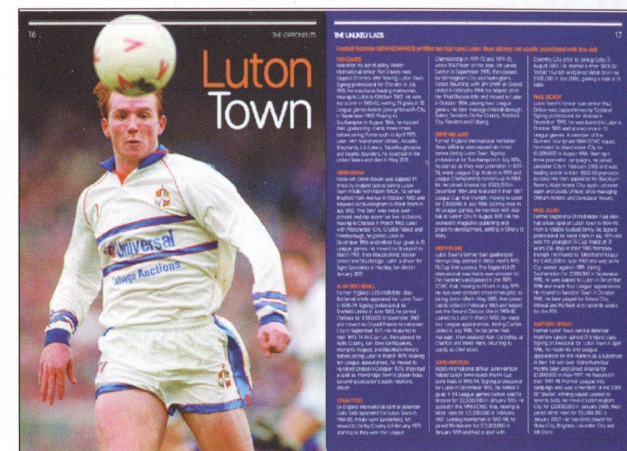

It is another big game for us here coming on the back of another up and down week.

We kicked off last week with a great win over Bradford in the Checkatrade Trophy which saw us go into the next round after coming through a very tough group which also included Bury and Stoke. We played some great stuff and I was proud of the lads for the way they played after a difficult week.

That win set us up nicely for the trip to Wycombe and the hopes that we could maintain our impressive away form. Unfortunately it wasn't to be and we went down 2-0 although the scoreline was particularly harsh I thought. We knew it would be tough against an improving side on their home patch but after the way we played in the first game I was convinced we had a real chance.

It all started well and it was brilliant to go a goal up early in the game. Unfortunately we let ourselves down and conceded two goals on the break that we should have done much better with.

To lose the first goal straight from our corner was criminal and the second one was a joke really and although both were good finishes we should have done much better and managed the situation much better than we did and that is what disappointed me most. I was bitterly disappointed after the game because I

am desperate for a good run in the FA Cup as a manager and I thought we had a great chance of making progress. Now we have to get over that disappointment and get ourselves right for today's game against a Luton side who are one of the pace setters in League 2 this year.

They are a good side but we know what we need to do. We have to be at our best from minute one to get back to winning ways at home here in the league. We have had some excellent cup displays here and now we need to transfer those performances into the league, starting today.

Finally I would like to sign off these notes by passing on my condolences to the family of Neil Marshall who sadly died this week. Neil was a local legend with Lancaster City and was a great servant to them. I know he will be sadly missed by all.

We have a lot of games coming up as we head towards the important Christmas period and we need to put in some good performances and improve our points tally.

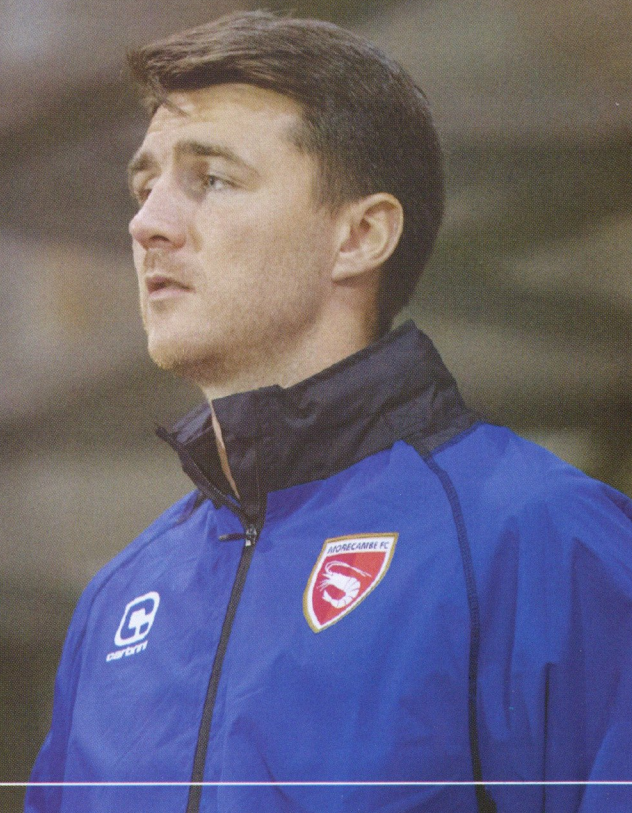
The League 2 table is mad again and every point will be vital and our home form will be important to us reaching our ambitions.

