SAM COLLINS SAYS HE WILL ASK HIS PLAYERS TO GIVE THEIR ALL THIS AFTERNOON AS THEY LOOK TO BUILD ON LAST WEEK'S FANTASTIC WIN AT EXETER CITY.

Good afternoon and welcome back to Victoria Park for our exciting Sky Bet League Two encounter against Luton Town.

I would like to start by welcoming John Still, his staff, players, officials and supporters to the north east; let's hope it's an entertaining game this afternoon.

Luton have made a good start to the season after winning promotion back to the Football League last year and I think John will be happy with the progress they have made so far.

They arrive at The Vic in good form having won a few games of late but that was the same sort of scenario we faced when we went to Exeter last week, who had won four league games in a row prior to our win there.

We're aware of Luton's strengths and we've let the players know about that; we've given them as much information as possible throughout the week but at the end of the day we need to focus on the job we need to do.

I'm confident that if we can put in the same kind of performance as we did against Exeter last Saturday then we will cause plenty of problems for teams in this division and give ourselves the chance to win lots more games than we lose.

My message to the players today is go out and match the standards they set last week; they've shown everyone what they can do but it's no good just winning one game – we need to win

two, then three, then keep carrying it on from there.


The most important thing right now is that this Club gets moving in the right direction up that league table. I've been at this Club a long time and I love it here; it hurts me to see our name near the wrong end of the division.

I can promise you that however long I am asked to do this job I will give it my absolute maximum and I will expect that of every one of my players and staff too. I know what Hartlepool fans are all about, I feel like I am from a similar background in that you demand hard work every game – I know you can accept mistakes but you won't accept lack of effort, and neither will I.

There's been a good feeling in the camp this week, just as there was before the game at Exeter and I think we're all really looking forward to this afternoon's game. Obviously getting that win last week just gives everyone a confidence injection too and we need to make sure we make the most of that when we go out there today.

As I say, everyone needs to be bang at it – everyone. I know there are players in the Reserves chomping at the bit to get in to this starting line-up so every player needs to watch their back and if they don't perform they won't play, it's as simple as that.

I was delighted that we were able to bring in Brian Honour on to the staff earlier this week and I have to say he's made an instant impact on the squad

at the training ground. He did some excellent work with the strikers and wide players on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday so hopefully that can help give them an extra edge.

Brian has vast experience; he's been there and done it with this Football Club and I wanted to tap in to that so I'm delighted he's going to be working with us. He's given everyone a big lift with his energy and enthusiasm, and I'm sure you'll all be very pleased he's back involved at the Club.

I would like to thank everyone who made the long trip to Exeter last weekend. I was so pleased we were able to put on such a good performance and get a great result for you all.

Finally, I would like to welcome the family of Michael Maidens who are here with us for the game this afternoon. It's the seventh anniversary of Michael's tragic passing this weekend and I know that everyone at the Club and all the fans will have him in their thoughts.



WE NEED YOUR SUPPORT

CHAIRMAN KEN HODCROFT GIVES US HIS LATEST VIEWS AHEAD OF THIS AFTERNOON'S GAME AT THE VIC.

Today we welcome Luton Town to Victoria Park after their period of absence in the Conference. We also welcome back all Hartlepool United supporters, some of who chanted "Cooper out" just two weeks ago – and got their wish within minutes of the final whistle. Others shouted similar remarks at the owners and may just get their wish sooner rather than later – but not due to the football on the pitch, the perceived lack of support for the (any) manager or the fact that other clubs' managers (Curle of Carlisle, in particular) seem to know more about how this Club is run and/or how it treats its players and manager than the owners do (reference: Hartlepool Mail page 39 02.10.14). No, none of those, but because Hartlepool Borough Council (HBC), are determined to do everything in their power to ensure that this Club fails. The lack of support to allow the Club to buy the land has been followed by their latest second letter threatening to implement rent increases going back to 2002. The public of this town elect this council so maybe the removal of IOR is the public's wish that HBC want to implement, if it is not then maybe chants of "HBC out" should be heard not just in this stadium but throughout the town. Let's be frank, the owners of this Club will not stand much more of the complete failure of HBC to support this Club which brings in annual revenue of £5 million into the town of Hartlepool by playing (at least) 23 home games and developing other benefits and positive publicity for the Town.

