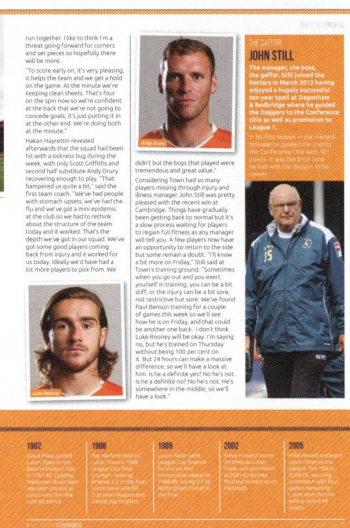

Nobody needs to tell us how dangerous the reigning Conference Champions can be when they step into League 2.

Not when we won promotion at the first attempt ourselves after our promotion to the League. Beating these today is certainly no gimme. Especially with a classy manager as experienced as Stilly who has taken brilliantly to a job that saw off some good men.

Today's opponents are a big club in League 2 in terms of fanbase. And were rightly placed as a 'favourite' because of that. You only need to look at their penalty record to see how their fans can affect a game!!! It's amazing how decisions do so often seem to go with crowd demands.

Our 'size' comes in the form of the CVs of our players.

In our starting 11 last week, we had seven lads who had previously played in League 2 promotion winning teams. And Wells, Pett, Parrett and Bondy, who hadn't done so, were amongst our top performers last week so there is great potential here.

Past success is no guarantee of future glory of course. However, there will not be anybody in that away dressing room today that will underestimate our players. John won't allow that. Mark my words.

Our week has been one in which we have taken yet another long, hard look in the mirror. We aren't happy with where we are at and we are hungry to keep sorting things out. We started with 1.16 pts per game over six games. We then won 1.33 pts per game in our next three and with last week's win, we pushed ourselves up to 1.4 pts per game across our ten games. It doesn't take a genius to see that we have won 1.75 pts per game in



our last four now; a clear sign that we are improving. Our new team is starting to settle down, our defence is solidifying and goals came last time out too. With our experienced players slowly returning, we will certainly get stronger.

We have built a focus for our week and it has really just been about winning today. Today is not vitally important for our visitors, who are already ahead of schedule for a promoted club, but it is for us. We know the benefits to us of winning today and they go way beyond the three points and the consequent jump in our position. We are ready to deal with the situation that is in front of us and we are really looking forward to attacking another visitor to our camp.

Derby games are always great occasions. But not when the result is wrong. To enjoy derby games we have to want the result more than their 11. We have to be prepared to outrun them and outfight them but more importantly to outplay them.

With our home backing, the lads will be right in the zone.

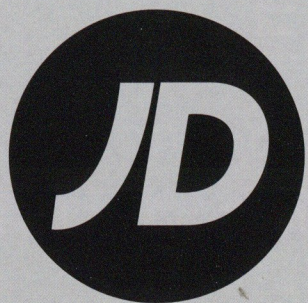
Both League games between the clubs in my time were won by the away team. That made sense back then. But now, it is time to move on from that. Whilst Liverpool and Everton, and Spurs and Arsenal played out Derby draws last weekend, I admit that I am going to encourage our lads to go forward relentlessly in pursuit of resounding victory. We will build on a phenomenal week on the training ground and in the gym with a performance that shows exactly where we are at right now which is that we are rising.

My strong feeling is that we will go from strength to strength today. Provided we do then we will win.

Enjoy the efforts of our players. I have a sense that they will put in a special display.

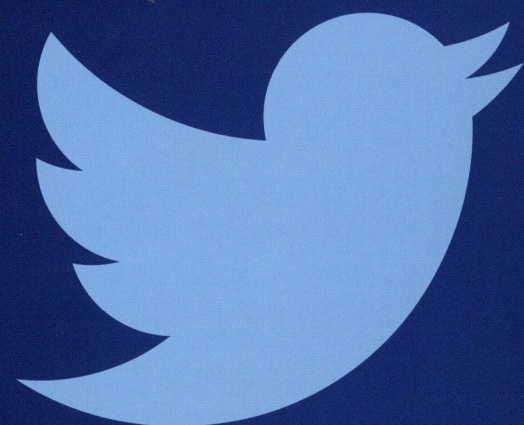
On another note, before the game last week we had a minutes silence for one of our own youth players who sadly passed away. Our thoughts are with his family at such a sad time.

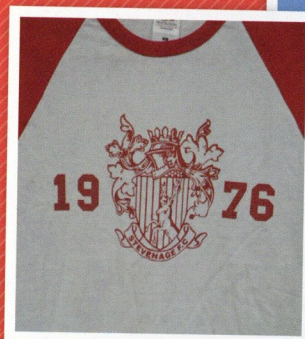

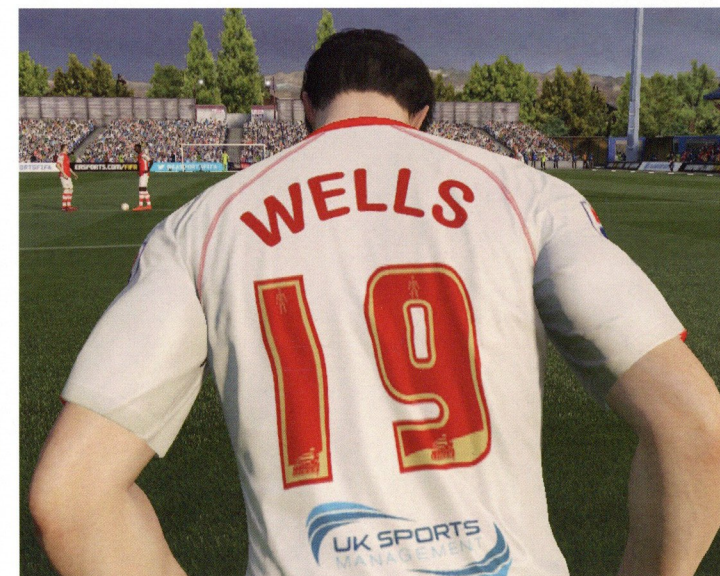

Good afternoon and welcome back to the Lamex for our League Two clash with near neighbours Luton Town.



