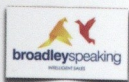

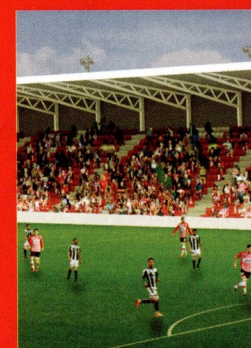

GOOD AFTERNOON AND WELCOME TO ST JAMES PARK FOR TODAY'S GAME AGAINST LUTON TOWN. I THINK IT'S SAFE TO SAY THAT A LOT HAS HAPPENED SINCE OUR LAST HOME GAME AND THERE IS UNDERSTANDABLY A LOT OF EXCITEMENT AROUND THE CITY RIGHT NOW AFTER WE WERE PAIRED WITH LIVERPOOL IN THE FA CUP DRAW.

However, we have a lot of games before then, starting with today's visit of Luton, and we welcome them, the directors, supporters and the coaching staff to Devon and wish them a safe journey home. We have to make sure we keep our eye on the ball because our league form has been good of late, and we can't be distracted by what lies ahead.

The weather is certainly causing us a few issues at the moment, none more so than last weekend when we endured a fruitless trip to Morecambe. Unfortunately, it was one of those situations where the pitch was playable at 9am, but a downpour at lunchtime left it unplayable by 1pm and the referee has no alternative but to call the game off.

Closer to home, we have invested heavily in our pitches at both St James Park and at the Cliff Hill Training Ground, and while they are being severely tested with this spell of wet weather, they are generally holding up well and are a vast improvement on what we had before, certainly in the case of our main pitch at St James Park, which has held up really well. The problems haven't gone away, but it is an improvement, although the pitches are now being stretched to the max and have a long way to go to get through this winter.

It goes to show the benefit of investing in our infrastructure, which is why I think it is so important that, when we get a mouth-watering FA Cup tie like Liverpool at home, we really have to make the most of it.

Not only is it a fantastic opportunity for the players to play in a game of this magnitude, but there are financial opportunities for the club, which is invaluable for clubs like Exeter City, who rely on these type of windfalls.

It is going to be a lot of work all round and I know the scramble for tickets has already started. I just hope we can display the club in a very positive light on that Friday.

The issue on ticket prices is always going to upset some, but it should be remembered that Exeter City is unique in that we don't have a major benefactor investing vast sums of money, so we have to raise money in other ways if we want the club to thrive, prosper and keep moving forward.

An extra few quid on the ticket prices ultimately can get us a new player, some extra goalposts or even a new minibus. We get such little opportunity to create some kind of cash injection and this opportunity is very big for the club and we need to take it.

This is also a meaningful game; it is not a pre-season fixture. This is the Third Round of the Emirates FA Cup and a big, big game for the football club, where the eyes of the world are upon us.

With this being our last game before the festive period, I wish everyone a Happy Christmas and look forward to seeing you back at the Park for the Dagenham game.

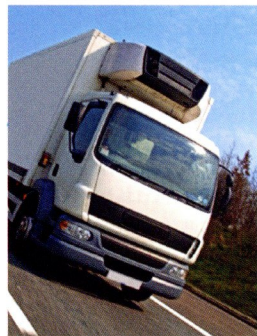

EXETER CITY have been drawn at home against Liverpool in the Third Round of the Emirates FA Cup.

The Grecians have made it to this stage of the competition for the first time in a decade, and now the reward is a visit from Jürgen Klopp's Reds, a tie which looks to be the pick of the round.

Tickets immediately became the most-sought-after item in town as soon as the draw was made, and it looks likely that a full house will be in attendance to watch City go for an upset win.

The BBC will screen the match live from St James Park on Friday 8th January, with a kick-off time of 7:55pm.

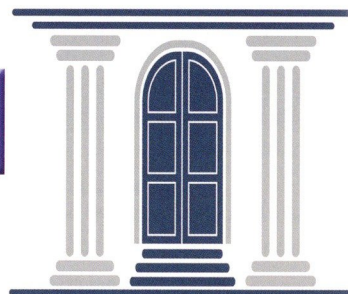

JORDAN TILLSON AND OLLIE WATKINS helped Exeter City into the Third Round of the FA Cup.

City took the ascendancy during the opening stages, and made their dominance pay in the nineteenth minute. Lee Holmes' corner from the right-hand side found its way to stand-in midfielder Jordan Tillson, who proceeded to stab the ball past Alnwick from close-range.

Joel Grant spun across the face of goal from Alex Nicholls' pass shortly after the break, though the Grecians could have - and perhaps should have - secured victory long before Watkins' arrival. But it was to be the City youngster that would have the final say, as he displayed composure beyond his years to roll the ball beyond the on-rushing Alnwick.

A two-nil win for the Grecians saw them bridge a gap of twenty-four league places between the two sides, setting up a lucrative home tie with Liverpool in the next round.

Paul Tisdale: "It was a fabulous performance and a great result. We had lots of challenges coming into the game with the, and the line-up was bit of a Rubik's cube, but whoever I selected had to

play their game. It is a really good result for us; it was the complete performance in many ways."

