Well, it's been another tough week for all involved at Yeovil Town FC after back-to-back defeats to Bristol Rovers and York City.



Harry's time to impress

Loan signing Harry Cornick is hoping some of Bournemouth's Premier League magic can help him impress during his spell at Huish Park.

The winger arrived in South Somerset on the eve of the season and made an instant impact as he scored on his debut at Exeter on the opening day.

The former Christchurch youngster is rated highly by the Cherries management but needs to accumulate first team experience before he challenges for a place in their first team squad.

So a spell with Yeovil is ideal for his development - and Cornick is hoping to be inspired by the wide men who helped Bournemouth win promotion to the Premier League last season.

Matt Ritchie, Marc Pugh and Junior

Stanislas all impressed as the Dorset side reached the top flight. And Cornick admits he looks up to all three as he tries to carve out a career in professional football.

He said: "I learn every day from the players at Bournemouth. It's a great squad with brilliant players who are now in the Premier League.

"They've all got their tricks and their way to beat a player and they can only help me to improve when I play or train with them.

"It's good to have them around and there are lots of good wide players and forward players in the squad for me to learn from.

"I look at them all in a different way and they all have their own qualities. Matt

Ritchie has a great shot on him and a brilliant delivery.

"Junior (Stanislas) can beat players for fun; Marc Pugh has great skills and is brilliant at cutting inside the full-back so they are all good at different things.

"If I can just take a little bit from every one of them then I'm sure I will improve."

Cornick joined the Cherries from Non-League Christchurch two years ago, just in time to witness their transformation from Football League also-rans to Premier League underdogs.

He added: "It's been a whirlwind for Bournemouth over the last few years. They've just kept winning games and ended up going all the way to the Premier League.

"It's going to be a tough season but one that I know that everyone at the club is really going to enjoy.

"They will work hard, I know that, and I'm sure they will stay up. They've got a good side and a good squad with a brilliant young manager and I'm pretty sure they'll be ok."

Cornick has yet to experience a winning feeling at Huish Park, with the Grovers losing all four games so far this season.

But he insists he's enjoying his time with Yeovil - and broadening his footballing education.

Cornick said: "It's good to be getting plenty of game time and it's a different experience to what I've been used to at Bournemouth where it's a different style of play.

"I've really enjoyed my first few weeks here. Results haven't gone too well but there's a great team spirit here and everyone is remaining positive so I'm sure things will turn around soon and we'll get a few wins and climb up the table.

"At Bournemouth I play for the Under-21s and train with the first team from time to time but the style there is very different.

"They are always looking to play and get on the ball and play out from the back whereas here it's more of a long ball approach and we look to get the ball forward early.

"So I need to work on fitting into this system and it will definitely help me improve as a player during my time here."

Cornick has enjoyed a meteoric rise, from playing Non-League in 2013 to being part of a Premier League club just two years later.

He was spotted by a Bournemouth scout playing for Christchurch and didn't hesitate to sign for their illustrious neighbours.

The wideman said: "I was at Christchurch which was the local club close to my house. I was playing Non-League, in the Wessex League.

"It's a family club and everyone is very nice and very welcoming. When they found out clubs were coming to watch me they were really pleased for me.

"Then Bournemouth came in with an

offer and it just made sense for me to give that a go and it's worked out well so far.

"Bournemouth look at a lot of Non-League clubs. They've got a great scouting network and they've picked up some good players that way.

"It's good for them to bring local talent to the club and it has helped me massively in my career so far."

And Cornick now has a familiar face alongside him in the Town squad after Cherries midfielder Josh Wakefield linked up with the team in York on Tuesday night.

Wakefield made his debut at Bootham Crescent just hours after meeting his new

team-mates - and Cornick welcomed his arrival

He said: "I'm buzzing to have Josh with me here now. It's good for me to have someone in the squad that I know so well and someone to do things with when we are not training.

"I know he's a good player so hopefully he will help improve the side and help us start getting some results.

"We've been playing in the same team for the last two years at Bournemouth so we know each other's game inside out, which can only help us here."

Alex Lacey is likely to be more familiar with away supporters today having started his career at Luton Town.

