THE MANAGER NATHAN JONES



Welcome to Kenilworth Road for tonight's third and final group game in the first stage of the Checkatrade Trophy against Millwall.

I'd like to welcome everybody travelling from The Den – supporters, directors, staff, manager Neil Harris and his squad – and I hope they have a safe trip back to the south-east London following the game.

Millwall and ourselves sit together at the top of Southern Group H with exactly the same points, goal difference, goals scored and goals conceded having beaten Gillingham 2-1 and West Brom's Under-21s 2-0.

We have both already qualified for the next round, but there is still plenty riding on tonight's game against tough opposition from the division above. We want to win to finish top of the group so we can have home advantage in the first knockout stage, and of course we are keen to extend our recent unbeaten into double figures, having made it nine matches without defeat in the FA Cup win at Exeter on Saturday.

WELCOME MILLWALL

Like the Hatters, the Lions have won both of their matches so far in the Checkatrade Trophy, setting up a race for first place in Southern Group H which will be decided when the final whistle blows tonight at the Kenny.

Both clubs have already qualified for the next round and are on a goal difference of plus-three, so if after 90 minutes both sides are drawing, the penalty shoot-out for the additional point on offer will determine the winner.

Neil Harris' side have matched the Hatters in both their results in the Trophy so far, defeating Gillingham and West Brom, 2-1 and 2-0 respectively.

Crowds of just over 2,000 have watched on at The Den in both of Millwall's matches, as Steve Morison netted a goal against both the Baggies and the Gills. His winning goal against Justin Edinburgh's League One side came in the 88th minute after going a goal down early on, setting up this evening's winner-takes-all encounter.

It's fair to say Harris has an abundance of striking talent to choose from for tonight's game, as Morison leads the way as top goal scorer with nine strikes so far this term, but Lee Gregory is close behind with six. Aiden O'Brien has one fewer with five, whilst Fred Onyedinma has netted three, twice in Cup and Trophy competitions so far.

Morrison is top of the assist charts at The Den, laying on three goals so far this season.

The Lions were unfortunate not to make a return to the Championship at the end of last season, having finished in the play-off places with 81 points. Harris' side made it to

the final, but came unstuck against Barnsley, as the Tykes ran out 3-1 winners at Wembley.

The Den has been crucial to the Lions' points haul in the league so far this season, having only lost two in front of their home crowd from seven games. Currently sitting in mid-table, Millwall are within touching distance of the play-off places, having recently beaten Oxford 2-1 before booking a place in the second round of the FA Cup with a 1-0 win over Southend last Friday.

The furthest the Lions have reached in the competition was a Trophy Final appearance at Wembley in 1999, which they lost 1-0 to Wigan.

Manager Harris is a Millwall legend. Currently their top goal scorer with 138 goals, with no signs of being beaten anytime soon, he is ahead of second-placed Teddy Sheringham by 27 strikes, with the former England striker on 111 goals.

The sides will contest their 122nd meeting this evening. Millwall – known as Millwall Athletic when the Hatters played them up until 1899 – have beaten the Town 53 times, whilst they have drawn and lost to the Hatters an equal amount of times, with 34.

THE BOSS

NEIL HARRIS

The former Millwall striker became boss at The Den in March 2015. He led the side to the League One play-off final last season, where they were beaten by Barnsley at Wembley.

BETWEEN THE STICKS

TOM KING

The former Palace man joined the Lions in 2014. The 21-year-old has been deputy for Jordan Archer in the league, and first choice in the League Cup and Checkatrade Trophy this season.

IN DEFENCE

SHAUN HUTCHINSON

The 25-year-old joined Millwall after his contract expired with Fulham in the summer. The centre-back made a name for himself at Motherwell, before joining the Craven Cottage outfit in 2014.

SID NELSON

One of Millwall's upcoming talents, the 20-year-old has been in-and-out of the side for almost two years since his debut in December 2014, but has made several appearances already this season.

TONY CRAIG

After coming through the youth ranks at The Den, Craig returned for his fourth spell at Millwall after his contract expired with Brentford in the

summer of 2015. His other former clubs include Crystal Palace and Leyton Orient.

