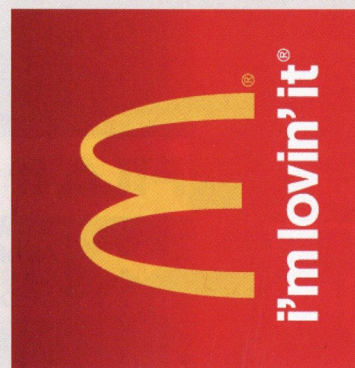

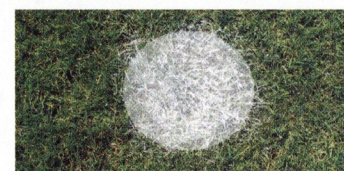

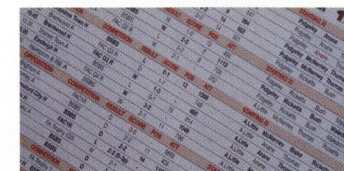

Thank you for coming along to Kingfield for this afternoon's big game. I hope you've all had an enjoyable Christmas and I wish you all the best for 2013.

I'd like to extend a particularly warm welcome to Paul Buckle and his management team and to the players, officials and fans from Luton Town. I hope that they enjoy their stay with us today.

Because of holiday printing deadlines, I'm having to write these notes immediately after our Boxing Day game at Kenilworth Road and have not therefore been able to take into account our away match at Braintree Town. I very much hope of course that we put up a good performance there.

Because of the postponement of our game against Forest Green Rovers on the Saturday before Christmas I've not

commented so far in my programme notes on our defeat in the FA Trophy against Welling United. It was extremely disappointing to go out of a competition in which we had fancied our chances of making further progress. It was a story of lack of discipline. Although we went behind early on to a well-taken free-kick, there was plenty of time to get back into the match. But Brett Williams's reckless challenge, leading to a red card, made the task much harder and then, early in the second half, Bradley Bubb paid a heavy price for an earlier unnecessary booking. Although we fought hard with nine men and were in the game until the final whistle, we had in effect handed the tie to Welling.

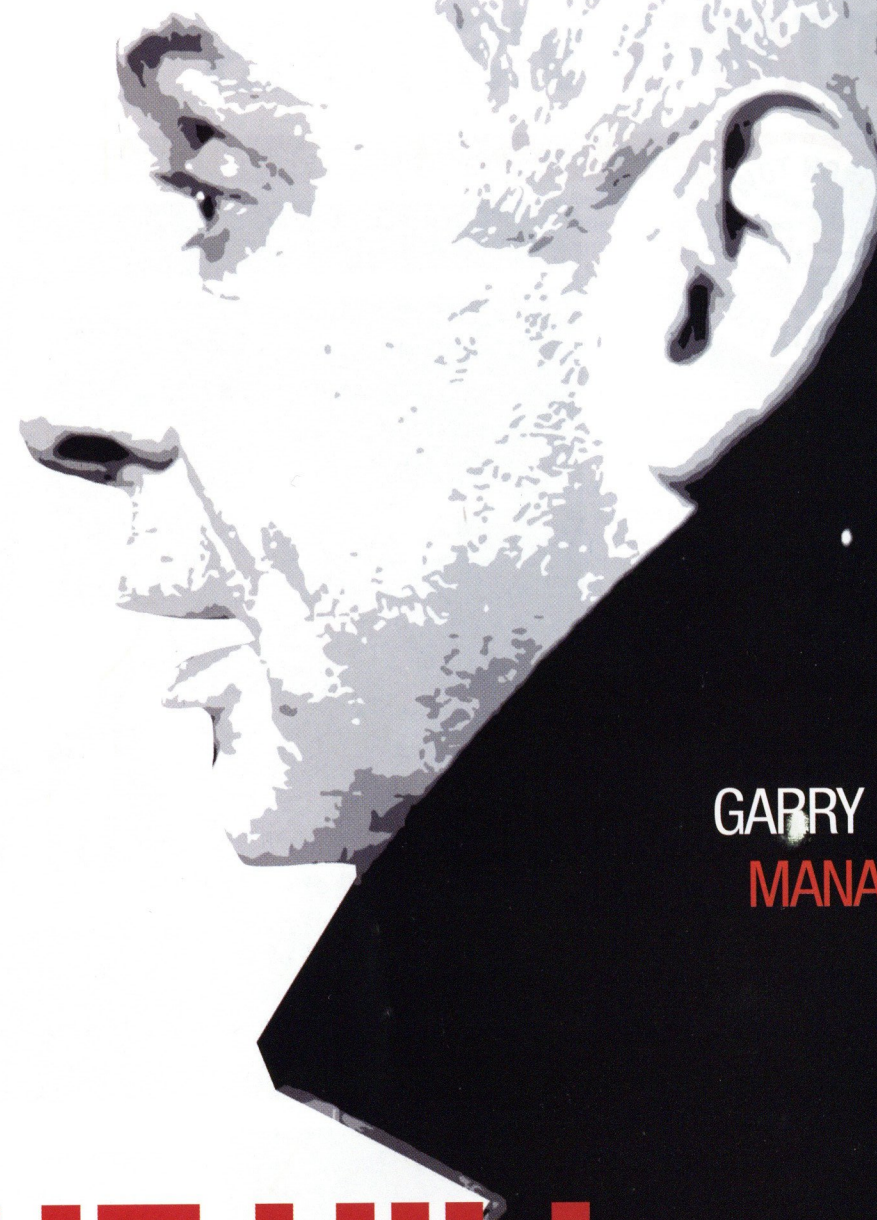
We knew that we would be tested at Luton on Boxing Day but gave a good account of ourselves. We started soundly but conceded the lead with poor marking from a corner and then conceded a second before half-time, perhaps showing Luton too much respect. The second half was a different story as we showed great character to take the game to Luton, scoring an excellent goal and then putting the home side under a lot of pressure. It looked as though we might go on and grab a point but we were undone by a breakaway which led to a penalty. I hope that our second-half performance will have given us heart for our trip to Braintree and today's return encounter against Luton. The players and I really appreciated the great support you gave us at Kenilworth Road.

I hope to see you all at our next home game, which is now at 1pm on Sunday 13 January against Ebbsfleet United. Enjoy the match and have a safe journey home.

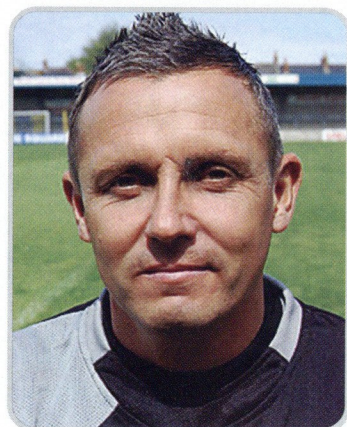

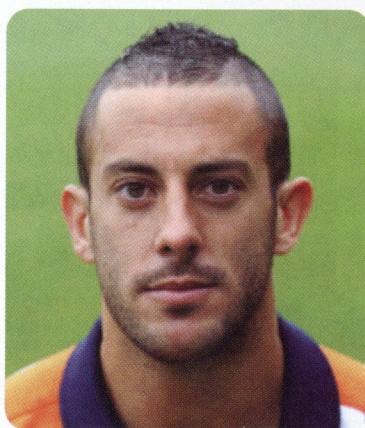
## The Manager

### Paul Buckle

The Hatters appointed Welwyn-born Buckle in April 2012 following the departure of Gary Brabin. He signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road three months after leaving League Two side Bristol Rovers. He also previously managed Torquay United, guiding them to promotion from the Blue Square Premier in 2009. After a 17th-place finish in League Two in 2009-10, Buckle led the Devon club to the League Two play-off final last season, where they lost narrowly to Stevenage. In his playing days he was best known as a midfielder for Colchester, Brentford, Torquay and Exeter.

## Dangerman

### Stuart Fleetwood

Striker Stuart signed from Hereford United in August 2011 and ended his first season at Kenilworth Road as Luton's top goalscorer with 16 goals in all competitions. He began his career as a trainee at Cardiff City, making eight senior appearances for the Bluebirds between 2003 and 2006. He first joined Hereford in January 2006 before moving to Forest Green in 2007. The Wales U21 international then joined Championship side Charlton but was loaned out to Cheltenham, Exeter and Brighton before re-joining the Bulls in July 2010.



