
BORO NEWS & REVIEWS




WELCOME TO LUTON TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB

FOUNDED in 1885 through the merger of Luton Town Wanderers and Exelsior, they began life at the latter's Dallow Lane Ground.

Luton were trailblazers in the south of the country, first offering payments to players in 1890 before becoming the first club in Southern England to go fully professional a year later.

Initially a founder member of the Southern Football League, they joined



the mostly northern based Football League in 1897. Leading a nomadic existence in their early years, Luton played at Dunstable Road for eight years before finally settling into life at Kenilworth Road in 1905.

After several years in the lower echelons of League football, Luton reached the top flight of the English game for the first time in 1956 and reached the FA Cup final three seasons later. But relegation soon followed and a dramatic drop down the divisions saw them returning to the Fourth division by 1964. The first of their resurgences followed, and within a decade they had returned to the top table.

After another spell out of the top flight David Pleat managed them back there, and famously danced on the pitch at Maine Road as they won on the final day of the season to survive, relegating City



at the same time. Their highest ever League placing followed soon after with a 7th place finish, as well as lifting the League Cup in 1988.

Dropping out of the top flight in 1992 they again dropped to the third tier. Various on and off field problems followed eventually leaving them to start the 2008/9 season on minus 30 points, and an insurmountable hurdle to remain in the Football League – but bowing out with a JPT final win at Wembley.

The conference years have seen Luton perennially in and around the play-offs, finishing in the top five three times in four seasons.


This season they arrive at the Sperrin Brewery Stadium eight points clear at the top of the division. Determined not to face the lottery of the play-offs again, they arrive on the back of a 22 match unbeaten run which includes a 3-0 win over Boro at the end of January.

Their last game saw them hit seven against Hereford United at Kenilworth Road thanks to goals from Goals from Paul Benson, Pelly Ruddock Mpanzu, Jake Howells, Alex Lawless and an Andre Gray hat-trick.

Luton Town received a boost this week when they announced that Norwich City's FA Youth Cup winning skipper, Cameron McGeehan, will stay with The Hatters on loan until the end of the season. The 18-year-old's original loan expired after last weekend's win against Hereford but Hatters' boss John Still is delighted to keep the midfielder at Kenilworth Road.

"Cameron initially came in for the month and impressed us all with his attitude and performances," Still told Luton's official site. "He's brought a real freshness with him and similar to Pelly Ruddock he has a great work ethic. Overall we are delighted to extend his stay until the end of the season."


McGeehan has also been included in Northern Ireland's Under-21 squad to face Italy in Belfast on Wednesday March 5.



POSITION: GOALKEEPER







6. ANTONY CHARLES
POSITION: DEFENDER

Experienced central defender who helped Barnet and Aldershot to the Conference title in 2005 and 2008 respectively. A calm, composed, left-footed defender, Charles left Aldershot for Northampton in January 2012 and went onto appear 18 times in League 2 for the Cobblers. He ended last season with Plymouth.

7. ALEX LAWLESS
POSITION: MIDFIELDER

The influential and creative midfielder penned a new two-year contract in May, turning down contracts at two clubs in League 1. The 27-year-old has made 124 appearances for the Hatters since signing from York City in November 2010 and has scored 12 goals.

8. SOLOMON TAIWO
POSITION: MIDFIELDER

Central midfielder who agreed a new one-year contract at the end of the season having appeared

nine times for the Hatters having been signed by John Still in March. Starred for a host of non-league clubs before being snapped by Still at Dagenham in 2007 where he became a driving force in the Daggers midfield. His impressive performances led to him signing for then-Championship Cardiff in 2009 for £250,000.

9. JON SHAW
POSITION: STRIKER

Centre-forward in his second season at Kenilworth Road having signed last summer from Gateshead. Scored 45 league goals in 80 appearances for the Tynesiders and hit double figures for the Town last term, including a hat-trick in the 6-1 win over Barrow in January.

10. ALEX WALL
POSITION: STRIKER

Raw, powerful centre-forward with pace to boot, who became John Still's first signing at Kenilworth Road having joined from Maidenhead last season. He scored his first goals for the Hatters when both hitting both goals in a 2-0 win over Ebbsfleet in April.