The central defender admits it was hard to leave the Hatters this summer after eight years at the club, but says he is fully focused on getting the three points for Yeovil today.

He said: "I was 16 and had never been signed despite trials at a lot of clubs. At Luton I was progressing through the youth system, but when I reached the age of 16 I had to make a choice - whether to continue with A-Levels or sign professionally. I ended up getting a scholarship with Luton and I've enjoyed it ever since.

"I initially joined Luton when I was 13, rising through the youth team and academy to the reserves and the first team. I ended up making just over 50 appearances so I'd been there a long time and I was very comfortable at the club. It's where I was born and raised as well so it was a tough decision to leave but I think it was the right career choice to make.

"Of course, first and foremost, I will be a Yeovil player and out to win. It will be nice to say hello to everyone but as soon as I'm out on that pitch I just want to win the game. It will be good to see a few old faces though."

Having signed a two-year deal with the Grovers in the closed season, Lacey reveals why he chose Yeovil as his next step.

Lacey added: "Yeovil's been a great club in previous years and having been in the Championship was a big factor. I came here and met with the manager and the staff and I really liked my introduction to the squad.

"The facilities are very good and I felt it was a place I could come and get 40 games in League Two and that appealed to me a lot.

"I'd love to play as many games as possible. Be successful and hopefully win the league, that's the aim or at least to go up."

Most footballers look up to a star player and Lacey is no different, with the 22-year-old acknowledging there is one standout Premier League player he admires.

He said: "Definitely John Terry. He's been so solid and successful at Chelsea for however many years. He's probably the best English centre-back at the minute and I think if you had to pick anyone as an idol then he'd be first choice."

LUTON TOWN

Having narrowly missed out on a play-off place last season, Luton Town have their eyes on promotion this year.

The Hatters fell away badly at the end of last season and veteran manager John Still appears to have signed wisely in the summer with 11 new additions, including strikers Craig Mackail-Smith and Josh McQuoid and creative players Paddy McCourt and Cameron McGeehan.

These carefully calibrated arrivals join a squad which already boasts experience in the form of captain Steve McNulty, goalkeeper Mark Tyler and forward Paul Benson, meaning an improvement on last season's eighth-place finish is definitely the target.

It was injuries and suspension which led to the club's collapse with just four wins in their final 16 matches of the season, including seven defeats in a row, and manager Still believes his new arrivals will help prevent this problem recurring.

He said: "What we need is 22 players fighting from Monday to Friday to play on Saturday and at the moment in training we've got that. We have tried to make our squad strong and it has good competition for places.

"We are quite pleased, having brought so many in, that 95 per cent are on the same wavelength and the only reason the odd one or two might not be can be for a variety of reasons."

It is testament to the quality of these arrivals that the loss of last season's top scorer Mark Cullen, who joined League One side Blackpool for a six-figure fee in the summer, has barely been mentioned in the pre-season previews.

However, the Hatters arrive at Huish Park still looking for their first win in League Two after two draws and a defeat in their opening three matches.

They were held 1-1 at Accrington Stanley on the opening day, tied 2-2 at home to Oxford United last weekend and went down to a last-minute defeat to Bristol Rovers on Tuesday night.

To add insult to injury, it was former player, Stuart Sinclair, who raced through in the fourth minute of injury time at the end of the game to net the winner four days ago.

However, in between the opening two games, they showed their class with a 3-1 defeat of Championship newcomers Bristol City in the first round of the Capital One Cup.





>> **GOALKEEPERS**

Luton Town arrive for today's game with two goalkeepers competing for their number one jersey.

Veteran **Mark Tyler**, who had a loan spell at Yeovil Town nearly a decade ago, has been the club's first-choice for many seasons until suffering a knee injury three months from the end of the last campaign.

That gave **Elliott Justham**, signed from East Thurrock United in 2013,

the opportunity to stake a claim for the spot and played the remainder of the campaign and signed a one-year extension to his contract in the summer.

Despite Tyler regaining his fitness, it was Justham who started the 1-1 draw at Accrington Stanley on the opening day between the posts, although Tyler returned for the 3-1 defeat of Bristol City in the Capital One Cup and last weekend's 2-2 home draw with Oxford United.

