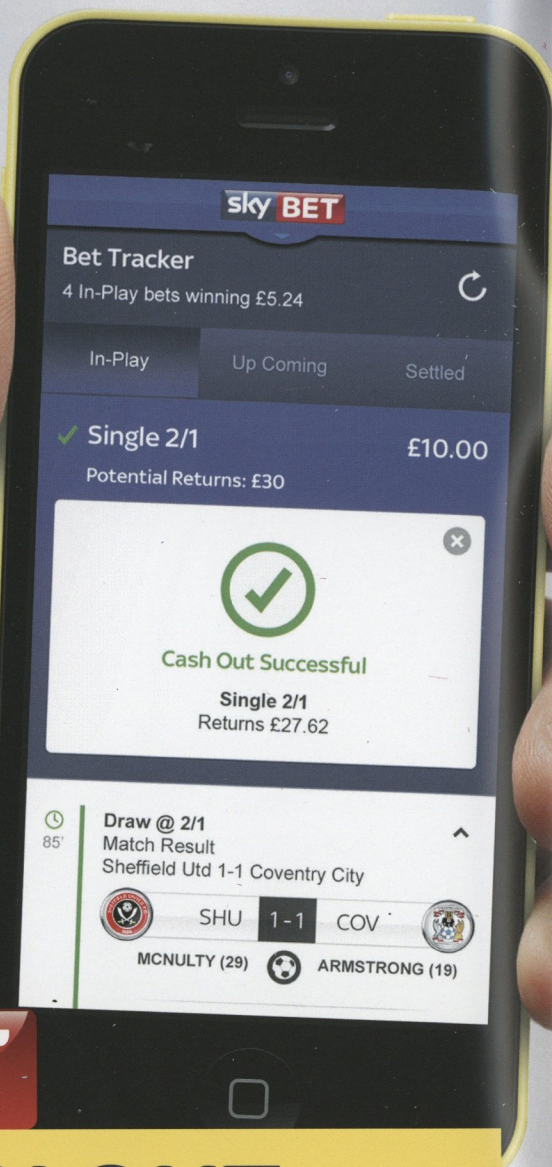

We need to get points on the board quickly to keep the table tight from our point of view and Saturday is a great opportunity to do that following on from a couple of positive results and performances.