Rob Page: "Credit to Exeter in the first half, they were excellent and thoroughly deserved it, but we were as bad as they were good.

I will take a defeat, but not that kind of defeat, not one when you question their attitude and effort. That is far away from what I stand for and I'm not going to accept it."

Ollie Watkins: "The team did all the hard work, and I really got it put on a plate for me to finish it off. We're a great team, and we're League 1 standard, so with the greatest respects to Port Vale, I didn't think there was much difference at all between us.

"I was hoping that I did get at least one chance after coming on, - otherwise it was about doing the defensive work and trying to see out the game. That proved when we went up the other end, and there was a lovely ball through to me and I thought I finished it nicely. You can't complain with that!"

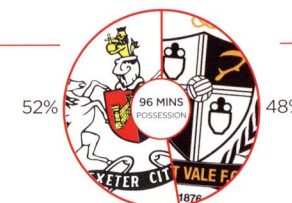

EXETER CITY AT CHRISTMAS

WITH CHRISTMAS DAY fast-approaching, Henry Justice provides a quick history of Exeter City connections with the Yuletide season.

The first professional match to take place at St James Park on Christmas Day was back in 1908, when Millwall were the visitors. For the many Devonians who went to bed that Christmas Eve dreaming of waking up to maximum points, they were to have the perfect red and white Christmas. James 'Daisy' Bell and Andy McGuigan played the part of Santa Claus that afternoon as they netted one each to leave City fans feeling spoilt rotten.

Christmas Day football was part and parcel of the business back then, but unfortunately for the Grecians this often meant an away trip. A remarkable twenty-three of twenty-nine Exeter games on Christmas Day since 1900 were played away from St James Park, with the points only returning home on four of those occasions. The 25th December 1946 saw Exeter travelling again, this time to the Goldstone Ground and Brighton & Hove Albion.

The formbook suggested City would have trouble with only one win in their last seven prior to kick off, and with their

traditionally poor Christmas form on the road, few would have predicted what would follow. Bill Owen went on to score a hat-trick as City gave the Seagulls a Christmas Day stuffing; 6-1, the hosts' heaviest defeat of their league campaign.

The remaining six fixtures Exeter partook in on Christmas Day were played at home, and City can boast an impressive record of having lost none of them, with five wins in the period. The picks of those were a pair of 4-0 wins in 1925 and 1951 when the Grecians beat old enemies Plymouth and Torquay respectively.

With the visit of Luton the final game before this latest festive period, City will be hoping to roll back the years to December 18th 2010 when they beat Sheffield Wednesday 5-1, courtesy of goals from Jamie Cureton, John O'Flynn, Liam Sercombe and Scott Golbourne. This was the last time City won their final game before Christmas Day; let's hope the boys can break that particular Christmas turkey when they take on the Hatters this weekend.

If not, of course there's always the visit of Liverpool to look forward to in what promises to be the perfect New Year's pickup.

DAVID WHEELER'S last-gasp winner rounded off a magnificent second-half performance from for the Grecians as they overcame a two-goal deficit last season at Kenilworth Road.

Luton opened the scoring, as after Lee Holmes was dispossessed, the Hatters broke forward quickly. Mark Cullen picked out Luke Guttridge, whose deflected strike found the corner of James Hamon's goal.

Cullen turned from provider to goal-scorer as he doubled the Hatters' lead just before half-time. The ex-Hull City striker controlled a long-ball played to him through the middle of the park, before he struck a firm shot past Hamon.

Despite trailing by two, the Grecians refused to let their heads go down. Within barely five minutes of play having been resumed, the Hatters' lead was halved, as Matt Oakley dinked the ball into the path of Ryan Harley, who proceeded to volley past Elliot Justham.

City were on level terms with fifteen minutes of normal time to go. A free-kick eventually found its way to

substitute Clinton Morrison, who laid the ball into the path of Jordan Moore-Taylor to steer into corner.

Just as it looked like the Grecians would leave Kenilworth Road with an equal share of the spoils, City sealed the most dramatic of late turnarounds. With seconds remaining, Christian Ribeiro's header rebounded off the post to Wheeler, who poked the ball past Justham for the dramatic conclusion.

WHAT HAPPENED NEXT

The result at Kenilworth Road left both sides on fifty-eight points, just three points off City's rivals Plymouth Argyle, who occupied the final play-off position in seventh.

City followed up their success at Luton with a victory at home to Newport County, but picked up only three points from their final five games as they finished the season in tenth. Luton gained four more points than the Grecians during the end of season run-in, but it wasn't to be for the Hatters either, as they finished eighth, just three points off the top seven.

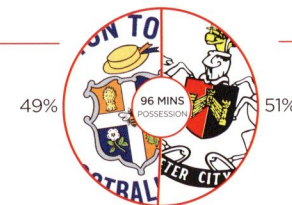

With everyone's lists now sent off to Father Christmas, it's time to enjoy the run-in to the big day as we wait to see what will be under the tree.

As far as Exeter City are concerned, top of our list is the go-ahead for the proposed development of St James Park.

