STAINES TOWN FC TIMELINE



1879/80 – Earliest known record of a football club in the town, Staines Rovers. Earliest home grounds included Lord's Field, the Lino' Ground, Stollery's Field, and The Lammas. Around the same time, St Peter's Institute FC formed, playing at Edgell Road.

1892 – accepted date of formation of Staines Town FC, believed to be based at the Billet Ground on Shortwood Common.

1895 – Staines Town FC absorbs St Peter's Institute FC; a year later, the club becomes Staines Albany FC.

1900 – West London Alliance Division 1 winners.

1901 – West London League Division 1 winners, then switched to the West Middlesex League.

1903 – club known as Staines FC (until 1914).

1904 – West Middlesex Cup winners for the first time; joined Great Western Suburban League.

c1908 – home ground moved to the Mill Mead Enclosure at Hammond's Farm.

1910 – defeated at Griffin Park by Shepherds Bush in Staines' first Middlesex Senior Cup final.

1912 – GWSL runners-up during the presidency of John Ashby, of the prominent finance and brewing family.

1913 – dropped into Hounslow & District League.

1914 – converted to a rifle club during WWI: football in the town continued in works munitions leagues.

1919 – resumed as Staines Lagonda FC, spending a season back in the Hounslow & District League.

1920/1 – reverted to the Great Western Suburban League, and won promotion to Division I by winning Division 2 (Middlesex), as well as capturing the Uxbridge League and Cup double.

1924 – create shockwaves in the FA Amateur Cup, by reaching the last 16 (3rd Round Proper) and only losing to Wycombe Wanderers after a missed penalty in front of well over 3000 at Mill Mead; having been GWSL runners-up for the past two seasons, stepped up to the Spartan League, under the progressive presidency of John Drake.

1925 – reached FA Amateur Cup 2nd Round Proper; name changed back to Staines Town FC at end of season.

1935 – following a period of financial decline and the loss of the Mill Mead ground to the water com-

pany, the club went into hibernation.

1943 – resumed under the name of Staines Vale FC, replacing Vickers Armstrong in the Middlesex Senior League, and playing at the Lino' Meadow; finished as South Division runners-up in the first two seasons.

1947 – after a year or so known just as Staines FC, present Staines Town FC name is adopted; home grounds in this period included Staines Stadium on Wraysbury Road, The Lammas also on Wraysbury Road, Mott's Field (Commercial Road), and predominantly Laleham Village Recreation Ground on Broadway (now home of Staines Lammas FC).

1951 – league re-organised and became the Parthenon League. Purchase of a new ground at Wheatsheaf Lane, as the Club stabilises under officers Jim and George Bone, Charlie Young, and Fred Terry.

1953 – finished 3rd in the Parthenon Premier and became founder members of the Hellenic League.

1958 – advanced to the Spartan League.

1960 – Spartan League Senior Section champions in the first of Pat Wire's 18 years as chairman.

1963 – Cliff Lane appointed Manager, 10 years after joining the Club as a player. By the time he died in 1995 he had served in numerous capacities, including two spells as Chairman.

1965 – first Southern Combination Cup win: it has also been captured in 1967, 1995, and 2006.

1968 – following the untimely death of Ray Wyld the previous year, the Club settles on Ken Ballard as its first modern style manager. His 11 year tenure brings unprecedented success.

1971 – Spartan League runners-up earned promotion to the Athenian League Division 2.

1972 – promoted to Division 1 as champions with record 51 points.

1973 – Athenian Division 1 runners-up spot enabled the Club to skip the Premier entirely and join the new Isthmian League Division 2.

1974 – champions of Division 2 to earn promotion to Division 1, which was renamed the Premier Division 3 years later. Mick Clarke founds the Youth section.

1975 – winners of the Barassi (Anglo-Italian Ama-

teur) Cup, defeating Banco di Roma home and away, with 70,000 seeing the game in the Olympic Stadium, and a record 2750 at the home leg; beat Hendon in a replay to win the Middlesex Senior Cup for the first time: it was retained in '76 and '77.

1977 – first London Senior Cup final, losing a replay to Wimbledon, their last game as a non-League club.

