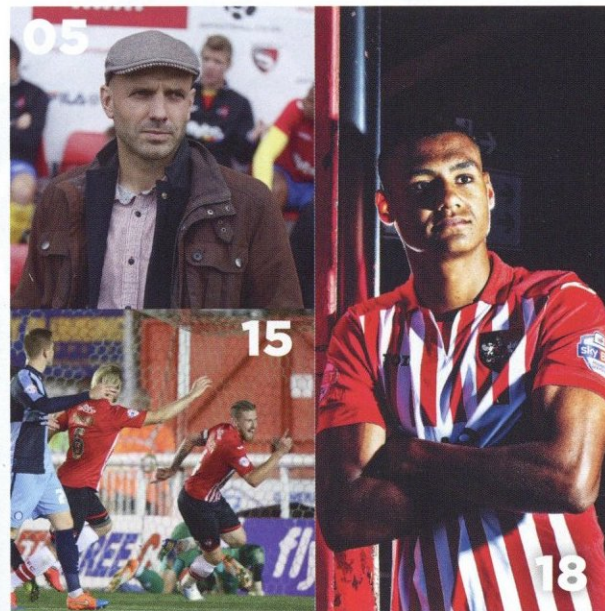

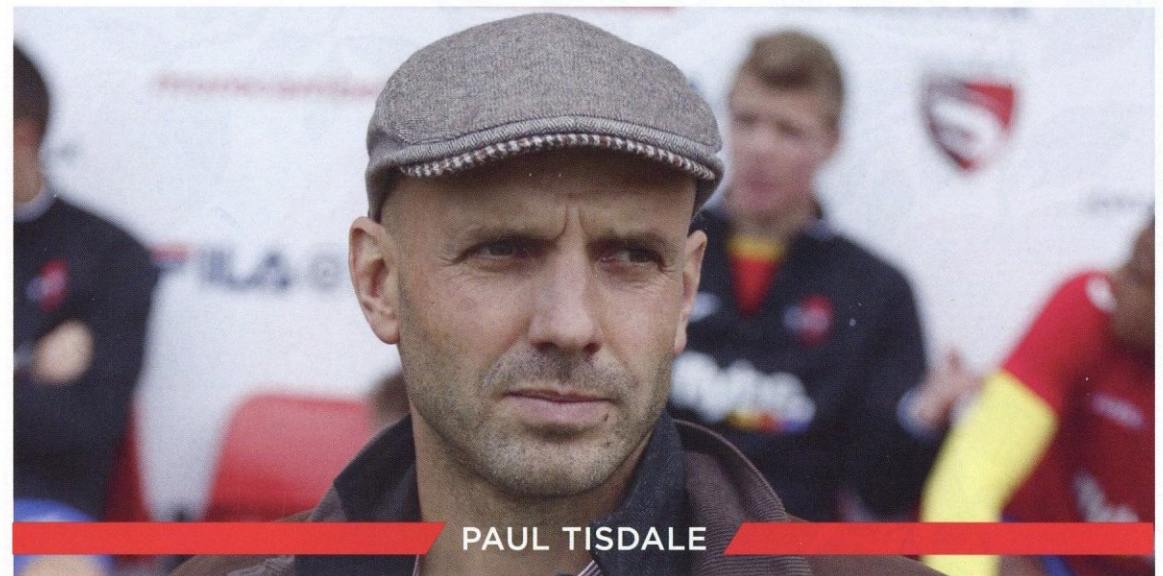

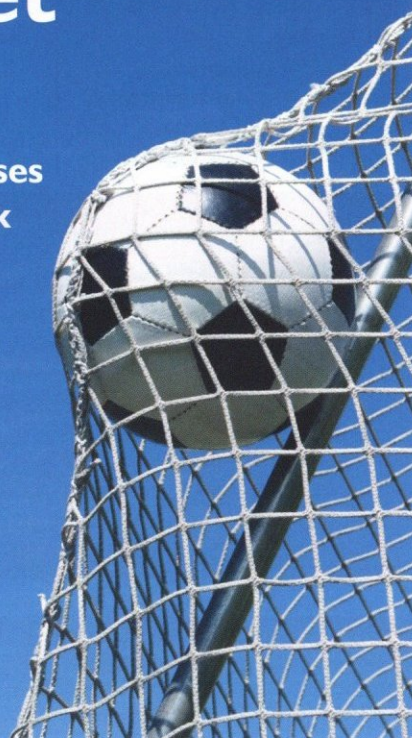

us in the early 1970s, is highlighted in today's programme.

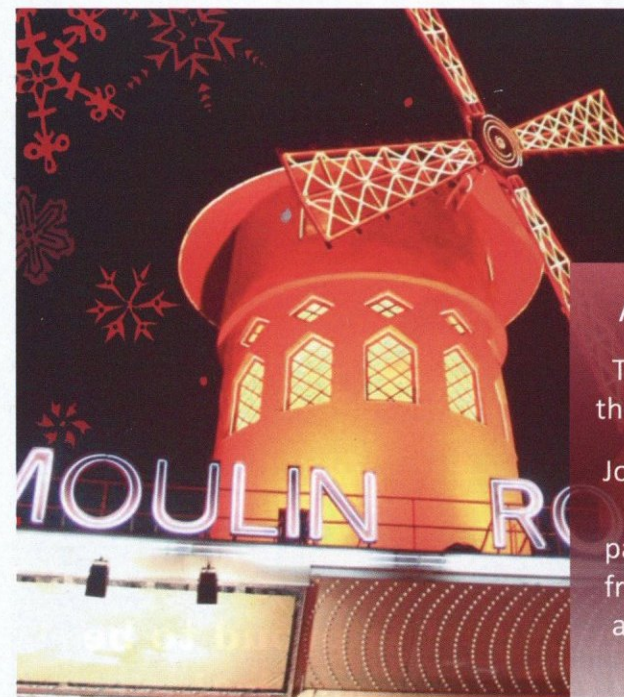

### Welcome to our friends from Flybe

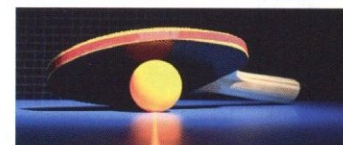

The visiting Chairboys took an early lead in the evening fixture as Peter Murphy rose to guide home a cross from Sam Wood from the left. A fine, stretching save by City stopper prevented Paul Hayes from scoring a second for Wycombe.

But Exeter were soon level through David Wheeler – he set away Graham Cummins who couldn't beat Matt Ingram under pressure, but winger Wheeler was alive to follow in and send the Big Bank into raptures.

