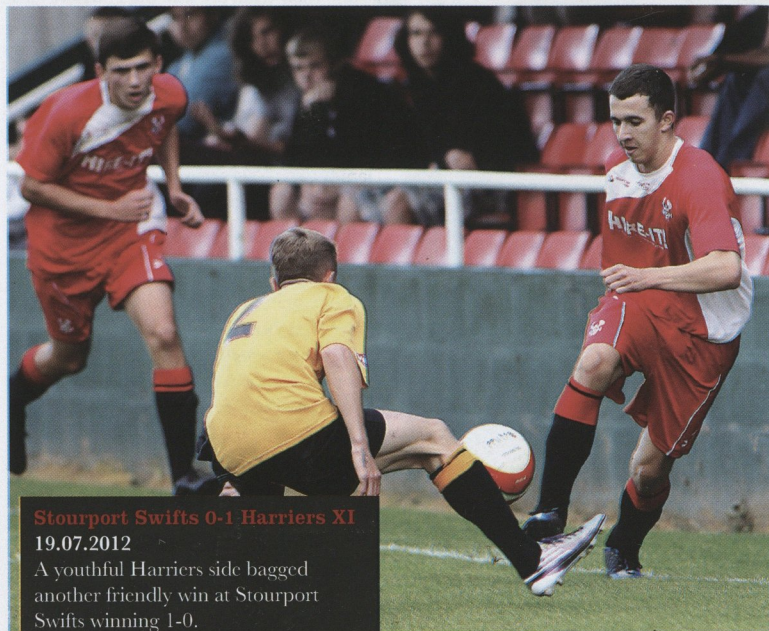
17.07.2012

A strong Harriers side recorded a comfortable 3-1 win at AFC Wulfrunians. The visitors strode ahead with a little over two minutes on the clock; they were awarded a penalty after Marvin Johnson was fouled in the area and Steve Guinan stepped up to do the honours from the spot.

Just a few minutes later, though, the scores were level as Anthony Thompson latched on to a ball up field before dinking the ball over Danny Lewis and into the back of the net.

The lead was restored for the reds by Callum Gittings on 22 minutes; his superb first touch in the area matched by a neat finish into the roof of the net.

The game was a neat affair with very few goalmouth opportunities. Stourport's Louis Bridges arguably had the hosts' best two with efforts in the second period that were well dealt with.

Anthony Malbon was in amongst the goals as Harriers picked up another pre-season win, this time at Stafford Rangers.

Steve Burr's men took charge of this one from the off and were ahead on seven minutes when Marvin Johnson finished from close range after being set-up by good work from Ricky Shakes.

Malbon then took over, netting twice before the break to put his team into a comfortable lead.

First, with 23 on the clock, he latched on to a perfect pass from the middle of the park before holding off his man and firing into the far corner.

He should really have scored again before he actually did – he fired way over the bar after being set up by Shakes once again, but made amends with yet another scary finish low past the goalkeeper with 37 minutes on the clock.

Harriers made several changes at the break and one of those, Danny Pilkington, could have made it 4-0 just after the re-start but his curled effort was just over the bar.

Harriers 2-3 Walsall

Harriers put in a superb first-half showing against Walsall but ultimately fell to a 3-2 defeat at the hands of the League One side after a strong comeback.

The first chance of the night came on 14 minutes as the Saddlers' Adam Chambers tested Danny Lewis with an angled drive, though Harriers had the lead just two minutes later as Ryan Austin's superb, powerful volley flew past James Walker.

With 28 minutes played it should really have been 1-1 as Florent Cuvelier curled a neat effort towards goal that clipped Lewis' post, the home side punishing that miss by making it 2-0 soon after, Marvin Johnson netting with a good finish after a mazy run through the defence.

Johnson, a first half sub, warmed the palms of Walker again on the stroke of half time, though just after the re-start the visitors had one back through James Paterson's low finish into the bottom corner.

The lively Paterson struck again to level matters after the hour, before the Saddlers completed the turnaround and made it 3-2 through Will Grigg on 67.

Stratford Town 1-5 Harriers

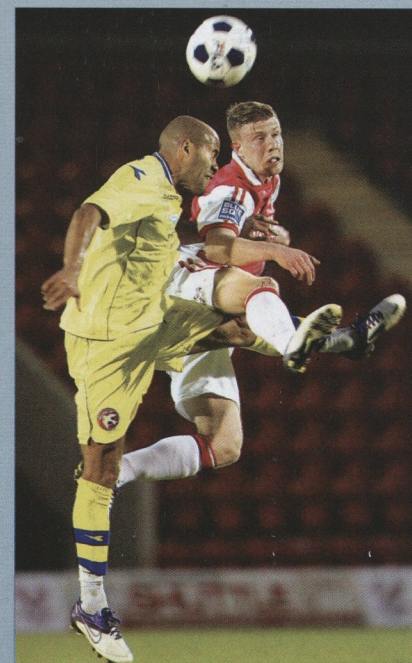
23.07.2012

Harriers were once again comfortable pre-season winners as they saw off Stratford Town with a flurry of goals.

Just seven minutes were on the clock when Lee Vaughan stroked home a penalty and the lead was doubled through Danny Pilkington's excellent lobbed effort just moments later.