There has understandably been much excitement over the plans for upgraded facilities at St James Park and what it could mean for the Football club. Now that the planning applications have been submitted to Exeter City Council, we took a few moments to discuss the plans with club chairman JULIAN TAGG.

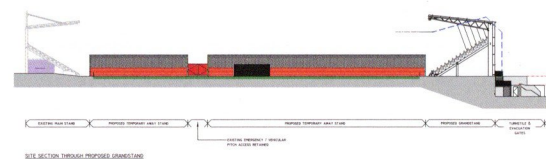
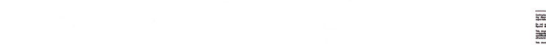
THE GRECIAN: "This development sounds very exciting indeed. What's the feeling at the club about how things are going?"

JULIAN: "The feeling at the club is very positive, and we're tremendously excited about what this could mean. Hopefully the Grecian community has had a chance to view the plans, either at our public events or online. Just a quick glance shows how much they could benefit the club.

"For example, we hope that these plans will inject a much-needed lease of life into a dilapidated part of St James Park. The project will also bring invaluable improvements to the experience of spectators and players. Most importantly, the development will allow Exeter City to maintain its good financial health, helping it to grow and progress as a community-owned club with huge potential."

THE GRECIAN: "Could you remind us of the basic elements of the proposals?"

JULIAN: "The plans for the St James Park Development will include the demolition and rebuilding of the ageing Stagecoach Stand. This will dramatically improve the club's dated spectator facilities and bring them up to modern standards,



which is the first and foremost aim of this project.

"These new plans would also see the relocation of the player and referee changing facilities to beneath the main stand. As part of this move, the facilities will also be upgraded to modern standard, so that the players and referees experience is enhanced along with those of the fans.

"The transfer of these facilities from beneath the old Stagecoach Stand also opens up all of the concourse space beneath the new grandstand for a number of uses. As you will be able to see from the plans, this includes a variety of spectator facilities, toilets including disabled facilities, concessions, a bar and food facilities, all of which can be used for commercial hire outside of game days.

"Significant improvements to other parts of the

ground include the replacement and enhancement of the toilet facilities for the Big Bank. We are also looking at the possibility of improving the away end, if funds permit."

THE GRECIAN: "Why is there no certainty about delivering the stand at the away end?"

JULIAN: "This simply boils down to the question over how much money will be available after the various elements of the plans I've described have come to fruition. We can't promise people that we will build the stand if we are not certain we have the money available. That doesn't mean we aren't desperate to do it; it means we being realistic and truthful. What we have been able to promise is that we will sort out the boundary wall and generally tidy up the appearance of the away end so as a minimum it will at least look better than it does now.

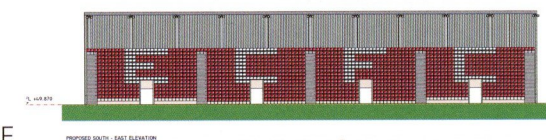
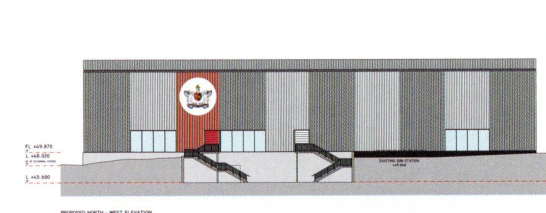
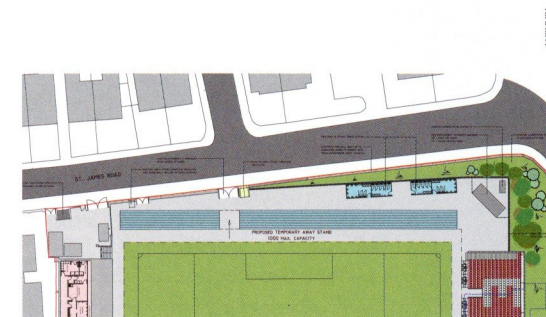
"I hope people will understand that we are doing our best here and that if we succeed then the club will be taking a massive step forward. We understand that people would like more - so would we! But, what we really need now is for everyone connected with the club to stand with us and get behind the plans."

THE GRECIAN: "What are the timeframes we are looking at for the development?"

JULIAN: "We submitted two planning applications in November 2015 to cover the whole development site. The Council is currently undergoing its own consultation in order to gather the views of local residents and various statutory bodies. We're expecting a planning decision from Exeter City Council in the spring of 2016.

"All things being well, work will begin on site in the summer or autumn of 2016. We're hoping that the stadium works will be completed by the winter of 2016/2017."

INTRODUCING LUTON TOWN

This afternoon sees St James Park play host to Luton Town, with the Hatters having a point to prove after a tough run of recent results. Four defeats from four has seen their progress in the league stall, and they now sit in seventeenth, six places and four points behind the Grecians.

Luton's fortunes in recent years have been mixed. They achieved their highest-ever league position a little less than thirty years ago, finishing seventh in the old First Division in the 87/88 season, and were champions of the newly-rebranded League One in its inaugural season in 2004/05. Following serious financial troubles, they endured three quick-fire relegations and a five-year exile from the Football League. This only ended with their title win in 2014, after three unsuccessful play-off campaigns.

