



I'd like to welcome John Still and Terry Harris to the club along with all of the directors, staff, supporters and everyone else associated with Luton Town.

Everyone will all be aware of this fixture because John Still and Terry Harris achieved absolutely unbelievable things for Dagenham & Redbridge Football Club and will go down as legends around here. Rightly so as well! They spent a lot of time here and built this club to have a lot of successful times.

John has been at Luton for over two years now and has been successful there. It goes to show the quality of the man. Today will be a very tough fixture but we will be looking to win. Our home form hasn't been great and that's very disappointing. As a group, our results and performances haven't been good enough.

assessing multiple academy players. For instance, Jodi Jones was spotted by a lot of fans and given his first real opportunity because of his performance in the ESC. We are aware that Basildon will be a tough game as they will be up for it and while we may field youngsters, they will put out their strongest team.

If we beat Oxford in the Johnstone's Paint then that is another great opportunity for the lads. CAPTAIN'S NOTES ANDRE BOUCAUD

Since the last programme notes – written by Ashley Hemmings - we've had three disappointing results against Hartlepool, York and Accrington. But I can honestly say I thought our only poor performance was away at Accrington.

I thought in the Hartlepool game we were very unlucky not to get the win. Hartlepool barely had any opportunities but the result is the most important thing and we couldn't get the three points. No one would care if we played badly and got the victory.

Then we had the York game where we let yet another lead slip after going ahead, and that's happened too much this season. There have been several games where we have had the lead and let it slip. These are games we could have got more points from - we need to manage games properly. I think Mansfield where we went 3-1 up and the York game are examples of the good positions we've been in and haven't managed to see it out.

Our game against Accrington on Saturday was the poorest of the season. When you start a game and go behind after a minute and a half it's not good. You're chasing the game and you can't afford to start like that.

Today we focus on playing Luton Town. All of the games to me are massive, but this is even more important because we are bottom of the league and teams around us have started to get a few results, so we need to do the same. If we start today by putting our best foot forward then hopefully we can get a good result.

It's a game we have to go and win. Obviously it will feel a bit weird training

on Saturday rather than playing but it's no big deal really playing on a Saturday or a Sunday. You've still got to prepare, focus on the game and concentrate during the game just like you would any other day of the week.


Obviously for various reasons the game has been hyped up because of where we find ourselves and the history of the opposition personnel. But we've just got to go out there and win because those three points are crucial.

Before the Hartlepool game I was away on international duty with Trinidad & Tobago which is obviously good for myself, but I'm aware of it possibly affecting the team. I'm sure if anyone else was called up for their respective national team they would take the opportunity as well. We played against Panama and Nicaragua, winning 2-1 and drawing 0-0 respectively. It was a great experience for myself.

Since the Accrington game we have also had a new arrival in James Dunne on loan from Portsmouth. He's only trained a few times with us but he looks like a good player, and obviously he has experience in this league and he's come in from

Portsmouth who are a decent team so hopefully he can add something different. His arrival brings further competition to the squad and it means if you're not performing, other players will be waiting who deserve an opportunity.



PASK JOINS

Daggers have signed defender Josh Pask on a one month loan from Premier League side, West Ham United. Pask has been at West Ham since the age of 8, and can play in the centre of defence or in central midfield if required. He has so far made three appearances for Daggers, including picking up the man-of-the-match award in our last home fixture against Hartlepool United in October.

DUNNE DEAL

The Daggers have completed the signing of midfielder James Dunne on a one-month emergency loan from Portsmouth. James will wear the number 26 and joins the club until the 24th November. The 26 year-old started out at Arsenal before moving on to Exeter City, Stevenage, Portsmouth and St Johnstone, where he won the 2014 Scottish Cup whilst on loan at McDiarmid Park. RNA DINNER



Gary Cole speaks to LIAM O'BRIEN

Within a challenging season so far, your form has stood out. Have you been pleased with your performances?

After not playing much last year, I was given an opportunity this season after about five games and with someone like Mark waiting in the wings, I know I have to be consistent every time I walk out onto the pitch. The more you play, the more confidence you get and hopefully that shows in my form.

Last season you started off in goal until being dropped. How did that feel?

It was my first year at the club and I was quite nervous if I'm being honest. It had been a while since I'd played regular football and maybe I needed time to settle. After losing my place, my head didn't drop, I worked really hard in training and just tried to improve my game as best I could. I stayed fit and made sure that I was ready to be called upon when needed.

What areas did you feel needed working on?

As a professional, you're always looking at every aspect. I was happy with my shot stopping but maybe felt that I wanted to command my area more. Games breed confidence and if I've successfully come for a cross in one game, then it kind of comes naturally in the next.

Against Hartlepool, you hardly got your gloves dirty but still ended up on the losing side.

I think I made one save during the game and for the goal, he headed it in just about the only area that I couldn't get to. It was such a frustrating result for us. As a defensive unit we did well, the communication was good and then they score from a rare opportunity.

There should be a big crowd today. Does having a large vocal support on your back

affect you at all?

When you're switched on, your focus has to be 100% on the game. Whatever people shout out, you block off. It's all about concentrating on the match, staying sharp and being prepared for whatever is thrown at you.

Goalkeepers need to have thick skin. How's yours looking?

There's always a chance that at 0-0 in the last minute, you make a mistake that leads to a goal. Unfortunately that's part and parcel of football. I made an error at Yeovil recently, where we ended up getting a draw, but I was still upset about it. However, you have to look at the positives and for the seven games preceding that, I think I did well. You can't dwell on it for too long, you have to move on and just perform in the next game.

A lot of teams use sports psychologists now. Have you had much use for one?

For a lot of last season, we had someone here called Rob Fish who was a great help to me. I would see him once a week for a sort of pick me up and I always came out of the sessions feeling better about myself.

Do you look at videos of matches to analyse your performance?

It's important to look at goals conceded to see what could have been done to prevent them. Positional play is vital as well as decision making. You can also look at what you did well in a game which also bodes well for boosting confidence.