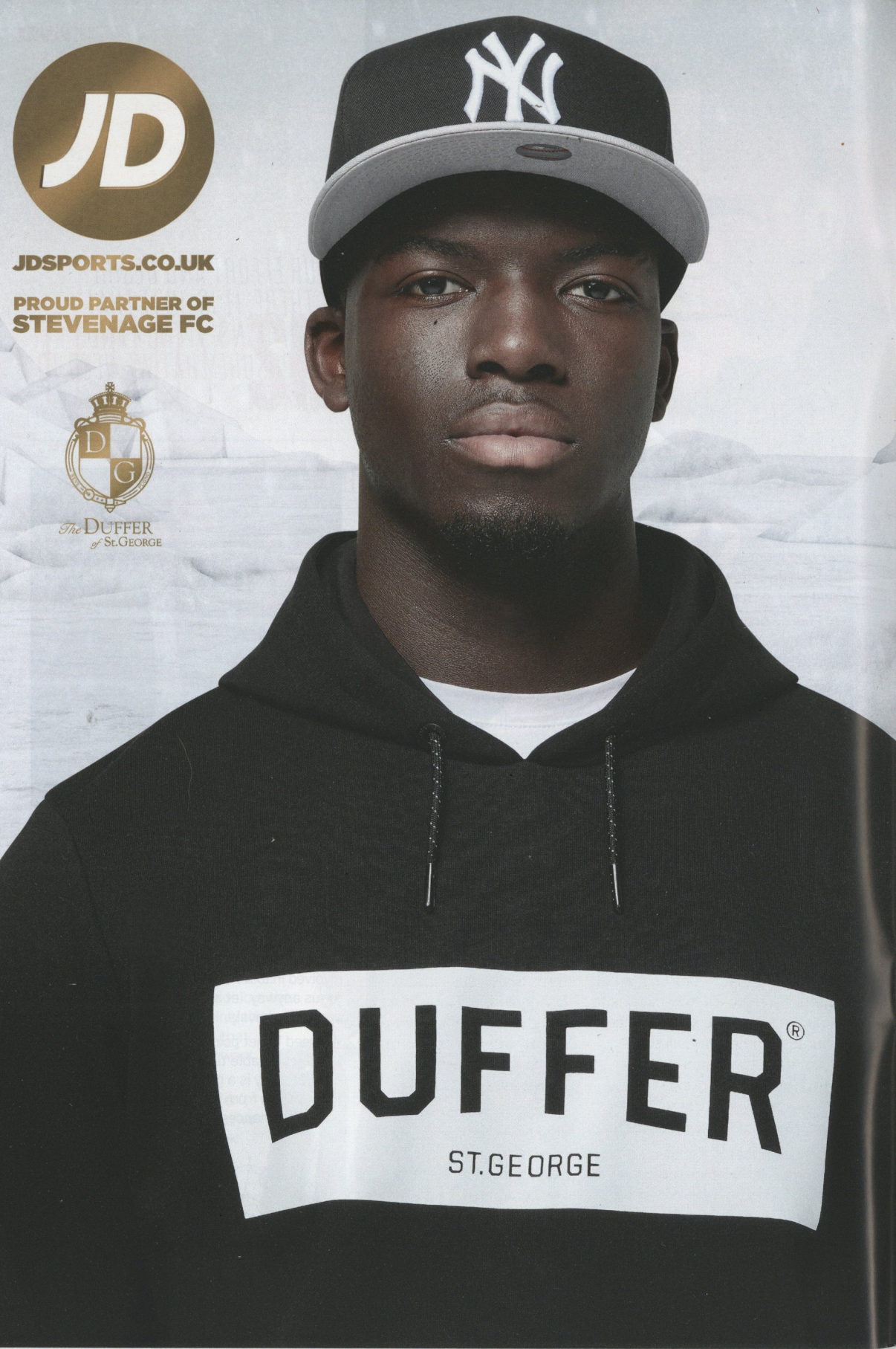

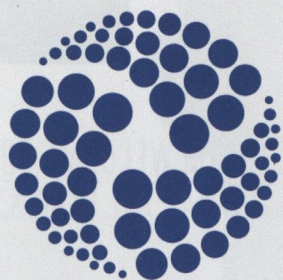

THE FOOTBALL LEAGUE SET FOR REBRANDING



EFL

COMING SOON • SEASON 16/17

The Football League is to be renamed the English Football League as part of a comprehensive corporate and competition re-branding.

The new title, which will come into use at the conclusion of the current season and ahead of the 2016/17 campaign, will be shortened to EFL for everyday use across the game.

The EFL name will be accompanied by a stunning new visual identity featuring a dynamic circular arrangement of 72 balls in three swathes of 24, representing each of the League's member clubs and the respective divisions they play in.

The new logo is just the fourth in the 127 year history of the world's original league football competition and, for the first time, each club will be presented with its own bespoke version in its individual playing colours, ahead of the new season, for it to retain in perpetuity.

The Football League's Chief Executive, Shaun Harvey said: "The new EFL name rightly emphasises the central role

our clubs play at the heart of English professional football.

"In an increasingly challenging global sports market, it is absolutely essential that sports properties can project a modern identity that not only resonates with their regular audience but is also easily recognisable to a broader audience of potential fans, viewers and commercial partners.

"We believe the EFL name and brand would be retaining the three existing divisional titles, while at the same time retaining our unique heritage. As such, it will be something that all fans can identify with - whether they be young or old, at home or abroad.

Harvey also confirmed that the League would be retaining the three existing divisional titles, "The Championship, League One and League Two divisional titles have proven popular with fans since their introduction in 2004 and have since been used by leagues in other countries and in other sports. It is therefore our intention to incorporate them into the new EFL brand," he said.

DIPO JOINS ALDERSHOT ON LOAN

Dipo Akinyemi last week joined Aldershot on a one month youth loan.

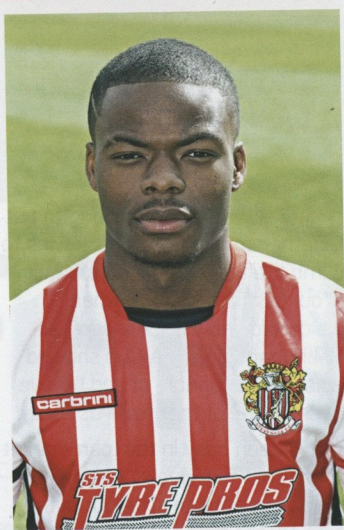
The 18-year old striker has made 14 appearances for Boro this season and it's hoped this loan spell will aid his development with further first team football.

Akinyemi has already made an immediate impact at the Shots, scoring in his first appearance against Lincoln and he says he hopes to improve his game for when he returns to Boro.

"I saw it as an opportunity. An opportunity to play games and goals. I have done ok at Stevenage so far but I wasn't playing or starting as much recently so hopefully I can continue to improve at Aldershot.

"It is always good to score. I only trained with the lads a few days, was put into the team and had a nice debut. It is still a good level, only one division below us so I think it is a good move.

"I just hope to keep playing, keep scoring and get better for when I return to Stevenage."



GNANDUILLET HAS MORE TO SHOW AFTER SIGNING LOAN EXTENSION



Armand Gnanduillet says he is delighted to have extended his loan with Stevenage for an extra month after fitting in perfectly since his move from Chesterfield.

The French striker has started every game since joining the club and has scored a couple of goals to compliment his impressive performances.

Despite this, Gnanduillet says there is more to come.

"It is good to play. I have a good feeling with the lads and I am happy here and even though I think I have done ok, I know there is more to come and I am getting stronger each game.

"When I came here I only started two games at Chesterfield so I wasn't properly fit. Game after game I feel fitter and more confident so I know I can do a lot better. It comes little by little so extending the loan was important to me."

In the final minutes of our last home game against Gillingham, Gnanduillet

scored a tap-in to round off the 3-0 win after unselfish work from Dean Parrett in the build-up.

The win was arguably the best performance of the season and Gnanduillet says that after a good talk in the week, the team were determined to get the win.

"Before the Gillingham game we had a really good talk and everybody was ready for the fight. We were all ready and it showed in the game. We need to keep doing it in future games and I am sure we will get up the table.

"To be fair I missed a great chance earlier in the game which I should have scored so I have to thank Dean for giving me the goal at the end." He added about his goal in the final minutes.

"As a striker you always want to score no matter how, it was probably the easiest goal I have scored in my career but I don't care really!"

