



It is part of our way of playing our football and I loved it as a young fan and now as a player. As a West London boy, I was a season-ticket holder at QPR for five seasons – I was even the mascot twice! – and I really looked forward then to the Boxing Day matches and I have the same feeling still.

With players coming back from long-term injuries, I believe we now have the strongest squad of players in my time at the club. Dani Lopez is a gifted player and we all know what he is capable of and Jake Hyde is now fully fit and he will, I'm sure, be match-fit after two or three games.

As for New Years' resolutions I always have a few. A major one is to try and beat the club's record for clean sheets and to do that I know we'll need to keep the opposition at bay in something like 20 matches. That is a tall order, but I like setting myself particular targets to go out and aim for.

To get into the Play-Offs is also a target and to gain promotion by any of the means possible remains the ultimate.




MEET THE BEES...



JOSH ILAN catches up with the forward who can also play in defence...MAURO VILHETE...



You came through the KICKZ programme at Barnet - how did you get spotted by the club?

I had a few training sessions with my local club and we entered a few local community tournaments. There were a few clubs that were interested in me, and had asked me to go on-trial, but Barnet were the club I chose. They were local to me, and were starting up an academy just as I was leaving school. Giuliano Grazioli has always been there for me, and has been a good friend ever since I joined the club. He has been proud of me throughout, and has helped me to develop. (Janet Matthewson deserves a mention here. She was instrumental in making sure that Mauro's name was well known in Barnet FC circles after she'd been impressed by his performances in tournaments that she had helped put together. Ed.)

You became the club's youngest ever player in 2010 when we faced Grimsby Town in a crunch relegation clash. What did you make of your debut at such a crucial time?

There was a buzz around the club. Obviously it is nerve-wracking as you are in a relegation battle, and you really need the win. The manager said to me, "carry on what you're doing and you'll never know what can happen." I was raring to go and happy to play a part in our survival.

It was a great feeling to stay up; it was a mental experience and I loved it. Having played in a few relegation battles, I have learned never to give up. The first three years we managed to stay up and last year we were relegated. It is always good to have a team spirit and if you're together, you can succeed.

Your first goal for Barnet came five months later against Southend United in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy. What was it like to score your first career game?

I was delighted, but I wanted to score more and more goals after this. The first goal isn't the hardest to score; it's the second goal. You're hungry and you want more, and you lose your head if you don't score - especially for an attack-minded player.

In March 2011, you were called up for Portugal's Under-18s training camp. What did you make of this experience?

I enjoyed every moment of it - the experience was a very good learning curve for me. Just to train with the Under-18s was a pleasure, but once you do get to play there, you want more and more of it. I'll carry on working and you never know what can happen.

Having burst on to the scene relatively early, were you upset not to have made more appearances for Barnet in

the last few years?

Definitely, it has been a very frustrating two years for me. I don't complain about it, though; I always keep striving and carry on, so as to make sure I would get back into the team.

You had three loan spells away from the club, with the first being at Hendon and the latter two being separate stints at Boreham Wood. How much did you learn from your time away from the club?

Every level is different, and you learn that when you play there. When I went lower down, it was a more physical game; a lot of the teams played very direct, kicking it backwards and forwards. However, it was good to experience this and it definitely helped me to develop.

Direct football, though, is not a bad thing. Football is all about success, and it depends on the team you have as to how you play. If you look at the likes of Barcelona, they have worked on it for many years. You look at teams like Stoke City, though, who play a different style and get results. Football is the way you want to play it, with no one-set rule - everyone loves football for that reason.

When you returned to Barnet last season, you played a few games under the management of Edgar Davids. What was your reaction when you found out he joined the club? It is fair to say that, like everyone else, I was a little bit shocked - none of us really expected it. We are working under, and with, a legend and we try to take on-board everything he says. He has played at the very top, which is where we all want to be.

He tries to give us knowledge of what it is like at those top clubs. He is a professional and a perfectionist: he doesn't want 80%, but expects you to give 100%. It makes you want to better yourself and you are going to get the chances as it is up to you, not the manager, which helps everyone to knuckle down. Every manager has got his own style. He's more hands on in comparison to the other managers I've worked under. We all know where he's played, which gives us a different insight into the game.

In the past few years, Barnet have had a large amount of players appear for them. Is it nice to have some stability inside the club now?

It is good to keep a good group of players for this season because you already have got that team chemistry and you want to play - and work hard - for each other. It is far easier than regrouping and getting to know everyone. This is certainly one of the best groups we've had in my time at the club.

NO.20 MAURO VILHETE...



Having moved from Underhill to The Hive this season,
what do you make of the facility and how does it compare
to our old stadium?

The pitches are outstanding, especially for the way we
want to play. It is all very good and will only make us
better. I enjoy it more at The Hive than at Underhill - I
hated the slope, which was a killer! However, I loved
the crowd and atmosphere at Underhill - unless you
were having a shocker! When you played well and the
fans were praising you, it was absolutely fantastic.

**What have you made of life in the Conference so far -
have you enjoyed your more regular inclusions in the
team?**

I went on-loan to Boreham Wood, who were in the
league below the Conference, and so had a taste of
non-league football. It is not as easy as people think. A
lot of it is about what you think as a team. If you
think, 'we'll take it easy,' you will lose, but we have
stayed and will continue to be focused.

**On a few occasions this season, you have been deployed
at left-back. Did you enjoy playing there?**

I have really enjoyed playing there and am relishing it
really. I never thought I'd ever play left-back and
thought it would be a bit tough. It is all down to the
management if I play there again and I am happy to

play wherever – although it is no secret that I prefer
playing in an attacking role.

