GOOD afternoon and welcome to all our loyal supporters. Your backing in the last two home games carried the team through to victory and the support afforded to the team against Forest Green on Friday night was excellent from start to finish. On behalf of the Board I say thank you.



We also welcome the supporters, players, management and directors of Luton Town. I think that they can be said to be one of the 'big' teams in the Blue Square Bet Premier and are on a good run of form at the moment. It is going to prove a tough test for the Imps today!

Since the last programme notes we have played Nuneaton at the Bank and Forest Green away. The match against Nuneaton was won 2-1 in the end but it is fair to say that the game turned on the sending off of the Nuneaton defender. Up to that point Nuneaton had scored and due to a combination of poor finishing and an excellent display by Paul Farman they should really have been out of sight. After the sending off, the players grabbed the initiative and could even afford the luxury of a missed penalty. Just why didn't Colin Larkin take it?

On to the Forest Green game and a defeat by 3-0 was the outcome. Whilst saying how well Forest Green played, I felt that the team were never at the races all night and were soundly beaten.

Moving on from that and the Youth Team progressed to the next round of the FA Youth Cup on Tuesday with an 8-1 demolition of Mansfield. Congratulations must go to Grant, Chris and the players for this impressive performance and here's to a repeat for the first team in their match against Mansfield this coming Tuesday. Well we can hope!

The draw is made on Monday for the fourth qualifying round of the FA Cup and it will be interesting to see who we draw - will it be a local derby with Boston United? As always progression in the cup competitions is important due to financial


reasons as the reward for winning your first round tie is £16,000.

As a board of directors we have taken quite a bit of criticism recently as being out of touch with the supporters. We have tried to answer this criticism by meeting with different supporters' groups and taking on board their views and ideas. The ideas put forward have been excellent and have been implemented already in a lot of cases with radio advertising, the banner in the town centre, fixture lists in shops and pubs and players visiting local schools. We, as a board, are always open to suggestions and ideas from supporters to help to get our club back on track and where we were five years ago. I am sure that most supporters would relish trips back to the play-off finals and all the adrenalin that produces. Volunteering an hour of your time is one way to help this happen.

As Finance Director it is pleasing to see that things are improving off the field financially. The Club has suffered a reduction in its income of approximately one third since being relegated out of the League. As a supporter, ask yourself if your weekly wage was suddenly reduced by a third, how would you cope? In 90% of the cases I am sure that the supporter would cut back their spending and this is exactly what the Club has had to do. Some of the decisions made have been difficult and unpopular but necessary to ensure that we still have the football club we love here and surviving.

Let's hope for the three points today we need.



A warm welcome to today's Blue Square Bet Premier game against Luton Town. An extended welcome to manager Paul Buckle, the chairman, directors, players and staff of Luton.

Our last home game saw us gain a healthy victory having come from a goal down, which I understand is the first time for a while that this has happened. The confidence the players maintained throughout the game was very important having suffered an early goal from a good strike by the Nuneaton player.

In the build-up to last Friday's trip to Forest Green, John Nutter was the latest casualty in the treatment room and was unable to play or participate. He remains very unlikely for today's match. Paul Robson acquitted himself very well in John's absence and can come out of the game in a

positive manner having gone up against a very, very good side and one I likened to the AFC Wimbledon side that gained promotion a couple of years ago. I'm sure Forest Green, like our opponents today, will be optimistic of having at least a top two finish this season with the amount of investment they've put into their squad.

Our ambitions, meanwhile, are managed by ourselves and we have to remember that the legacy of the last couple of years has taken its toll but likewise the heart beat is very strong. 


Welcome To... Luton Town

So far this season...


Luton are currently fourth in the table, four points behind leaders Forest Green. Conscious of the last three seasons' play-off heartbreak, the Hatters will be eager to gain ground on the rest of the leading pack.

Despite the lofty position, there has been some discontent from the fans over the team's start to the season, most notably after heavy defeats at Alfreton (3-0) and Grimsby (4-1). However, it seems the team has turned a corner since their loss at Blundell Park, putting together two improved performances and much needed wins.

