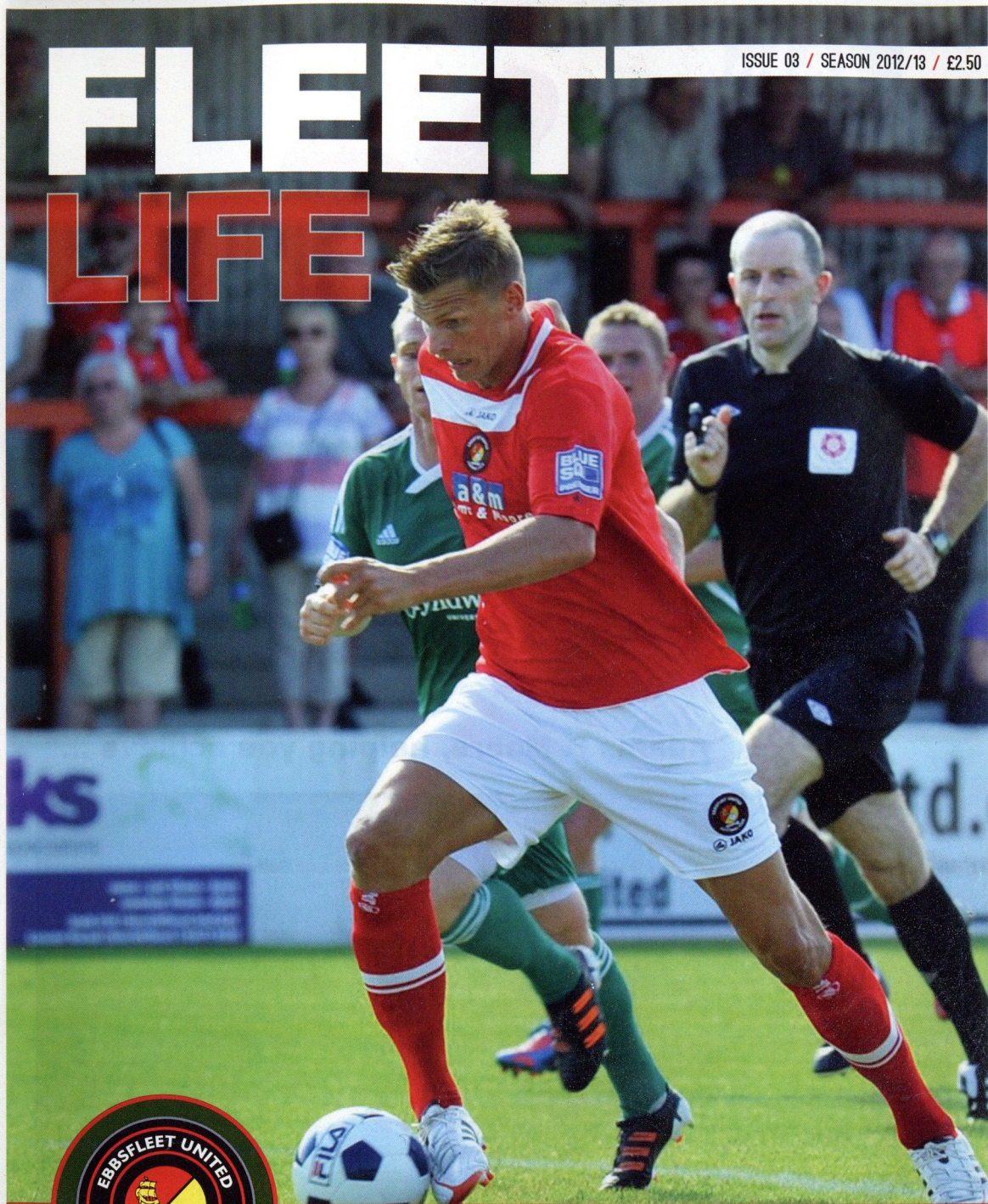

Good afternoon everyone and a very warm welcome to you all. I would like to thank everyone for making it to today's Blue Square Bet Premier league game against Luton Town. I hope everyone has a good afternoon and wish you all a safe journey home.

At the time of writing these programme notes the club has had mixed fortunes in the league with a win, a draw and a defeat in the opening three games.

I thought I would take a few moments to reflect on how the club has performed in terms of the early attendances as this is a very important area when it comes to the income for the football club.

Whilst the pre-season gates were up on last year, for example, the Leyton Orient attendance this season was 617 compared to 432 last season and the Gillingham attendance was 915 compared to 787 last season, the income for year to date July was around £4,000 lower than budget.

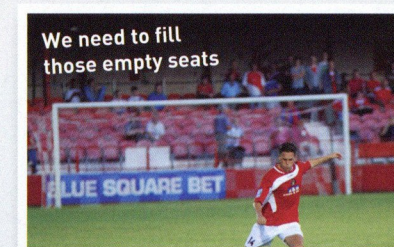
The overall figure for friendly games budgeted for the year is £15,000 and this is unlikely to be achieved because last season we had a well attended bonus game against a West Ham XI.

Whilst only a couple of league games have been played at home the attendances have already been mixed. The game against Braintree on a Tuesday evening saw a crowd of 857. Last season the same game had an attendance of 938, however, this was played on an Easter Monday when we would expect a good



attendance. Normally Tuesday evening games are in the region of around 700-800 fans in attendance.

The game against Wrexham was very disappointing in the attendance was only 843 on a Saturday early in the season. The same game was played on a Tuesday evening in mid March last season where there was an attendance of 990.



I appreciate that there were a few London clubs playing at home on the day, but the attendance was poor. What do we have to do to get a few more fans along to the games? I also appreciate that both ourselves and Wrexham went into the game on the back of a defeat which seems to have had an impact on the number of away fans travelling to Stonebridge Road.