On 32 minutes the hosts got themselves back in it as Luke Williams fired in a penalty of their own, but it was 3-1 on the stroke of half-time as Robbie Thompson-Brown's corner was palmed into his own net by Tom Cross.

Into the second half, Harriers added further goals through Ricky Shakes' close-range header and another powerful drive from Anthony Malbon.



Harriers 1-0 Wolves XI

Harriers kept up their pre-season form with a 1-0 win over a youthful Wolves XI at Aggborough.

There was an early chance for Harriers when Anthony Malbon headed wide after a few minutes, Ricky Shakes then seeing an effort hooked off the line with around half an hour gone.



Wolves came close on 36 minutes when a Matt Doherty header was held by goalkeeper Robert Ambrusics, who then kept out Adam Hamill's free-kick.

Shakes was at it again early in the second half as he forced Aaron McCary into a neat far-post save; the game disjointed a little by wholesale changes.

On 73 minutes Johnny Gorman fizzed an effort at goal that was turned around the post well by Ambrusics, the deadlock broken by Harriers six minutes later; an excellent Danny Pilkington free-kick curling around the wall and finding the bottom corner from around 20 yards.

LUTON TOWN

WE WELCOME losing play-off finalists Luton Town to Aggborough for our first home game of the season tonight, writes Rob Fletcher.

Much fancied for promotion the last few years, Paul Buckle's side came within 90 minutes of a return to the Football League in May, but fell at the last hurdle to York City. With other disappointment in recent years also coming via the play-off route, Buckle is determined for his side to put the failure of the past behind them and make a push for an automatic place this year.

Having only taken over in April, Buckle had been at the helm for just a month when the play-off final came around – leaving him little time to get to grips with his side. He joined the club following a spell at Bristol Rovers.

With a solid pre-season under his belt and the opportunity to work further with his players, Buckle will be confident of pushing forward this season. Having achieved promotion via the play-offs with Torquay a couple of years ago, he definitely has the experience to take the Hatters all the way this year – but will be looking to take top spot to save more play-off heartache.

And judging by pre-season results, Buckle and his side seem prepared to make a name for themselves in the Blue Square Bet Premier this season. A goalless draw with Wycombe was followed up by wins against Championship side Ipswich and Leyton Orient of League One. The results against Football League opposition will have given the fans hope that the Hatters can finally propel themselves out of non-league, after a longer than expected exodus from the Football League.

Alongside this impressive run of pre-season results, Buckle has been able to mould his side into one he feels is ready to tackle the new campaign. Bringing in a host of new players, Buckle has plenty of options at his disposal and can boast a big squad compared to many other non-league teams.

Experienced midfielder Danny Spiller is one of the names that stand out in the long list of summer arrivals at Kenilworth Road. He joins the club following his release from Gillingham, where he scored four times in a two-year spell. Defender Garry Richards also joins on a free from Gillingham, after having made over 100 appearances for the club in just over four years.

Also arriving at the club this summer was striker Scott Rendell, who played under Buckle at both Torquay and Bristol Rovers. Having spent the latter part of last season on loan at Oxford, where he scored three times – Rendell was keen to try his luck in non-league again, having enjoyed previous successful spells at this level. Also adding firepower in attack is Jon Shaw, who opted to join Luton after rejecting a new contract at Gateshead. Shaw scored 28 times for Gateshead last season to help them to an eighth-place finish, but decided on a move to Luton in the hope of gaining promotion. Rendell and Shaw have the potential to form a deadly strike-force in the division this year and are set to cause plenty of problems for defences.

Fellow new signing Ronnie Henry has been appointed Captain in the hope he can emulate his achievements with Stevenage. As well as winning the FA Trophy twice with the club, he also helped Boro to the Blue Square Bet Premier title in 2010 and then a second successive promotion via the League Two Play-Offs a year later. After making a total of 329 appearances for the club, he decided to move to Luton to help them with their own promotion push.

As well as the host of new signings, Buckle has been able to hang on to a couple of key players from last season. Striker Stuart Fleetwood, who ended the 2011/12 campaign as the club's top scorer with 16 goals, will battle with Rendell and Shaw for a starting spot this year. Defender Janos Kovacs has also remained at the club, after his impressive performances throughout last season saw him named as Luton's Player of the Year. As well as this, he was also named in the Blue Square Bet Premier team of the season, alongside goalkeeper Mark Tyler – who has also remained at Kenilworth Road, but will battle with newly-signed Dean Brill for a starting spot between the posts.

With such a host of talent at his disposal, Buckle will be feeling confident about his side's chances this season. If the players are able to put the lows of last season behind them, there is every chance that a lot of happy Hatters could be sat atop the Blue Square Bet Premier come May 2013.



IN CHARGE

Paul Buckle

The Hatters appointed Welwyn-born Buckle in April 2012 following the departure of Gary Brabin. He signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road three months after leaving League 2 side Bristol Rovers. Originally moved to the Memorial Ground having managed Torquay United where he won them promotion from the Blue Square Premier in 2009. In his playing days he was best known for his spells in midfield for Colchester, Brentford, Torquay and Exeter.

Mark made 483 appearances in 15 years at London Road and was rewarded for his loyalty with a testimonial against Liverpool in 2007.