Paul Tisdale sent his troops out in a different formation for the second period, and it was captain Scot Bennett – now up front – that won a free-kick for Matt Grimes to deliver. Cummins initial effort was saved but Bennett hammered in the rebound to win it for Exeter. ■

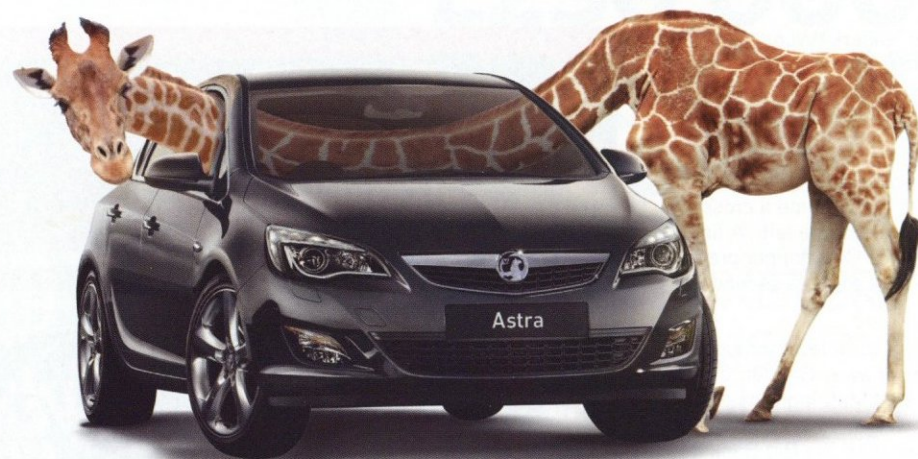

**T**he Grecians made it consecutive wins with a 2-0 victory at the expense of Morecambe at the Globe Arena last Sunday.

Jimmy Keohane had already gone close with a left-footed volley when Exeter took an early lead – Arron Davies aimed a cross at Graham Cummins at the back post but Shaun Beeley provided a helping hand as he turned into his own net.

City had plenty of chances to extend the lead, including a headed effort from David Wheeler as Craig Woodman hung up a cross, only for Scott Davies to produce an incredible diving save.

The slim scoreline kept things a touch nervy going into the closing stages, and a long-range effort by striker Jack Redshaw found Christy Pym alert between the sticks to keep his sheets clean.

And victory was sealed a minute from time when David Noble released fellow sub Tom Nichols, who sold the goalkeeper and smashed in from inside the six-yard box. ■

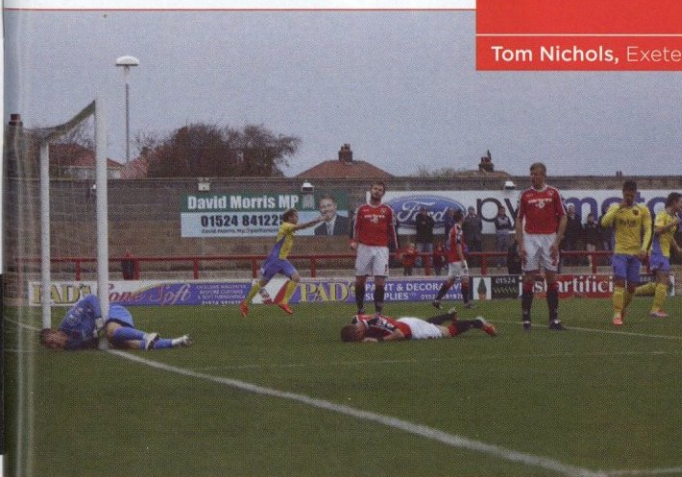

# THE BIG INTERVIEW

## NEW OPPORTUNITIES

**C**ity forward Ollie Watkins, alongside the three others boys that graduated from the Academy this summer, will have experienced plenty of new opportunities in recent months.

Earning a pro contract brings with it a bulk of other experiences. The media want to arrange interviews, every shot and tackle is snapped by photographers, and they're suddenly turned into digital effigies on computer games like FIFA and Football Manager – not that that has fazed Ollie.

And while young pros are cast more into the public eye than they are at youth level, conversely playing time often proves harder to come by.

18-year-old Watkins has played three times for the Grecians so far this season – netting his first goal against Coventry City in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy – and so far he has been enjoying the whole experience of stepping up to the first team.

"It's been a good change," says Ollie. "I have gone from playing in the youth team week-in week-out to only getting a look-in once in a while.

"That's tough, but I'm really enjoying it. I feel like I have improved a lot during these past few months and I'm getting used to the physical side of it. It is a big change to be playing against men and more experienced players, but that has helped me a lot.

"When I came on against Coventry, I really enjoyed playing alongside Danny Butterfield – he has had a really good career. He always trusts me on the ball and helps me in every way possible really. All the older players do generally – they're such a great bunch to be around.

"I think the biggest thing I have learned is about decision-making. That can be off the pitch such as preparing better and getting into the gym a bit more, or it might be decisions on the ball. In the youth team I would sometimes try to beat a player in my own half, but now I'm more likely to set the ball off and spin.

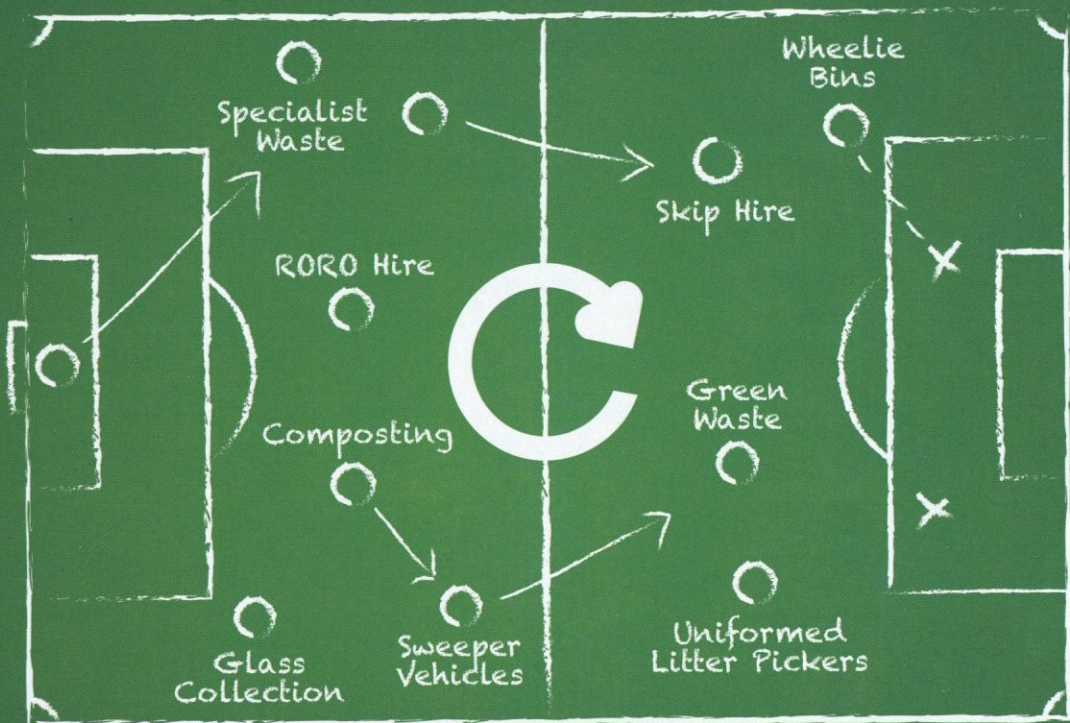
"When you step up to this level, it's a case of trying to be more mature in everything that you do. I don't think Tis is worried about my attacking play – I think the thing that I need to show him is in my defensive play and proving that I can be trusted to do that side of the game."

The forward's three appearances to date add to a single game from the bench on the final day of the 2013/14 campaign, as City beat Hartlepool 2-0 at Victoria Park when he was still on the under-18 books.

Ollie has certainly got a few people off their seats with his entertaining and attacking style, and he is pleased to have ticked off a few rites of passage in his fledgling career already. >>

However his next goal is to feature a bit more prominently for Exeter, and he is hoping to earn a place on a starting teamsheet in the near future.

"It was really nice to make my debut at the end of last season against Hartlepool when I was only a second-year scholar," he continues. "That was a good opportunity for me to see what the game is like and get a feel for League 2 football compared to what I had been used to in the youth team."

