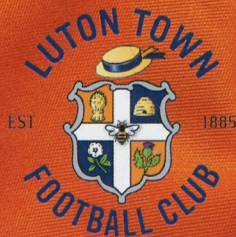

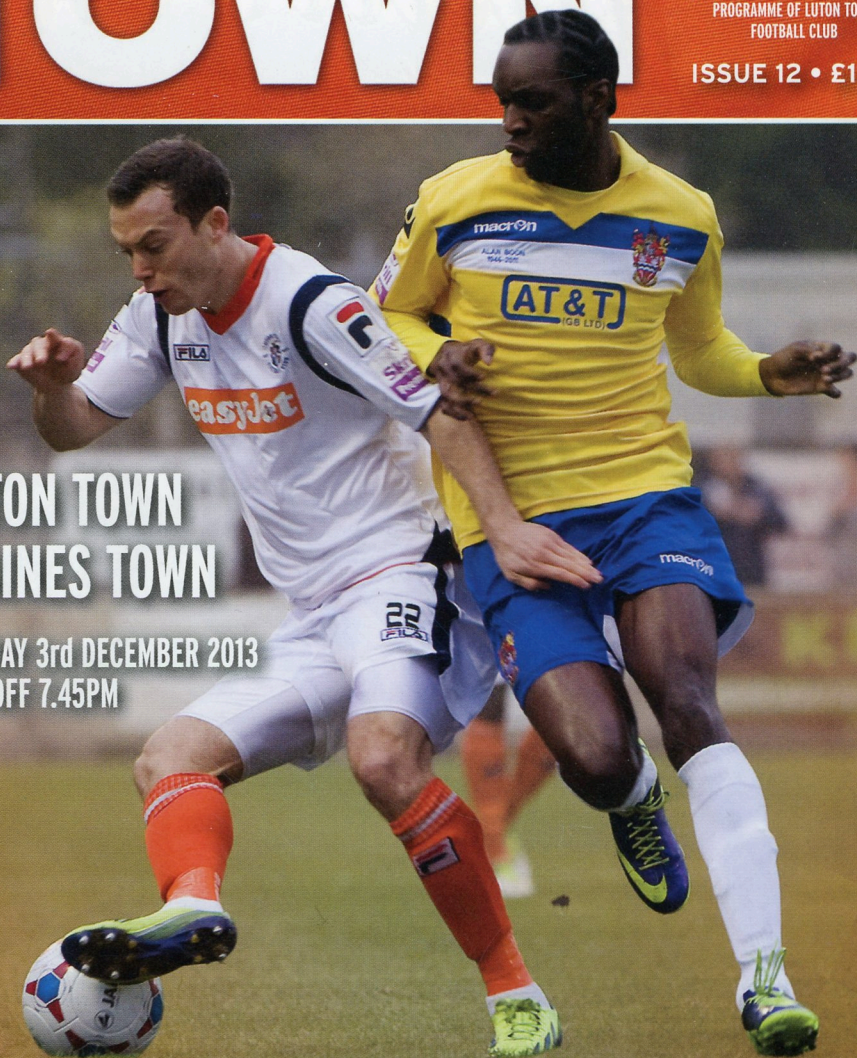

JOHN STILL

Good evening and welcome back to Kenilworth Road for this FA Trophy replay with Staines Town.

We face the Swans for a second time following Saturday's entertaining draw at Wheatshaf Park in which both sides acquitted themselves really well, especially ourselves with the young team we fielded.

It was a younger squad that we would usually pick for a league fixture but we felt we had the quality in the team we took to get a result. Unfortunately, despite our best efforts – and those of the Staines goalkeeper – we couldn't find a winning goal which would have been deserved.

Welcome

The team included two of our three new faces and I would like to welcome Pelly Ruddock and Joe Davis – who both made their debuts at the weekend – and Alfie Mawson, who is cup-tied having already featured in the FA Trophy this season.

I have said in the past that I have not really been a fan of dipping into the loan market but I thought it was necessary to do so following injuries to defenders with Anthony Charles and Danny Fitzsimons both suffering from knocks.

With the loan window closing I thought it was important that we do something and bring in three new bodies to see us through what is going to become a really busy time of year.