**You are one of a few players who have come through the
club's youth ranks. Why do you think so many players are
coming through the Academy now?**

A lot of credit must go to the coaches who know exactly
what they are doing. They know the philosophy of the
club, while they also add their own philosophy which
helps you to strive. You wouldn't be able to produce
your talent without them.

The good thing at Barnet is all the senior players
welcome you when you breakthrough and make you
feel at home. They want you to express yourself and
they try and help you out with them not getting on your
back. It is not easy to adjust but it makes your life
easier as they will help guide you.

**With the team being in 7th place, what are the side's and
your own ambitions for the rest of the season?**

For me, I think we will get to the play-offs – but
anything can happen and there is a long way to go.
Personally, I hope to play as many games as I can, get
a few goals and assists and help the team to win
promotion.

WHAT'S THE BUZZ... BY JOSH ILAN...



A comprehensive guide as to what is happening in the Conference and beyond...

Aldershot Town were walking in a 'winter wonderland' last Saturday as they climbed out of the relegation zone with an emphatic victory against fellow battlers **Tamworth**. They won 6-0 on their home patch with **Brett Williams** grabbing a double, taking him up to 14 goals this season which makes him the joint top-scorer in the Skrill Premier.

The other player to have reached this goal tally, **Connor Jennings**, looks unlikely to add to this record. The striker's loan spell at **Macclesfield Town** was cut short by a month due to injury, which will be a major blow for **John Askey's** side and he has returned to his parent club **Scunthorpe United**.

Another highly-touted striker, **Joe Lolley** of **Kidderminster Harriers**, may be leaving Aggbrough in the near future. The striker has excelled since joining from **Littleton** in the summer, attracting the interest of sides higher up the footballing pyramid. **Kidderminster** manager **Steve Burr** stated: "Joe is still learning the game. But, when you're a striker, you're scoring and creating headlines, it leads to even more interest. And we can't stand in people's way. But this sort of decision will be made only if it is right for everybody."

Despite **Lolley's** strike partner **Michael Gash** grabbing an early goal, **Kidderminster** incurred their eighth defeat in 23 games after losing 3-1 away to fellow promotion contenders **Grimsby Town**. This victory was inspired by **Scott Neilson**, who scored his first two goals of the season in the clash.

Hereford United's financial woes have seen them sink into despair, which has left them with an unavoidable plea to fans to raise money. The cash-strapped club, which has suffered enormously since relegation into the Skrill Premier, needs to raise £35,000 in the next fortnight to fend off a winding-up order.

On-the-pitch, however, **Hereford** have bolstered their ranks with the signing of midfielder **Jamie Edge**. The 20-year-old failed to reach his potential when touted as one of **Arsenal's** best young prospects, with his last spell having been at Skrill South outfit **Gloucester City**.

With this week of relative despair, Hereford managed to claim the major scalp of the latest round of the Skrill Premier. Veteran striker **Michael Rankine** buried a first-half winner as they condemned league leaders **Cambridge United** to only their second defeat of the

season.



This allowed **Luton Town** to close the gap at the top of the table to one point, with them recording a comfortable 4-2 win over Gateshead. The away side looked on course for a thrashing but two former Bees helped to halve the deficit, with **John Oster** and **Liam Hatch** grabbing late goals.

Junior N'Tame decided to depart Wrexham upon the completion of his six-month contract with **Andy Morrell's** side. The defender, who had previously plied his trade in France and Slovenia, made seven appearances for the Skrill Premier side; the last of which came against **Aldershot Town** in September.

Tuesday night's FA Trophy replays created a couple of shock outcomes. **Nuneaton Town** succumbed to a penalty shoot-out loss at home to Skrill South outfit **Gosport Borough**; while penalties also determined the outcome in the tournament's major surprise, with **Forest Green Rovers** being defeated by **Gary Flitcroft's** inspired **Chorley**.

Chorley's reward for pulling off a cup coup will be a trip away to Skrill Premier strugglers **Tamworth**. After defeating The Bees 2-1 to go through to the Third Round, **Grimsby Town** face a relatively easy tie as they were drawn at home to **Maidenhead United**. The round's plum tie sees the fifth tier's top two sides, **Cambridge United** and **Luton Town**, compete against each other.

Despite the tournament presenting a rare opportunity to go to Wembley, **Cambridge United** launched a scathing attack on the prestige and importance of the competition. Their director of football, **Jez George**, declared: "The way it's organised, it does everything possible to deter the bigger clubs from taking it seriously."

One player has literally thrown in the towel this week. **Rory Delap**, famed for his propelling of long-range throws – which helped **Stoke City** to become an established Premiership outfit – announced his retirement after a 19-year career, with him cutting short his spell at League Two side **Burton Albion**.

Having been released from his contract at **Brentford** after an unproductive spell, striker **Paul Hayes** has




rejoined **Scunthorpe United** for the third time in his career. He previously played for them between 2002-05 and 2007-10, scoring 60 goals in 231 games; and he will be hoping to fire them out of League Two at the first attempt.

From the riches and glories of the Barclays Premier League to the blood and sweat of non-league is the journey one former top tier one former player has undertaken. Ex **Newcastle United** defender **Olivier Bernard**, who had to retire prematurely through injury, has become chairman and owner of **Durham City**, who reside in the Northern Premier League, Division One.

Gavin McCallum, who played two games on-loan for **Barnet** in 2012, has left **Sutton United**, the club he joined from **Woking** in the summer, for **Tonbridge Angels**, who also ply their trade in the Skrill South, on a short-term loan deal.

Staying in the Skrill South, **Eastleigh** gained a vital win in their quest to win promotion to the Skrill Premier after a 2-1 win away to fellow promotion contenders **Dover**. Former **Barnet** striker **Ben Strevens** started the comeback on 79 minutes, with it being completed by a last-minute winner from **Stuart Fleetwood**.



