# MONEY TALKS |

A WARM WELCOME TO EVERYONE TO THIS AFTERNOON'S SKY BET LEAGUE TWO ENCOUNTER AGAINST LUTON TOWN.



Early season results can often be a bit mixed. Players missing pre-season, early knocks, bumps and bruises can all affect the way a team starts. Throw in some illness and a new group of players trying to gel and find out about each other, and it should come as no surprise when that does happen.

In some cases they are moving house, temporarily living away from partners and still settling into a new environment. Footballers have to adapt and cope, they know and accept that as part of the package, but it shouldn't be underestimated either.

Football has always been a game that creates so many emotions, mostly either very high or very low. More so than any other sport. Sky Sports, phone-ins, social media, you name it and suddenly individuals are the best thing since sliced bread one minute and the worst player ever signed the next.

Next month I will be 60 years old. That means 43 years as player, coach or manager. Over those years you learn to take a more considered view of where you are as a team, where you want to go and most importantly how you are going to get there. You are never

as good as you might think you are and more importantly never as bad.

We have tried to get as many minutes into as many players as possible. Those missing game time and training in pre-season have to get up to speed. Those who miss out through injury and illness are likewise in a similar positon. When you bring in so many new faces they need an opportunity to show us what they can do.

Rightly or wrongly after seven league and cup games we have 18 players who have made three or more starts. It is very important to me that when the 11 starts to evolve not one player can say to me they haven't had an opportunity. I always tell players I don't really pick the team, they do!

The immediate task ahead is to turn a good group of players from a competitive squad into a team, one that can cope with injuries, illness or loss of form. Players need to keep the shirt or fight like mad to get one. If they do neither then they need to play somewhere else, it is that simple. We still have to find which category the players in this group fit into.

As the manager I am the one responsible, accountable for the decisions, the buck stops with me. However experience tells me that until we are able to create the type of environment mentioned in the previous paragraph it is dangerous to make decisions that in hindsight are too hasty. The transfer window is closed and whilst a loan may be available it is up to all of us to settle things down.

Your support has been fantastic, patient, understanding and I am sure a little bit curious as to how things will evolve. Continue to behave and react in that manner and I am confident we will be fine.

Finally a welcome to our old adversaries and opponents today, in John, his staff, players, board and supporters. We have played them many times in the recent past, the games have been closely contested in both league and cup and the atmosphere created by both sets of supporters terrific. We can I am certain look forward to a very exciting afternoon.

### DEMETRIOU SIGNS LOAN DEAL WITH THE U'S

Cambridge United have this week completed the six month loan signing of left-back Mickey Demetriou from Shrewsbury Town.

The 25-year old joins Richard Money's side until January and will give the U's boss additional defensive options for the first half of the 2015/16 Sky Bet League Two season.

Also capable of playing in a central role, Demetriou joined the Shrews at the beginning of last season's campaign and played an integral role in the Shropshire side's charge up the division to promotion, having featured 42 times and registered goals on three occasions.

As a youngster Demetriou attracted the attention of Fulham and Leicester City where he had trials, before becoming a product of the Glenn Hoddle Academy in Spain.

The full back made a name for himself in non-league, firstly for Eastbourne Borough where he made his debut amongst ten appearances during the 2010-11 season, before spending three seasons at

Kidderminster Harriers which allowed him to develop his playing abilities further.

Last season marked his Football League debut after being snapped up by Shrewsbury during the off season, despite fierce competition from a handful of League One and League Two clubs.

Twice the defender came up against the U's during last year, but it was for the men in Amber and Black that Demetriou lined up for on Tuesday, winning the Vindis Man of the Match award in an impressive first display for the club.

Commenting on the loan deal, the U's boss said: "Mickey is a player we know well from our time in the conference whilst playing against Kidderminster, and last season he played 40 games for Shrewsbury during their promotion winning campaign.

"We have been active in trying to bring another versatile left sided player to the club and Mickey fits the profile perfectly.

"He will give us good options and competition at left back, left wing back and left midfield, all areas where we felt we needed another player."