I'm sure the fans are looking forward to this game and it presents us with the opportunity to post another good home win.

As has been the trend of late, there is a mixture of good news and not so good news from the treatment room.

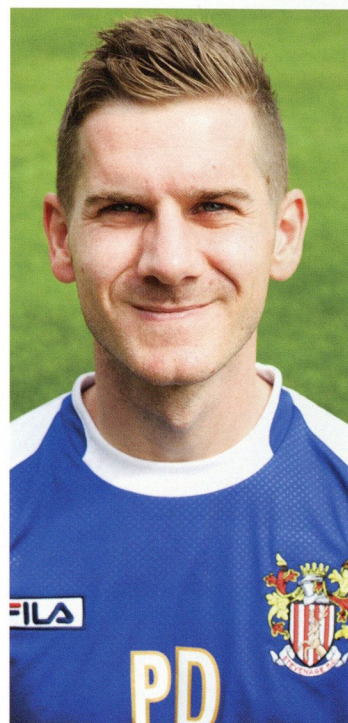
Starting on a plus note, it was pleasing to see Dean P start and come through 45 minutes last Saturday. He picked up a knock during the first half so we decided against the risk of making it worse. We have managed his training schedule this week to ensure he is as fresh as possible ahead of today.

Adam (hamstring) resumed full training earlier this week will no ill effects to add another much needed number to the squad for this afternoon.

The news from Walts recent ultrasound scan was positive - there are encouraging signs of healing and he has near full contraction of the muscle, which at this stage gives us a platform to move forward with his rehab. We remain optimistic of a return within the 8 week mark.

Jerome is another player going through a frustrating time following a hamstring injury 4 weeks ago. Although his symptoms and function have shown improvement, there remains some doubt over the healing of the tissue so he was referred for a further scan this week. I will let you know the outcome in my next column.

Sam has been slow in recovering from a foot injury which has seem him miss the last two weeks of

training. Due to the ongoing symptoms, he was sent for a scan on Wednesday to assess the extent. At the time of writing we were awaiting feedback so I will keep you informed.

Harry is making steady progress and is where we would expect him to be at this stage of his recovery. He is able to use the static bike without any issues and we are increasing the difficulty of his balance exercises almost daily.

We have recently introduced strengthening work into his regime which will assist in developing the muscle weaknesses which resulted from disuse in the early stages post-operation. He is back to see the consultant at 12 weeks where we are hoping he will be able to resume light running drills.

Calvin was working towards full fitness only to sustain an ankle injury in training on Tuesday. He landed awkwardly and was suffering from soreness and swelling around the lateral ligament but we saw an improvement in the first 24 hours and will be doing everything possible to get him ready for today's game.

Finally, this weeks edition of 'Did you know' features our said number 10 Calvin Zola. Born in Zaire, did you know that Calv is fluent in 3 languages, English, French and Lingala (native Congolese). Pretty impressive!

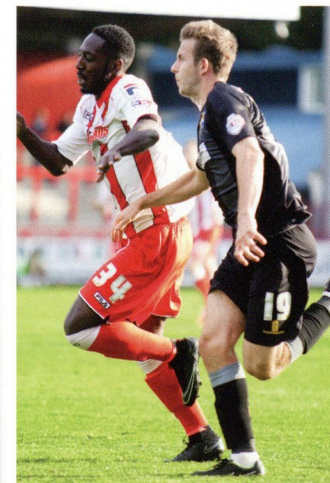
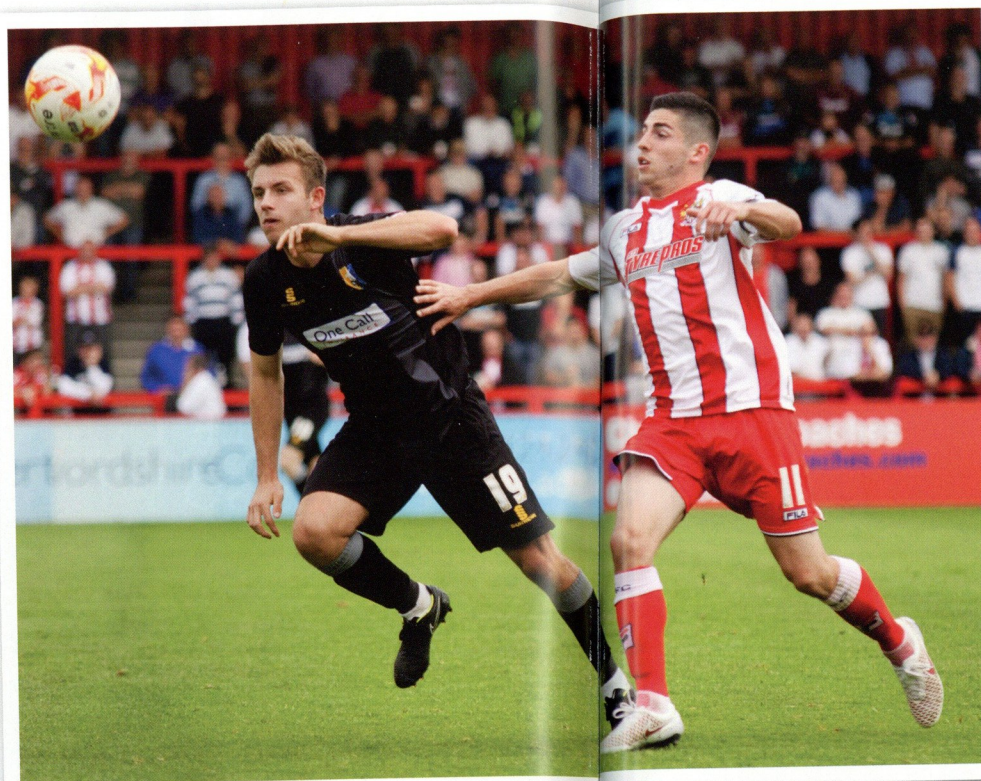

