# CHIEF EXEC'S NOTES

Notts County Chief Executive Jason Turner gives his thoughts ahead of today's game...



I would like to welcome the members of Luton Town to this afternoon's Sky Bet League Two match.

Today is our annual Remembrance fixture. We are looking forward to welcoming representatives of the Royal British Legion and the armed forces as we join them to pay tribute to the men and women who have given their lives in service to their country.

It has been another busy period since my last programme notes, with our Football in the Community day, against Crewe, proving a huge success.

Since then there have been a number of exciting off-field developments, including the launch of a huge range of personalised gifts in our online store and the voting process getting underway for the final position in our Supporter Liaison Officer team.

I have kept supporters up to date with my attempts to secure a new kit supplier for next season and, following detailed discussion with two market leaders, I have recommended my choice to the board. Once the final decision has been made we will make an announcement.

Understandably, this year's kit problems have caused much frustration among fans and I do sympathise with them. Therefore, following close consultation with our SLO Dougie Pullen, we have decided to give our supporters the chance to choose the colour of next season's away kit. Once the supplier has been confirmed I will provide an update on this.

After today, our academy and first-team will both switch their attentions to cup competitions. The Under-18s face an FA Youth Cup First Round tie against Romulus FC at Meadow Lane on Tuesday, while our first-team open their Emirates FA Cup campaign with a trip to National League side Boreham Wood.

The latter fixture will be played next Sunday to accommodate the BBC covering the match on their extended highlights show, which means our Checkatrade Trophy trip to Sunderland has been pushed back a day to Wednesday 9 November. This has had a further knock-on effect, with our Meet the Manager night now moving to Wednesday 16 November.

On a final note, I am absolutely ecstatic that Aaron Collins will be available to us after our appeal against his red card at Portsmouth was rightly upheld. Anyone who knows Aaron will understand there is not a malicious bone in his body and it is heartening to see justice done on this occasion. Come on you Pies!

## YOUNG NOTTS COUNTY FAN TO REPRESENT ENGLAND

A youngster from Nottingham has been selected to represent England at karate in a tournament in Ireland.

Devoted Magpies fan Luke Beardsley was chosen after a qualifying tournament and now the 18-year-old will perform for his country on the international stage.

Beardsley, who sits in the Kop, told The Mag how it was an unexpected achievement after a break from the discipline.

"I've only recently started karate training again, after a three-year break, to attempt to make it in football. Unfortunately that didn't work out, but it opened the door back up to karate through my association, S.K.I GB, and now I'm loving it," he explained.

"It was a bit unexpected. I went to a qualifying tournament and fought against three top fighters. I wasn't sure I'd fought too well on the day but when I heard my name had been called-up it was mind blowing.

"It's been such an exciting time for me and I'm proud to represent Nottingham. My Chief Instructor Hanshi Asano is now based in Wilford and I come from a long line of Notts County fans, my granddad used to attend in



the 1950s and my uncle brought me down to Meadow Lane a few years ago and I've been a season ticket holder ever since."

Club chaplain Liam 'Rev' O'Boyle said: "It took all the romance out of sleeping under the stars that's for sure, even on the hallowed turf of Meadow Lane!

"It was a very humbling experience - I think I got to sleep around 3am before waking up to a dawn chorus

of snoring echoing round the ground! "Sleeping outside gave you a real appreciation of how tough it must be to live on the streets and how vulnerable you feel. It's scary to think some people in our city have to do this every night without the luxury we all have of spending the next night in our warm, comfy beds.

## THE VOICE OF NOTTS COUNTY

BBC Radio Nottingham's **Colin Slater** writes exclusively for The Mag, this week discussing a new club tome and national Hall of Fame recognition...

**T**wo events, within three days of each other and both keenly anticipated, make next week a significant one for everybody associated with Notts.


As imminently as Monday comes the official launch of the latest book on the club, the number of which has grown remarkably over the past few years.

The author of "One Flew Over the Magpies' Nest" is Paul Mace, a life-long Magpies' fan, like his father before him and whose own son is following in the family tradition, the two of them hardly ever missing a match, home or away.

Writing this 650-page volume has therefore been a labour of love and the family's long relationship with Meadow Lane is reflected in the measured attitude taken when recording some contentious issues.