Since **Chelmsford City**'s appointment of **Mark Hawkes**, their league form has perked up, having collected two wins and two draws from their last four league outings, taking them up to 16th place. Former Bees **Mark Hughes**, **Nicky Nicolau** and **Kieron St Amie** have appeared in all of these games.

Former **Barnet** defender **Grant Basey** has left Skrill South high-fliers **Ebbsfleet United**, only three months after joining them. This is due to suffering another cruciate knee ligament injury, which has left the 24-year-old wanting to take time out of the game to re-evaluate his options.

Centre-midfielder **Josh Wright**, who appeared 32 times for The Bees in the 2007-08 season, has been recalled by his parent club **Millwall**. The 24-year-old had spent the previous month on-loan at **Leyton Orient**, playing two games for the League One leaders.



Another ex-**Barnet** loanee, centre-back **Michael Hector**, may receive the breakthrough he has been longing for. Having excelled at **Aberdeen** in the SPL this season,

the 21-year-old will become a part of **Reading**'s first-team squad upon the expiry of his loan, linking up with another ex Bees loanee in **Jordan Obita**.



The manager who signed the **Reading** duo for **Barnet** was **Lawrie Sanchez** and he made some interesting comments this week regarding his one-year stint at the club. Now managing Greek Super League side **Apollon Syrmini**, the man who scored the winning goal in the 1988 FA Cup Final declared: "People think: 'He was sacked by Barnet, there's something wrong.' But they don't realise that keeping Barnet up, in 2011, was a massive achievement. In terms of budget, they were a Conference team, and we weren't in the relegation zone when I left."

A fellow **Wimbledon** legend, **Terry Brown**, has made a long-awaited comeback after a lengthy spell without a managerial position. He has been handed the reins at ambitious **Margate**, who have come under new ownership and plan to build a new stadium in the near future, with them aiming to reach The Football League.

One manager who found himself out of a job last weekend was **Aidy Boothroyd**. Having guided **Northampton Town** to the play-off final last season, the hangover from their crushing defeat at Wembley has lurked around Sixfields, with The Cobblers being bottom of League Two.

Boothroyd's former club **Watford** are also under new management. With **Gianfranco Zola** having admirably handed in his resignation after a run of nine games without a win, he was replaced by the Pozzo family with another Italian, **Giuseppe Sannino**. His first game saw **Trot Deeney** score a late equaliser to salvage a late draw away to **Ipswich Town**.

Alfreton Town manager **Nicky Law** praised his side after producing a comeback to condemn **Dartford** to a ninth consecutive defeat, affirming: "We went out first half and did everything we didn't want to do. We spoke about going out and working them, using the extra man in midfield and passing the ball and it didn't quite work for us. I think we came out really strong in the second half for the first 25 minutes and I think we deserved the win."





But sadly it wasn't to be with both sets of defences on top.



John Still – Manager

The 63-year-old joined the Hatters last March having enjoyed a hugely successful 10-year spell at Dagenham & Redbridge where he guided the Daggers to the Conference title as well as promotion to League 1 and of course is well-known to Barnet supporters. John is assisted by Terry Harris, Hakan Hayrettin and Jeff Wood.

1 Mark Tyler

Hugely experienced goalkeeper who signed a one-year contract extension in May. On the verge of 700 senior appearances, 36-year-old Tyler was one of the Hatters' first signings in their first season in the Conference in 2009-10, and the stopper has since gone on to make 184 appearances between the sticks, keeping 72 clean sheets. Previously with Peterborough United.

3 Danny Fitzsimons

Danny is a 21-year-old former Millwall and QPR defender who followed team-mate Jim Stevenson to Kenilworth Road from Histon on a two-year contract this summer. He swept the board at the Stutes' end-of-season awards and has over 100 games' experience despite his age. Capable of playing at left-back or in central defence. Previously with QPR, Millwall, Yeovil and Histon.

4 Jonathan Smith

Central midfielder who joined the Hatters from Swindon Town last season having helped the Robins lift the League 2 title in 2011-12 under Paolo Di Canio. Also capable of playing at right-back. Aged 26. Previously with Morecambe, Forest Green Rovers, York City and Swindon Town.


5 Steve McNulty

The experienced 29-year-old centre-half signed a new deal with the Hatters this summer after a string of accomplished performances for the club during 2012-13. The Liverpool-born defender led Fleetwood Town to the Conference title in 2011-12 as the Cod Army captain. Also formerly with Barrow and Vauxhall Motors.

6 Anthony Charles

Now aged-32, the experienced central defender helped Barnet and Aldershot to Conference titles in 2005 and 2008 respectively. A calm, composed, left-footed defender, Charles left Aldershot for Northampton in January 2012 and went onto appear 18 times in League 2 for the Cobblers. He ended last season with Plymouth.

7 Alex Lawless

The influential and creative midfielder penned a new two-year contract in May, turning down contracts at two clubs in League 1. The 27-year-old has made 124 appearances for the Hatters since signing from York City in November 2010 and has scored 12 goals. Also formerly with Fulham, Torquay United and Forest Green Rovers.

8 Solomon Taiwo

Central midfielder who agreed a new one-year contract at the end of last season having appeared nine times for the Hatters having been signed by John Still in March. Starred for a host of

non-league clubs before being snapped by Still at Dagenham in 2007 where he became a driving force in the Daggers midfield. His impressive performances led to him signing for then-Championship Cardiff in 2009 for £250,000. Aged 28.

9 Jon Shaw

The 29-year-old centre-forward is now in his second season at Kenilworth Road having signed from Gateshead. Scored 45 league goals in 80 appearances for the Tynesiders and hit double figures for the Town last term, including a hat-trick in the 6-1 win over Barrow in January. Also previously with Sheffield Wednesday, Burton, Halifax and Mansfield Town.