1978 – reached the last 32 of the FA Trophy, a feat repeated in 1985, 2004, and 2012.

1982 – 4th place in the Isthmian Premier, which was then (theoretically) a direct feeder to the Football League.

1984 – demoted to Division 1 under a controversial ground grading ruling.

1989 – promoted back to the Premier as Division 1 champions under Alan Gane.

1990 – the visionary Alan Boon becomes chairman for a third time, beginning an unbroken 21 years in which he guided the Club to its present respected position. Won Middlesex Senior Cup for second time in three years.

1993 – relegated to Division 1.

1994 – Chris Wainwright's side does a Middlesex 'double', winning both the Senior and Charity Cups

1996 – promoted to the Premier.

1997 – the first of a two year groundshare at Chertsey Town proves unsettling as the Club is relegated to Division 1, although the Middlesex Senior Cup is recaptured.

2002 – Isthmian League (now known as Ryman League) re-organised: placed in Division 1 (South).

2003 – during Ballard's second spell as manager, groundshares at Walton & Hersham and Egham Town are followed by a triumphant return to the rebuilt Wheatsheaf Park. Club adds an Academy, based at Kingston College.

2004 – Steve Cordery caps the first of his 9 sea-

sons as manager by advancing the Club to the Ryman Premier, following re-organisation sparked by expansion of the Conference.

2006 – women's team reach FA Women's Cup 3rd Round Proper; Academy are ESFA U18 National Cup finalists.

2007 – highest Ryman Premier placing, runners-up spot puts us in the Play-Offs, but narrowly lose the final to AFC Wimbledon; reached the FA Cup 1st Round Proper for the first time since 1984, and after drawing at Stockport County, David Sargent's winning shoot-out penalty in front of a record home crowd of 2860 and a live SkyTV audience takes the Club to the Second Round for the first time, and eventual home defeat by Peterborough United.

2008 – no mistake this time, as another runners-up spot is followed by Play-Off success and promotion to the Conference (South).

2009 – among the prestigious matches hosted at Wheatsheaf Park, perhaps the most important was the full women's international between Iceland and Denmark; another glorious FA Cup run, with a 1st Round Proper win at Shrewsbury Town followed by home and away games with Millwall.

2010 – Middlesex Senior Cup winners for the first time in 13 years: it is retained in 2011, after winning the George Ruffell Shield for the Middlesex Super Cup.

2011 – Matthew Boon assumed the chairmanship following the passing of his father, and completes the Club's transition to a limited company.

2013 – former Jamaican World Cup player Marcus Gayle caps his first season as manager by guiding the team to Middlesex Senior Cup success. Academy team win the Ryman Youth League (West) for the 3rd year running, and add the Lucas Fettes Isthmian Youth Cup, and Isthmian Champions' Play-Off.

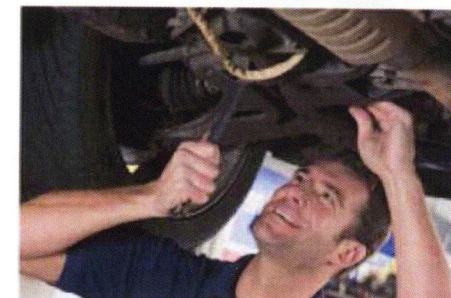

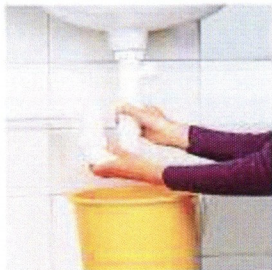

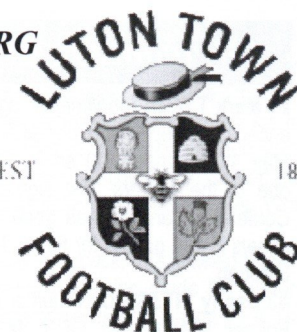

Good afternoon everyone, and a warm welcome to Wheatsheaf Park to all players, officials and supporters, especially those from Luton Town FC, whom we are delighted to host in today's FA Carlsberg Trophy tie. We hope you have a pleasant afternoon with us, and a safe journey back to Bedfordshire later this evening.