IN DEFENCE

Lathaniel Rowe-Turner

Defender Lathaniel Rowe-Turner became Town boss Paul Buckle's sixth signing of a busy summer in July 2012. The 22-year-old is a left-back by trade but is equally comfortable at centre-half and is reunited with the manager having previously worked together at Torquay United. Born in Leicester, 6ft 1in Lathaniel began his career with his hometown club.

Garry Richards

Commanding centre-half who arrived as the Town's fifth summer signing in June 2012. The 6ft 2in defender signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road following his release from League Two Gillingham where he made 122 appearances over four years. A tough, no-nonsense defender, the Romford-born man started his career with Colchester United, who he helped earn promotion from League 1 as runners-up in 2006.

Dean Beekwith

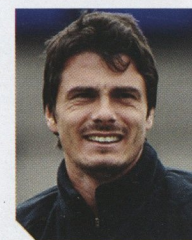

The young winger, who can also play at left-back or in central midfield, came through the ranks at Kenilworth Road and made his first team debut as a second half substitute in May 2008. Capped at U21 level by Wales, Howells signed a three-year contract extension in the summer of 2012.

JJ O'Donnell

Left-sided or central midfielder who joined Luton with St Albans team-mate Godfrey Poku in January 2010. After loan spells at Thurrock and Hampton & Richmond in 2011/12, Paul Buckle rewarded his efforts with a new three-year contract in the summer of 2012.

Danny Spiller

Spiller began his career as a youngster with Gillingham and his displays in the middle of the Gills' midfield attracted Millwall who he signed for in 2007. However, when Gillingham came calling in 2010 the Maidstone-born man jumped at the chance to return to Priestfield and scored four times in 45 league appearances prior to his departure in the summer of 2012 when he signed for Luton.



Adam Watkins

Young midfielder, capable of playing in attack, who signed professional forms at Kenilworth Road in June 2010. A self-confessed Hatters fan, he made his first team bow in a 1-0 defeat at Southampton in the FA Cup Third Round in January 2010.

Alex Lawless

Former Wales U21 midfielder who signed in November 2010 initially on-loan from York City before a permanent deal went through in January 2011. A former Cardiff City scholar he took-up non-league football in Wales before he was snapped up to earn his first professional contract with Premier League Fulham in 2003.

James Dance

Able to play on either flank or as a central striker, Dance began his career as a trainee at Birmingham City but, after being released, he made his name in non-league circles in the West Midlands before catching the eye at Kettering Town in 2010.

Yaser Kasim

Iraqi central midfielder who has arrived on a six-month loan deal from Championship side Brighton. Began his career as a trainee at Tottenham Hotspur before moving to the Amex Stadium. Made his league debut for the Seagulls in May 2011.

AWAY TEAM

IN ATTACK

Stuart Fleetwood

Prolific striker who signed for an undisclosed fee from Hereford United on deadline day in August 2011. Stuart signed for Forest Green in June 2007, and he scored 32 league and cup goals in a season that saw the Gloucestershire side earn their highest league placing.

Andre Gray

Lightning-quick forward signed from Blue Square Bet North Hinckley United on loan transfer deadline day in March 2012. The prolific striker had scored 39 goals in two seasons for the Knitters after being released from Shrewsbury Town in 2010. The Wolverhampton-born man made a goalscoring debut for Luton when scoring in the 1-1 draw with Grimsby Town. Scored seven goals in 12 games at the end of last season to earn his first call up to the England C squad this summer.



Jon Shaw

Prolific centre-forward who the Hatters beat off stiff competition to sign on a two-year contract in June 2012. Sheffield-born Shaw hit a phenomenal 35 goals in all competitions for Gateshead last season, 28 of which came in the Blue Square Bet Premier. In total Shaw netted a hugely impressive 56 goals in 97 appearances for the Heed.

Scott Rendell

Striker who became the Town's third signing of the summer after completing a move from Wycombe Wanderers for an undisclosed fee. He hit 85 goals in his past six seasons and has been the creator of many more during successful stints with Wycombe, Torquay, Cambridge (twice) and Crawley in both the Conference and in League Two.



PREVIOUS ENCOUNTER

FLASHBAX

Harriers stretched their unbeaten run to 13 games but had to come from behind twice in the last five minutes against their play-off rivals to preserve their run.

Unfortunately for them, however, results elsewhere saw Fleetwood leapfrog Harriers to take the last play-off place on goal difference.

The early stages of the game were quite dour with the teams cancelling each other out. Luton possibly edged the possession in the opening half but didn't do much with it, former Harrier Matt Barnes-Homer was subdued in attack and full-back Fred Murray was lost to injury after quarter of an hour.

Harriers took the lead after 25 minutes; Matt Blair made a surging run into the Town penalty area and was upended by Hatters skipper George Pilkington, referee Andy Madley having no hesitation in pointing to the penalty spot. Chris McPhee took the penalty and despatched it beyond the reach of Mark Tyler to record his 17th goal of the season. Before the interval Harriers could have increased their lead; Nick Wright crossed from the left and found Blair who headed back across the face of goal and wide and then in similar circumstances Sean Canham glanced a header wide across the face of goal from Callum Gittings' corner from the right.

After the break Luton came out of their shell more and pressed forward in search of an equaliser which came three minutes before the hour mark. Harriers gave away a needless free-kick 30 yards from goal that Robbie Willmott sent arcing over the wall and into the top corner of the net giving Danny Lewis no chance of reaching. Four minutes later Danny Crow headed into the side netting at the far post

after substitute Jason Walker had flicked on a corner from the right.

