

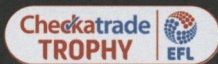

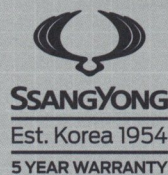

# WELCOME WEST BROM

Tonight we extend a warm welcome to West Bromwich Albion; their staff, players and fans, as the Hatters take on the Baggies in their second match this season in the Checkatrade Trophy.

The fixture is part of the new format this season for the Football League Trophy – won by the Hatters in 2008-09, of course, when it was known as the Johnstone’s Paint Trophy – with 16 EPPP Category 1 Academy teams invited by the EFL to take part in a new group stage.

The Baggies U21 side have had a decent run of form going into tonight’s game, winning three on the bounce against their counterparts at Brighton & Hove Albion, Aston Villa and Stoke City. Their first match in Southern Group H of this competition didn’t quite go to plan though, as they lost 2-0 to Millwall at The Den at the end of August, while the Town were winning at Gillingham.

Nadjim Abdou scored on the hour mark for the Lions, before Steve Morison fired home from the penalty spot with 15 minutes to go after Ben Thompson was brought down by Dara O’Shea in the box. West Brom’s official website said: “An extremely young and inexperienced Baggies team took on the side currently sitting fifth in League One and they competed admirably throughout the night at The Den.”

The U21s, who were watched over by James Shan during that defeat, have seen a number of Baggies first team players make an appearance this season, with the likes of Northern-Ireland international Chris Brunt, Malian international Mohammed Sissoko and Moroccan international Marouane Chamakh all getting a run out for the side. Brunt scored a fantastic free-kick in their 2-1 win against Stoke.

The academy side in recent seasons has seen the likes of Jonathan Leko and Saido Berahino come through and graduate, earning first team appearances.

Overall, the Hatters’ first team have faced West Bromwich Albion 42 times and have an inferior record to the Hawthorns club. Town have only won ten, whilst losing 23 times and drawing nine.

The first time the sides met was on New Year’s Day in 1897, when just under 7,000 spectators watched on as the Hatters were defeated 1-0. It didn’t matter too much to the Town though, as they had won the four previous games that season and were victorious in their seven after, including an 8-0 thrashing of Wellingborough.

The Baggies first team currently sit ninth in the Premier League, with solid wins over Crystal Palace and West Ham in recent weeks and a 1-1 draw with Sunderland on Saturday.

**STORY OF THE MATCH:** Town returned to form with a fantastic victory over Doncaster Rovers in a match that seemed to have it all. Nathan Jones rang the changes as he replaced five players from the loss to Crawley Town in the previous game.

James Coppinger fired in from close range to give his side the lead on 21 minutes after a period of sustained pressure from the visitors, before Scott Cuthbert had to have lengthy treatment on a neck injury and was replaced by Alan Sheehan.

The break whilst Cuthbert received treatment seemed to wake the Hatters up from their early slumbers, as Cameron

McGeehan fired in from close range on 36 minutes, before Jack Marriott slotted through Donny keeper Marko Maroš's legs after a smart flick on from Danny Hylton, to put the Hatters in the lead just before the break.

Mpanzu was brought down in the box nine minutes from full-time after a clumsy challenge from Joe Wright. McGeehan smashed the ball down the middle, as Maroš dived to his left, giving the Hatters a two-goal cushion and an eventual win.

Hylton received his marching orders in time added on after receiving a second yellow for throwing a litter picking stick in frustration after he slid onto it at the side of the pitch.

**STORY OF THE MATCH:** The Hatters made it three games unbeaten and took another point from the second long away trip of last week after Cheltenham hit back to cancel out Danny Hylton's stunning sixth goal of the season.

The first half failed to capture the eye and the hosts had much the better of the play, with Christian Walton called into action to keep out a long range effort from former Town midfielder Asa Hall.

But the second burst into life when Hylton scored with the Hatters' first attempt on target seven minutes in, the striker virtually walking the ball into the Cheltenham net after nutmegging defender Aaron Downes and rounding the keeper Russell Griffiths.

Cameron McGeehan then went close to doubling the advantage when Jack Marriott dummied Jordan Cook's low free-kick to allow him a shot from just inside the area.

**STORY OF THE MATCH:** The Town moved back up to second place in the Sky Bet League Two table after a brilliant second-half free-kick from captain Alan Sheehan earned a deserved point at Hartlepool.

On a night when manager Nathan Jones fielded what is believed to be the youngest starting XI in the Town's League history at just over 22 years, the Hatters might have taken all three after seeing a host of chances go begging after the hosts had been reduced to ten men in the second half after Nicky Featherstone had been shown a straight red card for a foul on Olly Lee. But Sheehan's 79th-minute curler, after Alex Gilliead had been fouled on the edge of the Hartlepool

area, was ultimately all the Town could manage after Nathan Thomas had given Hartlepool the lead on the stroke of half-time.

Sheehan, skipper for the night in Scott Cuthbert's absence, marshalled his young team-mates – including 17-year-old Akin Famewo and 18-year-old James Justin either side of him in defence – with great maturity.

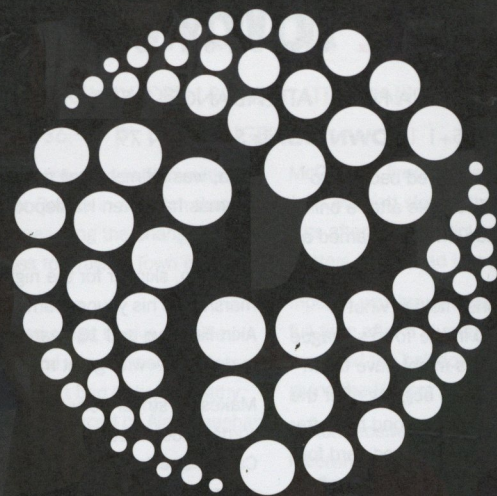
Makeshift striker Pelly-Ruddock Mpanzu hit the post, sub Jordan Cook brought the best out of home keeper Trevor Carson and Jack Marriott twice went close to winning the game late on, but ultimately a point was good enough to raise the Town one place in the table.

►► The hosts belied their lowly second-from-bottom position in the table, however, to bombard the Town defence with some fine set-piece deliveries, and took a share of the spoils with Daniel O'Shaugnessy's equaliser 12 minutes later.

The point saw the Hatters drop down to fourth, with 18 points after eleven games, but manager Nathan Jones deemed it a point well earned.