Pelly is a player we have known about for a while and have come up against twice in development matches this season. He can play in central defence and in central midfield. Joe has plenty of Football League experience with Port Vale and is versatile enough to play anywhere across the back.

Alfie is a tall, strong, young defender who we have also kept tabs on after our development squad played against Brentford earlier this season.

All three are versatile, young and hungry players. Just what I like. At this time of year it is important to ensure you are not left light in any department and I now think our defence is suitably strong enough now.

The incentive for both teams tonight is a home tie against Wrexham, the current holders of the FA Trophy, a week on Saturday. All clubs wish to have a home draw and we are no different so, if we are successful this evening, we will have an exciting game to look forward.

Exciting

On Saturday we make the journey to Alfreton in the Skril Premier. The Impact Arena has been a fortress this season and we are under no illusions how difficult it will be for us to go and get a result there. It's the start of a really difficult month for us in league action but a really exciting one, too. They'll be difficult games but ones in which I absolutely relish.

Turning attentions back to tonight, though, which once again represents a wonderful opportunity for some of our development players to stake a claim in the first team squad. It also gives those younger players some vital minutes of experience of first team football which is crucial in their development.

So please get behind them and encourage them as many of these players are the future of Luton Town.

The Town made it six home wins on the spin with a comfortable victory over Southport to extend their unbeaten run in the Skrill Premier to 13 games.

The Hatters began on the front foot and should have taken the lead in the 10th minute when Andre Gray strode through onto Paul Benson's throughball but couldn't poke home with just the goalkeeper to beat.

As the Town continued to push for an early opener, Benson came even closer to breaking the deadlock on the quarter-hour mark, turning to hit a low shot that bounced back off the post.

Southport survived that scare but on the half-hour mark they could do nothing as the Town took the lead in astonishing fashion. There seemed little on after the visitors had headed clear Alex Lawless' free-kick, but Steve McNulty lined up a first-time volley which flew over gaping heads of those players in the penalty area and up and over goalkeeper Danny Hurst. Sensing a quickfire double, it was almost 2-0 a minute later when Scott Griffiths sprinted up from left-back and into the box but his effort was sliced into the side-netting.

Clearly shell-shocked by McNulty's pearly, the visitors were all of a sudden at sixes and sevens at the back and Luke Guttridge almost made them pay for some hesitant defending on 36 minutes when he reacted first to Benson's knock-down only for Southport to clear as the ball bounced goalwards.

A goal to the good at the break the Town pressed for a second straight from the restart. Gray should have done better three minutes into the second period when heading Guttridge's left-wing cross over before Richard Brodie

almost snuck in an equaliser a moment later with his shot from the edge of the box that deflected inches wide.

While the Hatters were dominating, clear-cut chances were at a real premium and it took until the 66th minute before the hosts doubled their lead. Guttridge's cross-field pass found Gray and he in turn fed Jonathan Smith and the midfielder rifled an accurate shot into the corner of the net. It was his second goal from outside the box this season.

2-0 up it was time for the Hatters to really flex their muscles. Guttridge's shot was deflected behind on 73 minutes before Benson saw his goal-bound, back-post header denied by a clearance off of the line a minute later.