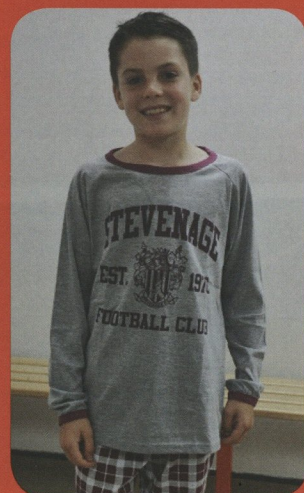
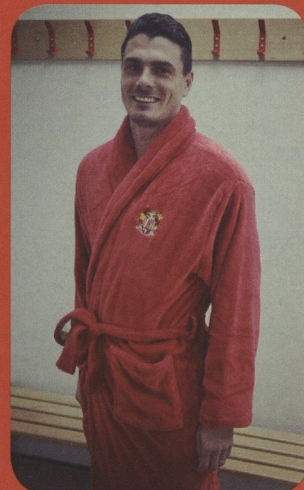

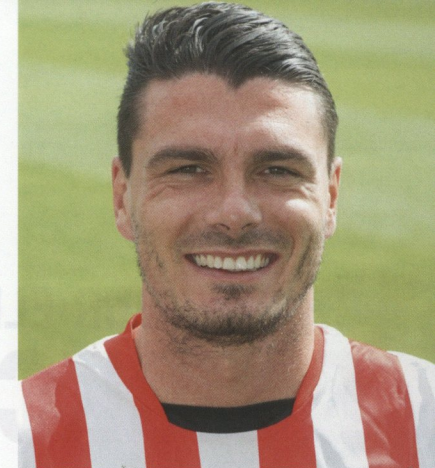

IN OUR LAST OUTING HERE AGAINST GILLINGHAM WE PUT IN OUR BEST ALL-ROUND PERFORMANCE OF THE SEASON AND SHOWED EVERYONE WHAT THE POTENTIAL OF THIS SQUAD IS.

We showed that we can put one foot in front of the other when we get each other going and I think we backed each other up well in that game. We played some good football; we didn't play in the wrong areas in that match. We got the ball forward and played off that. Dangerous going forward, compact without the ball and secure at the back. We scored three goals and kept a clean sheet; all the things that I have been talking about in recent notes and we have been working towards in training.

When we can put in performances like that against a very good team that are riding high in the division above is it is even more puzzling and frustrating that we have been unable

to find that form on a regular basis in our league matches. But there is a long way to go in terms of the league, still 29 more games to play, so we have to set about ensuring that we put in that type of performance week in and week out to earn the points to move us up the table.

As a team we travelled down to Yeovil last weekend full of confidence. In the first half we played well, we were in no danger at all and could and should have gone in at the break in front. But it wasn't to be and in the second half we were a bit sloppy and conceded a couple of goals. But to be fair it's not an easy trip, it's a long way to go and Yeovil have picked up their form in recent weeks. In the end it was probably a fair result. We had to show our battling qualities to get back in the game right at the end. It wasn't a perfect day but a point away from home and we can build on that.

One big positive to come out of last weekend was to see Adam Marriott back on the pitch. He has been out of action since Shrewsbury away last season. We have missed him because he's a good goalscorer. He has been working hard in the gym over the course of his injury. It's great to see him back amongst it, hopefully he can stay out there and add to our attacking threat.



Today we welcome Luton Town to The Lamex Stadium. It's a big game for our fans but every game is a big one for us at the moment given our league position. They are one of our local rivals and Fraser and myself know them very well, the management and a lot of the players. It's probably not what our fans want to hear but they are a very good football club, certainly a big club. They are also a well-supported club so that is something we will have to deal with on the day. They have sold out their allocation and every time we have played them here it has been like an away game. They will all be right up for it so we need to be ready to go. They have picked up form lately. But we are at home and if we can pick up the win it will be a good day for everyone at the club. We need to be tight at the back and keep a clean sheet and build from there. We know it will be tough but we need to show our qualities like we did in the Gillingham game; I'm sure if we do we will get the result.

As I said, it will be like an away game but our fans are great and I'm sure they will also be up for it and it will be a good day. If the fans can raise their level for the day it will be well appreciated by the players on the pitch.

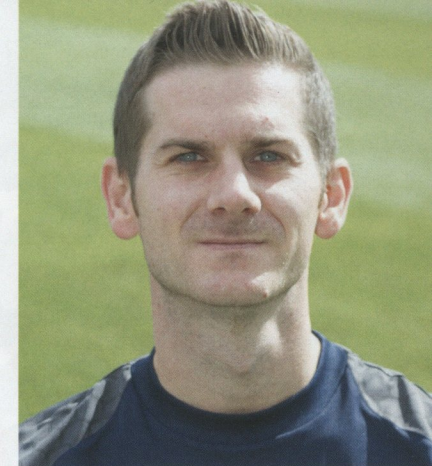

Being a local derby, this fixture is an exciting one for the fans, so let's hope we are in for an entertaining afternoon.

I'm pleased to report that the injury list is slowly improving, with several players returning to training in recent weeks.

Gormo (back) is now back in full training after nearly ten weeks out with a stress response in his lower back. His progress was steady throughout this time and his transition into high load and contact fairly smooth. We will continue to keep a close eye on him, but he will be edging towards squad selection in the coming weeks.