And what about this elusive first home win?

We've been in positions to win matches but mistakes have cost us and in other games, the ball just hasn't run for us. There are other sides in this league with better away records than home, which is just football I guess. We must stay positive, focus on creating chances and that victory will come.



Luton Town

When it is considered that Luton were in the Championship as recently as 2007, taking on the likes of Crystal Palace, Southampton and Norwich City, and beating them, it underlines the dramatic decline which saw the Bedfordshire club relegated three seasons in a row, gaining the dubious honour of being the largest club to ever feature in the Conference when they opened life there in 2009.



The Hatters were undoubtedly a scalp at that level, which was a contributing factor to their stay there unexpectedly lasting five seasons until John Still repeated his magic at the Daggers and Town swept to the 2014 title as they amassed 101 points. Unsurprisingly, then, Luton were tipped to challenge for League Two promotion immediately, but, instead claimed a solid eighth spot, undoubtedly a foundation for the future, as Barnet and Bristol Rovers have both shown this season that the transition into League football is not as straightforward as it once seemed to be.

The close season saw the sale of top scorer Mark Cullen to Blackpool for £180,000 whilst fellow forward Lee Angol, who had a prolific campaign whilst on loan at promoted Conference South side Boreham Wood, rejected a new contract and signed for Peterborough United.

Elsewhere on the pitch, defenders Fraser Franks, Alex Lacey, Brett Longden and Danny Fitzsimons left the club, as did midfielders Jim Stevenson, Kynan Isaac, Shaun Whalley, Ian Rees, Andy Drury and Charlie Smith, and strikers Ross Lafayette, Charlie Walker, Ricky Miller and Alex Wall. Arriving at the club were defenders Stephen O'Donnell of Partick Thistle, Leyton Orient's Scott Cuthbert, Mark O'Brien of Derby County, West Ham United's Dan Potts and Magnus Okuonghae from Colchester United. Augmenting the midfield were Norwich City's Cameron McGeehan, for an undisclosed fee, alongside Ollie Lee from Birmingham City, former Dagger Danny Green from Milton Keynes and Brighton & Hove Albion's Paddy McCourt. The forward line was restocked with another former Dagenham player, Craig Mackail-Smith from Brighton, as well as Josh McQuoid from AFC Bournemouth and

Ipswich Town's Jack Marriott. As well as the transfer activity at Kenilworth Road, a deal elsewhere attracted interest, as the sale of Andre Gray to Burnley by Brentford means Town are set to receive up to £1.1 million, proof, if any were needed, as to how important sell-on clauses are. More recently, captain Steve McNulty has been loaned to Tranmere Rovers, and defender Sam Long has been signed on loan from Reading.

With expectations of a promotion challenge again, it has been a rather slow start for Luton, who took just two points from the first five League Two matches and stood 22nd in the fledgling table, but have improved from that low point, although have lost a large number of points through late goals. The opening match saw a stoppage time penalty from Jonathan Smith rescue a 1-1 draw at Accrington Stanley, ahead of a notable 3-1 Capital One Cup home win over

Championship side Bristol City as Marriott scored twice, alongside former Victoria Road favourite Paul Benson. Luke Wilkinson and McGeehan appeared to have set them up for a home win over Oxford United, as they led 2-0 going into the last nine minutes, only for the U's to salvage the draw, and the theme of late goals conceded reared its head again, as Bristol Rovers scored in the 94th minute to win 1-0 at Kenilworth Road, ahead of a 3-2 loss at Yeovil where the Hatters had led 2-0 after just 19 minutes, through Mackail-Smith and Benson. The former was on target again in the home clash with Portsmouth, but a stoppage time goal meant Town were defeated 2-1. In contrast, Luton scored in added time themselves to force a 1-1 Capital One Cup home draw with Premiership side Stoke City, who eventually prevailed on penalties.


September brought considerable

improvement, as four wins from five took Town into the top half. A first league win was collected at former manager Richard Money's Cambridge United side, where Luke Guttridge, Wilkinson and Green netted in a 3-1 win, before a 3-2 loss at Notts County, where Smith and McGeehan had pulled the Hatters level, only for the Magpies to steal a 90th minute winner. The two first clean sheets of the campaign proved pivotal, though, as a Mackail-Smith penalty was enough for a 1-0 home win over Mansfield Town, whilst Marriott scored twice in a 2-0 home victory against AFC Wimbledon. A pair of commanding away successes took the run of wins to four, beginning with a 3-1 triumph at Morecambe through Wilkinson, McGeehan and Smith, and followed by a 4-1 success at Hartlepool United, as Smith and Lee scored, alongside a Marriott brace. McGeehan rescued a point

in a 1-1 home draw with York City, but despite opening the scoring at Crawley Town, his goal proved in vain, as a 2-1 defeat was suffered in Sussex. Another lead was lost as Marriott was on target as Town drew 1-1 with Leyton Orient at Kenilworth Road, ahead of last Saturday's 2-1 reverse at home to Plymouth Argyle, in which they lost out to yet another stoppage time goal after McQuoid had levelled.

That match saw Mark Tyler in goal, with Long at right back, Potts at left back and a partnership of Cuthbert and Wilkinson in central defence. Into midfield, and Pelly Ruddock featured with Smith, McGeehan, Nathan Doyle and Guttridge, with Marriott as a striker. Ryan Hall came on for Long, but was sent off, whilst Alex Lawless replaced Potts in the first half, and McQuoid was brought on for Ruddock early in the second half.



MEET THE SQUAD

GOALKEEPERS

Mark Tyler is now in his seventh season at Kenilworth Road and has amassed over 250 appearances for the Hatters since signing from Peterborough in the summer of 2009. The 39-year-old helped the Hatters to promotion back to the Football League during 2013/14 and played in the history-making 1-0 win over boyhood club Norwich in January 2013.



