From the Boardroom...

GOOD AFTERNOON and a very warm welcome to you all especially those of you who have travelled some way to the match today.

I know many of you will be visiting family and friends for Christmas and some will have made the trip from Luton this morning.

I'd like to thank you for supporting the team and want to wish you all a Happy New Year. Looking back on the calendar year and the team had a lot of success at the start of the season. I'm sure we'll be able to replicate that in 2014.

At Lincolnshire Co-op we've had a good year again, but also were able to celebrate Christmas and help some of those less fortunate than ourselves.

We donated more than £4,500 worth of food in £250 packages to over 18 food banks. Each pack featured over 418 products including 24 tins of peas 12 jars of pasta sauce 12 bags of porridge oats and 24 litres of UHT milk.

Food Banks are designed to help people experiencing a short term crisis. Care agencies give a client a voucher which is handed over at a local food bank in return for 3 days' worth of food.

More than 80 local good causes will share a Christmas gift of £33,956 thanks to members of Lincolnshire Co-op using their dividend card when they spend.

Scout troops, churches and gymnastics clubs are among the groups receiving a portion of the cash after their three-month stint as a Community Champion.

The Community Champions scheme sees every one of the Society's 228,000 members linked to a good cause close to where they live.

Between September and December, every time they've

used their dividend card in any Lincolnshire Co-op outlet where points are issued a donation from the Community Champions pot has gone towards their local good cause.

The Community Champions can now put the money towards their projects.

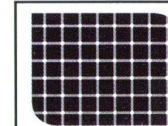

Here's what some Community Champions have raised:

- Members raised £326 for Branston and Washingborough LIVES group to buy equipment including defibrillators, thermometers, pulse oximeters and oxygen bags.
- Members raised £793 for the Nettleham Woodland Trust to buy grass and wildflower seeds and a petrol driven strimmer.
- Members raised £529 for West Rasen Village Hall and Heritage Centre to go towards the cost of painting the outside of the building.

Once again thank you all for your support this year. As always with football, 2013 has been a year of ups and downs but I'm sure 2014 will be a year full of success for Lincoln City.

Along with Callum Ward and Alex Simmons who have also been involved in recent weeks, I think Kegan is going to be one for the future so it was pleasing to give him his first chance on what was a big stage for such a young kid.

The Board have made some money available so I can strengthen my squad and at the time of writing it was looking promising that some fresh blood would be coming in in time for today's game. If there are some new faces out there then please give them your full support as I know you will.

All games are tough at this stage of the season but if the lads show the same spirit, strength and will as they did on New Year's Day then I'm sure they will be rewarded with results.

SAFETY MESSAGE

Following our fixture at Barnet on Saturday 14 September 2013, a 15-year-old supporter has been arrested and charged for being in possession and throwing a smoke bomb within the away stand.

Lincoln City Football Club advises that it adopts and enforces a clear policy to prevent and prohibit spectators from taking a flare, smoke emitter or fireworks into Sports Grounds.

A reminder to all Imps' fans, be it at home or travelling away, anyone seen in possession or seen to throw a flare or smoke bomb is liable to arrest and a subsequent banning order. Football clubs and police forces around the country are taking a zero tolerance approach on all related matters.

The Sporting Events Control of Alcohol Act 1985 (as amended by the Public Order Act 1986) makes it an offence for a person to have in their possession any firework / flare / smoke emitter / etc whilst attempting to enter or whilst in a football ground and provides police with the power to search people and to arrest persons committing offences under the Act.

Supporters are also reminded that Gelder Group Sincil Bank Stadium is a no smoking stadium and anyone found smoking will be ejected and liable to a stadium banning order. Imps' fans will be aware more than most of the reasons for non smoking stadiums after the tragic events at Bradford in 1985.