Last season our average league attendance was 1,018 and this season we have budgeted for an average attendance of 1,060. Hopefully, the way the fixtures have fallen this season this should be achievable, but we cannot afford to be complacent about the subject.

If you know a friend who has stopped coming to games or never

been to a Fleet game, try to get them to come along. The football is of a good standard and there are plenty of former league clubs playing in this division which makes it a massive challenge for the club.

I was pleased to report to the board earlier this month that the football club made a profit of around £70,000 for the two months ending July 2012, when a year to date loss of around £40,000 had been budgeted.

This compares to an overall full year budgeted profit of just under £20,000. Whilst there were a few up and downs, costs came in just about on budget which is very good to see.

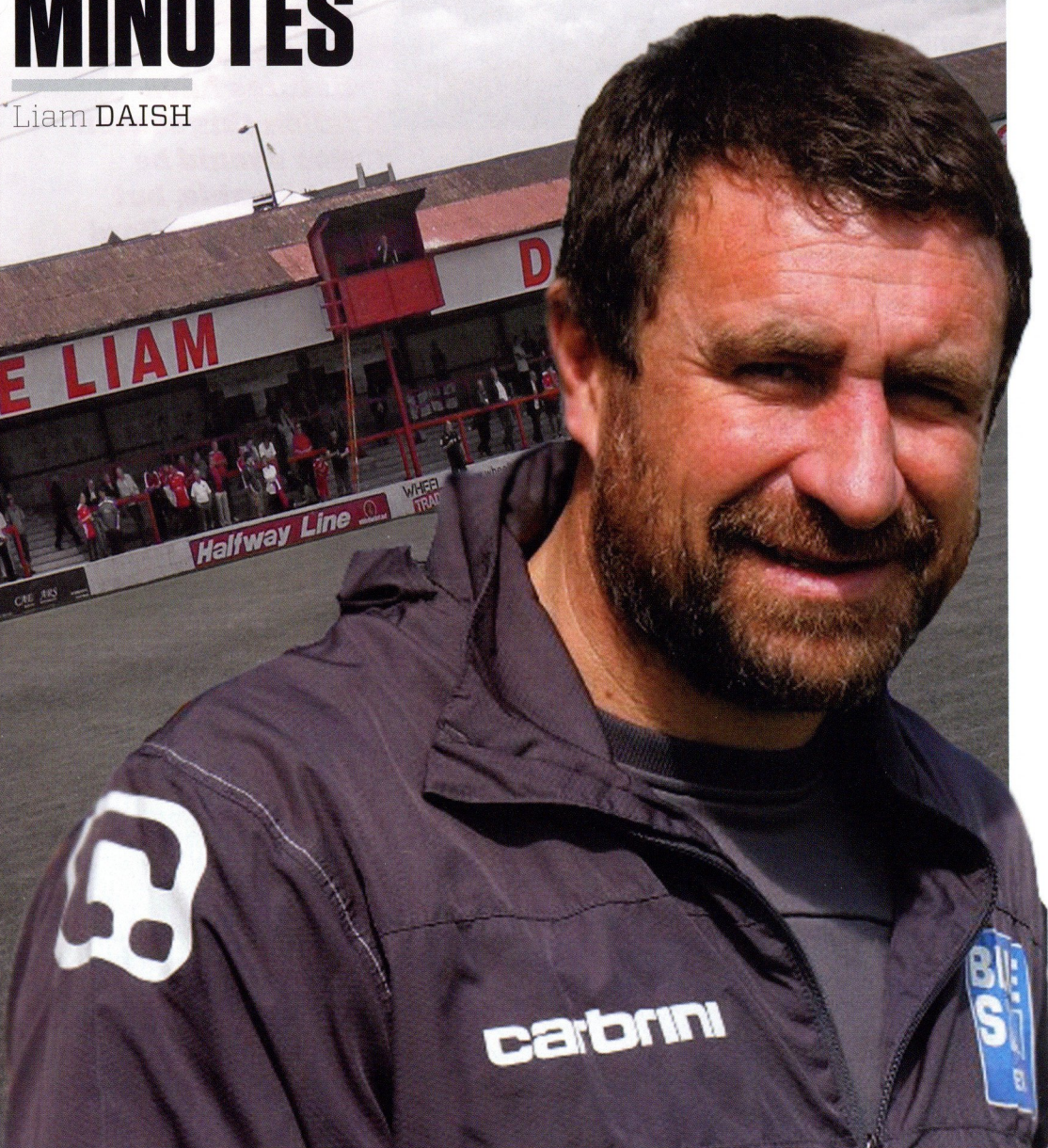
The profit came about from various income streams being better than budgeted, but there were also one or two areas that under-performed. Again, to ensure the survival of the football club we cannot afford to be complacent but it is a positive start to the season.

Be positive and I hope the rest of the season is an enjoyable one for everyone associated with the club.

