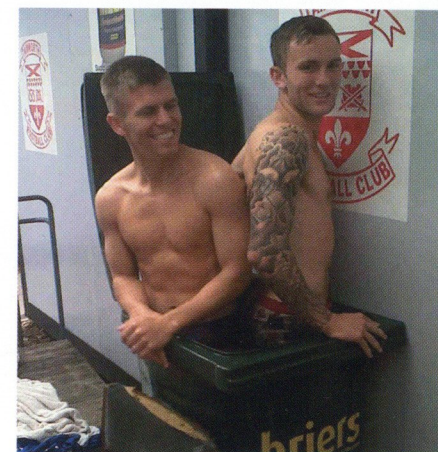
CAPTAIN'S CORNER

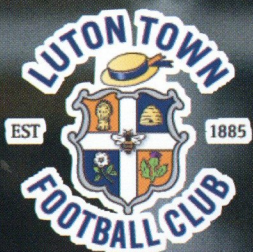
is that you get behind us like you always do and push us in the right direction. We all appreciate your support and it definitely helps us during tough periods in games.

THE SEASON SO FAR

Following the appointment of Paul Buckle as Manager towards the end of last season hopes were high that at long last this would be the season that the Hatters would reclaim their place back in the Football League, writes Terry Brumpton. Buckle almost made it a fairy tale start to his Managerial career at Kenilworth Road when he led his new club into the Blue Square Bet Premier Division Final to stand just ninety minutes away from a return to the Holy Grail. York City stood in their way and it was the former Tamworth Manager, Gary Mills, who had the last laugh on the day when he saw his side beat Luton in a tight final and with a hotly disputed goal.

So when this season kicked off the vast majority of the 6743 fans that made their way to Kenilworth Road for the opening day of the season were in confident spirits that this was to be Luton's season. However, someone forgot to tell opening day visitors Gateshead who raced into a 2-0 lead, within thirty five minutes of the season. To their credit the home side rallied and second half goals from new signing Jon Shaw, against his former club, and Stuart Fleetwood rescued a point for the Hatters.

Next stop was a difficult looking away game at Aggborough against Kidderminster Harriers and ace marksman Fleetwood was on target again scoring both goals within the opening half hour as Luton recorded a splendid 2-0 win to get their season up and running. A trip to newcomers Hyde was next on the agenda and the watching live Premier Sports TV audience sensed a shock was on the cards when Steve Blinkhorn shot the home side into a fifty fifth minute lead. However, their joy was shortlived, as within fourteen minutes JJ O'Donnell equalised and twelve minutes from time that man Fleetwood was on target for the third successive game with the winner.

A crowd of 5970 returned to Kenilworth Road for the visit of AFC Telford United and Kieron St.Aimie stunned them by firing the visitors into a first half lead. The second half turned out to be a stormy affair

with three sending off's. The visitors had Preston dismissed in the seventy ninth minute followed by Reid seven minutes from time and in between times Luton had skipper Henry dismissed as well. This time there was to be no recovery as Luton slipped to their first defeat of the season.

On August Bank Holiday Monday they had an early opportunity to put that defeat behind them when they travelled to Kent to face Ebbsfleet United and two goals in the opening nineteen minutes gave Buckle's men just the sort of start they were looking for. Fleetwood, was on target again for his fifth goal of the season after just ten minutes and nine minutes later Scott Rendell doubled the advantage with his first goal of the campaign. Fleetwood wrapped things up with a third and although the home side did pull a goal back it was little more than a consolation.

The opening day of September saw relegated Macclesfield Town the visitors but once again Luton were quick out of the blocks to open up a two goal lead inside seventeen minutes. The visitors pulled a goal back early in the second half but late strikes from Rendell and Fleetwood swept the Hatters to an emphatic 4-1 win, their best of the season. Just three days later it was the turn of Cambridge United to visit Kenilworth Road and it was the U's who opened the scoring through Welland after thirteen minutes. Goals, though, from Kovacs, Gray and Beckwith put Luton into a strong position and although McAuley did grab a late goal back for United it was Luton who held on to claim three more valuable points.

With two home wins, and seven goals behind them Luton travelled to Alfreton Town in good spirits but just ninety minutes later they were brought down to earth suffering a surprising 3-0 defeat, a result which ranks as one of the most surprising of the season so far and then a week last Saturday Luton again drew a blank when they were held to a goalless draw by high flying visiting Wrexham. Last Friday evening the Hatters suffered a 4-1 defeat at Grimsby Town.

