



LUTON TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB

This afternoon we
welcome Luton Town
to the New Lawn
and last Saturday

they enjoyed a tremendous 2-0 victory at
Cambridge United to reach the first round
proper of this season's F.A. Cup. Today we
take a look at the players who started the
game for the Hatters.

MARK TYLER

Hugely experienced goalkeeper who signed a two-year
contract at Kenilworth Road in June 2009 to become
Mick Harford's fifth signing of the summer following his
release from Peterborough United.

Mark made 483 appearances in 15 years at London
Road and was rewarded for his loyalty with a testimonial
against Liverpool in 2007.

After falling down the pecking order at Posh he found
first team opportunities hard to come by and in 2008/09
he was loaned out to League 2 Bury where he made 11
appearances for the Shakers.

A former England Youth international, Tyler was handed
the number one shirt by the Hatters boss who admitted
he'd failed in an attempt to sign the stopper the previous
summer.

After a hugely successful two years between the sticks
at Kenilworth Road, Mark signed a new contract in the
summer of 2011.

LATHANIEL ROWE-TURNER

Defender Lathaniel Rowe-Turner became Town boss
Paul Buckle's sixth signing of a busy summer in July
2012.

The 22-year-old is a left-back by trade but is equally
comfortable at centre-half and is reunited with the
manager having previously worked together at Torquay
United.

Born in Leicester, 6ft 1in Lathaniel began his career
with his hometown club. He was part of the Foxes'

youth team that won the Premier League academy
league in 2006/07. In the following season he was
named City's academy player of the year.

However, having failed to make a first team appearance
in 2010 he was released by the Foxes and in February
of that year he joined Buckle at Plainmoor.

In his first season on the Devon coast the youngster
appeared 10 times and scored once - in the Gulls' 3-0
win against Barnet.

JANOS KOVACS

Hungarian defender who signed on-loan for his second
spell at the club in September 2011. Formerly with
Chesterfield and Lincoln, Kovacs first signed in January
2010 before signing for Hereford United in the summer
of that year.

Signed a 18-month contract in January 2012.

RONNIE HENRY

The Hatters unveiled influential defender Ronnie Henry
as their first signing of the summer in June 2012.

The former Stevenage captain signed a two-year
contract at Kenilworth Road to also become Paul
Buckle's first recruit as Town boss.

Hemel-born Henry joined the Hatters having spent
seven successful years at Broadhall Way in which he
helped the Hertfordshire side twice win promotion and
twice lift the FA Trophy.

Primarily an attacking and assured right-back, Henry
began his career as a youngster at Tottenham Hotspur,
but after a loan spell with Southend United in 2003, he
joined Dublin City in Ireland in 2004 for four months
before returning to England to sign for Stevenage.

He went onto make 329 appearances for Boro to
become their fourth highest appearance holder, playing
key roles in their title winning side in the Blue Square
Bet Premier in 2009/10 and their subsequent Play-Off
final victory over Buckle's Torquay side in the following
campaign that earned a second successive promotion.

In the season just passed, Henry made 40 appearances
in League 1, helping Stevenage to another Play-Off
appearance. But, having received an offer of a new
contract with Boro and from a string of Football League
sides, he opted to sign on the dotted line for the Town -
and was named captain for the 2012/13 season by Paul
Buckle.

JAKE HOWELLS

The young winger, who can also play at left-back or in
central midfield, came through the ranks at Kenilworth
Road and made his first team debut as a second half
substitute in May 2008. He made his full debut in the
Hatters colours away at Bradford City in October 2008.

After making 36 appearances for the Hatters in the
2008/09 the England C international was rewarded for
his efforts with a professional contract in May.

In his first season as a pro, Howells made huge strides
with impressive performances on the left-side of

midfield, ending the 2009/10 campaign with six goals, including his first senior goal in the incredible 4-3 win over Cambridge in September 2009.

Capped at Under-21 level by Wales, Howells signed a three-year contract extension in the summer of 2012.

ARNAUD MENDY

Made his Luton debut last Saturday after joining the club on loan from Macclesfield Town with a view to a permanent move in January.

The young French midfielder arrived at the Moss Rose in the summer of 2011 having impressed in pre-season training following his release from Pride Park. Unable to force his way into the Derby County 1st team, Arnaud spent three months on loan at Tranmere Rovers, appearing 12 times for the Prenton Park club.