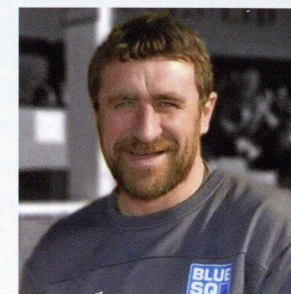
MANAGER'S MINUTES

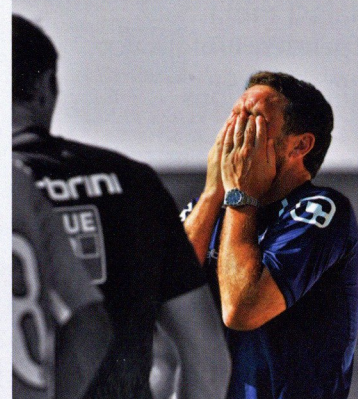

LOUNGE KNIGHTS

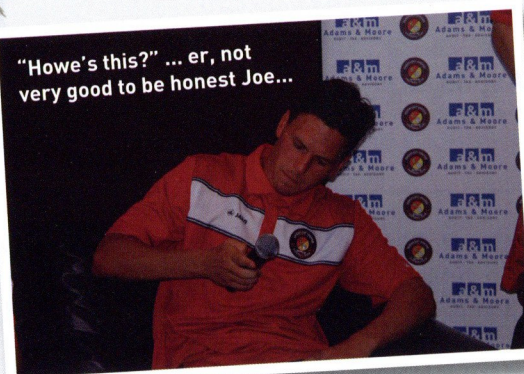

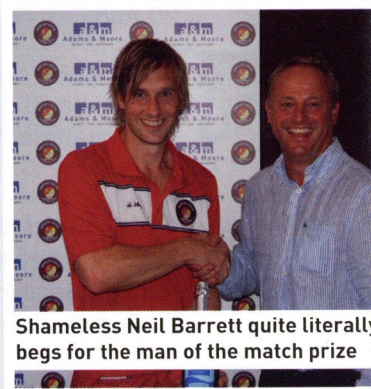

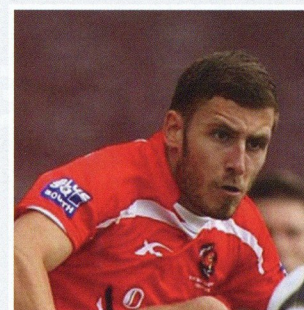
COMMUNITY AND EVENTS

As already mentioned, plumbing, general maintenance, carpentry... all these skills make you much more likely to be able to further your own career, or even work for yourself!

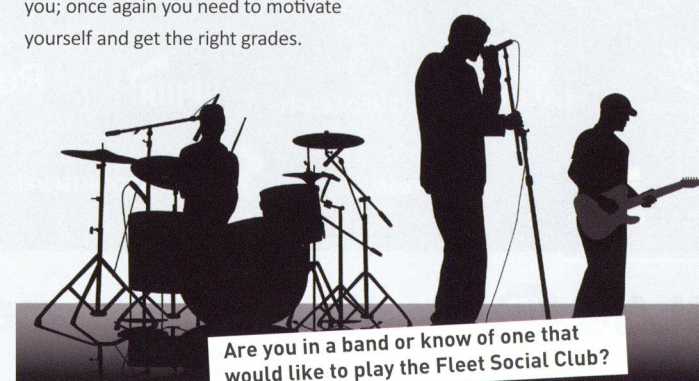
Ebbsfleet United is willing to give schools the opportunity to visit the club and I will be sending correspondence to local schools to arrange appointments.

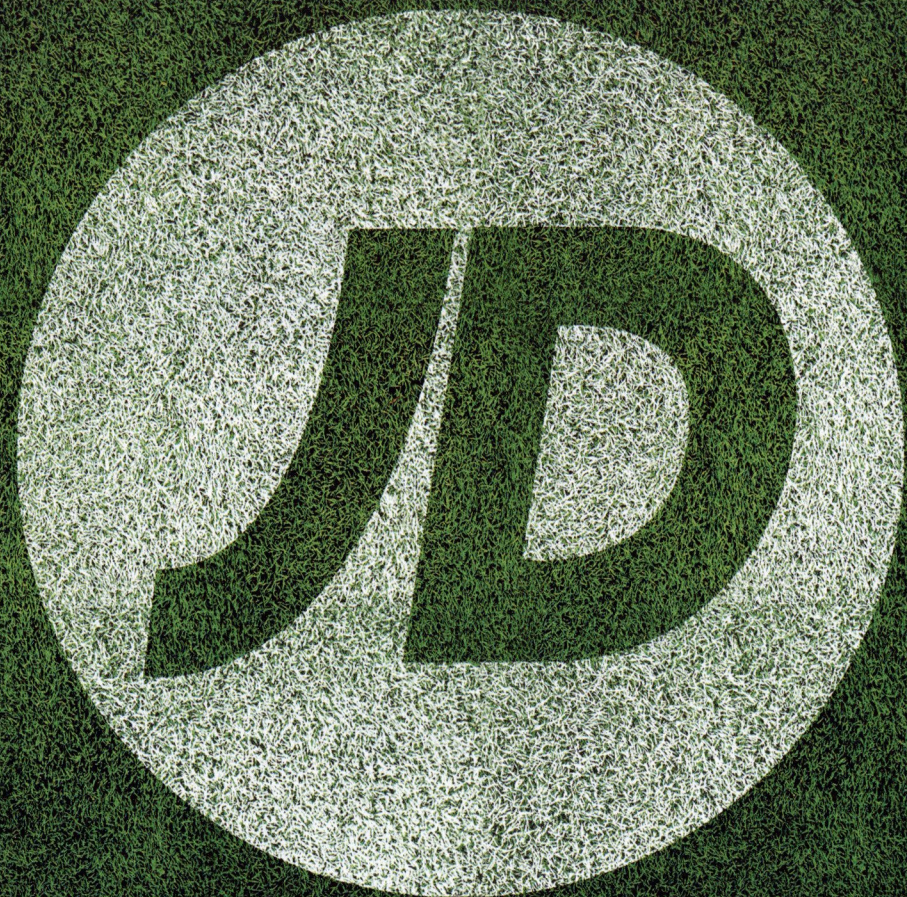

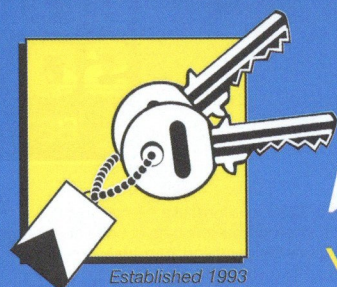

Football truly is a funny game. This season the Blue Square Premier consists of teams that have risen from the lower leagues. Teams such as our near neighbours Dartford, and also Newport County are examples. Both these clubs were a few years ago playing in the Kent and Hellenic Leagues respectively.