JOHN STILL (MANAGER)

The boss joined the Hatters in March 2013 having enjoyed a hugely successful 10-year spell at Dagenham & Redbridge where he guided the Daggers to the Conference title, as well as promotion to League 1 via the League 2 Play-Offs. In his first season in the Hatters' hot-seat he guided the club to the Conference title with 101 points. It was the third time he had won the division in his career.

TERRY HARRIS (ASSISTANT MANAGER)

John Still's right-hand man who had been with Dagenham & Redbridge since 1999. As a player he starred for the old Dagenham FC – scoring a winning goal at Wembley – and has also coached at Dartford, Enfield and St Albans.

Elliot Justham made his Football League debut in the 3-2 defeat at AFC Wimbledon last February and kept his place for the remainder of last term. An ever-present on the bench during Town's Conference title campaign, Justham originally joined from East Thurrock.


Craig King signed his first professional contract this summer having impressed with his performances in the youth and reserve teams last year. King deputised on the substitutes' bench in a number of Football League matches last season. To enable his development the young keeper was sent on loan to Ryman League side Met Police for the rest of the season.

DEFENDERS

Stephen O'Donnell signed from Partick Thistle where he had earned a fine reputation as a mauling right-back with a real eye for goal. He started his career as a youngster at Celtic and has also played for the Scotland Under-21s.

Dan Potts has joined The Hatters from West Ham, where he made five appearances in the Premier League. Whilst with the Hammers he has also represented England at youth level and spent time on-loan at Colchester and Portsmouth.

Scott Cuthbert signed for the Hatters this summer having spent two years at Leyton Orient. He helped the O's reach the League 1 Play-Off final the season before last, and prior to that his influential performances enabled Swindon to do the same. He has been capped at B level for Scotland and, like O'Donnell, also came through the youth ranks at Celtic.



Scott Griffiths is now closing in on 100 appearances for the Hatters following two years of service, during which he helped the Town win the Conference title. Griffiths is another player who John Still unearthed from obscurity, having signed him from Aveley. The defender won the Conference title at Dagenham with Still before moving to Peterborough and Griffiths has also won League 2 with Chesterfield.

Sean Long is a Republic of Ireland Under-21 international who joined the Hatters on a month's loan from Championship side Reading in October 2015. He joined the Royals from Irish club Cherry Orchard and has played once for the Reading first team, making his debut as a substitute in the League Cup against Scunthorpe. The right-back made his Town debut in the 2-1 defeat at Crawley in which he set-up Cameron McGeehan's goal.

Curtley Williams is now in his second season at Kenilworth Road having joined the Hatters last summer from Lowestoft. Injuries kept him out of the Town side last season, restricting him to just three appearances but following his return from injury he helped the Hatters development squad win the development league title.

Mark O'Brien became the Hatters' 10th new recruit this summer when signing on the dotted line during the pre-season training camp in Portugal. Although versatile enough to also play in midfield, O'Brien made his name as a centre-half having come through the ranks at Derby. Injury and illness halted his progress at Pride Park but following his return to fitness he spent last season with impressive performances on loan at Motherwell north of the border.

Luke Wilkinson enjoyed an excellent first season at Kenilworth Road following his arrival from

Dagenham last summer. He repaid his boss with a string of committed displays from central defence as well as chipping in with four goals. Began his career at Portsmouth before moving to Dagenham where he was named player of the year in 2012/13.

Luke Trotman signed professional forms earlier last season after a string of impressive displays for the youth team. The right-back made his senior debut aged 16 in the FA Trophy during the title-winning campaign and has bounced back to full fitness in time for the start of this season after breaking his leg in a youth team fixture in September last year.

Mark Onyemah joined the Town last summer from Thurrock, who he returned to on-loan for a spell last term. Yet to make his Hatters debut, the powerful, quick defender has recently joined National League South (the new name for the Conference South) Dartford for a month on loan.

MIDFIELDERS

Cameron McGeehan joined on a permanent contract this summer having previously enjoyed two spells on-loan from Norwich City. The central midfielder played a key role in the Conference title campaign before rejoining again last season. He originally came through the ranks at Chelsea and has also spent time on-loan with Cambridge, helping them to a draw with Manchester United in the FA Cup.

Danny Green signed for the Hatters this summer, linking up once more with manager John Still. The Hatters boss plucked Danny from Bishop's Stortford while at Dagenham, and the winger went onto help the Daggers win the League 2 Play-Offs. After 27 goals for the Essex side he moved to Charlton who he won promotion with from League 1 to the Championship.

Jonathan Smith joined from York City in 2011. Part of the squad that won the Conference title, he began his career at Morecambe and won League 2 with Swindon. Smith fought back from a broken leg sustained on Boxing Day 2013 and has now made over 100 appearances for the club.

Alex Lawless arrived at Kenilworth Road from York in 2010 and has now made almost 175 appearances in Town colours. Lawless has also played for Forest Green. He had the disappointment of losing in three successive Play-Off finals (twice with Luton), before he helped the Hatters to the Conference title in 2013/14.

Ryan Hall joined the Hatters at the end of the January transfer window this year. He joined the Town following his release from Rotherham but he has previously excelled at League 2 level while with Southend, scoring 19 goals from the wing across two seasons as well as a loan spell at the Daggers.

Paddy McCourt came through the ranks at Rochdale but came to prominence at Celtic where he became a cult hero for the Bhoys with his silky skills and incredible solo goals. After winning the SPL twice, he left Scotland for Barnsley in 2013, briefly turned out for Brighton last season and ended the campaign on-loan at Notts County.

Pelly Ruddock Mpanzu is a former West Ham United academy graduate. The direct, pacy youngster was an instant hit when signed on-loan by John Still from the Hammers midway through the Conference title winning campaign.