At the other end Harriers should have regained the lead on 68 minutes when Gittings' corner from the left picked out an unmarked McPhee who had more time than he realised and headed tamely straight at Tyler.

Keith Briggs headed it back into the goalmouth and Jamille Matt helped it on to Lee Morris who headed in his fifth goal of the season.

The action was not yet over, however, as Luton took the lead again with 11 seconds of normal time remaining; the lively Walker sweeping in a shot from the edge



The drama began with ten minutes remaining; another needless free-kick conceded by Harriers led to Crow knocking the ball through the inside-left channel for Claude Gnappa to chase, he got the by-line and cut back inside his marker and lashed a shot beyond Lewis into the far corner.

'Harriers thought that they had saved themselves a point with five minutes left; McPhee picked out Blair on the right, he mis-hit his cross to the far post where

of the penalty area after Gnappa's initial effort had been blocked by Michael Briscoe. Two minutes into stoppage time Harriers levelled again; Morris and McPhee combined on the left, playing the ball into the penalty area for Matt who knocked it back into the path of Mike Williams who rifled in his first goal in a Harriers shirt to complete the scoring of an extraordinary match.

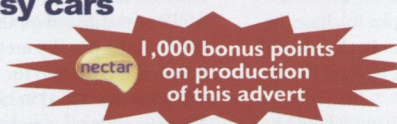

CLASSIC CAMPAIGNS

Football historian Leigh Edwards selects ten post-war Luton Town 'Classic Campaigns'.

1954/55

Gordon Turner scored 32 goals as Luton Town won promotion to the top-flight for the first time in 1954/55. The Hatters began with a 3-0 victory at home to Nottingham Forest and soared up the Second Division table with six straight wins. Gordon Turner grabbed a hat-trick as Luton trounced Blackburn 7-3 and they triumphed 5-1 at Nottingham Forest. Dally Duncan's side maintained their challenge, slamming four goals past Hull City, Rotherham, Liverpool and Port Vale. Tom Aherne and Shay Dunne were ever-present as Luton pipped Rotherham to the runners-up slot on goal average with a 3-0 win at Doncaster.

1958/59

Luton Town were FA Cup finalists for the first and only time in 1958/59. The Hatters were unbeaten in their opening ten First Division games, trouncing Manchester City 5-1 and scoring four goals past West Ham and Preston. They recovered from a lean spell to beat Arsenal 6-3 and Burnley 6-2, then top scorer Allan Brown netted four goals in a 5-1 demolition of Nottingham Forest but poor results over the closing weeks saw them finish below mid-table. Luton defeated Leeds 5-1, Leicester 4-1, Ipswich 5-2, Blackpool 1-0 and Norwich 1-0 in the FA Cup before Syd Owen's side lost 2-1 to Nottingham Forest in the final.

1967/68

Bruce Rioch netted 24 goals as Luton Town won the Fourth Division title in 1967/68. New captain Terry Branton made his debut as the Hatters kicked off with a 1-1 draw at Wrexham and Ian Buxton arrived from Derby in September. Luton lost just two of their first 18 matches and beat Charlton in the League Cup first round, scoring 27 goals in a run of eight successive wins. Allan Brown's side went top of the table with a 2-0 win at Brentford in February and Keith Allen, Max Dougan, Fred Jardine, John Moore and Ray Whittaker also starred as they remained in pole position, clinching the title with a 4-0 victory over Crewe.



1987/88

1969/70

Malcolm Macdonald scored 25 times as Luton Town won promotion in 1969/70. The Hatters had narrowly missed promotion the previous season and Bruce Rioch was sold to Aston Villa for a record fee, with Alec Stock signing Malcolm Macdonald, John Ryan and John Collins. Luton were early leaders after remaining unbeaten in their opening 13 matches, recruiting Chris Nicholl from Halifax and Matt Tees from Charlton. Malcolm Macdonald grabbed hat-tricks in 5-0 wins over Bradford City and Reading, with Luton unbeaten in their last six matches and clinching promotion as Third Division runners-up with a 0-0 draw at Mansfield

1973/74

Luton Town regained top-flight status after an absence of 14 years in 1973/74. The Hatters recovered from a 4-0 defeat at Nottingham Forest on the opening day to hammer Carlisle 6-1, embarking on an eight-match unbeaten run. Harry Haslam signed Alan West from Burnley and Jimmy Husband from Everton as Luton maintained their promotion challenge. Husband netted a hat-trick in a 3-1 victory over rivals Orient, then leading marksman Barry Butlin scored three in a 4-2 win over Preston. Alan Garner and Bobby Thomson were ever-present and other stars included Peter Anderson and John Ryan as Luton finished runners-up.

1981/82

David Pleat guided Luton Town to the Second Division title in 1981/82. The Hatters had narrowly missed promotion in the previous two years and Tony Grealish was swapped for Brighton's Brian Horton. They raced to the top by winning their first three games and hammered rivals Watford 4-1, then Steve White scored four times in a 6-0 demolition of Grimsby. Richard Money arrived from Liverpool and was an influential figure as Luton were unbeaten in their last 14 matches. Leading marksman Brian Stein, Mal Donaghy, Kirk Stephens and Steve White were all ever-present as Luton won the title with 88 points.

