JOHN STILL



Good evening and welcome back to you all for this FA Trophy third round replay against Cambridge United.

I would like to wish a warm welcome to those who have made the short trip from Cambridge, including manager Richard Money and first team coach Alan Neilson, as well as the players, directors and supporters of the U's.

Anybody who witnessed Saturday's game will have been impressed by the desire of both clubs to win the game at the weekend. It was an exciting, proper old-fashioned cup tie in which both clubs gave their all. It was a fabulous advert for the competition and if tonight's replay is half as good as Saturday's game then we're in for a treat.

I think both clubs can look on their afternoon's work with real satisfaction having given 100 per cent for the cause.

Naturally it is disappointing to have let a two-goal lead slip but the performance from the team was excellent, especially considering a number of the players were returning to senior first team football for the first time in a while.

In the grand scheme of things we felt it was necessary to play those players who needed time on the pitch. Anthony Charles, Ryan Inniss, Solomon Taiwo and Kane Ferdinand all completed 90 minutes, while Jon Shaw and Alex Wall both got a significant amount of game-time. We now know that the winners of tonight's replay face a quarter final tie away to Skrill South Eastleigh. The Spittfires are second in their division so whoever progresses this evening will have another big test.



The group of players who have taken part in the FA Trophy for us this season have done magnificently for us and, should we get through, a quarter final place will be a great reward for the players.

Looking back at our last league fixture we earned a hard-earned point from a goalless draw at Lincoln last week.

In difficult conditions we could have snatched all three points but all things considered, a point was very welcome.

It ended an excellent run of results over the tough festive period, which included important victories over Gateshead, Kidderminster and twice against Barnet.

The performances and results over the Christmas and New Year period were hugely encouraging, and they were the result of hard work on the training ground by everyone. 

CAMBRIDGE 2-2 TOWN

A much-changed Town surrendered a 2-0 lead to draw with promotion rivals Cambridge in a thrilling FA Trophy tie at the Abbey Stadium.

With just captain Jake Howells keeping his place in the Town side, it was a total of 10 changes that John Still made and one of those had the Hatters in front inside five minutes when Shaun Whalley's inswinging free-kick was met by a thumping header by Ryan Inniss – scoring with his first touch for the club having arrived on-loan from Crystal Palace on Friday.

A minute later Elliot Justham was tested for the first time, getting down well to his right to keep out a low shot from Harrison Dunk.

The Hatters should have doubled their lead on 12 minutes when an unmarked Anthony Charles headed over the crossbar from six yards following Solomon Taiwo's pin-point right-wing cross.

Justham dealt with a low shot from Nathan Arnold on 24 minutes before the Town keeper then stopped another effort from the same player four minutes later.

The Town came close to doubling their lead when Mark Cullen's shot from 12 yards was tipped over in unorthodox fashion by home stopper John Sullivan.

As half-time approached, United got the opportunity to notch from 12 yards. Howells was adjudged to have handled a goal-bound shot from Arnold and a penalty was awarded.

However, former Hatter Greg Taylor saw his spot-kick strike the foot of the post.

But, just like in the first half, the Hatters struck early and doubled their lead three minutes after the restart. Kane Ferdinand was the architect, robbing Michael Spillane of the ball down the left and he looked up to spot the unmarked Wall in the six yard box and the striker headed home.

The Hatters came close to making it 3-0 on 62 minutes when Wall showed great pace and power to set-up substitute Jon Shaw to hammer a shot at goal that was clawed away well by Sullivan.

It was end-to-end as both sides traded chances. Ashley Chambers fired over for United, as did Cullen at the other end. Justham again did well on 67 minutes, getting down to his right to prevent Dunk's low shot from finding the target. A minute later Chambers then sent a low shot skimming inches wide of the target.

But the pressure from the home side was slowly building again, though, and on 73 minutes Dunk's cross was headed home by Tom Elliott at the back post to get United to within one goal of the Hatters.

And, less than 60 seconds later, Cambridge completed the turnaround to equalise when Chambers was sent through and he kept his composure to beat Justham with a fine finish. All of a sudden it was all United. Dunk sent a rasping shot over the bar moments later.

Back came the Town, Ferdinand unable to get past Sullivan on 80 minutes, Whalley unable to find Cullen for the chance to shoot, before Howells twice came close to making it 3-2 when curling a free-kick wide on 84 minutes and thumping a shot over two minutes later.

As time ticked towards the final few moments, Elliott saw a shot deflected just wide on 87 minutes before Luke Berry headed over a minute later as the hosts pressed for a late winner. United came even closer in the first minute of three added when Liam Hughes' rasping free-kick came back off the post and bounced to safety.

And the Town defence stood firm in the final few moments as Cambridge came closer to finding a winner with Justham brilliantly denying Chambers twice before Arnold struck the outside of the post with the last kick of the game.



welcome

CAMBRIDGE UNITED



After Saturday's pulsating 2-2 draw at the Abbey Stadium it is with pleasure that we welcome Cambridge United back to Kenilworth Road for what will be the second time this season.

Since United's last visit – a goalless draw on August Bank Holiday – Richard Money's side have enjoyed a fine season in the Skrill Premier and, up until a fortnight ago, had been clear at the top of the table.

United sit five points behind the Hatters in the standings but have three games in hand which, if they were to win, would take them back to the summit where they had been for so long this term.