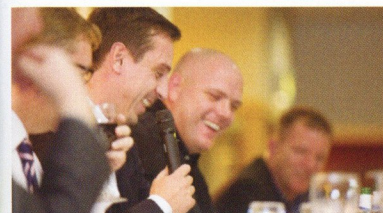

Neville wows the crowds at packed house



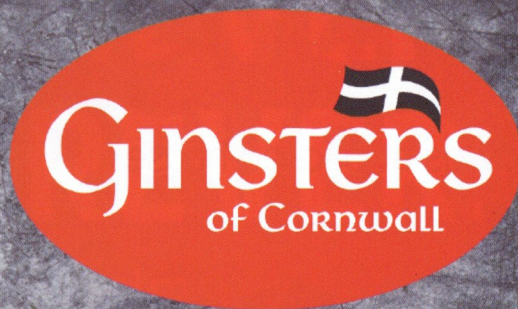
FORMER Manchester United and England star Gary Neville was the special guest at a question and answer night at the Globe Arena recently.

Morecambe today face a side that have had six managers at the helm since 2009, compared to our two.

Luton Town appear to be on the up now despite experiencing financial struggles in the past decade. They currently sit in a healthy fifth position in League 2, and have plans for a new stadium to replace their current home Kenilworth Road. The 2008-09 season was the start of the Hatters' downfall, as they were forced to start the campaign on -30 points due to financial misconduct.

They were relegated from the Football League, finishing bottom on 26 points. They would've finished 15th otherwise. In the following season, they were under immense pressure to return to the Football League at their first attempt.

After a poor start to the season, Mick Harford left them in October being 13 points off the top of the Conference. Following an excellent five game unbeaten run under caretaker manager Alan Neilson, Richard Money took the reins and led the side to a second place finish. Unfortunately for them, they lost to York City in the play-off semi-final. In the 2010-11 season, it was a similar story with their manager Richard Money

leaving in March with the side 15 points behind leaders Crawley. Gary Brabin replaced him, and took Luton to a third place finish only for them to lose to AFC Wimbledon on penalties in the final at the Etihad Stadium.

They made the play-off final again the following season, and lost to York City at Wembley. Gary Brabin left in March with the Hatters falling out of the play-off spots, and Paul Buckle took over and ensured they made the play-offs for the third season in a row- finishing fifth.

They didn't even make the play-offs in the 2012-13 season, finishing seventh in the Conference table. Paul Buckle left the club in February due to personal reasons, and John Still took over as manager. Still took the club back to the Football League in his first full season in charge at the Bedfordshire club, finishing as Champions. Andre Gray, who is now in the Premier League with Burnley, played a crucial role for the club scoring 30 goals in that season.

In his second season, Still took the club to an eighth place finish- just three points off the play-offs. Last season, Luton finished 11th. Still left the club in December following a poor run of two wins in 10

games. In a season in which they got past the first round of every cup competition, Nathan Jones' was named as Still's successor in January. Jack Marriott was the side's top scorer with 16 goals, and midfielder Cameron McGeehan also scored fourteen goals.

Both McGeehan and Marriott remain at the club this season. Luton have repeated their feat of getting past the first round of every cup competition this season, and they remain in the FA Cup and the Checkatrade Trophy. Whilst 14 players departed in the summer including veteran players Paddy McCourt and Paul Benson, Nathan Jones has brought eight players to Kenilworth Road.

One of the more notable signings was Danny Hylton from Oxford United. Hylton, who scored 30 goals in his two years at Oxford United, has scored 10 goals for the club so far this season, and Cameron McGeehan has been impressive again with nine goals.

Nathan Jones' side currently sit in fifth position, and are unbeaten in their last eight league games. If the stats are anything to go by, they will prove tough opposition for the Shrimps today.