1987/88

Ray Harford plotted Luton Town's 1988 Littlewoods Cup Final triumph. Danny Wilson replaced Peter Nicholas in midfield, while Micky Weir arrived from Hibernian and Mike Newell moved to Leicester. The Hatters won 5-2 at Oxford and Ian Allinson was signed from Stoke in October, with Luton losing just twice in 12 matches including a 7-4 win in the return match against Oxford, finishing ninth in the top-flight. They defeated Wigan 5-2, Coventry 3-1, Ipswich 1-0, Bradford City 2-0 and Oxford 3-1 in the Littlewoods Cup before beating Arsenal 3-2 in the final. Luton were also FA Cup semi-finalists and Simod Cup finalists.

1989/90

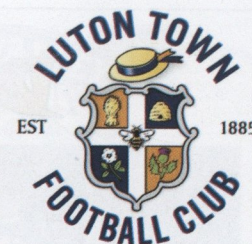
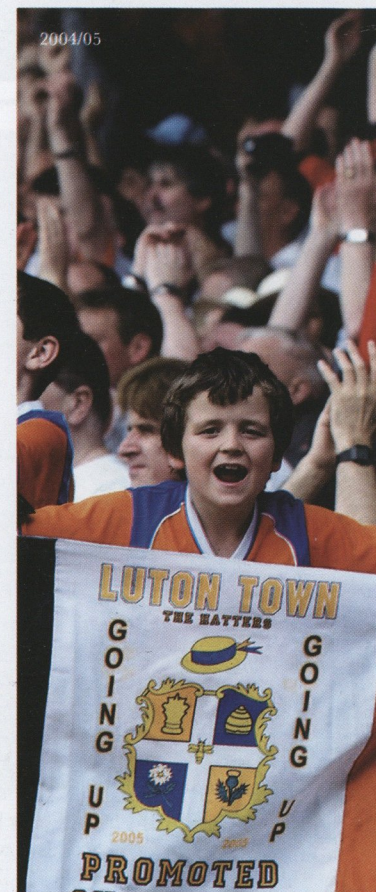
Luton Town were Littlewoods Cup finalists for the second consecutive season in 1988/89. Departures were Brian Stein, Mark Stein and Andy Dibble, while newcomers included Roy Wegerle, John Dreyer and Steve Williams. Luton's first home win was 1-0 against Liverpool and they beat Southampton 6-1 in January but First Division form was generally disappointing, with the Hatters narrowly avoiding relegation by winning three of their last four games. Luton defeated Burnley 2-1, Leeds 2-0, Manchester City 3-1, Southampton 2-1 and West Ham 5-0 in the Littlewoods Cup before losing 3-1 to Nottingham Forest in the final.

2001/02

Steve Howard scored 24 times as Luton Town won promotion in 2001/02. Joe Kinnear's side were early leaders after winning their opening two matches and newcomer Carl Griffiths netted a hat-trick in a 5-1 win over Torquay. The Hatters briefly regained pole position after beating Darlington 5-2 in October, signing Chris Coyne from Dundee, Jean-Louis Valois from Lille, Dean Crowe from Stoke, Ahmet Brkovic from Orient and Dave Bayliss from Rochdale. A run of 12 successive wins, slamming five goals past Halifax and Mansfield, took Luton back to the top with two games remaining but they finished runners-up to Plymouth.

2004/05

Mike Newell managed Luton Town to the League One title in 2004/05. The Hatters stormed to the top of the table, winning 10 of their first 12 games before three successive defeats. They beat Bradford City 4-0 and Wrexham 5-1, then Steve Howard netted a hat-trick in a 4-1 win at MK Dons. The 1-0 victory over Port Vale in December heralded a 14 match unbeaten run and Luton bounced back from a 3-1 defeat in the return fixture to hammer Bristol City 5-0. Briefly displaced as leaders by Hull, they triumphed 4-1 at Torquay and secured promotion with four games remaining. Luton won the title with a record 98 points.

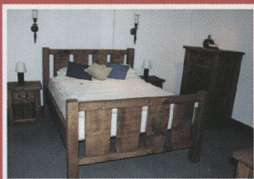

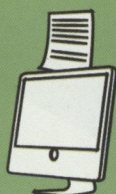

Both teams took part in the Fans' Day at Aggborough in May and with the money they raised that day, £1,200 has been donated to the Club (in exchange for shares) to assist with the new pool table area in the Harriers Arms. They have also donated Delwyn Humphreys' signed shirt from the West Ham Cup tie for display.

2020 Lottery

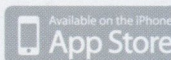
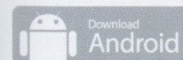

Danny Boy's Delight

Aggborough fan favourite on his return after ten months and tonight's key clash against the Hatters at Aggborough...



THEY SAY a week's an age in football – imagine if you can, then, the delight ahead of tonight's game for goalkeeper Danny Lewis

The custodian is set to feature in his first competitive match at Aggborough since September 2011 and a 1-1 draw with Grimsby Town.

Just days later in training, the 30 year-old took what was thought to be a relatively innocuous bang to the knee – the plan being to 'rest' him for the following weekend's trip to Kettering Town to avoid further damage.