Olly Lee joined the club having previously been on loan at Plymouth last season. Described as a 'passer' by manager John Still, Lee started on the books of West Ham before a move to Birmingham City. Played under Still when on-loan at Dagenham & Redbridge

Luke Guttridge now has over 500 senior appearances under his belt during a career which has seen him win promotion three times. After spells with Cambridge, Southend, Colchester, Leyton Orient, Aldershot and Northampton, Guttridge joined the Town in 2013 and his 13 goals were vital in the Conference title winning campaign of 2013/14. Injury meant he was in and out of the side last term but he still contributed well with four goals.

Nathan Doyle was named as the 2014/15 supporters' player of the season. Snapped up by John Still in September last year following his release from Bradford, Doyle immediately began taking control of the midfield, screening the back four to great effect. Nathan began his career at Derby but went onto enjoy success at Barnsley, Hull and Bradford, winning promotion while with the latter two clubs.

Isaac Galliford hit double figures for the youth team last season. Scored two impressive goals for the Hatters development squad in a match at the tail end of last season and that helped the coaching staff make the decision to offer the Luton-born youngster his first professional contract.

FORWARDS

Paul Benson signed for the Hatters originally on a season-long loan in 2013/14 from Swindon. His 18 goals helped the Town lift the Conference title before a broken leg disrupted his first permanent season with the Hatters last term. The forward was found by John Still playing in the Essex Olympian League in 2005 and has helped former clubs Dagenham and Swindon to promotion in the past.

Jack Marriott made the move to Kenilworth Road this summer having spent six years at Ipswich Town where he came through the Portman Road academy. The forward only played twice for

Ipswich in the Football League but gained experience out on-loan over the past three seasons, including two spells at Woking in the Conference where he impressed in matches against the Hatters.

Craig Mackail-Smith put pen to paper at Kenilworth Road a week before the start of the season having trained with the Hatters during pre-season. Scouted by former Daggers manager Garry Hill, Mackail-Smith joined the Daggers the season after scoring against them in an FA Trophy upset by Arlessey. His form at the Daggers won him a move to Peterborough. He scored 99 goals in 212 games for Posh, helping them win promotion on two occasions. His goals at London Road got the forward a big money move to Brighton in 2011. He scored 10 goals in his debut season at the Amex and 11 in the next before two injury-affected campaigns followed that restricted his game-time.


Josh McQuoid arrived at Kenilworth Road this summer having spent the previous three years at Premier League-bound Bournemouth. That was the forward's second spell at the Dean Court club in between a spell at Millwall. During his time at the New Den, McQuoid was capped at international level by Northern Ireland. Capable of playing on the flanks or in a central role he spent last season out on loan in League 1 with Peterborough and Coventry.

Zane Banton first came onto the scene during the Hatters' Conference title winning campaign, making his first team bow in a 4-0 win at Woking. He was soon snapped up on a professional contract and continued to impress in his appearances in the FA Trophy. He spent time out on loan last season with Biggleswade Town and Hemel Hempstead to further his footballing education.





THE UNLIKELY LADS

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles ten big-name Luton Town players not usually associated with the club.

RON DAVIES

Noted for his aerial ability, Welsh international striker Ron Davies was capped 29 times after leaving Luton Town. Signing professional for Chester in July 1959, he was twice leading marksman, moving to Luton in October 1962. He was top scorer in 1962-63, netting 21 goals in 32 League games before joining Norwich City in September 1963. Moving to Southampton in August 1966, he topped their goalscoring charts three times before joining Portsmouth in April 1973. Later with Manchester United, Arcadia Shepherds, LA Aztecs, Tulsa Roughnecks and Seattle Sounders, he coached in the United States and died in May 2013.

DEREK KEVAN

Inside-left Derek Kevan was capped 14 times by England before joining Luton Town. Initially with Ripon YMCA, he joined Bradford Park Avenue in October 1952 and followed Vic Buckingham to West Brom in July 1953. 'The Tank' was twice ever-present and top scorer on five occasions, moving to Chelsea in March 1963. Later with Manchester City, Crystal Palace and Peterborough, he joined Luton in December 1966 and netted four goals in 11 League games. He moved to Stockport in March 1967, then Macclesfield, Boston United and Stourbridge. Later a driver for Signs Specialists in Hockley, he died in January 2013.

ALAN BIRCHENALL

Former England U-23 midfielder Alan Birchenall briefly appeared for Luton Town in 1978-79. Signing professional for Sheffield United in June 1963, he joined Chelsea for £100,000 in November 1967 and moved via Crystal Palace to Leicester City in September 1971. He featured in their 1973-74 FA Cup run, then played for Notts County, San Jose Earthquakes, Memphis Rogues and Blackburn Rovers before joining Luton in March 1979. Making ten League appearances, he moved to Hereford United in October 1979, then had a spell as Trowbridge Town's player-boss, before becoming Leicester's public relations officer.

STEVE WILLIAMS

Former England international midfielder Steve Williams was capped six times before joining Luton Town. Signing professional for Southampton in July 1976, he starred as they won promotion in 1977-78, were League Cup finalists in 1979 and League Championship runners-up in 1983-84. He joined Arsenal for £525,000 in December 1984 and featured in their 1987 League Cup final triumph, moving to Luton for £300,000 in July 1988. Scoring once in 40 League games, he reunited with Alan Ball at Exeter City in August 1991. He has worked in magazine publishing and property development, settling in Ottery St Mary.

COLIN TODD

Ex-England international central defender Colin Todd appeared for Luton Town in 1984-85. Initially with Sunderland, he moved to Derby County in February 1971, starring as they won the League Championship in 1971-72 and 1974-75, when PFA Player of the Year. He joined Everton in September 1978, then played for Birmingham City and Nottingham Forest. Reuniting with Jim Smith at Oxford United in February 1984, he helped clinch the Third Division title and moved to Luton in October 1984, playing two League games. He later managed Middlesbrough, Bolton Wanderers, Swindon Town, Derby County and Bradford City.