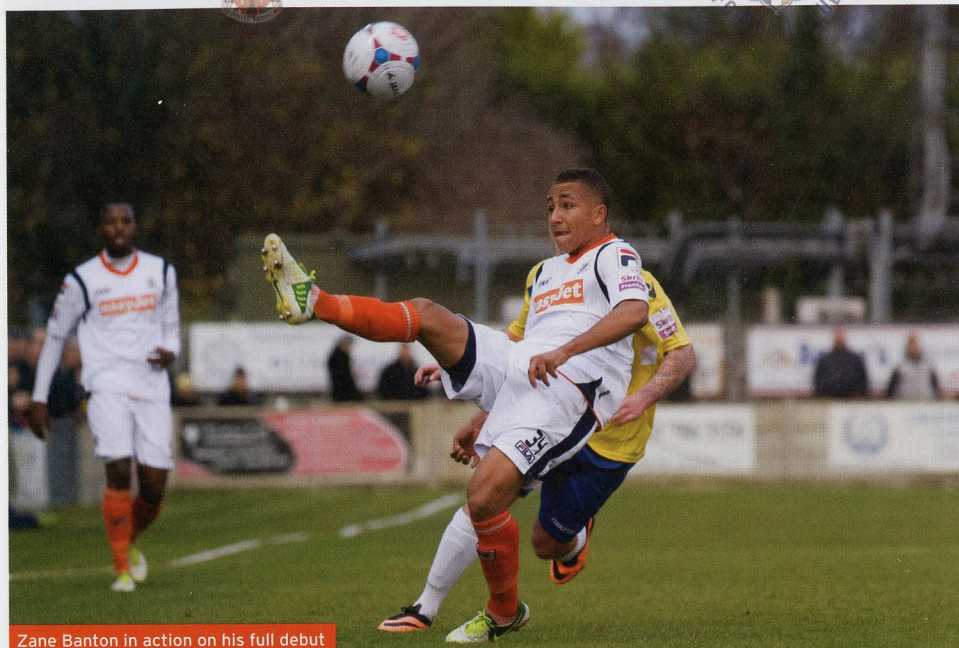
But the Town made it 3-0 with 15 minutes left on the clock. Lawless' lovely flick was perfect for Gray to run on to and he thrashed home an unstoppable finish with his left foot. It was the striker's 10th goal in his last 10 starts.

Guttridge angled a shot against the underside of the bar as the Town came close to a fourth on 78 minutes before Hurst pulled off an admirable save to keep substitute, and ex-Sandgrounder, Shaun Whalley's stinging effort on 85 minutes.

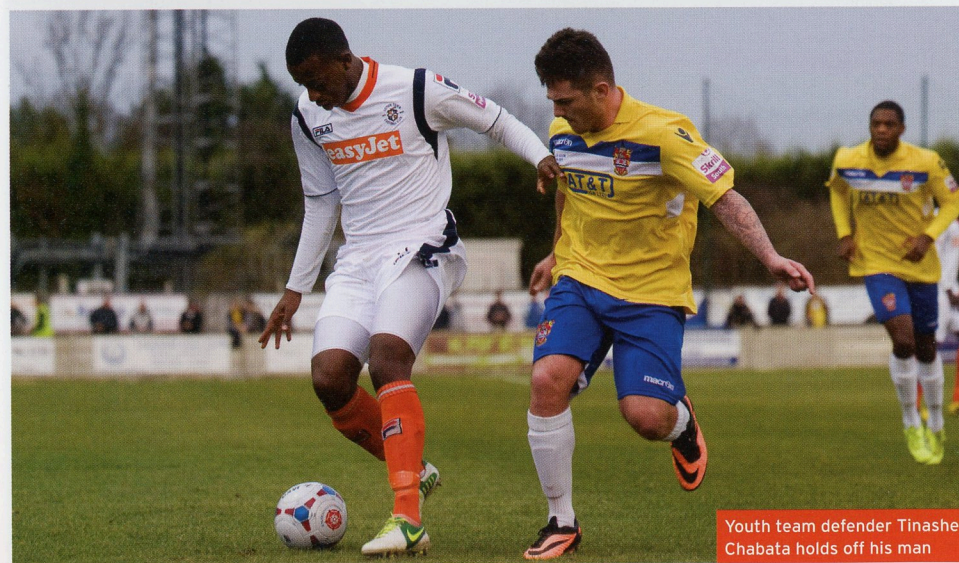
Mark Tyler, who was a virtual spectator throughout, showed his concentration levels remained in stoppage time with a brave stop with his body, denying former Hatter Jamie Hand a consolation for his latest employers.

The Hatters almost had the very last word in the second minute of added time when Guttridge curled a shot high and wide but it mattered little and the Town saw out a comfortable victory.

Skipper-for-the-day Jake Howells goes for goal

A young and much-changed Town were denied a place in the second round of the FA Trophy by a fine goalkeeping display from Staines' Jack Turner.

The home goalkeeper earned his team, who played the tie with 10 men for an hour, tonight's replay at Kenilworth Road with a series of excellent saves in both halves.

After keeping out Mark Cullen's effort in the fourth minute, the stopper pulled off a number of breathtaking stops in the second, thwarting Matt Robinson, Cullen again, David Viana and Charlie Smith.