CHADWICK SET FOR FUTSAL DEBUT

Former Cambridge and Manchester United star Luke Chadwick is set to make his debut for Cambridge United Futsal Club tomorrow against Oxford City Lions, with tickets available to purchase online now!

Last month the club announced an exciting merger with the city's existing futsal team to form the Cambridge United Futsal Club, which as of next month will compete in the FA National League Midlands Division Two.

Chadwick was revealed as the star signing; having had an involvement with Cambridge United Futsal Schools and Futsal Scholarship Programme this summer, which now offers a direct pathway into the National League side.

Ahead of the start of the new season, an exciting pre-season clash against the Oxford City Lions has been planned (KO 12.15pm) at Cambridge University - where the new CUFC side will play all home fixtures - and gives Cambridge United supporters the chance to check out Chadwick and the U's Futsal team in action against high class opposition.

The Lions will compete in the Super League South for the forthcoming 2015/16 season and are considered to be one of the top Futsal clubs in the country, therefore marking them out as more than worthy opponents for CUFC's inaugural fixture.

## THE MADNESS OF FOOTBALL IS NEVER DEMONSTRATED MORE SUCCINCTLY THAN ON TRANSFER DEADLINE DAY.

Sky Sports News goes into overdrive; the requirement to satisfy a craving for hype and instant updates is provided by a frenzy of activity. The day now has its own show, its own colour, its own brand. It has become an actual event! When two of the richest clubs in the world can't complete a transfer in time (or choose not to complete the transfer depending on which statement seems more plausible), it adds to the drama. Suddenly, TMS is added to the vernacular of every football fan!

The transfer window also indicates how football has changed from a time not so long ago when transfers were permitted at any time until a deadline imposed sometime in March. I know that was a long time ago, before the advent of seven substitutes, perfect pitches and more pertinently for this point, before Sky TV, the Premier League, the associated millions billions



of pounds that is pumped into football at the highest level (which TRICKLES down) and the proliferation of social media. But what happens now is that clubs are judged by their transfer activity before they are even allowed to be judged by their results. Pundits ponder on whether or not they had a "good or bad window" before a ball is kicked by any of their signings. Fans clamour for activity. There is outrage that Arsenal have "only" signed a world class goalkeeper to complement their huge squad of world class players. Their fans are up in arms demanding an explanation!

Manchester United are slaughtered because they spent too much money but failed to sign a "galactico", ironically, the previous sole preserve of Real Madrid. Their spending has now exceeded a quarter of a billion pounds in three "transfer windows". The last "galactico" signed last year for £59m has been sold to PSG,



another club with the odd bob or two in the bank, at a loss of around £14m over 12 months. Interestingly, Van Gaal's first 50 games in charge at Manchester United has brought the same number of wins as David Moyes (27) but somewhat less media led criticism. Perception and reality in football are distant concepts.

Chelsea attract similar calls of a crisis, or a perceived "bad window" because they "only" sign a left back and a winger, both for £20m+, two relatively unknown defenders for a combined £20m and a goalkeeper for £8m! What a shocking lack of investment! In comparison, Manchester City have quickly progressed from a "crisis" club at a crossroads in the summer with a manager under pressure, to the "champions elect" thanks to £100m investment in TWO players and FOUR wins. That's right, the title we are now told will be wrapped up by Christmas, less than a month after they were apparently the most vulnerable club for the champions league places following Liverpool's annual transfer splurge. Wait until a defeat in the champions league and Pellegrini will be under the spotlight again and a certain Catalan, currently residing in Bavaria, will again become the talk of Eastlands.

Then there is Liverpool. It's taken one defeat, after three clean sheets and seven points, for the debate to re-open about the manager in situ, who was sanctioned to spend £80m in the "transfer window", and potential replacements

in the form of Carlo Ancelotti and Jurgen Klopp, regardless of whether they have any interest in the job. In football, it's immaterial that  $2+2=4$  if it's more expedient for everyone that it equals 5, 6 or 7!

The amount of money in the Premier league now makes all of its clubs powerhouses in the transfer market compared to every club abroad apart from a handful of Europe's elite. Just look at the recruitment of clubs like Stoke, Southampton and Swansea. They can compete at a level that in the past would have been fantasy. Four ex Barcelona players are now plowing their trade at the Britannia!