MERVYN DAY

Luton Town's former loan goalkeeper Mervyn Day starred in West Ham's 1975 FA Cup final success. The England U-23 international was twice ever-present for the Hammers and played in the 1976 ECWC final, moving to Orient in July 1979. He was ever-present three times prior to joining Aston Villa in May 1983, then joined Leeds United in February 1985 and helped win the Second Division title in 1989-90. Loaned to Luton in March 1992, he made four League appearances. Joining Carlisle United in July 1993, he became their manager, then assisted Alan Curbishley at Charlton and West Ham, returning to Leeds as chief scout.

PAUL DICKOV

Luton Town's former loan striker Paul Dickov was capped twice by Scotland. Signing professional for Arsenal in December 1990, he was loaned to Luton in October 1993 and scored once in 15 League games. A member of the Gunners' triumphant 1994 ECWC squad, he moved to Manchester City for £1,000,000 in August 1996. Starring in three promotion campaigns, he joined Leicester City in February 2002 and was leading scorer in their 2002-03 promotion success. He then appeared for Blackburn Rovers, Manchester City again, Leicester again and Leeds United, since managing Oldham Athletic and Doncaster Rovers.

PAUL ALLEN

Former England U-21 midfielder Paul Allen had a loan spell at Luton Town in 1994-95. From a notable football family, he signed professional for West Ham in July 1979 and was the youngest FA Cup finalist at 17 years 256 days in their 1980 Wembley triumph. He moved to Tottenham Hotspur for £400,000 in June 1985 and was an FA Cup winner again in 1991. Joining Southampton for £500,000 in September 1993, he was loaned to Luton in December 1994 and made four League appearances. Joining Carlisle United in July 1993, he became their manager, then assisted Alan Curbishley at Charlton and West Ham, returning to Leeds as chief scout.

MATTHEW UPSON

Former Luton Town central defender Matthew Upson gained 21 England caps. Signing professional for Luton Town in April 1996, he made his only League appearance for the Hatters as a substitute in their 1-0 win over Rotherham four months later and joined Arsenal for £1,000,000 in May 1997. He featured in their 1997-98 Premier League title campaign and was a member of the 2001-02 'double' winning squad. Loaned to several clubs, he moved to Birmingham City for £2,000,000 in January 2003, then joined West Ham for £6,000,000 in January 2007. He has since played for Stoke City, Brighton, Leicester City and MK Dons.

JOHN HARTSON

Welsh international striker John Hartson helped Luton Town reach the FA Cup semi-finals in 1993-94. Signing professional for Luton in December 1992, he netted 11 goals in 54 League games before being sold to Arsenal for £2,500,000 in January 1995. He scored in the 1995 ECWC final, moving to West Ham for £3,200,000 in February 1997. Leading marksman in 1997-98, he joined Wimbledon for £7,000,000 in January 1999 and had a spell with Coventry City prior to joining Celtic in August 2001. He starred in their 2001-02 'treble' triumph and joined West Brom for £500,000 in July 2006, gaining a total of 51 caps.

First-half goals from Jakub Berkowicz and Paul Symes alongside a terrific second-half strike from Darren Foxley saw a masterful Dagenham & Redbridge u18s side effortlessly brush aside Stevenage in a five-goal epic.

The visitors wasted no time getting forward as midfielder Henry Burnett forced a save from the Boro keeper early on with a dipping shot after being teed up by Darren Foxley from a worked free-kick, and two early corners saw David Nicol-Wilson direct a header towards the far post before a dangerous Henry Burnett cross was just cut out moments before a goal-bound touch could be applied.

Then defender Jimmy Nottage's through ball from the wing just evaded Jakub Berkowicz, who did not have to wait long to get his next chance as a cute Henry Burnett through ball met Berkowicz's crosswise run, and the striker cleanly slid a diagonal finish in off the far post from twelve yards as the Daggers took a deserved lead.

Against the run of play, Stevenage equalised barely seconds after the Daggers gained the ascendancy as the visitors failed to get the ball out of their box, enabling the left-winger to hook it back into the path of the centre-forward to float a backheeled volley over Daniel Boness and high into the net from six yards.

The Daggers found themselves in the ascendancy once more as the resulting corner was flicked-on for Jimmy Nottage to nod in low at the far post from four yards, and Reeco Hackett-Fairchild came close to extending the lead but shot narrowly wide after the defender catastrophically slipped.

The Daggers' inevitable third eventually arrived courtesy of Jakub Berkowicz who, after planting Darren Foxley's low cross into the side netting moments earlier, was on hand to powerfully dispatch Henry Burnett's corner with downward header into the far corner of the goal.

The Daggers' first-half rout did not end there, as Henry Burnett fed Jordy Mongoy six yards from goal, and the winger's delightful turn and shot produced a sensational save from the home stopper that left Daggers players' with their hands on their heads.

The visitors continued to press in the latter half, with Berkowicz netting a wrongly-called offside goal in a move that saw midfielder Kai Heather release the striker with a powerfully volleyed through ball, enabling the trialist to cleanly chip over the keeper only to turn and find the linesman with his flag raised.

Reeco Hackett-Fairchild and Kai Heather both blasted over before Darren Foxley's swerving 25-yard strike flew above the home stopper's waist and into the net to seal a mouth-watering victory.

LEAGUE 2 NEWS

Luton Town have allowed captain Steve McNulty to join National League side Tranmere Rovers on loan in order to be closer to his family. McNulty was a key factor in Town's promotion from the National League under John Still, and amassed a total of 124 appearances for the Hatters after joining from Fleetwood Town in 2013. The deal is set to be made permanent in January when the transfer window reopens.

Mansfield Town will be without star full-back Malvind Benning until at least the New Year according to boss, Adam Murray. Benning was an ever-present for the Stags prior to picking up a serious knee injury in Town's 2-1 defeat to Bristol

Rovers earlier this month. His solid performances and spectacular goals – one against Daggers at the Chigwell Construction Stadium – propelled Mansfield into the play-off places after an excellent start to the season. Town boss Adam Murray said, "We think we'll have him back January time, he hasn't got to have an operation. He's got to be in a brace for 12 weeks." Benning was signed by Murray in the summer and has become an integral player at the One Call Stadium.