Opened his account for the Silkmen in their 4-0 demolition of AFC Wimbledon, coming off the bench to score with a well timed run and shot from the edge of the area. He has also represented Guinea – Bassau in World Cup qualification matches this season forcing him to miss three Silkmen games. Illness limited his appearances prior to Christmas but was regular in the centre of midfield after that, grabbing the headlines with his spectacular goal against Bolton in the FA Cup 3rd Round tie in front of the TV cameras.



Alex Lawless

JJ O'DONNELL

Left-sided or central midfielder who joined the Town with St Albans team-mate Godfrey Poku in January 2010.

Also capable of playing at left back the youngster featured for the Hatters' reserve and youth teams during 2009/10.

He made his first team debut as a substitute in the 4-2 FA Cup first round replay win over Corby Town and was handed a one-year contract extension in June 2011.

After loan spells at Thurrock and Hampton & Richmond in 2011/12, Paul Buckle rewarded his efforts with a new three-year contract in the summer of 2012.

ALEX LAWLESS

Former Wales Under-21 midfielder who signed in November 2010 initially on-loan from York City before a permanent deal went through in January 2011.

A star of the Minstermen's campaign last season which saw them lose in the Promotion Final to Oxford United, Lawless featured prominently in all four of the meetings with the Hatters last term at the heart of midfield.

He only joined York at the start of last season, impressing then boss Martin Foyle enough to prise the 25-year-old away from Forest Green Rovers where performances in a variety of positions - in defence and across midfield - had also caught the eye of Football League scouts.

It's not just the 150 games experience in the Conference that Lawless has with Forest Green and York that he has on his CV. A former Cardiff City scholar he took-up non-league football in Wales before he was snapped up to earn his first professional contract with Premier League Fulham in 2003.

Without featuring for the Cottagers it was off to South West to Torquay United for the young Lawless but after just a year and 16 appearances at Plainmoor he was on the move again, to Forest Green in 2006 and in his three seasons he helped the Gloucestershire consolidate in the Conference.

Arriving at Bootham Crescent in the summer of 2009, local media announced him merely as a "utility player" but that was far from the case, and alongside Neil Barrett he forged a formidable partnership in the centre of City's midfield, changing the Yorkshire club's relegation worries from one season to making them just one game away from promotion the next.

STUART FLEETWOOD

Prolific striker who signed for an undisclosed fee from Hereford United on deadline day in August 2011.


The Gloucester-born frontman, who scored 28 goals the last time he played at Conference level whilst with Forest Green Rovers, signed a two-year deal at Kenilworth Road.

He began his career as a trainee at Cardiff City, making the grade to feature eight times for the Bluebirds between 2003 and 2006.

In January 2006, Fleetwood signed for Hereford for the first time scoring eight times before he signed for Forest Green in June 2007.

And it was his spell with Rovers that saw people sit up and take notice after plundering 32 league and cup goals in a season that saw the Gloucestershire side earn their highest league placing.

The Wales Under-21 international turned down a new contract at FGR to sign for then Championship Charlton

in June 2008 but was loaned out Cheltenham, Exeter and Brighton.

Fleetwood returned to Edgar Street last summer and scored 18 goals as he helped the Bulls avoid the drop in League 2.

After hitting the post on his debut against Stockport, Fleetwood scored on his full debut in the win over Darlington.

ANDRE GRAY

Lightning-quick forward signed from Blue Square Bet North Hinckley United on loan transfer deadline day in March 2012.

The prolific striker had scored 39 goals in two seasons for the Knitters after being released from Shrewsbury Town in 2010.

The Wolverhampton-born man made a goalscoring debut for the Town when scoring in the 1-1 draw with Grimsby Town.


He has also spent time on-loan with AFC Telford United.

Scored seven goals in 12 games at the end of last season to earn his first call up to the England C squad this summer.

JON SHAW

Prolific centre-forward who the Town beat off stiff competition to sign on a two-year contract in June 2012.

Sheffield-born Shaw hit a phenomenal 35 goals in all competitions for Gateshead in 2011/12 - 28 of which came in the Blue Square Bet Premier. In total Shaw

netted a hugely impressive 56 goals in 97 appearances for the Heed - 45 of them coming in 81 league games.

The striker has scored almost 130 career goals after starting out as a trainee at home-town club Sheffield Wednesday and scored his first senior goal for Wednesday at Kenilworth Road in a 3-2 victory for the Hatters in April 2004.