"And scoring a goal against Coventry was just the best feeling. I would have loved for it to have been the winner, but beggars can't be choosers! I'm just glad I've got a goal to open the account, and now hopefully I can continue that and get more."

"I've scored goals at youth level, but that one at Coventry had the most meaning to me really, as that was my first career goal. Sometimes at youth level you'll come across teams that aren't great and you can end up scoring two or three, and it doesn't necessarily give you the confidence that I got from the one at Coventry."



I'm really happy to be the **Kick It Out ambassador** – it has already given me a **few chances** to see and do some **different things**.



"I am hopeful that I'll get a start sometime soon – I know I have to be patient and keep working and hopefully that will come."

"We're on a roll at the moment – even though I'm not featuring too much, it's really good to be around the ground when it's a great atmosphere. Hopefully I'll soon earn a chance to show what I can do."

And Ollie was all set to make his fifth appearance of his career last weekend at Morecambe, only for a quickly-taken throw-in to deny him a chance to notch another late appearance at the Globe Arena.

Ollie explains: "It was the 91st minute and I had my jumper and trousers on, with my warm-up top underneath – Tis turned and said, 'Ollie, you're on'."

"I stripped down as quick as I could, got my shirt on, and Morecambe took the throw-in and I had to wait, and then the ball didn't go out of play again. The fourth official looked over and said, 'there's only a few seconds left mate'."

"Then the whistle blew, so I didn't get to make that appearance! But never mind – maybe next time I'll get to come on and get involved in the game, and look to grab another goal."

But it isn't just on the pitch that Ollie has been gathering new and exciting experiences.

He was invited by the club's One Game One Community group to be the Kick It Out ambassador for the forthcoming season, a role which he willingly accepted.

The theme of today's Kick It Out fixture is Race Equality in Football. And while racism in football is now being tackled head-on and is no longer tolerated, there is still work to be done.

The opportunity to be the club's ambassador has already provided Ollie with some eye-opening experiences.

"We're lucky that we live in a society where people are largely treated the same now," continues the 18-year-old. "Problems still occur occasionally, which is why the work that Kick It Out does is important, and I'm really happy to be the ambassador – it has already given me a few chances to see and do some different things. >>





"I went along to Exeter Mosque recently with Football in the Community – to be honest I didn't really know what to expect at first, but it was great. Everyone there was really welcoming and really funny with some great banter! Then they cooked us a traditional meal which was brilliant.

"I didn't realise just how many of the people there would be so passionate about football. They were all interested in what I do and asking all sorts of questions – and they were also really keen on all sorts of other sports as well. They were really happy to make me welcome there so I think they enjoyed it too.

"I had a conversation with one of the guys there about fasting – it really opens your eyes to other people's cultures. It makes you realise that you've always got to stay humble.

"No matter where you're from, everyone loves football – a few of them were asking for some tips for what they should do on and off the pitch, so I tried to pass on some advice where I could.

"A lot of the people I met there said they already come to St James Park – hopefully there'll be a lot of them there for the Luton game, and hopefully they'll enjoy it and we'll be trying to get a win in front of them."

Ollie also represented the club at Football in Community's International Tournament this summer, which fell on World Cup final day, and saw teams from numerous communities around Exeter coming together for a festival of football.

It hammered home the role that these kind of initiatives play in binding people together in society regardless of race, creed and colour.

"There were some good players there, and you can tell that not that many of them often get the opportunity to play in tournaments like that against other teams," Ollie says.

"That makes those kinds of events really important, and you could see that everyone took it really seriously and really enjoyed it as well.

"When you're out on the field playing football – or even if you're down the park and someone asks you to come and play – it's just the best feeling.

"Whether it's playing with random people or having a kickabout with mates, it is just great fun. You're there to play football and that only really – at that moment you don't care about anything off the field." ■

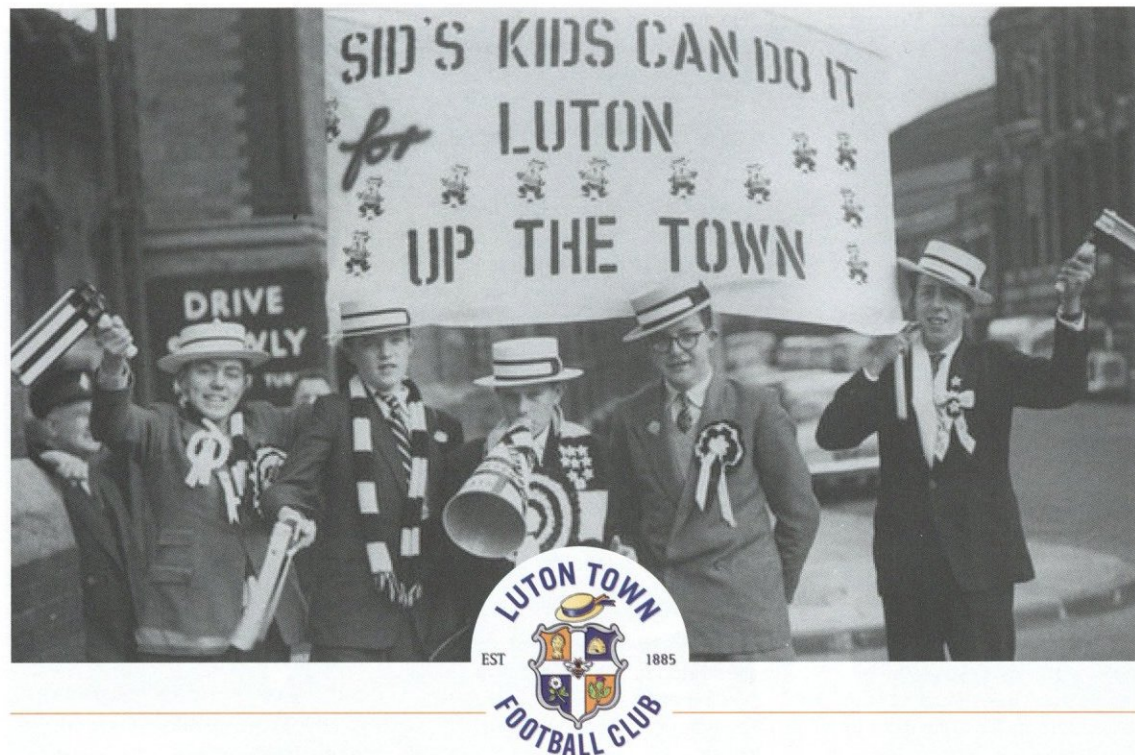

## INTRODUCING LUTON TOWN

**W**e're making a habit of this here at St James Park this season. For the third time in 2014/15, the Sky Bet League 2 leaders come to the home of Exeter City, and Luton Town will hope to do what Bury and Wycombe Wanderers before them have tried and failed to do – that being to leave SJP with any points for their efforts.

Last year was a season of success at Luton Town as the Hatters finally earned promotion back to the Football

League as Conference Premier champions.

They were well worth the league title, breaking the hundred-point barrier and scoring 102 goals. The highlight of the season (other than winning the league, of course) was the setting of a new club-record 27-game unbeaten run that saw them reach the league's summit in December, a position they would not relinquish.

Town's success was in large part down to the goalscoring prowess of Andre Gray, who got 30 goals in the league

alone. He has now left for Brentford but so far Mark Cullen has stepped up to that plate, scoring eight times, including a hat-trick a fortnight ago in Luton's 3-1 Kenilworth Road victory over Dagenham & Redbridge.