Also in the BSP are the 'big guns'. These are the teams that were experiencing great footballing times not so long ago. Naturally, the names of Luton Town, Wrexham and Stockport come to mind. Then, of course, there is also Hereford United. Who can ever forget Ron Radford's screamer of a goal versus Newcastle United in the FA Cup many moons ago!

During the late 1980s Luton Town were a force to be reckoned with in English football. Managed by the tactical genius that was David Pleat, the Hatters achieved a highest Division 1 placing of seventh. A year later they were in the League Cup Final at Wembley against the then holders, Arsenal. With 10 minutes to go Luton Town were trailing the mighty Gunners 2-1. It looked all over

for the minnows. However, a penalty save from Andy Dibble sparked a recovery. Goals from Danny Wilson and a last-gasp effort from Brian Stein ensured a memorable victory in front of 95,000 fans.

During this same period Ebbsfleet United, then known as Gravesend & Northfleet, had been relegated to the old Southern Division (South). On top of this, the club was beset by financial

problems. At that time reaching the first round of the FA Cup, or even getting to the then Blue Square Premier equivalent was just a pipedream.

The season that Luton Town won the League Cup, the Fleet finished fourth in the Southern Division. Although I cannot verify this, I would guess that the team would not have played in front of a total of 95,000 fans all season!

This just goes to show how things can change fairly quickly in the football sphere. You only have to look at what Fleetwood Town have achieved over the past few years to see evidence of this.

So both clubs' fortunes have changed

a lot since the late 1980s, and today they play each other at Stonebridge Road. Naturally, we will be hoping that Ebbsfleet put on a good show and record their first home win of the season. Luton, on the other hand, will be wanting to stretch their away wins to three. It should be a cracker of a game. Last year the Fleet came from 2-0 down to earn a creditable home draw with two late Michael West goals.

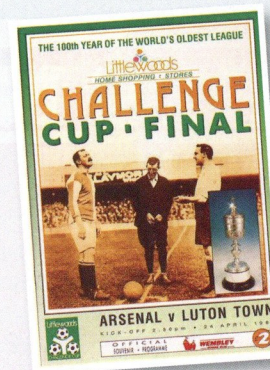
Now for a bit of footballing trivia. Whilst I was researching some of the facts for this article I came across a website that listed all the players that had been bought and sold by a team called Manchester United. Apparently they are quite well known in one of the leagues, though I cannot place them!

Anyway, back in 1898 a player by the name of John Turner was transferred from Gravesend United to the Red Devils. It is safe to assume that the

transfer price would have been the cost of a train ticket rather than the millions paid out to the top players

nowadays. Gravesend United were, of course, the predecessors once removed of Ebbsfleet United.

Entitled 'Big Hands Big Heart' and superbly written by one of Fleetwood Town's media men, David Mitchell, it

tells the story of how 'Nico' fulfilled his dream of going from semi-pro football to the top of the English game.

Nixon recalled how he was working for a car valeting business in 1983 when ex-Manchester United and England keeper Gary Bailey's motor was brought in for a clean.

Nixon – then playing for Curzon Ashton – wanted a bit of the Sierra Sapphire lifestyle, and went straight to Maine

Road, then home of his beloved Manchester City, after finishing his shift.

Met by City legends Tony Book, Denis Law and Ken Barnes in reception, he asked

for a trial. A scout watched him play in the North West Counties League the following day, then invited him to play in a reserve game at the stadium where he had watched his heroes from a being small boy.

To cut a long story short, Nixon earned a contract and went onto play 84 times for the Sky Blues. He then enjoyed great success at Tranmere Rovers, earning cult status over a decade, and Stockport before more recently

working as goalkeeper coach at Fleetwood and now Macclesfield.

Picking up The NLP after returning home last weekend, I then read an excellent interview my colleague Matt Badcock had done with current Stockport player Joe Connor.

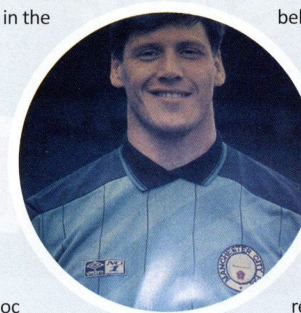
After eight years studying and playing soccer in America, the 26-year-old returned to his native Stockport last November with his pregnant wife and child.

His granddad Jack and dad Jim had both played for the Hatters, so after seeing County had been hammered 7-0 at Grimsby, he thought "I'm going to see if I can go and play for them".

The midfielder turned up at the training ground, asked if he could join in and was told 'No'. But he stayed to watch to "see what the standard was like", and when they needed an extra man, he was invited onto the training pitch.

Connor must have impressed Jim Gannon, because the Edgeley Park boss soon signed him and has since made him his captain.

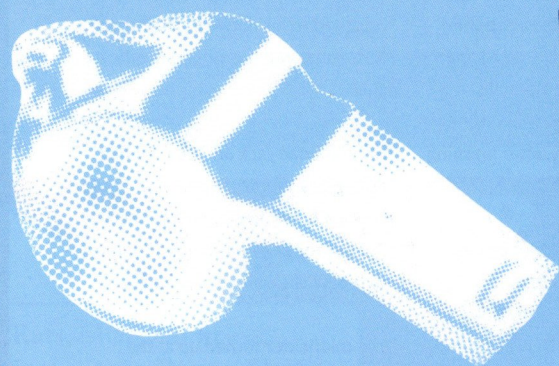

If the opening fixtures of this season in all leagues are anything to go by, us fans could be in for an absolute feast of goals. Obviously, it's not so good if we're on the receiving end of a high-scoring game but it's a great spectacle for supporters to see from the stands.