John Still fielded a side with an average of just under 21 with debuts for loan signings Joe Davis and Pelly Ruddock, midfielder Viana and 17-year-old youth team defender Tinashe Chabata at right-back. Zane Banton, also 17, was given his full debut in attack, whilst Arnaud Mendy made his first appearance since March in the centre of midfield.

The Town had the first chance on four minutes. Shaun Whalley, at 26 the oldest player on show for the Hatters, sent a ball through to Cullen to race on to, but the striker's shot from 12 yards was well saved by Turner in the Staines goal.

That would turn out to be the last real clear-cut chance of a first half that the Hatters dominated. Elliot Justham in the Town goal, did, however, have his fair share of saves to make. The stopper held a low shot from Max Worsfold on 22 minutes which crept towards the bottom corner.

However, the hosts were reduced to 10 men on the half-hour when left-back Jordaan Brown was sent-off for a second yellow card. The defender had been cautioned in the eighth minute for a deliberate handball and he

received his second card for exactly the same offence to leave the Town with a man advantage for an hour.

The Town upped the ante with an extra man. Viana and Robinson were both off target with efforts from distance before Chabata blocked a goal-bound shot from Cullen inside the penalty area on 40 minutes.

Cullen had an early chance at the beginning of the season half, nodding a Whalley cross onto the roof of the net, before Whalley tested Turner with a dipping strike from the edge of the box that the keeper had to tip over.

Turner then came to the home side's rescue three times on 53 minutes with a series of acrobatic stops to keep the Hatters at bay. Firstly, Robinson's swerved effort was turned away by the goalkeeper before he made an even better save to deny Cullen from point blank range on the follow-up. The Town still weren't done, though, and neither was Turner: throwing out his hands to stop Viana's shot from the edge of the box.

Staines had barely had a sniff in the second half but had two efforts in as many minutes with leading goalscorer Louie Theophanous shooting over from the edge of the box on 69 minutes before Justham dealt with a routine shot from Worsfold.

Back came the Town, and again Turner came to the hosts' rescue when he dived away to his left to tip away a shot from substitute Smith from 20 yards that seemed destined for the top corner. Moments later the keeper was involved again, this time holding onto a low free-kick from substitute Alex Wall from distance.

Both sides pushed for a goal in the closing stages. Staines sub Bajram Pashaj tested Justham before Cullen missed a chance in stoppage time but couldn't pull the trigger and it meant with the game finished goalless.

STAINES TOWN



This evening we give a warm welcome to everybody associated with Staines Town to Kenilworth Road.

The Swans make their first visit to this corner of Bedfordshire looking to improve a poor away record which has threatened to derail a fine campaign so far in the Skril South.

Marcus Gayle – he of Premier League fame with Wimbledon in the 1990s – has only seen his side win once on the road this term and that came in a FA Trophy third qualifying round replay at Farnborough which earned the Swans a meeting with the Town.

In the hurly-burly of the Skril South, however, the Swans have taken just one point from eight fixtures away from their Wheatheaf Park home, where, conversely, Gayle's side have lost just once.

However, Gayle's side will take heart from Saturday's goalless draw with a youthful Town side who are likely to be given another chance at Kenilworth Road tonight. Even more impressive was the Swans' determination to secure a replay after playing over an hour with 10 men following Jordaan Brown's first-half sending off.

The Swans are enjoying their fifth season in England's sixth tier of football, following their promotion via the Play-Offs from the Ryman Premier in 2009. The club finished 18th in the Conference South last season and currently sit 13th in the Skril South having taken 22 points from 15 games. The Swans lie just three points off of the Play-Offs and nine points away from the bottom three.

Gayle, who was capped 14 times by Jamaica, took over the reins at the beginning of last season and is ably assisted by experienced striker Scott Taylor. Taylor, a veteran of 11 Football League clubs, began his career with the Swans before he was snapped up by Millwall in 1995. He returned to Wheatheaf Park in 2008 and, now 37, he is still registered as a player.

The Staines side that held the Town at the weekend is a mix of youth and experience. A number of players have joined the Swans' academy and risen through the ranks.

The Hatters will need to be wary of the Swans' top goalscorer Louie Theophanous. He hit over 20 goals last season having joined the club from AFC Wimbledon where boss Gayle was reserve team boss. So far this term, Theophanous has 14 goals to his name and scored eight in a five-game spell between September and October.