10 Alex Wall

Raw, powerful 22-year-old centre-forward with pace to burn became John Still's first signing at Kenilworth Road having joined from Maidenhead last season. He scored his first goals for the Hatters when hitting both goals in a 2-0 win over Ebbsfleet in April.

11 Jake Howells


Still hard to believe he's 22, Howells is the Hatters' longest serving player having made his debut as a 17-year-old on the final day of the 2007-08 season. Since then, the left-footer has been capped by Wales at U21 level and has made over 200 appearances for the club.


12 Scott Griffiths

Left-back who penned a one-year contract at the end of last season. Another former Dagenham man, the experienced 27-year-old joined the Hatters in March following his release from former club Peterborough. He won the Conference under Still in 2007 and lifted the League 2 title with Chesterfield in 2011. Has played against the Bees on many occasions.

13 Mark Cullen

Young 21-year-old striker who signed on a two-year deal following his release from Hull City. A clever, poacher of a forward, Cullen impressed the manager with two fine performances against the Hatters whilst on loan at Stockport. He scored on his full debut for the Hull whilst in the top flight.


14 Andy Parry

The central defender signed from Southport on a two-year contract this summer. Also able to play in central midfield, Parry has two season's worth of Conference football under his belt but began his career as a youngster at Blackburn. Aged 21.

15 Pelly Ruddock

Young West Ham defender who joined on loan from the Hammers in late November. Can also play in midfield.

16 Elliot Justham

Promising young goalkeeper signed from East Thurrock on a two-year deal in May. The commanding 6ft 3in stopper kept 14 clean sheets in 31 matches for the Rocks last season and the 22-year-old has previously enjoyed trials at West Ham and Reading.

17 JJ O'Donnell

Left-sided midfielder who joined the Town in 2010 from St

Albans and made his debut as a substitute in an FA Cup tie against Corby later that year. After successful loan spells at Thurrock and Hampton & Richmond, he penned a three-year contract last summer. Aged 21.

18 Dave Martin

Left-winger who signed for the Hatters in January this year and went onto score three times in 16 league appearances for the club. He was rewarded for his fine performances with a new two-year deal this summer. The 28-year-old was previously with Dartford, Crystal Palace, Millwall, Derby and Southend United.

19 Joe Davis

Young central defender on loan from Port Vale until 4th January. Played 19 times for the Valiants, having risen through the ranks at Vale Park.

20 David Viana

Highly-rated Portuguese youth international who signed a one-year contract at Kenilworth Road in late September 2013. The France-born midfielder is capable of playing across the midfield and in an advanced position behind the striker. Has played in the MLS with Salt Lake and been on the books of Spanish giants Atletico Madrid.

21 Luke Guttridge

Influential and experienced central midfielder with over 400 senior appearances to his name who signed for the Hatters in August on a two-year contract. He has twice won promotion whilst with Southend, and also helped Northampton reach the League 2 play-off final last season. The 31-year-old has played for Torquay, Cambridge, Southend, Orient, Colchester, Aldershot and Northampton Town.

22 Shaun Whalley

Attack-minded midfielder or winger who followed Andy Parry to Kenilworth Road on a two-year deal from Southport. The 25-year-old was in inspired form for the Sandgrounders throughout 2012-13, scoring 10 goals and creating many more, and ended the campaign with a string of end-of-season awards.

23 Matt Robinson

Teenage midfielder in his second season at Kenilworth Road having signed from Leicester City. He impressed John Still towards the end of the previous campaign and was rewarded with a new two-year contract this summer.

24 Alfie Mawson

Centre-half on loan from Brentford who has gained experience away from Griffin Park with Maidenhead.

25 Ronnie Henry

Club captain and right-back in his second season with the club. The defender joined the Hatters last summer from Stevenage, who he helped win promotion from the Conference to League 1. Aged 29.

26 Paul Benson

Experienced 33-year-old centre-forward signed on a season-long loan from Swindon Town in August 2013. Helped

Dagenham & Redbridge to two promotions with John Still, scoring over 75 times in the process. Continued to score once he left the Daggers when with Charlton and Swindon. Won League 2 title with Swindon in 2012. A regular opponent of the Bees over the years.

27 Andre Gray

Lightening quick forward who finished last season as the Hatters' leading goalscorer with 20 goals. The young striker made an instant impact when signing from Hinckley in March 2012 and has been capped by England C.

28 Jim Stevenson

Box-to-box 21-year-old midfielder signed in May on a two-year deal from Histon. The youngster scored 11 goals for the Stutes in 2012-13 and ended the campaign as the top goalscorer. The 21-year-old made his full debut as a 17-year-old at Kenilworth Road for Histon in a game the Hatters won 5-1.

30 Alex Lacey

Highly-rated 20-year-old centre-half who made his Town debut as a 17-year-old in the FA Trophy and spent last season on loan with Eastleigh.

31 Jake Woolley

Teenage forward who signed professional forms last summer having impressed the coaching staff with his performances and attitude. Made his debut as a 17-year-old in the FA Trophy, but has also tasted action in the Conference.

32 Brett Longden

First year professional Brett is a right-back by trade and made his mark in pre-season with a fine 30-yard goal against Thurrock. He's another player who has tasted first team experience in the FA Trophy. Aged 18.

33 Jerome Jibodu

Jerome signed his first professional contract this summer. A composed left-back, he made his Hatters debut in the FA Trophy against Skelmersdale last season. Aged 18.

34 Zane Banton

Youth team striker who was rewarded for his performances in the Hatters' development and youth squads to earn a professional contract in September 2013. Made his debut as a second half substitute in the 4-0 win over Woking. Aged 17.