# LUTON TOWN

## Players to Watch

### Ronnie Henry – Defender

Ronnie was the Hatters' first signing of last summer in June 2012, the former Stevenage captain becoming Paul Buckle's first recruit as Town boss. Hemel-born Henry spent seven successful years at Broadhall Way and helped the Hertfordshire side twice win promotion and twice lift the FA Trophy. Primarily an attacking right-back, he began his career as a youngster at Spurs, but after a loan spell with Southend United in 2003 he joined Dublin City in 2004 for four months before returning to sign for Stevenage.



### Lathaniel Rowe-Turner – Defender

Lathaniel was Paul Buckle's sixth signing of a busy summer in July 2012. The 22-year-old left-back is equally comfortable at centre-half and previously worked with Buckle at Torquay United. Born in Leicester, 6ft 1in Lathaniel began his career with his hometown club and was part of the Foxes' title-winning youth team in 2006-07. Having failed to make a first team appearance in 2010 he was released by the Foxes and joined Buckle at Plainmoor.

### Jake Howells – Midfielder

The young winger and England C international, who can also play at left-back or in central midfield, came through the ranks at Kenilworth Road and made his first team debut as a substitute in May 2008, making his full debut the following October and completing 36 appearances for the Hatters that season. Jake has also been capped at U21 level by Wales.

### Andre Gray – Forward

Lightning-quick forward Andre signed from BSBP's Hinckley United on loan transfer deadline day in March 2012 after scoring 39 goals in two seasons for the Knitters following release by Shrewsbury Town in 2010. Wolverhampton-born Andre made a goal scoring debut for Luton in the 1-1 draw with Grimsby Town. He has also spent time on loan with AFC Telford United. After scoring seven goals in 12 games at the end of last season he earned his first call-up to the England C squad this summer.

### Scott Rendell – Forward

Scott joined last summer from Wycombe Wanderers after hitting 85 goals in his past six seasons. He has also enjoyed stints with Torquay, Cambridge (twice) and Crawley in both the Conference and in League 2. Beginning his career at Aldershot Town, Scott joined Reading, before an impressive loan spell at Crawley persuaded Peterborough to sign him in 2008.

### Jon Shaw – Forward

A prolific centre-forward who signed for Luton last summer, Sheffield-born Shaw hit 35 goals in all competitions for Gateshead in 2011-12, 28 in the BSBP. He started as a trainee at Sheffield Wednesday before making appearances for Burton Albion and Halifax, and has also played for Rochdale, Barrow, Crawley and Mansfield.

## A Brief History

Luton Town FC has been based at Kenilworth Road since 1905. Formed in 1885, it was the product of a merger of the two leading local teams, Luton Town Wanderers and Excelsior, and was the first club in southern England to turn professional, making payments to players as early as 1890 and turning fully professional a year later.

Luton Town was a founder member of the Southern League in the 1894-95 season and finished as runners-up in their first two seasons. The club then left to help form the United League and came second in that league's inaugural season before joining The Football League for 1897-98. However, the expense almost crippled the club financially and a return to the regionally-organised Southern League was arranged for 1900-01. Luton then remained in the Southern League until 1920-21, when the club rejoined the Football League, making their way up from the Third Division (South) via the (old) Second Division to the top flight, which they finally reached in 1956. Relegated from the top division in 1960, the team was demoted twice more in the following five years, reaching the Fourth Division for the 1965-66 season before being eventually promoted back to the top level in 1974.

Luton's most recent successful period began in 1981-82, when the club won the (old) Second Division and promotion to the First Division. Winning the League Cup in 1988 with a 3-2 victory over Arsenal, Luton remained an established First Division club until relegation in 1992 signalled the end of major success. More recently, financial difficulties have caused the club to fall, in just three years, from the second tier of English football to the fifth, ending its 89-year spell as a member of the Football League.

Starting in 2006-07, the team was relegated twice in a row and spent the latter part of the 2007-08 season in administration, thus incurring a ten-point deduction from that season's total. The club then had a total of 30 points docked from its 2008-09 record by the Football Association and Football League for various financial irregularities. These deductions proved to be too large an obstacle to overcome and the club dropped into the Conference National, where they remain after three play-off defeats in three seasons.

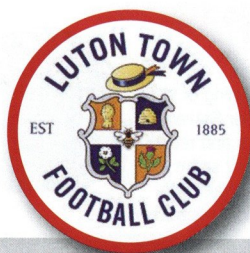

### Mark Tyler - Goalkeeper

Mark signed for Luton in June 2009 following his release from Peterborough United. A former England Youth international, he made 483 appearances in 15 years at London Road and was rewarded for his loyalty with a testimonial against Liverpool in 2007.

### Dean Brill - Goalkeeper

Dean has made 97 appearances for the Hatters after rising through the ranks as a youngster. He left the club in 2009 for Oldham, spending two seasons there before signing for Barnet last season.

### Lewis Kidd - Goalkeeper

Lewis is a young goalkeeper who has yet to make a first team appearance.

### Garry Richards - Defender

Commanding centre-half who arrived at Kenilworth Road after release by League 2 Gillingham, where he made 122 appearances over four years. Starting his career with Colchester United, Richards joined Southend but, after only 14 appearances, made the move to Priestfield.

### Greg Taylor - Defender

A left-back signed from Darlington in November 2011, Greg started his career as a junior with Northampton before signing for Kettering Town and then Darlington. He can also play at right-back and in central midfield.

### Alex Lacey - Defender

Centre half Alex, 17, made his first team debut in the FA Trophy first round tie against Welling and earned the Man of the Match award. He signed a contract extension last summer.

### Dean Beckwith - Defender

Centre-back Beckwith joined the Hatters following his release from League 2 side Northampton in 2011. The 6ft 3in defender experienced promotion from the BSBP with the Hereford United side that won the 2008 play-off final against Halifax Town.

### Janos Kovacs - Defender

Hungarian defender who signed on loan for his second spell at the club in September 2011. Formerly with Chesterfield and Lincoln, Kovacs first signed in January 2010 before joining Hereford United in the summer of that year.

### Simon Ainge - Defender

Centre-half Simon initially signed on a month's loan from BSN side Guiseley in late September. He spent three seasons at Nethermoor as the Lions' captain and was rewarded by a call-up to the England C squad last season. Scored nine goals from defence last term.

### Arnaud Mendy - Midfielder

Central midfielder Arnaud signed from Macclesfield Town in October 2012. Born in France, he began his career with Rouen before signing for Derby, making one appearance for the Rams before signing for the Silkmen in the summer of 2011.

### J J O'Donnell - Midfielder

Left-sided or central midfielder 'JJ' joined Luton in January 2010. Also capable of playing at left back, the youngster featured for the Hatters' reserve and youth teams during 2009-10.

### Danny Spiller - Midfielder

Former Millwall central midfielder Danny began his career as a youngster with Gillingham and signed for Millwall in 2007 before enjoying short spells with Wycombe, Welling and the Daggers. He returned to Gillingham in 2010 and joined Luton last summer.

### Adam Watkins - Midfielder

Young attacking midfielder Adam signed pro forms in June 2010. He broke into the first team squad during 2010-11 campaign, scoring twice on his full debut. Adam is also capped at England C level, scoring against Italy.

### Matt Robinson - Midfielder

Teenage central midfielder Matt earned a contract after impressing in pre-season. Prior to that he was a regular goal scorer for the Foxes' youth team.

### Alex Lawless - Midfielder

Former Wales Under-21 midfielder Alex signed in November 2010, initially on loan from York City before inking a permanent deal in January 2011. Prior to joining the Minstermen, he made around 150 appearances for Forest Green and has also been on the books with Fulham and Torquay.

### James Dance - Midfielder

An energetic winger who joined Luton from Crawley Town in July 2011, James can play on either flank or as a central striker. He began his career as a trainee at Birmingham City but after release, signed for Kettering Town in 2009. He joined Crawley in January 2011.

### Yaser Kasim - Midfielder

Iraqi central midfielder who has arrived on a six-month loan deal from Championship side Brighton. Yaser began his career as a trainee at Spurs before moving to the Amex Stadium, making his league debut for the Seagulls in May 2011.

### Andre Boucard - Midfielder

Andre, who signed for Luton in January 2012 from York City, began his career in the QPR academy but joined Reading in 2001 before being loaned out to Peterborough at the end of the 2002-03 season. He has also featured for Aldershot, Kettering Town and Wycombe, and has six caps for Trinidad & Tobago.

### John Paul Kissock - Midfielder

Attacking midfielder Kissock joined from Southport in August 2011. The former England U16 and U18 international began his career as a trainee at Premier League Everton, also making appearances for Gretna and Hamilton Accies. Southport signed the Liverpoolian in December 2010.