What to expect...

It's been well documented how manager Paul Buckle has attempted to shoe-horn four strikers into his starting line ups this season. Summer signings Scott Rendell and Jon Shaw have been added to the existing strike force of Stuart Fleetwood and Andre Gray. Rendell and Shaw provide the aerial threat, due to their height whereas Fleetwood and Gray are lightning quick and will look to get in behind the Imps' defence.

Despite all being natural strikers, Fleetwood and Gray's pace has often meant that they've been pushed out wide. All are capable of causing problems and have been prolific in seasons gone by. Fleetwood in particular has been excellent so far this season, with eight goals already to his name. However, since the away defeat to Grimsby, Luton have changed their formation and in the recent victories against Tamworth and Southport, one of these four has been left on the bench.




The gaffer...

Paul Buckle started his playing career at Brentford and went onto play for eight different clubs, most notably spells at Torquay, Colchester and Exeter.

Buckle's first job as a manager came in 2007 when he was appointed Torquay boss. Promotion back to the Football League was achieved under Buckle and in his final year at the club, they were a game away from League One as the

Gulls lost to Stevenage in the play-off final. Shortly after the loss he joined Bristol Rovers where he only stayed for three months before agreeing terms with Luton.

After coming back from behind against Southport, Buckle was keen to reiterate that the team is still a work in progress, stating: "You've got to remember we're still building a team. The bar has been raised but there is still room for



improvement, we all know that. We're improving all the times and we're up there in the top three now. We just need to get that consistency and slowly it's getting there."

A Brief History...

Luton Town FC are one of the most historically successful non-League clubs today. Their rich and colourful past has seen the club play in the top tier of English football and win major honours.

Luton Town FC were formed in 1885, a merger between Luton Town Wanderers and Excelsior. They were the first club in Southern England to turn professional, all the way back in 1891. After moving to the Football League in 1897, poor attendances, high wages and the costs of away-day travel left the club in dire financial straights and a move back to the Southern League was arranged for the start of the 20th century.

In 1920, Luton rejoined the Football League after a major change in the structure of England's football pyramid meant that virtually the entire top division of the Southern League was absorbed by the Football League to become the new Third Division.

Luton reached the second tier of English football in 1937 and the top tier in 1956 after finishing as runners up behind Birmingham, beating out Rotherham on goal difference. In 1959, one of Luton's most revered sons, Syd Owen won the FWA Footballer of the year on the way to leading the club to the FA Cup Final where they lost 2-1 to Nottingham Forest. However, The Hatters' fortunes soon declined and by 1965, the club was in the doldrums of the fourth tier. An up-and-down 17 years followed until, under David Pleat's stewardship, the club finally made it back to Division One in 1982.

The 80's was to be Luton's most defining decade. In their first season back, Luton survived relegation by beating Manchester City on the final day thanks to a late Raddy Antic winner. David Pleat's celebrations at the final whistle are one of the most iconic images in the club's history. The 80's also saw Luton reach its highest ever league finish - seventh in 1986/87. The club's greatest feat came the following year though as they beat Arsenal 3-2 in the League Cup Final.


In 1991/1992 the Hatters were relegated from the top division and by 1996, the club were in the third tier - a level they hadn't been in since 1970. Since the mid-90's Luton have been up and down the lower echelons of the Football League until the 2008/2009 season, when the prospect of non-League football became a reality after 89 years. A 30 points deduction due to financial irregularities proved to be too much to overcome as the Hatters braced themselves for life in the Conference.

Recent history hasn't been kind to the club as since joining the league, the Hatters have lost in the play-offs each of the last three seasons. After taking an early lead in last season's play-off final against York, the Minstermen rallied and won the game 2-1.

Defender Peter Gilbert has been drafted in by manager David Holdsworth with the left-back joining the Club on a non-contract basis.

Hexham-born Gilbert started his career as a trainee with Birmingham City but it was at Plymouth Argyle where the full-back made his Football League bow at the beginning of the 2003/04 season.

A successful loan spell at Home Park brought about a permanent move and he became a regular as Argyle won the Second Division championship, earning the first of eight Welsh U21 international caps in the process.

