




Club History

since Mark Morris' decided to resign after seven seasons at the helm at the end of season 2005/06. Over the following four seasons there were five managers, including one who undertook a caretaker role, but Ashley Vickers, who was appointed in November 2009, appeared to have succeeded in steadyng the ship. Unfortunately, as is so often the case, Ashley was relieved of his duties in October 2011 following a run of poor results, and was initially replaced on a caretaker basis by Assistant Manager Phil Simkin, who took the reigns with support from long serving player Mark Jermyn, before Portsmouth legend Alan Knight was appointed to the post in late November 2011, with Simkin reverting to his former role. Knight then resigned his post just prior to Easter 2012, and Phil Simkin was once again asked to step into the breach, this time on a permanent basis assisted again by Player Coach Mark Jermyn together with a newly appointed Assistant Manager Stuart Heath. The Magpies have enjoyed significant success in cup competitions over the years, and have reached the Second Round Proper of the FA Cup on four occasions, including this season. The most recent, prior to this season, was in 1981, when they lost to AFC Bournemouth after a replay, before a crowd of 8700 at Dean Court. Previously they had played York City and Plymouth Argyle, both in the 1950's. They have also reached the First Round Proper on six other occasions, with their opponents being Norwich City, QPR, and Port Vale, again all in the 1950's, Gloucester City in 1989/90, Oxford United in 1995/96, and finally in 2000/01 when Wigan Athletic were the opposition at The JJB Stadium, when The Magpies went down 3-1 after a fine display.

After joining the Southern League in 1972 the early years were a struggle, and it was not until season 1977/78 that the Club first tasted success, when they finished as runners up to Margate in Division One (South). The following season, upon the formation of the Alliance League (now the Nationwide Conference), The Magpies found themselves back in the reformed Southern Division. Dorchester then celebrated their centenary by winning the Championship of Division One (South) in 1979/80, by a one-point margin over Aylesbury. Relegated from the Premier Division at the end of the 1983/84 season, following a severe financial crisis, they only just avoided dropping out of the League in season 1985/86. However, a remarkable transformation was achieved, and Dorchester returned to the Premier Division as

Champions at the end of the following season. For most of the seasons that they were back in the Premier Division, Dorchester were a mid table team, but in season 1993/94, following a poor start to the campaign, Stuart Morgan was appointed manager, and having succeeded in steering the Club out of the relegation zone, he took The Magpies to sixth position the following season.

Season 1997/98 saw The Magpies achieve their highest ever Premier Division placing when they finished in fourth place, but the next two seasons were very disappointing with relegation only just being avoided on both occasions. After a poor start to the season, manager Stuart Morgan was relieved of his position as manager in September 1999, and was replaced by Mark Morris.

Mark was able to steer the Club out of the relegation zone in his first season, but sadly he was unable to repeat the feat the following season, when The Magpies lost the Premier Division place that they had held for fourteen seasons. The Magpies threatened to regain their Premier Division status in their first season in the Eastern Division, but finished in third place behind Champions Hastings Town and Runners Up Grantham Town, however they achieved their objective the following season, when after a fine campaign, with only five defeats, the Club returned to the Premier Division as Champions.

In season 2003/04 Dorchester won the end of season play off competition, defeating Bath City in the Semi-Final and Tiverton Town in the Final, played at Exeter City's St. James Park, to gain entry to the newly formed Conference South where, apart from the first two seasons and last season, they have invariably struggled in the lower half of the table, but have retained their place until the present day, which is a great achievement for the small market town of Dorchester with a population of 15,000.

Perhaps commensurate with their struggle to stabilise their position in the Conference South, not surprisingly there have been a number of managerial appointments

since 2005/06. The Magpies have reached the Second Round Proper of the FA Cup on four occasions, including this season. The most recent, prior to this season, was in 1981, when they lost to AFC Bournemouth after a replay, before a crowd of 8700 at Dean Court. Previously they had played York City and Plymouth Argyle, both in the 1950's. They have also reached the First Round Proper on six other occasions, with their opponents being Norwich City, QPR, and Port Vale, again all in the 1950's, Gloucester City in 1989/90, Oxford United in 1995/96, and finally in 2000/01 when Wigan Athletic were the opposition at The JJB Stadium, when The Magpies went down 3-1 after a fine display.

The Magpies, then in the Eastern Division, won the Southern League Cup competition in season 2001/02, convincingly defeating then Premier Division King's Lynn by an aggregate score of 4-0 in the two leg Final. Prior to that Dorchester's most successful season in that competition was 1991/92 when they finished as runners up to Dover. Previously they reached the semi finals in 1981/82 when they lost to Wealdstone, and they reached the same stage again in 1998/99 when they were defeated by Cambridge City.

Dorchester have won the Dorset Senior Cup on twelve occasions, the most recent being last season when Wimborne Town were beaten in the Final played at the County Ground at Hamworthy.