I said in my interview with the Hartlepool Mail immediately after Colin Cooper resigned that it is tough on a new manager to be shouted out – but that's football and fans are entitled to voice their opinion. However, it was Colin's decision and his record, for whatever

reason, of 16 wins, 13 draws and 28 defeats from 57 league games during his 16 months in charge would give any manager food for thought. However, despite what is reported, Colin did make the decisions to release players last summer, recruit his players into the Club and have faith in the dressing room. He had our full support in those decisions and the decisions when to sell players. He was fully aware of the financial constraints and the payment structure dictated by Peterborough regarding the income from the sale of Baldwin and James. Colin had to work within all that and the Football League's Salary Capping rules which are very tough when income into this Club is at a premium – especially compared to other clubs in our league who have some wealthy business sponsors, higher crowds and a larger away end to generate good away fan based income. Our investment in some of those aspects is restricted due to HBC refusing to sell the ground. Eight points from 33 in League Two this season that Colin and his players secured have left the Club in its current league position. No doubt managerial charge would have had to come eventually if there was no sign of improvement and if new players continued to fail to be identified or players within the squad not given the chance.

The appointment of Sam Collins to look after the team in the interim period has resulted in some of these on the pitch items being implemented. We both agreed within minutes of Colin leaving that the use of some of our young players should be implemented and that a fresh look at all the players was needed. Sam delivered at the Sheffield United game and away at Exeter City. He will be in charge again today and as I said in the Mail interview we are looking for

everyone to pull together on and off the field to support Sam. Even Brian Honour has shown his faith (not for the first time) in the Club and stepped in to help out.

As we continue the search for a new manager – and everyone who has applied and has the necessary qualifications and experience – will be carefully considered and those of interest will be put on a short list to be further reviewed. We ask the town of Hartlepool to fully support this Club going forward – it's just a pity that such a request continually falls on (some) elected deaf ears. But perhaps our local elected MP, a lifelong Hartlepool supporter, and based on the comments he made in his column in the Mail on 9th October, is listening.

However Sam's ears need to hear your positive noise and encouragement today – he really does need you behind him and the players right to the very end of today's game and perhaps, just perhaps, Sam can deliver again.

On a lighter note it is pleasing to see that the Club has been placed near the top of one league – that of the BBC's annual Price of Football survey. Our Season Ticket prices are one of the best in the league – fortunately we do hear and listen to what fans want to pay in order to make it affordable for families and individuals to attend.

Enjoy today's game.

Good afternoon and welcome to our League Two game with newly-promoted Luton Town. It is good to see them back in the Football League, I know it has been a tough few years for them but they seem to have turned things around now. We wish them all the very best (after today). I can remember some great games in the past with them; Shuggie's great performance and goal against them comes immediately to mind.

It's been a traumatic couple of weeks since our last home game. The surprising resignation of Colin put things into turmoil, but I must say the staff pulled together to keep things going and put things in place for the up and coming training and games and a big thank you to the team for their efforts.

The win at Exeter last weekend was much-needed and shows that we have players here who can turn things around and help us get back where we belong at the other end of the table. We know that the next appointment will probably be one of the biggest decisions the Club has ever made so we are ensuring that every angle is covered in our decision. We have had a vast number of applicants for the job but our appointment must have the knowledge of this league and the ambition to move us forward. As I have said, Big Sam and Stephen did a great job at Exeter by galvanising the

This week's football news has been dominated by the price of football in this country. The gap is widening between the Football League and the Premier League regarding finances. The costs have risen over twice the rate of inflation which is unbelievable considering the recession we have just experienced. The cost of some Season Tickets such as Arsenal at £2000 is astonishing in this day and age and in my opinion is taking football away from the working man. The Premier League is fast becoming a corporate dream, stadia being filled with customers/sponsors rather than fans and is now ruled by TV. TV dictates everything in the Premier League from kick-off times, changing the whole face of traditional

football at 3pm on Saturday to football almost non-stop six days per week at ridiculous times. TV also dictates player wages which again, in my opinion, are obscene. It would be interesting to see how many Premier League players are actually interested in the cost of football to the ordinary fan and what a huge chunk of their income this equates to, not many I would think.

The Football League reflects the true game in this country where football is affordable for the family, where families can come and be part of the Club and not just be a commodity. The people running the Premier League must realise this and ensure that the league is strong by supporting them financially by showing the enormous amounts of money received from TV companies.


Back to today's game. Let's hope that we can get another three points in our quest to move up the table. Get behind Sam, Stephen and the lads and make some noise.