Let's be honest, no-one likes a 0-0 scoreline! It says very little about the quality of the teams involved other than it being either a) a tight encounter between two quality competitive sides whose defences were impenetrable or b) two sides whose strike forces were so poor that they barely threatened the opposing keeper at all.

What we do like to see is the lads come from behind and steal victory in the dying minutes of the game don't we? The greater the goal tally for a match, the more entertaining it is for us.

There are a number of factors that can determine a high-scoring game, strikers who are absolutely on fire and/or defenders who are actually half-asleep. One or more red cards can often help one side's attacking ability too. We all love to see the ball in the back of the net, as long as it's the opposition's net that is!

Saturday 11th August saw the opening fixtures of the Blue Square Bet Premier League and Round 1 of



the newly named Capital One Cup. Of the 11 BSBP games on this day there were 39 goals scored, that's an average of 3.54 goals per game – great for the spectators. The 13 Capital One Cup Fixtures on the same day (excluding penalties) saw 35 goals scored in 13 games averaging 2.69 goals per game.

On the Tuesday (14th August) after this Goal Fest weekend, the averages per game were even better! Again it was the BSBP and Capital One Cup which provided the net-swellers.

The 12 BSBP fixtures on this Tuesday evening provided the paying customers with a total of 35 goals (2.91 goals per game). Those at the 18 Capital One Cup fixtures on the same night were treated

to an incredible 64 goals averaging 3.55 goals per game!

Sadly, those at the Oxford United v Bournemouth game saw NO goals at all as their game ended 0-0. Those at any of the other 17 fixtures witnessed goals galore, especially at Derby County's Pride Park where 10 goals were scored (in regular time) in the game v Scunthorpe United

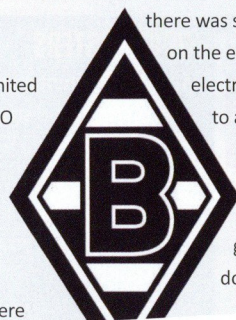
which ended 5-5 after the 90 minutes. Derby had been 3-0 to the good at half time, only for Scunthorpe to fightback for the draw and eventually won the tie on penalties.

The opening day of the Barclays Premier League also brought about a few high-scoring fixtures although the average goals per game was only 2.71 over the seven fixtures played. It makes you wonder why fans of Premiership clubs pay silly money to watch these overpaid 'superstars' doesn't it?

The scoreboard operators at these opening games must have had their work cut out as the goals were flying in! Not so bad if you've got the modern day electronic scoreboard where you just key in the scorer and your job's done. They don't know how easy they've got it nowadays do they?

They should spare a thought for the scoreboard 'monitor' at a German Bundesliga game back in 1978. The score between Moenchengladbach and Dortmund had reached 6-0 and the scoreboard was already choc-a-block with the goalscorers' names. A further six goals were scored making it 12-0 to Moenchengladbach but there was simply no more room left on the electronic scoreboard (yes, electronic, even way back in 1978) to add the later goalscorers.

Hopefully, we'll see a similar scoreline in today's game? Though we'd doubtless settle for a simple 1-0 victory and all three points surely, wouldn't we?

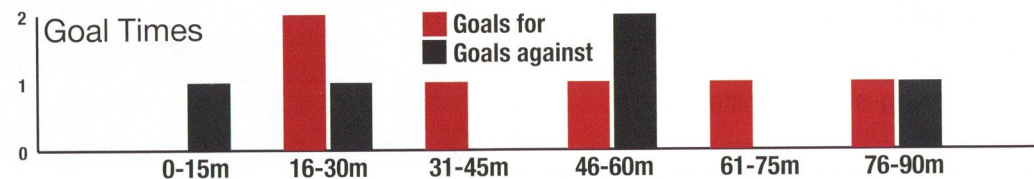

THE OTHER SIDE: LUTON TOWN

IN GOAL

MARK TYLER

Hugely experienced goalkeeper who signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road in June 2009 to become Mick Harford's fifth signing of the summer following his release from Peterborough United.

Tyler made 483 appearances in 15 years at London Road and was rewarded for his loyalty with a testimonial against Liverpool in 2007.

A former England Youth international, Tyler was handed the number one shirt by the Hatters boss who admitted he'd failed in an attempt to sign the stopper the previous summer.

After a hugely successful two years between the sticks at Kenilworth Road, he signed a new contract in the summer of 2011.



MANAGER PAUL BUCKLE

The Hatters appointed Welwyn-born Paul Buckle in April 2012 following the departure of Gary Brabin. He signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road three months after leaving League 2 side Bristol Rovers.

He originally moved to the Memorial Ground having managed Torquay United where he won them promotion from the Blue Square Premier in 2009.

After a 17th-place finish in League 2 in 2009/10, Buckle guided the Devon club to the League 2 play-off final the following season where they were defeated narrowly by Stevenage at Old Trafford. In his playing days he was best known for his spells in midfield for Colchester, Brentford and Torquay and Exeter.

DEAN BRILL

No stranger to Kenilworth Road having made 97 appearance for the Hatters after rising through the ranks as a youngster. He left the club in 2009 for Oldham where he spent two seasons before signing for Barnet last season, who he helped keep in the Football League.