Further inspection of the knock, however, revealed it was anything other than routine – in the coming weeks it emerged the popular stopper had suffered a total rupture of the anterior cruciate ligament.

Surgical intervention was all-but a necessity and his season was over.

With his trademark professionalism and attitude, though, the former Studley and Redditch player took to his operation and subsequent rehabilitation with gusto, under the watchful eye of Senior Sports Therapist at Aggborough, Gavin Crowe.

Progress was, initially, remarkable and the outlook upbeat – even though, as Lewis reveals, the comeback had its set-backs.

"I got a bit down during January and February," he told tonight's BIC Interview.

"You can make enormous progress at different times during such a long rehab period but there were times where I went five or six weeks without really going anywhere and that was hard.

"The lads would come in on a morning and I'd have ten minutes among them and then they'd go off to the training ground and I'd go to the gym.

"That was a bit lonely at times. Gavin is fantastic but there's only so much of him you can take! I'm hoping I won't need to bother him for quite a long time now.

"It's good to be back around the boys and the banter because I've missed all of it."

Almost typically, Dan's return to action has also been less than straightforward; a minor calf injury and the nuisance of a dislocated finger punctuated the progress of his pre-season.

But when able to feature he has been strong, with some impressive performances between the sticks in warm-up games.

Now, though? He's ready to really get back into the thick of it.

Without a doubt he'd have become the latest to have broken through the 100 appearance barrier for Harriers had he not been robbed of most of 2011/12.

His frustration now coming to an end, he added: "It has been ten months now since my op and so the start of the season has been a long time coming.



"That was a bit lonely at times. Gavin is fantastic but there's only so much of him you can take!"

"The friendly games just aren't the same – you can play as many as you like but you cannot beat the gritty nature of a match that has points at stake and the league stuff is most important.

"I've taken a few bumps in the summer but my knee has held up really well – I've just been a bit frustrated with a couple of other things like my finger and calf.

"It has been so long so I guess that is to be expected but I can't wait to get going. There are a few excited nerves in there! but I have always been that way before games."

Looking forward, Harriers' home campaign for the term could barely be getting off to a tougher start with the visit of perennial title favourites Luton Town.

The Hatters, to be frank, have had our number over the years – Kidderminster have never beaten the Kenilworth Road outfit.

Tonight would be a great time to put that right but as ever it will not be easy.

Lewis went on to say: "They have signed a lot of players and we have to try and catch them cold before they can settle in.

"Since I've been back here we have never beaten them and it is going to be a tough game but we do owe them one.

"We drew 3-3 a couple of seasons ago but apart from that it has always been a case of the odd goal – especially in the two games last season."

And so, finally, our interview with Lewis came to the point of addressing the hopes of the side for the forthcoming season.

He's typically positive with the bright outlook that undoubtedly saved his career.

"We seem to have a good team spirit with the way the gaffer likes us to play and, with that, we're always going to win more games than we lose," he said.

"Fingers crossed we can go one better this year and make it third time lucky."

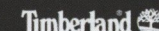

COLLECTING GEMS

The founder of "Programme Monthly" magazine describes fascinating little sets of historic programmes, and the football stories that they represent.

Football fanatics were consoled in the first half of this summer's close season by the European Championship Finals, held in Poland and Ukraine. As is now the norm with European and World Championship finals, two large brochure-style programmes were produced, one for the tournament which was sold up to and including the semi-finals, and the second for the final. For those so inclined, there are variations in different languages to be collected, along with the huge number of pirate (completely unofficial) issues which habitually appear in Eastern European countries.

The European Championship Finals has expanded beyond recognition from its early years, when it was contested between just four countries. The four-year gap between tournaments and its comparatively late start (1960) provides a nice little set of programmes to collect.

A complete set is likely to be quite pricey, however. The first finals, staged in France, saw USSR play Yugoslavia in the Final, and a programme from that match, published by France Football newspaper, would now cost in excess of £500 at auction. Probably rarer, and more expensive, is the colourful booklet issued for the 1964 finals in Spain.

England first qualified for the final round of fixtures in Italy in 1968, when the tournament programme was brought back to this country in some quantities for the first time. The forty page brochure is a very attractive, tall, slim production with a light card glossy cover, and it now sells for around £20.

Not so striking, but similarly priced, is the glossy, green-covered programme issued by Belgium for the 1972 finals. Yugoslavia, hosts in 1976, was still behind the Iron Curtain, and very few programmes from those finals made their way back to Britain. As a consequence, they sell for around £150.

Very surprisingly, there were no programmes produced for the 1984 finals in France. In those days, UEFA adopted a policy of leaving match programme production to the host nation, for their

Championship Finals, and for all three of their club tournaments. As a result, programmes were of varying quality and quantity, and sometimes non-existent (notoriously for the 1970 European Cup Final between Feyenoord and Celtic in that traditionally programme-free zone, Milan). A VIP-only programme was issued for the 1984 tournament in France, which is very rare, and quite expensive.

Four years earlier, the Italians had issued the first large-sized tournament brochure in 1980, in such quantities to make it very cheap to obtain nowadays.

Germany hosted the 1988 finals, and maintained their excellent programme-issuing tradition of producing programmes for each individual match. Ironically, the tournament programme, issued only to VIPs, is very difficult to obtain, and now costs at least £200.