Dorchester moved to their current ground, The Avenue Stadium in August 1990, which is literally a few yards down the road from their old home. The ground stands on land owned by the Duchy of Cornwall, and Prince Charles, in his role as Duke of Cornwall, took an active interest in its design, making a number of private visits during construction, before officially opening the ground on the 20th November 1991. A Tesco supermarket has been built on the Club's previous ground, which they had occupied since 1929. The highest attendance for a league game at The Avenue Stadium is 4129 for the match against Weymouth on the 1st January 1999, although the stadium capacity is 5009, with seating for 710.

Town Travel

For those of you wishing to travel to The Magpies away games the following may be of use to you.

SATURDAY 1st DECEMBER 2012 - LUTON TOWN FC - 3pm KO (Tuesday 27th November if replay is required for the FA Trophy)

Kenilworth Stadium, Kenilworth Road, Luton LU4 8AW. Tel No: 01582 411622

1. Take the A35 from Dorchester heading towards Bere Regis.
2. At Bere Regis join the A31 towards Wimborne and Ringwood.
3. Stay on the A31 until joining the M27.
4. Stay on M27 and after passing Rownhams Services bear left and join M3.
5. Stay on M3 until reaching M25 and go clockwise (signed Heathrow).
6. Leave M25 at junction 21a and join M1 heading North signed Luton Airport.
7. Leave M1 at junction 11 and follow A505.
8. Follow A505 for about 1.5 miles and Kenilworth Road is on your right as you leave the one way system along Dunstable Road.
9. To park follow one way around turning left right and right again so that you do a complete u-turn.
10. Take second left into Ash Road.
11. Continue down to the bottom turn left and the club is in front of you.
12. Continue straight past the club and the road bends immediately over a dual carriageway bridge.
13. Beyond this is plenty of street parking (and club advises a great fish and chip shop if arriving early).

THERE IS NO PARKING AT THE GROUND AT ALL.

APPROXIMATE DISTANCE: 145 miles.

ADMISSION PRICES: Adults £18; Over 65's, Under 22's £13; Over 75's £10; Under 16's £8; Under 10's £5.

BY TRAIN: Luton Railway Station is a good 15 minutes walk from the ground. From the station turn left along the railway bridge down the steps and turn right along Bute which runs through the Arndale Shopping Centre. At the top of the centre bear right along Dunstable Road and the ground is on the left.

MATCHDAY PROGRAMME: £3, away fans purchase from inside the ground from sellers on pitch perimeter.

A safety certificate is issued by Dorset County Council to permit the Club to admit spectators into the stadium.

This certificate imposes certain conditions.

A minimum number of safety stewards must be present. They are in attendance for your safety, and you are asked to comply with any reasonable request.


Spectators are not permitted to lean on the pitch perimeter wall, as its safety cannot be guaranteed.

24th NOVEMBER

This is largely a successful date in The Magpies' diary, with only two defeats suffered in the eight games played on the 24th November, two games were drawn and four were won.

1951 A home game in Division One of the Western League with the opposition being provided by Street, who were defeated by The Magpies by three goals to two, with our scorers being Harry Merritt, John Masterson and Ken Symes.

1956 Another home game in the same division and another victory, this time against Salisbury City by five goals to two, with Denis Cheney scoring four and Eric Bryant netting the other.

1962 Yet another home game and yet another home win in the same league. This time the vanquished were Bideford who went down by four goals to two, with The Magpies goals being scored by Peter Brown who bagged a hatrick, with the other goal being scored by Graham Fuge.

1973 Our second season in the First Division South of the Southern League, and an away game for a change with a trip to Bath City, but a defeat on this occasion by a single goal.

1990 At home once again, this time against Atherstone United in the Premier Division of the Southern League, but sadly a defeat by the odd goal in three, with Tony Diaz on target for The Magpies.

1998 A Dr. Martens League Cup tie, second leg, away at Fleet Town. The Magpies had won the home leg by three goals to one, and the second leg ended goalless in a game watched by thirty-two spectators, two of whom was yours truly and my daughter.


2001 A home game against Corby Town in the Eastern Division of the Southern League and a comfortable 3-0 success for The Magpies, with their scorers being Marcus Oldbury, Matt Groves and Justin Keeler.

2007 A home Third Qualifying Round tie in the FA Trophy against Worthing with the Ryman League Division One South side holding The Magpies to a 1-1 draw, with The Magpies goal being scored by Dani Rodrigues. The Magpies went on to win the replay by two goals to one.

Down Memory Lane

The Magpie Who Flew The Nest To Become a Hatter - David John Noake

David was born in the village of Marston Magna, just outside Yeovil on the 9th June 1940.