The FA's balls have certainly been well-disposed towards Staines Town this season, at least in terms of interest and excitement for the *Massive*. First of all, having battled through to the First Round Proper of the FA Cup for only the fourth time in our history, we got the pairing most of us would have chosen - Brentford - from among the 79 other possible clubs, and now in the Trophy we've got probably the plum draw with a visit from the best supported club in non-League football (average home league crowd since their demotion from the Football League - exactly 6000, at least 60% higher than the second highest). That does of course mean that Marcus' boys will have faced two of the most accomplished possible opponents in the space of a month, but that's the sort of test that every player relishes, and it's up to them to show how much we've learned from the defeat at Griffin Park when we take the field this chilly November afternoon. Luton moved up to second place in the Conference Premier as they eased past Southport 3-0 on Tuesday night.

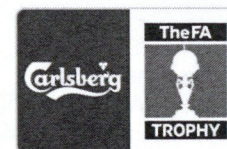
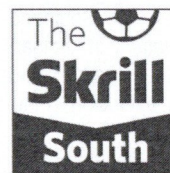
If the cups have been exciting, then so has our League campaign to date, especially here at Wheatsheaf Park. Who would have thought, when we dodged the drop back in April, that we would win all seven of our opening League games here - a record surpassed only by our 1922/3 season in the Great Western Suburban League, when it is believed that we won all 9 home league games (although there is some doubt over one of the results), an possibly a tenth against a team who did not complete the season! Unfortunately, this season's run ended at seven, as we came unstuck here last weekend against Concord Rangers by a single goal, a trend that continued in disappointing style on Tuesday night when we rolled over for bottom side Gosport Borough to register a 2-0 win at their Privett Park ground. Both opponents whom we have never met in league competition before, being newly promoted, and two unwanted records we will have to try to put right when we meet again later in the season. A couple of small positives to take from both those games were the absence of any bookings, and the very kind comments from both Concord and Gosport regarding our fans and graciousness in defeat.

If you have young children, then make a note in your diary for the afternoon of Sunday 22nd December, when Sally Payne, Kim Sherwood, and Vanessa Cox will be holding their traditional Staines Town FC Kids' Christmas Party here at the Club. For more details, see the panel on page 25.

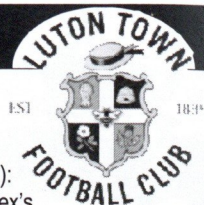
Don't forget, if we draw today, the replay is at Luton this Tuesday (7:45) which will mean our cup game with Harrow is off that night.

Welcome to the Hatters – Player Profiles



#1 **Mark TYLER** (goalkeeper, age 36): Hugely experienced goalkeeper who signed a contract extension in May. With almost 700 senior appearances, he was one of the *Hatters'* first signings upon joining the Conference, and he has gone on to keep 72 clean sheets in 184 games for them. Previously with Peterborough.

#3 **Danny FITZSIMONS** (left or centre back, 21): Bio: Former Millwall and QPR defender who followed team-mate Jim Stevenson to Kenilworth Road from Histon in the summer. He swept the board at the *Stutes'* end-of-season awards and has over 100 games to his name.

#4 **Jonathan SMITH** (centre midfield / right back, 26): Joined the *Hatters* from Swindon last season having helped Paolo Di Canio's *Robins* lift the League 2 title in 2011/12. Previous clubs include Morecambe, Forest Green, and York.

#5 **Steve McNULTY** (centre back, 29): Liverpool-born and a former player with Barrow and Vauxhall Motors, Steve signed a new deal with the *Hatters* this summer after a string of accomplished performances for the club during 2012/13. Captained Fleetwood Town's *Cod Army* to Conference title in 2011/12.

#6 **Anthony CHARLES** (centre back, 32): A wealth of experience includes helping Barnet and Aldershot to Conference titles in 2005 and '08 respectively. A calm, composed, left-footer, Charles left *The Shots* for Northampton in January 2012 and went onto play 18 times in League 2 for the *Cobblers*. Ended last season with Plymouth.

#7 **Alex LAWLESS** (midfield, 27): Influential and creative player signed from York in November 2010, and after renewing his contract in the close season, in preference to offers from League 1, has taken his *Hatters* appearance tally to 124, with 12 goals. Formerly with Fulham, Torquay, and Forest Green.