There were programmes for individual matches in Sweden in 1992, then a mixture of group-issues, and individual programmes in England in 1996, and also in Netherlands/Belgium in 2000.

With UEFA firmly in control of their own programmes in 2004 (Portugal) and 2008 (Germany), the two-programme regime was established, and continued this year.

These, and all those back to 1988, can be purchased at reasonably cheap prices (the odd rare issue notwithstanding) to provide a colourful, interesting and varied collection.

ON THIS DAY...

Dan Machin casts an historic eye over the events of this day in years past...

1948 Closing ceremony of the 14th Olympic Games at London.

After a 12-year break because of World War II, these were the first Summer Olympics to be held since the 1936 Games in Berlin. The event came to be known as the Austerity Games due to the economic climate and post-war rationing.

Because of their roles as aggressors in the war, Germany and Japan were not invited to participate; the USSR were invited but chose not to send any athletes. Britain won a total of 23 medals, three of them gold, while the USA team took home 84 medals, 38 of which were gold.



1971 Kevin Keegan makes debut for Liverpool

Keegan got his Liverpool career off to a winning start when he scored 12 minutes into his debut against Nottingham Forest.

Six trophy-packed and often controversial years at Anfield followed where Kopites were treated to 100 goals in 323 appearances, as well as some of the best hair-dos the 70s had to offer.

1948 England bowled out for 52 v Australia at The Oval

The opening day of the 5th Test in the Ashes series was a disastrous one for England. Ray Lindwall took six wickets at the expense of just 20 runs from 16.1 overs as the hosts limped to a total of just 52. Leonard Hutton was the only player to reach double figures, scoring 30.

It was no surprise that Australia went on to win the match by an innings and 149 runs, taking the series 4-0.

1948 Donald Bradman's plays his last Test innings

After England were bowled out cheaply, Bradman came in at number 3 for Australia to a standing ovation from the crowd and three cheers from the opposition. His Test batting average stood at 101.39.

However, he was bowled by Eric Hollies on the second ball he faced, deceived by a googly that nipped between bat and pad. The duck meant he finished with a Test average of 99.94.

1971 New Zealand 14-14 British Lions

New Zealand had never been beaten in a Test series by any side from the British Isles, and only twice at home by anyone else. After wins in Dunedin and Wellington, sandwiched by defeat in Christchurch, John Dawes led his Lions side out on to Eden Park for the final Test safe in the knowledge that they could not be beaten.

A dramatic match ended 14-all, meaning the Lions had achieved what six previous and four subsequent squads failed to do.

1981 Matthew Etherington (birthday)

Currently playing for Stoke City, Etherington began his career at Peterborough United and quickly caught the attention of a host of Premier League clubs.

1982 David Campese makes his Test debut for Australia

"Campo" made his Test debut in the first of a three-Test Bledisloe Cup series against New Zealand in Christchurch. His big match temperament shone through immediately as he scored a try, the first of eight he would notch in 29 matches against the All Blacks.

He could not inspire Australia to victory on the day, but did nine years later in a memorable World Cup semi-final in Dublin.

He got his big break with a move to Tottenham and then went on to play for West Ham where he helped the East London club win the Championship Play-Off Final in 2005.

1988 Enzo Ferrari dies aged 90

Enzo founded the iconic racing team and car maker in 1947, and remained in charge until his death. Ferrari is now by far the most emotive and successful team in the history of Formula One.

1999 Liverpool 0-1 Watford

Newly promoted Watford pulled off a shock 1-0 win against Liverpool thanks to a goal from Tommy Mooney in the 14th minute. Some sloppy defending allowed the striker to pounce, side footing calmly into the back of the net.

The good times didn't last long for the Hornets though, as they would end the season bottom of the table. Mooney, meanwhile, went on to become something of a journeyman, roaming the lower leagues before signing for UD Marbella in 2008.

2010 The first-ever Youth Olympic Games are held in Singapore.

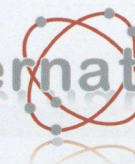

IN PARTNERSHIP WITH STOURBRIDGE COLLEGE

COMMENT

RADIO WAVES

Well, after all the 'excitement' of Euro 2012 and the unbridled joy that is pre-season friendlies, thank goodness we are finally back to the real thing and the first home match of the new Blue Square Bet Premier season.

Despite the almost inevitable disappointment of Euro 2012, there were at least some encouraging signs for those of an England persuasion. The team appeared to believe in what Roy Hodgson was trying to get them to do, which was a refreshing change from the impression most of us had during the Capello era. To their credit, they showed a fair bit of character in the Sweden game, while they proved they are capable of getting the job done in the final group game against Ukraine.

Realistically, in reaching the last eight, England got as far as most people thought they were ever likely to. When you looked at the four sides that reached the semi-finals it is a sad truth that, on a good day, England could probably give Italy and Portugal a game, but they are currently light years behind both Germany and Spain. Given time, Roy Hodgson will undoubtedly get England organised but he is not a miracle worker and has only a reasonably small pool of players from which to select.

With so many overseas players in the Premier League this is always going to be an issue - fewer young English players are having the opportunity to stake a claim for a regular starting place at the top domestic level and so how are they supposed to improve their individual games? I appreciate the FA's hands are tied by European law, but until there is a system that allows more young English players to play regular top-flight domestic football,

England can pretty much kiss goodbye to any hopes of winning a major trophy on either the European or world stage - it is just not going to happen.