His football career began at the age of seventeen with Yeovil Town, for whom he played in their Colts and Reserves sides, before he joined Reading on amateur terms, where he played in their Reserve side for a season. At the end of that season the manager at Reading at the time, Harry Johnston, wanted David to stay at the club, but to remain on an amateur basis. David was unhappy with the continuation of the arrangement, as he felt that the management had had sufficient time to decide whether he was worthy of a professional contract, and he decided to return home.

David then lived in Sherborne, and whilst on an evening out he was approached by Arthur Proudler, who was then the manager at Dorchester Town, and he stole a march on other clubs who were keen to sign him and beat his rivals to David's signature, who then signed for The Magpies in August 1959.

In his short time at The Avenue Ground David made a total of twelve league appearances and scored three goals. He also appeared in both of the club's FA Cup matches that season, against Weymouth away in the Fourth Qualifying Round, which was won 1-0, and in the First Round Proper at home to Port Vale, when The Magpies went down 2-1 to the then Division Three side, with The Valiants scoring the winning goal in injury time after a great game.

Prior to those cup games an approach to sign David had been received from Luton Town, but it was made clear by the management of Dorchester that he would not be allowed to leave until The Magpies were out of the FA Cup, and so it was on the 24th November, just after the Port Vale game, that David joined The Hatters who were managed at the time by Sid Owen. As part of the transfer deal Luton agreed to play a friendly game at Dorchester, a game that David played in, and another player who appeared in that game was the former Northern Ireland International Billy Bingham who, David informs me, extolled the quality of the pitch at the old Avenue Ground at the time as the third best he had ever played on, behind Wembley and Ipswich Town!

David went on to make seventeen league appearances for the Bedfordshire club, without scoring, although it should be noted that David is of the opinion that he made more like a total of twenty-five appearances in all for The Hatters during his spell there, which ended in June 1961 when he joined Bristol City. Unfortunately his departure from Kenilworth Road did not end harmoniously, as he had a dispute with the then manager Sam Bartram, who had replaced Sid Owen the previous year, over a fitness issue.

At Ashton Gate David made eleven league appearances and scored three goals under the management of Fred Ford.


After one season with the Bristol club David moved into non-league football with Trowbridge Town where Charlie Fleming, the former Scottish International, was manager, and David spent three happy years there, mainly playing as an inside forward and scoring a lot of goals. Whilst with the Wiltshire club David went into his own business in a shop and Post Office in Yeovil where he lived.

At this time Ron Saunders who was then the manager of Yeovil Town wanted to take David to Huish, but Bristol City, who had held on to his league registration, demanded a fee of £15K, which Yeovil were not prepared to pay, and so nothing came of it.

David then went on to play for Frome Town, where he played twelve games, before suffering a knee injury, and then ended his playing career with Glastonbury, for whom he played for nine years, and subsequently became their manager for five years.

David has not enjoyed the best of health at times in recent years, but looked very well the day I met him, and he continues to live in Yeovil with his wife Pam, with whom he has four children, three daughters and one son, and has ten grandchildren and one great grandchild.

It was lovely to see David again after all the years that have elapsed since he graced the Avenue turf, and I know that he is intending to attend today's match between two of his former clubs, with other members of his family, including his grandson, who is following in his grandfather's footsteps playing in Yeovil Town's youth set up.




Neil Martin

Jon Choperena Garcia







This time last year, York City were minutes away from exiting the FA Trophy at the first round stage. However, they equalised in injury-time against Solihull Moors, won the replay and the rest, as they say, is history.

With The Minstermen now back in the Football League after winning both the Trophy and Blue Square Bet Premier play-off finals in the space of a week, a new Trophy winner is guaranteed.

Today sees the first round of the competition and the introduction of the BSB Premier teams. Since its inception in 1969, the Trophy has been a magical competition. While the FA Cup will always be number one – and rightly so – the Trophy allows Non-League sides from Steps 1 to 4 to dream of a trip to Wembley.

Last season we saw Step 3 Wealdstone of the Ryman Premier make it all the way to the semi-finals where they were eventually beaten by Newport County. The Stones' magnificent run showed clubs from outside the Conference that it can be done.

King's Lynn Town, of the NPL Division One South have already seen off three clubs from higher divisions. And with a trip to Worksop Town next up for them today, boss Gary Setchell is hopeful of a fourth upset.

He said: "We understand where we are in this competition, we know we're one of the lowest sides left in it. We beat a Step 2 team in the last round and beat two Step 3 sides before that so we know we've got a chance.

"We absolutely love being the underdog, that's when we play at our best. We'll take a fair few fans up to Worksop and it'll be a great day for the club, hopefully we have another shock in us."

The other Step 4 clubs left in the competition are Merthyr Town who host Tonbridge Angels, Ossett Town travel to Stockport, Skelmersdale face a trip to Boston United and Maidstone United welcome Salisbury City.

Another side hoping to upset the apple cart are NPL Premier Rushall Olympic. The Pics face a tough task at BSB Premier heavyweights Wrexham. But boss Neil Kitching says his side will take strength from Wealdstone's achievements last year.