11. JAKE HOWELLS
POSITION: MIDFIELDER

Still hard to believe he's 22, Howells is the Hatters' longest serving player having made his debut as a 17-year-old on the final day of the 2007/08 season. Since then, the left-footer has been capped by Wales at under-21 level and

has made over 200 appearances for the club.

12. SCOTT GRIFFITHS
POSITION: DEFENDER

Left-back who penned a one-year contract at the end of last season. Another former Dagenham man, the experienced 27-year-old joined the Hatters in March following his release from former club Peterborough. He won the Conference under Still in 2007 and lifted the League 2 title with Chesterfield in 2011.

13. MARK CULLEN
POSITION: STRIKER


Young striker signed on a two-year deal following his release from Premier League-bound Hull City. A clever, poacher of a forward, Cullen impressed the manager with two fine performances against the Hatters whilst on loan at Stockport. Given his debut for Hull in the Premier League, he scored on his full debut for the Tigers whilst in the top flight.

POSITION: DEFENDER

The central defender signed from Southport on a two-year contract this summer. Also able to play in central midfield, Parry has two season's worth of Conference football under his belt but began his career as a youngster at Blackburn.

POSITION: GOALKEEPER





POSITION: MIDFIELDER





Influential and experienced central midfielder with over 400 senior appearances to his name who signed for the Hatters in August on a two-year contract. He has twice won promotion whilst with Southend, and also helped Northampton reach

22. SHAUN WHALLEY
POSITION: MIDFIELDER

Attack-minded midfielder or winger who followed Andy Parry to Kenilworth Road on a two-year deal from Southport. The 25-year-old was in inspired form for the Sandgrounders throughout 2012/13, scoring 10 goals and creating many more, and ended the campaign with a string of end-of-season awards.

23. MATT ROBINSON
POSITION: MIDFIELDER

Teenage midfielder in his second season at Kenilworth Road having signed last summer from Leicester City. He impressed John Still towards the end of the previous campaign and was rewarded with a new two-year contract this summer.

25. RONNIE HENRY
POSITION: DEFENDER

Club captain and right-back in his second season with the club. The defender joined the Hatters last summer from Stevenage, who he helped win promotion from the Conference to League One.

26. PAUL BENSON
POSITION: STRIKER

Experienced centre-forward signed on a season-long loan from Swindon in August 2013. Helped Dagenham & Redbridge to two promotions with John Still, scoring over 75 times in the process. Continued to score once he left the Daggers when with Charlton and Swindon. Won League 2 title with Swindon in 2012.

26. ANDRE GRAY
POSITION: STRIKER

Lightening quick forward who finished last season as the Hatters' leading goalscorer with 20 goals. The young striker made an instant impact when signing from Hinckley in March 2012 and has been capped by England C.

28. JIM STEVENSON
POSITION: MIDFIELDER

Box-to-box midfielder signed in May on a two-year deal from Histon. The youngster scored 11 goals for the Stutes in 2012/13 and ended the campaign as the top goalscorer. The 21-year-old made his full debut as a 17-year-old at Kenilworth Road for Histon in a game the Hatters won 5-1.

29. KANE FERDINAND
POSITION: MIDFIELDER

Midfielder on-loan for the rest of the season from League 1 Peterborough. Came through the ranks at Southend where his all-action performances led to Posh signing him for £200,000. Made 33 appearances last term in the Championship.

30. ALEX LACEY
POSITION: DEFENDER

Highly-rated centre-half who has enjoyed a fine pre-season in which he was handed the captain's armband by John Still. Made his Town debut as a 17-year-old in the FA Trophy and spent last season on loan with Eastleigh.

31. JAKE WOOLEY
POSITION: STRIKER

Teenage forward who signed professional forms last summer having impressed the coaching staff with his performances and attitude. Also made his debut as a 17-year-old in the Trophy, but has also tasted action in the Conference.

32. BRETT LONGDEN
POSITION: DEFENDER

First year professional Brett is a right-back by trade and made his mark in pre-season with a fine 30-yard goal against Thurrock. He's another player who has tasted first team experience in the FA Trophy.

33. JEROME JIBODU
POSITION: DEFENDER

Like Longden, Jerome signed his first professional contract this summer. A composed left-back, he made his Hatters debut in the FA Trophy against Skelmersdale last season.

POSITION: STRIKER






IT'S ALL BALLS!