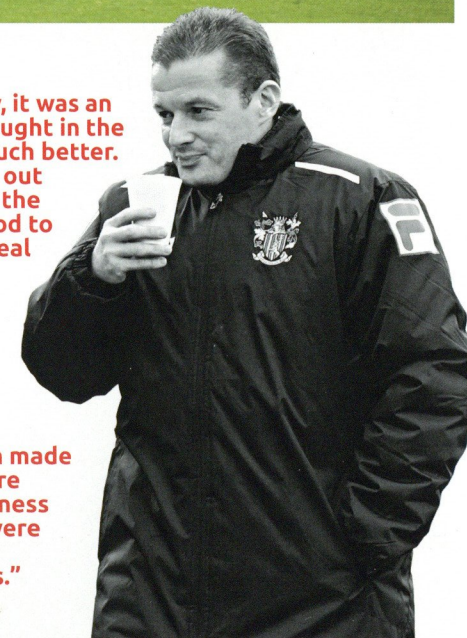


MANAGER'S VIEW

The Stevenage Under-18s have had a mixed bag of results over the past couple of weeks, suffering defeats against Cambridge and Northampton before picking up a point against Wimbledon. However despite picking up just the single point, Head of Youth Darren Sarll refuses to be down-hearted.

He told us, "The Cambridge and Northampton games had mixed emotions for me because when I say we played quite beautifully, it would be an understatement. At the moment we're treading that fine line between playing really, really good football – which has to be evident every game – and ensuring that we are secure defensively to not concede. At the moment we flirt with that line on being a little bit too open, but at the same point we're great to watch and we're good going forward.

"I want us to play good football. I want people to admire what we do and the way we play. And I want that to be a by-product to win, rather than win and let's see how we play against that. The outcome is really important but there are several things that I think have to be very evident every game in order to have a gratifying win. Playing good football, being very offensive and being aggressive with the ball is my way. I wasn't as disappointed to lose as some of the boys, but at the same time I'm saying to them 'Keep going. We'll do a little bit more here and there and that'll mean it doesn't happen again.'

"Against Northampton we were great to watch and went 1-0 up but were undone by two long throws. In youth football that's quite rare so it was a good thing for our lads to experience. In some ways it was good for them to be punished by that as defeat leaves a negative, mental thought process and

hopefully that is the motivation to go and make sure that doesn't happen again. With young players if they make mistakes, as long as it doesn't become a habit, it's well worth going through that process."

"Taking a closer look at individuals, Darren continues, "Jack Storer got two goals against Cambridge and the goal against Northampton which was important for him to get off the mark after an early-season suspension.

"We were five good players short against Wimbledon last weekend as Dale Gorman, Ben Kennedy and Tyler Reading had travelled with the first team to Oxford and both Matt Smith and Nathan Kerr were on international duty with Northern Ireland U17s. However the great thing about that was the younger ones really stepped up. From the U16s Zak Guerfi was excellent in midfield and Jamie Silvestre was brilliant in his running and intensity

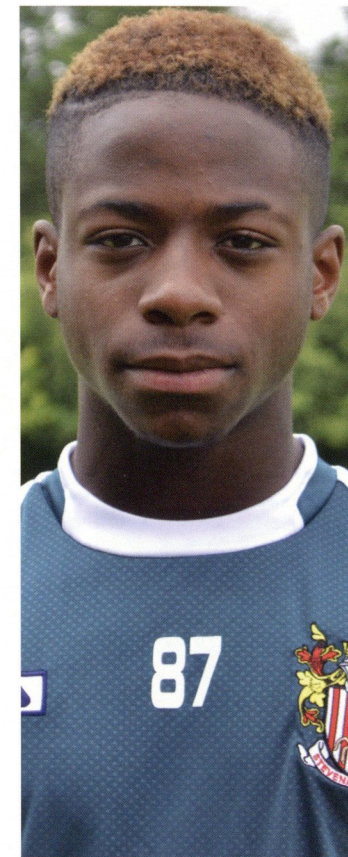
at centre-forward. Then we brought on an U15, David Etheridge, who we think very highly of and he's just 14.

"We probably didn't play as fluently as we have done, but we got a point against probably the best AFC Wimbledon side I've seen, with all due respect. I thought they were quite direct but effective.

"Of the remaining U18s, there was a good substitution by the coach who brought on Brandon Carney to score the equaliser, Norley Butaka and Jack Jones did very well at the back and Robbie Sweeney just makes me smile. I'm a football fan, I love watching the game and the reason I like that is players like Robbie. I want to watch players who take people on and have that entertainment factor in their game. Louis Yamfam is another who could potentially do that. They're the players I really want to watch and we encourage them to dribble and entertain as much as possible."

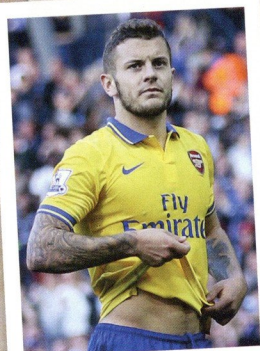

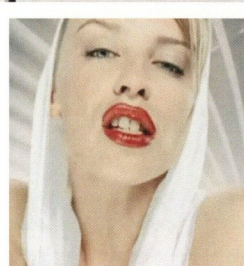

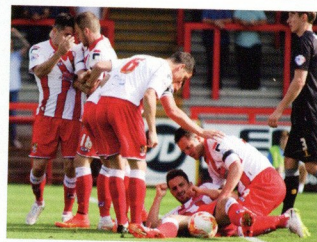

Bristol City midfielder Bobby Reid has joined Plymouth Argyle on a month's loan.