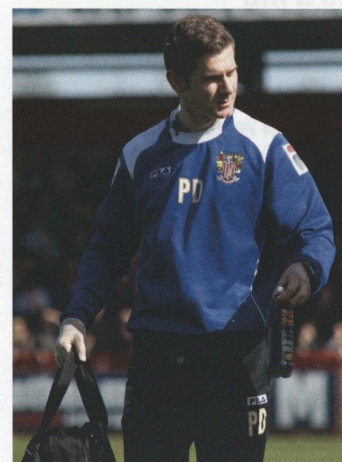
Macca (knee) is now two and a half weeks post-surgery, following a repair of his medial collateral ligament. He has started to partial weight bear with the crutches and will remain in the brace for a further three to four weeks, whilst increasing the range of movement. His follow up with the surgeon will also take place in the next two to three weeks, so I will keep you posted on his progress.

Johno (ankle) has started running again after an enforced period out of training with a torn capsule in his ankle. This has included some multidirectional tasks, all of which have caused him no aggravation. His

and anti-inflammatory medication. Although he has been able to train, we felt that a local steroid infiltration would result in an improvement in pain around the area of the impingement, and allow him to resume full training within a few days. He is unlikely to be available in time for today but is due to return to training this week.

We have lost the services of Jesse (thigh) for around four to six weeks following a torn quadricep muscle against Oxford. He underwent a scan which demonstrated a large tear and will spend the next few weeks at Fulham to continue his treatment and rehabilitation. We are hopeful

symptoms have settled down well, so the specialist is happy for him to push on, meaning we will increase his load accordingly, with a return to training anticipated within the next two weeks.

Jack (Jebb) underwent an injection into his problematic ankle on Tuesday which has been causing ongoing discomfort, despite a combination of rest, treatment

that he may return in time to play a part over the festive period and New Year.

That's it from me. I'm sure there will be a cracking atmosphere inside the ground today - let's make sure it's the Boro fans making all the noise!

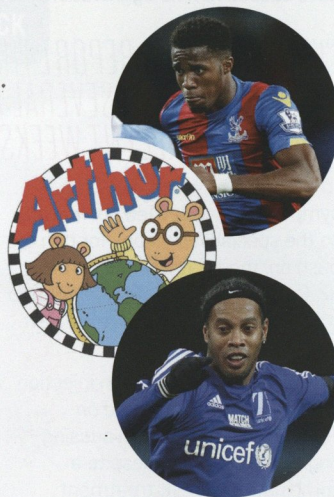

IN OUR LATEST CATCH UP WITH ACADEMY MANAGER ROBBIE O'KEEFE, WE TALK ABOUT THE UNDER-18S RECENT RUN OF FORM, THE ENCOURAGING DEVELOPMENT OF THE YOUNGER AGE GROUPS AND THE OVERALL PRODUCTIVITY OF THE ACADEMY COMPARED TO OTHER CLUBS.

We begin by looking at recent Under-18 results, with Robbie telling us, "We've had a good spell with lots of players returning from injury, which has helped.

The Youth Alliance game at Peterborough was probably the first time we've been able to put out what we'd consider to be our strongest squad for a long time. We won 5-2 and had some really good individual performances. It was good to see the goals going in at the rate they did. The lads were really structured in how they played and really good going forward.

"We followed that up with a tricky FA Youth Cup game at Aveley and won 3-0. Again it was a really structured performance and we looked good offensively, despite being down to 10 men. It was a shame really, Louis letting himself down with two really silly bookings, but in fairness we were better with 10 than 11 so from that point of view we didn't suffer too much. "Unfortunately he wasn't available for the second round game Cambridge. With the injuries that we've still got we went into that FA Youth Cup game without six scholars, which puts a lot on our Under-16 and college players, but we have confidence in them to come and do a good job. We've had them in for training quite a lot so that's the advantage of having a really good college programme.

"A fortnight ago we went to MK Dons and won 4-1, which made it 12 goals scored in three games, which we were really pleased with. People knock MK's philosophy but it's their

own philosophy and produced them players over the years. It just so happens that their philosophy really suits the way we play, so we always put in good performances against them.

"It was 4-1 at half-time and the game was dead, so we put a different set of demands on the players. We told them that because of the type of club we are, where scholars are continually getting thrown into first team action, it's really important that they're ready for the next challenge that comes their way. They haven't got to look at a massive first team squad and think 'I haven't got a chance of getting in.' They can look at the first team squad and think 'if there's a few knocks and suspensions then I've got a real chance'. So second half we told them to be organised, to be structured, to kill the game and make it a non-event and that's exactly what they did. It was the longest 45 minutes I've ever had in football but

that was very pleasing as it was a very mature performance. It went against what they're used to and what we're about, but it was important that they practice that in a real environment.

"Last weekend we lost 2-1 at home to Gillingham. We got undone by two free-kicks and apart from that I think they had one shot at goal. It was disappointing to lose but I was pleased with the defensive unit. That might sound funny considering the 2-1 defeat, but they defended well and really restricted Gillingham. The second goal was a great strike, right into the top corner from 30 yards. The first one we argued, saying it was a foul from their free-kick but sometimes those decisions don't go for you. In the first half we certainly had enough chances to win the game, which was a bit of a surprise for us considering how good we are in front of goal.

"The players know where they are as a group. They know they're a very young group, with the majority of those playing being first years and U16s. We probably step on the pitch with three or four second years so from that perspective we're not too worried. We just keep on at them about their standards and how it important it is to maintain a good level all the time and not dip with their training or match performances. In the long run they'll be much better.