IN DEFENCE

LATHANIEL ROWE-TURNER

Defender Rowe-Turner became Town boss Paul Buckle's sixth signing of a busy summer in July 2012. The 22-year-old is a left-back by trade but is equally comfortable at centre-half and is reunited with the manager having previously worked together at Torquay. Having failed to make a first-team appearance for hometown club, Leicester City, in 2010 he was released by the Foxes and in February of that

year he joined Buckle at Plainmoor. In his first season on the Devon coast the youngster appeared 10 times and scored once. Last season Lathaniel made 24 appearances in all competitions prior to his release by manager Martin Ling.

GARRY RICHARDS

Commanding centre-half signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road this summer following his release from League 2 Gillingham where he made 122 appearances over four years. A tough, no-nonsense defender, he started his career with Colchester United, who he helped earn promotion from League 1 as runners-up in 2006. In August 2007 he made the short hop south to join Southend but after just six months Richards made the move to Priestfield.

GREG TAYLOR

Left-back signed from Darlington in November 2011 and made his Town debut in the 1-1 draw at Cambridge United. Started his career as a junior with Northampton before he signed for Kettering Town. He then joined Darlo and is also capable of playing right-back and in central midfield.

ALEX LACEY

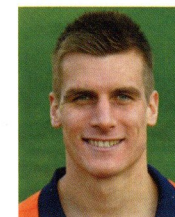
Up-and-coming centre-half who made his first team debut as a 17-year-old in the FA Trophy first round tie against Welling, earning the man-of-the-match award. He signed a professional contract to remain at Kenilworth Road until the end of the 2011/12 season which was extended to a three-year deal by Paul Buckle in the summer of 2012.

DEAN BECKWITH

Centre-back Beckwith became the Hatters' second signing of the summer of 2011 following his release from League 2 side Northampton Town. The commanding 6ft 3in defender has experienced promotion from the Blue Square Bet Premier before having been

part of the Hereford United side that won the Play-Off Final against Halifax Town in 2008. The defender turned down offers from a number of Football League clubs but was delighted to agree terms to bolster the Hatters' defensive options.

JANOS KOVACS



Hungarian defender who signed on-loan for his second spell at the club in September 2011.

Formerly with Chesterfield and Lincoln, Kovacs first signed in January 2010 before signing for Hereford United in the summer of that year. Signed a 18-month contract in January 2012.

RONNIE HENRY

The Hatters unveiled influential defender Ronnie Henry as their first signing of the summer in June 2012. The former Stevenage captain signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road to also become Paul Buckle's first recruit as Town boss. In the season just passed, Henry made 40 appearances in League 1, helping Stevenage to another play-off appearance. But, having received an offer of a new contract with Boro and from a string of Football League sides, he opted to sign on the dotted line for the Town – and was named captain for the 2012/13 season by Paul Buckle.

IN MIDFIELD

JAKE HOWELLS

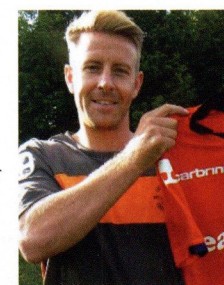
May that year. Capped at U21 level by Wales, Howells signed a three-year contract extension in the summer of 2012.

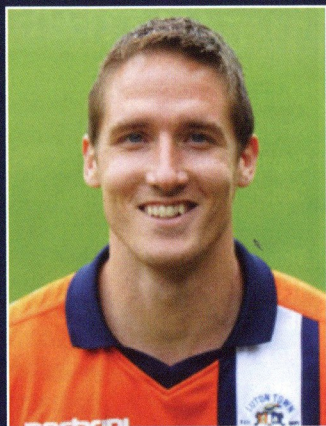

JON SHAW

Prolific centre-forward who the Town beat off stiff competition to sign on a two-year contract in June 2012. Shaw hit a phenomenal 35 goals in all competitions for Gateshead in 2011/12 – 28 of which came in the Blue Square Bet Premier. In total Shaw netted a hugely impressive 56 goals in 97 appearances for the Heed – 45 of them coming in 81 league games. In the past two campaigns he has scored four hat-tricks, including back-to-back trebles in late September 2011.

Spiller, he signed a two-year deal at Luton in June 2012. His displays in the middle of the Gills' midfield helped the Kent club achieve several mid-table finishes in the Championship and he signed for Millwall in 2007. Spiller failed to settle at the New Den but he still managed to score once in six starts for the Lions, and, after leaving the London club, he enjoyed short spells with Wycombe, Welling and Dagenham & Redbridge. 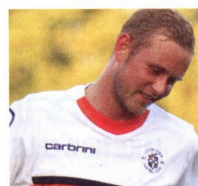

He made a goalscoring debut for the Town when scoring in the 1-1 draw with Grimsby and scored seven goals in 12 games at the end of last season to earn his first call up to the England C squad this summer.

SCOTT RENDELL

Striker who was a thorn in Fleet's side while at Cambridge, he became the Town's third signing of the summer after completing a move from Wycombe Wanderers for an undisclosed fee. STAR GRADUATE

Powerful midfielder Bruce Rioch was capped 24 times by Scotland after leaving Luton Town.

Born in Aldershot, where his father was a regimental sergeant major, Bruce was raised in Luton and became an apprentice at Kenilworth Road.

He turned professional in September 1964 and made his League debut in Luton's 1-0 defeat at home to Southend United two months later. His first League goal came in the Hatters' 3-2 defeat at Bradford City in December 1965 and he soon attracted interest from bigger clubs with his pace, power and fierce shooting. He also had great competitiveness and a ruthless streak.

Bruce was Luton's leading marksman in 1966-67 and again in 1967-68 when he missed just two matches as the Hatters stormed to the Fourth Division title.