Luton parted company with the man who led them to the title this week. John Still's playing days were sadly curtailed by injury, but he forged a long and successful managerial career in the lower echelons of the Football League pyramid. He was the second-most-senior manager in the top four tiers of English football, behind only Arsenal's Arsène Wenger.

He was one of the most highly-regarded coaches in the Football League, renowned for his ability to scout and nurture talented young players from non-League football. One such player was Andre Grey, who notched thirty goals

for the Hatters in their Conference title-winning season, and who is now leading the Championship scoring charts for Burnley.

Last season was Luton's first back in League 2, and they secured a credible eighth-place finish, going all the way to the final day with a chance to make the playoffs. Their form hasn't been as consistent this term, but they are safely in mid-table points-wise, and have shown that they possess the quality to pose a real threat to any team in the division.

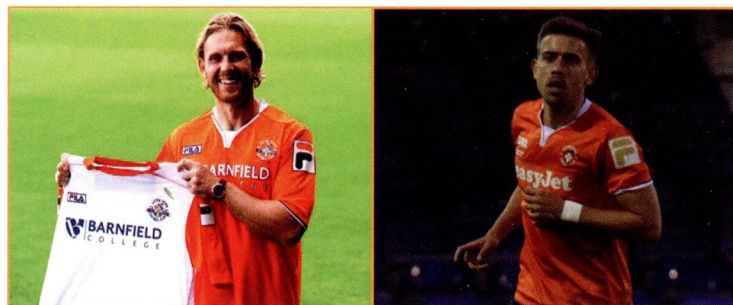
Outside of the League, the Hatters enjoyed a brief but thrilling run in the Capital One Cup. A 3-1 win in the First Round against Championship side Bristol City was rewarded with a home tie against Stoke City. The Potters were taken to extra-time at Kenilworth Road after a ninety-first-minute equaliser from Cameron McGeehan cancelled out Jonathan Walters' opener. There were no further goals in added time, and after a penalty taking masterclass defender Scott Griffiths smashed his spot-kick against the bar, allowing Geoff Cameron to convert his effort and hand the Premier League side an 8-7 shootout victory.

The Grecians are unbeaten in their last three matches against today's opposition. When the two sides last met, at Kenilworth Road in April, the Hatters took a 2-0 lead before half-time, but a resurgent Exeter side staged a magnificent fightback to win 3-2, with David Wheeler's scrambled injury-time strike securing the win.

MANAGER VACANT

Luton parted company with John Still this week. Still was the man who brought Luton back into the Football League, but unfortunately four successive defeats have led to his departure from the club.

1 GOALKEEPER MARK TYLER

Starting his career with Peterborough, experienced keeper Tyler amassed over four hundred appearances for the club, keeping a clean sheet in their play-off victory to the second tier back in 2000. The 38-year-old signed for Luton in 2009, and was named in the 2011-12 Conference team of the year.

16 GOALKEEPER ELLIOT JUSTHAM

Having come through the ranks at Kenilworth Road, goalkeeper Justham has shown serious promise in challenging for the number one shirt. Injuries to Mark Tyler last season saw the 25-year-old keep five clean sheets in fifteen appearances, and he was rewarded with a two-year contract extension in April 2015.

2 DEFENDER STEPHEN O'DONNELL

Defender O'Donnell won the Scottish Youth Cup for Celtic before moving to Partick Thistle in 2011. An engine-room-type player with an eye for goal, the right-back played a pivotal role for the club in gaining promotion to the Scottish Premiership. The 23-year-old signed for the Hatters in June 2015.



12 DEFENDER SCOTT GRIFFITHS

A fans' favourite for the Hatters, defender Griffiths has made over a hundred appearances for the club. The 30-year-old made his name at Dagenham & Redbridge under John Still, who brought him to Luton in 2013. A regular this season, Griffiths has been a part of five clean sheets thus far.

18 DEFENDER MAGNUS OKUONGHAE

Imposing defender Okuonghae was another to play under Still with the Daggers. The Nigerian centre-half spent two years at Victoria Road before becoming a crowd favourite during his two-hundred-game spell for Colchester United. Luton acquired the 29-year old this past summer, and he is currently enjoying a decent run in the team.

20 DEFENDER SEAN LONG

20-year-old full-back Long has recently seen his one-month loan deal at Luton extended, having impressed since his arrival from Reading in October. The Republic of Ireland Under-21 international made his debut in a 2-1 defeat against Crawley, setting up his team's only goal.

30 DEFENDER LUKE WILKINSON

Defender Wilkinson played under Still during the Daggers' spell in League 1. His exceptional leadership qualities and threat at set-pieces led to his current manager signing him in July 2014. The 25-year-old has been an ever-present thus far this season, scoring three goals for the Hatters in the current campaign.

37 DEFENDER FRANKIE MUSONDA

Defender Musonda has been identified as another potential leader at the back. The 17-year-old has been a regular fixture for the youth team, signing professional terms with the club in November 2015. Yet to appear for the first-team, the centre-half is ready to make a name for himself.