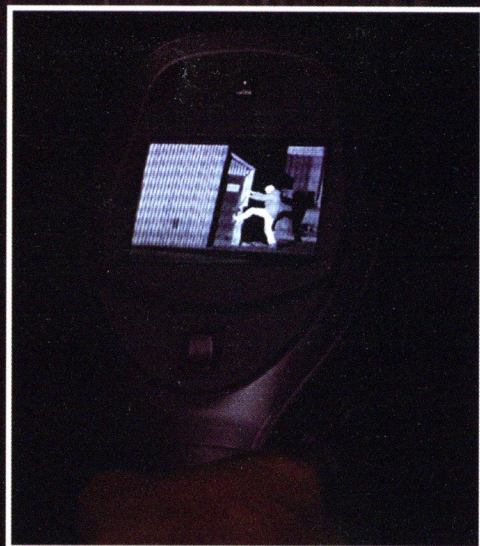

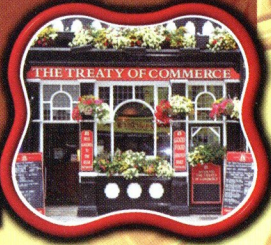

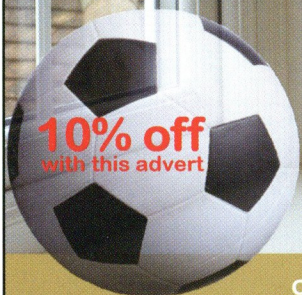

1950 Frank McMahon born Belfast born midfielder who began his career with Distillery before crossing the Irish Sea and joining Coventry in 1969. He failed to make an appearance for the Sky Blue's and was playing for Waterford when David Herd signed him for the Imps in July 1971.

He scored twice in 54+1 Football League apps for us over the next season and a half but rarely figured once Graham Taylor took over as manager.

He joined Darlington in March 1973 (with Alan Harding coming here as part of the deal) but made just 19+1 FL apps (1 goal) for the Quakers with another seven on loan Hartlepool before leaving League football and spending time in the south west with Yeovil Town, Bath City and Taunton Town where he was manager.

He later moved to America where he has run a bar and coached in New Jersey.



1915 Len Beaumont born

Huddersfield born winger who made five wartime appearances, scoring once on his debut, in 1944/45. Pre-war he had scored seven times in 52 appearances for Huddersfield, Portsmouth and Nottingham Forest. He died in 2002.

1936 James Fell born Cleethorpes born winger who joined Grimsby Town in 1953 but had to wait until after doing his National Service before making his goalscoring debut against Fulham in March 1957.

He quickly established himself in the Mariners side going on to score 35 goals in 166 Football League appearances and was even described as an "up and coming Stanley Matthews" after starring in a 7-0 away win at Bristol Rovers. In March 1961 he moved to Everton for a fee of £18,500 but stayed for just one two year (27 FL apps, 4 goals) before joining Newcastle United.

Again it was brief spell as despite being joint top scorer in his second season with 15 goals (in total he scored 16 in 49 FL apps)

he was released and signed for Walsall for £5,000. The Saddlers were struggling though and he spent less than six months there (scoring four times 21 apps) before he moved to Sincil Bank in January 1964. A regular in his first two seasons he eventually totalled 64 FL apps (10 goals) as an Imp before spells at various local non-League sides.

He was still playing Sunday League football in Grimsby until well into his forties as well as local cricket. He worked at Grimsby Leisure centre until his retirement and died in the town in 2011.

1955 Bobby Mitchell born

South Shields born midfielder who began his pro career at Sunderland in 1973 but had made just 1+2 Football League apps for them before joining Blackburn Rovers in July 1976. His 17+12 FL apps at Ewood Park saw him score six goals ahead of a move to Blundell Park where he linked up with George Kerr, a partnership that was renewed at three more clubs. He scored six times in 142 apps for the Mariners, winning promotion in successive seasons with them.

A brief spell followed at Carlisle (2 apps) before rejoining Kerr at Rotherham United in March 1983. The Millers were relegated in his first season there and after two more moderate seasons (86+9 FL apps, 2 goals) he moved to Hamrun in Malta. Kerr made him one of his first signings at Sincil Bank in January 1986 but the club was in a downward spiral and successive relegations saw us crash out of the League. Mitchell made 41+3 apps for us (2 goals) before being one of the many released after relegation and later played for Louth United, Boston United (again under Kerr) and Spalding United.