I started playing for a team called Merton FC when I was about six I think.




8 WHAT POSITION DID YOU PLAY WHEN YOU WERE YOUNGER?


1 WHAT IS YOUR FAVOURITE TV SHOW?

CONTRARY TO WHAT SKY WOULD HAVE YOU BELIEVE, FOOTBALL DID IN FACT EXIST PRIOR TO 1992, INDEED QUITE A FEW PEOPLE EVEN ENJOYED IT. THIS SEASON, PHIL DUNN PRESENTS A SERIES LOOKING BACK ON FOOTBALL'S "LOST DECADE", IN.....

For the followers of Fourth Division Hartlepool United, the 1970s had represented a decade pretty much filled with failure. In fact "success" was measured in terms of how far we had finished from the bottom - with the top half of the Fourth Division table serving merely as decoration.

As The Conservatives came into power led by Mrs Thatcher, surely the Eighties would bring a new optimism, a new outlook, and an improved turn in fortunes for the perennial strugglers? Well, yes and no. We'll start at the beginning, eh?

The eighties hadn't been great to Pools as far as the FA Cup was concerned.

Following the home tie against Leeds United in 1979, the Club's participation in anything beyond the Second Round had been about as reliable as Billy Horner's clapped-out sponsored Datsun. So when an upturn in form at the beginning of the 1987/88 campaign saw John Bird's side suddenly finding the net with regularity (thanks to Baker and Toman), a cup run was most welcome.

It began with a First Round win at non-league Chorley, where goals from Baker and Dean Gibb saw Pools through on an afternoon marred by crowd trouble. I think I can safely say, given the near-thirty years timescale, it was 100% caused by supporters of Manchester City, who for some reason had taken umbrage to the vast army of Poolies on "their patch".

The Second Round was a much trickier visit to Bootham Crescent where Baker yet again notched - this time a late, late equaliser. That gave Pools a second stab at The Minstermen, who were coolly despatched 3-1 just three days later at The Vic on a night when Andy Toman was simply unplayable.

So it came to the Third Round draw, and whilst everybody was hoping for a Manchester United or a Liverpool, it was First Division Luton Town who would be

visiting the, at that point, ramshackle Vic. Frantic attempts to increase the capacity of the old girl were made, and it was only a few short

days before the match that it was decided by Cleveland County Council that 6,620 would be the maximum crowd allowed.

The Programme for the big game (pictured) played on the fact that a Third Round tie was indeed something special by including a scan of the programme from the famous "Busby Babes" cup game in 1957, and featured columns from John Smart the Chairman, Eddie Barnett on the commercial side and Skipper Tony Smith. Smart was the first out onto The Vic turf, arms aloft with his Pools scarf raised about his head.

The game kicked-off in cold conditions and for the first twenty minutes it was all Luton, albeit well marshalled by the Pools defence more especially Paul Haigh was stopping everything and everybody in his path, despite Luton missing their prolific striker Harford.



ANYONE REMEMBER?

"Life At The Bottom"? October 1989, and the Tyne Tees Television cameras were at The Vic for a week to film a half-hour special which would eventually be screened some two weeks later. Highlights (or rather lowlights) of the 1-2 home defeat to Cambridge United were interspersed with interviews of fans in the Mill House pub looking dolefully into their beers, whilst the late Frankie Baggs and Eddie Barnett tried to convince them that everything would be OK.



Manager Bob Moncur told his story of the bailiffs turning up to repossess the goalposts on his first day at the Club, and Club Secretary Mal Kirby, with a booted-down door clearly visible behind him, regales the tale of the latest burglary at the Club Offices, all to a soundtrack of the 1972 doom-and-gloom version of "Never Say Die".

The programme ends with a shot of a clearly shaken Moncur leaving the pitch at the end of the game with his head down. Just three weeks later he would be gone. Garry Gibson makes a cameo role with a "big cheque" too... wonder if it bounced?

To be fair to TTV, a year and a half later they came back to The Vic to record "Life At The TOP" after Pools had been transformed by Cyril Knowles and Alan Murray, just for balance's sake!



Brian Honour had also started the game well for the hosts, and he skipped past future Pools boss Danny Wilson on the Mill House side on 22 minutes to put in the first of a series of dangerous crosses. On the half hour Rob McKinnon, who had been a serious doubt right until kick-off time with pulled stomach muscles, almost gave Pools the lead when his mazy dribble and low shot had Sealey beaten low to the near post but it went inches wide.