4 MIDFIELDER JONATHAN SMITH

Since his arrival from York City in 2011, midfielder Smith has won many plaudits through his exhaustive work rate and forward-like finishing ability. Despite breaking his leg in 2013, Smith has appeared over a hundred times for the club, with four of his nine goals coming this season.

7 MIDFIELDER ALEX LAWLESS

Another experienced player at the Hatters, Welsh midfielder Lawless was a trainee with Fulham before having an extended spell with Forest Green. Since arriving at Luton in 2011, the 30-year-old has refined his game, but his only goal this season came in a 2-0 victory at Dagenham.

8 MIDFIELDER CAMERON MCGEEHAN

Having previously enjoyed two loan spells with Norwich, midfielder McGeehan put pen to paper permanently for the Hatters this past June. The Northern Irishman learnt his trade at Chelsea, and he has immediately excelled in Still's midfield, showing some real flair in the middle and netting an impressive eight times this season.

10 MIDFIELDER RYAN HALL

Injury has hindered Hall's progress so far, but the midfielder is showing signs of his potential this season. The 27-year-old has proven pedigree in League 2, scoring nineteen goals in two seasons for Southend. With nine appearances this campaign, Hall will be hoping to start again against the Grecians.

11 MIDFIELDER DANNY GREEN

Right-sided midfielder Green linked up again with Still in July. With twenty-seven goals in ninety-one starts for Dagenham, his goalscoring prowess already looks to be invaluable for the Hatters, hitting the back of the net five times so far this season. His last goal came in their 4-3 defeat to Northampton last weekend.

19 MIDFIELDER OLLY LEE

A graduate of West Ham's academy, midfielder Lee is on loan at the Town from Birmingham City. The 24-year-old can dictate the pace of a game, as he exhibited last season during his loan spell with Plymouth, and has picked crucial passes throughout his twenty appearances for Still's men this season.

9 STRIKER PAUL BENSON

Veteran centre-forward Benson spearheaded Still's promotion campaigns with the Daggers. Clinical in front of goal, he was also pivotal in Swindon's League 2-winning campaign in 2012. The 36-year-old signed for Luton in 2014, with two of his four goals this season coming in their defeat to Northampton last weekend.

14 STRIKER JACK MARRIOTT

After spending six years at Ipswich, striker Marriott was recruited by Still in May 2015. The 21-year-old only made two appearances at Portman Road, but scored goals during several loan spells with Woking Town. Enjoying his breakthrough season, he has eight goals already this campaign.

22 STRIKER CRAIG MACKAIL-SMITH

A proven finisher across the Football League, striker Mackail-Smith signed for the Hatters in the summer. The Scottish international is another who played under Still at Dagenham, but he is best-known for hundred-goal spells at both Peterborough and Brighton, joining the latter from the former for over £3 million in 2011.

23 STRIKER JOSH MCQUOID

Having scored goals wherever he's been, striker McQuoid has continued this habit with Luton Town. The Northern Irish international started his career with Bournemouth, scoring eighteen times for the Cherries. Several loan spells ensued, with Burnley and Coventry two of his destinations, before he joined the Hatters in June.

Plymouth Argyle

Pilgrims boss Derek Adams took the uncommon step of blaming algae for his side's recent 2-1 defeat at home to Cambridge. In his post-match interview, the Scot said that the algae on the pitch made it difficult for his side to play, and led to a slip by a defender that gave Cambridge their winning goal.

Concerned Chief Executive Martyn Starnes told the BBC: "We've got to get some equipment on there to try to break the algae up, and then put some winter seed in to try to take over the growth of the grass. It'll be ready for the next game - whether we'll see a tangible improvement by then is doubtful as it takes some time, but the pitch will be playable by the time Yeovil come on Boxing Day."



AFC Wimbledon

The Dons have been approved permission by the local Council to go ahead with plans to build their new stadium in the spiritual home of the original Wimbledon FC at Plough Lane. The new stadium will be an 11,000 all-seater venue, with the option of increasing capacity to 20,000 should the club continue to show signs of success. If everything goes to plan, the team could be playing in their new ground from the start of the 2017/18 season.

Chief Executive Erik Samuelson said: "This is an important step in a journey we started some years ago. We have a long way to go and many major hurdles to clear, but we want to build a stadium that is embedded in the community and operate it in an inclusive way."



Morecambe

Manager Jim Bentley has got no complaints after the game against the Grecians last weekend was called off because of bad weather. The rain has affected large parts of the country, with Carlisle in particular being forced to abandon their stadium and play at Preston, Blackburn and Blackpool whilst their pitch dries out. Referee Andy Haines originally said that Morecambe's pitch was playable, but changed his mind after continuous rain left large puddles of water around the ground. Bentley, though, has no complaints, as long as the players are safe.

Bentley said: "It's a shame, because we obviously really wanted to play but the referee had no choice. He was here early and the pitch was playable this morning, but the rain just didn't stop. You have to think about the safety of the players. We are obviously disappointed because we were looking forward to our first Saturday home game for quite a while, but it wasn't to be, and we have no complaints."