PRIOR to the start of the season the Conference announce which manufacturer will be the ball sponsor for the new season and this season it has been Jako.

As the ball sponsor Jako supply each premier, north and south league teams with a quantity of both match and training balls.

Each club then has to purchase an equal amount of both types of balls. During the course of the season the team will get through 100 match balls and 50 training balls.

The difference between match and training balls is the quality and the colour. Match balls have a red design with training balls being green. The pressure in both types of balls is the same at 10.5 PSI.

With the 2014 World Cup just around the corner, some interesting facts about the match balls to be used during the tournament.

The brazuca, which means 'Brazilian' and refers to the Brazilian way of life, is the most-tested adidas ball in history. It was, over a two-and-a-half-year period, tried out by over 600 of the world's top players or former players including Iker Casillas, Dani Alves, Lionel Messi,


Bastian Schweinsteiger and Zinedine Zidane, and 30 teams in ten countries across three continents. The brazuca was also used at a selection of international football matches, albeit with a different design, including a friendly between Sweden and Argentina last February.

The brazuca's colours and ribbon design of the ball panels symbolise the traditional multi-coloured wish bracelets worn in the country, in addition to reflecting the vibrancy and fun associated with football in the South American country.

It has a new structural innovation, with a unique symmetry of six identical panels alongside a different surface structure will provide improved grip, touch, stability and aerodynamics on the pitch.



THE FA TROPHY. SO WHO DOESN'T CARE THEN?



SO, the big clubs don't care about the FA Trophy, eh?

Try telling that to the grand from Grimsby who filled the away end at Cambridge United for the first leg of their semi-final last Saturday.

It has become popular to bash Non-League football's premier knockout competition, and our fans' forum page in The NLP has been awash with letters criticising former Football League clubs' attitudes.

OK, the early rounds might be played out to smaller crowds than league fixtures, but with season tickets not counting, this is the case in every cup competition the world over.

Some clubs might change their line-up, but as Luton manager John Still said earlier this season, he has a squad of players he believes can all do a job in the first-team, so a Trophy tie is a shop window for those boys to earn a regular spot.

More of Luton in a moment, because for starters, I want to reinforce Grimsby boss Paul Hurst's praise of the thousand Mariners - 1,023 to be precise - who followed their team south last week. If my end-of-season award for best away fans were to be handed out now, it would be to the Cleethorpes crew. On Tuesday January 28, almost 500 of them sang their hearts out in the same stand as their team became the first to win a league game at Cambridge this season. Many United fans described them as the best to visit the Abbey in years.

Less than three weeks later, more than double that amount bought tickets to see the first half of their bid to reach a second successive Trophy final.







EDDIE HOLDING

15th October 1930 - 10th February 2013



EDWARD J. HOLDING was born in Wolverhampton on October 15, 1930. He signed professional terms for Walsall in January 1949 and in three seasons made 41 appearances scoring eight goals, including a Christmas Day hat-trick against Brighton.

Eddie played in defence or up-front. He went to Derby County in 1952-53 but was always a reserve and returned to Fellows Park for 1953-54.

In July 1954 he moved to Barrow where he scored five times in as many matches but decided to pack in full time football after going into business in Wolverhampton. It was then that he signed for Nuneaton Boro' after a short dalliance with Northampton Town.

He made his debut against Shrewsbury Town Reserves in a Birmingham League game at Manor

Park on November 13, 1954 in front of a crowd of 3,676. He scored twice in a 6-0 victory and went on to score a total of 18 goals in 27 appearances.

The following 1955-56 season he scored ten goals in 19 games before joining Lockheed Leamington. For Lockheed, he played only one match, at left back against Aston Villa 'A' before moving to Evesham United and later to Brierley Hill Alliance.

He had a spell as Manager at Tamworth in the 1960s and was also coach to Staffordshire County Youth Team where he helped Phil Parkes, Ray Train and Keith Ball and others.

Eddie died aged 83 after a long battle with prostate cancer.

A FOOT IN BOTH CAMPS

TREVOR PEAKE & KIRK STEPHENS

KIRK STEPHENS

Kirk Stephens was playing for Massey-Ferguson before Nuneaton Borough manager David Pleat brought him to Manor Park at the start of the 1972-73 season.

By October, Stephens, aged 17, had progressed from the youth to the first team. The fast-attacking right full-back quickly developed into one of the best defenders in the Southern League Premier Division, and in November 1976, was selected for the England Semi-Professional XI.