Yeovil Town have had Stephen Arthurworrey's loan spell from parent club Fulham cut short by a knee injury. The defender picked up a knee injury in Town's defeat to

Mansfield last week which will see him ruled out for over four weeks, leading to his recall back to Craven Cottage. Arthurworrey has been a key player for Yeovil this season, playing fourteen matches for the Grovers prior to injury.

York City have parted company with manager Russ Wilcox and his assistant John Schofield after a poor start to the season. The Minstermen have taken twelve points from fifteen games and find themselves just three points above the relegation zone. Last weekend's home defeat to AFC Wimbledon stretched York's winless run to nine and signalled the end for Wilcox after a year in charge at Bootham Crescent.

BILLY BINGHAM





SEASON REVIEW

2007/2008

After winning promotion from the Conference to the Football League for the very first time, Daggers began their inaugural league campaign away at Stockport County.

In a difficult match Daggers never truly took a foothold, Liam Dickinson's strike five minutes from time giving County all three points. John Still's side were further denied their first win a week later at home to Wycombe, Sam Sloma and Chris Moore's goals not enough in an enthralling 2-2 draw. The wait wouldn't go on for much long however, and a fortnight later Paul Benson's flicked 88th minute header secured a 1-0 win against Lincoln City to lift Daggers up to 21st with their first ever three points in the Football League.

A further three games without victory followed before back-to-back successes away at Mansfield and Brentford saw Daggers climb to a season high 13th in the table. Nine defeats in our next thirteen games kept the club firmly in the relegation mire, before victory at home to Bury in late December restored some much needed confidence around Victoria Road.

In spite of a difficult league campaign, the cup competitions provided a welcome distraction for the club, particularly in the FA Cup where Daggers made it to the third round for the first time since the 2002/2003 season.

Victories away at Hampton & Richmond and at home to Kidderminster Harriers set up a third round meeting with Southend United. Despite going behind early on, Daggers rallied early in the second half to take a 2-1 lead through Jon Nurse and Ben Strevens. Southend however had other plans, retaking the lead courtesy of a quickfire double salvo. And the misery was

complete for Daggers fans soon after, Tony Roberts' late sending off allowing the Shrimpers to hammer home the man advantage and secure a 5-2 win.

Back in the league and narrow defeats to Morecambe and Brentford dropped Daggers down to 22nd, a position from which even a narrow 1-0 away win at Wycombe could not lift John Still's side.

But with a tricky winter period now at a close, Daggers began to bloom at the beginning of February. With the bottom of the league looking increasingly tight, Daggers pulled out an incredible performance to see off Chester City 6-2 at Victoria Road. That was followed up by an even more impressive 4-1 win at Blundell Park against former Championship outfit Grimsby Town, goals from Ross Smith, Ben Strevens and Dave Rainford (x2) sending Daggers to a famous win in Lincolnshire.

Those two results formed part of a five game winning streak for John Still's side, a record that remains to this day for the club as a Football League outfit. Further successes at home to Morecambe and Hereford

followed, before another memorable away victory - this time 2-0 at Bradford City - kept our noses above the drop-zone.

And with the fight for survival looking increasingly as though it would go down to the final day, a combination of results elsewhere coupled with a historic victory at Darlington would seal Daggers' safety. Despite going 2-0 down to the play-off chasing Quakers, Daggers staged a remarkable comeback in the second half through Sam Sloma, Dave Rainford and Paul Benson to claim a 3-2 victory and secure Football League survival in our first season in the fourth tier of English football.

Our success came at the expense of Mansfield, the side whom we would face on the last day. With nothing left to play for, Daggers ran out comfortable 2-0 winners in a game best remembered for Lee Goodwin's stunning man-of-the-match performance.

John Still's side finished the season in 20th place, a brilliant achievement for a side written off by many at the start of the campaign.


Matt Richards, who's been out for several weeks with his Achilles will be going to see a consultant

GROUND OF THE PAST

THE VETCH FIELD

The home of Swansea City until May 2005, The Vetch Field also played host to The Who and Stevie Wonder in its 93 year existence.

Originally built on a site owned by the Swansea Gaslight Company, The Vetch – so named after a type of cabbage that grew on the soil prior to its use as a sporting arena – was constructed in 1912 to provide the town with a professional football club. Although the town had previously hosted men's football (Swansea Villa and Swansea Town), a new incarnation of Swansea Town would contest the first ever professional league fixture at The Vetch.

On the 7th September 1912, Town faced Cardiff City in a fixture that would grow to become one of the fiercest rivalries in British football. The match ended 1-1, and set the tone for a season that would see Swansea claim the Welsh Cup and the Southern League Second Division title. With that, the first set of renovations on the ground began. The South Stand was improved, while a grass pitch was laid for the first time in place of the coal cinder surface that had previously required players to wear knee-pads in case of injury!

As the years wore on, the mounds of earth that had comprised the early formations of The North Bank and East Stand began to transform into recognisable football terraces. The North Bank gained a roof and a daunting atmosphere in 1959 after a considerable £16,000 investment from the supporter's trust, while the East Stand was redeveloped in the 1970s. Now comprised of both terracing and a seated area with a

capacity of 2,500, the East Stand was also the home of the most unusual set of floodlights in the Football League

Unfortunately due to the financial problems that would go on to blight City into the early 2000s, the East Stand was the last major development to take place at The Vetch. Nonetheless it remained a popular venue for the Welsh National Football Team. From 1921 to 1988, the Dragons contested eighteen fixtures at The Vetch, including a number of World Cup and European Qualifying matches. At the conclusion of its last ever international fixture in 1988, The Vetch provided a satisfactory 44% win percentage for the Welsh National side.