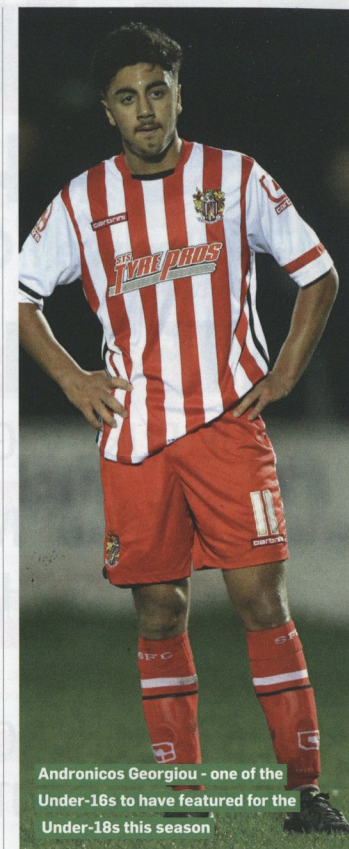
"Looking down the Academy structure, we've produced players at the top (under-18) level that haven't always been lads who have been with us since they were 14, 15 or 16. However our Under-16s now have been with us for a number of years now so are more 'us'. From the moment they step up to Under-18 we don't have to educate them, they know what we're about, so that's been a big plus.

"This year we have six or seven players that we've used and we've been really happy with them. It's important now that they use these opportunities to get their scholarships. It makes potential recruitment much easier when looking ahead to next year. In the same way that our Under-18s have to step up when they go into that first team environment to show that they warrant a professional contract, our Under-16s are stepping into that Under-18s environment and showing us that they warrant a scholarship.

"I think the one thing we can never been accused of at this football club is just giving out scholarships to our Under-16s. We haven't done many previously as we rarely felt they'd be professionals. This year is the first year we're thinking 'they've got a chance'. And as we look down the age groups we've got more because we're getting stronger all the way through.

"When we look at our neighbours, when we look at it statistically and see how many are coming through and making their first team, we're streets ahead. We've got seven academy products in the first team squad – Ryan Johnson, Dale Gorman, George Casey, Rohdell Gordon, Jack Storer, Dipo Akinyemi and Ben Kennedy – and five of them have started games in the Football League. There's no club locally that can make that claim. And that's what we should always be judged on. Not how many games you win at Under-18 level as that doesn't make you a pro. What makes you a pro is training with the first team, getting appearances in the Football League and getting a professional contract that warrant you getting a career in the game. On top of that we've had Nathan Kerr, Ben Jackson and Matt Smyth involved in first team squads too.

"At this club we're not judged on how well our Under-18s do in the Under-18 leagues. What's important is our productivity – how many people we get in to help the first team. We've had 10 whereas other clubs have one

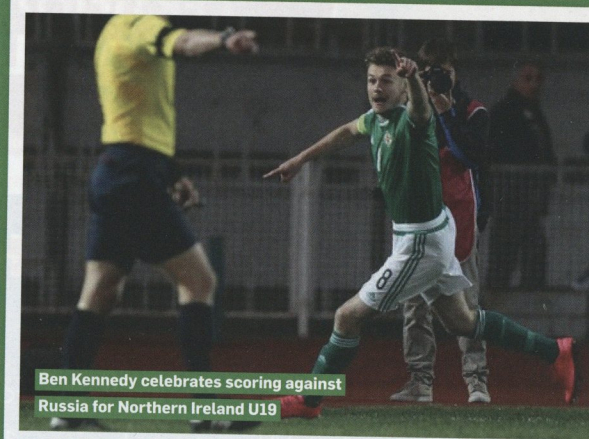
or two maximum. It's all well and good winning Under-18 leagues but if you don't produce a first team player at the end of it then neither your first team manager nor your chairman are going to be happy. We look at our productivity and we're very happy."

Robbie said, "It's great for us to see Ben captaining his country at Under-19 level. He's scoring goals and winning games, which helps us know that we're doing something right here and it inspires the youngsters too.

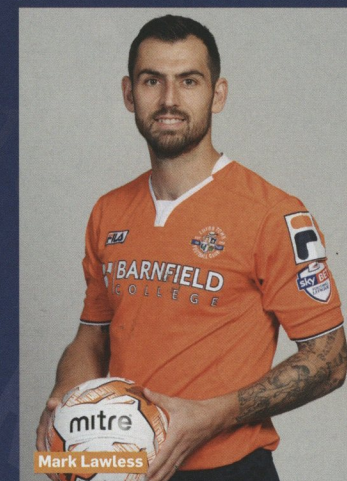
HATTERS NEWS

Luton striker Paul Benson is hoping that his injury woes are behind him now after returning from a slipped disc which saw him ruled out for almost three months. The experienced forward managed to play for 78 minutes in the 2-0 win over Barnet last weekend. "It's been tough, it's a horrible injury to have," admitted Benson. "It's one of those injuries which affects your whole day. You come to training and it hurts when you stand up. Then it hurts when you sit down. The only thing you can do is lie down. Then you go home and you've got three kids to look after. You go home and all you can do is lie down... it re-jigs your quality of life. But it's nice to get over that aspect of it now." Benson has made over 350 senior appearances since John Still plucked him from the Essex Senior League in 2005. And the 36-year-old believes years of fending off centre-halves and straining his neck down the years has taken its toll. "I can't see any other reason than overuse – the constant flicking the ball on – I do a lot of that in a game and I take a lot of hits from

defenders too," explains the striker. "I just hope I can stay on top of it until the end of the season and hopefully the end of my career." Manager John Still believes Danny Green has responded to his criticisms and thinks the winger can boost Luton's attacking options in the coming months. It was only a first home league start for the 27-year-old and his first appearance in the division in almost two months after the Hatters boss singled him out for a lack of application in training. Green made an impressive cameo off the bench in the FA Cup win over Crawley and asked about why he decided to include him from the beginning against Barnet Still said: "He's worked harder in training. He came on the other day [at Crawley] and done it and he's worked hard since. We like to play with wide people but we can only play them if they're working their socks off and impressing in training. That's where everyone shows it, five days a week. I'm sure supporters wouldn't want me to pick a player that is not trying and not working hard enough. Danny has really worked his socks off in the last couple of