Mace's approach to the task has been different to any other. It's based on a vast range of interviews he's conducted with just about all the club's major figures over the past 60 years who are still alive to share their memories.

The interviews which were recorded, have been faithfully transcribed and include contributions by Jack Dunnett, Derek Pavis, Sven Goran Eriksson and



Howard Wilkinson, to name but a very few. Several of the fascinating stories they recall have never previously surfaced.

Come Thursday and Notts will be celebrating their induction into Football's National Hall of Fame. As the world's oldest professional League club, longevity alone has earned them the right to a place at the game's top table.

Nottingham Ice Arena is the venue and the organisers invited me to prepare a list of former players who could be invited to attend.

I took the simple decision to concentrate on those who've figured in the club's eight promotion successes over the past half-century and more.

Don Masson captained Notts to three of those eight promotions, a proud and unique record and one unlikely ever to be broken. He led the team from the fourth-tier in 1971, the third-tier in 1973 and, most memorably of all, the second-tier in 1981 when the Magpies reached the old First Division after an absence of 55 years, the final triumph of the Jimmy Sirrel era.

Also there will be Phil Turner, who has the distinction of having climbed the 39 steps to the Royal Box at the old Wembley Stadium when he collected trophies for promotion via spectacular Play-off Final victories in 1990 and 1991 under Neil Warnock who, incidentally, is now weaving his magic for Cardiff City.

The line-up of captains will be completed by John Thompson in 2009-10, the season when Sven was director of football at Meadow Lane and Munto Finance, controversially, controlled the club. They claimed to be a special purpose acquisition company of a Middle East-backed investment fund based in Switzerland.

Finally, mention must be made of Gerry Carver, at 81 the oldest former player who'll be in attendance that night. A highly skilful and industrious midfielder, and a loyal one-club man, he made 31 appearances when Notts County climbed out of the Fourth Division 56 years ago, at the end of the 1959-60 campaign.





# WOLF HUNGRY FOR SUCCESS AT THE LANE...

In this week's Big Interview, Wolves loanee **Aaron Collins** talks about his sending-off that wasn't, his debut goal against Grimsby and becoming a fans' favourite...

**A**aron Collins joined Notts County on loan from Wolverhampton Wanderers in late August, and has quickly become a favourite with the fans. Sporting a standout attitude and bags of ability, the fresh-faced 19-year-old was rewarded for his promising beginning to life at Meadow Lane with his first start of the campaign, away at Fratton Park as the Magpies beat Portsmouth 2-1.

"It was great to finally get my first start for Notts, in front of such a massive crowd too," the teenager from Wales told *The Mag*.

"As soon as you walk into the ground you get a fantastic buzz and walking out in front of almost 18,000 was mind-blowing. It was like

a dream... but we weren't intimidated and I think that showed.

"It was a fantastic chance for me and I enjoyed the game. To go to Portsmouth and win is a huge result for us that is bound to have the rest of the division looking.

"We know if we want to get promoted this season we have to beat the big players in this league and Portsmouth are one of those."

It looked like a fairytale full league debut for Notts' No.39, but things turned slightly sour with just over ten minutes to go, a now rescinded red card being shown to the youngster for a supposed 'dangerous' challenge.

Speaking of the incident, he said: "I couldn't believe it when I was sent off. I made sure during the attempted

block that it wasn't dangerous. It was an attempt to work my socks off to get the ball back and nothing more.

"I jumped in front of him and suddenly he's on the floor. It's hugely frustrating for me to see, I don't think the referee has actually seen it. There was no intent"

The FA agreed, overturning the decision on appeal, allowing Collins to be available for selection for today's game against Luton Town.

News of Collins' signing was announced to Magpies supporters during half-time of our Checkatrade Trophy home tie with Hartlepool, with the Welshman eager to be at Meadow Lane playing football.

He said: "I couldn't wait to get started. I spoke to my dad who told me what a massive club Notts County are, and how they are the world's oldest Football League club. I got here and could tell straight away it's a huge club with a great stadium."

Collins made his debut four days later, in a scintillating home tie against Grimsby, a game that was drawn 2-2. Collins was introduced to the action on 59 minutes in a triple substitution that saw the game swing in Notts' favour, with a Collins goal rounding off a comeback from two goals down.