As their current league standing implies, the players have also taken like a duck to water in the Football League, as a 1-0 home win over Northampton Town last weekend completed a tremendous rise up the table which has seen a run of seven wins in a row. In fact, only the Grecians can come close to



matching the Hatters' eight-win record over the last nine games, with Paul Tisdale's side having won six – Wycombe, Exeter and Newport have only tasted defeat once in their previous nine, but of those it's City who have won the most games during that time. That implies we'll be in for a treat with this clash of the division's form sides.

37-year-old goalkeeper Mark Tyler and his defenders have a lot to do with Luton's lofty position at this stage in the season, with the Hatters having only conceded ten goals up to this point. Only Plymouth Argyle (eight) can better that figure, while those two sides also lead the way as far as clean sheets are concerned in this division, Argyle's Luke McCormick in front on eight and Tyler close behind with six.

Despite all of that success, Town midfielder Luke Guttridge insisted this week that going top of League 2 meant nothing to the players after chipping

in with the goal that sent John Still's side two points clear last Saturday against former club Northampton.

"It's brilliant for the club and fans," he told BBC Three Counties Radio. "But as players it means absolutely nothing. We're in October, there's a lot of football to go. Two or three bad results and you could be mid-table."

Barnstaple-born Guttridge came off the bench to down the Cobblers after not having started for the Hatters in five weeks. "It's how football seems to go these days, players scoring against their old clubs," said the 32-year-old former Southend United player. "From a personal point of view, I'm delighted to get on the pitch and get a winning goal."

"It's Roy of the Rovers stuff. Ask any footballer, when you're not playing it's a frustrating time. All you can do is be ready when you get a chance." ■

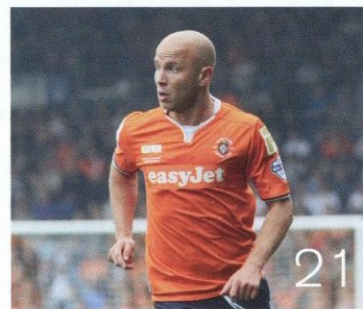
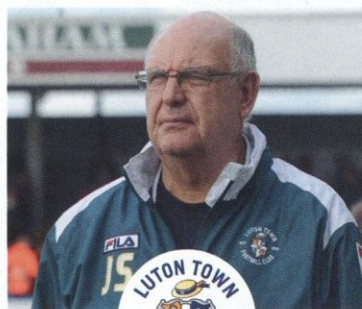
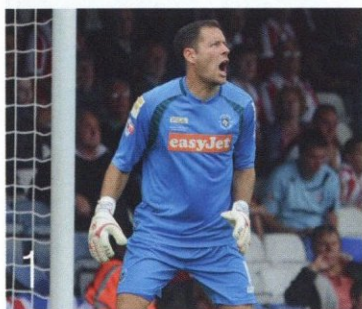

# IN OPPOSITION

## MANAGER JOHN STILL

John Still won promotion to the Football League for the second time with Luton's Conference title last season. He had previously achieved the feat with Dagenham & Redbridge in 2007; three years later he would guide the Daggers to League 1 via the play-offs. As a player, Still only played one Football League match, for Leyton Orient against Torquay United, and was injured. He has been more successful as a manager, overseeing Dagenham, Peterborough, Barnet, Bristol Rovers (as assistant) and now Luton. Still also has a track record for talent-spotting: the likes of Marlon King, Craig Mackail-Smith and Dwight Gayle were all developed under Still's guidance.

## 1 GK MARK TYLER

A hugely experienced goalkeeper, Tyler made over 400 appearances for Peterborough United before switching to Kenilworth Road in 2009. Voted Luton's Player of the Year in 2010/11, Tyler played all 46 games as the Hatters won the Conference title last season, keeping clean sheets in exactly half of those.

## 16 GK ELLIOT JUSTHAM

Up-and-coming goalkeeper Justham was signed from East Thurrock on a two-year deal in May 2013. The 6'3" stopper kept 14 clean sheets in 31 matches for the Rocks in 2012/13. He played in all of the Hatters' cup ties last season, and previously went on trial with both West Ham United and Reading.

## 5 DF STEVE McNULTY

A cult favourite due to his imposing frame, Luton captain McNulty has built a reputation for scoring spectacular goals and possesses a showboating skillset rarely seen in a big man. He led Fleetwood Town to the Conference title in 2011/12, and was an ever-present as Luton repeated that feat last season.

## 6 DF ALEX LACEY

Centre-half Lacey made his debut as a 17-year-old in an FA Trophy first-round tie against Welling in 2009, a game in which he was named man of the match. He spent 2012/13 on loan at Conference South side Eastleigh, but began the following season as Luton captain. He scored his first goal for Luton in the 4-0 win at Woking in September 2013.

## 12 DF SCOTT GRIFFITHS

Left-back Griffiths signed for Luton at the end of the 2012/13 season after impressing on his initial short-term deal. Formerly of Dagenham & Redbridge, he first linked up with the Hatters in March 2012 following his release from Peterborough United. He won the League 2 title with Chesterfield in 2011, before winning the Conference with Luton last season.

## 22 DF MICHAEL HARRIMAN

Now in the last few days of his emergency loan spell from Queens Park Rangers, defender Harriman is an Under-21 international with the Republic of Ireland. He previously had successful loan spells with Wycombe Wanderers and Gillingham, and played 38 times for the Gills in League 1 last term.

## 30 DF LUKE WILKINSON

A centre-half who had previously played under John Still at Dagenham & Redbridge, Wilkinson was the Daggers' player of the season in 2012/13. He won the Conference South with Dartford, and has also previously been with Portsmouth, Northampton Town, Eastleigh and Boreham Wood.

## 4 MF JONATHAN SMITH

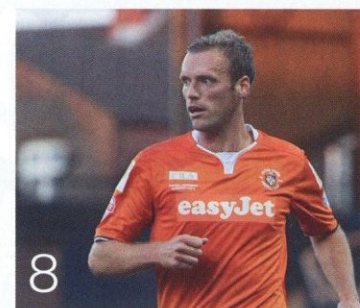
Combative midfielder Smith was signed from York City in January 2013 following a successful loan spell. He sustained what at first appeared to be a season-ending broken leg on Boxing Day last year, but his recovery was swift, and he made an emotional comeback as a substitute in the final match of the title-winning campaign.

## 7 MF ALEX LAWLESS

Amid offers from two League 1 clubs, creative midfielder Lawless signed a new two-year contract with the Hatters in May 2013. He was named both the club's Player of the Year and Players' Player of the Year in 2012/13, and has passed a hundred Hatters appearances. The Welshman began his career with Fulham.

## 8 MF ANDY DRURY

Drury returned to Luton last summer for a second spell having spent the 2010/11 season at Kenilworth



Road. He was a regular for Ipswich Town in the Championship until a change of manager saw him find first-team opportunities limited. He re-joined the club from Crawley Town, who he left Ipswich for in 2013.

## 11 MF JAKE HOWELLS

Young winger Howells, who can also play at left-back or in central midfield, came through the ranks at Kenilworth Road. A former England C international, Howells has also represented Wales at Under-21 level, eligible through one of his grandfathers. He has two goals this season, and they came at Accrington and in the 2-0 home win over Oxford United.

## 15 MF LUKE ROONEY

Midfielder Rooney signed a six-month deal with Luton in the summer having represented the Hatters in the final two months of their Conference-winning campaign. He signed for Swindon from Gillingham in 2010 and helped the Robins to the League 2 title in 2013, before departing for Maidstone on non-contract terms in early-2014.