That was one of two goals he scored in 24 appearances at Hillsborough before signing for then Conference outfit Burton Albion. The goals began to flow as he scored 31 times for the Brewers.

After three seasons at Burton, Shaw moved to Halifax in 2007 and once more goals were on the menu as 26 were plundered for the Shaymen during 2007/08.

That form in front of goal was enough to take him back to the Football League with Rochdale but, having failed to break into the Dale first XI on a consistent basis, loan spells with Crawley, Barrow and Gateshead followed in seasons 2008/09 and 2009/10.

On the lookout for regular first team action a six-month permanent spell with Mansfield followed for Jon in January 2010 having left Spotland. He scored three times in six starts for the Stags.

But then in May of 2010 came his move to Gateshead and the rest, as they say, is history, with his goalscoring feats over the past two seasons well documented that led to a number of clubs showing a keen interest in his performances, including the Town.

The Hatters' new man scored 21 goals in his debut season on Tyneside before hammering 35 in the season just gone. In the past two campaigns he's scored four hat-tricks, including back-to-back trebles in late September 2011.





LUTON TOWN - CLASSIC CAMPAIGNS

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS selects ten post-war Luton Town 'Classic Campaigns'.

1954/55

Gordon Turner scored 32 goals as Luton Town won promotion to the top-flight for the first time in 1954/55. The Hatters began with a 3-0 victory at home to Nottingham Forest and soared up the Second Division table with six straight wins. Gordon Turner grabbed a hat-trick as Luton trounced Blackburn 7-3 and they triumphed 5-1 at Nottingham Forest. Dally Duncan's side maintained their challenge, slamming four goals past Hull City, Rotherham, Liverpool and Port Vale. Tom Aherne and Shay Dunne were ever-present as Luton pipped Rotherham to the runners-up slot on goal average with a 3-0 win at Doncaster.

1958/59

Luton Town were FA Cup finalists for the first and only time in 1958/59. The Hatters were unbeaten in their opening ten First Division games, trouncing Manchester City 5-1 and scoring four goals past West Ham and Preston. They recovered from a lean spell to beat Arsenal 6-3 and Burnley 6-2, then top scorer Allan Brown netted four goals in a 5-1 demolition of Nottingham Forest but poor results over the closing weeks saw them finish below mid-table. Luton defeated Leeds 5-1, Leicester 4-1, Ipswich 5-2, Blackpool 1-0 and Norwich 1-0 in the FA Cup before Syd Owen's side lost 2-1 to Nottingham Forest in the final.

1967/68

Bruce Rioch netted 24 goals as Luton Town won the Fourth Division title in 1967/68. New captain Terry Branston made his debut as the Hatters kicked off with a 1-1 draw at Wrexham and Ian Buxton arrived from Derby in September. Luton lost just two of their first 18 matches and beat Charlton in the League Cup first round, scoring 27 goals in a run of eight successive wins. Allan

Brown's side went top of the table with a 2-0 win at Brentford in February and Keith Allen, Max Dougan, Fred Jardine, John Moore and Ray Whittaker also starred as they remained in pole position, clinching the title with a 4-0 victory over Crewe.



Malcolm Macdonald

1969/70

Malcolm Macdonald scored 25 times as Luton Town won promotion in 1969/70. The Hatters had narrowly missed promotion the previous season and Bruce Rioch was sold to Aston Villa for a record fee, with Alec Stock signing Malcolm Macdonald, John

Ryan and John Collins. Luton were early leaders after remaining unbeaten in their opening 13 matches, recruiting Chris Nicholl from Halifax and Matt Tees from Charlton. Malcolm Macdonald grabbed hat-tricks in 5-0 wins over Bradford City and Reading, with Luton unbeaten in their last six matches and clinching promotion as Third Division runners-up with a 0-0 draw at Mansfield

1973/74

Luton Town regained top-flight status after an absence of 14 years in 1973/74. The Hatters recovered from a 4-0 defeat at Nottingham Forest on the opening day to hammer Carlisle 6-1, embarking on an eight-match unbeaten run. Harry Haslam signed Alan West from Burnley and Jimmy Husband from Everton as Luton maintained their promotion challenge. Husband netted a hat-trick in a 3-1 victory over rivals Orient, then leading marksman Barry Butlin scored three in a 4-2 win over Preston. Alan Garner and Bobby Thomson were ever-present and other stars included Peter Anderson and John Ryan as Luton finished runners-up.