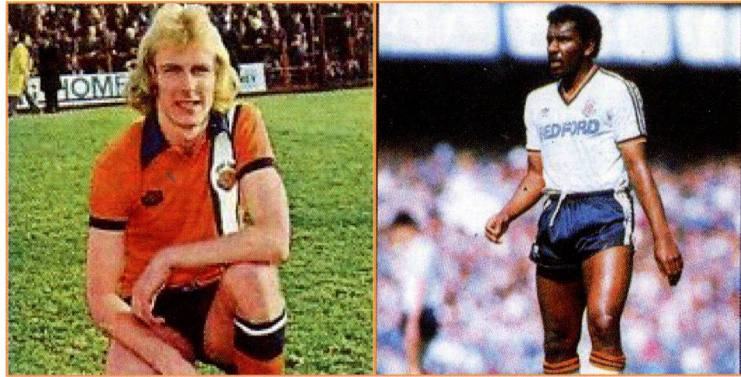


Crawley Town

Goalkeeper Darryl Flahavan has defended smaller keepers as he continues to impress for Crawley at the age of 37. Flahavan believes that he would have gotten a chance in the top flight had he been taller, but was rejected because of his height. The keeper, who is 5ft-11, started his career at Southampton, and believes that there is a glass ceiling for anyone who is below 6ft-3.

He said: "I think that's a stigma that people in England have where they feel goalkeepers need to be 6ft-8. I've heard that for twenty-odd years now, and I'm still here, so I must be doing something right. I think I could have had more of a chance when I was at Southampton, but they looked at me and I hadn't got to the height they wanted; that weakened my chances of playing in the Premier League."

FOOTBALL HISTORIAN LEIGH EDWARDS PROFILES TEN WINNERS OF LUTON TOWN'S 'PLAYER OF THE YEAR' AWARD

MALCOLM MACDONALD

Striker Malcolm Macdonald was capped fourteen times by England after leaving Luton Town. Initially with Tonbridge, he joined Fulham in August 1968 and moved to Luton in July 1969. He was twice top-scorer, including their 1969-70 promotion success when he was 'Player of the Year' and netted forty-nine goals in eighty-eight league games before sold to Newcastle United for £180,000 in May 1971. An FA Cup finalist in 1974 and League Cup finalist in 1976, he joined Arsenal for £333,333 in August 1976 and was an FA Cup finalist again in 1978 before injury ended his career. He managed Fulham and Huddersfield and now works in the media.

CHRIS NICHOLL

Northern Ireland international central defender Chris Nicholl was Luton Town's 'Player of the Year' in 1970-71. A former Burnley apprentice, he moved via Witton to Halifax Town in June 1968 and starred in their 1968-69 promotion success. He joined Luton in August 1969 and was a promotion winner in 1969-70, netting six goals in ninety-seven league games before joining Aston Villa in March 1972. Helping win promotion in 1974-75, as well as featuring in two League Cup final triumphs, he joined Southampton in June 1977 and was a promotion winner again in 1977-78, then played for Grimsby before managing Saints and Walsall.

PAUL FUTCHER

Former England Under-21 central defender Paul Futchter was Luton Town's 'Player of the Year' in 1976-77 and 1977-78. He turned professional with his twin brother Ron at hometown Chester in January 1974, moving to Luton in a joint £100,000 deal in June 1974 and scoring once in 131 league outings. Sold to Manchester City for £350,000 in June 1978, he then had spells playing for Oldham Athletic and Derby County prior to joining Barnsley in March 1984. He starred as they reached the FA Cup Sixth Round in 1984-85, moving to Halifax Town in July 1990. Later with Grimsby Town, he managed Darlington, Gresley and Southport.

KIRK STEPHENS

Attacking right-back Kirk Stephens was ever-present in Luton Town's 1981-82 Second Division title triumph. Initially with Nuneaton Borough, he helped them finish Southern League runners-up in 1974-75 and followed David Pleat to Kenilworth Road in June 1978. He was voted Luton's 'Player of the Year' in 1978-79 and 1983-84, scoring twice in 227 league games for the Hatters before moving to Coventry City in exchange for Ashley Grimes in August 1984. Later rejoining Nuneaton as player-manager after a knee injury ended his top-flight career, he also had a spell at Barnet and has since run the family building firm.



RICKY HILL

England international midfielder Ricky Hill was 'Player of the Year' when Luton Town won the Second Division title in 1981-82. Signing professional at Kenilworth Road in May 1976, he was also 'Player of the Year' in 1980-81 and starred as Luton were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85. He also featured in two consecutive League Cup finals including the Hatters' 1988 Wembley triumph and netted fifty-four goals in 436 league games before moving to Le Havre in July 1989. Reuniting with David Pleat at Leicester City in August 1990 and later as a coach at Sheffield Wednesday and Spurs, he briefly rejoined Luton as manager.

PAUL WALSH

England international striker Paul Walsh was capped five times while at Luton Town. Signing professional for Charlton Athletic in October 1979, he starred in their 1980-81 promotion success and moved to Luton in July 1982. He was 'Player of the Year' in 1982-83 and leading marksman in 1983-84, netting twenty-four goals in eighty First Division games for the Hatters before joining Liverpool in May 1984. Helping to win the League Championship in 1985-86, he joined Tottenham Hotspur in February 1988 and was an FA Cup winner in 1991. He later played for Portsmouth, Manchester City and Pompey again until injury curtailed his career.