In the last minute of the half, firstly Brian then just seconds later brother

Mark, had efforts ruled out for offside as the Stein family began to make their presence felt.

As the second half moved on, the First Division side began to dominate and on 49 minutes they took a deserved lead when Danny Wilson found Weir who finished well. On 76 minutes it was two as keeper Kevin Carr was left scrambling along the line as McDonough's effort crept in.

It took Pools until the 88th minute to respond when sub John Tinkler's shot was blocked and **ANDY TOMAN**

A KICK UP THE 80S



BYE BYE OLD FRIEND...

1982 and Pools legend Keith Houchen is allowed to leave the Club and sign for not Liverpool, not his hometown club Middlesbrough (as had been rumoured), but Leyton Orient for the unbelievably low fee of £20,000.

Making his Pools debut as a 17-year-old, Houchen's striking partnership with Bob Newton had accumulated over 150 goals as a pair, with Houchen notching 65 in just five seasons at the Club.

He later returned to The Vic as a player in 1994 before managing the Club - but not before scoring THAT goal in the FA Cup Final for Coventry.

HOW COULD YOU FORGET...

October 1983 and a Fourth Division game at Field Mill, Mansfield saw all 22 players that lined-up being "bought" on Free Transfers or "found" for nothing!

Sadly, Mansfield's freebies and cast-offs proved to be substantially better than the Hartlepool version, as Dave Caldwell ran riot in a 5-0 victory.

Chairman Smart was, of course, buzzing with the extra income and indeed it was only the following Monday that the Club announced that at last The Vic would be getting a new covered Rink End Terrace.

RECHARGED AND REFOCUSED

MICHAEL WOODS HAS ADMITTED THAT TAKING TIME OUT OF PROFESSIONAL FOOTBALL HAS HELPED HIM REKINDLE HIS LOVE FOR THE GAME – AND NOW HE'S HOPING HARTLEPOOL UNITED CAN REAP THE BENEFITS.

Once a £5million pound prospect on the books at Chelsea, the 24-year-old took a step back to refocus during a year with non-league Harrogate Town last term.

But after scoring his first goal in Pools colours in the 2-1 win at Exeter City seven days ago, Woods is now determined to repay the Club for giving him his second chance in football.

"I think I spent three or four years where I didn't play a lot and I think it's been well-documented the injury problems I've gone through," he told *The Blue Print*.

"I had some offers of trials up and down the country but I sort of swallowed my pride a little bit and felt like I wanted to go somewhere that I could enjoy playing football again."

"I didn't want the pressure anymore and I wanted to just enjoy playing again so I went to Harrogate for a year and I think it was brilliant for me."

"It's a really well-run club; the manager and everyone at the top of the club are really good people and they just gave me the freedom to go and play."

"After five or six games there I was already feeling strong physically and mentally, and I started to rediscover my love for the game and my hunger for it."

"I was grateful that Colin gave me the opportunity to come here during the summer and now I really want to try and repay the faith shown in me by Sam by keeping on performing as well as I can."

Woods sparkled during the much-needed victory in Devon last weekend and his brilliantly taken volleyed goal set the tone for a hugely impressive second half performance against The Grecians.

But the talented attacker has been around the block enough to know that it will take more than a win every few weeks for Pools to steer themselves clear of the foot of the division.

"It was a good weekend for us."

"It was certainly a better trip home; it was a long journey but made sweeter by the three points and there was a buzz in the changing rooms at training on Monday morning."

"We've been working hard in training and last

Saturday we got our rewards and there's no doubt in my mind that we thoroughly deserved it.

"We looked back at the game before we started training on Monday and it was amazing to see how many chances we created, particularly in the second half – we could have had four or five.

"But it's just one win; now we need to get a run of results going and make sure we move up the league table as quickly as possible.

"We have to try and build some momentum now and take the form we showed against Exeter in to Saturday's game; we've worked hard all week and we'll be ready.

"It was good to play my part and show people what I'm capable of so I've thanked Sam for the faith he has shown in me in the last couple of games.

"A few of the lads are feeling the same and there seems to be a real competition for places at the moment – the lads who have the shirts now know they are ours to lose.

"There's a great atmosphere within the Club; I always think people are tested when your backs are to the wall but even when we were at the bottom of the league the spirit has been second to none.

"If we can string some results together now then that will only get stronger so we have to keep working hard every day to keep our shirt and show why we should be in the team on a Saturday."