David Pleat

1981/82

David Pleat guided Luton Town to the Second Division title in 1981/82. The Hatters had narrowly missed promotion in the previous two years and Tony Grealish was swapped for Brighton's Brian Horton. They raced to the top by winning their first three games and

hammered rivals Watford 4-1, then Steve White scored four times in a 6-0 demolition of Grimsby. Richard Money arrived from Liverpool and was an influential figure as Luton were unbeaten in their last 14 matches. Leading marksman Brian Stein, Mal Donaghy, Kirk Stephens and Steve White were all ever-present as Luton won the title with 88 points.



Ray Harford

1987/88

Ray Harford plotted Luton Town's 1988 Littlewoods Cup final triumph. Danny Wilson replaced Peter Nicholas in midfield, while Micky Weir arrived from Hibernian and Mike Newell moved to Leicester. The Hatters won 5-2 at Oxford and Ian Allinson was signed


from Stoke in October, with Luton losing just twice in 12 matches including a 7-4 win in the return match against Oxford, finishing ninth in the top-flight. They defeated Wigan 5-2, Coventry 3-1, Ipswich 1-0, Bradford City 2-0 and Oxford 3-1 in the Littlewoods Cup before beating Arsenal 3-2 in the final. Luton were also FA Cup semi-finalists and Simod Cup finalists.

1988/89

Luton Town were Littlewoods Cup finalists for the second consecutive season in 1988/89. Departures were Brian Stein, Mark Stein and Andy Dibble, while newcomers included Roy Wegerle, John Dreyer and Steve Williams. Luton's first home win was 1-0 against Liverpool and they beat Southampton 6-1 in January but First Division form was generally disappointing, with the Hatters narrowly avoiding relegation

by winning three of their last four games. Luton defeated Burnley 2-1, Leeds 2-0, Manchester City 3-1, Southampton 2-1 and West Ham 5-0 in the Littlewoods Cup before losing 3-1 to Nottingham Forest in the final.

2001/02



Steve Howard

Steve Howard scored 24 times as Luton Town won promotion in 2001/02. Joe Kinnear's side were early leaders after winning their opening two matches and newcomer Carl Griffiths netted a hat-trick in a 5-1 win over Torquay. The Hatters briefly regained pole position after beating Darlington 5-2 in October, signing Chris Coyne from Dundee, Jean-Louis Valois from Lille, Dean Crowe from Stoke, Ahmet Brkovic from Orient and Dave Bayliss from Rochdale. A run of 12 successive wins, slamming five goals past Halifax and Mansfield, took Luton back to the top with two games remaining but they finished runners-up to Plymouth.

2004/05

Mike Newell managed Luton Town to the League One title in 2004/05. The Hatters stormed to the top of the table, winning 10 of their first 12 games before three successive defeats. They beat Bradford City 4-0 and Wrexham 5-1, then Steve Howard netted a

hat-trick in a 4-1 win at MK Dons. The 1-0 victory over Port Vale in December heralded a 14 match unbeaten run and Luton bounced back from a 3-1 defeat in the return fixture to hammer Bristol City 5-0. Briefly displaced as leaders by Hull, they triumphed 4-1 at Torquay and secured promotion with four games remaining. Luton won the title with a record 98 points.

HAVE WE MET BEFORE?

During this exciting season I will look back over the years at a past match involving our opponents.

In the league fixtures this season we have never before played Hyde or Dartford. We have played Nuneaton Borough many times before they changed their name to Nuneaton Town. It's also nice to see local rivals Hereford United back in the Blue Square Bet Premier Division and that game will certainly see us attract another good crowd to The New Lawn. It will also be the first time that we will have played Macclesfield Town in a league fixture after our two epic FA Cup games against them which made the Guinness Book of Records following that marathon penalty shoot-out in the replay at The New Lawn.

Today we take a brief look at our two games with today's opponents from Luton Town from last season.

Following a hard earned point from our opening game of the season against Stockport County we travelled to Kenilworth Road on the following Tuesday for our opening away game of the campaign. PRE-MATCH

For their first F.A. Cup game of the season Forest Green Rovers came into the match having suffered three successive league defeats in the Blue Square Bet Premier Division and were without Steve Brogan who suffered a knee injury in the 1-0 defeat at Mansfield Town. He was replaced in the starting line up by Magno Vieira. There was also a recall for Eddie Oshodi, who had missed the last two games because of suspension, and he kept the captain's armband despite the selection of Jared Hodgkiss.