Talking of Barcelona, as the madness of the transfer window reaches a crescendo, they are maybe privately grateful of their transfer embargo, which means they can actually concentrate on their players, their squad and their start to the season rather than the circus that surrounds what actually matters; the action on the pitch. That said, it didn't stop them signing Aleix Vidal from Sevilla for a cool £16m, even though he cannot be registered until January.

Until now, the Spanish TV deal has been different to the English Premier League in that each club could negotiate their own contract. In the cases of Barcelona and Real Madrid, that would be extremely lucrative and give them a huge competitive advantage, in addition to their huge fan-base and historical pulling power. It will be interesting to see what happens now that has changed and whether there is an equalising effect with income being distributed more evenly. That is what is starting to happen in the Premier League. The TV money is so huge, it starts to negate the difference between gate



revenues and even the effect of champions league qualification. A really interesting analysis shows the percentage of turn over that is directly attributed to TV revenue.

For some clubs it accounts for over 90% of their entire income. This shows why relatively small Premier League clubs, with attendance's of around 20,000, can offer higher wages and therefore compete favourably for players compared to far bigger clubs across Europe.

The brand that is the Premier League is a juggernaut that shows no sign of slowing down. It also enables these smaller clubs to reject the overtures of bigger clubs for their players. Look at West Brom with Saido Berahino. A reported offer of £25m pales into insignificance when you consider the £100m+/year on offer from the next TV deal

The effect further down the pyramid is that £10m+ transfers can now happen in the

second tier between clubs at this level. The finances in the Championship make your eyes water. When we played Rotherham in the Capital One Cup they were very open about the challenges they face as a "smaller" club, with an average attendance of just over 10,000.

The parachute payments available to three clubs every year creates wealth within half the division in every four year cycle that is impossible for others to match. Then you think of the size of clubs. The Championship boasts the fourth highest average crowd of any league in Europe.

The thousands of column inches and hours of TV coverage are not just filled with "expert" snap shot judgements. They are also filled with views of supporters on twitter and other social media outlets. The international break gives a brief respite for the managers of these premier league clubs, before service is resumed in ten days and a fully blown crisis, when a team goes two games without a win, really develops!

What's my point? I'm not sure! Except that every now and again you need to recognise the insanity of this industry in order to remain sane!

I saw a bunch of young kids in our stadium on Wednesday morning, all part of our final football course of the school holidays, with smiles on their faces and enthusiasm in abundance, just to play football. That's what football is really all about; it's what we all love. The rest is nonsense!

Enjoy the game.

# LUTON TOWN | ONES TO WATCH



WITHOUT A WIN SO FAR THIS SEASON IN SKY BET LEAGUE TWO, LUTON TOWN ARRIVE AT THE ABBEY STADIUM TODAY HUNGRY FOR THREE POINTS THAT COULD KICK THEIR LEAGUE SEASON INTO LIFE.

The Hatters did push Premier League Stoke City close in their Second Round Capital One clash two weeks' ago, before a 2-1 Johnstone's Paint Trophy victory on Tuesday night against high flying Leyton Orient delivered their first win of the season.

Both fixtures are signs that the Hatters may be beginning to find their form, whilst defeats to Portsmouth, Bristol Rovers and Yeovil Town in the League say them currently sit in 22nd position. However, armed with the likes of former U's loanee Cameron McGeehan, previous Peterborough and Brighton striker Craig Mackail-Smith and ex-Celtic Midfielder Paddy McCourt on their roster for this season, many will fancy John Still's side to challenge most teams in the division.

## ONES TO WATCH

### ELLIOT JUSTHAM : GOALKEEPER

Giving veteran Hatters keeper Mark Tyler some serious competition this season, Justham has come into the new campaign buoyed by an excellent end to last season, having grasped the opportunity given to him following injury to Tyler. He made his Football League debut in a 3-2 defeat at AFC Wimbledon in February this year and kept his place for the remainder of last term. An ever-present on the bench during the Town's Conference title campaign, Justham originally joined Luton from East Thurrock.