He said of his first appearance in Notts colours: "I couldn't have asked for anything more on my debut. To come on and get a goal was superb, and to be involved in the other goal was just the icing on the cake."



"I didn't really know what to do. I've hit it with my weaker foot and suddenly I'm in the corner celebrating! I've watched it on TV afterwards, I knew if I scored I was going to do a knee slide because it was nice and wet but I don't know what I'm doing with my arms, they're waving around all over the place! But the adrenaline and emotion just took over."

Collins was quick to praise the Magpies faithful, who have endeavoured to make him welcome since his signing.

He said: "The fans have been absolutely fantastic with me since I came here. Even after that first game, I stayed behind at the end for about half an hour to get photos with people and to sign things. I couldn't have asked for anything more."

"I get a lot of nice things said to me on social media also, and it massively helps to know that the fans are on my side too."

Collins is open when asked about his aims for the future, and shows a huge amount of ambition that is sure to serve him well moving forward. Currently a Wolves player, Collins

has already had a successful spell in League Two with Newport, after progressing through The Exiles' academy, and feels he has points to prove in order to play at a higher level.

He said: "I'm hopefully proving that I can play adult football, I just want to do as well as I can for Notts County. I've still got two years on my Wolves contract, but right now I'm just enjoying my football here at Notts."

The youngster has his sights firmly set high, but also appreciates how crucial his time lower down the football pyramid is.

"My main goal in life is to play in the Premier League," he said. "But I feel that coming to Notts is absolutely massive in my development as a player. I'm quite skinny at the moment and there's the potential for people to question my physicality but if I prove that I can do it at League Two level then that will bode well for the future."

"I'm not the biggest lad but learning how to play at this level is crucial when it comes to moving forward in the game and will help round me as a player. I'm hoping along the way that I will be able to do all I can for Notts County."

Two second-half goals saw Nathan Jones suffer his first loss as Luton manager at home to Notts County.

In an end-to-end first-half Cameron McGeehan should have given the hosts the lead but Notts gloveman Roy Carroll got down well to save.

The visitors took the lead midway through the second period when former Magpies defender Alan Sheehan diverted the ball into his own net and Jon Stead's neat finish sealed a comfortable victory for Notts County.

Luton boss Nathan Jones told BBC Three Counties Radio post-match: "I thought some of our play in the first-half was excellent, but our lack of conversion of the chances we created lost us the game.

"It's about winning games as well as the style of play. We may have played pleasing football to watch, but if we don't win the game then it's all for nothing.

"I don't envisage anything being done transfer wise now at this time in the window, but the loan market is still there for us if we need it.

"We are looking now at making sure we are a good side and have a strong number of principles that we stick to."

Luton midfielder Cameron McGeehan grabbed a late leveller as the Hatters salvaged a 1-1 draw against Mansfield.

Jordan Cook shot over the crossbar for the hosts early on but the Stags were ahead after nine minutes when Matt Green nodded in his eighth goal of the season on his return to the visitors' starting line-up.

Chris Clements' shot was saved by Christian Walton while at the other end Jack Marriott saw his effort blocked by a combination of Krystian Pearce and goalkeeper Scott Shearer.

Cook came close to an equaliser after 30 minutes, waltzing into the box and just missing the bottom corner, while Malvin Benning's free-kick was easy work for Walton.

McGeehan sent one effort from long-range well over, as after the break, Jake Gray saw his curler fly into the stands too.

Luton should have restored parity after 65 minutes when the ball dropped perfectly for Alan Sheehan eight-yards out, but he shanked horribly over the top. However, the hosts were level after 77 minutes when McGeehan drilled home from 25-yards.

Hatters skipper Scott Cuthbert almost won it when his side-footer drew a flying stop from Shearer, while Marriott's left-footer was inches wide of the target in stoppage time.

## Jones tipping Hatters for success

**T**here's a growing optimism around Kenilworth Road that this season could be Luton's best shot at returning to the third-tier, after last term's promotion quest was undermined by erratic home form.