The Main Man Stuart Fleetwood

Striker, Stuart Fleetwood has already bagged seven goals this season and the prolific striker will have to be closely marked this evening.

Fleetwood signed for an undisclosed fee from Hereford United on deadline day in August 2011.

The Gloucester-born frontman, who scored 28 goals the last time he played at Conference level whilst with Forest Green Rovers, signed a two-year deal at Kenilworth Road.

He began his career as a trainee at Cardiff City, making the grade to feature eight times for the Bluebirds between 2003 and 2006.

In January 2006, Fleetwood signed for Hereford for the first time scoring eight times before he signed for Forest Green in June 2007.

And it was his spell with Rovers that saw people sit up and take notice after plundering 32 league and cup goals in a season that saw the Gloucestershire side earn their highest league placing.

The Wales Under-21 international turned down a new contract at FGR to sign for then Championship Charlton in June 2008 but was loaned out Cheltenham, Exeter and Brighton.

Fleetwood returned to Edgar Street last summer and scored 18 goals as he helped the Bulls avoid the drop in League 2.

After hitting the post on his debut against Stockport, Fleetwood scored on his full debut in the win over Darlington.

The Manager Paul Buckle

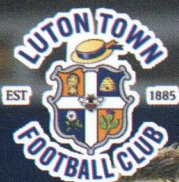
The Hatters appointed Welwyn-born Buckle in April 2012 following the departure of Gary Brabin.

He signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road three months after leaving League 2 side Bristol Rovers.

Originally moved to the Memorial Ground having managed Torquay United where he won them promotion from the Blue Square Premier in 2009

After a 17th-place finish in League 2 in 2009/10, Buckle guided the Devon club to the League 2 play-off final last season where they were defeated narrowly by Stevenage at Old Trafford.

In his playing days he was best known for his spells in midfield for Colchester, Brentford and Torquay and Exeter.



MEET THE HATTERS

MARK TYLER

Hugely experienced goalkeeper who signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road in June 2009 to become Mick Harford's fifth signing of the summer following his release from Peterborough United. Mark made 483 appearances in 15 years at London Road and was rewarded for his loyalty with a testimonial against Liverpool in 2007. After falling down the pecking order at Posh he found first team opportunities hard to come by and in 2008/09 he was loaned out to League 2 Bury where he made 11 appearances for the Shakers. A former England Youth international, Tyler was handed the number one shirt by the Hatters boss who admitted he'd failed in an attempt to sign the stopper the previous summer. After a hugely successful two years between the sticks at Kenilworth Road, Mark signed a new contract in the summer of 2011.

LATHANIEL ROWE-TURNER

Defender Lathaniel Rowe-Turner became Town boss Paul Buckle's sixth signing of a busy summer in July 2012.

The 22-year-old is a left-back by trade but is equally comfortable at centre-half and is reunited with the manager having previously worked together at Torquay United.

Born in Leicester, 6ft 1in Lathaniel began his career with his hometown club. He was part of the Foxes' youth team that won the Premier League academy league in 2006/07. In the following season he was named City's academy player of the year. However, having failed to make a first team appearance in 2010 he was released by the Foxes and in February of that year he joined Buckle at Plainmoor.

In his first season on the Devon coast the youngster appeared 10 times and scored once - in the Gulls' 3-0 win against Barnet.

Last season Lathaniel made 24 appearances in all competitions prior to his release by manager Martin Ling.

ANDRE GRAY

Lightning-quick forward signed from Blue Square Bet North Hinckley United on loan transfer deadline day in March 2012. The prolific striker had scored 39 goals in two seasons for the Knitters after being released from Shrewsbury Town in 2010. The Wolverhampton-born man made a goalscoring debut for the Town when scoring in the 1-1 draw with Grimsby Town. He has also spent time on-loan with AFC Telford United. Scored seven goals in 12 games at the end of last season to earn his first call up to the England C squad this summer.

JON SHAW

Prolific centre-forward who the Town beat off stiff competition to sign on a two-year contract in June 2012.

Sheffield-born Shaw hit a phenomenal 35 goals in all competitions for Gateshead in 2011/12 - 28 of which came in the Blue Square Bet Premier. In total Shaw netted a hugely impressive 56 goals in 97 appearances for the Heed - 45 of them coming in 81 league games.

The striker has scored almost 130 career goals after starting out as a trainee at home-town club Sheffield Wednesday and scored his first senior goal for Wednesday at Kenilworth Road in a 3-2 victory for the Hatters in April 2004.

That was one of two goals he scored in 24 appearances at Hillsborough before signing for then Conference outfit Burton Albion. The goals began to flow as he scored 31 times for the Brewers.