It was an error from Tyler which cost his side all three points against Oxford, but he managed to retain his place for Tuesday night's 1-0 defeat against Bristol Rovers.

John Still gave Tyler his Football League debut back in 1994 when he was boss at Peterborough United, a club the keeper went on to make more than 400 appearances for before joining Luton where he has played more than 200 times.

During his time at Peterborough, the keeper spent a month on loan at Huish Park at the end of 1996, the season which saw the Gloves return to the Conference winning the ICIS League title.

Academy graduate **Craig King** signed his first professional contract with the club in June after appearing on the bench as cover for Tyler last season.

>> **DEFENDERS**

Club captain **Steve McNulty** remains the formidable force in the heart of the visitors' defence.

>> **STAT ATTACK**
Jonathan Smith's last-minute equaliser on the opening day means Luton are unbeaten in their last six season openers in the Football League.

The robust central defender, who claimed the armband last season, is likely to be in the middle of the three-man backline favoured by manager John Still.

McNulty, whose ability with the ball at his feet belies his sizeable frame, is likely to be joined by **Scott Cuthbert** and former Bristol City man **Luke Wilkinson**.

Cuthbert was snapped up following his release by Leyton Orient at the end of last season, he was part of the Orient and Swindon Town sides which reached the play-off finals.

Wilkinson, one of a number of Hatters players who played under Still at Dagenham and Redbridge, formed a solid partnership alongside McNulty last season and is also a threat in the opposition box with four headed goals from set-pieces last season.

Former Colchester United captain **Magnus Okuonghae** has struggled with an Achilles injury since joining in the summer and is unlikely to feature today.

Alongside the back three are likely to be wing-backs **Stephen O'Donnell** and **Scott Griffiths** down the right and left respectively.

Griffiths, another player who played under Still at Dagenham, has been a regular since his arrival in 2012 while O'Donnell has arrived with an impressive reputation from Partick Thistle in the summer.

Mark O'Brien, who arrived following his release by Derby County in the summer, is able to play as a centre-half or full-back and has even been known to play in midfield.

Dan Potts and **Curtley Williams** are other options on the left and right sides respectively, while teenagers **Luke Trotman** and **Andy Parry**, who had a month on loan at Non-League Southport last year, are also available.

Potts was snapped up in the summer following his release by Premier League West Ham United, where his father, Steve, was a defender, and has the ability to play in the middle.

MIDFIELDERS & FORWARDS >>

>> MIDFIELDERS

A glance at **Paddy McCourt**'s footballing CV suggests a nomadic player.

However, when some of the names among his former employers include Scottish giants Celtic, Brighton and Hove Albion and Barnsley, the Northern Irishman is clearly a talent.

Nicknamed "the Derry Pele" during his time with his hometown team, the skilful midfielder has an ability to unlock any defence with a moment of trickery.

He has also carved out a reputation for being able to score goals with a 40-yard chip he netted for his country against the Faroe Islands in 2011 described by one reporter as "one of the best ever witnessed" for Northern Ireland.

McCourt returned to the national team last season despite not making Brighton's first-team in the second half of the campaign and being sent out on loan to Notts County.

He was an anonymous figure when Notts came to Huish Park for Paul Sturrock's first match in charge of Yeovil in April and was substituted after an hour, but he undoubtedly has the ability to do damage if he is in the mood today.

Alongside McCourt, all-action midfielder **Nathan Doyle** provides solidity in the middle of the park as does former Swindon Town man, **Jonathan Smith**, who missed a penalty and then scored Luton's equaliser in an opening day draw at Accrington.

It was Still who plucked the Scotland international from Non-League Arlesey Town to join Dagenham and Redbridge 11 years ago, where he scored 38 times in 93 appearances, before going on to play for Peterborough United and then Brighton and Hove Albion.

Given his career record of almost a goal every other game, it is no surprise Mackail-Smith had a number of options following his release by Brighton where he struggled to find fitness following a big money move.

Having stated he wants to return to "playing with a smile", Mackail-Smith will undoubtedly be a threat today.

The striker was the star signing of the summer but in **Josh McQuoid**, the visitors have another capable forward.