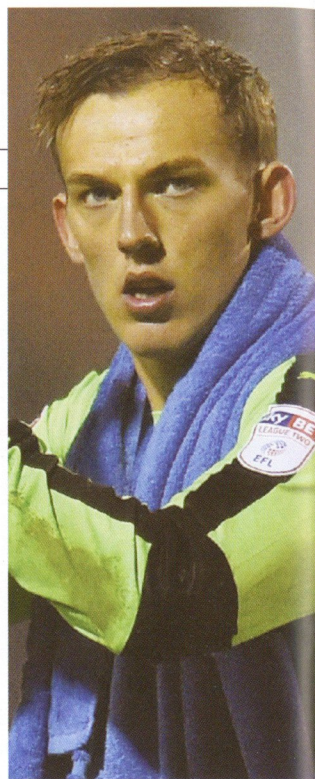
Goalkeeper

Young England keeper who came through the ranks at Plymouth Argyle, making the bench for the first-team three days after his 16th birthday, before Brighton swooped for him as a 17-year-old in February 2013.

Made his Seagulls debut at Tottenham in a Capital One Cup tie in August 2014 and went on to make three Championship appearances before being loaned to Bury and Plymouth last term.

Capped by England at Under-19, U20 and U21 level, with his debut for the latter coming soon into his season-long loan at Kenilworth Road, keeping a clean sheet in October's 5-0 win over Bosnia & Herzegovina.

In June Walton joined Luton Town on a season-long loan, linking back up with Nathan Jones who was first-team coach for his first three years at Brighton



Scott Cuthbert



Defender

Capable of playing at either centre-half or right-back, Cuthbert signed for the Hatters last summer having spent two years at Leyton Orient.

He helped the O's reach the League One play-off final the season before last, and prior to that his influential performances enabled Swindon to do the same.

He has been capped at B level for Scotland and, like Stephen O'Donnell, also came through the youth ranks at Celtic. Made 40 appearances in his first season at Kenilworth Road, and took over the captaincy when Steve McNulty left for Tranmere last October.

Cuthbert was captain of the Scotland under-19 team that reached the final of the UEFA under-19 Championships in 2006 and the Scotland under-20 team that played at 2007 Under-20 World Cup in Canada. He also represented Scotland B in May 2009



Cameron McGeehan



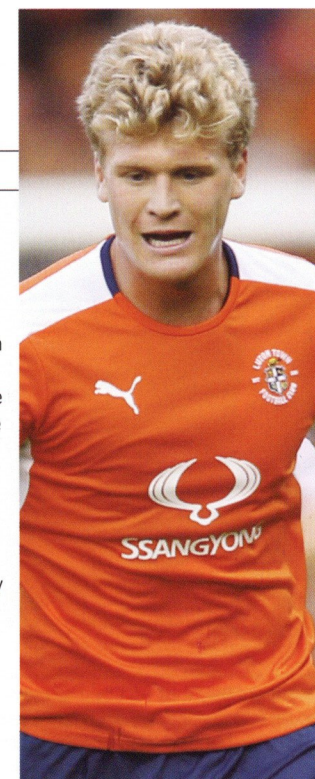
Midfielder

The Hatters were finally able to lure McGeehan to Kenilworth Road on a permanent contract last summer after he previously enjoyed two spells on-loan from Norwich City.

In the first, the central midfielder played a key role in the Conference title campaign of 2013-14, before rejoining again during our first season back in League Two after being on loan at Cambridge United, where he was part of the U's team that held Manchester United to a 0-0 draw in the FA Cup.

In his first permanent campaign with the Hatters, McGeehan netted 13 times to finish second top scorer behind Jack Marriott. The 21-year-old originally came through the ranks at Fulham and Chelsea and has caps for Northern Ireland at Under-17, 19 and 21 level.

He was the captain of Norwich's 2012–13 FA Youth Cup winning team, scoring in both legs of the final against Chelsea.