He said: "Wealdstone did very well last year, and it just proves that smaller clubs like ours can beat some of the bigger teams along the way.

"There are no guarantees that you'll beat anybody so we'll go to Wrexham, enjoy the day and there's the possibility of a massive cup upset."

With plenty of other big ties going on around the country, 32 sides will go into the next round one step closer to Wembley. It might be a bit early to start planning your trip to the famous arch but a good run in the Trophy can lead to a magical day for any club.



This is a busy time of year for everyone. Christmas on the horizon, fixtures starting to come thick and fast, and – for many clubs – the squeeze is starting to be felt. With the summer transfer window a distant memory and the January sales still not close enough for comfort, it is during November and December that many lurking financial concerns come home to roost.

This is something that we at Supporters Direct have learned in our years working with supporters' trusts and supporter owned clubs. Many of the first steps towards ownership or greater influence were taken during this time of year, though the campaigns are not always realised until the clocks have gone forward once more. In some cases, such as Portsmouth, the process unfolds over months and years. But for what journalist David Conn recently described as "one of the most unhappy sagas in English football's history of club ownership", an end looks like it could be in sight, after the news that Pompey Supporters' Trust have been named preferred bidders for the club.

Many of you reading this article will already be aware of the Trust's story, and the enormous effort they have put it to reach this point. Formed during the club's first period in administration and officially registered on December 23rd 2009, PST have been the one constant in a dizzying cast of characters to arrive on the south coast, and despite the ever-changing situation, they have stayed true to their original mission statement: "to bring about responsible, democratic representation at Portsmouth Football Club and so help promote the highest standards of transparent governance, accountability and embed Portsmouth FC deeper into its community through greater communication and co-operation with its fans."

Having watched their club teeter on the verge of collapse for much of the last three years, the Trust realised some time ago that the only sustainable future for their club was community ownership. As the Community Pompey website (the hub for their ownership scheme which has been developed with advice and support from Supporters Direct, Taylorcocks and Verisona) states: "Our club or no club, the choice is simple."

Securing preferred bidder status is, of course, only the first step, and there is a lot of work still to do. But the support – from fans, the press, and politicians of all persuasions – shows that the momentum is clearly with the Trust. A forthcoming share issue will seek to capitalise on that, and allow the fans to take control of the club's destiny, protecting the legacy for generations to come.

RECENT HISTORY OF LUTON TOWN 2006 TO THE PRESENT DAY

The 2006-2007 season was largely dominated by the Hatters' off-the-field problems, which began with manager Mike Newell blowing the whistle on underhand transfer activity that he knew of within the game. With the first game of the season at home to Leicester City being screened live on television, the early kick-off and subsequent 2-0 victory ensured the Town sat top of the table after their first match, albeit for a couple of hours.

However the season took a dramatic turn for the worse following a thumping 5-1 home victory over Leeds United which had seen the club cement its position in fifth place in the table. A 4-0 thrashing at Everton in the second round of the League Cup bringing everyone back down to earth with a bump.

But worse news was to follow.

Prior to the trip to face Ipswich Town at Portman Road, defender Sol Davis suffered a stroke on the team coach on the way to the hotel leaving the whole club in shock, and it was no surprise the following day that – with minds elsewhere – the Hatters were on the receiving end of a 5-0 defeat. The Hatters then went onto equal their all time record of eight consecutive defeats by losing the following six matches, which sent them plummeting down the table, with a 2-0 victory over Preston North End at Kenilworth Road stopping the rot.

Following a fifth straight defeat to Hull City on 13th March manager Mike Newell was dismissed after becoming increasingly frustrated with The Hatters' board and Brian Stein was placed in temporary charge for the next match against Ipswich Town which the team also lost amid angry demonstrations by sections of the Kenilworth Road faithful.

Former Barton Rovers goalkeeper and Leeds United manager Kevin Blackwell was named as Newell's permanent successor.

But despite gaining a gritty point during a 0-0 draw at Burnley in Blackwell's first match in charge, the side only won one of their remaining six games and relegation to League One was confirmed during a gutsy 1-0 defeat at Derby County.

Kevin Blackwell signed eight players during the summer of 2007 in preparation for a tilt at promotion back to the Championship. During the first month of the season it seemed that the Hatters stood a decent chance of doing so, after four wins from their first five league and cup fixtures, including a 3-0 victory over Premier League Sunderland at Kenilworth Road. However form began to tail off and The Hatters had yet to win away from home, but worse news was to follow when the club were deducted ten points for falling into administration in November. From being in a com-

fortable mid-table position the Hatters found themselves deep in a relegation battle, but the first match following the points deduction the team rallied themselves to beat Southend United 1-0 at Kenilworth Road. Results began to pick-up in December and a FA Cup Second Round replay victory over Nottingham Forest ensured The Hatters faced another cup clash with Liverpool at Kenilworth Road. On Boxing Day The Hatters were involved in a highly-controversial match at Bristol Rovers, where incredibly they held out to record a 1-1 draw despite having to play half the match with nine men and the last thirteen minutes with only eight men on the pitch following three sending-offs.