### STEPHEN O'DONNELL : DEFENDER

A summer arrival from north of the border, O'Donnell signed from Partick Thistle where he had earned a fine reputation as a marauding right-back with a real eye for goal. He started his career as a youngster at Celtic and has also played for the Scotland Under-21s. The U's will certainly need to keep tabs on him this afternoon.

### SCOTT CUTHERBERT : DEFENDER


Capable of playing at either centre-half or right-back, Cuthbert signed for the Hatters this summer having spent two years at Leyton Orient. He helped the O's reach the League One Play-Off final the season before last, and prior to that his influential performances enabled Swindon to do the same. He has been capped at B level for Scotland and, like O'Donnell, also came through the youth ranks at Celtic.

### LUKE WILKINSON: DEFENDER

Wilkinson enjoyed an excellent first season at Kenilworth Road following his arrival from Dagenham last summer. Manager John Still

raided his former club to recruit the commanding centre-half and Wilkinson repaid his boss with a string of committed displays from central defence as well as chipping in with four goals. The defender began his career at Portsmouth before moving to Dagenham where he was named player of the year in 2012/13.

### SCOTT GRIFFITHS: DEFENDER



A left-back who is now closing in on 100 appearances for the Hatters following two years of service, during which he helped Luton win the Conference title. The defender won the Conference title at Dagenham with Still before moving to Peterborough whilst Griffiths has also won the League Two title with Chesterfield.

### CAMERON MCCEECHAN: MIDFIELDER

The Hatters signed McGeehan on a permanent contract this summer having previously enjoyed two spells on-loan from Norwich City. The central midfielder played a key role in the Conference title campaign before rejoining again last season. He originally came through the ranks at Chelsea and has also spent time on-loan with the U's last season.

### THE MANAGER - JOHN STILL

Still joined the Hatters in March 2013 having enjoyed a successful 10-year spell at Dagenham & Redbridge, where he guided the Daggers to the Conference title, as well as promotion to League One via the League Two Play-Offs.

In his first season in the Hatters' hot-seat, he guided the club to the Conference title with 101 points. It was the third time he had won the division in his career.

### CRAIG MACKAIL-SMITH: STRIKER

A Prolific goalscorer, Mackail-Smith put pen to paper at Kenilworth Road a week before the start of the season having trained with the Hatters during pre-season. The striker came to prominence under John Still came to prominence at Dagenham before a move to Peterborough. He scored 99 goals in 212 games for Posh, helping them win promotion on two occasions.



His goals at London Road got the forward a big money move to Brighton in 2011. He scored 10 goals in his debut season at the Amex and 11 in the next before two injury-affected campaigns followed and restricted his playing time. Now fully-fit he is reunited with Still for a second time, and may prove to be a real handful for the U's this afternoon.

### DANNY GREEN: MIDFIELDER

Right-sided attacking midfielder Green signed for the Hatters this summer, linking up once more with manager John Still. The Hatters boss worked with Green whilst at Dagenham, and the winger went onto help the Daggers win the League 2 Play-Offs. After 27 goals for the Essex side he moved to Charlton who he won promotion with from League One to the Championship.

### PADDY MCCOURT: MIDFIELDER

Northern Ireland international attacking midfielder switched to Kenilworth Road during the off season. McCourt came through the ranks at Rochdale but came to prominence at Celtic where he became a cult hero for the Bhoys with a string of impressive solo goals. After winning the SPL twice, he left Scotland for Barnsley in 2013, and briefly turned out for Brighton last season before ending the campaign on-loan at Notts County.





# LUTONTOWN TOPBOYS I

FOOTBALL HISTORIAN LEIGH EDWARDS PROFILES SEVERAL WINNERS OF CRAWLEY TOWN'S 'PLAYER OF THE YEAR' AWARD.

## MALCOLM MACDONALD

Striker Malcolm Macdonald was capped 14 times by England after leaving Luton Town. Initially with Tonbridge, he joined Fulham in August 1968 and moved to Luton in July 1969. He was twice top scorer including their 1969-70 promotion success when 'Player of the Year' and netted 49 goals in 88 League games before sold to Newcastle United for £180,000 in May 1971. An FA Cup finalist in 1974 and League Cup finalist in 1976, he joined Arsenal for £333,333 in August 1976 and was an FA Cup finalist again in 1978 before injury ended his career. He managed Fulham and Huddersfield and now works in the media.