However, the Town will need to break the resistance of 21-year-old goalkeeper Jack Turner whose man-of-the-match performance on Saturday almost single-handedly earned tonight's replay with a string of excellent saves. The stopper joined the club from AFC Wimbledon and he was an unused substitute in the Wombles' Play-Off final penalty shootout win over the Hatters at Manchester City in 2011.

Since booking the tie against the Town, the Swans have lost both of their Skril South games without scoring, a 1-0 defeat at home to Concord Rangers – which ended the 100 per cent record at Wheatheaf Park – was followed by a 2-0 reverse at Gosport Borough.

MEET THE STAINES SQUAD

THE MANAGER

MARCUS GAYLE. Former Brentford, Wimbledon, Rangers, Watford and Jamaican international midfielder who took over at Wheatheaf Park in May 2012.

GOALKEEPERS

JACK TURNER. Former AFC Wimbledon goalkeeper who was Gayle's first signing this summer. Began his career as a junior with Chelsea and Fulham before joining AFC Wimbledon's School of Excellence. Made a handful of Football League appearances last season for the Wombles.

KYLE MERSON. Young stopper who graduated through the Swans' Kingston College Academy. Has spent time out on loan with St Albans, Godalming, Ashford Town (Middlesex) and Walton & Hersham.

DEFENDERS

JORDAAN BROWN. Skilful left-back who spent three seasons at AFC Wimbledon where he was a regular in the reserves under Marcus Gayle. Also enjoyed senior experience with Chipstead.

LEWIS FERRELL. Former Stevenage, Brentford and Hayes & Yeading right-back who snubbed a move to Boreham Wood to sign for the Swans. Was appointed captain at the start of this season.

JEREL IFIL. Centre-half who began his career as a youngster with Watford. Has a wealth of experience having enjoyed spells with Huddersfield, Swindon, Aberdeen and Bristol Rovers.

CHRIS M'BOUNGOU. Young centre-back who joined Staines from AS Cannes in France. Enjoyed seven years in the academy at Auxerre.

SANCHEZ MING. Versatile defender or midfielder who signed this summer. Previously on the books at Bromley, Fisher, Welling, Dulwich Hamlet and Bishop's Stortford.

STEPHANE NGAMVOULOU. Stylish right-back in his first season in England having signed for the Swans from US Torcy in France. Also capable of playing in midfield.

LUKE NEVILLE. Classy centre-half who played junior football for AFC Wimbledon, Ascot and Ashford before signing for the Staines academy in 2012.

QASEEM SOTONWA. Centre-back who signed for the Staines academy in the summer of 2011 and penned Conference forms in January 2013.

MIDFIELDERS

ERIVALDO FELIX. Teenage midfielder or right-back who made his debut for the Swans having risen through the youth ranks at Wheatheaf Park. He is the son of a former Angolan international handball player.

ASHLEY LODGE. The winner of multiple awards whilst with Kew Association in 2006/07, the midfielder joined Staines' academy. Left to sign for Molesey, Ashford and Chipstead but re-signed for the Swans in January 2013.

BAJRAM PASHAJ. Midfielder who joined the Staines academy in 2010/11 after seven seasons with Isleworth Colts. Caught Marcus Gayle's eye when playing for the Under-19s, which earned him a call-up to the senior squad.

MAX WORSFOLD. Former Aldershot Town professional who enjoyed considerable Conference South experience whilst on-loan with Basingstoke, Maidenhead and Dorchester. Briefly played for Staines Town juniors as a youngster.

STRIKERS

SCOTT TAYLOR. Hailed as the return of the prodigal son, Taylor returned to Staines in November in 2008 and is currently player/assistant manager. Started his career with the club before embarking on a successful professional career. Enjoyed spells with Millwall, Bolton, Tranmere, Stockport, Blackpool, Plymouth, Rochdale and Brentford.

LOUIE THEOPHANOUS. The Swans' top goalscorer so far this term, the young forward enjoyed a prolific spell under Marcus Gayle for AFC Wimbledon's reserves, scoring 38 goals in all competitions. Tried his luck in his native Cyprus with APOEL Nicosia, and had spells with Dagenham & Redbridge, Histon and Bromley.

DAN BROWN. Striker who signed for the Swans in March 2013 after a successful few months in the Ryman Premier with Wingate & Finchley. Also played for Ashford and Hanwell Town.