And in the last match of 2007 we saw the first away win of the campaign recorded courtesy of a last-minute strike from Matthew Spring. With the administrator in charge however, the New Year saw the beginning of player sales, which would go on to affect the team's performances later in the season.

But firstly the small matter of a game against Liverpool at Kenilworth Road in the Third Round of the FA Cup had to be settled and after going behind to a Peter Crouch goal, a John Arne Riise own goal thirteen minutes from time earned The Hatters a much needed money-spinning replay at Anfield. At this point the administrator had been working on cutting the spiralling wage bill at the club, and as a result club captain Chris Coyne was sold to Colchester United and midfielder David Edwards – only signed by Blackwell in the summer – was sold to Wolves.

Colossal Polish centre-half Jaroslaw Fojut returned to Bolton after his loan spell expired and would not return, as The Hatters were unable to sign anybody while still in administration, which left the squad decimated, especially in defence. Blackwell then decided to call it quits by saying he would quit the club following the replay at Liverpool.

Before the cup replay at Anfield it was announced that the administrator had chosen Luton Town 2020 Ltd as the preferred bidders to take over the club. The consortium was headed by famous Hatters' fan and TV presenter Nick Owen, and included former Hatters' legends Steve Foster and Godfrey Ingram as well as other influential businessman all of which were Town supporters. Buoyed by this news it made for an extra-special night at Anfield, where almost 6,000 Luton fans out-sung the famous Kop for long periods before, during and after the game. The team held on until the final minute of added on time in the first half before Ryan Babel struck the opening goal of the game to break The Hatters' hearts. A Steven Gerrard hat-trick and a goal from Sami Hyppia in the second half cumulated in a 5-0 defeat, but despite the score line,

The Hatters' performance was far from embarrassing. That was to be manager Kevin Blackwell's last match in charge of the Town as the administrator moved quickly to install legend Mick Harford as his replacement, but despite a spirited display the team lost 1-0 in his first game in charge away to Leyton Orient on 19th January. With the team struggling to find any form and with young players low on confidence, the side failed to win again until a 3-0 home victory over Oldham Athletic on 15th March, by which time they were already twelve points from safety. But after picking up five points from the following three games to give them hope, the Town went on to lose all of their final six matches and relegation to League Two was confirmed following the 2-1 home defeat to Brighton on 12th April.

With the new owners set to take full control of the club in the summer, the only problem The Hatters prepared themselves for would have been beginning their League Two campaign with fifteen points deducted for failure to agree to a CVA (Company Voluntary Agreement). However the Football League decided that because the club had been in administration for the third time in nine years, they would punish them further by deducting a further five points. But worse news followed.

The club were still being investigated by the Football Association for the past financial irregularities that had been made public during Mike Newell's time at the club two years previously. As a result the club had a further ten points docked by the FA, which meant the club had to start the season with an incredible thirty point penalty. Both Bournemouth and Rotherham suffered a similar fate for recent spells in administration and were hit with seventeen point deductions by the Football League. Once the club was officially taken over a week before the season started, the club only had six professionals on the books leading up to the home game with Port Vale. Harford though pulled off one of the biggest transfer coups in the club's history when it was announced that former club captain Kevin Nicholls was resigning for the club.

Nicholls was joined by ten other new faces, either signed on a free transfer or brought in on-loan, as the manager pieced together a team fit for the campaign ahead. Despite a slow and inconsistent beginning to the season The Hatters ended 2008 just one point away from wiping out the thirty point deficit and were only fifteen points away from safety. The season was also brought to life by the club's run in the Johnstone Paint Trophy, which was won in superb style at Wembley with a 3-2 victory over Scunthorpe United in April.

However, the burden of the points deduction

In Town Today

JJ O'Donnell

Left-sided or central midfielder who joined the Town with St Albans teammate Godfrey Poku in January 2010. Also capable of playing at left back the youngster featured for The Hatters' reserve and youth teams during 2009/10. He made his first team debut as a substitute in the 4-2 FA Cup First Round replay win over Corby Town and was handed a one-year contract extension in June 2011. After loan spells at Thurrock and Hampton & Richmond in 2011/12, Paul Buckle rewarded his efforts with a new three-year contract in the summer of 2012.

Adam Watkins

Young midfielder, capable of playing in attack, who signed professional forms at Kenilworth Road in June 2010. A self-confessed Hatters fan, he made his first team bow in a 1-0 defeat at Southampton in the FA Cup Third Round in January 2010. He broke into the first team squad during 2010/11 campaign scoring twice on his full debut in the 4-0 FA Trophy win over Uxbridge. Watkins then scored his first league goal on his first league start in the 3-1 win over Braintree in August 2011 and was then offered a new two-year contract extension. Adam went onto have a fine first season, scoring six goals and was capped at England C level – scoring against Italy.