## CHRIS NICHOLL

Northern Ireland international central defender Chris Nicholl was Luton Town's 'Player of the Year' in 1970-71. A former Burnley apprentice, he moved via Witton to Halifax Town in June 1968 and starred in their 1968-69 promotion success. He joined Luton in August 1969 and was a promotion winner in 1969-70, netting six goals in 97 League games before joining Aston Villa in March 1972. Helping win promotion in 1974-75, as well as featuring in two League Cup final triumphs, he joined Southampton in June 1977 and was a promotion winner again in 1977-78, then played for Grimsby before managing Saints and Walsall.

## PAUL FUTCHER

Former England U-21 central defender Paul Futcher was Luton Town's 'Player of the Year' in 1976-77 and 1977-78. He turned professional with his twin brother Ron at hometown Chester in January 1974, moving to Luton in a joint £100,000 deal in June 1974 and scoring once in 131 League outings. Sold to Manchester City for £350,000 in June 1978, he then had spells playing for Oldham Athletic and Derby County prior to joining Barnsley in March 1984. He starred as they reached the FA Cup sixth round in 1984-85, moving to Halifax Town in July 1990. Later with Grimsby Town, he managed Darlington, Gresley and Southport.

## KIRK STEPHENS

Attacking right-back Kirk Stephens was ever-present in Luton Town's 1981-82 Second Division title triumph. Initially with Nuneaton Borough, he

helped them finish Southern League runners-up in 1974-75 and followed David Pleat to Kenilworth Road in June 1978. He was voted Luton's 'Player of the Year' in 1978-79 and 1983-84, scoring twice in 227 League games for the Hatters before moving to Coventry City in exchange for Ashley Grimes in August 1984. Later rejoining Nuneaton as player-manager after a knee injury ended his top-flight career, he also had a spell at Barnet and has since run the family building firm.

## RICKY HILL

England international midfielder Ricky Hill was 'Player of the Year' when Luton Town won the Second Division title in 1981-82. Signing professional at Kenilworth Road in May 1976, he was also 'Player of the Year' in 1980-81 and starred as Luton were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85. He also featured in two consecutive League Cup finals including the Hatters' 1988 Wembley triumph and netted 54 goals in 436 League games before moving to Le Havre in July 1989. Reuniting with David Pleat at Leicester City in August 1990 and later as a coach at Sheffield Wednesday and Spurs, he briefly rejoined Luton as manager.

## PAUL WALSH

England international striker Paul Walsh was capped five times while at Luton Town. Signing professional for Charlton Athletic in October 1979, he starred in their 1980-81 promotion success and moved to Luton in July 1982. He was 'Player of the Year' in 1982-83 and leading marksman in 1983-84, netting 24 goals in 80 First Division games for the Hatters before joining Liverpool in May 1984. Helping to win the League Championship in 1985-86, he joined Tottenham Hotspur in February 1988 and was an FA Cup winner in 1991. He later played for Portsmouth, Manchester City and Pompey again until injury curtailed his career.

## MAL DONAGHY

Northern Ireland international central defender Mal Donaghy gained a club record 58 caps while at Luton Town. He moved to Kenilworth Road from Larne in June 1978 and was ever-present as Luton won the Second Division title in 1981-82 and were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85. Voted 'Player of the Year' in 1985-86, he was an FA Cup semi-finalist again in 1987-88 and starred in that season's League Cup final triumph. He netted 16

goals in 410 League games prior to joining Manchester United for £650,000 in October 1988, then returned on loan, moving to Chelsea in August 1992. He has worked for the Irish FA.