It was Pleat, now manager of Luton Town, who introduced Stephens to the Football League. Kirk was signed by Luton in the summer of 1978, and was an ever-present in their 1981-82 Second Division championship side.

Transferred to Coventry City in August 1984, a knee injury forced his premature retirement from full-time football in May 1986.

By March 1987 Stephens was back at Nuneaton helping them avoid the bottom three places of the GM Vauxhall Conference. Season 1987-88 saw Kirk assisting Barnet to the runners-up spot in the Conference before he again returned to Nuneaton, now members of the Beazer Homes League, Midland Division.

From September 1988 until his resignation in August 1989 he had the player-manager role.

In his three spells with Borough, he made 388 appearances, and was substitute on 10 occasions.

It wasn't the last time Kirk was involved with Nuneaton. In June 2010 he joined the board of directors to help develop Nuneaton's corporate side as well as providing support to the players from youth team upwards.

TREVOR PEAKE

Born in Nuneaton, Trevor Peake graduated through Borough's youth and reserve teams to make his first team debut at the age of 18 in September 1975. Peake, who was outstanding in non-league football, made 229 appearances for Nuneaton, playing in a back four which were among the most respected in the Southern League Premier Division.

At the end of the 1978-79 season, after assisting Nuneaton to qualify as founder-members of the Alliance Premier League and twice being selected for England at semi-professional level, he was signed by Lincoln City.

In December 1976 Trevor had been in the Nuneaton side defeated at Lincoln in the second round of the FA Cup.

Peake spent for years at Sincil Bank before joining Coventry City in the summer of 1983. A 1987 FA Cup winners medal followed, and only injury prevented him from collecting an England 'B' cap.

After two games for Coventry at the start of the 1991-92 season he was transferred to Luton Town. He would spend seven years at Kenilworth Road before retiring from football but not before coming off the bench vs Wrexham to become the club's oldest-ever player at the age of 40 years and 222 days. In total he had made 627 football league appearances, scoring 13 goals.

In 1998 Trevor returned to the Sky Blues to coach the Coventry U18 side and eventually the reserve teams.

In 2002, he, with ex team-mate Ogrizovic, was asked to become caretaker manager for one game following Roland Nilsson's sacking. In the summer of 2003 Trevor moved across to Midlands' rivals, Leicester City, initially in a scouting role but was soon moved onto a role in the Academy at The Foxes.

A year later Trevor took on the role of U17 manager and is now the Lead Pro Development Coach for the Under 18 set up.





When King George VI passed away*

...Nuneaton Borough had suffered three defeats in a row and their position at the top of the Birmingham Combination table was looking tenuous...

The latest set-back was a 4-2 defeat at Bromsgrove. It was their third consecutive away trip and a crowd of close to 3,000 saw the Boro' defence struggle to cope with an aggressive attack.

The four goals conceded meant that the back line had leaked eleven goals in their last three league games and the club's league championship hopes were certainly wobbling.

Not that the forwards were blameless with many of Boro's earlier efforts being limited to long-range efforts on a pitch that would have suited the attackers more.

Four days after the Bromsgrove trip on the morning of 6 February, George VI was discovered dead in bed at Sandringham House in Norfolk. He had died from a coronary thrombosis in his sleep at the age of 56.

Thousands gathered at Nuneaton Council House on Friday 8th as the Mayor - Alderman W.S. Johnson - read the Proclamation of Accession of Queen Elizabeth from a specially erected platform.

While the Rugby Union made a request that all matches the following day should be cancelled as a mark of respect to the late King - a request followed by Nuneaton RFC and Nuneaton Old Edwardians - football continued as Nuneaton travelled to league champions Hednesford, their fourth away trip in a row.

While Nuneaton ended their losing streak with a 2-2 draw, it was the referee that garnered much of the attention after a remarkable game. Borough made several changes to the one defeated at Bromsgrove with Billy Bond, Tommy Whitcroft and Mick Perry replacing Charlie Hudson, Len Slack and Hallard. The changes seemed to make little difference as right from the start

the Manor Park side were under the cosh and at times were completely outplayed who demonstrated skills and touches that defied the difficult Cross Keys pitch.