Matt Robinson

Teenage central midfielder with an eye for goal, who impressed Paul Buckle enough in pre-season to earn himself a contract. Despite being a regular goal scorer for The Foxes' youth team he was released at the end of last season.

Alex Lawless

Former Wales Under-21 midfielder who signed in November 2010, initially on-loan from York City before a permanent deal went through in January 2011. A star of The Minstermen's campaign last season which saw them lose in the Promotion Final to Oxford United, Lawless featured prominently in all four of the meetings with The Hatters last term at the heart of midfield. He only joined York at the start of last season, impressing then boss Martin Foyle enough to prise the 25-year-old away from Forest Green Rovers where performances in a variety of positions - in defence and across midfield - had also caught the eye of Football League scouts. It's not just the 150 games experience in the Conference that Lawless has with Forest Green and York that he has on his CV. A former Cardiff City scholar he took-up non-league football in Wales before he was snapped up to earn his first professional contract with Premier League Fulham in 2003.

Without featuring for The Cottagers it was off to the South West to Torquay United for the young Lawless, but after just a year and 16 appearances at Plainmoor he was on the move again, to Forest Green in 2006 and in his three seasons he helped the Gloucestershire side consolidate in the Conference. Arriving at Bootham Crescent in the summer of 2009, local media announced him merely as a "utility player" but that was far from the case, and alongside Neil Barrett he forged a formidable partnership in the centre of City's midfield, changing the Yorkshire club's relegation worries from one season to making them just one game away from promotion the next.

GOALKEEPERS

Mark Tyler

Hugely experienced goalkeeper who signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road in June 2009 to become Mick Harford's fifth signing of the summer following his release from Peterborough United. After falling down the pecking order at Posh he found first team opportunities hard to come by and in 2008/09 he was loaned out to League Two Bury where he made 11 appearances for The Shakers. A former England Youth international, Tyler was handed the number one shirt by the Hatters boss who admitted he'd failed in an attempt to sign the stopper the previous summer. After a hugely successful two years between the sticks at Kenilworth Road, Mark signed a new contract in the summer of 2011.

Dean Brill

No stranger to Kenilworth Road having made 97 appearances for The Hatters after rising through the ranks as a youngster. Left the club in 2009 for Oldham where he spent two seasons before signing for Barnet last season, who he helped keep in the Football League.

DEFENDERS

Lathaniel Rowe-Turner

Defender Lathaniel Rowe-Turner became Town boss Paul Buckle's sixth signing of a busy summer in July 2012. The 22-year-old is a left back by trade but is equally comfortable at centre-half and is reunited with the manager having previously worked together at Torquay United. Born in Leicester, 6ft 1in Lathaniel began his career with his hometown club. However, having failed to make a first team appearance in 2010 he was released by The Foxes and in February of that year he joined Buckle at Plainmoor. In his first season on the Devon coast the youngster appeared 10 times and scored once - in the Gulls' 3-0 win against Barnet. Last season Lathaniel made 24 appearances in all competitions prior to his release by manager Martin Ling.

Alex Lacey

Up-and-coming centre-half who made his first team debut as a 17-year-old in the FA Trophy first round tie against Welling, earning the man-of-the-match award for an excellent performance. Signed a professional contract to remain at Kenilworth Road until the end of the 2011/12 season, which extended to a 3-year deal by Paul Buckle in the summer of 2012.

Dean Beckwith

Centre-back Beckwith became The Hatters' second signing of the summer of 2011 following his release from League Two side Northampton Town. The 27-year-old, who signed a two-year deal at Kenilworth Road, was a key member of The Cobblers' squad in 2010/11, which reached the Fourth Round of the League Cup following wins over Brighton, Reading and Liverpool. The commanding 6ft 3in defender has experienced promotion from the Blue Square Bet Premier before having been part of the Hereford United side that won the Play-Off final against Halifax Town in 2008. With almost 250 senior appearances to his name after starting his career as a junior at Gillingham, the centre-half enjoyed his best goal scoring season last season scoring three goals. The defender turned down offers from a number of Football League clubs but was delighted to agree terms to bolster the Hatters' defensive options.

Janos Kovacs

Hungarian defender who signed on-loan for his second spell at the club in September 2011. Formerly with Chesterfield and Lincoln, Kovacs first signed in January 2010 before signing for Hereford Utd in the summer of that year. Signed a 18-month contract in Jan. 2012.