### Dan Walker - Forward

Dan signed in July 2010 after impressing in pre-season games for and against the Hatters. Previously with Bedford Town, Walker has also played for Stony Stratford Town and Leighton Town, and has also enjoyed loan spells at Eastbourne, Cambridge and Southport.

# OPPOSING VIEW

Tom Skinner isn't enjoying life in the Conference but it's changed his view of non-League football...



## Tell us a bit about yourself and your support for Luton Town

My Dad has been a long-standing Luton fan and took me to my first game in 1997. I've been a regular ever since and converted several others into becoming Hatters during this time, including my best friend.



## Did you ever envisage a time when Luton would be a non-League club (and below Stevenage in the football pyramid)? How are you and other fans enjoying your (not so brief!) sojourn in the BSBP?

No, absolutely never. The 40 points we had taken off us by the football authorities between November 2007 and July 2008 were an absolute dagger through the heart, an unreasonable and vindictive punishment for the fans to swallow who were not responsible for the previous financial mismanagement. Ultimately, it is this rather than our performances on the pitch which saw us end up in the Conference - though that's not an excuse for us not having got out of it since. We're having to endure it, with poor away followings at Kenilworth Road and the defensive, spoiling attitude of many teams being the worst aspects.

## Has it changed your view of non-League football?

Yes. To turn the last part of the previous answer on its head, the work rate and organisation of most teams is first class. I now don't believe that non-League teams particularly raise their game in the FA Cup - they show that level of commitment week in, week out. Teamwork is key in this division, but we've come up against some terrific individual players too, such as Matt Tubbs, Jamie Vardy, Mark Roberts and Lee Tomlin, all of whom are now plying their trade several leagues above.

## Do you think Luton will finally manage to get promoted back to the League this season?

We still haven't found the consistency and ruthlessness you'd associate with a promotion-winning team. We definitely need strengthening in defence and midfield and to stop leaking sloppy goals if we're to have a chance.

## Why do you think promotion is taking longer than most pundits expected?

With only one automatic promotion place available you have to be on your game every single week. Over the last three seasons, these places have been taken by two cash cows in Crawley and Fleetwood, and before that (much as it pains me to say it) a superbly-organised and fit Stevenage side, so we've had tough competition. The play-offs are always a lottery - I genuinely believe that if the penalties had been taken in front of the Luton fans when we played Wimbledon in the play-off final two years ago, we'd have won that day.

## How big a gap do you think there is between the BSBP and League 2?

Minimal difference. Some of the sides in League 2 hang on year after year and wouldn't do any better in the Conference.

## What do you think a realistic target is for Luton if and when the club returns to the League?

I think once we return to the League we'll have something of a monkey off our back and we should be aiming for mid-table in League One, interspersed with good cup runs and making the play-offs every few seasons.

## Of the teams you've played so far, who has particularly impressed you?

None have had a wow factor, though Dartford did a good job on us. Their vocal support was absolutely fantastic that day, which, as I've alluded to, stands out in this division.

## Who do you think will make the play-offs?

Us and Wrexham are bound to play each other in them, joined by Grimsby and possibly Mansfield.

## Which players should we particularly look out for today?

Andre Gray. Electric pace, great goalscorer, provider of many assists and general menace to defences. The non-League Peter Odemwingie! He has the potential to play in the Championship at the very least...hopefully he will get us there!

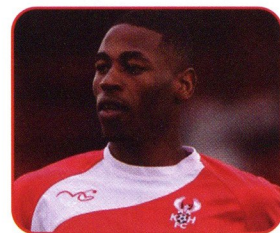
# BLUE SQUARE ROUND-UP

It's already been a frantic holiday period for non-League teams, several of whom have been occupied not only by league action, but by FA Cup and FA Trophy ties as well. **Newport County** and **Grimsby Town** continue to trade positions at the top of the **Blue Square Premier** table, with the latter currently leading the way from their Welsh rivals courtesy of a single additional point.

As of Boxing Day the Mariners were unbeaten in their last six games, comfortably defeating **Lincoln City** hours after the Christmas festivities. Andy Cook's neat finish and Andre Boyce's own goal put Rob Scott's team into an early two goal lead, before Alan Power pulled one back from the penalty spot. Unperturbed, the visitors struck twice more with Craig Disley and Joe Colbeck wrapping up a 4-1 rout. They have been doing everything possible to keep pace with their title rivals in recent weeks, also brushing aside mid-table **Tamworth** and defeating **Wrexham** in the past fortnight. Disley scored first for Grimsby against Tamworth, heading in Scott Neilson's corner, while Ross Hannah doubled the advantage six minutes into the second half. The Lambs struggled to get into the game and passed up their best chance of finding the net when Adam Cunningham missed from the penalty spot.

County's form has been far less consistent, with a hat-trick of headers from Jamille Matt enough for **Kidderminster Harriers** to overcome Justin Edinburgh's side 3-2 and continue their impressive march up the table. Steve Burr's team now sit in fifth place after seven consecutive victories. Michael Smith and Lee Evans had earlier given Newport a 2-1 half-time lead before Matt secured all three points for the Harriers.

But as if to emphasise that sporadic form, County turned on the style to dominate promotion rivals **Luton Town**, with top-scorer Aaron O'Connor giving the home side the lead against his

former club. Andre Gray briefly put the Hatters on level terms, but Christian Jolley's strike and an own goal by Ronnie Henry made it 3-1 at the half-time interval. A Jon Shaw volley gave the visitors hope, but Andy Sandell and a second from Jolley soon made the game safe. Goals from Ben Swallow and Ryan Charles then made it two wins out of two for the Exiles over their promotion rivals, with sixth place **Forest Green Rovers** – who have now won just one of their last five games – falling victim to a 2-1 Boxing Day defeat, Steve Brogan grabbing their consolation.

Despite defeat to Grimsby, Wrexham are still in the promotion hunt thanks to emphatic wins over **Nuneaton Town** and **AFC Telford**. They smashed Boro' 6-1 at the Racecourse Ground, with Johnny Hunt's 20-yard strike opening the scoring before headers from player-manager Andy Morrell and Neil Ashton made

it 3-0 at the break. Robert Ogleby fired in the fourth and Adrian Cieslewicz's 35-yard stunner added a fifth. Wes York grabbed a consolation for the visitors before Ashton's penalty wrapped up the rout.

Ross Hannah grabbed the only goal in the Dragons' defeat to Grimsby, but Morrell and his team recovered to put four past the Lillywhites: Brett Ormerod scoring twice with further goals coming from Nick Rushton and Danny Wright. Jake Reid scored the visitors' only goal seventeen minutes from time.

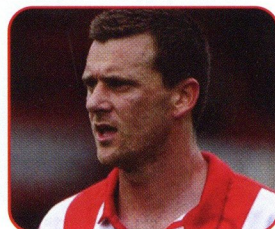
Either side of their emphatic defeat at Newport, Luton secured back-to-back home victories to move them up into fourth place. **Alfreton Town** were comfortably beaten 3-0, while Joe McNerney's goal was all that prevented a repeat scoreline when the Cards visited Kenilworth Road on Boxing Day.

Meanwhile, **Dartford** have finally halted an alarming run of results which looked set to ruin their fine start to the season. Their 3-1 win over **Ebbsfleet United** on Boxing Day was their first success in six games and ended a streak of four successive defeats. Tony Burman's side were left shell-shocked as Lincoln netted four times against them before the break: Dan Gray opening the scoring before Colin Larkin scored a 21-minute hat-trick. Harry Crawford scored twice for the Darts after the break, but the game was long gone. Further defeats against Tamworth, Nuneaton and a 5-1 trouncing by Kidderminster have pushed the Darts outside of the top five, but their post-Christmas success at least keeps them within two points of the playoffs, in seventh.

Colin Larkin's hat-trick helped rip apart out-of-form Dartford

However, it is shaping up to be another tight season, with last year's Blue Square South play-off winners only twelve points clear of the relegation zone. With 13 teams between Dartford and **Stockport County** in 21st place, it really is all still to play for. Struggling County have lost their last five games, failing to score in three while attracting much criticism from their board and fans alike. Early season candidates for a play-off place, they are seemingly a club in disarray.

Their disastrous form will act as encouragement to those around them, none more so than **Braintree Town**, who came crashing back to earth on Boxing Day after claiming back-to-back wins. Sean Marks scored both goals in Alan Devonshire's side's 2-0 success against fellow strugglers **Southport**, while he also struck in a surprise 3-1 win over Forest Green ten days later, but



Cambridge United firmly reminded the Iron that they are still in a relegation battle, with Michael Gash, Simon Smith and Andy Pugh netting for the U's in an impressive 3-0 win.