He arrived at Kenilworth Road following his release by Premier League new boys

AFC Bournemouth in the summer after failing to feature for them last season.

The Northern Irishman impressed during a loan spell at Coventry City in the first half of last season, scoring five times, before returning to Dean Court where he sat out the remainder of the campaign.


Jack Marriott, who signed in the summer following his release by Ipswich Town, staked his claim for a starting place with an impressive substitute appearance on the opening day at Accrington followed by a double in the 3-1 Capital One Cup against Bristol City three days later.



One of the most experienced heads in the Football League, **John Still** has been in football management since the mid-1970s.

The Luton Town boss, now 65 years old, arrived at Kenilworth Road two and a half years ago from Dagenham and Redbridge where he was the League's longest-serving manager following nine years with the club.

When he guided the Hatters to the Conference title with a record 101 points in 2013, it was the third time he had won the division in his career.

Still has admitted he understands the disappointment behind the club's failure to secure a play-off spot last season.

He said: "I think we've reacted well to (failing to finish in the top six last season). We have to keep progressing and this season we want to be better than we were last season and hope we can find ourselves at that top end at the end of the season."

The boss guides Luton into the current campaign knowing they are among the favourites for the League Two title, but his experience is refusing to allow his side to get carried away.

He added: "It is good that people recognise your squad is strong and you are doing the right thing, but it is on the pitch that counts."

Still's managerial career has largely kept him within his native South East starting out in the Non-League game with Leytonstone and Maidstone United, both of whom he got promoted out of the Southern League during the days when Yeovil played at that level.

He snubbed opportunities to turn full-time until 1994 when he took the job at Peterborough United which he held for just 18 months before going on to spend five years over two spells at Barnet, nine years at Dagenham before joining Luton.

Between one of his stints at Barnet and taking the job at Dagenham, he spent six months at Bristol Rovers, as assistant to Ray Graydon, before the club's financial troubles meant they had to cancel his contract.

His number two, Terry Harris, has been with Still since their days together at Dagenham while Kevin Dearden, who played more than 100 times for Torquay United, is on the books as goalkeeping coach.





Welcome to today's game which sees the Gloves of Yeovil take on the Hatters of Luton. The Hatters have only visited us once before and that was on October 2, 2007, when we played a League One game which ended goalless. The return at Kenilworth Road was a 1-0 victory for Luton, so our league record is currently not very strong.


Prior to those meetings we were drawn together for our very first game in the Carling Cup. With only a single Football League game under our belts we visited Bedfordshire and were given a bit of a footballing lesson by a side from the league above. Yeovil lost 4-1 and even the Gloves goal was an own goal, despite Darren Way's best attempts to claim it.

One player who some may remember playing for Yeovil is Mark Tyler, who should be in goal for Luton today. He came to Somerset from Peterborough United to cover for an injury to Tony Pennock in November 1996. He then got injured himself after two games, and watched as three other keepers were used before regaining fitness. He played two more matches before Tony Pennock was available to resume his normal duties.

Whilst several of the players that appeared in the ICIS (Isthmian) League winning squad of 1996-97 are still involved in football in various capacities, Mark must be the last one playing.

Another player probably better known to Luton fans is our own Alex Lacey. As we get used to our 17 new players, Alex will be coming up against the club where he went through their youth system between 2007-10. He made a total of 51 appearances for Luton over five years before being sent out for several loan spells.

Others that have played for both sides are Ryan Inniss who played three times for Luton and six times for Yeovil whilst on loan from Crystal Palace and Michael

McIndoe who started his senior career at Luton before coming to Yeovil via Hereford. He made 110 appearances for the Gloves and won the FA Trophy and Conference title, but didn't play in the Football League as he left before the start of the 2003-04 season.

The term 'yo-yo club' could be applied to many, but no more so than Luton Town. Having won the second tier in 1981-82, they spent 10 seasons in the top flight until relegation in 1991-92. This was the last season of the 'old' first division before the formation of the Premier League, which they only just missed playing in.

By 2000-01 they were in the fourth tier (League Two today) and by 2004-05 were back to second tier (Championship today), and by 2008-09 were in the Conference! Here they remained for five seasons before eventually winning the title and back to League Two. This is their second campaign at this level.