## 17 MF PELLY RUDDOCK MPANZU

Signed from West Ham United in January, Ruddock Mpanzu had previously been on loan with the Hatters, making his debut for the club at centre-back against Staines in the FA Trophy. He scored in Luton's home draw with Bury earlier in the campaign.

## 21 MF LUKE GUTTRIDGE

Experienced central midfielder Guttridge has over 450 senior appearances to his name, and signed with Luton Town in August 2013. He won two promotions while with Southend, and also has two Football League Trophy winners' medals. He scored 13 goals in 33 games before a foot injury curtailed his season in March.



## 26 MF NATHAN DOYLE

A part of the Bradford City side that won the League 2 play-offs in 2012/13 as well as making the League Cup final that same season, Doyle penned a one-year contract with the Hatters this past summer. He came through the youth ranks at hometown club Derby, before spells with the likes of Preston, Barnsley and Hull City.

## 9 ST PAUL BENSON

Striker Benson made the switch from Dagenham & Redbridge last summer. He top-scored for the Hatters with 18 goals in all competitions during a season-long loan spell last term, though he was even more prolific with the Daggers, scoring over 75 goals as they won two promotions. Benson was promoted from League 2 with Swindon Town in 2011/12.

## 13 ST MARK CULLEN

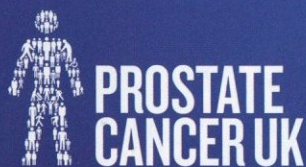
22-year-old striker Cullen scored a hat-trick two weeks ago in Luton's 3-1 Kenilworth Road win over Dagenham & Redbridge, taking his tally for the season to eight overall. Cullen was signed on a two-year deal following his departure from Premier League-bound Hull City in summer 2013. He made his debut for Hull in their previous Premier League stint, so has experience at the highest level.

## 19 ST RICKY MILLER

Last season's Conference North top-scorer and player of the year, Miller was snapped up from Boston having ended the campaign with a haul of 28 goals. Previously in non-League with Rothwell and Stamford, he began his career as a youngster with Charlton. John Still has described him as like 'a cross between Kevin Phillips and Craig Mackail-Smith'. He recently returned from a loan spell with Dover.

## DEFINING MOMENTS



Football historian **Leigh Edwards** selects **ten key matches** and **events** that have shaped **Luton Town's post-war era.**

### 1955 - TOP-FLIGHT HATTERS

Gordon Turner scored 32 goals as Luton Town won promotion to the top-flight for the first time in 1954/55. The Hatters began with a 3-0 victory at home to Nottingham Forest and soared up the Second Division table with six straight wins. Gordon Turner grabbed a hat-trick as Luton

trounced Blackburn 7-3 and they triumphed 5-1 at Nottingham Forest. Dally Duncan's side maintained their challenge, slamming four goals past Hull City, Rotherham United, Liverpool and Port Vale. Tom Aherne and Shay Dunne were ever-present as Luton pipped Rotherham to the runners-up slot on goal average with a 3-0 win at Doncaster.

### 1959 - FA CUP FINALISTS

Luton Town were FA Cup finalists for the first and only time in 1958/59. The Hatters were unbeaten in their opening ten First Division games, trouncing Manchester City 5-1 and scoring four goals past West Ham and

Preston. They recovered from a lean spell to beat Arsenal 6-3 and Burnley 6-2, then top scorer Allan Brown netted four goals in a 5-1 demolition of Nottingham Forest but poor results over the closing weeks saw them finish below mid-table. Luton defeated Leeds 5-1, Leicester 4-1, Ipswich 5-2, Blackpool 1-0 and Norwich 1-0 in the FA Cup before Syd Owen's side lost 2-1 to Nottingham Forest in the final.

### 1968 - FOURTH DIVISION TITLE

Bruce Rioch netted 24 goals as Luton won the Fourth Division title in 1967/68. New captain Terry Branston made his



debut as the Hatters kicked off with a 1-1 draw at Wrexham and Ian Buxton arrived from Derby in September. Luton lost just two of their first 18 matches and beat Charlton in the League Cup first round, scoring 27 goals in a run of eight successive wins. Allan Brown's side went top of the table with a 2-0 win at Brentford in February and Keith Allen, Max Dougan, Fred Jardine, John Moore and Ray Whittaker also starred as they remained in pole position, clinching the title with a 4-0 victory over Crewe.

#### 1970 - PROMOTION WINNERS

Malcolm Macdonald scored 25 times as Luton Town won promotion in 1969/70. The Hatters had narrowly missed promotion the previous season and Bruce Rioch was sold to Aston Villa for a record fee, with Alec Stock signing Malcolm Macdonald, John Ryan and John Collins. Luton were early leaders after remaining unbeaten in their opening 13 matches, recruiting Chris Nicholl from Halifax and Matt Tees from Charlton. Malcolm Macdonald grabbed hat-tricks in 5-0 wins over Bradford City and Reading, with Luton unbeaten in their last six matches and clinching promotion as Third Division runners-up with a 0-0 draw at Mansfield.

#### 1974 - FIRST CLASS RETURN

Luton Town regained top-flight status after an absence of 14 years in 1973/74. The Hatters recovered from a 4-0 defeat at Nottingham Forest on the opening day to hammer Carlisle 6-1, embarking on an eight-match unbeaten run. Harry Haslam signed Alan West from Burnley and Jimmy Husband from Everton as Luton maintained their promotion challenge. Husband netted a hat-trick in a 3-1 victory over rivals Orient, then leading marksman Barry Butlin scored three in a 4-2 win over Preston. Alan Garner and Bobby Thomson were ever-present and other

stars included Peter Anderson and John Ryan as Luton finished runners-up.

#### 1982 - SECOND DIVISION CHAMPIONS

David Pleat guided Luton Town to the Second Division title in 1981/82. The Hatters had narrowly missed promotion in the previous two years and Tony Grealish was swapped for Brighton's Brian Horton. They raced to the top by winning their first three games and hammered rivals Watford 4-1, then Steve White scored four times in a 6-0 demolition of Grimsby. Richard Money arrived from Liverpool and was an influential figure as Luton were unbeaten in their last 14 matches. Leading marksman Brian Stein, Mal Donaghy, Kirk Stephens and Steve White were all ever-present as Luton won the title with 88 points.

#### 1988 - LEAGUE CUP WINNERS

Ray Harford plotted Luton Town's 1988 League Cup final triumph. Danny Wilson replaced Peter Nicholas in midfield, while Micky Weir arrived from Hibernian and Mike Newell moved to Leicester. The Hatters won 5-2 at Oxford and Ian Allinson was signed from Stoke in October, with Luton losing just twice in 12 matches including a 7-4 win in the return match against Oxford, finishing ninth in the top-flight. They defeated Wigan 5-2, Coventry 3-1, Ipswich 1-0, Bradford City 2-0 and Oxford 3-1 in the League Cup before beating Arsenal 3-2 in the final. Luton were also FA Cup semi-finalists and Simod Cup finalists.

#### 1989 - WEMBLEY FINALISTS AGAIN

Luton Town were League Cup finalists for the second consecutive season in 1988/89. Departures were Brian Stein, Mark Stein and Andy Dibble, while newcomers included Roy Wegerle, John Dreyer and Steve Williams. Luton's first home win

was 1-0 against Liverpool and they beat Southampton 6-1 in January but First Division form was generally disappointing, with the Hatters narrowly avoiding relegation by winning three of their last four games. Luton defeated Burnley 2-1, Leeds United 2-0, Manchester City 3-1, Southampton 2-1 and West Ham 5-0 in the League Cup before losing 3-1 to Nottingham Forest in the final.