20 FACTS ABOUT LUTON TOWN FC...



Veteran programme contributor James Castle tries on a number of hats today, each more fetching than the last...

1. The club came into existence in April 1885 following the merger of Luton Town Wanderers and Excelsior.
2. It was the first southern club in England to officially turn professional in 1891.
3. The Hatters were a founder member of the Southern League in 1894 and finished second in its first two seasons before joining the Second Division of the Football League in time for the start of the 1897/98 campaign.
4. Town remained a League club for three seasons before financial difficulties, exacerbated by the cost of travelling to away fixtures mainly based in the North, necessitated a return to the Southern League.
5. Luton moved to their current Kenilworth Road ground in 1905 after spending eight years at Dunstable Road.
6. The club remained in the Southern League until 1920 when it became a founder member for the Third Division South, finishing ninth in its first season.
7. Luton scored over a century of League goals for the one and only time to date in 1936/37 on their way to their first League title, The Third Division South championship, exactly a year after they had missed out on promotion after finishing as runners-up to Coventry City by a single point.
8. Striker Joe Payne finished top scorer that season with 55 from 39 games; he also set the individual record for goals scored in one League game the previous campaign, netting 10 in Town's 12-0 defeat of Bristol Rovers in April 1936.
9. Town led the Second Division table on goal average at the cessation of the 1939/40 League campaign, when the season was stopped after three games due to the onset of World War II.
10. The club reached the First Division for the first time in its history in 1954/55, finishing behind champions Birmingham City on goal average.
11. Luton reached The FA Cup Final for the only time to date in 1959 but became the first side to lose to ten men when defeated 2-1 by Nottingham Forest; scorer Roy Dwight suffered a broken leg and, in the days before substitutes were allowed, could not be replaced when he left the field.
12. Player-manager Syd Owen, who had led the side to Wembley after manager Dally Duncan had left the club the previous October, was voted the Football Writers' Footballer of the Year for 1959 in recognition of his efforts.
13. The club remained in the top tier until 1960 but by 1965 had dropped down to the Fourth Division. Their stay was fleeting, with the Hatters winning their second league title in 1968 by five points from nearest rivals Barnsley.
14. Luton returned to the second tier two years later after finishing second behind Orient. Top scorer that season was Malcolm Macdonald who went on to net 49 times in 88 matches, earning himself a £180,000 move to Newcastle United in 1971.
15. The club returned to the top flight in 1974/75 but returned to the Second Division at the end of the season along with Chelsea and Carlisle United after finishing a point behind 19th placed Tottenham Hotspur.
16. Just four games were lost on their way to the Second Division championship in 1982, with Town finishing eight points clear of fierce rivals Watford in second place.
17. An 83rd minute goal by Raddy Antic secured a last-day victory at Manchester City kept the Hatters in the First Division at the end of the following season, whilst at the same time condemning their opponents to relegation.
18. Town secured their first national cup trophy in 1987/88 when they beat Arsenal 3-2 in the League (Littlewoods) Cup Final, courtesy of a last-minute winner from striker Brian Stein.
19. They repeated this feat in 2008/09 with the Football League Trophy, when an extra-time goal from Claude Gnakpa saw them beat Scunthorpe United by the odd goal in five in front of over 55,000 spectators at Wembley.
20. Luton became the first non-League side to beat a top-flight club in The FA Cup away from home since Altrincham beat Birmingham City 1-0 at St. Andrew's, with victory by the same score over Norwich City in January 2013.

LUTON TOWN'S CLASSIC CAMPAIGNS...



Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS selects ten post-war Luton Town 'Classic Campaigns'...

1954/55

Gordon Turner scored 32 goals as Luton Town won promotion to the top-flight for the first time in 1954/55. The Hatters began with a 3-0 victory at home to Nottingham Forest and soared up the Second Division table with six straight wins. Gordon Turner grabbed a hat-trick as Luton trounced Blackburn 7-3 and they triumphed 5-1 at Nottingham Forest. Dally Duncan's side maintained their challenge, slamming four goals past Hull City, Rotherham, Liverpool and Port Vale. Tom Aherne and Shay Dunne were ever-present as Luton pipped Rotherham to the runners-up slot on goal average with a 3-0 win at Doncaster.

1958/59

Luton Town were FA Cup finalists for the first and only time in 1958/59. The Hatters were unbeaten in their opening ten First Division games, trouncing Manchester City 5-1 and scoring four goals past West Ham and Preston. They recovered from a lean spell to beat Arsenal 6-3 and Burnley 6-2, then top scorer Allan Brown netted four goals in a 5-1 demolition of Nottingham Forest but poor results over the closing weeks saw them finish below mid-table. Luton defeated Leeds 5-1, Leicester 4-1, Ipswich 5-2, Blackpool 1-0 and Norwich 1-0 in the FA Cup before Syd Owen's side lost 2-1 to Nottingham Forest in the final.

1967/68

Bruce Rioch netted 24 goals as Luton Town won the Fourth Division title in 1967/68. New captain Terry Branston made his debut as the Hatters kicked off with a 1-1 draw at Wrexham and Ian Buxton arrived from Derby in September. Luton lost just two of their first 18 matches and beat Charlton in the League Cup first round, scoring 27 goals in a run of eight successive wins. Allan Brown's side went top of the table with a 2-0 win at Brentford in February and Keith Allen, Max Dougan, Fred Jardine, John Moore and Ray Whittaker also starred as they remained in pole position, clinching the title with a 4-0 victory over Crewe.