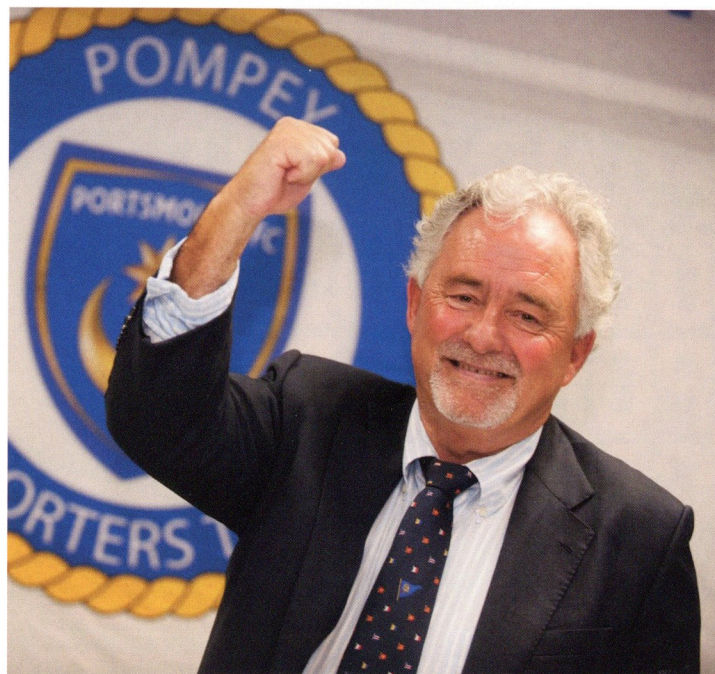
The 21-year-old has made 38 appearances for the Robins since graduating through their academy but has only appeared against Oxford in the Capital One Cup this season.

"We would like to thank all staff, supporters, directors and the PFA for their assistance in enabling this to be achieved well ahead of schedule.

"PCFC can now fully focus its efforts on looking forwards instead of backwards, while still recognising that the rebuilding process will continue to be a difficult task in the years ahead.

"Our imminent move to a new training ground is a fundamental part of this work in putting in place foundations to enable the sustainable growth of all aspects of the club."

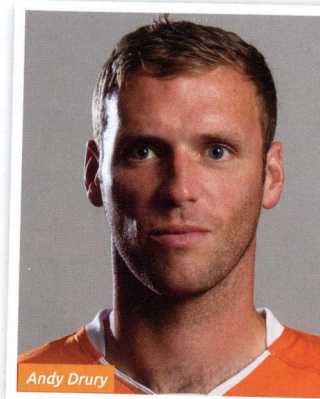

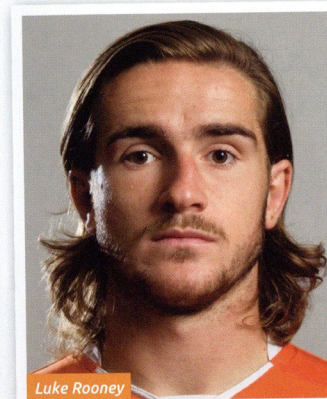

1970

Malcolm Macdonald scored 25 times as Luton Town won promotion in 1969-70, unbeaten in their last six matches they clinched promotion as Third Division runners-up with a 0-0 draw at Mansfield.

1974

Luton Town regained top-flight status after an absence of 14 years in 1973-74. Alan Garner and Bobby Thomson were ever-present as Luton finished runners-up.

1982

David Pleat guided Luton Town to the Second Division title in 1981-82. Leading marksman Brian Stein was ever-present as Luton won the title with 88 points.

1988

Ray Harford plotted Luton Town's 1988 League Cup final triumph, beating Arsenal 3-2 in the final. Luton were also FA Cup semi-finalists and Simod Cup finalists.

1989

Luton Town were League Cup finalists for the second consecutive season in 1988-89, losing 3-1 to Nottingham Forest in the final.

2002

Steve Howard scored 24 times as Luton Town won promotion in 2001-02 as they finished runners-up to Plymouth.

2005

Mike Newell managed Luton Town to the League One title in 2004-05, securing promotion with four games remaining. Luton won the title with a record 98 points.

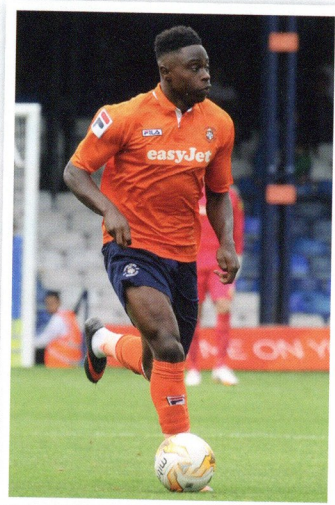
The Liverpool-born defender led Fleetwood Town to Conference title in 2011/12, lifting the title as the Cod Army captain. The Liverpoolian has also played for Barrow, Vauxhall Motors and Bursough. McNulty enjoyed a fantastic season at the heart of the Hatters defence in 2013/14 and was an ever-present as the Hatters lifted the Conference title. He walked away with a whole host of end-of-season awards, including Player of the Year and goal of the season. Named captain for the 2014/15 campaign.



Alex Lacey, who deputised at right-back against Cambridge in the absence of Paul Connolly and following Curtley Williams' first-half withdrawal, picked up a slight injury this week but Still hopes to have the defender available. Options are fast becoming limited. But what can you do with a right-side obliterated by injuries?

"It's really important wherever you can not to risk people," said Still. "We had to do it with Curtley Williams, we didn't really have a choice and in the end he had to come off at Cambridge. Fraser Franks, who isn't fit, can do a job there, but not ideally, while Alex Lacey has had a little bit of a knock, but has trained as well and went there (right back) and did well. So if that was the case again, it wouldn't give us too much trouble and we'll evaluate the situation with Curt and Paul Connolly next week. If Curt

wasn't available on Saturday, I'm pretty sure he'll be able to play next week and maybe Paul Connolly as well, so that situation will look a lot healthier."

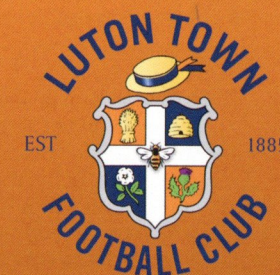

STAR GRADUATE: BRUCE RIOCH



Football historian Leigh Edwards profiles one of Luton Town's finest-ever players

Powerful midfielder Bruce Rioch was capped 24 times by Scotland after leaving Luton Town.

Born in Aldershot, where his father was a regimental sergeant major, Bruce was raised in Luton and became an apprentice at Kenilworth Road. Rioch turned professional in September 1964 and made his League debut in Luton's 1-0 defeat at home to Southend United two months later. His first League goal came in the Hatters' 3-2 defeat at Bradford City in December 1965 and he soon attracted interest from bigger clubs with his pace, power and fierce shooting. He also had great competitiveness and a ruthless streak.