#### 2002 - THIRD DIVISION RUNNERS-UP

Steve Howard scored 24 times as Luton Town won promotion in 2001/02. Joe Kinnear's side were early leaders after winning their opening two matches and newcomer Carl Griffiths netted a hat-trick in a 5-1 win over Torquay. The Hatters briefly regained pole position after beating Darlington 5-2 in October, signing Chris Coyne from Dundee, Jean-Louis Valois from Lille, Dean Crowe from Stoke, Ahmet Brkovic from Orient and Dave Bayliss from Rochdale. A run of 12 successive wins, slamming five goals past Halifax and Mansfield, took Luton back to the top with two games remaining but they finished runners-up to Plymouth.

#### 2005 - RECORD POINTS TOTAL

Mike Newell managed Luton Town to the League 1 title in 2004/05. The Hatters stormed to the top of the table, winning 10 of their first 12 games before three successive defeats. They beat Bradford City 4-0 and Wrexham 5-1, then Steve Howard netted a hat-trick in a 4-1 win at MK Dons. The 1-0 victory over Port Vale in December heralded a 14 match unbeaten run and Luton bounced back from a 3-1 defeat in the return fixture to hammer Bristol City 5-0. Briefly displaced as leaders by Hull, they triumphed 4-1 at Torquay and secured promotion with four games remaining. Luton won the title with a record 98 points. ■

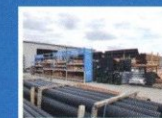

## DID YOU KNOW...

BY JACOB SCRIVENS

... that the club's formation was a result from a meeting of two existing teams in the Town Hall? On 11th April 1885 in Luton Town Hall, a meeting was held between two Wanderers and Excelsior on the possible merger to join to form one football club. The Wanderers had changed their name to 'Luton Town' three months to the meeting but nonetheless Luton Town Football Club was formed.

... that the first Luton Town strip included caps? The initial strip was navy blue and vibrant pink halves with caps of the same design. After a desire to change, the caps were discarded and the pink and blue were ditched for a more practical red. Luton switched between white and bright orange – the club uses the bright orange today but incorporates the white within the kit.

... that the selected items on the club's crest are references to Luton's heritage? The bee on the white cross in the centre represents their workmanlike industry, and the hive in the top right corner represents the straw plaiting industry for which Luton is famous for. Straw plaiting was brought to the area by a group of Scots under the protection of Sir Robert Napier of Luton Hoo: Scotland is represented by the thistle in the bottom right and the rose in the bottom-left is from the arms of the Napier family. The wheat sheaf in the top-left represents the agriculture and supply of wheat straw, whilst the hat, which sits on top, represents the town's hat-making trade.

... that Luton Town were one of the first clubs to adopt professionalism? One season after the formation of the club, the Hatters decided in their second campaign to pay three players professional wages. The club committee decided that with the increase of stronger opposition and the attraction of better players it was needed to progress into entering a competitive league.

## VISITORS' GUIDE TO WARRINGTON TOWN

It has been a few years since we've drawn a club from deep into the non-League pyramid in the FA Cup – although Curzon Ashton in 2008/09 springs to mind all of a sudden. They, like Warrington, were also a team playing in the Northern Premier League Division One North, and who upset us with a 3-2 win in Lancashire.

So here's a bit of a low-down on next weekend's hosts Warrington, who are the hurdle to the FA Cup second round.

### Who are Warrington Town?

Warrington Town were initially formed in 1949 as Stockton Heath Albion, and changed their name to the current title in 1961. Interestingly, the town's attendance is in excess of 200,000 – twice the size of Exeter. However football isn't particularly prominent in the City for a couple of reasons: firstly because of the prominence of Warrington Wolves rugby league club, and secondly because of the sheer number of neighbours within short commuting distance. They are nicknamed 'the Yellows' because of their kit colour, as well as 'the Wire' in reference to the town's historic wire-pulling trade.

### Where do they play?

Warrington moved to their current home at Cantilever Park in Latchford in 1965. A 3,500-capacity stadium, it backs onto the Manchester Shipping Canal – no doubt the graveyard of any number of balls cleared into touch. The postcode for your SatNav is WA4 2RS, but don't expect to find a parking space – places are limited even for league matches. The cantilever bridge across the canal dominates the skyline to the east. And much of the perimeter of the pitch is uncovered, so bring appropriate clothing!

### Historical achievements?

The Wire are in their 11th season in Step Four of the non-League pyramid – a third-place finish



last term was their joint-highest ever placement (first achieved in 1994/95), and they missed out on promotion to the Northern Premier League Premier through the play-offs this time. The 1994/95 season also saw their name in the FA Cup first round hat for the first time – though they never got to face Darlington, after losing to Hyde in a fourth round qualifying replay. The Yellows have been to Wembley before – they were FA Vase runners-up to local rivals St Helens Town in 1987.

### Famous faces?

The club's most famous son is undoubtedly World Cup winner Roger Hunt, who was selected to represent England in 1966 – three of his 18 international goals came in the 1966 World Cup as he played every game for the Three Lions' world-conquering side. Hunt, now 76, had played for the club (then Stockton Heath) on three separate occasions before being signed for Liverpool, where he had

a phenomenal goalscoring record of 245 goals in 404 league games. Manager Shaun Reid was an experienced Football League player with Rochdale and York, and is the younger brother of ex-England international Peter Reid.

### Their season so far?

Undoubtedly, the FA Cup run has been the focal point of the Yellows' season to date. They have played just nine games to date in the league – leaving as many as seven games in hand over other clubs in the Evo-Stik NPL Division One North, and the Wire sitting in a lowly 17th place. Their cup campaign, meanwhile, has required a mammoth seven games just to reach this stage. Barton Old Boys, Trafford, Sheffield, Colwyn Bay and North Ferriby United have all been vanquished, though Sheffield and Colwyn Bay both forced replays. It was Lewis Field, marauding from right-back, that grabbed the game's only goal against North Ferriby. ■





## AROUND LEAGUE 2

### Dagenham & Redbridge

Former City striker Jamie Cureton has targeted 300 career goals before retirement after he scored his sixth of the campaign in the Daggers 1-1 draw with Wycombe. Cureton gave the Daggers the lead on 63 minutes after Ade Yusuff's shot was blocked but it wasn't enough for all three points as Peter Murphy equalised for the hosts in the 83rd minute.

The 39-year-old is currently on 264 goals and still has some way to go but believes he can do it. "I know it is quite a way off but if I play another two years, there is a chance. At my age, I have to score to keep getting a job somewhere. I still get very down when I don't score and miss chances."

### Tranmere Rovers

Micky Adams saw his new side climb off the bottom of the League 2 table with a 2-2 draw at AFC Wimbledon, their second consecutive draw under their new manager. Striker Armand Gnanduillet, one of a number of

loan signings recently made by the new boss, scored both goals for Rovers.

The club remain winless since August however and are still in the relegation places but Adams is pleased with how things are shaping up. "I think it's been a good week for us, although we've not got that win. We're unbeaten since I've been here and what we need to do now is get three points sooner rather than later."

### Burton Albion

Burton have been rocked by the news that manager Gary Rowett has left the club to become the new boss of Championship side Birmingham City. Rowett replaces Lee Clark who was sacked last week and brings with him his backroom team of Kevin Summerfield, Kevin Poole and Mark Sale. The former Blues defender has led the Brewers to third in the table this season and got them to the playoff final last term where they unfortunately lost out to Fleetwood.