After three seasons at Burton, Shaw moved to Halifax in 2007 and once more goals were on the menu as 26 were plundered for the Shaymen during 2007/08.

That form in front of goal was enough to take him back to the Football League with Rochdale but, having failed to break into the Dale first XI on a consistent basis, loan spells with Crawley, Barrow and Gateshead followed in seasons 2008/09 and 2009/10.

On the lookout for regular first team action a six-month permanent spell with Mansfield followed for Jon in January 2010 having left Spotland. He scored three times in six starts for the Stags.

But then in May of 2010 came his move to Gateshead and the rest, as they say, is history, with his goalscoring feats over the past two seasons well documented that led to a number of clubs showing a keen interest in his performances, including the Town.

The Hatters' new man scored 21 goals in his debut season on Tyneside before hammering 35 in the season just gone. In the past two campaigns he's scored four hat-tricks, including back-to-back trebles in late September 2011.

LUTON TOWN - CLASSIC CAMPAIGNS

Football historian **LEIGH EDWARDS** selects ten post-war Luton Town 'Classic Campaigns'.

1947-48

Gordon Turner scored 32 goals as Luton Town won promotion to the top-flight for the first time in 1954/55. The Hatters began with a 3-0 victory at home to Nottingham Forest and soared up the Second Division table with six straight wins. Gordon Turner grabbed a hat-trick as Luton trounced Blackburn 7-3 and they triumphed 5-1 at Nottingham Forest. Dally Duncan's side maintained their challenge, slamming four goals past Hull City, Rotherham, Liverpool and Port Vale. Tom Aherne and Shay Dunne were ever-present as Luton pipped Rotherham to the runners-up slot on goal average with a 3-0 win at Doncaster.

1958/59

Luton Town were FA Cup finalists for the first and only time in 1958/59. The Hatters were unbeaten in their opening ten First Division games, trouncing Manchester City 5-1 and scoring four goals past West Ham and Preston. They recovered from a lean spell to beat Arsenal 6-3 and Burnley 6-2, then top scorer Allan Brown netted four goals in a 5-1 demolition of Nottingham Forest but poor results over the closing weeks saw them finish below mid-table. Luton defeated Leeds 5-1, Leicester 4-1, Ipswich 5-2, Blackpool 1-0 and Norwich 1-0 in the FA Cup before Syd Owen's side lost 2-1 to Nottingham Forest in the final.

1967/68

Bruce Rioch netted 24 goals as Luton Town won the Fourth Division title in 1967/68. New captain Terry Branston made his debut as the Hatters kicked off with a 1-1 draw at Wrexham and Ian Buxton arrived from Derby in September. Luton lost just two of their first 18 matches and beat Charlton in the League Cup first round, scoring 27 goals in

a run of eight successive wins. Allan Brown's side went top of the table with a 2-0 win at Brentford in February and Keith Allen, Max Dougan, Fred Jardine, John Moore and Ray Whittaker also starred as they remained in pole position, clinching the title with a 4-0 victory over Crewe.



Malcolm Macdonald

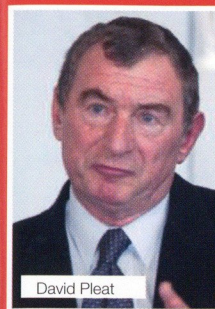
1969/70

Malcolm Macdonald scored 25 times as Luton Town won promotion in 1969/70. The Hatters had narrowly missed promotion the previous season and Bruce Rioch was sold to Aston Villa for a record fee, with

Alec Stock signing Malcolm Macdonald, John Ryan and John Collins. Luton were early leaders after remaining unbeaten in their opening 13 matches, recruiting Chris Nicholl from Halifax and Matt Tees from Charlton. Malcolm Macdonald grabbed hat-tricks in 5-0 wins over Bradford City and Reading, with Luton unbeaten in their last six matches and clinching promotion as Third Division runners-up with a 0-0 draw at Mansfield

1973/74

Luton Town regained top-flight status after an absence of 14 years in 1973/74. The Hatters recovered from a 4-0 defeat at Nottingham Forest on the opening day to hammer Carlisle 6-1, embarking on an eight-match unbeaten run. Harry Haslam signed Alan West from Burnley and Jimmy Husband from Everton as Luton maintained their promotion challenge. Husband netted a hat-trick in a 3-1 victory over rivals Orient, then leading marksman Barry Butlin scored three in a 4-2 win over Preston. Alan Garner and Bobby Thomson were ever-present and other stars included Peter Anderson and John Ryan as Luton finished runners-up.