1969/70

Malcolm MacDonald scored 25 times as Luton Town won promotion in 1969/70. The Hatters had narrowly missed promotion the previous season and Bruce Rioch was sold to Aston Villa for a record fee, with Alec Stock signing Malcolm MacDonald, John Ryan and John Collins. Luton were early leaders after remaining unbeaten in their opening 13 matches, recruiting Chris Nicholl from Halifax and Matt Tees from Charlton. Malcolm MacDonald grabbed hat-tricks in 5-0 wins over Bradford City and Reading, with Luton unbeaten in their last six matches and clinching promotion as Third Division runners-up with a 0-0 draw at Mansfield. The title that season being lifted by Jimmy Bloomfield's Orient.

1973/74

Luton Town regained top-flight status after an absence of 14 years in 1973/74. The Hatters recovered from a 4-0 defeat at Nottingham Forest on the opening day to hammer Carlisle 6-1, embarking on an eight-match unbeaten run. Harry Haslam signed Alan West from Burnley and Jimmy Husband from Everton as Luton maintained their promotion challenge. Husband netted a hat-trick in a 3-1 victory over rivals Orient, then leading marksman Barry Butlin scored three in a 4-2 win over Preston. Alan Garner and Bobby Thomson were ever-present and other stars included Peter Anderson and John Ryan as Luton finished runners-up.

1981/82

David Pleat guided Luton Town to the Second Division title in 1981/82. The Hatters had narrowly missed promotion in the previous two years and Tony Greathouse was swapped for Brighton's Brian Horton. They raced to the top by winning their first three games and hammered rivals Watford 4-1, then Steve White scored four times in a 6-0 demolition of Grimsby. Richard Money arrived from Liverpool and was an influential figure as Luton were unbeaten in their last 14 matches. Leading marksman Brian Stein, Mal Donaghy, Kirk Stephens and Steve White were all ever-present as Luton won the title with 88 points.

1987/88

Ray Harford plotted Luton Town's 1988 Littlewoods Cup final triumph. Danny Wilson replaced Peter Nicholas in midfield, while Micky Weir arrived from Hibernian and Mike Newell moved to Leicester. The Hatters won 5-2 at Oxford and Ian Allinson was signed from Stoke in October, with Luton losing just twice in 12 matches including a 7-4 win in the return match against Oxford, finishing ninth in the top-flight. They defeated Wigan 5-2, Coventry 3-1, Ipswich 1-0, Bradford City 2-0 and Oxford 3-1 in the Littlewoods (League) Cup before beating Arsenal 3-2 in the final. Luton were also FA Cup semi-finalists and Simod Cup finalists.

1988/89

Luton Town were Littlewoods Cup finalists for the second consecutive season in 1988/89. Departures were Brian Stein, Mark Stein and Andy Dibble, while newcomers included Roy Wegerle, John Dreyer and Steve Williams. Luton's first home win was 1-0 against Liverpool and they beat Southampton 6-1 in January but First Division form was generally disappointing, with the Hatters narrowly avoiding relegation by winning three of their last four games. Luton defeated Burnley 2-1, Leeds 2-0, Manchester City 3-1, Southampton 2-1 and West Ham 5-0 in the Littlewoods Cup before losing 3-1 to Nottingham Forest in the final.

2001/02

Steve Howard scored 24 times as Luton Town won promotion in 2001/02. Joe Kinnear's side were early leaders after winning their opening two matches and newcomer Carl Griffiths netted a hat-trick in a 5-1 win over Torquay. The Hatters briefly regained pole position after beating Darlington 5-2 in October, signing Chris Coyne from Dundee, Jean-Louis Vailois from Lille, Dean Crowe from Stoke, Ahmet Brkovic from Orient and Dave Bayliss from Rochdale. A run of 12 successive wins, slamming five goals past Halifax and Mansfield, took Luton back to the top with two games remaining but they finished runners-up to Plymouth.

2004/05

Mike Newell managed Luton Town to the League One title in 2004/05. The Hatters stormed to the top of the table, winning 10 of their first 12 games before three successive defeats. They beat Bradford City 4-0 and Wrexham 5-1, then Steve Howard netted a hat-trick in a 4-1 win at MK Dons. The 1-0 victory over Port Vale in December heralded a 14 match unbeaten run and Luton bounced back from a 3-1 defeat in the return fixture to hammer Bristol City 5-0. Briefly displaced as leaders by Hull, they triumphed 4-1 at Torquay and secured promotion with four games remaining. Luton won the title with a record 98 points.

Some years ago, further back than I care to mention, I saw Luton play at Stamford Bridge, then a few years later at Highbury. Despite this, the Hatters created a plastic pitch and went on to win the Littlewoods Cup. My extensive research even unearthed an appearance at Wembley for the Simod Cup. No, me neither...

ALL HAIL GUS CAESER...


“The Littlewoods Cup Final that year was a disaster”. Not the perspective of Hatters’ fans certainly, but the view of Nick Hornby. One that I share clearly, although Nick is unlikely to recall me holding a door for him at Highbury; yet he vividly remembers Gus on the 24th of April 1988. “Caesar leaves it late, but when the ball is knocked into the box seven minutes from time, he miskicks so violently that he falls over; at this point he looks like someone who has won a competition to appear as a centre-half in a Wembley final, and not like a professional footballer at all, and in the ensuing chaos Danny Wilson stoops to head the ball over the line for Luton’s equaliser” Some years later, when Fever Pitch was dramatised, there was even a Gus Caesar Rap. Not many professionals can brag of that. 2Pac never paid tribute to Kelly Haag for instance. The production even played such respected venues as Ystradgynlais Welfare Hall, and the Bull in Barnet. But Gus, if you’re reading this, I’ve finally achieved closure and forgiven you...just about....

(Luton deserved to win on the day. I was there. Great match. Ed.)

KENILWORTH ROAD...