#8 **Solomon TAIWO** (central midfield, 28): Experienced Conference player before John Still signed him for Dagenham & R in 2007, before Cardiff took him into the Championship for £250,000 in 2009. Re-united with Still in March, and extended his Luton contract in the summer.

#9 **Jon SHAW** (striker, 29): Appeared for Sheffield W, Burton, Halifax, and Mansfield, before a golden spell at Gateshead yielded 45 goals in 80 games prompted a move to Kenilworth Road last summer. A

hat-trick against Barrow helped him reach double figures for Luton last term.

#10 **Alex WALL** (striker, 22): Raw, powerful and pacy, Alex's move from Maidenhead last term was John Still's first signing at Kenilworth Road, and he responded with a brace against Ebbsfleet.

#11 **Jake HOWELLS** (midfield, 22): Debuting on the last day of 2007/8 makes Jake Luton's longest serving player, despite his young age. Since then, the left-footer has earned Wales U21 caps and has made over 200 appearances for the club.

#12 **Scott GRIFFITHS** (left back, 27): Helped Still's Dagenham win the Conference in 2007, and a loan at Chesterfield in 2011 saw him win a League 2 medal. Signed a contract with Luton following his release from Peterborough in March.

#13 **Mark CULLEN** (striker, 21): A former Hull player who scored on his debut in the top flight, but the two fine goals he scored against Luton while on loan at Stockport did enough to convince *The Hatters* to offer him a 2 year deal.

#14 **Andy PARRY** (central defence / midfield, 21): Signed from Southport on a 2 year contract this summer, Andy has two seasons' worth of Conference football under his belt but began his career as a youngster at Blackburn.

#16 **Elliot JUSTHAM** (goalkeeper, 22): A commanding 6'3" who was a trialist with W Ham and Reading and had a spell at Brentwood. Kept 14 clean sheets in 31 games for East Thurrock last season, earning the offer of a 2 year deal at Luton in May.

#17 **'JJ' O'DONNELL** (left midfield, 21): Joined the *Town* in 2010 from St Albans, making his debut in an FA Cup tie vs Corby later that year. After successful loan spells at Thurrock and Hampton & Richmond, he penned a 3 year contract last summer. Currently on loan at Hyde.

#18 **Dave MARTIN** (left wing, 28): Former Dartford, Crystal Palace, Millwall, Derby, and Southend midfielder who signed for the *Hatters* in January and went onto score 3 times in 16 league appearances for the club, gaining him a 2 year extension in the summer.

#20 **David VIANA** (midfield): Highly-rated Portuguese youth international who signed a one-year contract at

Luton 2 months ago. Born in France and previously playing for Strasbourg, Atletico Madrid, and MLS side Real Salt Lake, he can play across the midfield or just behind the striker.

#21 **Luke GUTTRIDGE** (central midfield, 31): This influential player has over 400 senior appearances with clubs including Torquay, Cambridge U, Southend (promoted twice), L Orient, Colchester, Aldershot, and Northampton (League 2 Play-Off finalists). Signed a 2 year contract for the *Hatters* in August.

#22 **Shaun WHALLEY** (attacking midfielder / winger, 25): Previously at Wrexham and Chester, he enjoyed a super 2012/13 season with Southport, scoring 10 with numerous assists. After picking up his awards with The Sandgrounders, he followed Parry to Luton on a 2 year deal.

#23 **Matt ROBINSON** (midfielder, 19): In his second season at Kenilworth Road having signed last summer from Leicester City. Impressive displays earned a new two-year contract in 2013.

#25 **Ronnie HENRY** (right back, 19): Club captain in his second season with the club since joining in summer 2012 from Stevenage, whom he helped win promotions from the Conference to League 1.

#26 **Paul BENSON** (striker, 33): Experienced centre-forward who has been on loan from Swindon since August. Helped Dagenham & Redbridge to two promotions under John Still, scoring over 75 times in the process. He added to his tally while at Charlton and Swindon, where he won a League 2 winners' medal in 2012.