Bruce was Luton's leading marksman in 1966-67 and again in 1967-68 when he missed just two matches as the Hatters stormed to the Fourth Division title. Rioch was also an important figure as Luton narrowly failed to win promotion again in 1968-69, netting 47 goals in 149 League games before moving to Aston Villa for a then club record £100,000 in July 1969. His younger brother Neil, an England Youth international, followed him from Luton to Villa shortly afterwards.

Bruce played for Villa in the 1971 League Cup final and starred in their 1971-72 Third Division title triumph. Moving to Derby County for £200,000 in February 1974, he took over from the injured Henry Newton and helped Dave Mackay's side to finish third in the top-flight that season. Rioch was ever-

present and leading marksman with 15 League goals in 1974-75 when Derby won the League Championship for the second time in four seasons.

Towards the end of that title campaign, he scored one of his most memorable goals with a surging run from near the half-way line against Newcastle United at St James' Park. The following season, he hit a thunderous free-kick in the FA Cup sixth round win at home to Newcastle, then scored four goals in Derby's remarkable 8-2 First Division victory over Spurs in October 1976.

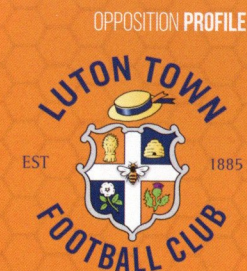
Rioch could play for Scotland through parental qualification and made his international debut in their 1-0 victory over Portugal at Hampden Park in May 1975. He scored his first international goal to clinch Scotland's 2-2 draw with Wales four days later and went on to become the first English-born player ever to captain Scotland, leading them in the 1978 World Cup finals in Argentina.

Sold to Everton for £180,000 in December 1976, Rioch returned to Derby a mere 11 months later but fell out with Tommy Docherty and Colin Addison and had loan spells at Birmingham City and Sheffield United. After that he played for Seattle Sounders, becoming Torquay United's player-coach in October 1980 and later their player-manager. He then took charge of Middlesbrough, managing them from the Third Division to First in consecutive seasons.



After a spell as Millwall's manager, he became Bolton Wanderers' boss in May 1992 and plotted two promotion successes, also leading them to the 1995 League Cup final. He spent a year as Arsenal's manager before the appointment of Arsene Wenger, signing Dennis Bergkamp and David Platt, then managed Norwich City, Wigan Athletic and Danish side Aalborg.

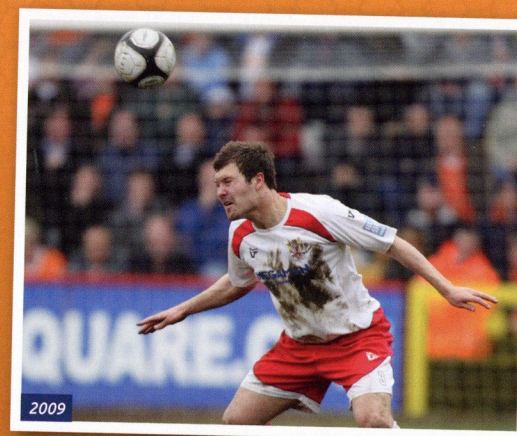
Ahmet Brkovic scored an incredible three goals in six minutes to send Luton through 4-3 at the expense of local rivals Stevenage.

The Boro had been ahead at half time after Kevin Nicholls had put the ball into his own net, but the Hatters were level shortly after the break when Tony Thorpe powerfully headed home.

Dominica international forward Richard Pacquette then put the hosts back in front before Brkovic made it 2-2 following Michael Leary's delivery.

He then thumped the Hatters in front before securing the visitors place in the next round with a confident left-footed finish moments later.

Versatile Richard Scott then pulled back a consolation for the Boro late on.

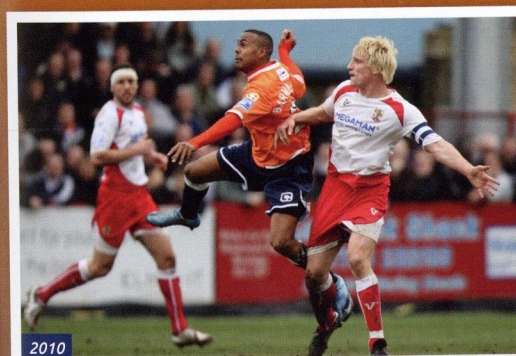
14th October 2003, LDV Vans Trophy

Substitute Matthew Judge's last gasp strike was enough to secure a 1-0 triumph for Luton against local rivals Stevenage, and sends the Hatters through to the next round of the LDV Vans Trophy.

The visitors started the game the better and came close through Ahmet Brkovic, but he was denied by a superb Mark Westhead save.

Stevenage then came forward with some momentum, but both Tony Battersby and Simon Wormull squandered opportunities.

The match looked destined for extra-time but as the game drew close to the final whistle Judge struck spectacularly from 25 yards to snatch victory and a place in the next round for Luton.



2009/10

Luton 0 Stevenage 1

19th September 2009, Conference Premier

Scott Laird popped up with a late goal to snatch a 1-0 victory against Luton, stretching Stevenage's unbeaten run to eight games.

Centre-half Mark Roberts almost put Stevenage in front when he rose highest to meet a corner, but saw his header drop inches wide of the post.

Jake Howell's then volleyed over for the Hatters before Boro forward Chris Beardsley's shot was tipped around the post by Mark Tyler.

Luton nearly snatched the points themselves, yet George Pilkington's effort could only find the post before Scott Laird left-footed strike into the top corner confirmed victory for the visitors.

Stevenage 0 Luton 1

3rd April 2010, Conference Premier

Matthew Barnes-Homer scored one-minute after coming off the bench to secure a 1-0 victory for Luton against Stevenage, cutting the Boro's lead at the top of the table to two points.

After a goalless first half, Luton keeper Mark Tyler made a superb fingertip save to deny Chris Beardsley just minutes before Barnes-Homer entered the fray.