My first visit to Kenilworth Road was as a neutral, sitting in the Main Stand although the Bees have made the journey a few times in recent years, and our friends from Hendon also found Mill Hill Broadway handy when

they travelled up there for an FA Cup tie a few seasons ago. The first competitive match at the stadium in 1905 was known as the “Green Game.” Plymouth Argyle were the opponents, a local brewer named Mr Green kicked off, and both the Town secretary and the referee that day were called Green. If there is ever a recreation, I am sure that Professor Green will provide the soundtrack.



PLAYED FOR BOTH...

Brian Stein was a Kenilworth Road favourite. Starting his career around the corner from here at Edgware Town, he went on to enjoy two spells at Luton, the first of which gained him England recognition. A career

total of 130 goals is a handsome one and he formed productive partnerships with both Mick Harford, Paul Walsh and his brother Mark. Inevitably in 1983, Brian played on the day of the great relegation escape, when David Pleat danced with such abandon. The Capetown dynasty also produced striker Mark Stein, who himself had a spell as Barnet’s Physio under Paul Fairclough and Ian Hendon. In the wonderfully understated words of Wikipedia, it states that there was another brother who played for Barnet, by the name of Ed Stein. There are countless tales behind that statement, and Brian himself went on to join the Bees, making 40 appearances before his retirement. Like Eddie, he was a character, and I am sure there is a Reckless profile coming on...

Manager: John Leonard Still needs no introduction to Bees fans as he was manager at Underhill from June 1997 to February 2002. John's playing career ended at the age of 26 due to a knee injury but he has been a successful coach and gaffer for over 35 years with notably Peterborough, Maidstone United, Dagenham & Redbridge, Barnet and now Luton Town. His current right hand man is another ex Bee in Hakan Hayrettin.

Brief Directions by Road: Leave the M1 at its Junction 11 and take the A505 signposted Luton. Option 1: Follow the A505 for approximately 1.5 miles and Kenilworth Road is on your right as you leave the one-way system along Dunstable Road. To park, follow the one-way around, turning left, right and right again all in about 100 yards so that you do a complete U-turn and then take the second left into Ash Road. Continue down to the bottom, turn left at the end and the club is in front of you. Option 2: From the A505, go through one set of traffic lights to the 1st roundabout and turn right into Chaul End Lane. At the next roundabout turn left into Hatters Way. Continue down Hatters Way and you will see the ground's floodlights on your left. Please note however that the ground is not accessible from this road. At the end of Hatters Way turn left and begin your search for street parking.

Car Parking: Please note that there is a residents' only parking scheme in operation near to the ground, so you will have to travel a little further away to find street parking. It is available, trust me!

Directions by Train: Luton train station is a brisk 15 minutes walk from the stadium. From the station, turn right into Station Road which runs into Mill Street. At the junction, turn left into Telford Way and right into Dunstable Road. Oak Road is the fifth on the left after approximately a third of a mile. These directions are courtesy of LTFC.

Eating and Drinking Locally: I am told.....The Beech Hill Conservative Club on Leagrave Road, which welcomes both home and away supporters, is the best bet for a pre-match drink although time is limited due to the early kick off time. To find the club with the away entrance in front of you, turn left and walk down to the bottom of Oak Road. Proceed through the small arcade of shops opposite and you will see the sign for the club between two shops. Directions courtesy of LTFC.

Social Club: There are no Social Club facilities for visiting fans at Kenilworth Road apart from the Luton Bobbers Club which will allow a small number of away fans who are quite heavily

supervised while in the club.

Ground Description: New grounds are springing up everywhere with space galore. However the word cramped has been used at many grounds over the years, Underhill included, but at Kenilworth Road you will really appreciate the word cramped! But it is glorious for those who love vintage football grounds. The existing Main Stand dates from the 1920s and was purchased allegedly from Kempton Park Racecourse. Alongside it sits the Family Stand built in 1991 with seats for 700. The narrow stand opposite was originally erected in 1933 and was given the name of the Bobbers stand; 1/- (one shilling or a bob) was the price at the turnstile. To those under the age of 37 that was 5 pence! It was made all seated in 1977 and the executive boxes which adorn it were developed in 1986. To the right of the main stand is the home fan stronghold, the fully covered Kenilworth Stand which was originally a tall open bank of terracing. The entrance to the away enclosure - The Oak Road Stand - is without doubt the most unusual in the country. After walking down a dark alleyway, one basically queues above back gardens before entering the stand! It can accommodate 1,800 fans on a shallow rake of seating. The leg room is tight and several pillars obstruct the view but the acoustics are superb for the vocal fraternity. Overall ground capacity around 11,000, all seated.

Admission Prices: Adults £18, Concessions £13, Over 75s £10, U16s, U10s £5.

Rivals: Watford and Watford Reserves

Previous Meetings and Memories: Our only visit to Luton Town in the League was in December 2008 when the following side went down 3-1 with a goal from Abu Ogogo (who was sent off moments after scoring). The line-up: Beckwith, Ogogo, De Magalhaes, Leary, Gillet, Adomah, Townsend, Bishop, Birchall, Akurang and O'Flynn. Subs: Kadoc, Yakubu, Deverdics, Porter and Medley.



WHAT'S IN a name? Not a lot if you're one of the myriad of Non-League and lower Football League players who share the same christian and surnames, but it can get confusing.

Take last Saturday for example. I get the St Albans City teamsheet for their FA Trophy second round tie with Cambridge United at Clarence Park, and find that Danny Green is on the bench - but then he's not, as striker Mark Nwokeji feels an injury in the warm-up and the two swap places.

Now, is this the Danny Green who John Still plucked from Bishop's Stortford's right-wing when he was Dagenham & Redbridge manager, and turned him into a League One player?

Or is it the 'other' Danny Green who went from Billericay to Dagenham a year later, and who also played on the right flank, and had been at Bishop's Stortford previously.