In terms of experience, Woods is still catching up – last week was just his 20th senior appearance and he remains confident that he and the team can keep getting better as time goes on.

With Woods, Dan Jones, Kieran Green and Lewis Hawkins all drafted in to the starting eleven of late there is a new competition for places at The Vic and Woods feels it's going to help the climb away from trouble.

"I think consistency can come from playing week in and week out."

"I am feeling stronger with each game; I managed my first ninety minutes against Sheffield United after coming in to pre-season a little late so I was happy with that."

"I think I will keep getting stronger as time goes on and I think the understanding

among the lads will grow too – there were new players who came in during the summer and more have come in on loan so the understanding is improving all the time.

"Sam has a lot of respect from the lads in the changing room – and that's by no means saying that the previous manager didn't – but I think there's a real fight for shirts at the minute and it's healthy competition."

"If you look at the bench we named last Saturday there are some big players on it with lots of Football League games under their belts."

"There's an edge in training which you will see if you watch a session because all of the lads want to be in the team and are determined to show they should be."

There were 93 Poolies in attendance as Pools collected all three points at Exeter last weekend and Woods was full of praise for their efforts to get behind the team.


But now he knows that it's important that the team back-up what they did in Devon when they return to more familiar surroundings against Luton Town this afternoon.

"We mentioned the travelling support at Exeter and to take as many as we did all that way was a great effort."

"But we're at home this weekend and it's always been said that if you want to achieve anything in any league then the home form needs to be right."

"The confidence is growing; I think the Sheffield United performance was an improvement and we built on that at Exeter but now we need to improve again and get three points against Luton."



At the end of February last year John Still was appointed to the hotseat at Luton Town following the departure of Paul Buckle.

Still's experience was seen as vital to The Hatters as they looked to reclaim their place in the Football League and it proved a wise choice as he guided the club to Conference title glory in his first full season in charge.


It was the third time that Still had taken a team in to the Football League as Champions having previously been at the helm for a decade at Dagenham & Redbridge.

Born in West Ham, Still came through the ranks as a player on the books at Leyton Orient having signed amateur terms with the club in 1967.

However, a knee injury suffered on his O's debut cut short his professional career and he went on to play his football in non-league with Bishop's Stortford, Leytonstone and Dagenham.

After a part-time managerial role at Leytonstone & Ilford, Still moved on to Maidstone United whom he guided to the Conference title in 1989 before moving on to Peterborough United and then Barnet.

In April 2004 he returned to non-league management with The Daggers and by 2007 he was once again celebrating promotion to the Football League after performing wonders on a limited budget.

The player this issue who headed overseas under the 'scope is a player from the late 60s who most Pools fans will remember – **ERNIE PHYTHIAN**.

Bolton-born (1942) Ernie joined hometown club Bolton Wanderers straight from school, impressing them as a youth for Lancashire Schoolboys. Understudy to the one and only Nat Lofthouse, Ernie managed to make his debut aged just seventeen, but due to the strength of the side there he just managed to break into double figures, netting three goals before moving to Wrexham in a desire to play First Team football in January 1962. He spent three and a half

decent years in North Wales rattling in 43 goals in his 136 outings. Form like this didn't go unnoticed and it was a former Wrexham player in the guise of Alvan Williams who liked what he saw. The then Pools manager signed Ernie in the summer of '65, but himself moved on to Southend before Ernie could play for him. Ernie then played for Pools under a struggling Geoff Twentyman and then the unique Brian Clough.

In a side blessed with great team spirit and drive, Ernie excelled under Clough and his assistant Peter Taylor. In fact he topped the scoring charts for all of Division Four in season 1966/67. Ernie scored a


total of 40 goals for the Club under Clough and never missed a game. However, when Clough moved onwards and upwards at the end of that season, Ernie's time at The Vic became less enjoyable under Gus McLean and, despite his obvious prowess and hot form, they never saw eye to eye. Clubs soon got wind of the fall out and Colchester, Lincoln and Southend all sniffed around The Vic for the chance of signing the want-away forward. Talks started and broke down, the deal to move away from The Vic just wasn't affordable for Ernie even in those days.

Almost from nowhere, an offer came in from South Africa where football was starting to expand. An unbelievable financial offer saw the 26-year-old head there, tempted by the weather and lifestyle as well as the chance to settle there after the game, where he thought he may have better prospects.