During 2015-16 ten defeats in their Bedfordshire backyard eroded any chance of promotion, but the opening three months of this campaign show signs of a more resilient, unified and confident Hatters outfit. They've been firmly entrenched in the play-offs all

season, boast one of the most free-scoring forward lines in the division and look to have sorted out their home form.

Yet despite sitting fourth in the League Two table, Town manager Nathan Jones is far from content. A 1-1 draw last weekend against Mansfield was a fourth stalemate in their last five League outings and he told lutontown.co.uk: "We know we are capable of scoring in any game, and we don't concede many, but it is little lapses in concentration that are costing us. We must have one of the best defensive records in the league but we also have one of the worst clean-sheet records, keeping just two in 14 games, and that is really frustrating.

I'm pleased with our structure and our ball retention, but we have to keep working extremely hard to get better defensively and in doing the nitty gritty things that will give us those wins. I want clean-sheets in our armoury."

Set up to hurt teams on the counter-attack the Hatters have a plethora of attacking options and have only failed to score past Leeds and Crawley this term. Even without Craig Mackail-Smith at present, Jack Marriott and Danny Hylton have formed a ruthless strike partnership and have the creativity and

invention from Alex Gilliead, Jake Gray and Cameron McGeehan driving from midfield.

The future certainly looks bright when you see the next crop of Academy stars being drip-fed into the senior set-up as well. James Justin, Akin Famewo and Tyreeq Bakinson are already catching the eye and reinforcing the manager's belief that in being a hot-bed for such emerging talent they can be a force to be reckoned with at any level.

Jones told BBC Three Counties Radio recently: "I'm telling you our youngsters are better than a lot at Premier League sides... you'll be recognising these Luton youngsters sooner than you think."

## KEY MEN: THREE TO WATCH



### 1 CHRISTIAN WALTON

**Age:** 20  
**Nationality:** English

Although clean-sheets for the Brighton loanee have been scarce this season, just two in 16 outings, the 20-year-old has underlined why he is so highly-regarded at The Amex. The former Plymouth gloveman gained his first England Under-21 cap earlier this month, keeping a blank slate as the Three Lions won 5-0 against Bosnia and Herzegovina. Said Jones: "He's been playing very well, so we're happy that he's got the recognition he deserves and it shows that coming out of Brighton's environment into ours isn't a backward step."



### 9 DANNY HYLTON

**Age:** 27  
**Nationality:** English

Luton commander-in-chief Nathan Jones has been waxing lyrical about his summer acquisition, Hylton having contributed eight goals in 12 League outings already this term. The terrier-like marksman was prolific at Aldershot, before helping to fire Oxford out of League Two last term with 14 goals. Although the mercurial frontman was suspended last weekend, Jones commented: "He's my main man and I love him because he gets me goals, he leads the line, he's tireless, he's a nuisance... he's the best in the league."



### 8 CAMERON MCGEEHAN

**Age:** 21  
**Nationality:** Northern Irish

Despite contributing 14 goals from midfield last term, and scooping the Hatters' joint Young Player of the Year award, the Northern Ireland Under-21 is aiming to surpass last season's haul. The former Norwich trainee has been a driving force from right midfield, or in orchestrating attacks from a No.10 role, and has scored eight times already this term, including braces against Newport and Doncaster. With a ratio of a goal every two games manager Jones said: "If you look at his stats, he's phenomenal."

Devout Christian Nathan Jones hasn't required any divine intervention in reversing Luton's trajectory since taking Luton's hot-seat at the start of 2016.

The former Southend, Brighton and Yeovil left-back guided the Hatters to 11th place after replacing John Still, and now in charge of his first full campaign looks to have eradicated the inconsistent home form which curtailed last season's promotion charge.

The bilingual Welshman, who was assistant manager at Yeovil and Brighton, has impressed with a 51 per cent winning ratio and, with the club's best crop of youngsters in a decade at his disposal, he's eyeballing a return to the third-tier after an eight-year absence.