**RON
DAVIES**

Noted for his aerial ability, Welsh international striker Ron Davies was capped 29 times after leaving Luton Town. Signing professional for Chester in July 1959, he was twice leading marksman, moving to Luton in October 1962. He was top scorer in 1962-63, netting 21 goals in 32 League games before joining Norwich City in September 1963. Moving to Southampton in August 1966, he topped their goalscoring charts three times before joining Portsmouth in April 1973. Later with Manchester United, Arcadia Shepherds, LA Aztecs, Tulsa Roughnecks and Seattle Sounders, he coached in the United States and died in May 2013.



**DEREK
KEVAN**

Inside-left Derek Kevan was capped 14 times by England before joining Luton Town initially with Ripon YMCA, he joined Bradford Park Avenue in October 1952 and followed Vic Buckingham to West Brom in July 1953. 'The Tank' was twice ever-present and top scorer on five occasions, moving to Chelsea in March 1963. Later with Manchester City, Crystal Palace and Peterborough, he joined Luton in December 1966 and netted four goals in 11 League games. He moved to Stockport in March 1967, then Macclesfield, Boston United and Stourbridge. Later a driver for Signs Specialists in Hockley, he died in January 2013.



**ALAN
BIRCHENALL**

Former England U-23 midfielder Alan Birchenall briefly appeared for Luton Town in 1978-79. Signing professional for Sheffield United in June 1963, he joined Chelsea for £100,000 in November 1967 and moved via Crystal Palace to Leicester City in September 1971. He featured in their 1973-74 FA Cup run, then played for Notts County, San Jose Earthquakes, Memphis Rogues and Blackburn Rovers before joining Luton in March 1979. Making ten League appearances, he moved to Hereford United in October 1979, then had a spell as Trowbridge Town's player-boss, becoming Leicester's public relations officer.



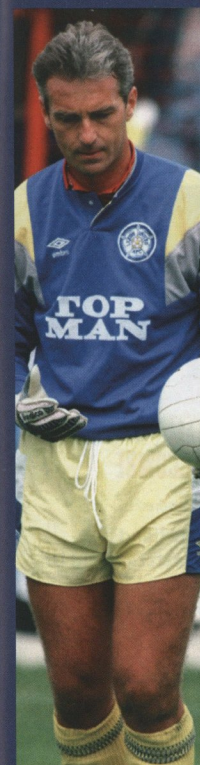
**COLIN

Ex-England international central defender Colin Todd appeared for Luton Town in 1984-85. Initially with Sunderland, he moved to Derby County in February 1971, starring as they won the League Championship in 1971-72 and 1974-75, when PFA Player of the Year. Reuniting with Jim Smith at Oxford United in February 1984, he helped clinch the Third Division title and moved to Luton in October 1984, playing two League games. 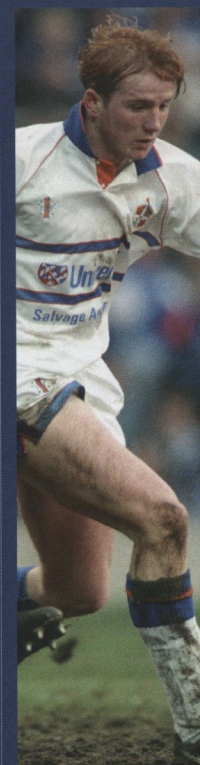
**STEVE

He was ever-present three times prior to joining Aston Villa in May 1983, then joined Leeds United in February 1985 and helped win the Second Division title in 1989-90. Loaned to Luton in March 1992, he made four League appearances. Joining Carlisle United in July 1993, he became their manager, then assisted Alan Curbishley at Charlton and West Ham, returning to Leeds as chief scout.



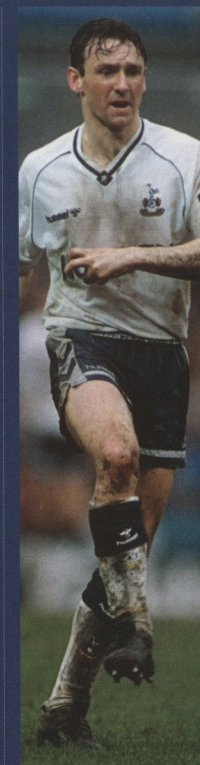
**JOHN

Welsh international striker John Hartson helped Luton Town reach the FA Cup semi-finals in 1993-94. 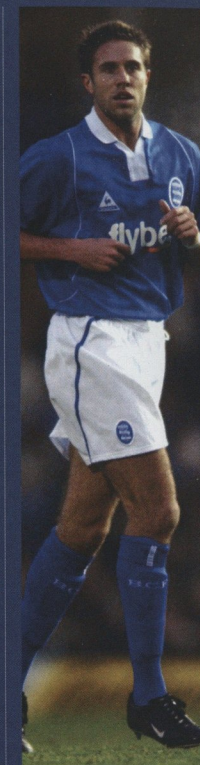
**PAUL

Joining Southampton for £500,000 in September 1993, he was loaned to Luton in December 1994 and made four League appearances. He moved to Swindon Town in October 1995. He later played for Bristol City, Millwall and Purfleet and currently works for the PFA.