Other than league leaders Grimsby and high-flying Kidderminster, Cambridge are in the best form of anyone – unbeaten in six matches with wins also coming against **Macclesfield Town**, **Ebbsfleet** and **Gateshead**.

There has also been a managerial sacking in the last month, with Gateshead's 3-0 defeat at Cambridge enough to see the end of Ian Bogie's five year spell in charge; the Tynesiders now sit 11th in the table, with a 2-0 victory over bottom of the table **Barrow** at least giving them some late Christmas joy.

Stockport and Barrow are joined in the bottom four by Ebbsfleet – whose defeat to Dartford was their third in succession – and Nuneaton, while Telford are now just one point clear of that group in 20th place. Of those five teams only Nuneaton have claimed a win in their last three games, defeating Tamworth 2-1 on Boxing Day.

In the **FA Cup** a couple more non-league fates have been decided. Isthmian League side **Hastings United** defeated **Blue Square North** rivals **Harrogate Town** on penalties to reach the third round for the first time in their history. The attendance of 4,028 at Pilot Field was a club record. They will be rewarded with a trip to the Riverside to face Championship high-flyers Middlesbrough.

Mansfield won the money-spinning replay against Lincoln to earn a third round tie with Premier League **Liverpool**. The game, due to be played on Sunday 6th January, will be shown live on ESPN and will undoubtedly attract a sell-out crowd at Field Mill. Louis Briscoe got the winner for the Stags in the second round, his goal coming 13 minutes from time.

Elsewhere Hereford lost out against League Two **Cheltenham Town** after extra time, while Barrow and Macclesfield now go to a replay after a 1-1 draw. The original clash was called off twice for a frozen pitch.

In the **FA Trophy**, Woking's conquerors **Welling United**, who also claimed the round one scalp of Newport, have been rewarded with a home tie against Grimsby in round three. An intriguing draw also sees **Skelmersdale United** (of the Northern Premier League Division One North) make the trip to Kenilworth Road to face Luton and **Sutton United** host Wrexham.

In **Blue Square South** the league leaders remain **Salisbury City**, who are yet to lose a home game this season. Out of both the cup and the trophy in its early stages the Whites are clearly setting all their focus on promotion back to the Blue Square Premier this season. They have won their last three games, including a crucial 3-2 result against promotion rivals **Chelmsford City** which moved them two points clear of second place **Dover Athletic** with two games in hand.

Boosted by a strike force that includes Billy Bricknell (who has 10 goals this season), Ben May (10) and Moses Ademola (7), newly signed from Eastleigh, Nicky Forster's side won seven matches in a row before a surprise defeat at **Tonbridge Angels** on Boxing Day.

Ollie Palmer's 11 goals have **Havant & Waterlooville** in mid-table 'security', with the Hawks four points clear of the bottom three. **Bromley**, **Basingstoke Town** and **Truro City** currently occupy those positions.

Like Salisbury, **Blue Square North's** **Chester** look well set for a return to the top flight, with 58 points already on the board: the Blues are looking for back-to-back promotions. Dropping points just twice all season, Neil Young's side have won their last ten games, scoring a stunning 58 goals in just 21 games. Despite both having two games in hand, second place **Guisley** and third place **Brackley Town** are now some way adrift, sitting on 46 and 40 points respectively.

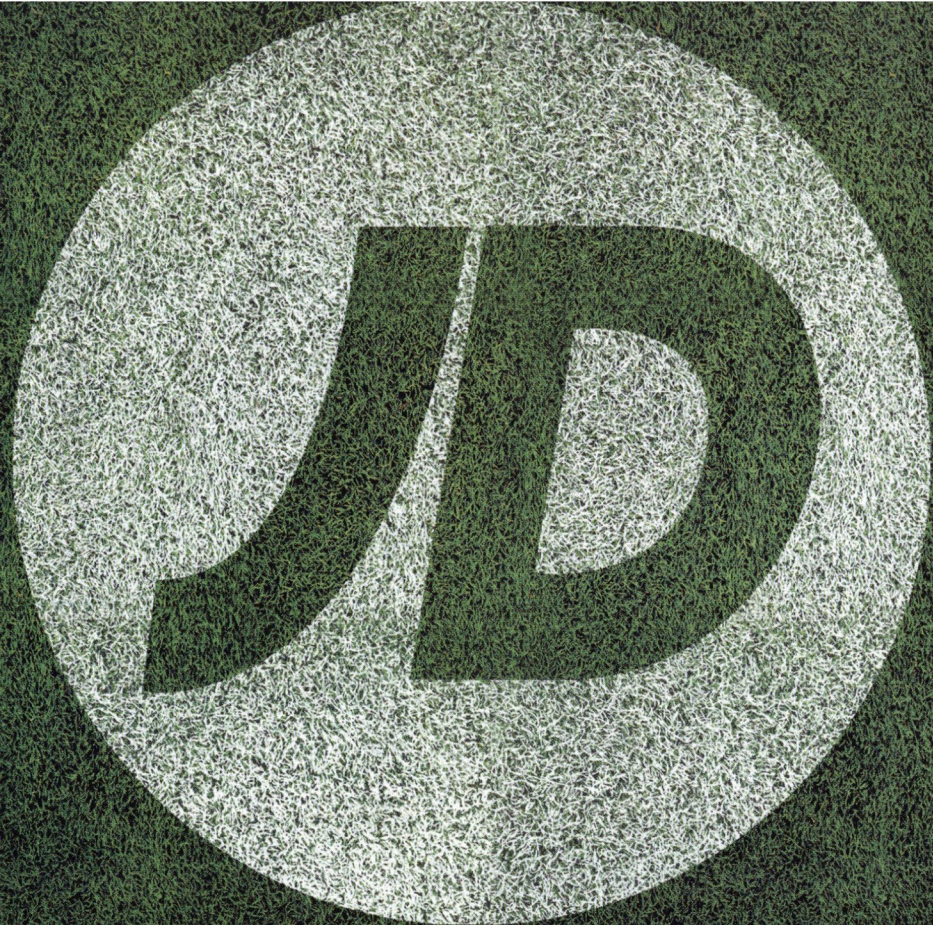


Chester have lost just once all season, winning 19 of their 21 games

Former Blue Square Premier sides **Droylsden** and **Histon** occupy two of the bottom three places in the division, the latter three points adrift of nearest rivals **Bishops Cleeve**, while bottom of the table **Hinckley United** now have a grand total of 0 points after being deducted the three they had registered – for failing to pay football creditors. Their 19 defeats from 20 games have also brought about a massive 76 goals, all but ten of them finding the Knitters' net.

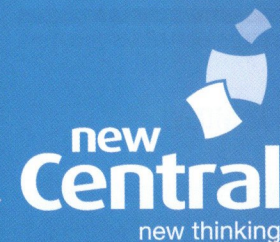

## No festive fun for Cards at Luton

A second goal for the Hatters came twenty minutes later. Gray's cross from the left was pushed away by Howe but into the path of Shaw, who made no mistake despite the lunging attempts at a block from a couple of Woking defenders.

The second half began as the first with the Cards making the better start but it was not too long before Luton again began to dominate. Garry Hill needed to make a change and did so with twenty minutes remaining. Loick Pires replaced Jayden Stockley, with Joe McNerney moving up front to join him. The change brought instant results. Pires played in Gavin McCallum, whose shot from the left of the box was parried by keeper Tyler. McNerney was on hand at the far post to steer the ball past the keeper and into the far corner.

Goals change games and this was no exception as suddenly it was the hosts who were on the back foot with Woking looking far more dangerous on the break. But the game was made safe for Luton with a third goal that came somewhat against the run of play.

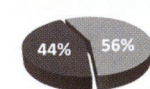
A Gray long-range effort rebounded off Howe's post into the path of Lawless. Yellow shirts immediately surrounded him and it was Ricketts who brought him down inside the area. Scott Rendell made no mistake from the spot and Woking would have to leave Kenilworth Road empty handed.