Danny Hylton

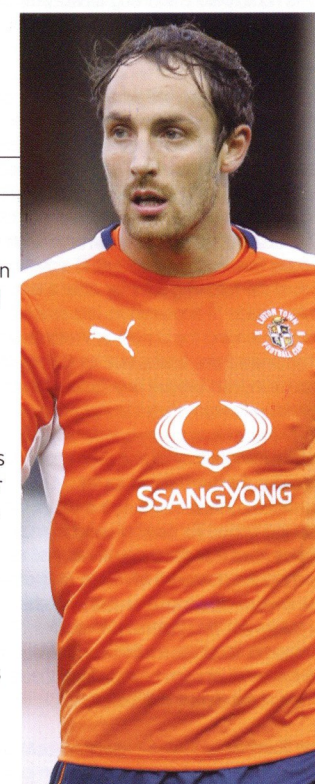


Forward

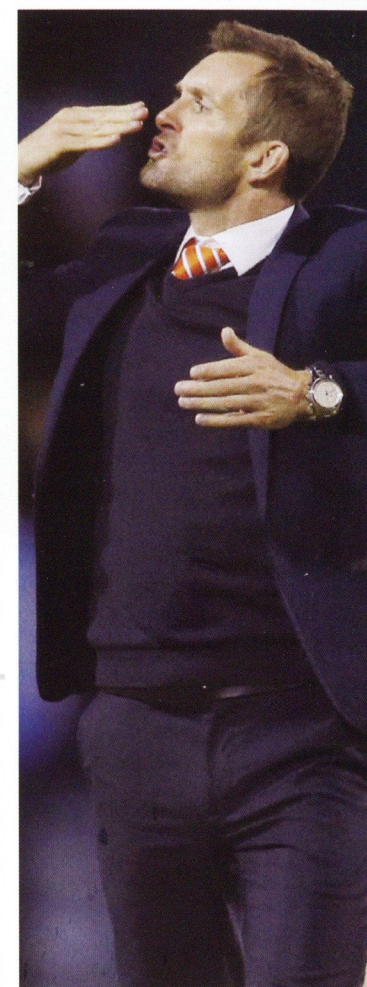
London-born forward who joined the Town this summer alongside Oxford United team-mate Johnny Mullins, after the pair had helped the U's to promotion to League One and the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final last season.

Hylton started his career with Aldershot Town when he was signed by Terry Brown as a 16-year-old, and made over 200 appearances in the Conference and League Two. During the 2007–08 season, Hylton was part of the team which won the Conference Premier League title and the Conference League Cup before joining Rotherham United in 2013.

He played just one game for the then-League One club, however, and was loaned out to Bury and AFC Wimbledon prior to his move to Oxford two years ago. While at the Kassam Stadium Hylton hit 30 goals in 84 starts, but turned down the offer of a new contract in order to pen a two-year deal at Kenilworth Road.



TheManager Nathan Jones



Welshman Jones was appointed as John Still's successor in January 2016. A former coach and assistant-manager at Brighton & Hove Albion, Charlton Athletic and Yeovil Town, he was a player at Kenilworth Road in 1995 but left without making an appearance.

Jones spent a year in Spain before returning to the UK and playing for Southend, Brighton and Yeovil, making over 500 appearances.

The 43-year-old began his coaching qualifications while still a player with Yeovil, initially coaching the Ladies team, and achieved his UEFA Pro-Licence in 2014.

Luton Town



Jonathan Smith

With a never-say-die attitude and exhaustive work-rate, former Forest Green Rovers midfielder Smith has become a firm favourite with Town fans since his arrival from York City in 2011 and is now the longest serving senior member of the squad.

Part of the team that won the Conference title in 2013-14, the Preston-born player – who began his career at Morecambe and won League Two with Swindon – fought back from a broken leg sustained on Boxing Day 2013 and has now made over 150 appearances for the club.

Smith signed a three-year contract last summer after being voted the Hatters' player of the year by his team-mates for the 2014-15 campaign.

GOALKEEPER

Craig King

Teenage stopper King signed his first professional contract last summer having impressed with his performances in the youth and reserve teams during 2014-15. With Mark Tyler injured, King deputised on the substitutes' bench in a number of Football League matches that year, and to aid his development, the young keeper was sent on loan to Ryman Premier side Met Police last season. He made 23 appearances between August and mid-January before returning to Kenilworth Road to feature in the matchday squad several times, with a one-year option on his Hatters deal being exercised by the Town in May.

DEFENDERS

Stephen O'Donnell

The 24-year-old arrived at Kenilworth Road in the summer of 2015 from Partick Thistle, who he'd helped win promotion to the Scottish Premiership and reach the final of the Scottish Challenge Cup during 2012-13, earning himself a place in the PFA Scotland First Division Team of the Year. O'Donnell started his career as a youngster at Celtic and has also played for the Scotland Under-21s, earning a fine reputation as a marauding right-back with a real eye for goal. Made 33 appearances – all of them starts – in his debut campaign with the Hatters.