Cambridge's season has been built around an impregnable home record at the Abbey Stadium. The U's have won all 12 of their Skrill Premier fixtures on home turf and have conceded just two goals. It is the best home record in the country.

In all competitions, only League 1 Sheffield United have won at the Abbey this season so for a much-changed Town side to earn tonight's replay following Saturday's 2-2 draw is a testament to the performance by John Still's side at the weekend.

Saturday saw the third successive draw between the two clubs and, overall, a draw has been the most common result in the games between the teams down the years. Just under half of the 29 meetings have ended all square whilst the Town have the upper

hand when it comes to recording victories with nine to Cambridge's seven.

United last tasted success at Kenilworth Road in September 2011 in what was then the Blue Square Premier. A Rory McAuley goal gave the U's all three points – their first ever league victory over the Town.

In fact tonight's visitors have won on their last two visits to Kenilworth Road in cup competitions.

An extra-time golden goal win in the LDV Vans Trophy came in 2002 with a certain Luke Guttridge scoring the winner for Cambridge.

And in 1993 another former Hatter inflicted defeat on the Town when Steve Claridge scored in a 1-0 win at Kenilworth Road in a League Cup first round second leg tie.

Guttridge and Claridge are two of a whole host of players who have played for both clubs and the connections in both squads are still evident today. United have former Town men Michael Spillane, recent recruit Matthew Barnes-Homer and Gregg Taylor in their current ranks. The U's, of course, have Money at the helm and Alan Neilson as assistant manager.

The main focus for both clubs is a return to the Football League but tonight the only thing on the minds of both is a place in the last eight of the FA Trophy. The Town have reached the quarter-finals of the competition for the last three seasons, twice reaching the last four.

MEET THE CAMBRIDGE UNITED SQUAD

THE MANAGER

RICHARD MONEY. No stranger to Kenilworth Road, Richard managed the Town between October 2010 and March 2012. Previously in charge at Walsall, he took over as the U's head coach in October 2012. A defender in his playing days also at Kenilworth Road as well as with Liverpool, Fulham, Derby and Portsmouth.

GOALKEEPERS

JOHN SULLIVAN. Stopper who arrived on loan at the Abbey Stadium two weeks ago from League 2 side Portsmouth. Began his career with Brighton before spells at Millwall and Charlton. Played seven games for Pompey this season before falling out of favour.

WILL NORRIS. Young goalkeeper plucked from Royston Town in July 2012. Spent last season back on loan with Royston to garner further experience and also one month earlier in this campaign before returning to fight for a first team place.

DEFENDERS

KEVIN ROBERTS. Dependable right-back who has since made 100 appearances for the U's since signing from Chester in January 2010 and was player of the year in 2011/12.

JOSH COULSON. Centre-back and the U's longest-serving player. A local lad, Josh is a product of United's academy.

RORY McAULEY. England C international centre-half who has risen through the ranks at the Abbey Stadium. Also able to play at full-back or in central midfield.

RICHARD TAIT. Former Nottingham Forest trainee who signed this summer from Tamworth. The right-back made 160 appearances for the Lambs and was their captain.

TOM BONNER. Summer arrival from Dartford, the former QPR scholar was a virtual ever-present last season. Capped at Under-16 level for Scotland he helped the Darts to promotion in 2012.

IAN MILLER. Commanding centre-half signed a two-year deal this summer after leaving Grimsby. The experienced defender has also won the FA Trophy whilst with Darlington.

GREG TAYLOR. No stranger to Kenilworth Road, Bedford-born Taylor joined the U's this summer following his release from the Town. Formerly with Darlington and Kettering.

MIDFIELDERS

HARRISON DUNK. Left-winger and fans' favourite who signed for the U's from Bromley at the start of last summer and scored on his home debut against Telford.

LUKE BERRY. Box-to-box midfielder who has risen through the U's youth ranks to become a first team regular. England C international who has twice been named young player of the year.

LUKE ALLEN. Former Tottenham trainee who joined the U's youth set-up before signing his first professional contract last summer. Spent last season on loan at Cambridge City.

TOM CHAMPION. Joined team-mate Bonner at the Abbey Stadium this summer from Dartford. Won the Conference with Barnet in 2005 before helping the Darts to Conference South Play-Off glory in 2012.

RYAN DONALDSON. Former Newcastle trainee who signed this summer from Gateshead. The former England youth international can also play on either flank or in a central position in attack.

LIAM HUGHES. Another product of United's academy, the attacking midfielder has made the transition from a defender to be a vital part of the U's squad.

NATHAN ARNOLD. Close-season arrival from Alfreton. He scored 32 goals in 131 games for the Reds and can play on either flank or in a central role.

STRIKERS

TOM ELLIOTT. Towering centre-forward signed from Stockport last summer. A former England under-18 international, the pacey striker came through the ranks at Leeds United.


ADAM CUNNINGTON. Proven Conference goalscorer who moved from Tamworth. Hit 21 goals for the Lambs last season and signed a two-year deal with the U's.

ASHLEY CHAMBERS. Striker or winger who arrived at the Abbey last week on a permanent deal from York City. An England Youth international, he started his career with Leicester but made his name with York – scoring against the Hatters in the 2012 Play-Off final at Wembley.

MATTHEW BARNES-HOMER. Cup-tied tonight but a former Hatters striker who also joined the U's last week. Spent last season with Macclesfield, finishing the Silkmen's top goalscorer but joined Forest Green this summer. Failed to settle in Gloucestershire before signing for United.