### AT THE BACK...


Just three League Two teams have conceded fewer than Luton this season and integral to such resilience has been their experienced centre-back duo. Imposing Hatters captain **Scott Cuthbert**, who helped both Leyton Orient and Swindon to League One Play-off Finals, has been a talismanic figure. While **Alan Sheehan** was a former Notts skipper during three years at Meadow Lane and is a cultured left footer. Only No.1 gloveman **Christian Walton** and **Dan Potts** have been League ever-presents in 2016-17 and the former Young Hammer of the Year has looked accomplished at left-back. On the other flank overlapping full-back **Stephen O'Donnell**, a Scottish First Division winner with Patrick Thistle, played every League game before losing his place to Academy ace **James Justin**, although the 19-year-old is sidelined with a calf injury. Also pushing for a regular berth is former Mansfield Player of the Year **Johnny Mullins**. A member of the '400 Club', the domineering centre-back captained both Rotherham and Oxford out of League Two. At the other end of the experience spectrum is left-back **Jack Senior**, **Kavan Cotter**, 17-year-old powerhouse **Akin Famewo** and last season's youth team captain **Frankie Musunda**.

### THE ENGINE ROOM...

Luton chief Nathan Jones prefers a midfield diamond, with **Glen Rea** or **Olly Lee** often the defensive anchor. The latter is a well-travelled midfield dynamo once of Birmingham, while the high-octane Rea is a Republic of Ireland Under-21 who started out at Brighton. Former Notts loanee **Nathan Doyle** is cast from a similar mould but pulled his Achilles tendon in pre-season, while **Pelly Ruddock** is another box-to-box enforcer. Providing the graft down the right is often fans' favourite **Jonathan Smith**. A League Two winner with Swindon before helping Luton to the Conference title, he was 2014-15 Player of the Year. Providing similar industriousness along the left has been **Jake Gray**, the former Palace trainee arriving in the summer. The on-form **Cameron McGeehan** has been utilised on the right, or in a more advanced No.10 role, although on-loan Newcastle winger **Alex Gilliead** has also been deployed at the tip of the diamond and is of "thoroughbred quality" according to Jones. While winger **Danny Green** has been missing since May due to a leg break, teenage prodigies include **Conor Tomlinson**, **Alex Atkinson**, **Jack Snelus** and **Tyreeq Bakinson**.

### UP TOP...

Luton boast an exciting armoury and while joint leading scorer **Danny Hylton** has been taking the headlines, his partner in crime **Jack Marriott** is held in equally high regard by Jones. "He's a menace all day long and I'm very pleased my front two are mine," Jones told Dunstable Today about last season's 16-goal top scorer. The clinical former Ipswich trainee, still only 22, was the Hatters' Player of the Year for 2015-16. While prolific scorer **Craig Mackail-Smith** is on the comeback trail after suffering a broken leg in March, other options include summer arrivals **Jordan Cook**, once of Charlton and Walsall, and the lightning quick **Isaac Vassell**. Five-time Northern Ireland international **Josh McQuoid**, who helped Bournemouth up three divisions, scored five times in his maiden campaign for Town and can be used centrally with his quick feet. Alternatives also include Academy graduates **Zane Banton** and **Freddy Hinds**, the duo both getting run-outs in the EFL Trophy win over West Brom earlier this month.



**MATCH REPORT:** A brace from Adam Campbell saw ten-man Notts County earn an impressive victory at promotion-chasing Portsmouth.

Despite having not tasted success since September, and with the confident hosts starting strongly on the south coast, it was Notts that broke the deadlock on 21 minutes. Richard Duffy's free-kick allowed Campbell to take an exquisite first touch before coolly lofting the ball into the far corner of the net from 18 yards for his first goal of the season.

Portsmouth restored parity just six minutes later though when a neat cut-back from Gary Roberts presented Conor Chaplin with time to guide the ball home.

After the break the hosts were still in the ascendency and should have gone ahead when Carl Baker's cross was met by Kyle Bennett, only to nod agonisingly wide.

John Sheridan's men might only have had five shots compared to Pompey's 17 in Hampshire, but they made their openings count. Campbell restored the visitors' advantage on 71 minutes when he capitalised on some sloppy defending, slotting neatly past a stranded David Forde in the home side's goal.

Notts had to survive a Portsmouth onslaught for the final 15 minutes though after Aaron Collins was shown a straight red card for a challenge on Forde, when it looked as though the youngster had made no contact with the goalkeeper.

However, thanks to some wonder saves from Adam Collin in the Notts goal, Sheridan's men hung on for a well-deserved victory to collect their fifth win on the road this season, lifting them into the top six, level on points with Portsmouth.