Dan Potts

Another new face at Kenilworth Road last summer, Potts is also a full-back but operates on the left-hand flank. The 22-year-old joined the Hatters from West Ham United, where he made 13 appearances after being handed his debut in a Championship win over Barnsley in

December 2011. Whilst with the Hammers he also represented the USA at Under-20 level in 2011, before being selected for England Under-18, 19 and 20s. Potts gained valuable Football League experience on loan at Colchester and Portsmouth before agreeing a two-year deal with the Town. Appeared 15 times last term.

Johnny Mullins

Experienced centre-half who started out at Reading, but left in 2006 without adding to the 50 appearances he'd made during two lengthy loans with Kidderminster. Mullins then spent two years at both Mansfield and Stockport before joining Rotherham in the summer of 2010. He helped the Millers win promotion to League One in 2012-13, but left to sign for Oxford the following summer after a loan spell. Mullins made 51 appearances last season, including leading the U's out at Wembley in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final, as Oxford sealed promotion from League Two, before joining the Hatters with team-mate Danny Hylton.

Frankie Musonda

Defender. Centre-half and captain of last season's hugely successful youth team that won the Under-18s' Football League Youth Alliance league and cup double, as well as reaching the quarter-finals of the FA Youth Cup. The 18-year-old penned his first professional contract with the Hatters in November 2015, making his debut as a substitute at Mansfield the following January, having joined the club's centre of excellence in 2006.

Alan Sheehan

Defender. Cultured defender Sheehan joined the Hatters on loan from Bradford City last

January, becoming Nathan Jones' first signing after taking over as manager. The deal was made permanent in the summer of 2016. The Irishman made 20 appearances and captained the team for the final seven matches after Scott Cuthbert suffered a season-ending injury at Stevenage in early April. The left-footer can operate at either full-back or in central defence, and has made over 300 appearances in his career so far with the majority coming during two spells with Notts County. Sheehan also counts Leeds United and Swindon Town among his former employers, as well as loans with Mansfield, Crewe, Oldham and Peterborough United, after starting out at Leicester City.

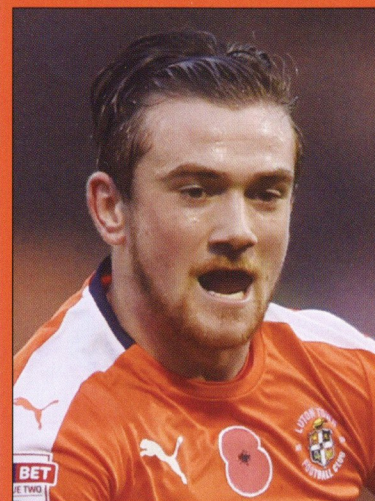
MIDFIELDERS

Jake Gray

Midfielder. Attacking midfielder who became the Town's eight summer signing when he joined on a two-year contract from Premier League club Crystal Palace on 1st August. The Eagles had signed him from Wycombe Wanderers in 2012 when the Chairboys closed their academy. Gray made his Palace debut in a League Cup tie against Walsall in 2014 and then gained League experience on loan at Cheltenham, where he made his debut against the Hatters in January 2015, and Hartlepool United. The Aylesbury-born player scored six times in 30 starts and three sub appearances for the League Two club last season.

Danny Green

Right-sided attacking midfielder Green signed for the Hatters last summer and scored six times in 28 appearances before suffering a broken leg at Northampton in the penultimate game of his first season. Former Hatters boss



Jack Marriott

Talented young forward who moved to Kenilworth Road last summer after spending six years at Ipswich Town, where he came through the academy. Marriott played twice for Ipswich in the Football League, but gained experience on loan at Colchester, Gillingham and Carlisle, as well as in three spells at Conference club Woking, where he impressed in matches against the Hatters.

After a bright start to his Luton career, Marriott signed a two-year contract extension before August was out and his goalscoring form continued throughout 2015-16, with 16 in 25 starts in all competitions earning him our supporters' player of the year award. Rewarded with a new three-year deal in late July.