## BRIAN STEIN

England international striker Brian Stein was Luton Town's 'Player of the Year' in 1987-88, scoring twice in that season's League Cup final triumph. Moving to Kenilworth Road from Edgware Town in October 1977, he was leading marksman in Luton's 1981-82 Second Division success and also starred as they were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85 and 1987-88. He joined Caen in July 1988 and moved via Annecy back to Luton in July 1991. Voted 'Player of the Year' again in 1991-92, he netted 130 goals in 427 League games overall before joining Barnet in August 1992. His younger brother Mark also played for Luton.

## MICK HARFORD

England international striker Mick Harford was Luton Town's 'Player of the Year' in 1988-89. Initially with Lincoln City, he played for Newcastle United, Bristol City and Birmingham City prior to joining Luton in December 1984. He starred as the Hatters were League Cup finalists in two consecutive seasons, including their 1988 Wembley triumph, also FA Cup semi-finalists on two occasions. Moving to Derby County in January 1990, he returned to Luton in September 1991. Joining Chelsea in August 1992, he then appeared for Sunderland, Coventry City and Wimbledon. He has since been coach and manager of Luton.

## DAVID PREECE

England B international midfielder David Preece was 'Player of the Year' when Luton Town reached the FA Cup semi-finals in 1993-94. Signing professional for Walsall in July 1980, he helped them reach the League Cup semi-finals in 1983-84 and joined Luton for £150,000 in December 1984. He appeared in two consecutive League Cup finals including the Hatters' 1988 Wembley success and was also 'Player of the Year' in 1991-92, netting 21 goals in 336 League games while at Kenilworth Road prior to joining Derby County in August 1995. Later player-coach at Cambridge United and Torquay United, he died in July 2007.

THE U'S LONGEST SERVING PLAYER DISCUSSES THE RIVALRY BETWEEN CAMBRIDGE UNITED AND TODAY'S VISITORS LUTON TOWN, AS WELL AS HIS TARGETS FOR THE SEASON.

CAMBRIDGE UNITED'S JOSH COULSON TALKS TO THE MATCH DAY PROGRAMME ABOUT THE CLASH AGAINST THE HATTERS AND THE SEASON SO FAR.

High octane games like today's clash are the reason most players want to play football according to the Coulson, who also describes the positive impact a result against the Hatters can have moving forward.

"Whenever you play Luton, they are always massive games whether it is at home or away," he said.

"If you can't get up for these sort of games then there is no point in being a footballer, because the atmosphere and intensity of the game is just unbelievable."

"It is a local derby, and no doubt they will bring a lot of fans but we'll have plenty of supporters there too. It is always a game to look forward to."

"It is one of them matches that if you win you are on cloud nine and you take some real confidence in your next few games and almost feel unbeatable. I'm hopeful of a strong performance and that we can get the result that we want come 5 o'clock."

The last time the two sides met at the Abbey Stadium, the U's claimed a 2-1 victory in the FA Cup third courtesy of goals from Robbie Simpson and Ryan Donaldson, which led to United's infamous draw with Manchester United in the following round.

Coulson, who started in his usual central defensive position that day, reflects back on what was a difficult but memorable clash.

"That really was a very tough game and from beating them we got the just rewards we deserved with the Manchester United games and all that followed from there. It did feel that little bit sweeter to do it in the FA Cup and end up with the circumstances that we did."

"I have good memories of the last time we played them at home but I'm hoping we can have another good game like that today."

Having played his first professional game for the club way back in October 2007 against Halifax Town; at the age of just 26-years old Coulson is currently the U's longest serving player.

***"It's exciting for me and although I won't say what I think we can achieve because we'll just take it game by game, it will be interesting to see what we can do."***

His extensive period with the club he supported as a boy, means the defender has experienced more than his fair share of Cambridge United drama, which has included Play-off final heartache, Wembley glory in the FA Trophy, promotion back to the Football League and the aforementioned FA Cup ties against Manchester United, all under countless managers and part of numerous sides.

However, Coulson is adamant not to rest on his laurels and feels there are still plenty more memorable experiences to be had with the U's, especially with such a talented group of players on the books of the club at present.

"This is my ninth season with the club, so that is a lot of years and lot of players that I have played alongside and under a few different manager as well."

"Getting promoted the season before last and winning the FA Trophy was unbelievable and for me a dream come true, but I just want to keep playing as many games I keep this year and help the side succeed."