With Swansea's dire financial situation slowly resolving, the emphasis was put on finding a new home away from the shadows of Swansea Prison. The Vetch, starved of investment in the quarter of a century preceding the millennium, had become decrepit to a point where it was no longer fit for purpose. Isolated parts of the stadium were now closed, and an arena that had welcome 32,000 spectators for the visit of Arsenal in 1968, could now only hold 11,000.

As a result, plans for a new stadium for both Swansea City and Ospreys were formed. It meant the 2004-2005 League Two campaign would be the Swans last at the Vetch, and what a season it was. Kenny Jackett's side were defeated just three times at home over the course of the entire season, winning their final league match at the ground 1-0 against Shrewsbury Town in April 2005. They would go on to seal promotion away at Bury a week later.

The final ever fixture at the ground however, was the 2005 Welsh Cup Final. Against recently relegated Wrexham, the Swans claimed a 2-1 victory in front of over 9,000 supporters to send the Vetch off in style. That season and the stadium move that followed provided the catalyst for Swansea's future success, allowing the club to grow, prosper and become economically viable.

The Vetch also hosted a number of rugby fixtures both domestic and internationally. The Welsh National Rugby side played six matches on the site, winning three, including a 22-10 victory against Samoa in the 1995 World Cup.

The Shaymen got off to a flyer in the pouring rain when on their first foray forward Lee rifled home. Jake Sagere collected the ball on the byline, turned and quickly struck a low cross for Lee to power past Daggers keeper Tony Roberts. The home side immediately took control and began to boss the middle of the park. It wasn't long before their early lead was doubled. A flowing move of intricate one-touch attacking forced Daggers full-back Ashley Vickers to handle just outside his own area. Sandwith thumped home his first of the season direct from the free-kick with a low drive that sneaked just a foot inside the post. Dagenham did force their way back into the game for a spell and came close when Steve Watts' volley forced a stunning reaction save from Halifax keeper Mark Cartwright. But Halifax added to the visitors' woes when McCombe glanced a header past a rooted Roberts from a Craig Midgley free-kick. A substantial spell of possession from the Daggers early in the second half brought little in the way of openings and a solid and confident Halifax back four dug their heels in.

Terrible weather conditions made it difficult for either side to play football. Stanley started the brighter of the two, with full-back Chris King seeing his thunderous 30-yard strike saved by Daggers keeper Tony Roberts in the ninth minute, before John Miles hit the post from an acute angle a minute later. Dagenham defender Magnus Okuonghae had the first chance for the home side in the 18th minute, rising highest in the Accrington box to head a Sam Saunders corner wide of the post. Dagenham striker Paul Benson nearly snatched the lead for his side five minutes before the break but fired over the bar after running onto a clever Ben Strevens pass. Roberts was

Daggers midfielder Matt Ritchie fired an inviting cross-cum-shot into the Stanley area in the 53rd minute but Benson slid in just too late to convert it. Benson should have put his side ahead in the 61st minute when he shot straight at Accrington keeper, Kenny Arthur, after pouncing on a loose ball in the visitors' box. The home side pushed men forward in search of a winner in the last ten minutes but Stanley held on for a point.

Liam Lawrence's 95th-minute penalty completed a second-half comeback for 10-man Shrewsbury away at Dagenham. Billy Bingham opened the scoring after five minutes, and the Daggers' position was improved when Jermaine Grandison saw red for pulling down Ade Yusuff when he was through on goal. Andy Mangan then equalised on 70 minutes before earning the spot-kick. Dagenham & Redbridge boss Wayne Burnett said, "I wasn't happy when their player got sent off, I felt it changed the game. They raised their game and we took the back foot and gave them the initiative. Their first goal was a great finish but their second goal was just comical defending."






Luton's only previous win away at Dagenham came in the 2007/08 League Cup. They've lost two and drawn one of their other three games there.

Today represents only the seventh competitive meeting between Dagenham & Redbridge and Luton Town. The Hatters currently hold the advantage with three victories to the Daggers one.

Although the sides did not go head-to-head in the league until the 2008/2009 season, we had met twice before in cup competitions. The first fixture took place fourteen years ago in October 2001, Victoria Road hosting an LDV Vans Trophy 2nd Round clash between Daggers and the Hatters. After a tight first half, Daggers took the lead in the second through Steve McGavin before strikes from Dean Brennan and Peter Thomson gave Luton the lead. But with the Division Three Hatters looking comfortable against their Conference opponents, Mark Ovendale put the ball through his own net to send the tie into extra-time. And it was in the first period of extra-time that Daggers snatched the victory, Ashley Vickers' effort setting up a quarter-final meeting with Bristol Rovers.

The sides would not meet again for another six years, this time in another cup competition – The League Cup. Unbeknownst to Daggers, the result – a 2-1 win for Luton with goals from Matt Spring and Drew Talbot – was to set the tone for nine years of anguish in the competition in which we are still yet to pick up a win.

The following season the two sides met for the first time in the league. And once again it was Luton who claimed the spoils, Magnus Okuonghae's goal not enough either side of efforts from Paul McVeigh and Sol Davis. In the return fixture at Victoria Road on Valentine's Day however, Daggers got their own


back. Unusually it was a man not often found amongst the goals who made the vital contributions that afternoon, Danny Foster firing a shot into the roof of the net before tapping home Sam Saunders's cross early in the second-half. Ian Henderson mustered a quick reply for the visitors but it wasn't enough as the Hatters remained bottom of the League Two table.

Following the Hatters subsequent relegation and promotion back into the Football League, the two sides did not face each other again competitively until the beginning of last season. At Kenilworth Road in October it was the Mark Cullen show, the striker netting a hat-trick as John Still's side ran out 3-1 winners. A more mundane affair at Victoria Road followed in mid-April, a game of precious few chances ending a 0-0 stalemate to further dent Town's promotion chances.