His last game in charge was Saturdays 1-0 defeat to Stevenage but he leaves the

club in the promotion places. Chairman Ben Robinson said: "After the success Gary has achieved at Burton Albion over the last three years it was inevitable that there would be interest from other clubs. We wish him well and thank Gary and his coaching team for what they have done for the club."

### Northampton Town

The Cobblers have decided to make Kelvin Langmead available to go out on loan to help him regain his fitness, after going 19 months without starting a game. He had attempted to return from a knee injury in April but began to suffer Achilles problems meaning that he has been reduced to just one substitute appearance this term.

It isn't the first time that Northampton have sent out players to regain fitness, as Alex Nichols spent time here at Exeter earlier this year. Manager Chris Wilder said: "Kelvin has been out for a hell of a long time and I look at him in the same light as Alex Nicholls - he needs to go out and play some football." ■

## STEVE STACEY

**T**oday's One Game One Community match has the theme of race equality, an ever-important issue in football and wider society.

Steve Stacey was Exeter City's first black player – he joined Exeter in 1971 and played at the Park for two seasons, as a full-back, making 59 League appearances.

He now lives in Australia.

Steve was a pioneering black player, thought to be the first African American to play in England. The story of his heritage is embedded in the Second World War. "I was born in Bristol on 27 August 1944," says Steve. "My father was Clarence Sims, a black American GI based in the Westcountry. He had been born in Mississippi Kemper County, an area which saw

various atrocities against black people.

"At the time of my birth the US military was very highly segregated and US servicemen were under US law, not British law. The military refused to grant my father permission to marry my mother who was from a poor white family simply because he was black and she was white.

"At the end of the war my father



left and it took my family 40-odd years to catch up with him in New York. We met a couple of times but both he and my mum have now passed on".

Steve started his professional career at Bristol City and later also played at Wrexham (105 appearances; 6 goals), Ipswich, Charlton, Chester, Bristol City (for a second spell) and Bath City. "Being black and playing football in the 60s and 70s was lonely," recalls Steve. "A young kid in the Bristol City youth team, ironically called John White, and John 'Dusty' Miller in the Ipswich reserve side, were two lonely companions that I played with throughout my career.

"It may seem ridiculous now to suggest that the biggest conflict was to overcome not the crowd or your fellow players, but yourself. I think back then I was always conscious of being different and that I would stand out when mistakes were made. Remember also that I had no father to lean on so I had to bear all these crosses alone.

"I can recall a couple of incidents on the field that may have been racially-motivated but can only say may have been. I didn't react well to either but anger is never a positive response".

Steve speaks powerfully of the support he had from team mates. "My favourite place was the dressing room. Never in all my travels were any of the issues concerning race or colour raised in any dressing room. Here you were the equal of anyone. All that mattered was how well you had played. How much did you contribute to the team today? Enough to hold your place?"

Coming to Exeter from Bristol City was also a good experience. "I was the first black player at

Exeter but did not suffer any racial abuse at any time. John Newman was an honest, friendly and knowledgeable manager and I liked him very much.

"Exeter and the Devon coast made for a great place to be and while we were there my family and I made the most of it. Usually on a Sunday we would take the two kids on a trip, perhaps Dawlish Warren or one of the other easy to reach beaches.

"We had a clubhouse in St James a nice peaceful little place while we were there. There was not widespread team bonding but my wife Dot and I socialised with Bob Wilson and Barry Rowan and their wives – perhaps a meal and a drink in mid-week.

"What I do remember well is the long trips to away matches. I used to share a room with Fred Binney sometimes. Fred played the guitar; well his fingers hit the strings anyway! He was the away bus musician and on a trip to London the coach broke suddenly and Fred sat on his precious instrument. I do believe there were tears in his eyes.

"Fred and I went out before a game at Barrow and ended up in the naval dockyard, then home to Britain's nuclear fleet. We started talking to some workers there when we escorted off to a small room and questioned as to why we had broken the submarine gate protocol. I think they feared we were about to run off with the country's nuclear secrets. They had to ring John Newman to come and fetch us out of custody!

"But above all I remember Fred for the club song he wrote that was blasted out every time we took the field. I was embarrassed it was that bad! How it made the

cut I have no idea. I used to have a copy of it.

"Another memory is of celebrities sometimes visiting the dressing room. Eric Morecambe and Ernie Wise put in an appearance and we brought in our kids as a real treat."

Away from the game it wasn't always so friendly. "I remember in the early days of our marriage, Dot and I were on a bus and an ignorant man told us to go back to our own country. He obviously didn't take into account that my father, who was black, had just fought in a vicious war in order to give this man the freedom that he now had to insult my wife and I."

After his career ended in England, Steve emigrated to Western Australia where he continued playing football and has a proud record of public service to look back on. "My journey took me to all three layers of government, local, state and federal, mainly involving sport and recreation," he explains. "My last job before retirement was assisting the federal government in determining whether sport could help indigenous Australians to overcome the crippling social barriers that they face at the moment."

Steve, who is now writing a book about his life, was pleased to hear about the equality work that the One Game One Community group do at Exeter. "I very much admire what your group does in combating discrimination. Racism is a complex and many-faceted process from minor, major to incomprehensible. Please pass on my best wishes and a special thank you for what I believe is a very noble cause. Sport transcends race and colour – it's the binding glue of humanity." ■

# TITLE TRIUMPH 25 YEARS ON

25th anniversary of the 1989/90 Division Four title-winning season

I'm often reminded of how many good young players Exeter have produced over the years. The '90s generated, Martin 'Buster' Phillips, who followed Alan Ball to Manchester City and the Premier League. The last decade saw Dean Moxey head to Derby and eventually Crystal Palace in the top flight. While most recently, we have seen, Christy Pym and Matt Grimes, represent England at Under-20 level.

25 years ago we had Chris Vinnicombe, who almost to the day signed for the then-giants of British football, Glasgow Rangers. The deal was potentially worth up to £600,000, and given that the transfer record between two British clubs at the time was the £1.5 million that Manchester United paid for Bryan Robson, this appeared to be an incredible sum.

The last game that 'Vinny' played for City was the visit of Colchester. Facing a possible seventh defeat on the spin, Colchester battled for everything, but despite taking the lead, it would be the Grecians day once again at SJP. Steve Neville provided the goals in a 2-1 win, thanks once again to his dribbling skills, whilst in goal, the recently criticised Dave Walter saved a penalty to keep us in the game.



Next up Lincoln, and with our left-back gone, Terry Cooper called for focus. For motivation he reminded his players that the last time we'd played them, he was so disgusted with the performance that he made the team run nine laps of the pitch after the game!

Cooper juggled the pack, shifting Richard Dryden into the vacant left-back spot, whilst Darran Rowbotham moved to midfield, with Richard Young selected upfront. Given the enforced changes, many expected a difficult afternoon against the fifth-placed side, but there was to be no long-distance running following this match, as City smashed the league's best defence 3-0, with goals from Jim McNichol, Rowbotham, and Neville.

A lot of focus had been on the full backs, and while Dryden had

several efforts including one off the line, it was Scott Hiley, with his constant overlapping threat on the right, that made fans feel like we had another great prospect on our hands.