After 55 goals in 135 games, Ernie was no longer a Poolie, he was on the book of Southern Suburbs. He stayed with them until 1975 when he eventually called it a day with them, spending the last four years as player-manager, later managing a Portuguese owned side called Lusitano, for whom he had a former Pools colleague Wilson Hepplewhite as captain for a while. He also spent time with Greek-owned side called Corinthians, before finally retiring from the pro game in 1976, playing amateur football right up until 2001, playing, coaching and finally becoming Chairman of Johannesburg outfit The Wanderers. After the game Ernie, prior to eventually retiring, became an executive in a luxury car salesroom and a keen golfer.

OVERSEAS POOLIE

A player not from these shores who had a stint with the Club during 1999 was Norwegian defender Rune Vindheim. Born deep in fjord territory in Hoyanger on the east coast of Norway, Rune learnt his trade with localish side Forde, before joining Brann Bergen and then Sogndal. It wasn't until he was with Asane that he got some regular games under his belt, which saw him move to Fana where his form earned him a move to Burnley in October 1998, making his debut the following day as a sub at Maine Road in a Championship game against Manchester City. He lasted just two months in the First Team, playing ten times, scoring twice. When he was released, Pools' Norwegian contacts saw him join the Club on trial and, after impressing, he joined in the summer of 1999. However, with competition for places from Barron, Westwood and Lee he lost his place after being a regular for a short period, making just eight starts. Despite this initial promise, he was allowed to return to Norway and joined Forde again, later playing for Haugesund and Fana. After quitting playing he became assistant coach at Fana in 2010 and became manager the following year, guiding them to promotion to the Norwegian Second Division.







ARMSTRONG REVEALS GOALS

YOUTH TEAM HOTSHOT DYLAN ARMSTRONG IS DETERMINED TO TAKE EVERY OPPORTUNITY THAT COMES HIS WAY TO IMPRESS THE HIERARCHY AT POOLS THIS SEASON AS HE LOOKS TO EARN A PROFESSIONAL DEAL AT VICTORIA PARK.

The 17-year-old front man has hit the net six times already for the Youth Team this season, including an eye-catching four-goal haul during their 6-3 win over Rotherham United in August.

And while he's happy to be among the goals early in the campaign, Armstrong knows that he must keep on producing consistently if he is to reach his goals off the pitch.

"I'm happy with my own season so far; I've scored a few goals and played quite well so I'm pleased with that and need to keep on doing it," he told *The Blue Print*.

"It's a really important season for me obviously because my fate will be decided at the end of it in terms of whether I get a professional deal or not.

"That means I have to take every chance I can to impress and work as hard as I possibly can to keep on improving."

Armstrong has also been a regular in Reserves squads this season and was on the bench again in midweek as the second string travelled to Doncaster Rovers.

And the talented teenager is adamant that he will use his exposure to Reserve football as a means to improving his game and is delighted to have been involved so much.

"I think when you're included in the Reserves you have to be happy with that and make the most of it.

"I try to be as comfortable as I can in the environment and learn as much as I can too, especially from any senior players who are alongside you in the squad.

"It's a big step up when you make the transition from Youth Team to Reserves, especially in terms of the physicality, so it's hard work but it's really enjoyable too.

"Everything about the game is different in the Reserves but it's important that you take every chance you have to impress and that's

certainly what you can do in Reserve football."

Over the last couple of weeks Kieran Green has emerged as a First Team contender under Sam Collins, while Connor Smith has also been knocking at the door for a place.

And Armstrong says seeing their teammates pushing for places in the senior eleven makes all of the players in the Youth Team hungry to follow that path.

"I think it shows that at this Club there is a route for young players right through to the First Team and that's encouraging for us all.

"To see the likes of Kieran and Connor getting their chances can show us all what can happen if you work hard and try to improve.

"Sam is keen to give young players their chance and he's not been afraid to use Kieran and Connor so hopefully I can force my way through and get an opportunity too."

In the short term, one of Armstrong's main priorities is to try and help the Youth Team rediscover their best form after a troublesome start has seen them lose five of their first seven outings.

"I don't think we've been playing that badly in all honesty.

"Last week was really disappointing because we were 2-0 up at half time and really we should go and win the game from that point but we've ended up throwing it away and losing 3-2.

"There have been too many individual errors made by us which is sloppy obviously and we've been working hard in training to try and make sure they don't keep happening.

"I feel like we're improving in the last few games overall but we need to keep that going now."