His impressive form earned him a six-figure move to Leicester City in the summer of 2005 but after just a handful of appearances he was loaned to Sheffield Wednesday before making the move to Hillsborough permanent. After spending three years with the Owls, Gilbert (29) went on to play for Doncaster Rovers (loan), Oldham Athletic and Northampton Town before spending the last two seasons at Southend United.







HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO CAMERON AND OLI!





COME ON YOU IMPS!

BORN

1913 John Daniels

Prestwich-born goalkeeper who appeared in City's first 17 Football League games after the Second World War before losing his place because of injury. Pre War had appeared with Leeds United, Stockport County and Accrington Stanley but had only amassed 20 games in five seasons. He died in 1970.

1932 George Johnson

One of many north easterners to play for City, George was born in Esh, County Durham. Just made three appearances for us in 1951/52 and his one goal came in the record 11-1 win over Crewe. He died in 2002

1957 Bruce Grobbelaar

Born in Durban, South Africa, Bruce Grobbelaar made his name with Liverpool appearing 440 times in the top flight. Had previously played for Crewe and later had games for six other clubs including two for City in 1998.

1978 David Graham

One of Peter Jackson's summer signings in 2008, David Graham failed to live up to the hype in a brief stay at Sincil Bank where he started just two League games with a further seven appearances off the bench. Earlier in his career the Edinburgh born striker had played for Scotland U-21's and Rangers and scored 47 goals in 103+17 League games for Torquay and was voted into the PFA Division Three Team of the Season in 2004/05. A big money move to Wigan wasn't a

success and he joined Sheffield Wednesday before spells at Huddersfield Town, Bradford City, Torquay again, Gillingham and the Imps ended his League career with a total of 185+65 apps and 65 goals. He has since played non-League football for Sheffield FC, Ilkeston Town and Workson Town.

1985 Karl Bermingham

Born in Dublin, Karl Bermingham played for the Republic Of Ireland at schoolboy level before crossing the Irish Sea to join Manchester City in 2001. Despite appearing for their first team in several friendlies and scoring prolifically for the reserves his only competitive action came in loan spells here in 2004 with just two substitute appearances and Burnley in 2005 where he made one start and three appearances from the bench. He was released by Manchester City in May 2006 and after a brief trial at Dunfermline returned to Ireland.


1987 Michael O'Connor

Belfast-born Michael O'Connor made a big impression in a loan spell at Sincil Bank in March/April 2009 scoring once in 9+1 League apps for us. A full international for Northern Ireland he joined us after a fall out with his Crewe manager where he had played 65+12 times (3 goals) since joining them in 2005. He joined Scunthorpe United for a reported £250,000 fee in July 2009 and scored 12 times in 77+20 League apps for them before moving to Rotherham United on a free transfer in June 2012 where he has scored four goals in eight League games up until last weekend.

BORN

1878 WILLIAM GARRATY

Born in Saltley, Billy Garraty joined the Imps at the end of a successful career that had seen him win the Football League [1900] and FA Cup [1905] during 11 seasons with Aston Villa as well as one England cap (v Wales in 1903). He was the League's top scorer in 1899/1900 with 27 goals in 33 games and has a unique claim to fame as arguably one of the first substitutes in a Football League game. In 1898/99 Villa's game at Sheffield Wednesday was abandoned after 80 minutes but rather than replay the whole game Villa had to travel back to Sheffield to play the final 10 minutes. Ten players from the first game made the return trip and Garraty replaced the other one! He totalled 299 League games scoring 118 goals for Villa, Leicester, West Brom and City and died in 1931.




1961 PAUL CASEY

Born in Germany Paul Casey played 23 (2 sub) times for Sheffield United scoring once before joining Boston United. Capable of playing in defence or midfield he joined City in the 1987/88 Conference season and went on to appear 44 times (5 sub) scoring 4 goals in the Football League for us. The figure would probably have been higher but for a succession of injuries and a spell in jail for GBH in 1991. Later returned to Boston and played for Lincoln United.