John Still had originally plucked Green from Non-League club Bishop's Cleeve while at Dagenham & Redbridge, and the winger went onto help the Daggers win the League Two play-offs in 2010. After 27 goals for the east Londoners, he moved to Charlton Athletic, where he won promotion from League One to the Championship. Joined the Hatters after a season with MK Dons.

Alex Gilliead

The England Under-20 international joined the Hatters on the last day of the summer transfer window from Newcastle United on loan until January 2017. Known for his dribbling and trickery, 20-year-old Gilliead had a successful season-long loan at Carlisle United last season, where he made 41 appearances, scoring five goals. One of those came against the Hatters when he came off the bench to help his side come from two goals down to a 4-3 victory.

Glen Rea

Highly-rated Republic of Ireland Under-21 international who can operate as a holding midfielder or centre-half. Rea joined the Hatters on loan from Championship club Brighton & Hove Albion last March, making ten appearances, and signed permanently in June. The Sussex-born player had made his debut for Albion last August in the Capital One Cup against Southend, who he went on to join on loan for a three-month spell before his temporary stint at Kenilworth Road. Opted to rejoin the Hatters in June and be reunited with Nathan Jones, who he worked under at Brighton, ahead of interest from the Shrimpers.

Pelly Ruddock Mpanzu

Former West Ham United academy graduate Ruddock Mpanzu is hoping to stay fighting fit for 2015-16 after an injury-disrupted couple of years. The direct, pacey youngster was an instant hit when signed on-loan by then-boss John Still from

the Hammers midway through the Conference title winning campaign of 2013-14, scoring a memorable goal in a crucial come-from-behind win at Dartford. Versatile to play in central defence, midfield or on the wing, Pelly is a real crowd favourite and will be hoping to build on the run of games he put together towards the end of last season.

Olly Lee

Central midfielder Lee joined the club on an initial short-term deal in August 2015. The brother of ex-Hatters loanee Elliot Lee, Olly started on the books of West Ham. He had two loan spells at Dagenham & Redbridge under former Hatters boss John Still, who brought him to Kenilworth Road, and one at Gillingham before signing for Barnet for 2012-13. He joined Birmingham City before the season was out, but was released by the Championship side in 2015 after a spell on loan in League Two with Plymouth. Made 37 appearances in his first campaign with the Town.

FORWARDS

Jordan Cook

Forward. Former Sunderland youngster Cook flew out to Hungary to join the Hatters squad at their pre-season training camp, where he penned a two-year contract having turned down the offer of a new deal at Walsall. The 26-year-old began his career in the Premier League, making his Black Cats debut as a substitute against Manchester United on Boxing Day 2010. He gained experience on loan at Darlington, Walsall and Carlisle, before heading south to sign for Charlton Athletic in 2012. Cook first worked with Town boss Nathan Jones at The Valley, and after spending two years at Walsall in League One, he jumped at the chance to be reunited with his old Addicks coach this summer.

Craig Mackail-Smith

Striker. Prolific goalscorer Mackail-Smith put pen to paper at Kenilworth Road a week before the

start of last season. Having started his career in Non-League with St Albans City and Arlesley Town, he came to prominence at Dagenham in 2006-07 before a move to Peterborough. He scored 99 goals in 212 games for Posh, twice helping them win promotion. A big money move to Brighton followed in 2011 and he scored 10 goals in his debut season at the Amex and 11 in the next before two injury-affected campaigns. Made 34 appearances in his first season with the Town.

Zane Banton

Striker. Another Town academy graduate, 20-year-old forward Banton first came onto the scene during the Hatters' Conference title-winning campaign, making his first team bow in a 4-0 win at Woking. He was soon snapped up on a professional contract and continued to impress in his appearances in the FA Trophy. Spent time out on loan with Biggleswade Town and Hemel Hempstead to further his footballing education and has nine senior Town appearances to his name going into 2016-17.

Isaac Vassell

Former Plymouth Argyle forward who became manager Nathan Jones' seventh signing of the close season when he penned a one-year deal at the end of a successful fortnight on trial in July. The 22-year-old is a cousin of former England international Darius Vassell, and for the past two seasons has combined life working on a building site with playing part-time for Truro City following his release by the Pilgrims in 2014. Vassell helped his hometown club win promotion from the Southern Premier Division and then qualify for the National League South play-offs in his two years at Treyew Road.