**MANAGER'S COMMENTS**

Both sides had to settle for a point as Notts ended a three-game losing run in all competitions but dropped to 12th in the League Two table.



Nearly every Notts fan I spoke to before the game said they would happily take a point before kick-off. Yet the battling, fighting display from John Sheridan's team proved otherwise.



The delighted supporters left the stadium for the long journey home and were wondering if this could be the turning point in our season. On this showing, I for one think anything is possible when our team show this sort of resolve.

## The Beautiful Game

The Football League Paper's resident sage Chris Dunlavy pens his latest musings on the weird, the wonderful and the down right crackers from the sport we all love...



**Seventeen games. Eleven goals. A string of inspirational displays - Bristol City striker Tammy Abraham has been tipped for greatness after a phenomenal start at Ashton Gate.**

"You see Rashford and what a fantastic job he did for Manchester United and then England," said Robins boss Lee Johnson of his 19-year-old striker. "I certainly put Tammy up there, when he is at his best, in that category."

The omens are good for the on-loan Chelsea man, who netted 74 goals in 98 matches for the Blues' youth sides. This week, Abraham picked up the EFL Player of the Month award, given out 61 times since its inception in December 2009. And while not everyone lived up to their billing, the list is studded with starlets who went on to become household names.

### VICTOR MOSES DECEMBER 2009

The first ever winner of the award, Moses scored six goals in eight games as a teenager at Crystal Palace, earning the gong and a £2.5million move to Wigan in the process. However, the winger was in danger of drifting into obscurity following a move to Chelsea in 2012. Loaned here, there and everywhere for the best part of four years, the arrival of Antonio Conte this season has given Moses a new lease of life. Reinvented as a wing-back, he has scored three goals in ten games and is being tipped for an England call.



### DANNY INGS APRIL 2011

Recalled from a loan spell at non-league Dorchester due to an injury crisis at parent club Bournemouth, the 18-year-old striker responded in spectacular style. Ings netted seven goals, including four in April, to win the award and reportedly arouse the interest of Liverpool. In the end, he joined Burnley where he scored 43 goals in 182 games before finally earning an England call-up and that big move to Anfield. Sadly, injury has restricted the 24-year-old to just nine games in 15 months.



### CHARLIE AUSTIN MARCH 2010

In September 2009, Austin was plying his trade for Poole Town. One trial and one hat-trick later, he was playing for Swindon in League One. By March, he'd netted 18 goals. And the progress has never stopped. At Burnley, QPR and now Southampton, the 27-year-old's strike rate has never fallen below one in two, with his top-flight tally a hugely impressive 23 goals in 49 games.



### JON JO SHELVEY NOVEMBER 2011

Signed by Liverpool from Charlton at just 18, Shelvey spent just two months on loan at Blackpool in 2011, but nobody at Bloomfield Road will forget it. The midfielder scored six goals in his ten games, including a hat-trick in a 5-0 win away at Elland Road. Things haven't quite gone to plan since, however, and despite playing for England in September 2015, Shelvey is now back in the Championship with Newcastle.




Adam Campbell took his two goals at the weekend superbly well and stepped up with aplomb in the absence of Stead.

However, over the course of the 90 minutes we more than deserved the victory as we not only matched them in all of these areas, we maintained it for 90 minutes as well as adding to it with quality in possession.

"We started the game brightly, Sam Osborne driving forward from kick-off, combining with Edwin Towers to get the ball back on the edge of the area, where he was fouled by the Wrexham midfielder.

"Skipper Dom Brownhill was unable to give us the perfect start to the game though as his free-kick was saved easily by the 'keeper.

"We managed to maintain pressure on our opponents for the majority of the half, not really being threatened at our end, and we squandered a number of chances from set-plays and long throws from both full-backs that we should have capitalised on.

"Some of our play was excellent again and with Nathan Cobain and Declan Dunn giving us width in the full-back areas we got a lot of joy when switching the play.

"George doubled our lead a few minutes later when their goalkeeper presented him with the ball for him to bundle home, and it was game over then with 15 minutes to play which was brilliant.

"We managed the game really well to the end and saw out the match by showing a maturity in our play that we have seen time and time again this season.