The substitute then curled in a left-footed shot from the edge of the box ten minutes after the break to earn the Hatters their eighth straight win.



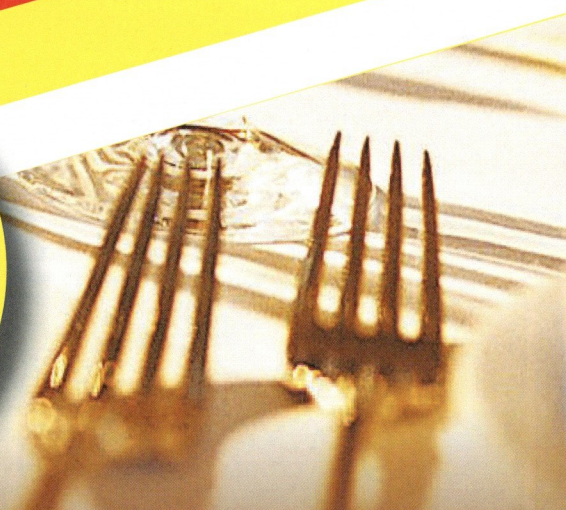

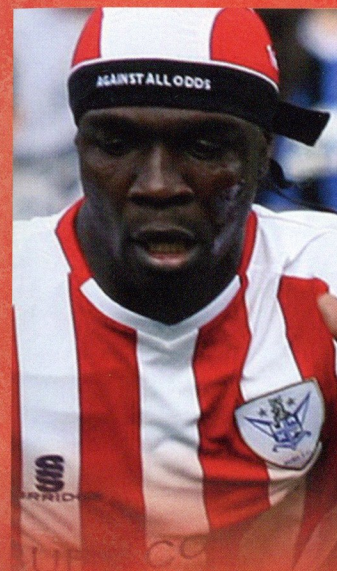

RONNIE HENRY

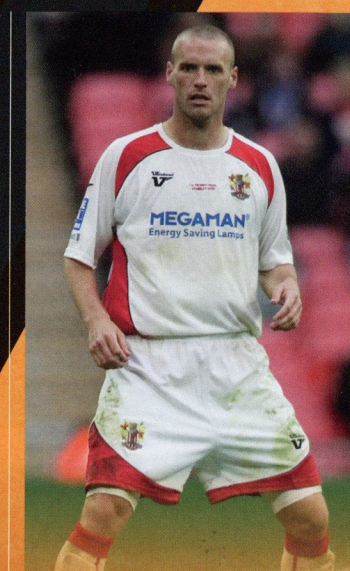
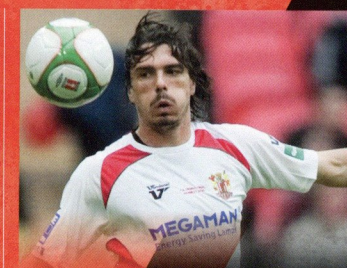
Stevenage 2005-2012;
Luton Town 2012-2014

Defender, Ronnie Henry began his career with Spurs before later joining Irish Premier League side Dublin in 2004, but was later released due to financial problems at the club. He then signed for Hertfordshire side Stevenage side until the end of the 2004/05 season. Henry was part of the side that made the Conference play-off final in 2005, falling one game short of promotion to the football league. The following season, he was made captain, and was part of the Stevenage side that won the FA Trophy in the first ever-competitive final at Wembley Stadium; ultimately becoming the first ever player to lift a competitive trophy at the new stadium in May 2007. He enjoyed FA Trophy success once more in 2009, before being an instrumental part of the side that earned promotion to the Football League before the following season promotion to League 1. Henry then left Stevenage in 2012 after seven years with the club to join local rivals Luton, where he was made captain, and in his second year with the Hatters lead the side back to the football league. The England C international then returned to the Lamex Stadium this summer.

EFE SODJE

Stevenage 1994-1997;
Luton Town 1999-2000

Sodje was the rock at the heart of Stevenage defence during his time at the club. After being denied promotion due to a lack of facilities, Sodje was forced to leave Stevenage to achieve his dream of playing in the football league, and did so for newly promoted Macclesfield Town in 1997. He had made 138 appearances for Stevenage during his three-year spell, scoring 13 goals. After his time at Macclesfield, Sodje subsequently signed for Luton Town, but would only make nine appearances in his one year at the club. However, after getting his career back on track he did enough to be called up for the Nigeria Squad, and subsequently represent his country at the 2002 World Cup.



ANDY DRURY

Stevenage 2008-2010;
Luton 2010-2011 and 2014 to present)

Midfielder, Andy Drury was signed by Graham Westley in the close season of 2008 with the view of gathering a squad strong enough to target promotion. The versatile midfielder brought a wealth of Conference experience and in his two years made fifty-seven league outings, netting seven times as Stevenage won promotion to the football league. He then had a short one-year stint at Luton Town before he was signed by Championship outfit, Ipswich Town for £150,000 in 2011. After two years at Portman Road he was on the move again, joining League 1 side, Crawley Town in 2013. A year later and Drury re-joined Luton for £100,000 after two initial bids had been rejected.

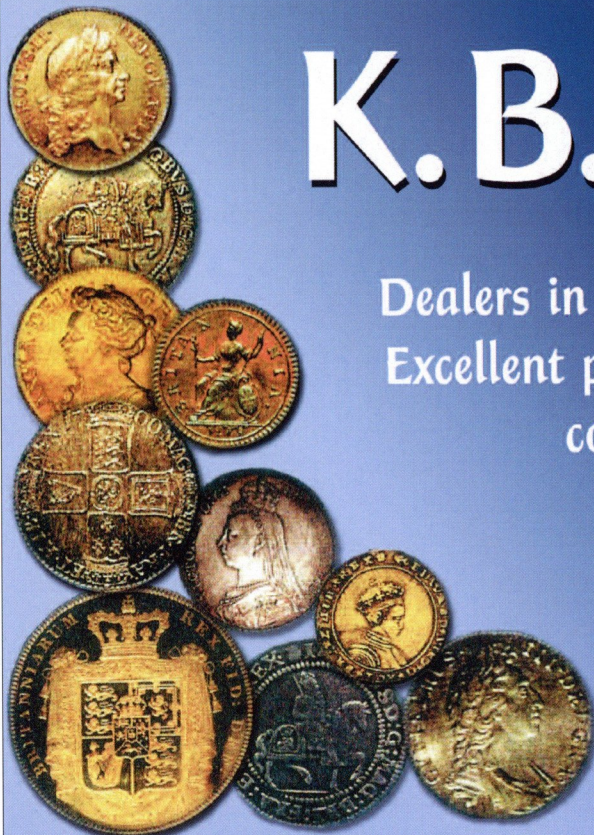

FROM THE PRESS BOX

Today's viewpoint comes from Simon Oxley,
commentator at BBC 3CR

Today's derby match has been eagerly anticipated at BBC 3CR, and is one of several 3CR derbies in League Two.