Ronnie Henry

The Hatters unveiled influential defender Ronnie Henry as their first signing of the summer in June 2012. The former Stevenage captain signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road to also become Paul Buckle's first recruit as Town boss. Home-born Henry joined The Hatters having spent seven successful years at Broadhall Way in which he helped the Hertfordshire side twice win promotion and twice lift the FA Trophy. Primarily an attacking and assured right-back, Henry began his career as a youngster at Tottenham Hotspur, but after a loan spell with Southend United in 2003, he joined Dublin City in Ireland in 2004 for four months before returning to England to sign for Stevenage. In the season just passed, Henry made 40 appearances in League One, helping Stevenage to another Play-Off appearance. But, having received an offer of a new contract with Boro and from a string of Football League sides, he opted to sign on the dotted line for the Town – and was named captain for the 2012/13 season by Paul Buckle.

Simon Ainge

Classy centre-half signed on a month's loan from Blue Square Bet North side Guiseley in late September. Has spent three seasons at Nethermoor as The Lions' captain with his fine form rewarded by a call-up to the England C squad last season. Known for his calm defending and threat in the opposition penalty area. Last season he scored nine goals.

MIDFIELDERS

Arnaud Mendy

Combative and creative central midfielder signed from Macclesfield Town in October 2012. Born in France, he began his career with Rouen before moving to England to pursue a professional career. He signed for Derby, making one appearance for The Rams before signing for The Silkmen in the summer of 2011. He enjoyed a fruitful spell at the Moss Rose and hit the headlines last season with a stunning goal against Bolton Wanderers in the FA Cup. Impressed against The Hatters in Macc colours and having continued to monitor him boss Paul Buckle snapped the Guinea-Bissau international up on a two-year deal.

Jack Howells

The young winger, who can also play at left-back or in central midfield, came through the ranks at Kenilworth Road and made his first team debut as a second half substitute in May 2008. He made his full debut in the Hatters colours away at Bradford City in October 2008. After making 36 appearances for the Hatters in the 2008/09 the England C international was rewarded for his efforts with a professional contract in May. In his first season as a pro, Howells made huge strides with impressive performances on the left-side of midfield, ending the 2009/10 campaign with six goals, including his first senior goal in the incredible 4-3 win over Cambridge in September 2009. Capped at Under-21 level by Wales, Howells signed a three-year contract extension in the summer of 2012.

proved too much to shoulder and relegation out of the Football League was confirmed following a goalless draw against Chesterfield on Easter Monday. It meant the club would start life in the Blue Square Premier in 2009/10 after 89 years in the Football League.

In their first season in non-league football the Town finished second behind champions Stevenage, but lost in the Play-Offs at the semi-final stage to York City. During that campaign Richard Money took over from Mick Harford where the Town also reached the third round of the FA Cup. The Hatters again suffered Play-Off heartache in 2010/11 and again there was a change in manager - Gary Brabin taking over from Money in March. After finishing third this time around and beating Wrexham in the semi-finals, the Town lost on penal-

ties to AFC Wimbledon in the Promotion Final at the City of Manchester Stadium after the game ended goalless after one hundred and twenty minutes.

That meant a third season in non-league football for The Hatters and hopes were high of a tilt at the title in 2011/12. Unfortunately for the Town inconsistency dogged the team throughout the campaign, as they played catch-up on runaway top two Fleetwood and Wrexham. A terrible run of eight games without a win in March saw Gary Brabin lose his job. Paul Buckle was the latest man hired at to bring success to Kenilworth Road. Having witnessed a 3-1 defeat at Braintree, Buckle went about ensuring the Town's place in the Play-Offs, which was by no means guaranteed this time around. However, a run of six games undefeated, including a final-day-of-the-season victory

at champions Fleetwood, confirmed their spot in the top five and with it a crack at the Play-Offs for a third season running. For the second successive campaign the Town were paired with Wrexham. The Welsh club had finished runners-up having amassed 98 points.

A 2-0 home victory put The Hatters in command in the first leg and, while Buckle lost his unbeaten record in the second leg when Wrexham won 2-1 on the day, the Town were in the final once more where this time they would face York City.

At Wembley 30,000 Hatters fans turned Wembley orange and were celebrating just two minutes in when Andre Gray fired them in front. But joy turned to despair as Ashley Chambers equalised for The Minstermen, before a contentious winner ensured it was York and not the Town celebrating a return to the Football League.

James Dance

Energetic, tricky winger who joined the Hatters from Crawley Town in July 2011. Able to play on either flank or as a central striker, Dance began his career as a trainee at Birmingham City, but after being released, he made his name in non-league circles in the West Midlands before catching the eye of Kettering Town in 2009. After a string of fine performances on the wing for The Poppies - including a man-of-the-match performance against the Town in August 2009 - he signed for Crawley in January 2011. However, after picking up a Blue Square Bet Premier winners' medal last term, Dance found himself out of The Red Devils' starting XI and, after the Hatters' bid was accepted by the League Two club, a two-year deal was agreed.