No, because the first is now at Charlton Athletic, the second is at Maidenhead and a local reporter informs me that this one came from Harpenden Town, has spent time on loan at Potters Bar Town this term and plays right-back or central midfield. But, lo and behold, he comes into the team on the right wing!

These lads' stats have all probably merged into one on the internet – and there are others, like the two Mike Greens who both play for Gloucester City, or the father-son, manager-player combinations we've seen over the years with the Craig Edwards at Grays, Chelmsford and Billericay, and Chris Kinnears at Dover.

There are the two Steve Browns who have both managed or coached at Dover, and it must be something about the name Danny, because boy, just like with the Greens I've had trouble with the two Danny Rowes up north.

It doesn't help that these same-namers tend to frequent the same part of the country, and often the same clubs.

So one Danny Rowe has played up front for Barrow and Stockport - and so has the other!

Oh what fun it was to try and decipher which was which when they were both at County and going by the names of Danny L Rowe and Danny M Rowe.

One is now at Lincoln City, and I think it was the one I once interviewed in the middle of a purple patch at Edgeley Park about his formative years at Manchester United.

The other, last Sunday's copy of The NLP informed me, came on as sub in Macclesfield's 1-0 win over Salisbury.

But who the 'L' is who I have not really got a clue!

THE OTHER name game I like are the famous names – or ones very similar – in the Non-League ranks.

I was impressed by Stourbridge left-back Jamie Oliver at Stevenage recently. Thankfully he kept his clothes on, but couldn't come up with a recipe for 15 minutes of FA Cup fame.

Another one who starred in this year's qualifying rounds is Brighouse Town's Nick Jaggar, while Jason Bourne has reigned supreme during Tunbridge Wells' recent FA Vase efforts.

At Chester we used to have the original Mark Wright and David Cameron, as manager and striker respectively, while the various Non-League versions of Michael Jackson and Robbie Williams have provided plenty of entertaining headlines over the years.

Players Jon Nurse, Luke Gambin, Carl Fletcher, George Sykes, Iffy Allen, Ahmed Abdulla and Mauro Vilhete, along with mascot Mr Bumble and Father Christmas, were all on hand to deliver presents to youngsters on the renamed Galaxy ward before visiting the hospital's new Starlight neonatal unit.

The footballers were accompanied by pupils from Latymer School in Edmonton, who are part of the hospital's youth advisory group.

Nicky Evans, Head of Children's Nursing at the hospital, said: "It was great to see the team come along and visit the children and babies.

The club and the community cannot work without each other so it is vital to give something back, especially at Christmas time."

MATCHDAY DRAW...






To be back in The Football League and be challenging at the top end of the table instead of fighting against relegation and also to be playing back in Barnet, hopefully at South Underhill.



Key Personnel: Everybody knows that midfielder Mikey Harris is Salisbury manager and is the youngest manager in the World! He took over after being assistant manager in the summer of 2013.

Brief Directions by Road: The ground is situated north of Salisbury, near to the A345. From the M3 and then on to the wonderful A303 Road, which eventually passes Stonehenge (well worth a small detour if you have time) turn onto the A345 signposted Amesbury. Stay on this road which is now signposted Salisbury into open countryside for around 4 miles. The road becomes Four Mile Hill and at a roundabout, bear left into Portway and follow signs to Salisbury FC. Take the first left into Partridge Way where you find the ground car park.

Car Park: Pot Hole City according to the locals! The car park at the ground has plenty of room for £2.00 per car. Street parking locally is allowed too.

Directions by Train: Salisbury station is located just less than three miles away from the stadium and a cab is frankly your best options as the ground is in the outskirts of the City. It is served by trains from London Waterloo. The number 8 bus from the city centre serves the ground.

Eating and Drinking Locally: The Harvester outlet The Old Castle, Old Castle Road, Salisbury SP1 3SF is the nearest pub to the stadium which is still a good mile from Partridge Way. Otherwise, very little on offer close by. In the city centre the Reckless Recommendation is the Coach & Horses, 39 Winchester Street, Salisbury, SP1 1HG – the home of the Gourmet Burger. A seriously superb menu of homemade burgers and sandwiches and well worth a visit if you have the time for lunch before the game. You will not be disappointed! <http://www.coachandhorsessalisbury.co.uk>

The Social Club: The Social club is open to all and serves a selection of bar food. We will be made more than welcome.

Ground Description: An unusual arena for this level which was opened in 1999 as the main stand is really just a section of seating in front of the club office facilities, a smaller version of the Hive's East Stand. The area has a covered terrace to its left which wraps behind one goal. The opposite end is an open terrace, The Partridge Terrace, which is usually allocated to visitors with a small section of seats opposite the main stand if required. This area is called the Hop Back Side. The ground has a surprising capacity of around 4,000 with seating for approx 500.

Admission Prices: Adults £14, Concessions £12, Students £10.

Previous Meetings and Memories: Our meetings in the old Southern League First Division South 1976-77 season were probably the most memorable as Barnet and City were front runners for most of the season. The Bees of course won the title that year - featuring the likes of household names in John Fairbrother, Dennis Brown, Les Eason, Bob McNab, Marvin Hinton and Terry Mancini - but the two games both finished 1-0 to the home clubs.

Celebrity Watch: Actor Ralph Fiennes has been spotted at the M&S in the city centre a few times as he has relatives locally. Toyah Wilcox, who I have had the pleasure to back with my band at the East Finchley British legion in the 1970's, lives close by as does Sting! Other celebs of note include Michael Crawford, Christopher Biggins, Rod Hull and the 1960s pop superstars Dave, Dee, Dozy, Beaky, Mick and Titch. (Robert Fripp must therefore be in this neck of the woods also. Ed.)