Admittedly Stevenage versus Wycombe is stretching it a bit, but I can remember Norwich versus Luton being called a derby purely because they were both in the Anglia TV region.

Anyway there's no argument on Stevenage versus Luton. After all it's only ten minutes up the A505, a queue through Hitchin, and a quick trip under the A1 - the geography is easy to debate. But I'll admit that for many years it was unthinkable in footballing terms.

I was aware of Luton as a football club from a fairly early age - my Grandpa was a big Morecambe and Wise fan - but Stevenage only cropped up during Mr Tuffin's geography lesson on new towns. Even when I headed south, notebook and pen in hand in the 1980s, Luton were riding high, and Stevenage were midweek opponents for Wolverton on a Tuesday night assignment for the Milton Keynes Herald.

Since then of course, for a variety of reasons, they have been drawn closer together and their paths crossed in the 2009/10 season with significant fixtures.

Scott Laird's goal at Kenilworth Road at the end of September 2009 gave Stevenage a one-nil victory and meant the end of Mick Harford's managerial reign. Matthew Barnes-Homer's goal here at the beginning of April



2010 gave Luton a one-nil win, but it was Stevenage who went on to win the Conference title.

Now they are back together again, and in the Football League. In the seasons since that Conference title race, Luton have finally made it up of course, whilst Stevenage went up again, and nearly a third time, before being relegated last season.

How they both respond to League 2 will be, and has already been, fascinating. At the start of the season I predicted Luton would finish above Stevenage, and I stand by that although Luton haven't found top gear, and the Boro look to have the makings of a good side.

John Still and Graham Westley are football men who live and

breathe the game. JS was a strong candidate to manage here a few years back, whilst Luton fans debated long and hard about appointing GW.

I wish both sides well today, and make no apologies for reflecting that in commentary.

Ronnie Henry will no doubt be the centre of attention, but is more than capable of coping with that. I hope, and believe, that he will get a good reception from the travelling faithful. Indeed, two of my fondest memories in 25 seasons with the BBC involve Ronnie Henry holding up a trophy; the FA Trophy in the first final at the new Wembley in 2007, and the Conference trophy at Kenilworth Road just a few months ago.

So plenty of links, and plenty of talking points in the so far brief history of Stevenage versus Luton. There will be plenty more today, and you can always have your say on 3CR. Today's programme comes live from the Lamex Stadium, and you can text, tweet, email or phone-in with your views after 5pm.

Then keep in touch with every game after today. Stevenage matches are on 95.5FM, with Luton on 630 and 1161 medium wave. Both feature on other FM frequencies depending on other fixtures, and all our clubs share the DAB digital radio frequency.

Really looking forward to today's game. Hope you enjoy it.

Adrian Roberts takes his usual irreverent look at the world of football.

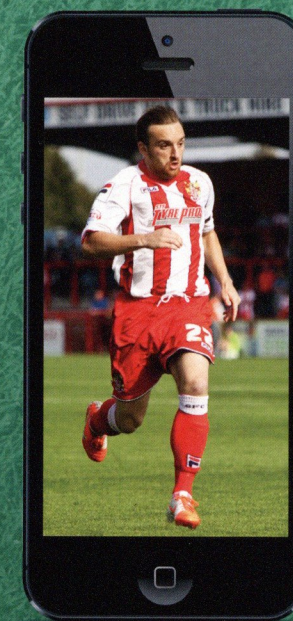

From THE ARCHIVES

THE WALLSPAN LEAGUE CUP

Lloyd Briscoe continues his look through the history of Stevenage Borough. This week's episode starts at Christmas 1979.

It was 1979 and Christmas was fast approaching.

Stevenage Borough were becoming accustomed to their first season in the Wallspan Southern Combination League and the new players were gelling well together as a team.

Despite still playing their home games on the King George V playing fields, the promise of returning to a refurbished Broadhall Way later in the season was a massive incentive for the fledgling club.

Having completed a goodly part of their league commitments, Stevenage embarked on a number of cup competitions, one of them being the Wallspan Southern Combination League Cup

On November 17th, the Boro journeyed to Bedford in the 1st round of the Wallspan League cup competition. The team that Derek Montgomery took on this occasion was: Billy Bennett, Graham Pearce, Jerry Abbiss, John Downes, Tony Shafe, Mark Vooght, Drew Noble, Peter Gittings, Malcolm Ward, Frank Tyler, and Brian Carter. Subs for this game were Derek Montgomery and Paul Peterson.

It was a poor pitch at Bedford. So poor in fact, that the groundstaff were still sanding parts of the playing surface just before kick-off, with both teams still warming up on the pitch. The ground was a quagmire.

Borough took a very early lead, with just two minutes on the clock. Having been fouled, Drew Noble took the resulting free kick. Headed on by Malcolm Ward, Frank Tyler easily headed home into an empty net. This early goal subsequently allowed Stevenage to dominate the first half and a

Brian Carter effort on the 33rd minute was only narrowly cleared off of the line.

The respective half-time team talks clearly went in the favour of Bedford, whose game was much improved in the second half. However, a resolute Borough held on to their lead until the 82nd minute when Bedford managed to equalise.

Stevenage Borough went on to beat Bedford 2-1 in the replay where they were rewarded with a home tie against Dunstable on December 1st. This was fortuitous, as Boro had previously thrashed Dunstable 0-3 away in a league game on the Wednesday before with Nigel Roberts scoring a hat-trick.