The signs were ominous when a Newman cross hit the visitors crossbar but it was Nuneaton who almost stole an unlikely lead when Horton missed an open goal.

The expected goal came on 10 minutes. Ward collected a cross from the left, turned past Dearson and fired a shot past Barber just inside the post.

Ten minutes later Hednesford increased their lead. A good

movement had the visiting defence all at sea and Newman's high ball into the middle found the head of Roberts giving Barber no chance. An overhead kick from Eddie Friemanis almost caught the home keeper, Turner, napping. It was one of the few chances Boro' made as they struggled to get the ball forward and they were thankful that the reached the half-time break just

two goals down. If the first half belonged to the home side then the second period emphatically belonged to the Boro'. The visitors laid siege to the home goalmouth and everyone in the ground thought their endeavour had reaped its just reward. Tommy Whitcroft lofted a ball high towards the goal. Unsighted by his own defenders and Boro' forwards, Turner misjudged the flight of the ball. It dropped behind him, clearly a foot over the line, before a defender hooked it away. The only persons who hadn't seen it cross the line, unfortunately, were the

match officials, Birmingham referee W.R. Rogers waving heated protests away.

The official's day was about to get worse. Minutes after disallowing that perfectly good goal he ignored a blatant handball in the penalty area when a Hednesford defender blocked Perry's drive to the amazement of the Boro' supporters. The apparent injustice seemed to drive the visitors on and on the hour Boro' pulled a goal back with Horton converting Perry's centre. Three minutes later Friemanis levelled with a 'gem of a goal' that saw him head home from Dearson's ball.

It was all Boro' now and they were roared on by their travelling supporters.

But once more referee Rogers took the spotlight. With the match approaching an exciting climax Hednesford centre forward Ward received his marching orders. When the full time whistle sounded two minutes later hundreds of home supporters surged onto the pitch and the officials had to be escorted from the field by police and players.

It was Boro's first point in four games but they dropped from first to third in the league table - the first time in months that they had not been the leaders.

*Wednesday 6 February 1952

George VI became King unexpectedly following the abdication of his brother, King Edward VIII, in 1936.

His greatest achievements came during the Second World War, when he remained for most of the time at Buckingham Palace (the Palace was bombed nine times during the war). He and his wife, Queen Elizabeth, visited severely bombed areas in the East End of London and elsewhere in the country, gained him great popularity.

The King developed a close working relationship with his wartime Prime Minister, Winston Churchill, as most of Europe fell to Nazi Germany.

The strain of the Second World War and the tensions of the post-war period had taken their toll on the King's health. The King failed to recover from a lung operation, and died in his sleep on 6 February 1952 at Sandringham; he was aged 56.

At the King's funeral, attached to the Government's wreath was a card on which Churchill had written the phrase inscribed on the Victoria Cross - 'For Valour'.

It would be another eight months before an accurate singles chart would be published. Up till then (and for a while after) sales were measured in terms of sheet music purchases. As in the case with this day's number one, it was common for multiple versions of the same song to exist.


The Number 1 Sheet Music was:
Mario Lanza / Anne Shelton - *The Loveliest Night Of The Year*

This song was on the UK chart for a record 32 weeks before making No 1. An adaptation of a waltz called Sobre las olas (Over the Waves) first published in 1888, it is a familiar tune now closely associated with funfairs, as it was one of the tunes available on Wurlitzer's popular fairground organs.

Mario Lanza was an American operatic tenor and Hollywood movie star who enjoyed success in the 1950s. His version of *The Loveliest Night of the Year* featured in the 1951 movie *The Great Caruso*, a biopic where he played the role of Enrico Caruso, his tenor idol, and would sell a million copies and spend eight months on US Billboard's singles charts - five of them in the top-10. Anne Shelton, OBE, was a popular English vocalist, who is remembered for providing inspirational songs for soldiers both on radio broadcasts, and in person, at British military bases during the Second World War.

You couldn't move for cinemas in Nuneaton in the 1950s. At the Ritz you could see the Royal Command movie *Where No Vultures Fly*, a story about a game warden who is horrified by the destruction of wild animals by ivory hunters.

Nuneaton nursery schools were being closed due to the 'unjustifiable cost' involved though in a meeting on Wednesday 6th the Nuneaton Committee for Education decided to make representations to the County Council that the buildings be retained for use as day care nurseries or crèches.