A number of players have featured for both clubs down the years, and none-more-so than in the current campaign with eight former Daggers now plying their trade under John Still at Luton Town. In the Daggers camp, Andre Boucaud

had a stint at Kenilworth Road in 2012, while Kane Ferdinand had a short loan spell under Paul Buckle, also in 2012. Others to have played for both include Dean Beckwith, David Button, Darren Currie, Tresor Kandol, Tom Kilbey, Mark Nwokeji, John Taylor and Mickey Spillane.

The most obvious connection between the two clubs currently however is Luton Town's management team of John Still and Terry Harris. Still and Harris managed the Daggers through our greatest period from 2004-2014, taking the club into the Football League, keeping us there, and then going one step further up to League One. The pair moved to Kenilworth Road in February 2014 and have since repeated their success, guiding Luton back into the Football League in their first full season in the dugout.




FOOTBALL IN THE **COMMUNITY**

We start today by offering a warm welcome to the Mayor of Barking & Dagenham, Councillor Simon Bremner's charity group, who are collecting this afternoon for the Sycamore Trust.

The Trust offers support to parents, carers and individuals affected by autism spectrum disorders and those with learning difficulties. We will soon announce the total amount collected and we thank you as always for your generous support.

You will remember from the last programme that we have a new Community Trust manager, Richard Tyne, and this week being half-term, he spent some time with me getting to grips with the job and all of the various elements involved with it. Richard starts with the Trust on Monday 16th November and is looking forward to the challenges that lay ahead.



Having worked in primary schools in Barking & Dagenham for a number of years, Richard has many contacts

within the local school system. He comes from a coaching background with experience of managing a team of coaches who provide sessions to a number of children within the borough. Richard is also heavily involved with girls' football and sponsors the borough's girl's league whilst also co-managing the under-11 girls District side.

One of the first things Richard will be involved with is the organisation of this year's Girls' Cup competition as the borough heat must be held before the 27th November. Last year, Warren School's Girls' team won the competition and went on to represent the club in the regional heats at Southend United. The competition is open to school under-13 sides and we hope that we can encourage more than four schools to enter – this is where Richard's contacts may prove useful. Following that we have the kid's cup which is open to all primary schools and again we will be working with the Barking & Dagenham Schools' football association in partnership with this competition.

Our PL Kicks sessions are also continuing to prove very successful. The challenge here is that Eastbrook School is currently undergoing major building works and therefore we are currently seeking a new venue for the sessions. We have to move venues in December.

We have also joined the Jack Petchey Award Scheme and between now and June we will be nominating three of our PL Kicks participants for a bronze award. The award can go to youngsters with an outstanding individual achievement such as being a good role model, overcoming a personal challenge, volunteering, breaking through a personal barrier or showing bravery. Each person that is nominated will have the opportunity to decide how a grant of £200 is spent for the participants of the group and we are very much looking forward to their ideas!

Our next home game is against Oxford United and Maylandsea Under-8s – who are in their first season together – will be forming our guard of honour. The team is sponsored by the Blackwater Bar and Bistro and is one of the four sides that the venue sponsors at Maylandsea. The Bar and Bistro is owned by Keith Ross, who as well as being a Daggers Match Sponsor, is also responsible for all of the Matchday Hospitality provisions here at the club.

We have two Junior Daggers birthdays coming up, so we would like to wish Thomas Raynor a happy 10th birthday for the 18th November, and Bradley Stewart a happy 14th birthday for the 20th November!

On the road to Morecambe FC

After 89 years at Christie Park, Morecambe moved into their brand new £12 million Globe Arena stadium in time for the 2010/2011 season. Despite being a new build ground, the Globe retains the charm of a lower league stadium with the inclusion of covered terraces at either end of the pitch, and an uncovered terrace running the length of the turf on the far side. The only seated stand – and by extension the largest in stature – is the Peter McGuigan Stand, so named after the man himself. This stand holds just under 2,200 spectators, contributing to an overall stadium capacity of 6,476.

TRAVELLING BY CAR:
Exit the M6 at junction 34 and take the A683 towards Lancaster followed by the A589 towards Morecambe. Go straight across two roundabouts, passing a McDonalds outlet on



your left-hand side. At the next roundabout take the first exit into Westgate Road (signposted as West Promenade, Sandylands). Continue along this round for around a mile and the ground should soon become visible on the right. Other routes avoiding Lancaster are also available. Parking at the stadium is for permit holders only, as a result your best bet is to find street parking which should be plentiful on the roads surrounding the stadium.

BY TRAIN:

Any Daggers fans planning to travel by train should note that there is no direct service running from London Euston. Supporters should travel to Lancaster and from here change onto a Northern Rail service which takes approximately 10 minutes before arriving into Morecambe Station. The Globe Arena is around a 20 minute walk away via the seafront, so it is advised that supporters book a taxi upon arrival.

SUPPORTERS COACH:

The supporters club will be running a coach to this fixture at a cost of £25 for members and £30 for non-members. It will depart Victoria Road at 7:15am and contain a 45 minute comfort break en-route. Anyone wishing to book should contact Russell Elmes on the Daggers travel hotline.

DAGGERS FANS:

Daggers supporters will be located in the far corner of the Peter McGuigan Stand where 300 seats are made available for visiting fans. This stand is all seated and offers an unobstructed view of proceedings with both hot and cold food available in the concourse underneath. Supporters are able to purchase their ticket on the turnstile without an increase on the advance price.

FOOD & DRINK:

A number of food outlets are available along the seafront and in the town which is around a 10 minute walk from both the station and the stadium. The nearest pub to the station is the Hurley Flyer which admits away supporters, otherwise the Regent Leisure Holiday Park located a few minutes' walk along Westgate also has a bar, Sky TV and hot food available. Supporters travelling by train may also wish to visit the Eric Bartholomew on Euston Road which is a Wetherspoons. The York Hotel – a popular venue for away supporters in the Christie Park era – is also nearby and serves hot food, while the Smuggler's Den along Poulton Road is listed in the CAMRA Good Beer guide.