The cup game with Dunstable was much the same story as the league game – except for the first half-hour or so. During this period, Dunstable effectively dominated the mid-field, but failed to trouble the Stevenage goal-keeper, Billy Bennett.

During the 40th minute of the game, Drew Noble launched a fine through ball to player-boss Derek Montgomery whose accurate cross met the head of Nigel Roberts - who duly scored his fourth goal against Dunstable in as many days.

In the second half, Borough again dominated, but failed to score again until the 87th minute when Malcolm Ward buried an unstoppable shot that the Dunstable goal-keeper (Barnes) simply couldn't keep out.

However, just two minutes later, John Downes handled in the penalty area, allowing the Bedfordshire team a consolation goal.

Result: Stevenage Borough 2-1 Dunstable Reserves.

So, having despatched two teams from the Wallspan League Cup (Bedford and Dunstable), the Boro were then drawn against Letchworth – away.

The game was originally scheduled to be played on New Year's Eve, but intensive rain storms rendered almost all of the pitches in North Herts unplayable.

In the event, Stevenage Borough beat Letchworth and went on to meet Luton Town "A" in a two-legged semi-final.

The 1st leg was played on Saturday April 19th 1980.

Stevenage lost 4-2. By the 70th minute, it was actually 4-0 to Luton. The Hatters scored two of them from penalties, one of which was hotly disputed. Drew Noble had been dismissed due to an alleged derogatory remark to the referee, and Derek Montgomery was furious. He was adamant that the referee had got the wrong player.

Stevenage did fight back though with a goal apiece from John Huxtable and Ashley Palmer. A third, from Frank Tyler, was disallowed.

The 2nd leg was played a week later at Hitchin's Top Field stadium. Despite Borough being the much better team on the day, the game ended in a 2-2 draw, dashing Stevenage's hopes of collecting silverware in their first season as a senior club. Goals from Peter Gittings and Derek Montgomery were neutralised by Luton, who progressed through to the final.

WHAT'S BRUNTON PARK LIKE?

The Story Homes Stand on one side of the pitch, is a relatively new covered, all seated stand, which looks quite smart. The other side is an old partly covered (to the rear) Main Stand, which has seating at the back and a terraced paddock to the front. The central part of this stand was built in 1954 and the wings added at a later stage. The Warwick Road End is a covered terrace that has a peculiar looking roof. The other end, the Petterill End (aka The Waterworks End), is a small open terrace, which after refurbishment has now been re-opened after being closed for a number of years. Oddly it has a small number of seats fitted to part of the terrace, which don't seem to fulfil any particular purpose. There is also an electric scoreboard at this end, which is also known as the Waterworks End. The ground also has some strange looking floodlights. Outside the ground entrance is a statue of former Carlisle favourite Hughie McIlmoyle, who over three separate spells at the club, scored 91 goals in 189 appearances.

Another unusual aspect of the ground is that the central point of the East Stand, is located just off the half way line. This means that one side of the stand extends past the one goal line, whilst the other side falls short of this. This was due to the fact that the club were intending to rebuild the whole ground and move the pitch a few yards further north, but alas the development funds ran dry.

WHAT CAN BORO FANS EXPECT?

After a short stint in the Petterill End, it would appear that away fans are now mainly housed once

again in part of the Story Homes Stand on one side of the pitch. The facilities and the view of the playing area from the East Stand are good. Steve Barrie adds; 'If away supporters are allocated part of the East Stand, then they will find that they are only separated from home fans by a piece of fabric spread across the seats and a bit of plastic ribbon. It tends to create a lively atmosphere between the two sets of fans and can also be a little intimidating'. If a particularly large following is expected then the Petterill End terrace can also be opened which houses around 1,700 supporters. Please note though that this end is open to the elements. I personally found the Carlisle fans to be friendly and helpful and had a pleasant afternoon there.

WHERE TO DRINK?

The Carlisle Rugby Club next to Brunton Park on the Warwick Road, has a club bar which allows in away supporters and is family friendly. Also near to the ground on Warwick Road is the Beehive, which serves a good pint of Theakstons. The pub does employ doormen on match days and for certain games away fans may not be allowed entrance. Barrie Mossop recommends another Theakstons House, called the Howard Arms, which is on Lowther Street. This is just off Warwick Road, towards the town centre, down from the White House. Simon Tunstall adds; 'At the back of the main car park there is the Stoneyholme

Golf Club, which has a bar, serves food and welcomes fans on matchdays'. Paul Sawyers adds; 'I would recommend the Lakeland Gate for a drink on match days, which is a family friendly pub'. Also if you leave the M6 at Junction 43 and take the A69 towards Carlisle, then you will pass a recently opened Toby pub/carvery, which is not that far from the ground.

HOW TO GET THERE AND WHERE TO PARK.

The ground is easy to find. Leave the M6 at junction 43 and take the A69 towards Carlisle. After a mile the ground is on your right (look out for the statue of a footballer on the corner). The club car park (cost £2) can be found by taking the first right immediately after Brunton Park into Victoria Place and then turn first right onto St Aidans Road. Otherwise street parking.

LAST SEASON...

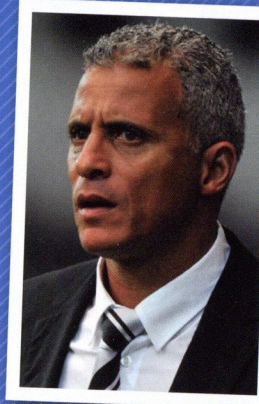
Carlisle suffered relegation from League 1 last season after finishing just three points above Boro, five points adrift of safety.

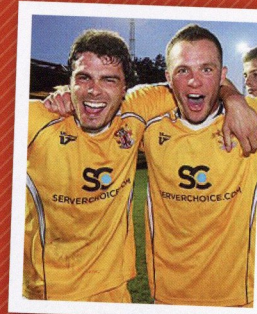
Despite this set-back Stanley were able to begin climbing the league but manager James Beattie left the club six games into the season, leaving the club's future up-in-the-air.