MAL DONAGHY

Northern Ireland international central defender Mal Donaghy gained a club record fifty-eight caps while at Luton Town. He moved to Kenilworth Road from Larne in June 1978 and was ever-present as Luton won the Second Division title in 1981-82 and were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85. Voted 'Player of the Year' in 1985-86, he was an FA Cup semi-finalist again in 1987-88 and starred in that season's League Cup final triumph. He netted sixteen goals in 410 league games prior to joining Manchester United for £650,000 in October 1988, then returned on loan, moving to Chelsea in August 1992. He has worked for the Irish FA.



BRIAN STEIN

England international striker Brian Stein was Luton Town's 'Player of the Year' in 1987-88, scoring twice in that season's League Cup final triumph. Moving to Kenilworth Road from Edgware Town in October 1977, he was leading marksman in Luton's 1981-82 Second Division success and also starred as they were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85 and 1987-88. He joined Caen in July 1988 and moved via Annecy back to Luton in July 1991. Voted 'Player of the Year' again in 1991-92, he netted 130 goals in 427 league games overall before joining Barnet in August 1992. His younger brother Mark also played for Luton.

MICK HARFORD

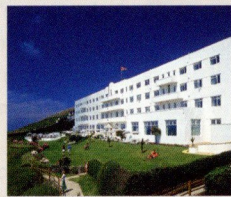
England international striker Mick Harford was Luton Town's 'Player of the Year' in 1988-89. Initially with Lincoln City, he played for Newcastle United, Bristol City and Birmingham City prior to joining Luton in December 1984. He starred as the Hatters were League Cup finalists in two consecutive seasons, including their 1988 Wembley triumph, also FA Cup semi-finalists on two occasions. Moving to Derby County in January 1990, he returned to Luton in September 1991. Joining Chelsea in August 1992, he then appeared for Sunderland, Coventry City and Wimbledon. He has since been coach and manager of Luton.

DAVID PREECE

England B international midfielder David Preece was 'Player of the Year' when Luton Town reached the FA Cup semi-finals in 1993-94. Signing professional for Walsall in July 1980, he helped them reach the League Cup semi-finals in 1983-84 and joined Luton for £150,000 in December 1984. He appeared in two consecutive League Cup finals including the Hatters' 1988 Wembley success and was also 'Player of the Year' in 1991-92, netting 21 goals in 336 League games while at Kenilworth Road prior to joining Derby County in August 1995. Later player-coach at Cambridge United and Torquay United, he died in July 2007.



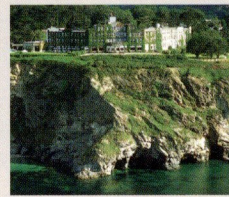

UNBEATABLE Brighton's 2-2 draw at Derby means the Seagulls have not tasted defeat in their first twenty games - a new Championship record.

The Seagulls overtook Neil Warnock's QPR, who didn't lose a game until December 10th in their title-winning campaign of 2010-11.

Of course, football did exist before the division was rebranded in 2004. And while Chris Hughton's men are clearly a doughty lot, they've got a way to go before they can be called the second tier's most invincible side.

Liverpool 28 games 1893-94

Just two years old when they kicked off against Middlesbrough Ironopolis, Liverpool destroyed all and sundry as they finished the season unbeaten in twenty-eight matches.

In an era when the default formation was six up front and it was practically impossible to stay onside, their Scottish-themed side (two McQueens, McQue, McOwen, McLean, McCartney, McVean and McBride) won all but six of them.

Oddly, though, it still wasn't enough for promotion. In those days, the bottom three sides in the First Division played the top three in the second in a set of promotion 'Test matches'.

Liverpool were drawn away at Man United, where a 2-0 victory took their tally to twenty-nine, clinching a place in the top flight and sparking a rivalry that endures to this day.



Reading 33 games 2006-07

Arguably the greatest side the second tier has ever seen, Steve Coppell's Royals actually began the season with a dismal defeat at home to Plymouth.

It would be six months before they lost again, by which time they had overtaken Liverpool's benchmark and all but sewn up the easiest of titles.

Inspired by the goals of Dave Kitson and unknown £78,000-signing Kevin Doyle, the Royals were actually promoted on March 25th and, six games later, had notched a still-unbeaten Football League record of 106 points.

Chelsea 27 games 1988-89

On September 20th, 1988, Chelsea lay bottom of the Second Division. Six games had yielded no wins and just three points. Manager Bobby Campbell - who'd hung his hat on summer signings Graham Roberts and Peter Nicholas - was feeling the heat.

Then, out of the blue, everything clicked. For the next seven months, the Blues were unstoppable, their only other defeat - a 2-0 reverse at Filbert Street in April - punctuating a title-winning run of thirteen straight victories.

Chelsea finished seventeen points clear, Kerry Dixon won the golden boot with twenty-eight goals and, but for that sole defeat, the Blues

would have set that mark of thirty-three games two decades earlier.