"That alone will be another test for me because we have got some good players in my position so I'll work hard every day on the training field to be involved in as much as possible".

Assessing how United have fared so far this season, Coulson says there is still plenty more in the tank from the men in Amber and Black and a result this afternoon would go a long way to setting the U's on the right path.

"The good thing for us and the positive we must take is that we still have plenty in the tank and we haven't really started to play how we know we can. The performances are still to come from our point of view and with that the results should follow."

"We are around where we want to be but there is still a lot more to come and I'm looking forward to that."

He continued: "There are a lot of new players and a lot of different styles from each player which you have to get used to, which we did over pre-season."

"I enjoy getting to know other players and starting working relationships with them, so it has been good."

"It's exciting for me and although I won't say what I think we can achieve because we'll just take it game by game, it will be interesting to see what we can do."

"As it stands now, all that matters is our next game which is today against Luton."

**FOOTBALL DEVELOPMENT MANAGER JAMES CUTTING REVEALS FURTHER DETAILS ABOUT THE CLUB'S LATEST COMMUNITY FOOTBALL PROGRAMMES.**

For nine years Cambridge United has built a Youth Development programme that competes with the very best. Step inside the B.E.E.T.S. Hospitality Lounge and you'll be shocked by the size of the Cambridge United Trophy cabinet – who knew that this club had such a golden history?!

Pennants from the top clubs in Europe – Bayern Munich, Juventus, Borussia Dortmund and a plethora of others. However, this trophy cabinet belongs to the Cambridge United Academy!

The Cambridge United youth system is built off the hard work of a number of key individuals and now, since it's growth, a strong team of outstanding 'deliverers' within our ever-growing coaching team. The youth pyramid is made up of around 100 Academy players, 200 Shadow Academy players and 900 Regional Development Centre players. A huge pool of talent I'm sure you'll agree.

But these programmes cater only for those who are invited. These are the top 1%. The best player in the team and not his or her team mates – who may well have just as much passion and love for the game. To this end, two programmes are about to kick off next week.

Commencing on Monday 14th September, ten open-access Soccer Centres will offer professional coaching to boys and girls aged 5-12. Anyone within this age group can attend. The programme is supported by Xtreme Soccer who offer events for all



kinds of groups including zorb football and a number of other new and exciting products.

The coaches will teach the children simple football techniques, through story-based games. Children attending will even receive their very first football kit and ball.

The Soccer Centres and Soccer Tots will sit alongside the Elms Cambridge BMW Soccer Schools to complete a trio of open-access programmes.

### RDC AND SHADOW ACADEMY PLAYERS COLLECT ERMS UK SPONSORED TRAINING KIT






YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PHASE LEAD COACH




At the start of his tenth season with Cambridge United, Tom currently works closely with the U13-U16 players as Youth Development Phase Lead Coach.

This season has seen the Foundation Phase incorporate the U12 age group as well as enhance the programme for the U8s and Pre Academy.





Now, with the club having achieved Category 3 academy status in the EPPP audit, Adam aims to continue pushing the academy forward and raising standards.



### FAIR TRADING

*Why 100 Years of Coconuts is at this year's Stourbridge Fair*

While today's match against our friends from Bedfordshire - the latest in a series that began in 1965 with a 3-1 home win for the U's, fact fans - is being played out, a very much older custom is being preserved on the other side of Newmarket Road. Volunteers from 100 Years of Coconuts are among those who are, in some small way, recreating Stourbridge Fair, which was for several centuries, from the 1200s on, Europe's greatest marketplace.

The Chapel of St Mary Magdalene, better known to you and me as the Leper Chapel, is the only standing reminder of this vast but moveable city of commerce, revelry, indulgence and sin, but you may sometimes find an centuries-old oyster shell embedded in the Stourbridge Common mud as you leave the Green Dragon and head for the Abbey.

The street names Oyster Row, Garlic Row, Cheddars Lane and Mercers Row recall the map of what Daniel Defoe called 'a well fortified city' that flourished for weeks

every late summer. Traders from all corners of our continent arrived by river and road to set up streets where John Bunyan and Isaac Newton browsed.