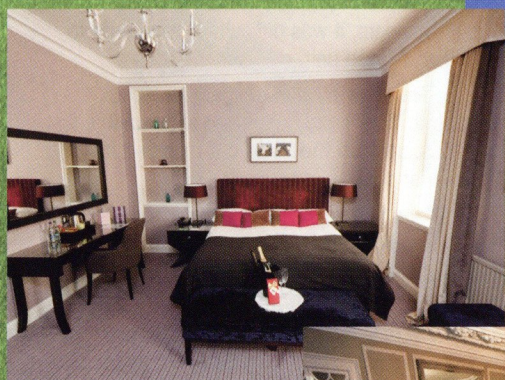

# On the Spot...

ADAM NEWTON

## Reflections of a Luton 'old boy'

I've always tended to admire players like Adam Newton. I like the way he quietly gets the job done week in week out. He rarely has a poor game and if he does I imagine he is his own harshest critic and bounces back stronger. He is dependable, strong and a great example to younger professionals about how to conduct yourself both on and off the pitch. Along with three or four others, he has been the stable backbone of Garry Hill's Woking side. Last season he captained the Cards to promotion while Mark Ricketts was sidelined and, although right backs rarely grab the supporter's attention, it was no surprise that both Woking's manager and the players selected 'Newts' as their player of the season.

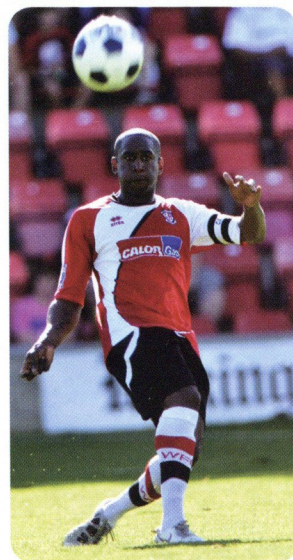
An England Under 21 international and Youth Cup-winner with West Ham, Adam has had a successful career, particularly with over 200 appearances at Peterborough. One of his former clubs was Luton Town and with them facing Woking twice over the Christmas season I took some time for his reflections on the Hatters – certainly, in terms of history and following, the biggest club in the Conference.

*You must be looking forward to the two games against Luton?*

Yes, the Luton fans won't like me for saying it but, once I saw they weren't promoted, I selfishly began to look forward to the two games. With it being Christmas, I know that both Kenilworth Road and Kingfield will be buzzing – we'll be totally up for it.

*How did you come to join Luton?*

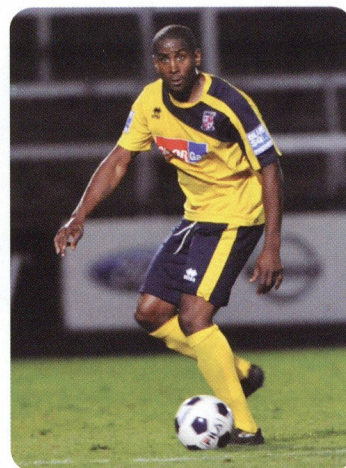
Well, in the previous season I was playing for Brentford and we had already won promotion. I didn't score many but popped up and got the last goal against Luton in the Football League. Obviously, it was a painful time for their supporters but I suppose it helped get me noticed! I was at Kenilworth Road for two years and it was a real pleasure to be there. They are very passionate about football, which gives you a real boost. However, it works both ways and if you drop your standards they soon let you know what they think!



*Are you surprised that Luton are still in the Conference?*

Yes, I am, to be honest. Both years I was there we got to the play-offs and

came up short. The first year we lost on penalties to Wimbledon and then we were knocked out in the semis by York. I let myself down in the second leg and got two stupid bookings for dissent and kicking the ball against an advertising board right in front of the Executive boxes. It's still the only red card of my career. They are such a big set-up that if they don't get promoted this year I am sure they will in the next year or two.



*You had quite a few managers in your time there*

In two seasons I had four different managers: Mick Harford, Gary Brabin, Richard Money and then Alan Neilson. We had some really good players and played nice football – Tom Craddock, Kevin Gallen and Keith Keane, who is now at Preston with Jack (King), stand out. Luton are an expectant club and the manager and players have to deliver or face the consequences. Any player wants to play in front of a large and passionate crowd – it gives you a great buzz. However, you have to be prepared to take the criticism as well.

*Does that mean that there is more pressure at a club like Luton than, say, Woking?*

I wouldn't actually say that. Pressure comes in different ways and Woking is also a big club in non-League terms. Last season we had pressure because we were such hot favourites for promotion. Also, I think good players always put pressure on themselves to perform to their best.

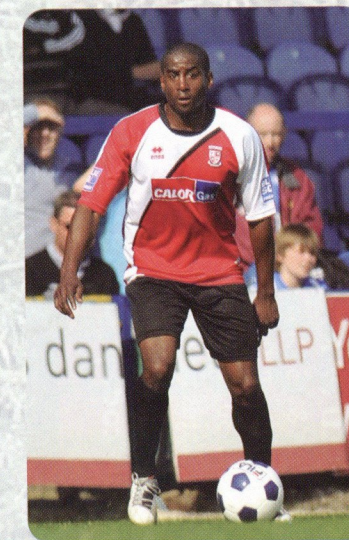


*As you get older does it become harder to maintain your level of performance and enjoyment of the game?*

Others have said it did for them but I certainly haven't found that. I love football – the competitive challenge, banter with team mates and I always want to play to win. As players we win together and lose together. As long as my legs work I will always want to play so I do apply myself. I don't want to let the manager, team mates and fans down and at my age I am pretty clear on what is expected of me.

*How does a professional react to a game like the recent defeat at Hyde?*

Well, it was awkward for me personally because I had never been beaten 7-0 before. It's embarrassing because it's in black and white forever. You can take defeat if you give your all but when six or seven players are not pulling their weight you won't win



anything. We watched the video 'nasty' of the game and there was nowhere to hide. You have to then look at yourself and ask what you could have done better. It was a wake-up call and we spoke honestly for the benefit of each other and the team.

*The response has been encouraging*

Our response was vital and we had to show the manager, the supporters and each other that we could turn it around. The supporters were

great and got behind us. To be honest, I was amazed that so many fans travelled to Hyde, saw us walloped and then followed us again to Lincoln a few days later. Work-rate can compensate for big differences in ability and we are part-timers, playing at a higher level, so have to have the right attitude.

*So where do you think that leaves us now in the BSP?*

Well, I am really excited about what we can achieve. Each game is a challenge as we are usually the underdogs but it's great to test ourselves. Our priority has to be consistency and we know in this league anyone can beat anyone. I think we will begin to move up the table now and, if we maintain performance, could be challenging for the play-offs.

*Finally, have you ever been part-time in a national league before?*

No, Woking is my first part-time club and to be honest I am really enjoying it. You adjust to mixing work and the travelling. I knew at some stage I would need to start learning skills to prepare for life after football. I am progressing with learning the Knowledge and that will then enable me to work flexibly around coaching and playing. I am very happy and I consider it a privilege to be playing for Garry Hill and Woking – I genuinely don't think there is a better-organised and run part-time club in the country. I think we will surprise a lot of people.



*Thanks, Adam, for your time and also your commitment to the Woking cause. We hope the rest of the season is big success for you – and, of course, the Cards!*

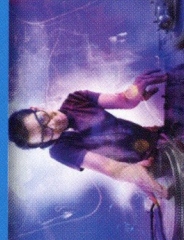
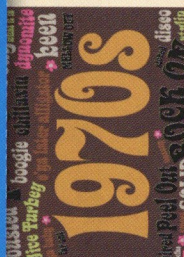
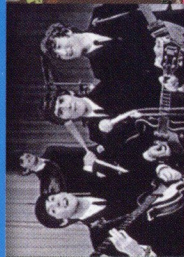

# BEHIND THE SCENES

## DAVID HORNCastle

**The first of an occasional series features our much-travelled match programme editor...**

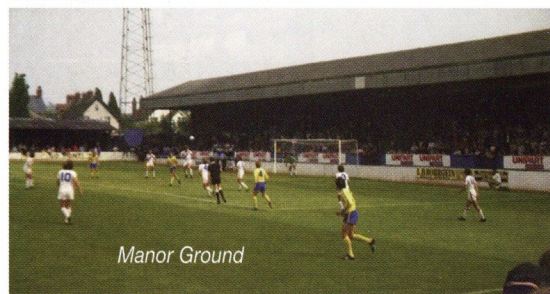
David has edited the Woking programme for the past season and a half, taking over from Martin Townshend at the end of 2010-11. His background in advertising and marketing has helped him put together a widely-admired and popular publication for the Cards, with the help of a dedicated (and voluntary!) band of writers and contributors. A native of Oxford, his varied career has taken him all over the globe and he has followed a number of 'local' clubs in his time – more of that later. He moved to the area in 2009 and has been a regular at Kingfield ever since.