THE GAME

There was a quiet opening to this FA Cup tie but that changed in the twelfth minute when JAMES NORWOOD picked the ball up from deep, surged forward, and unleashed a twenty five yard drive that flew past Dartford goalkeeper Louis Wells into the bottom corner. It was just the start that the home side had been looking for but the urgency normally associated with an FA Cup tie was still missing and Sam Russell in the home goal did not have a shot to save until the twenty fifth minute when he clutched a speculative effort from Lee Noble. Dartford could only improve in the second half and just eight minutes in they were back on level terms. Ed Asafu-Adjaye appeared to lose his footing and presented the ball to Ryan Hayes who did well to pull the ball back for JACOB ERSKINE to finish from ten yards.

This was the wake up call that Rovers needed and they responded when Norwood was foiled by a plunging save from Wells after getting to a firm header from Jamie Turley. Norwood remained the home side's biggest threat and the winger's mazy run in the seventy second minute ended with a decent drive that whistled past the post. Two great

late chances were spurned at either end, first when Wells produced a brave block to deny Yan Klukowski from close range and then Noble shot wide from inside the area. The two evenly matched teams must do it all over again when they meet on Tuesday night in the replay.

AFTER MATCH VERDICT

Following the 1-1 draw between the two sides Rovers Manager, David Hockaday, said "We played very well first half but it was only 1-0 and we said they are waiting for us to make a mistake. Then we go and make a mistake and gift them the goal. Goals change games, so it gives them something and it was an end to end game. "However much you train you cannot cater for individual mistakes and we are making too many at the moment so we need to get rid of them. "We've got to pick ourselves up and go there and put on a performance to get in the next round."

Today, Richard talks to former Luton Town defender, Ed Asafu-Adjaye now of course playing a starring role for Rovers here at The New Lawn



In Luton's three previous visits to The New Lawn, defensive man Ed Asafu-Adjaye has always visited Gloucestershire as part of the Luton Town side that offered him his big chance in the game.

Today however, for the first time in his career, 'Prince' as he is affectionately known, lines up against the club he grew up with as a young boy, forging a career with the Kenilworth Road club that has brought massive highs and some deep lows.

The London born defender finally cut ties with Luton at the end of last season and winged in at Rovers this summer, penning a one year deal, and he has proven to be Mr Consistency so far as he has featured in every game this season.

"It's been a brilliant start," commented Asafu-Adjaye. "I've enjoyed coming down here, it's been a bit of a change.

"Being at the top it's a different kind of pressure but it's a pressure that you want."

Asafu-Adjaye's performances have singled him out as one of Rovers star performers this term.

An early season injury crisis handed him a starting role in the back line at left full back. He's eventually worked his way round to a more comfortable right sided position but in more recent times has again found himself on the left flank.

"It is going to be the first time I will come up against Luton. I'm looking forward to it and obviously there are a lot of players there that I played with for many years and it would be nice to be on the pitch with them again. Hopefully we can get a good result.

"I always tried to applaud the fans and always tried to show them my appreciation. When they come here and when I go back to Kenilworth Road I will give them a clap and I hope it's returned."

Asafu-Adjaye featured for the Hatters first team over the course of five seasons, taking in time as a League One, Two and Conference player.

He experienced the rocky ride that the Bedfordshire club found itself embroiled in with points deductions and eventual relegation out of the Football League but will always look back at his time with the club with many fond memories.

"There are some great memories. We had some lows and we had some highs. For me I remember more highs than I do lows."

In 2009, Asafu-Adjaye was a part of the Luton side that breathtakingly pipped Scunthorpe United to the Johnstone Paint Trophy title at Wembley Stadium.

That day over 40,000 Luton supporters filled the stands of the world's most famous footballing venue and the reliable defender knows all too well how much of a difference a big crowd can make for any side.

"Playing in front of big crowds helps any player. When you get used to playing with the support it can be a twelfth man and at Luton we really experienced the twelfth man at the Johnstone Paint Trophy final.

"We never would have won that game and it does make a difference. Hopefully the better we do here at The New Lawn we can draw in more fans and more crowds and give the boys more support."

Asafu-Adjaye will no doubt be hoping he can return to Wembley this season with a big following and as part of a success story with Forest Green Rovers.



BACK IN TIME