**MATTHEW
UPSON**

Former Luton Town central defender Matthew Upson gained 21 England caps. Signing professional for Luton Town in April 1996, he made his only League appearance for the Hatters as a substitute in their 1-0 win over Rotherham four months later and joined Arsenal for £1,000,000 in May 1997. He featured in their 1997-98 Premier League title campaign and was a member of the 2001-02 'double' winning squad. Loaned to several clubs, he moved to Birmingham City for £2,000,000 in January 2003, then joined West Ham for £6,000,000 in January 2007. He has since played for Stoke City, Brighton, Leicester City and MK Dons.

"WHAT A GREAT DAY FOR FOOTBALL.

LLOYD BRISCOE CONTINUES HIS LOOK THROUGH THE ARCHIVES AT THE HISTORY OF STEVENAGE BOROUGH. THIS WEEK HE CONTINUES WITH THE 1981-82 SEASON.

Holbeach is a small fenland market town in the South Holland district of Lincolnshire, equidistant between Boston and Kings Lynn. On Saturday April 17th 1982, the Stevenage Borough squad boarded the bus at Broadhall Way for the 78 mile journey to Holbeach.

It was a United Counties Premier League fixture and Boro' were buoyed by the 2-1 away win they had enjoyed at Long Buckby just two days earlier. The bus duly arrived at a very windy Carters Park and was greeted by a smattering of Stevenage supporters.

After warming up, the two teams kicked off at the appointed time and within 100 seconds, Boro' were 1-0 down thanks to an own goal by Andy Hughes. Within six minutes, Stevenage should have been 3-0 down, with a Holbeach shot hitting the post and another being cleared off the line by young Graham Cox.

Stevenage rallied, but gifted Holbeach with a second goal after Boro' full-back Derek Remington attempted a back-pass to his keeper, which was intercepted and duly converted.

Stevenage returned home with their tails between their legs, trying to forget an unremarkable performance on that chilly, blustery Saturday.

The team didn't have much time to lick their wounds when just three days later they were back

in action. The venue this time was Chelmsford and the competition was the Eastern Professional Floodlit League Cup. This was the 2nd leg of the semi-final.

Having lost the 1st leg 2-0 at home, Boro' were up for the fight. Sadly, the aspiration didn't achieve fruition as Stevenage went down 3-0 on the night, 5-0 on aggregate.

Fortunes didn't improve any when third-placed Rushden came to visit on April 24th.

A 2-0 defeat saw keeper Martyn Thompson stretchered off with an injured shoulder as Boro' completed all of their home League games for the 1981/82 campaign.

This was the club's fifth consecutive defeat. Despite that, club chairman George Clarke had announced before the game that the executive had unanimously agreed to re-appoint both Derek Montgomery and Paul Peterson as the management team for the following season. George went on: "We have taken the step of announcing these reappointments now, to finally end all the rumour and speculation surrounding Derek and Paul's future with the club. The club's executive unanimously favoured them finishing the policies they have started."

The decision to retain the management duo came after Derek Montgomery had informed two key players of his decision to drop them

from the first team squad. Tim Jolly and Ronnie Lawson had both been told that they no longer figured in Montgomery's plans for the following season and that they had been relegated to the reserve team.

The club now faced four more games before the end of the season. All of them in the League. All of them away from home.

A 2-2 draw with Desborough Town on April 27th followed by a 0-0 draw at Ampthill on the Saturday after at least stopped the decay. Unbeknown to Boro' they were about to end the season on a high.

It started at St Neots on May 8th. The team on this day consisted of: Martyn Thompson, Ward, Derek Montgomery, Mitch Dee, Paul Johnson, Andy Hughes, Graham Cox, Terry Broom, Ashley Palmer, John Huxtable and Lee Jacobs. A brace from Ashley Palmer and a fine lob from Andy Hughes saw Stevenage win comfortably by 3-1, making amends for the 4-3 defeat at home by the Saints just a month earlier.

Stevenage Borough completed their United Counties Premier League season on a high note on May 11th. After this afternoon's fixture Boro hit the road again for another trip to the West Country, this time to face Bristol Rovers

WHAT IS THE MEMORIAL STADIUM LIKE?

The club moved to the stadium in 1996 and two years later bought the ground from the then owners Bristol Rugby Club. Although the Memorial Stadium has seen some changes since the Football Club took up residence, it still has the feel of a rugby ground about it.

On one side is the West Stand, which with its pavilion looks more like a cricket stand. It has a row of hospitality boxes across the top, with a few rows of seats in front. Below is an area of terrace. Just under this stand's roof is a television gantry and a small electric scoreboard. The stand runs for about half the length of the pitch and straddles the half way line. On one side of it, towards the Blackthorn end is a small covered terrace, used as a family area, whilst the other side has a small covered area of temporary seating, called the South West Stand. Opposite is the Uplands Stand, taller than the West Stand, but similar in length. This stand has covered seating to its rear and terracing at the front. It has open terracing to either side, one of which is given to away supporters. The team dug outs are located in front of this stand, although the dressing rooms are located behind the West Stand. This leads to quite a procession of players and officials at half time and full time.