In the final fixture of this period, the attitude of this team shone through. On a bumpy and patchy pitch, Exeter somehow managed to pass their hosts, Scarborough, off the park, but couldn't quite find the winner. Then in the last minute, with the scores tied at one-apiece and the manager screaming at him to 'take it to the corner', Danny Bailey dug out a cross to find his midfield partner Paul Batty, who rose to net his first goal in over a year, and earn City a rare away win and a rise to second in the league. ■

## THE SQUAD CHRIS VINNICOMBE



Despite his young age, marauding left-back Vinnicombe put in a series of mature displays for the Grecians, before moving to a Glasgow Rangers side which provided more players to the England national team for the 1990 World Cup than any other. Perhaps it was due to the intense competition he faced at Ibrox that he never made the 40 appearances required to activate the full £600,000 fee due to City, but the £200,000 paid upfront was more than enough to smash the record £105,000 paid for Tony Kellow in 1978. Like Kellow, Vinnicombe would also return to City, for a brief spell in 2005, after spending the majority of his career at Burnley and Wycombe Wanderers, for who he played in an FA Cup semi-final against Liverpool. Today Vinnicombe is manager of Witheridge and is still lauded as one of the best to play in a City shirt.

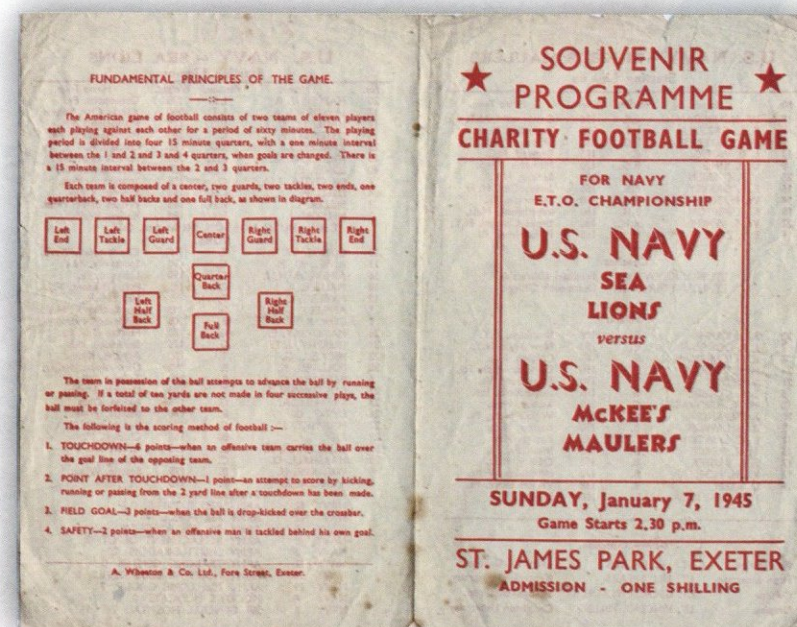

# HISTORY OF CITY IN 24 OBJECTS

#9 - THE WAR YEARS: 1939-1945

**N**ot many people know that Exeter City finished the 1939/40 season unbeaten... What many will recognise however, is that these dates coincide with the outbreak of the Second World War, which led the Football League to suspend the competition with Exeter sitting in fourth place. While some regional leagues were organised for the duration of the conflict, the board of directors decided that due to its distance from other footballing centres, Exeter City would close down until this state of emergency passed.

The break from football changed the purpose of SJP, and during the war years the ground was used by both the Home Guard and the US military for training, with the latter proving so popular that the stadium was opened for the visiting public to come and watch.

Sport would also feature, with the European Baseball Championship final being played here in 1945, as well as the above documented game of American Football, where the US Navy 'Sea Lions' beat their fellow naval opponents 'McKee's Maulers' by 13 points to 6... a result which technically makes it the highest scoring game of 'football' ever to be played in our stadium! ■

## TONY MORRIS

**O**ur visitors today have, like City, suffered a recent spell of indignity outside the Football League, finding – as we did – that it was no easy matter to regain their former proud status. But whereas the Grecians had regularly come close to demotion to the fifth tier before disaster finally struck, the Hatters had a more precipitous fall from grace, having featured in tier two as recently as 1996.

I have vivid recall of the first time I saw Luton Town at the Park, because the occasion was a Third Round FA Cup tie in January 1960, and they came to us as not just a Division One outfit with internationals in their line-up. They had actually reached the final of the competition in the previous season, going under 2-1 to Nottingham Forest at Wembley. We hadn't entertained such a big club in the Cup since our 1-1 draw with Chelsea in 1951, and that was a bit before my time.

We had despatched Barnstaple Town 4-0 in Round One and had overcome Brentford 3-1 in Round Two, and the revelation of

'mighty' Luton Town as our next opponents had the predictable effect on an impressionable 15-year-old City fanatic. You may well imagine how excited I felt over the prospect of seeing my heroes pitted against such star-studded opposition, and after we'd warmed up for the big occasion by beating Torquay home and away over Christmas I could even entertain the fanciful notion of a passage through to Round Four.

It wasn't strictly necessary for me to arrive at the Park at 8.45am, but I did anyway. I was determined to be first in the queue, to ensure that when the gates were opened I could make the dash to secure my preferred pitch at the front of the cowshed opposite the halfway line. I was on my own for quite a while, and there were still fewer than a dozen in the queue when Tony Court, the Express & Echo's football reporter, came by.

It had never crossed my mind that my early arrival at the ground could be of interest to anyone other than myself, but it apparently was. For the first time in my life I was interviewed, and

the story, along with a photograph, duly appeared in the Echo's early evening edition. Court asked me a load of questions, but I remember only one of them. In answer to his query about what I wanted when I left school, I told him: "Your job." I meant it too.

I achieved my aim of being the first through the gate, to be joined later by 19,999 others. And from my chosen vantage point I had a perfect view of the shocking bad tackle by Billy Bingham that left our star player, Gordon Dale, a virtual passenger for most of the match. Unsurprisingly in the circumstances, we lost 2-1, our score being an o.g.

Of course, I never did get Tony Court's job. And when, a few years later, he phoned through his report of an Exeter Falcons speedway match to the Press Association, I thought it wisest not to tell him that the precocious young brat who had coveted his role had made it to Fleet Street. ■

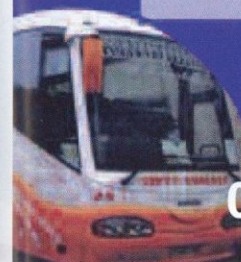

## REMEMBERING SERJEANT GEORGE THOMAS WHITE

**E**xeter City Football Club and its Supporters' Trust are marking the centenary on Thursday (30th October) of the first player from the club to lose his life in action during the First World War.

Serjeant George Thomas White was captain of the Exeter City reserve team before going to France in August 1914 as a member of the Devonshire Regiment. In October he was involved in an attempt to recapture Neuve Chapelle, in the Pas-de-Calais region, which had been taken by the Germans.

It was during this fighting, some of the heaviest of the early months of the war, that White

was killed on 30th October. In a sad twist of fate a fellow Exeter City player, Fred Bailey, was able to confirm White's death. Bailey, who also later died in action, was volunteering with the Royal Army Medical Corps and told a local paper how White had 'come into the hospital where he was on duty, and passed away there'.

White was aged just 30 and left a widow, Ada Rose, in Portland Street, just a short distance from St James Park.

His death is commemorated on the Le Touret memorial beautifully maintained by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission. He is also remembered on a First World War memorial near the Chapel

inside the St Sidwell's Community Centre in Sidwell Street.

White's name will also be inscribed on a new stone memorial being erected by the Supporters' Trust next to the new garden of remembrance behind the main stand at St James Park. He will be honoured alongside 10 other City players who lost their lives in the First World War.

A more detailed account of White's service and the other City players who died is available in Aidan Hamilton's book 'Have you ever played Brazil?', which is available to buy from the Club Shop at St James Park or directly through the Supporters' Trust. ■