**Have you always been interested in football?**

I've been a keen footballer since primary school, where I played in a pair of my older brother's hand-me-down boots from the Dark Ages: rounded toe-caps, nailed-in studs and high ankles. I had to stop playing in them when the stud nails started coming through the sole – my parents then bought me my first pair of Adidas boots, what luxury! I used to alternate between centre forward and centre half with my pal Paul Burton as we thought these were the only two positions worth playing.



**And you were a keen Oxford United supporter at that time?**

Yes, my late father – who was a big football fan himself and at one time played left wing for Grays Athletic – used to take me along with him to the Manor Ground in Headington when I



was old enough to see over the terracing wall. I can't recall exactly how old I was, but the crowds were usually pretty sizeable and as a kid you couldn't always see what was happening on the pitch. This was when Arthur Turner was manager, soon after the club was elected to the Fourth Division after winning the Southern League, and I can still remember several of the players' names from that era: ace

goalkeeper Jim Barron, defenders Maurice Kyle, Colin 'Nobby' Clarke and John Shuker, Ron 'Tank' Atkinson (yes, that Ron Atkinson!) in midfield and his brother Graham up front, Colin Harrington on the left wing. Graham Atkinson was my hero at that time, although my Dad reckoned that he was lazy and that I modelled my own game too much on him. David Sloan was another player I admired, a tricky winger with a bit of pace and not a little skill, a different character from Colin Harrington on the left who had unbelievable pace but often forgot to take the ball along with him!

**How about your own football 'career'?**

Well unfortunately for me I went to a rugby-playing high school and although I represented the school, I only

from school – Falcon Sports FC, we called ourselves – which played on Sundays against opposition in the Oxford area culled either from acquaintances within other teams or by advertising in one of the football publications available at the time. However, we didn't always face similar-standard opponents: I recall we beat a local scout troop 18-0 as several of them were about half our age, and were thumped 9-0 by a team from one of the Oxfordshire Sunday leagues, so it was a bit varied.



**You then moved to Scotland?**

Yes I was offered a place at Dundee University and continued to play there, although I spent more time at the Royal Infirmary than I care to remember. Pitches in Dundee weren't exactly Premiership standard and one set of pitches in particular down by the River Tay had turf laid over cinder and gravel, which showed through in some places. A real recipe for plenty of injuries!

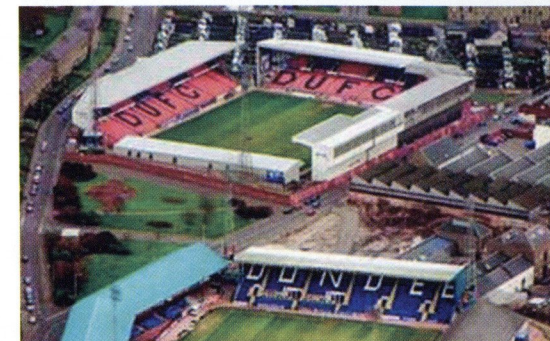
**And your team allegiance moved on?**

Well I wouldn't say I totally lost interest in the U's but clearly I wasn't able to go to Oxford matches regularly so I used to watch Dundee United, although family ties meant that Aberdeen was my 'number one' Scottish team. Dundee is the craziest city: its two football clubs, United and Dundee FC, are literally across the road from one another and both were in the Scottish 1st Division at the time. I never figured out how Dundonians decided which of the two to support but my friends and I cheered on the team that played the most attractive football – definitely United, with Jim McLean at the helm and Paul Sturrock leading the line.

**Your next move was to the Midlands?**

Yes, my first job was in Birmingham, which was close enough for visits back to the Manor Ground as well as occasionally 'slumming it' at Villa or Birmingham City,

but it wasn't long before I was back in Scotland, working this time. Although based in Edinburgh, this

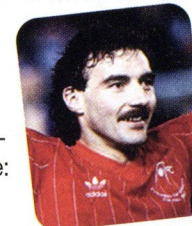


Fergie wins the Cup-Winners Cup

**And you seem to have kept on the move ever since!**

was probably in LA: the Galaxy used to play at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, a massive stadium which holds around 100,000 spectators and was used for the 1994 World Cup Final. However, LA Galaxy only used to attract crowds of a few thousand – it was a little like being ants in a giant's cave. The strangest thing about it was that I also went to a college (American) football game there – UCLA against USC, I think – and the place was packed to the rafters. A college game, for goodness sake!

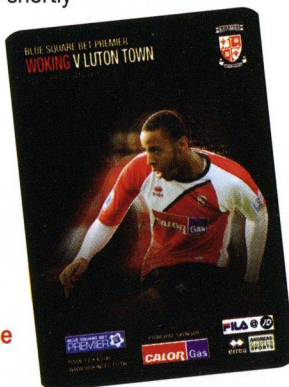


#### And how did you come to be our programme editor?

#### And what do you do away from Woking FC?

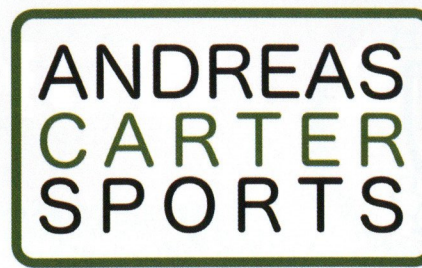
I'm involved in some advertising and marketing consultancy work as well as occasional market research projects. In addition to editing the match day programme I also help out in the Geoff Chapple Lounge, but I'm sorry to say I'll be hanging up my editor's boots at the end of this season as I think two years is probably enough, given the time demands it makes. It'll also give the next editor the opportunity to take a fresh look at the design, layout and content and inject some fresh ideas. I have to give credit to all the contributors, though – none of whom receive payment of any kind – as the writing is of a consistently high standard and we haven't missed a single copy deadline!

#### Do you still take an interest in Oxford United's fortunes?

Of course, I don't think you ever forget your 'first love'! I've been to see them a few times at the Kassam Stadium (the Manor Ground's site is now a private hospital) and also saw them beat York City 3-1 at Wembley in the 2010 play-off final, when they regained their Football League status – but it's a far cry from those heady days of John Aldridge, Ray Houghton and Dean Saunders and 3-0 wins over Arsenal...

#### So where are you off to next?

I plan to stay in Woking for a while yet. My daughter Lauren, who helps with the photo-editing for the match programme, works just down the road in Guildford and I think I've had enough globe-trotting to last me for some time. Anyway, Woking's road, rail and air connections are a major plus and on top of that it's not a bad place to live!



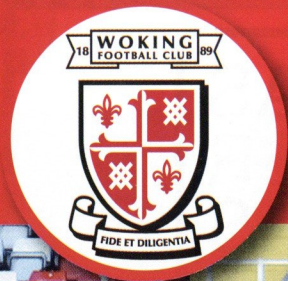

# From Aldershot to Wembley Way – Kingfield in the 1950s

Mark Doyle continues his decade-by-decade look at Woking FC's history

The 1950s, a jet-age decade of rock and roll, a new Queen on the throne, new hope and eventual glory at Kingfield, a period in the club's history that started quietly and ended at the Twin Towers of Wembley. The 40s had seen Woking's initial surge after the War drift away back to the middle reaches of the Isthmian League but, with the clouds of War lifted and rationing easing, there appeared to be a glimmer of hope for the supporters of Woking – in the shape of two brothers from Hampshire.

## A new beginning?

The new Elizabethan era was dawning, and the sleepy suburban town of Woking began to rise from its slumbers, swelling with an influx of over 5,000 Londoners displaced by the blitz to London County Council's new garden housing estate at Sheerwater. Together with the newly-built Barnsbury and Elmbridge estates, a growing Italian immigrant community, initially settling in Maybury ("Little Italy" as it was often affectionately called), the town of Woking was developing a unique personality all of its own. With this increasing population from communities that traditionally held a desire for association football, came the potential growth in support for the Cardinals at Kingfield. All that was required was for something to ignite the fire of interest – the catalyst for this revolution was to come from an unlikely location.



## We two Kings of Aldershot are

In what was, in hindsight, the most noteworthy event in Woking FC's history since the Bolton Wanderers FA Cup tie of 1908, England Amateur International Charlie Mortimore and his younger brother, John, signed for Woking in August 1953 from Aldershot, when the Hampshire club put paid to their reserve side. Aldershot's loss was certainly Woking's gain. Their arrival and belief in total football transformed the Cards in a few short seasons into a club which was to be recognised for always trying to play stylish passing football.