Rioch was also an important figure as Luton narrowly failed to win promotion again in 1968-69, netting 47 goals in 149 League games before moving to Aston Villa for a then club record £100,000 in July 1969. His younger brother Neil, an England Youth international, followed him from Luton to Villa shortly afterwards.

Bruce played for Villa in

He may be more familiar to younger fans as manager of Bolton and for a brief stint as Arsenal boss, but Bruce Rioch was one of Luton Town's finest-ever players. Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles him

the 1971 League Cup final and starred in their 1971-72 Third Division title triumph. Moving to Derby County for £200,000 in February 1974, he took over from the injured Henry Newton and helped Dave Mackay's side to finish third in the top-flight that season. Rioch was ever-present and leading marksman with 15 League goals in

1974-75 when Derby won the League Championship for the second time in four seasons.

Towards the end of that title campaign, he scored one of his most memorable goals with a surging run from near the halfway line against

Newcastle United at St James' Park. The following season, he hit a thunderous free-kick in the FA Cup sixth round win at home to Newcastle, then scored four goals in Derby's remarkable 8-2 First Division victory over Spurs in October 1976.

Rioch could play for Scotland through parental qualification and made his international debut in their 1-0 victory over Portugal at Hampden Park in May 1975. He scored his first international goal to clinch Scotland's 2-2 draw with Wales four days later and went on to become the first English-born player ever to captain Scotland, leading them in the 1978 World Cup finals in Argentina.

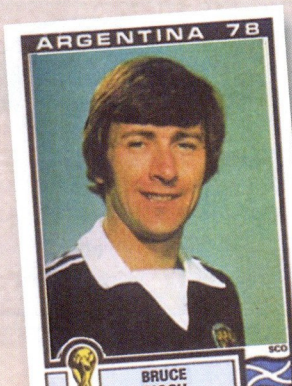
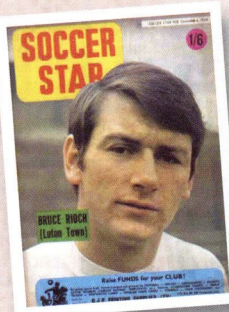
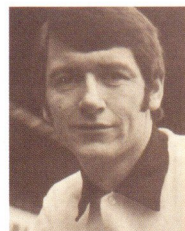
Sold to Everton for £180,000 in December 1976, Rioch returned to Derby a mere 11 months later but fell out with Tommy Docherty and Colin Addison and had loan spells at Birmingham City and Sheffield United.

After that he played for Seattle Sounders, becoming Torquay United's player-coach in October 1980 and later their player-manager. He then took charge of Middlesbrough, managing them from the Third Division to First in consecutive seasons.



After a spell as Millwall's manager, he became Bolton Wanderers' boss in May 1992 and plotted two promotion successes, also leading them to the 1995 League Cup final. He spent a year as Arsenal's manager before the appointment of Arsene Wenger, signing Dennis Bergkamp and David Platt, then managed Norwich City, Wigan Athletic and Danish side Aalborg.

More recently he has been involved with his local non-league side, Falmouth Town. His son Greg was a regular foe of the Fleet, playing for Shrewsbury and Northwich (indeed he was once sent off for the latter against the Fleet for a foul on Toastao Kwashi). He is also the uncle of former West Ham midfielder Matty Holmes.

One of three ex-Bees in the Fleet squad, Ryan Blake is one of a rare breed who finds the move to part-time football has its benefits. We find out more about his background and stifle a giggle at the thought he used to play for a team called The Anglo-Saxons.

BACK TO BLAKE

Ryan Blake was born in Ashford, Middlesex, and has lived in and around that area for most of his life. He attended Laleham primary school and later progressed to Thamesmead School.

He began his footballing career at the tender age of seven, when he started going to a Saturday coaching school. Two of the dads then decided to form their own team and Ryan was one of the chosen few. The team went by the unlikely title of The Anglo Saxons and Ryan stayed with them for about a year before he joined Chelsea's youth setup where he stayed until he was 14. Ryan recalls being released as pretty devastating and says that without his dad's support and encouragement, that may well have been it as far as football was concerned. Indeed many of the lads that were with him at Chelsea no longer play football at all.

Ryan, however, was fortunate enough to continue and was asked to join Brentford at U15 level, where he was offered a scholarship for two years which was then extended for a further year. It was during this time that Ryan first joined Ebbsfleet United on loan, making his debut in a 4-2 win at Hampton & Richmond in January 2011.

Like so many footballers, Ryan also took part in other sports growing up and did a fair amount of athletics, in particular long-distance running. But football always came first and from the start he found his natural position at full back, initially playing on the right.

By far the biggest influence and support in his life comes from his parents, who are always there for him and clocked up the mileage, especially when he was with Chelsea. Added to this list is his youth team manager

who encouraged and helped Ryan develop towards senior football – he was helped with lots of things, from how to deal with disappointment, conduct himself on the field of play and how to maximise the enjoyment from a football career.

Ryan has a sister and brother, who (aged 8) is showing plenty of promise.

He also had some kind words for the Brentford fans; even though he did not make that many first-team appearances, he always felt they were supportive, even when he was on the bench. He also feels the fans at Ebbsfleet offer good support and hopes he will become a firm favourite with supporters.