Eric Morecambe was a great supporter of Luton Town, mentioning them in some of his sketches on the Morecambe & Wise show. Let's hope today brings us sunshine and three points for the Gloves.

Out with the old and in with the new

This week marked the 25th anniversary of the first competitive match here at Huish Park. The Grovers lined up against Colchester United on August 18, 1990 and won 2-0 with goals from Mickey Spencer and Peter Conning. But work on the new stadium had begun years before, and it wasn't an easy road to come along.

The first whisperings of a new ground for Yeovil Town FC were heard in 1985. Weymouth and Dorchester were eyeing up new sites for their stadia and initial discussions with supermarket giant Tesco took place with a view to the club selling their Huish ground and building a new modern stadium elsewhere.

At Christmas 1986, the club's advisors Collier & Madge, advised the club that the offer for Huish of £2.4 million was the best offer they could hope for. The new proposed site would be at Houndstone and would be 20.75 acres on freehold and 4.2 acres on a long lease agreement. The site had been identified and planning went in during the summer of 1987 for a 10,000 capacity ground that would be the envy of the Non-League world.

With the Bradford fire report insisting that clubs spent huge funds on making their stadiums safe, the move seemed well timed. The club's shareholders voted by a huge majority to agree the sale of Huish with more than 91% backing the 'yes' campaign at an E.G.M in August 1987.



On the pitch, season 1987-88 was a roaring success as the optimism and ambition flowed from terrace to team. Brian Hall's men lifted the Vauxhall Opel Premier League Championship before adding the AC Delco Cup with a 3-1 win over Hayes in the final.

The 1988-89 season then saw GM Vauxhall Conference consolidation with a ninth place finish before the final season at what would now be known as 'the old ground'. Huish had been Yeovil's home since 1920, 70 glorious years of cup giant-killings and tilts at the Football League. But time doesn't stand still and by the end of the 1980's, the ground that had seen Liverpool, Sunderland,

Arsenal et al was looking tired and a little dishevelled. The capacity was reduced significantly following national supporter safety decisions and by the time work on the new ground had begun, a lot of fans were ready to move.


The first real visible signs of Huish Park's birth came when the ground works at Houndstone started. It had been a long wait of 20 months for the result of the public enquiry but when the Department of Environment finally gave the go ahead on March 21, 1989, there were growing concerns that the delay would cost the club financially. The board visited Scunthorpe's Glanford Park stadium, a similar sized structure to the planned new Yeovil one, and in May, a borehole was drilled to locate a water supply. The summer brought the news that the cost

of the contract to build Huish Park had spiralled to £3.5 million.

On October 16, 1989, the traditional first sod was cut at Huish Park and the following month saw the landscape really start to alter as the steelwork erection commenced. Within three to four weeks, there was enough work complete to have the first of several guided tours of the new stadium while arrangements to sell off various parts of the old ground were put in place. Chesham United, Barnet and Burton Albion all suggested they'd like the main stand at Huish; quite desirable given that it was only around 27 years old. Fans would also be given the chance to buy the turf from Huish.

Sunday April 1, 1990 was a real landmark day for Grovers supporters as their new ground took shape. More than 500 fans took the opportunity to view the new ground with club chairman Gerry Lock conducting the tours himself. The main structures of the two side stands were well along the road to construction and the two ends also, though they would be completed without roofs due to cost controls.

Huish Park was finally beginning to resemble a football stadium and one to be proud of; it appeared modern, neat and stylish and well on the way to being ready to be the home of the most famous Non-League team ever, Yeovil Town.


But Artur wasn't alone in his misfortune, for two other keepers with strong Yeovil connections were also suffering the same fate at the weekend.

I was at Huish Park for the first time last weekend to see us lose out to local rivals Bristol Rovers and although this is being penned before the Tuesday fixture with York City, there was already an air of discontent around the terrace with regards to the Grovers' success this season.

I'm not sure if any of those around had firmly pressed down on the metaphorical panic button, but there were some already convinced we were heading towards dropping out of the league - something one person ironically referred to as "doing a Bristol Rovers".

Despite a couple of local derby losses, a Capital One Cup exit and an injury list that could fill an entire Football League bench, it's a little too early to be worried about copying our blue and white cousins from up the A37.