1982 Richard Logan born

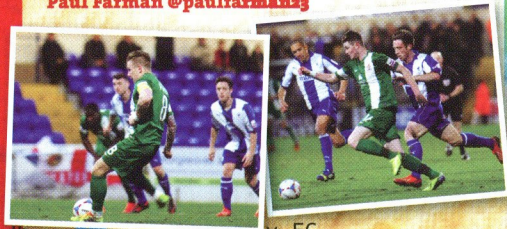

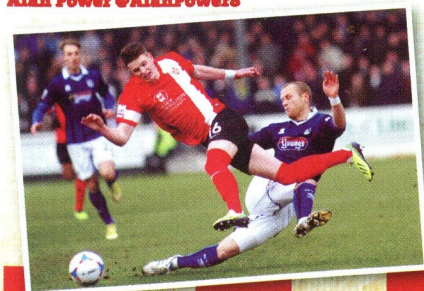

Raw, powerful centre-forward with pace to boot, who became John Still's first signing at Kenilworth Road having joined from Maidenhead last season. He scored his first goals for the Hatters when both hitting both goals in a 2-0 win over Ebbsfleet in April.

Mark Cullen

Young striker signed on a two-year deal following his release from Premier League-bound Hull City. A clever, poacher of a forward, Cullen impressed the manager with two fine performances against the Hatters whilst on loan at Stockport. Given his debut for Hull in the Premier League, he scored on his full debut for the Tigers whilst in the top flight.

Andre Gray

Lightening quick forward who finished last season as the Hatters' leading goalscorer with 20 goals. The young striker made an instant impact when signing from Hinckley in March 2012 and has been capped by England C.

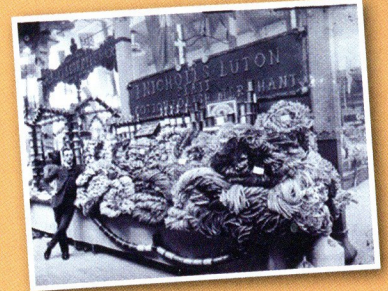
Paul Benson

Experienced centre-forward signed on a season-long loan from Swindon in August 2013. Helped Dagenham & Redbridge to two promotions with John Still, scoring over 75 times in the process. Continued to score once he left the Daggers when with Charlton and Swindon. Won League 2 title with Swindon in 2012.

LUTON TOWN:

A BLUFFER'S GUIDE

Why are Luton known as the Hatters? Plaiting and straw hat making were very popular in Luton in the 19th Century. Plaits used to be imported from Italy but the Napoleonic wars stopped that and a Luton businessman, Thomas Waller, started buying them from prisoners of war and the people in and around the town who plaited. You don't find that sort of information in many football programmes by the way.



When were the club formed? 11th April 1885, and they made quick progress. In 1891 Luton became the first club in southern England to be fully professional. The club was a founder member of the Southern Football before joining The Football League for 1897-98, although they returned to the Southern League for the 1900-01 season for financial reasons.

How long have then been at Kenilworth Road? Since 1905. They were there when they got back into the Football League in 1920-21 and for their best pre-match season of 1936-37, when the team finished top and won promotion to the Second Division. **Joe Payne** was the star in those days: he scored ten goals in one match against Bristol Rovers, which remains a Football League record.



Other than their golden era in the 1980s what other memorable moments did they have? The 50s were a great period - they reached the FA Cup Final against Nottingham Forest in 1958-59 but by 1964-65, were playing in the fourth tier. The 70's saw stars such as Bruce Rioch and Malcolm Macdonald while comedy legend Eric Morecambe's spell on the board kept them in the public eye.

But the 80s were the best years... Yes. David Pleat had played for the Hatters and was made manager in 1978. By 1982-83 the team was back in the top flight. Stars such as Ricky Hill, Brian Stein, Steve Foster, Mal Donaghy and Les Sealey shone as Luton relished life at the top. Pleat dancing across the pitch at Man City after Raddy Antic scored to keep them up, and a dramatic Wembley League Cup final win over Arsenal remain iconic moments in their history.

What happened after that? The club was relegated from the top division at the end of the 1991-92 season and were back in the third tier four years later Luton stayed in the old Second Division until relegation at the end of the 2000-01 season. Joe Kinnear helped them win promotion to rise again but administration and point deductions followed and despite winning the Football League Trophy they were relegated to the Conference.

They have been in the promotion play-offs three times and remain arguably the biggest club playing at this level.