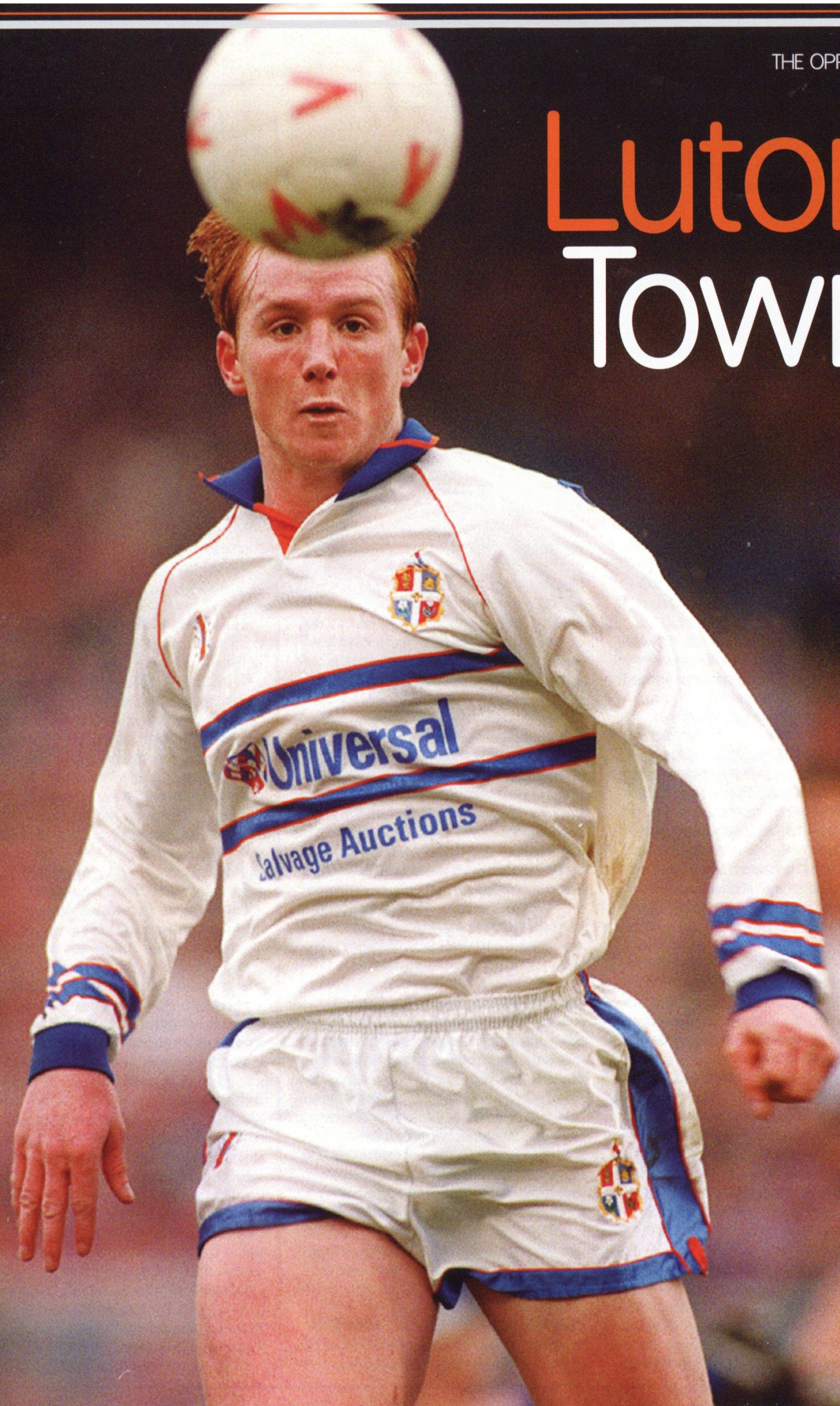
Jack Senior

A summer transfer deadline day signing from Huddersfield Town, left-back Senior won the Professional Development League 2 Championship in the 2015/16 season with his former side. The 19-year-old left the Terriers after a nine-year association with the club, signing for the Hatters on a two-year-deal. He made his first career professional appearance for the Hatters against West Bromwich Albion in the Checkatrade Trophy in October 2016.