The most positive performances from the weekend came from Artur Krysiak and Jakub Sokolik and it got me thinking about those two players and their history with YTFC.

Both players joined in the summer of 2014 and both could have been forgiven for thinking their career in Somerset was over at different points.

Krysiak was one of six goalkeepers used by Yeovil last season and spent his time in and out of the side, at one point not even making the bench when one of three fit and available keepers.

As for Sokolik, he started well putting in a fantastic performance at right back against Walsall early in the Grovers' first away win of the season. He began as fans favourite with his no nonsense, hard hitting style.

He would play just 12 times for Yeovil, all prior to Christmas before falling out of favour and joining Southend on loan seemingly destined for the exit.

Injury would cut the loan deal short and cost the defender the rest of the season. When Sturrock returned Sokolik was thrown a lifeline when he was announced

as one of two fit players retained by the new manager along with Nathan Smith.

Krysiak on the other hand was told he was free to find other employment but in a turnaround he was back in contention by the start of the new season.

Krysiak and Sokolik's individual performances against Bristol Rovers have shown the type of attitude needed to succeed at Yeovil. Facing the exit and uncertainty over their future they turned themselves into two pieces of the Yeovil Town puzzle.

The key is now forcing themselves into the picture as key players in a spine of the side with a returning Matt Dolan and one of the strikers staking their claim in a similar way as the season progresses.

In a hectic and injury ravaged start to the season, us Yeovil fans have a couple of familiar faces to rely on as the new players bed themselves in.



>> VIEW ON THE WORLD OF FOOTBALL

It seems a very odd thing to say that a manager can be 'embattled' only three games into a season, but August has not been a good month for Jose Mourinho thus far.

A Community Shield loss to Arsenal, an opening day draw at home to Swansea, and last weekend's humbling at the hands of a rampant Manchester City, coupled with the controversy surrounding the demotion of medics Dr Eva Carneiro and Jon Fearn, has seen the Blues make a stuttering start to the season.

Can they turn it around? Of course they can. In last weekend's column I predicted them to retain the Premier League, and that hasn't changed. They're still the best side, with the deepest squad, and the best manager. The last fortnight has just shown that the Blues are not invincible.

What it has certainly shown us is that Mourinho already knows the areas of his squad that need attention; John Terry, withdrawn for the first time in 177 matches under the Portuguese last weekend against City, cannot go on forever. The former England captain has had a new lease of life since Mourinho came back to the club but was ruthlessly exposed against Sergio Aguero at the Etihad and suffered the ignominy of being withdrawn at half-time.

This puts the relentless pursuit of Everton's John Stones into sharp focus; Mourinho has clearly identified the young Toffee as a natural successor to Terry. A calm, measured defender and a capable ball-player, Stones possesses all the attributes to go on and become a stalwart of the Blues' defence, and would benefit massively from being under the tutelage of Terry for a year or two before taking up the baton. Will Everton sell though? That remains to be seen.

Their other problem area appears to be up front. With Diego Costa reportedly still struggling for fitness, Mourinho moved swiftly this summer to sign up last season's Manchester United

flop Radamel Falcao. One ponders his motives; is it because he genuinely believes Falcao is the same player as before his injury? A chance to get one over Louis van Gaal if he's a success? Regardless, Falcao and Costa look well off the pace up front and I wouldn't be at all surprised to see them bolster their lines further before the transfer deadline.

Then, of course, we come to the ridiculous Carneiro/Fearn squabble. Mourinho demoted them after they treated Eden Hazard for injury whilst Chelsea were playing with ten men against Swansea, temporarily reducing them to nine.

Last week's defeat at the Etihad was so poor it actually deflected some attention away from this sorry spat that seems to have developed; Mourinho has faced criticism for his actions in demoting them from the bench but if his match day medical team are ultimately at his discretion and he believes his staff underperformed, in my view that's up to him.

A lot of Blue fat to chew on already then, and after three games I didn't think Chelsea would have no wins and six goals conceded. Mourinho will sort it out, for sure, but it's made for an interesting and intriguing start to the season to see him on the defensive for a change.