FORWARDS

Dan Walker

Quick young forward capable of playing down the flanks, who signed a one-year deal in July 2010 after impressing in pre-season in games for and against The Hatters. Previously with Bedford Town, Walker has also played for Stony Stratford Town and Leighton Town. He made his first team debut for The Hatters as a substitute in a 3-0 win over AFC Wimbledon in September 2010, before scoring his first senior goal against Forest Green a month later. In the summer of 2012 he signed a new one-year contract.

Stuart Fleetwood

Prolific striker who signed for an undisclosed fee from Hereford United on deadline day in August 2011. The Gloucester-born front man, who scored 28 goals the last time he played at Conference level whilst with Forest Green Rovers, signed a two-year deal at Kenilworth Road. He began his career as a trainee at Cardiff City, making the grade to feature eight times for The Bluebirds between 2003 and 2006. In January 2006, Fleetwood signed for Hereford for the first time scoring eight times before he signed for Forest Green in June 2007. And it was his spell with Rovers that saw people sit up and take notice after plundering 32 league and cup goals in a season that saw the Gloucestershire side earn their highest league placing. The Wales Under-21

international turned down a new contract at FGR to sign for then Championship Charlton in June 2008, but was loaned out Cheltenham, Exeter and Brighton. Fleetwood returned to Edgar Street last summer and scored 18 goals as he helped The Bulls avoid the drop in League Two. After hitting the post on his debut against Stockport, Fleetwood scored on his full debut in the win over Darlington.

Andre Gray

Lightning-quick forward signed from Blue Square Bet North Hinckley United on loan transfer deadline day in March 2012. The prolific striker had scored 39 goals in two seasons for The Knitters after being released from Shrewsbury Town in 2010. The Wolverhampton-born man made a goal scoring debut for the Town when scoring in the 1-1 draw with Grimsby Town. He has also spent time on-loan with AFC Telford United. Scored seven goals in twelve games at the end of last season to earn his first call up to the England C squad.

Jon Shaw

Prolific centre forward who the Town beat off stiff competition to sign on a two-year contract in June 2012. Sheffield-born Shaw hit a phenomenal 35 goals in all competitions for Gateshead in 2011/12, 28 of which came in the Blue Square Bet Premier. In total Shaw netted a hugely impressive 56 goals in 97 appearances for the Heed - 45 of them coming in 81 league games. The striker has scored almost 130 career goals after starting out as a trainee at home-town club Sheffield Wednesday and scored his first senior goal for Wednesday at Kenilworth Road in a 3-2 victory for The Hatters in April 2004. That was one of two goals he scored in 24 appearances at Hillsborough before signing for then Conference outfit Burton Albion. The goals began to flow as he scored 31 times for The Brewers. After three seasons at Burton, Shaw moved to Halifax in 2007 and once more goals were on the menu as 26 were plundered for The Shaymen during 2007/08. That form in front of goal was enough to take him back to the Football League with Rochdale, but, having failed to break into the Dale first XI on a consistent basis, loan spells with Crawley, Barrow and Gateshead followed in seasons 2008/09 and 2009/10. On the lookout for regu-

lar first team action a six-month permanent spell with Mansfield followed for Jon in January 2010 having left Spotland. He scored three times in six starts for the Stags. But then in May of 2010 came his move to Gateshead and the rest, as they say, is history, with his goal scoring feats over the past two seasons well documented that led to a number of clubs showing a keen interest in his performances, including the Town. The Hatters' new man scored 21 goals in his debut season on Tyneside before hammering 35 in the season just gone. In the past two campaigns he's scored four hat tricks, including back-to-back trebles in late September 2011.

Scott Rendell

Striker who became the Town's third signing of the summer after completing a move from Wycombe Wanderers for an undisclosed fee. He hit 85 goals in his past six seasons and has been the creator of many more during successful stints with Wycombe, Torquay, Cambridge (twice) and Crawley in both the Conference and in League Two. He helped fire Wycombe to promotion in 2010/11 by hitting 16 goals in 26 starts, but found first team opportunities limited in League One in 2011/12 and was loaned out to Bristol Rovers and Oxford United - scoring three times for the U's. Scott began his career at Aldershot Town before making the short move to Championship club Reading. It was a loan move to Crawley that jump-started his career in 2006 when he hit eight goals in 21 games, which led to a permanent move in 2007. Soon the 6ft 2in striker was snapped up by Cambridge, and scored 17 league goals in 23 starts in 2007/08 at the Abbey Stadium. That goal scoring form in the Conference persuaded Peterborough United to shell out £115,000 for his services in 2008 but, after struggling to break into The Posh starting line-up, a loan move back to Cambridge followed in 2008/09 where he notched a further 15 goals. The following campaign Rendell was again out on loan, with Buckle securing the striker for a season long-loan that saw him hit 13 goals in all competition for The Gulls. A permanent move away from Peterborough saw Rendell sign for Wycombe in 2010 and was The Chairboys' top goal-getter as they secured promotion to League One.