The growing local population flocked to Kingfield to see the silky, flowing fare on offer. Centre-forward

Charlie swiftly became club captain, collecting personal honours in his reign at Kingfield which eventually spanned fifteen years. These included Surrey, Hampshire, FA XI, Isthmian League, Middlesex Wanderers, regular England Amateur International honours and becoming Woking's all-time record goal scorer with over 260 goals. Consequently the 50s were to become the most glorious decade in Woking's history so far. With two Surrey Senior Cup Final wins, topping the Isthmian League briefly (for three days to be exact!) in 1955 for the first time in our history and finishing runners-up to Wycombe Wanderers by only one point in 1956-57, scoring 104 league goals, Charlie himself scored 39 in 34 League and Cup appearances. It was a glorious point in our history when the Cardinals were on top of the amateur football pile, in a period when the word "Amateur" was synonymous with honour. The Cards' stunning performances, and those of John Mortimore in particular, didn't go unnoticed and Chelsea (who had already signed John as an amateur) quickly acquired the full-time signature of the lanky centre-half in 1957. This was despite Charlie pleading with John not to turn professional in an attempt to reach Wembley together in the FA Amateur Cup with Woking. John signed for the Blues and went on to have a glittering career at Stamford Bridge, making 279 appearances before moving on to QPR in 1965 and he eventually managed such football clubs as Benfica, Real Betis and Portsmouth.



Another young local player to catch the eye was Geoff Hamm, who is still to this day a regular guest here at Kingfield. The crowds flocked into Kingfield, with Isthmian League fixtures

often attended by well over 3,000 noisy locals, treating their visitors to what was often quoted in the Woking News and Mail at the time as "The Kingfield Roar". And with the goals came England Amateur International caps aplenty: at one stage during 1957-58 Kingfield boasted four Amateur International forwards in Charlie Mortimore, Geoff Hamm, Roy Littlejohn and Reginald Stratton.

## Wembley – the first time

The FA Amateur Cup of 1958 was to be the icing on the cake for Charlie and the Cardinals. It was so appropriate that this modest gentleman lifted the cup after defeating Ilford 3-0 in front of a 71,000 crowd at the twin towers. It was Charlie's 30th birthday and he finished it off in style by helping young John Hebdon score his second and Woking's third goal in the 88th minute.

The tumult and shouting of 12 April 1958 may have long since died away. The Wembley terraces have now been torn down and rebuilt in 21st century splendour, but the image of Charlie Mortimore victoriously holding aloft the coveted Amateur Cup in the spring sunshine of 1958 will remain forever in the minds of the Cardinal faithful who were privileged enough to be at Wembley Stadium that day. But at the post-match celebrations in Woking our down-to-earth Cardinal hero birthday boy summed himself up, in just one short sentence, saying: "I'd rather face a



71,000 crowd than make a speech". Charlie, as always, much preferred to let his feet do the talking for him.

## The only way is up?

After the Wembley glory, you'd be forgiven for thinking that the only possible direction for the football club to go would be upwards. Certainly new facilities at Kingfield, in the form of new baths, changing rooms and more covered standing accommodation, paid for from receipts gained during the cup run, were tangible, but away from Kingfield trouble was brewing in the form of "Shamateurism". Woking FC was a fiercely traditional amateur football club and as a result only paid their players expenses. Other rivals were not – how can I say this diplomatically? – perhaps as honest as they should have been? Kingfield had become a hot-bed for young footballing talent and soon, one by one, the young cup-winning side were either enticed away from Kingfield's green wide open spaces by financial incentives (often called "boot money", as money magically appeared in a player's boots in a dressing room before a game) or players were legitimately signed by professional clubs, such as Fulham in the case of the talented youngster and Wembley goal-scoring ace Reg Stratton.

As a consequence the Cards' fortunes dipped rapidly as the swinging 60s approached and, although the Charlie Mortimore legacy of total football lived on at Kingfield, with future Woking teams attempting to play his style of football, this was not always with great success, as the increasing pressure from outside finances started to make an impact on the pitch and in the amateur football world as a whole.

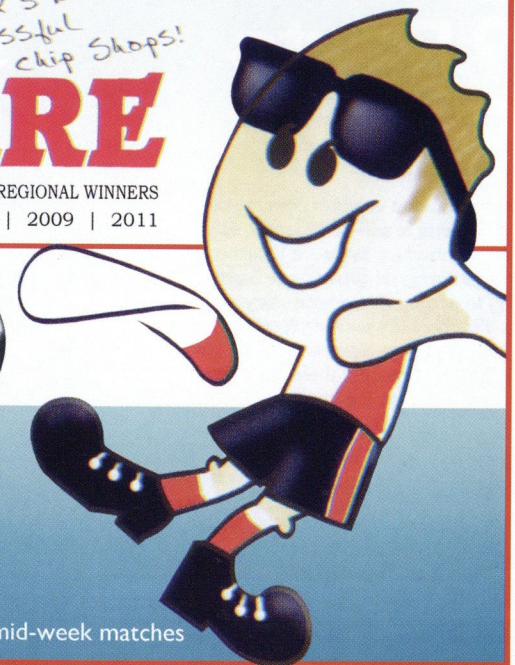

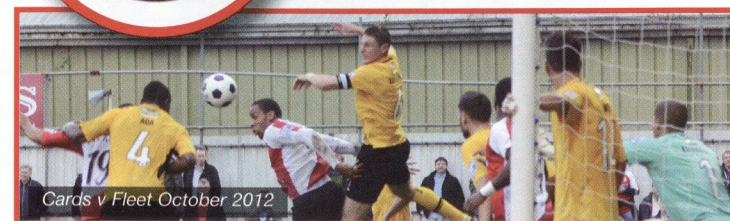

Cards v Fleet October 2012

Last time out: Woking 0 Ebbsfleet United 1 FA Cup Q4 October 20th 2012

The Cards' second-ever FA Cup 4th Qualifying Round meeting with the Fleet ended up the same as the first (albeit without the replay) – a 0-1 reverse. After securing a 2-2 away draw in the league at Stonebridge Road the previous month, the Cards conceded a late goal to put them out of the competition: "a bitter pill to swallow", as Garry Hill said after the game. Woking had the better of the early exchanges and pushed forward, enjoying the majority of possession but unable to find the killer pass. Parkinson and Newton had the best of the Cards' first-half chances and Pires, Bubb and Ricketts went close in the second, but it was Ebbsfleet who got the decisive goal in the 88th minute when Howe's save pushed the ball to Ashikodi and the latter fired home.

This rearranged fixture – the Cards' first on a Sunday since New Year's Day 2012 – sees the two teams' 11th encounter, the Cards having won and lost three times (including the losses in both FA Cup meetings). Ebbsfleet have spent much of the season near the foot of the Blue Square Premier table and are without a win since mid-November, when they beat Macclesfield 2-1 away at the Moss Rose with goals from Phil Walsh and Nathan Elder (a penalty). After a draw and a defeat this season against the Fleet, Woking will be hoping a victory is long overdue.

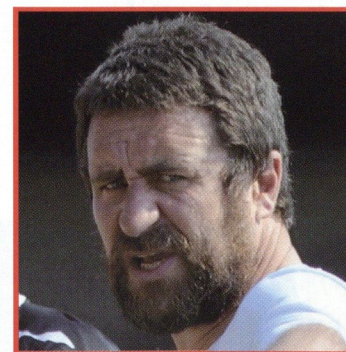

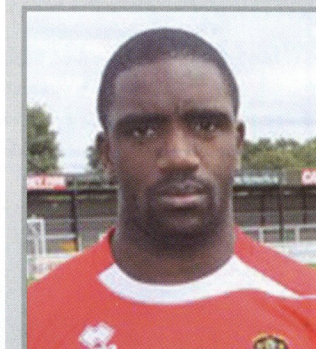

He then moved on to Shrewsbury Town before signing on loan at AFC Wimbledon and then joining Hayes & Yeading in 2011. Nathan returned to the Football League, playing 26 times for Hereford United, before a delighted Liam Daish secured his services in the off-season.

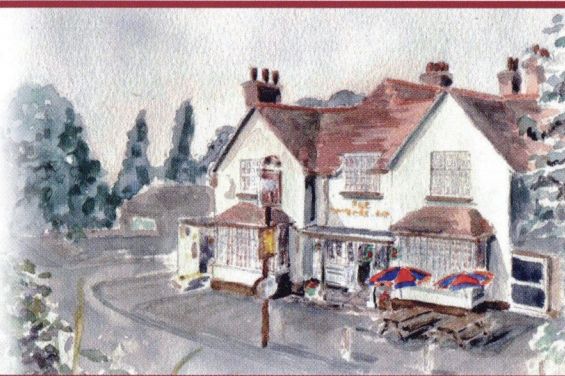

# CARDINAL NORTH

## YOU CAN RUN, BUT YOU CAN'T HYDE...

In which blog writer and long-distance Woking fan Malcolm Wyatt re-lives his latest WFC awayday misadventure.