#27 **Andre GRAY** (striker, 22): Signed in March 2012 from Hinckley and made an instant impact with his pace and scoring ability – topping the charts with 20 last term. Has been capped by England C.

#28 **Jim STEVENSON** (midfield, 21): Box-to-box man signed on a 2 year deal in May from Histon, where he ended last term as top scorer with 11. Actually made his *'Stutes* debut as a 17 year old away to Luton. Currently on loan at Dartford.

#30 **Alex LACEY** (centre half, 20): Made his Luton debut at 17 in the FA Trophy, and after returning from a season long loan at Eastleigh, was made captain during an outstanding pre-season in 2013.

#31 **Jake WOOLLEY** (striker, 19): Another to debut at 17 in the Trophy, and has added Conference action too, earning his first pro' deal in the summer after impressing with great performance and attitude.

#32 **Brett LONGDEN** (right back, 18): A 1st year pro' who made his mark in pre-season with a fine 30-yard goal against Thurrock. Has appeared in the Trophy.

#34 **Zane BANTON** (striker, 17): Rewarded for his performances in the *Hatters'* development and youth squads to earn a professional contract in September, and debuted as a substitute in the 4-0 win over Woking.

#33 **Jerome JIBODU** (left back, 18): Gained his first pro' contract this summer, having made his *Hatters'* debut against Skelmersdale in last season's FA Trophy.

Arel AMU (left wing, 18): and alongside the likes of Rees, Barton and Stevenson, was in the side that beat Biggleswade to lift last season's Beds Premier Cup.

Tinashe CHABATA (utility, 18): followed the same route as Rees and could make his debut today.

Ian REES (left midfield, 18): Joined the Luton Centre of Excellence via the TIPS Development Programme.

Charlie SMITH (midfield, 18): Another member of Luton's Football League Youth Alliance side with the talent to break into the senior squad.

Three additional loan players were signed yesterday:

Joe DAVIS (defender, 20) Young Player of the Year 2012/13 at Port Vale, where he has played 19 times including promotion last term. Son of Crewe boss Steve; 6' tall.

Pelly RUDDOCK Mpanzu (defender, 20) Started at Boreham Wood, and has been with West Ham since 2011. An eventful last two months has seen him help the *Hammers* to win the Ciutat de Barcelona Trophy against Espanyol, then make his senior West Ham debut vs Burnley in the League Cup.

Alfie MAWSON (centre back, 19) ex Brentford and Reading but cup-tied from a loan at Maidenhead.

MANAGEMENT

Manager John Still, 63, joined in March after 10 great years at Dagenham & Redbridge, in which he guided them from Conference to League 1. **Terry Harris** (Assistant) played and coached at Dagenham, as well as Dartford, Enfield, St Albans. **Hakan Hayrettin** (First Team Coach) arrived from Grays in July. The staff is completed by **Jeff Wood** (Goalkeeper Coach), **Dave Richardson** (Fitness Coach), **Simon Parsell** (Physio), and **Darren Cook** (Kit Man).

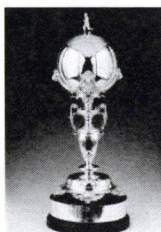

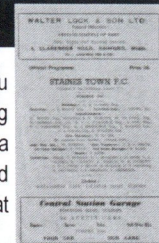

You may be surprised to learn that we have however met the *Hatters* in League action - during 1957/8 their Colts (3rd XI) were fellow Hellenic League members, and Staines Town did a Premier Division double with a 6-0 home win on 12 October (Peter Ellis 5, Dick Watmore), and a 3-1 win on 6 April (Ted Hasley and Ellis two more; Mardle for Luton) in the 'away' game that was also played at Wheatsheaf Lane. Watmore missed penalties for Staines in both games!

We had to wait until 7 Nov 1994 for a visit to Kenilworth Road, and then it was a 1st Round Proper FA Youth Cup tie, when Luton beat Peter Penycate's charges 5-0 (Paul McLaren 2, Chris Willmott, Gary Issott 2).