Among the other stories that were used to fill the back pages during those long months between England's exit and the start of the domestic season was the decision to leave David Beckham out of the Team GB Olympic football squad. I have to admit my overriding reaction on hearing the news was: 'Good call' as it would surely have been a retrograde step. I am taking nothing away from Beckham's contribution to the game in this country over the past two decades, but he is now very much yesterday's man.

I imagine the only reason they include three overseas players in each squad is to ensure there is a reasonable take up of the tickets. Personally, I would far rather the entire competition was restricted to Under 23 players but commercially they have to have a few big names involved. If you are going to go down that road, then most football fans would agree there are far more deserving cases than David Beckham. Ryan Giggs would certainly be up there while, if he had declared himself available, Paul Scholes' performances towards the end of last season would have earned him my vote.

But the bottom line is that the majority of British-qualified Premier League players would have a better claim than David Beckham for a place in the Olympic squad. Beckham has been out of top-class

football for too long to be considered a serious contender and if Stuart Pearce had included him he would surely have been laying himself open to accusations of playing to the corporate gallery.

David Beckham still played his part in London 2012 by doing his best James Bond impression in a speed boat on the Thames. But even he would probably admit to being upstaged by a combination of Mr Bean and the Queen in what was a fantastic opening ceremony - well done Danny Boyle, you pulled it off.

Meanwhile, back in the real world, it is the return of Blue Square Bet Premier football for another season and a great opening game at Aggborough with the visit of Luton Town. The Hatters narrowly missed out on a place in the Football League when they were beaten in the play-off final by York City. Everyone at Kenilworth Road will be doubly determined to go one better this season and preferably without the need to battle through the play-offs.

Here's hoping Steve Burr's side can get off to the best possible start tonight - while Luton will certainly provide a tough test, they will be well aware of Harriers' form in recent seasons so won't be able to take anything for granted here this evening. The Blue Square Bet Premier promises to be every bit as competitive this season and let's hope Harriers are in the thick of it.

"It was good to see us believing in what we're doing - in a very tight game, a bit of quality won it in the end.

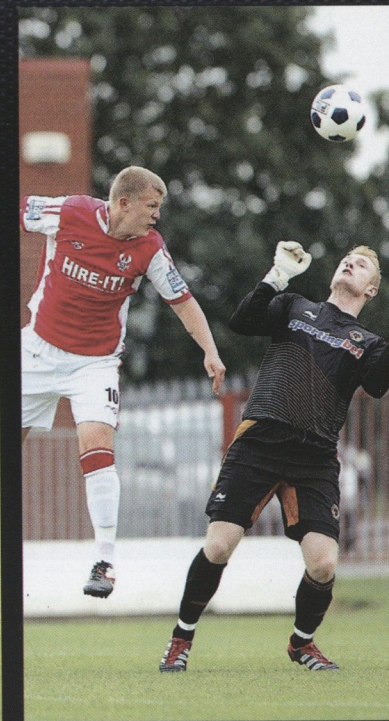
"You look for contributions from players and if you look at Danny over the last two games, he got a goal and an assist at Stratford on Monday and scored a great goal here that's won us the game.

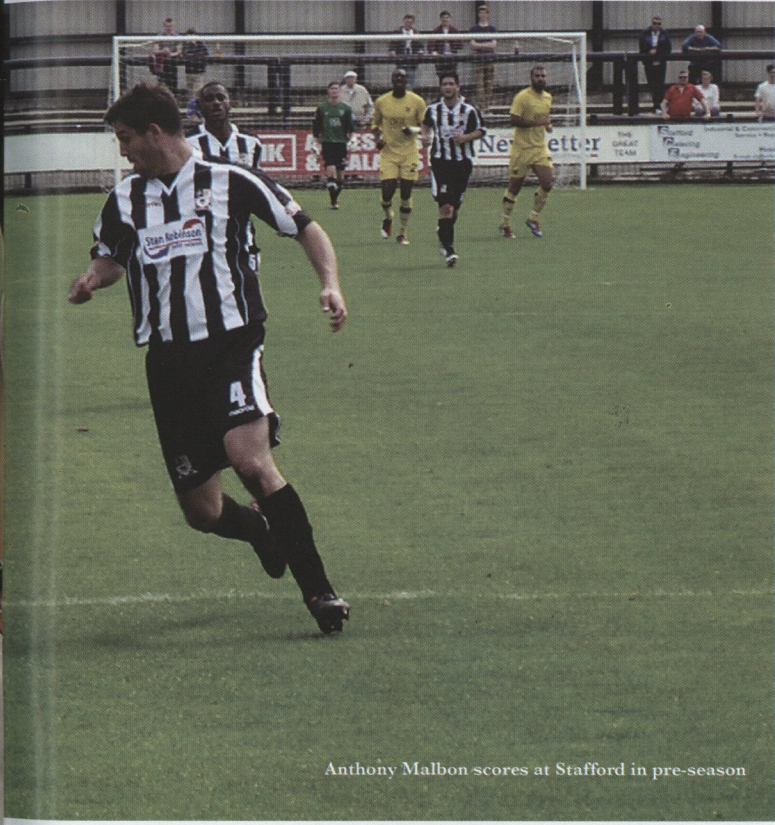