Stourbridge - or Stirbitch, or Steresbrigge, or Sturbridge - was given the green light, as today's papers would put it, by King John (famously played by a lion in the Disney vision of Robin Hood) in 1199. The big idea was that the fees paid by traders would aid the leprosy hospital that hugged the road towards Bury, although when the hospital shut up shop no one took any notice and the fair continued to prosper. Its decline began in the 18th century and it finally fizzled out in 1933, when the mayor of Cambridge, Florence Keynes, noted as she opened proceedings that the ceremony was being watched by two women, their babies and an ice cream vendor.

That same year, a few yards away, Abbey United were embarking on their second season at what we now call the Abbey Stadium, playing the likes of RAF Duxford, Gamlingay and the University Press. But there are other reasons why we at Coconuts thought it important to tell the

story of the U's at Cambridge Past, Present & Future's recreation of the once mighty fair.

If you're a United supporter you have surely heard the tales of your predecessors carrying the goalposts from Abbey United HQ at the Mission Hut in River Lane to the Common, so that the 'Wasps' could play on the very ground where the fair once flourished. This was United's home turf when the club was reformed after the first world war, and it was there that Ditton Rovers were beaten 6-3 on 20 September 1919. How many ancient oyster shells were unearthed by those primitive football boots, you have to wonder. Was the pitch situated on the site of the Duddery, the fair's 'main square' where drapers, tailors and second-hand clothes sellers plied their trade?

There's another connection between Stourbridge Fair, the Leper Chapel and Cambridge United: do the bones of medieval leprosy victims lie beneath Ian Darler's beloved turf? There are plenty of scholars round these parts who believe they do. RIP.

# CAMBRIDGE UNITED WOMEN'S MATCH REPORT

U'S CRUISE TO FA WOMEN'S PREMIER LEAGUE CUP WIN



Cambridge United Women successfully booked themselves into the First Round of the FA Women's Premier League Cup after defeating Cheltenham Town 3-0, their visiting opponents from the South West division.

A comprehensive performance ensured the U's secured their first victory of the new campaign, and warranted a strong score line having dominated from start to finish.

An early chance went begging for the U's early on when Becky Taylor's inviting ball across the six yard box only marginally evaded Lucy Du Plooy, but it didn't take too long before the home side had taken a big step in stamping their authority on the game with the first goal.

Laura Mills grabbed her eighth goal of the season in all competitions, with a vicious free kick from 30 yards out that beat the Cheltenham goalkeeper, hitting the underside of the crossbar and into the net.

The U's continued to build pressure which became telling shortly before the half time break. Nuala Wayne's cross was met with a fine strike from Faith Hewitt at the far post that drew a fine save out of the Cheltenham shot stopper, but Becky Taylor was following up well to fire home on the rebound to gain

her first competitive goal for the club. A change of shape in the second half for the hosts saw them take the game to Cheltenham and in truth the visitors never looked like getting back into the game as more chances fell the way of Cambridge with the woodwork denying them on two occasions.

The passing moves had more fluidity to them and Du Plooy's pass to Taylor, saw her flick the ball smartly into Wayne's path and her drive was finger tipped onto the crossbar by the busy Cheltenham keeper.

The chances kept coming with Taylor having two efforts wide of the target and Baker forcing another good save from the keeper from distance.

Substitute Sophie Thompson had a smart overhead kick saved too from a Hannah Goodchild cross and then with one of the moves of the game, Mills eased past two defenders before a one touch combination involving Taylor found Thompson's run but her clip over the keeper bounced off the far post and away.

The U's finally got the goal their second half display deserved in the dying minutes of the

match. After two strong penalty claims were penalties down by the referee earlier in the half, he couldn't wave away the third when Goodchild was bundled over in the box. Skipper Laura Bright stepped up to emphatically fire home the penalty in the final minute of the game to put the result beyond doubt and send the U's through to Round One.

Following the game, Manager Steve Edwards was pleased to have got the job done he said: "I feel that victory has been coming for the group and their hard work and performances over the last few weeks haven't been rewarded with the results, so I'm pleased that we were able to come away with a good win."