LOUIS-RAE BEADLE. Rose through the ranks at Hampton & Richmond Borough to sign for Staines in July 2012. Once spent a trial with Championship side Burnley in March 2011.

OLUWOLE AKINSANYA. Powerful, teenage forward who joined the Staines academy in 2012 having previously been on the books at Hayes & Yeading.

THREE IN, TWO OUT ON LOAN

The Town have loaned defensive trio **Alfie Mawson, Joe Davis and Pelly Ruddock** from **Brentford, Port Vale and West Ham** respectively.

All three players have made their senior debuts for the parent clubs and arrive at Kenilworth Road until 4th January.

Commanding centre-back Mawson, 19, joined Brentford from Reading in 2010 and made his debut for the Bees in their Capital One Cup tie with Derby this season. The defender has recently enjoyed a loan spell with Maidenhead United.

Davis, 20, is the son of Crewe manager Steve, and he made his debut for Vale when aged just 17 in the 2010/11 campaign.

Burnley-born Davis was named the Valiants' Young Player of the Year in 2012 and has made 19 appearances in all competitions for Micky Adams' side, including eight appearances last season as Vale won promotion via third place in League 2.

Meanwhile 20-year-old Ruddock, who can also play in midfield, made his debut for the Hammers in a Capital One Cup tie this season having originally signed for the East London club from Boreham Wood in 2011.

Ruddock played against the Town in the development squad match between the two clubs at Kenilworth Road last month and has scored twice in nine Premier League Under-21 division games this season.

The Town have also loaned two players from Kenilworth Road to two clubs in the Skrill Premier. JJ O'Donnell has joined Hyde and Jim Stevenson has been loaned to Dartford. The pair will remain at those clubs until 4th January.

DUO REFLECT ON DEBUTS

New loan signings **Pelly Ruddock** and **Joe Davis** were pleased to help keep a clean sheet on their **Town debuts at Staines on Saturday**.

Ruddock, 20 - who signed from West Ham - and Port Vale's Davis, also 20, were one of 11 changes to the Hatters side which drew a blank at Wheatheaf Park but both were calm figures at the heart of the defence as the home side rarely threatened Elliot Justham's goal.

Impress

Davis, who has tasted first team experience with League 1 Vale last term is hoping that he can impress enough to earn a longer spell at Kenilworth Road.

"It all happened quite fast," Davis told Hatters Player after the goalless draw. "Micky Adams pulled me and said Luton were in for me. It's a massive club and nobody can turn that kind of move down.

"I've wanted to get out on loan for a while now so this loan move is like a breath of fresh air. To come here and play competitive football is great. I've played at League 2 level so I know I can cope with what non-league football has.

"My aim is to impress the people here and hopefully stay a bit longer. I'd love to stay longer and do well for this football club."

Happy

Having trained with his new team-mates on Friday, Davis was happy to help guide an inexperienced Town side through the 90 minutes and a clean sheet.

"It was quite hard but we talked ourselves through the game," he said. "We had a training session on Friday which helped and I'm sure we'll get better and better as we develop an understanding.

Help

"The manager told me to help some of the young lads through the game. Jake Howells and Shaun Whalley were doing the same. It was a case of being vocal and helping those around you.

"We're disappointed we haven't won the game, though. Their keeper's had a worldly. We thought we'd done enough but we've got another game and it gives me and the other players another chance to impress.

"Staines, though, did well, I thought. They made it hard for us, especially when they went down to 10 men."

Fellow centre-half Ruddock, who played against the Town development squad in two fixtures for West Ham this season, was happy to help the side keep a clean sheet.

"The important thing for me was to keep a clean sheet and we did that," said Ruddock. "It was a good experience and a decent result. We knew we should have won and hopefully we can learn from that.

Confident

"I only joined on Friday and met Joe then so to keep a clean sheet after just one day of training is really good.

"Their goalkeeper's made some good saves but we'll be confident playing in front of our own supporters."

Ruddock joined the Hammers from Boreham Wood and although utilised at centre-back, the youngster admitted he can also operate in midfield.

"I like to play the ball and I like to play in midfield, that's my preferred position," he said. "But the manager told me to play in defence and that's where I'll play - that's football."