To keep himself fit, especially in that all-important pre-season period, Ryan does running, weight-training at the gym every other day as well as generally working himself back to

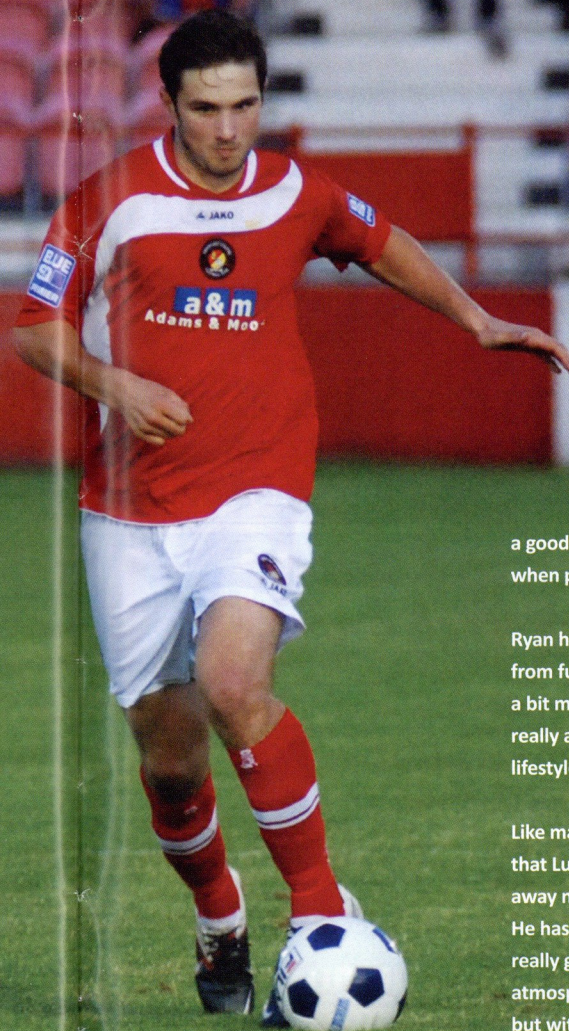

a good level of fitness ready to start when pre-season begins.

Ryan has rather enjoyed the change from full time; he says it gives him a bit more freedom and he has really appreciated the change to his lifestyle.

He has heard that the fans at Luton really get behind their team and the atmosphere can be intimidating, but with their high expectations, a smash and grab goal for the Fleet may quieten them down. He can put that to the test this afternoon with any luck!

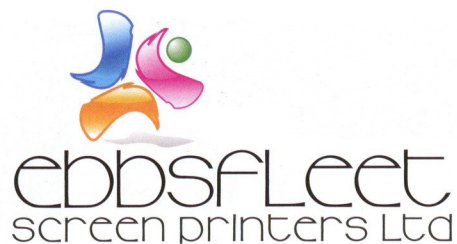
Going forward, Ryan would like to cement a place in the first team and would love to see the club gain promotion into the league.

Ryan has settled well at the club, having already met most of the lads – and he knows Nathan and Liam (Bellamy) very well through their time at Brentford.

Fleet missed the chance to take all three points with a late penalty miss but will otherwise be happy with a point after coming from behind against Wrexham.

With Patrick Ada's red card rescinded by the FA, he was eligible to play while elsewhere in defence Craig Stone returned to action after injury, meaning Ryan Blake dropped to the bench. Wrexham came out with more purpose and were in front inside four minutes. Fleet cleared one attack but only as far as Keates who cut open the defence

It was Phipp again who drove Fleet forward as the home side looked drained. He singlehandedly unlocked the visitors' defence on 58 minutes, shrugged off Riley's challenge and forced goalkeeper Mayebi into a good block in the six-yard box.

Liam Daish made a double change on the hour, Lanre Azeez and Phil Walsh

replacing Bellamy and Nathan Elder. And Fleet got back into things courtesy of a Mayebi error on 70 minutes. The keeper appeared to have gathered a ball 10 yards from goal but Ashikodi took advantage of a fumble and as Mayebi lay on the floor, Enver-Marum tucked a shot over him and into the net.

The expected onslaught from Wrexham never quite materialised though Ada and Howe had to be alert to clear the danger on several occasions. And with

three minutes left, the Fleet almost grabbed an unlikely win. Riley was adjudged to have handled inside the box, though it appeared to be right on the line, and after Wrexham protests, Ashikodi stepped up to the spot. But Mayebi turned from villain to hero as he got down low to his left to push the penalty away.

So mixed feelings in the 32-degree cauldron for the Fleet but ultimately it was a worthy point against opponents who put five past us on their last visit.

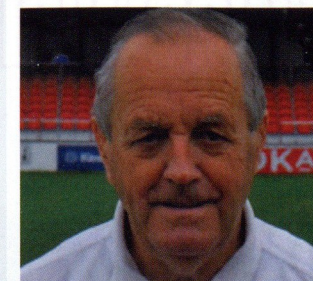

Ian Mackie's squad stormed to a 76-point total, four points clear at the top, mainly thanks to a 42-point performance from star man, Chelsea's Eden

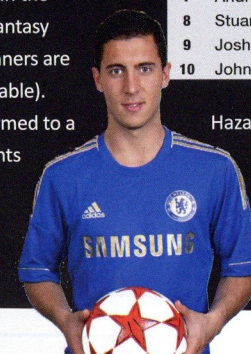

and after 4 miles, you'll merge with the A15. Take the 2nd exit at the next roundabout into South Park Avenue, signposted "A15 Humber Bridge, Skegness", and the ground is on the left hand side.

Parking is available on South Common which is on the right hand side as you turn into South Park Avenue.

By Train: There are two routes to Lincoln from London, either from King's Cross via Newark/Retford, or from St Pancras via Nottingham (see box, below).

• **St Pancras to Lincoln via Nottingham - £53.40**

Lincoln Central station is a short walk from the ground. Exit the station and turn left up St Mary's Street. At the main road (High Street), turn left and walk across the railway crossing. Head straight down the High Street, calling in at any number of pubs (!), until you reach Scorer Street on the left hand side. Walk down Scorer Street, cross the Sincil Drain and turn right into Sincil Bank. The ground is ahead on the left hand side.