West Ham 21 games 1990-91

Next up for Chris Hughton's boys is the record of Billy Bonds' Hammers - and it's one the Brighton boss should remember well.

Hughton played thirty-two times as West Ham finished runners-up to Oldham and, alongside fellow veterans Alvin Martin and Tony Gale, formed part of the division's meanest back four.

They conceded just thirty-four goals as Bonds guided the Hammers back into the first division, though it would prove a short-lived stay as they plummeted straight back down again.

Toby Down and Jamie Harkness grabbed the goals that sealed an impressive victory against a very good United side.

The Grecians took the momentum they gained from their midweek FA Youth Cup win over Bolton Wanderers – 4-3, with all the goals coming in the second half - into the start of the match at Oxfordshire as Lee Skyrme's men started well.

In attack they were looking to kill the game off with a third, with substitute Ben Seymour perhaps having the best opening. The forward found himself 1-on-1 with the goalkeeper, but he was unable to take the chance.

But the missed opportunities didn't matter, because the full-time whistle sounded, with the Grecians recording an excellent victory from a tough away trip.

FA CUP CITY MEMORIES: 1959/60

BACK in September I was privileged to share my memories of my first visit to St James Park to support Exeter City, when they played Leyton Orient in November 1954.

Fast-forward five seasons to the 9th January 1960, and we reach another first for me. City had beaten Barnstaple Town 4-0, and then Brentford 3-1, to make it through to the Third Round of the FA Cup, and they were drawn to play Luton Town at home.

So what makes this a first? Well it is not the fact that City made it through to the Third Round of the Cup, as they had done that four seasons earlier when they would ultimately lose to Stoke City. It was because Luton Town were members of the old First Division, so it was my first opportunity to watch a top team who had, incidentally, been FA Cup finalists the previous season.

This was a season which started with an air of optimism around St James Park, as City had just missed out on promotion from the newly-formed Fourth Division by one point in the previous campaign. City's form had slipped a little since then, but Luton were struggling near the bottom of the First Division. So here was an opportunity - not only a chance to play a top division team, but also a real possibility of a giant killing.

I recall having to patiently queue to get tickets for my brother and myself for the Big Bank, and the air of expectation as we and the other 20,191 supporters (only 791 less than the record attendance) packed the ground on match day.

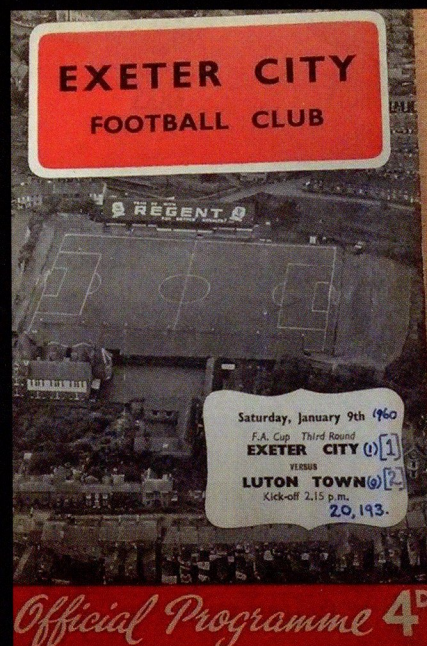
In goal for City that day was John Lobbett; the full-backs were Theo Foley and Les MacDonald, half-backs Arnold Mitchell, Ken Oliver and Jimmy Thompson, while the forwards were Nelson Stiffle, Graham Rees, Jack Wilkinson, Andy Micklewright and Gordon Dale.

The game is one, like many, that is difficult to remember in great detail, but I recall that the success City were enjoying during those few seasons stemmed mainly from the skill of one man: Gordon Dale. His skill was magical at times and he was a marvellous crosser of the ball.

With Dale playing well, City were more than holding their own against their First Division opponents, and went in at half-time 1-0 up, albeit courtesy of an own-goal by Luton's left full-back Daniel. However, during the second half Luton imposed themselves more on the game thanks in no small part to a dreadful tackle by Billy Bingham on Gordon Dale which effectively put him out of the game, and in turn took City down to ten men.

Luton went on to win the game 2-1. To the outside world it was an expected win, but I always believed the result hinged on that one incident, and that with a fit Gordon Dale for ninety minutes it may have been very different. However, City won their next three league matches, scoring four goals in each of the next two, so it was not as gloomy as it could have been in the weeks that followed...

So, up the City! Let's hope for a game with no bad tackles and a better scoreline!



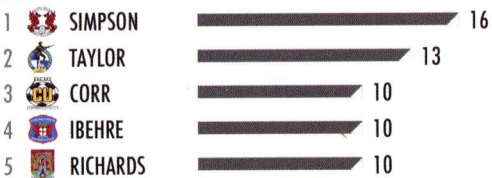

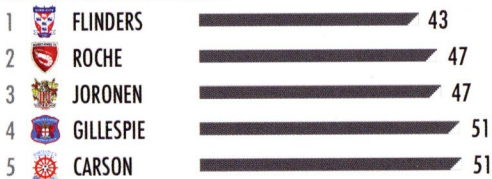