At one end is the unusual looking South Stand. This was originally erected as a temporary stand, to fill the previously empty end. It has now been opened for a number of seasons now, although it still looks,

with its green seats and bright white roof, more suitable for an outdoor show jumping competition than a football ground. The stand only runs for just over half the width of the pitch, has several supporting pillars running across the front and has been nicknamed 'the tent' by Rovers fans. Opposite is the Blackthorn End, which is a covered terrace for home supporters.

WHAT CAN BORO FANS EXPECT?

Away supporters are mostly housed in an open terrace on one side of the East (Dribuild) Stand. This area is open to the elements so you might get wet if it rains. The open terrace makes it difficult for away fans to really generate some noise. Up to 1,100 away supporters can be accommodated in this area. If the weather is poor then it may be a better bet to head for one of the seats that are made available to away fans in the South Stand at one end of the ground. I must recommend the huge Cornish pasties (£3) that are sold at the ground, huge and tasty, plus they even do vegetarian ones which makes a change. Also on offer are a range of pies including the Chicken Balti Pie. I did not experience any problems on my visits, however I noted that the Rovers fans seemed to tolerate away fans rather than being over friendly. They can still do a good rendition of their club anthem 'Goodnight Irene', when the occasion stirs.

WHERE TO EAT AND DRINK?

There is a bar behind the clubhouse terrace at the ground that allows in away supporters.

Pete Stump recommends: "The Queen Vic pub on the Gloucester

Road, which is around a five minute walk from the ground, usually has a comfortable mix of home and away fans, although it does get busy."

Rhys Gwynllyw a visiting Wrexham supporter recommends the Annexe Inn on Seymour Road. Located half mile away from the stadium, the pub is listed in the CAMRA Good Beer Guide. It is close to the County Cricket Ground, going further along the A38 towards Bristol. After passing an Indian Restaurant call Guru, turn left into Nevil Road and then right at the Sportsman Pub into Seymour Road. You then pass the Wellington pub on your right and continuing along the A38 Gloucester Road, turn left into Filton Avenue. The entrance to the Club car park is the second right down this road. There is a fair amount of street parking around the sides and back of the Wellington pub.

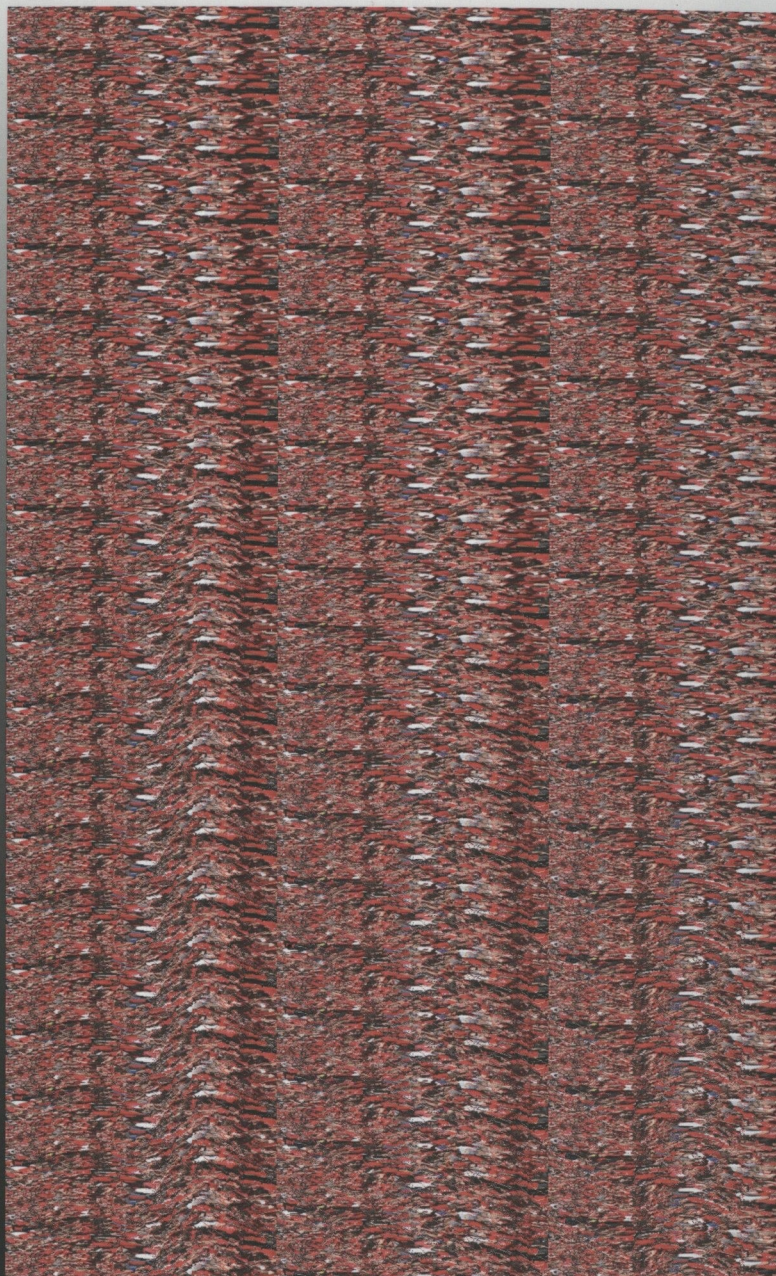