Our Women's side enjoyed an intense Greater London League rivalry with Luton Town Belles II in 2005/6 and '06/7, with Staines taking the title and promotion in both seasons. There were four meetings that first season, a 1-1 draw in the AIFT Tournament, a thrilling 2-1 *aet* Russell Cup win, and a 4-1 and 5-0 League double. Staines gleaned 4 League points the following season, from a 1-1 draw and 3-2 win.

Today's game will be our third FA Trophy tie to be played on this date of the calendar, the other two being against clubs who were - at the time - big Southern League outfits. The 1976 game represented one of our best results for many a year, having held unbeaten Cambridge at their own ground, Kenny Ballard's side put them to the sword at a muddy Wheatsheaf Lane. In 1968, we were drawn away to London University in a Southern Combination Cup tie, but the game was moved to here, and yielded the biggest margin of victory on this date: sadly, some of the margins of defeat have been somewhat heavier! In 1987, we kicked off our Middlesex Senior Cup campaign by beating Hayes, eventually lifting the trophy by beating Wembley in extra time at Wealdstone's old Lower Mead Stadium.

LUTON TOWN FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

1885 - Formed on 11 April by merger of Wanderers FC (who claimed to already be using the Luton Town name) and works team Excelsior FC. They began just playing friendlies and entering the FA Cup, at Excelsior's Dallow Lane ground.

1890- Became the first southern side to adopt professionalism

1894 - Founder members of the **Southern League**.

1895 & '96 - Southern League runners-up, gaining election to **Football League** Division 2.

1897 - Moved to Dunstable Road.

1900 - Failed to gain re-election and re-joined **Southern League**.

1905 - Moved to Kenilworth Road.

1912 - Relegated to Southern League Div 2, where they mostly played Welsh teams!

1914 - Div 2 runners-up, resuming in Div 1 after the War.

1920 - Along with fellow Div 1 members, became Football League Division 3 *en masse*.

1936 - Runners-up to Coventry. Debutant Joe Payne netted 10 goals in a 12-1 win over Bristol Rovers.

1937 - Aided by 55 goals from Payne, secured promotion to Division 2.

1939 - With Kenilworth Road extended to hold 34000, the side just missed promotion to the top flight, and a good start the next season was cut short by war.

1955 - Clinched promotion on goal average. Having just avoided the drop in '51, Town came close to promotion in both '53 & '54, with a strong Youth policy feeding Jesse Pye's side with stars such as all-time top scorer Gordon Turner.

1956 - Began the 1st Division campaign with thumping wins over Newcastle, Blackpool, Wolves, and leaders Sunderland, but finished mid-table.

1958 - On the back of a best-ever 8th place finish, hit top spot for a time early in

'58/9.

1959 - Exceeded their previous best in the FA Cup by beating Leeds, Leicester, Ipswich, Blackpool, and Norwich to reach the Final, where they lost 2-1 to Nottingham Forest.

1960 - Finished bottom: relegated to Div 2.

1963 - A succession of boardroom and managerial changes culminated in relegation to Div 3.

1965 - Crowds of 30,000+ in the cup run, dropped to 3,000 as they slumped into Div 4.

1968 - Promoted as champions to Div 3 under Allan Brown.

1970 - Manager Alec Stock and top scorer Malcolm Macdonald (£17500 from Fulham) took Luton up to Div 2.

1974 - Promoted again to Division 1, but went down after just one season.

1978 - Reserve boss David Pleat takes over a club with financial problems.

1982 - Following two near misses, Pleat took them back to Div 1 in great style.

1983 - A season of high scores ended with a 1-0 win over Man City to ensure they stayed up ... and made Mr Pleat's pitch-dance a tv favourite!

1984 - Lost to Everton in FA Cup semi-final

1985 - Club embroiled in controversy, first with the "plastic pitch" - similar to our neighbours' at Feltham, and then with the bam on away fans after trouble in an FA Cup tie v Millwall.

1986 - A good period saw Pleat lured away to Tottenham.

1987 - Under Ray Harford, Luton lost in the Simod Cup and Mercantile Credit Cup finals, and the FA Cup semi to Wimbledon, but Ray Harford's team secured a first ever major trophy by beating Arsenal 3-2 thanks to Brian Stein's last minute

winner in the Littlewoods (League) Cup.