NOAH CHESMAIN

Another academy graduate, Chesmain has been a regular for the Lions in their Checkatrade Trophy campaign so far this season. The 18-year-old had a loan spell with Welling last season.

JOE MARTIN

The former England Under-16 and 17 international joined Millwall last summer on a one-year deal, which was extended by a further 12 months at the end of the 2015/16 season.

ACROSS THE MIDDLE

IGGY WYLDE

After impressing last season, but ultimately failing to gain promotion with Plymouth Argyle, Wylde earned a move to Millwall in the summer, signing a two-year contract.

SHAUN WILLIAMS

Williams moved to England in 2011 when he joined MK Dons, after starting his career in Ireland with Drogheda United. The 30-year-old joined the Lions in 2014.

CALUM BUTCHER

The midfielder won promotion to the Championship with Burton Albion last season, making 43 appearances for the Brewers. The 25-year-old signed a two-year deal in the summer with the Lions.

STEVE MORISON

The former Norwich forward is now in his third spell with Millwall. A Wales international, he re-joined the Lions permanently in the summer of 2015.



BEN THOMPSON

The 21-year-old was crowned Young Player of the Year and won Goal of the Season last term with the Lions, the latter award for a 20-yard belter against Shrewsbury.

DAVID WORRALL

After leaving Southend in the summer, Worrall joined up with Harris' side on a two-year deal. His former teams include Oldham Athletic, Rotherham United and West Bromwich Albion.

UP FRONT

LEE GREGORY

Gregory formed a deadly partnership with Steve Morison last season, as he scored 27 of the 46 goals they managed. His former sides include FC Halifax Town and Mansfield.

FRED ONYEDINMA

The 19-year-old signed his first professional contract in November 2013. He had a loan spell in the 2014/15 season with Wycombe Wanderers, where he netted eight goals in 27 appearances.

Matt Green headed in from close range to give the Stags an early lead, but McGeehan's 25-yard strike 14 minutes from time meant both sides continued their unbeaten runs for another week.

With Danny Hylton suspended, Jones opted for a possession based approach. From the first kick of the game, Mansfield didn't seem to get a touch of the ball, until the ninth minute when Green struck.

STORY OF THE MATCH: Top scorer Danny Hylton set the fireworks off early on Bonfire Night with a typical all-action display in Devon to help the Hatters make it nine games unbeaten in all competitions with a 3-1 Emirates FA Cup first round win over League Two rivals Exeter.

The Town hitman has been in sparkling form and he added two more to his season's haul by notching a penalty in each half at St James Park; one that he won himself, the second he helped create.



The breakthrough came in the 11th minute when Hylton was brought down in the box by Pierce Sweeney, and the Hatters striker picked himself up to chip a Panenka-style penalty down the middle of the City goal as home keeper Bobby Olejnik dived to his right.

Reuben Reid brought the hosts deservedly level six minutes before half-time, but – a minute after manager Nathan Jones threw Craig Mackail-Smith into the fray for his first action since breaking his leg in March – Glen Rea steered





STORY OF THE MATCH: More than 2,000 Hatters watched on as a perfect penalty save from Christian Walton kept his side's unbeaten run going as Town failed to break down the Magpies.

An eighth match without defeat saw the Hatters hold on to fourth spot in the Sky Bet League Two, but it wasn't an easy ride as County came the closest to defeating the Kenilworth Road outfit in recent weeks.

Seven minutes from time, Scott Cuthbert was adjudged to have been holding in the penalty area by referee Michael Salisbury and he pointed to the spot.



Vadaine Oliver stepped up and sent the ball to the right of Walton, but the keeper guessed correctly and somehow clawed the ball away from the Hatters' net to keep the score level.

Newcastle loanee Alex Gilliead was a constant threat with his dribbling ability on full show, but the Town's best opportunity came when Alan Sheehan's free-kick from the left of the County area was met by Glen Rea.

Rea nodded the ball into the path of Danny Hylton who was five yards out from goal, but he fell backwards as he tried to make connection with the ball, and County smuggled the ball away.