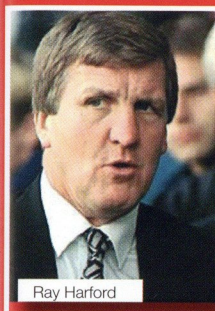


David Pleat

1981/82

David Pleat guided Luton Town to the Second Division title in 1981/82. The Hatters had narrowly missed promotion in the previous two years and Tony Grealish was swapped for Brighton's Brian Horton. They raced to the top by winning their first three games and hammered rivals Watford

4-1, then Steve White scored four times in a 6-0 demolition of Grimsby. Richard Money arrived from Liverpool and was an influential figure as Luton were unbeaten in their last 14 matches. Leading marksman Brian Stein, Mal Donaghy, Kirk Stephens and Steve White were all ever-present as Luton won the title with 88 points.



Ray Harford

1987/88

Ray Harford plotted Luton Town's 1988 Littlewoods Cup final triumph. Danny Wilson replaced Peter Nicholas in midfield, while Micky Weir arrived from Hibernian and Mike Newell moved to Leicester. The Hatters won 5-2 at Oxford and Ian Allinson was signed from Stoke in October, with Luton losing just twice

in 12 matches including a 7-4 win in the return match against Oxford, finishing ninth in the top-flight. They defeated Wigan 5-2, Coventry 3-1, Ipswich 1-0, Bradford City 2-0 and Oxford 3-1 in the Littlewoods Cup before beating Arsenal 3-2 in the final. Luton were also FA Cup semi-finalists and Simod Cup finalists.

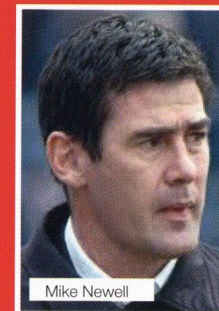
1988/89

Luton Town were Littlewoods Cup finalists for the second consecutive season in 1988/89. Departures were Brian Stein, Mark Stein and Andy Dibble, while newcomers included Roy Wegerle, John Dreyer and Steve Williams.

Luton's first home win was 1-0 against Liverpool and they beat Southampton 6-1 in January but First Division form was generally disappointing, with the Hatters narrowly avoiding relegation by winning three of their last four games. Luton defeated Burnley 2-1, Leeds 2-0, Manchester City 3-1, Southampton 2-1 and West Ham 5-0 in the Littlewoods Cup before losing 3-1 to Nottingham Forest in the final.

2001/02

Steve Howard scored 24 times as Luton Town won promotion in 2001/02. Joe Kinnear's side were early leaders after winning their opening two matches and newcomer Carl Griffiths netted a hat-trick in a 5-1 win over Torquay. The Hatters briefly regained pole position after beating Darlington 5-2 in October, signing Chris Coyne from Dundee, Jean-Louis Valois from Lille, Dean Crowe from Stoke, Ahmet Brkovic from Orient and Dave Bayliss from Rochdale. A run of 12 successive wins, slamming five goals past Halifax and Mansfield, took Luton back to the top with two games remaining but they finished runners-up to Plymouth.



Mike Newell

2004/05

Mike Newell managed Luton Town to the League One title in 2004/05. The Hatters stormed to the top of the table, winning 10 of their first 12 games before three successive defeats. They beat Bradford City 4-0 and Wrexham 5-1, then Steve Howard netted

a hat-trick in a 4-1 win at MK Dons. The 1-0 victory over Port Vale in December heralded a 14 match unbeaten run and Luton bounced back from a 3-1 defeat in the return fixture to hammer Bristol City 5-0. Briefly displaced as leaders by Hull, they triumphed 4-1 at Torquay and secured promotion with four games remaining. Luton won the title with a record 98 points.

absolutely delighted. "The quality that we have brought from the bench has changed the game for us."

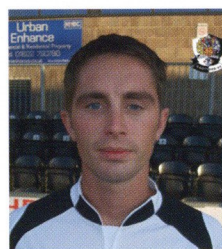


Steve Brogan - Debut Goal

A last-minute equaliser from Lee Noble (pictured) secured a point for in-form Dartford at high flying Wrexham. Danny Harris gave

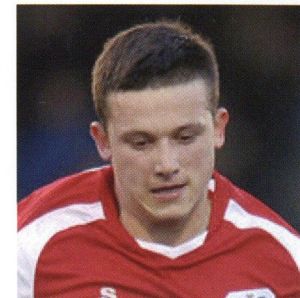