Did that really happen? I was only at Ewen Fields, Hyde, to stretch my impressive unbeaten run watching Woking to 16 matches.

Despite perceiving myself as some sort of Jonah, I'd not actually seen my team (I am based 240 miles from Kingfield) lose since a 2-0 home humbling by Maidenhead United in Blue Square South in August, 2010. Even then, the hosts had Dereck 'God' Brown as assistant manager, so you could argue it would have been sacrilegious to win. Besides, I'd since witnessed 13 wins and two draws (eight away), scoring 37 times en route.

All the signs were good, with a victory not so long before at nearby Stockport County, and the Cards humbling Farnborough in the FA Trophy 7-0 that previous weekend. It wasn't likely to be another septhrashing (think I made that word up), as those are pretty rare. That said, we'd already scored a hatful this season, and Hyde were in the bottom three.

I'd also seen us pick up points at Hyde's neighbours Droylsden and Stalybridge in the past, and more often than not had something to savour from matches on the outskirts of Greater Manchester, as a reporter at obscure venues like Abbey Hey, Ashton United, Cheadle Town, Flixton, Mossley, Radcliffe Borough, Trafford and Woodley Sports, or with the Cards at not-so-far-off Altrincham and Macclesfield Town.

Admittedly, my first visit to Stalybridge (which I equate with Stoneybridge from cult Scottish comedy sketch show, Absolutely) ended in defeat, and it took a few visits before we got the hang of Bower Fold. But we eventually started winning, the highlights including hat-tricks from Clive Walker in 1995 and Darren Hay in 1998.

But then came December 1st's Tameside Terror, a right proper Hydeing and Saturday roll-over in this weekly lottery we call football. And who knows, if our cave-in started any earlier it might even have inspired the hosts to finally avenge the 26-0 record league loss to Preston North End - the heaviest competitive defeat in English football, dating back to an October 1887 FA Cup tie when Hyde were just two years old and Woking just a week and a half away from a first general meeting (our team just a twinkle in the eye of first club president Alfred Wright).

I was surprised this Conference Premier clash was even on, with a few Evo-Stik League ties that day called off due to frozen pitches before I left my base in Leyland, Lancashire, for the 45-minute drive around the M60 and beyond. But the referee donned his boots at 1pm, ran across the pitch, then declared this embarrassing day in WFC history open.

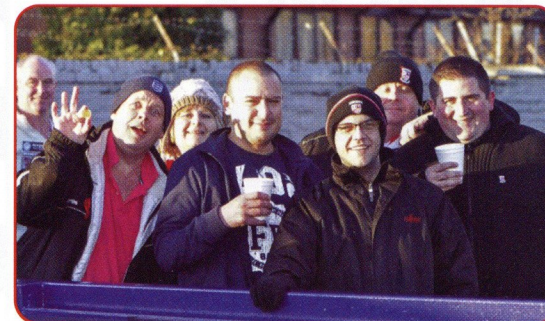
In the early stages I remained confident. We weren't going great shakes, but while experienced home hands like Chris Sedgwick (ex-Rotherham, Preston, Sheff Wed) and Phil Jevons (ex-Everton, Grimsby, Yeovil, Bristol City, Huddersfield, Morecambe) posed a threat, Aaron Howe seemed to have it all under control in our net.

But then came a key moment, a seemingly-innocuous challenge just outside the penalty area from Brett Johnson catching England C cap Scott Spencer (ex-Rochdale, Southend, Lincoln), who made a meal of it on a stodgy pudding of a pitch, the ref eventually catching up and brandishing his red card.

Much shouting and partisan haranguing followed from our end, while Spencer dusted himself down. We survived the resultant free-kick and almost made it to half time following a substitution and change of formation. But then Jevons slotted home just before the break.

Even when a second went in courtesy of Spencer on 51 minutes, I felt we had a chance of a draw against this relegation-threatened outfit. But when Jevons struck again just before the hour it was as good as game over, Howe's cartoon-like rage against defensive ineptitude at the other end almost comical. Tragi-comic as it turned out.

I'll gloss over the rest, save for mentioning (it feels better to share it - it's a bit like rubber-necking the aftermath of an accident in the opposite motorway carriageway) that at one point it seemed like every half-hearted Hyde foray forward brought another goal. You could as good as see the smiles and disbelief from an increasingly-bewildered home crowd, despite the murky December dusk.

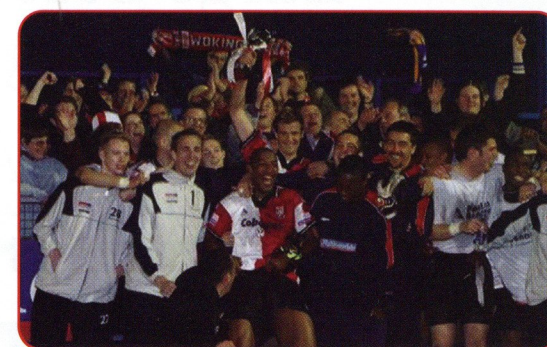


*Still smiling: Woking fans put a brave face on events at Hyde*

When the fourth official's board went up I half-expected to hear on the PA, 'the referee has indicated three additional goals for the home side'. They did manage one more - the seventh of the day - but we dutifully stayed to the death (or perhaps the post-mortem), because that's what real fans do. There was no ovation for our embarrassed side though, and the only hands I saw raised in tribute were from a fella in front of me, applauding the shell-shocked Tigers fans who could just about stand up after laughing so hard.

The supporters to our left certainly had a ball (and four-goal Jevons had the match one now), and couldn't believe their luck - even when they were singing - in homage to Mancunian icons Joy Division - 'Hyde ... Hyde will tear you apart ... again!'. Either way, Garry Hill would have gladly reprogrammed his team to Factory setting (or 'I Remember Nothing', to borrow another Joy Division title) to erase the memory, or at least take us back to our 'Boro' bashing.

It was an afternoon to forget, in a region which has given us ups and downs since our first defeat at Stalybridge in August 1992. The best was our Mickey Mouse glory night when we won the GLS Conference League Cup at Bower Fold at the end of April 2005 thanks to a lone Karl Murray wonder strike (having being forced to travel away on a Wednesday on the toss of a coin). There was a similar size away contingent then, the difference being that seven and a half years ago we were a little more eager to cram on to the official photos as Shwan Jalal, Adriano Basso and co hoisted our silverware.

I could add a few less memorable encounters in East Manchester, including a late season April 2008 date at The Butchers Arms, Droylsden, when a meagre 301 crowd saw a 1-1 mid-week draw against the already-relegated Bloods. Not even Lou Reed would have relished a walk on the Tameside that night. I'd like to add something that proved I was there, but a meaningless match evades my memory, including Matt Pattison's goal.

What I'd have given to see our trip to Hyde becoming just as unmemorable. It doesn't work like that though. And I only wish I was there with the loyal Cards who - despite many of them suffering at Ewen Fields - headed to Lincoln City just three days later to see us overcome the odds and win 2-0. Which just goes to show that we can still run with it, even if we can't always Hyde.

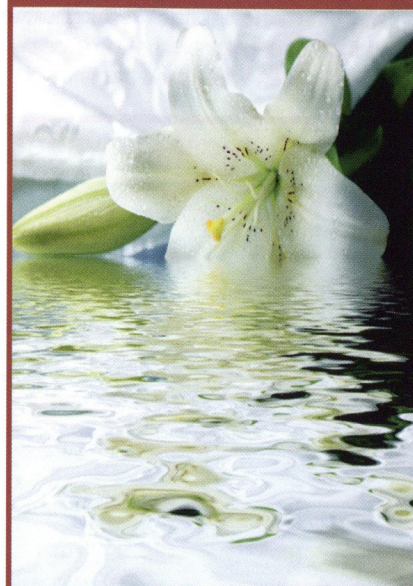

It has been a busy couple of weeks in the Community department: our first event was a Christmas Lunch for some of our more senior supporters. They were treated to

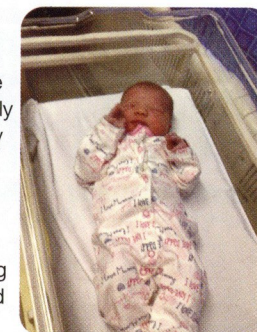