Josh McQuoid

Attacker. Josh arrived at Kenilworth Road last summer having spent the previous three years at Premier League-bound Bournemouth. That was the forward's second spell at the Dean Court club either side of a spell at Millwall. During his time at the New Den, McQuoid was capped at international level by Northern Ireland. Capable of playing on the flanks or in a central role he has also spent time on loan in League One with Peterborough and Coventry during 2014-15. The 26-year-old hit five goals in 33 appearances in his first season with the Town.

Football historian **LEIGH EDWARDS** profiles ten big-name Luton Town players not usually associated with the club

RON DAVIES

Noted for his aerial ability, Welsh international striker Ron Davies was capped 29 times after leaving Luton Town. Signing professional for Chester in July 1959, he was twice leading marksman, moving to Luton in October 1962. He was top scorer in 1962-63, netting 21 goals in 32 League games before joining Norwich City in September 1963. Moving to Southampton in August 1966, he topped their goalscoring charts three times before joining Portsmouth in April 1973. Later with Manchester United, Arcadia Shepherds, LA Aztecs, Tulsa Roughnecks and Seattle Sounders, he coached in the United States and died in May 2013.

DEREK KEVAN

Inside-left Derek Kevan was capped 14 times by England before joining Luton Town initially with Ripon YMCA, he joined Bradford Park Avenue in October 1952 and followed Vic Buckingham to West Brom in July 1953. 'The Tank' was twice ever-present and top scorer on five occasions, moving to Chelsea in March 1963. Later with Manchester City, Crystal Palace and Peterborough, he joined Luton in December 1966 and netted four goals in 11 League games. He moved to Stockport in March 1967, then Macclesfield, Boston United and Stourbridge. Later a driver for Signs Specialists in Hockley, he died in January 2013.

ALAN BIRCHENALL

Former England U-23 midfielder Alan Birchenall briefly appeared for Luton Town in 1978-79. Signing professional for Sheffield United in June 1963, he joined Chelsea for £100,000 in November 1967 and moved via Crystal Palace to Leicester City in September 1971. He featured in their 1973-74 FA Cup run, then played for Notts County, San Jose Earthquakes, Memphis Rogues and Blackburn Rovers before joining Luton in March 1979. Making ten League appearances, he moved to Hereford United in October 1979, then had a spell as Trowbridge Town's player-boss, becoming Leicester's public relations officer.

COLIN TODD

Ex-England international central defender Colin Todd appeared for Luton Town in 1984-85. Initially with Sunderland, he moved to Derby County in February 1971, starring as they won the League

Championship in 1971-72 and 1974-75, when PFA Player of the Year. He joined Everton in September 1978, then played for Birmingham City and Nottingham Forest. Reuniting with Jim Smith at Oxford United in February 1984, he helped clinch the Third Division title and moved to Luton in October 1984, playing two League games. He later managed Middlesbrough, Bolton, Swindon, Derby County, Bradford City, Randers and Esbjerg.

STEVE WILLIAMS

Former England international midfielder Steve Williams was capped six times before joining Luton Town. Signing professional for Southampton in July 1976, he starred as they won promotion in 1977-78, were League Cup finalists in 1979 and League Championship runners-up in 1983-84. He joined Arsenal for £525,000 in December 1984 and featured in their 1987 League Cup final triumph, moving to Luton for £300,000 in July 1988. Scoring once in 40 League games, he reunited with Alan Ball at Exeter City in August 1991. He has worked in magazine publishing and property development, settling in Ottery St Mary.

MERVYN DAY

Luton Town's former loan goalkeeper Mervyn Day starred in West Ham's 1975 FA Cup final success. The England U-23 international was twice ever-present for the Hammers and played in the 1976 ECWC final, moving to Orient in July 1979. He was ever-present three times prior to joining Aston Villa in May 1983, then joined Leeds United in February 1985 and helped win the Second Division title in 1989-90. Loaned to Luton in March 1992, he made four League appearances. Joining Carlisle United in July 1993, he became their manager, then assisted Alan Curbishley at Charlton and West Ham, returning to Leeds as chief scout.

JOHN HARTSON

Welsh international striker John Hartson helped Luton Town reach the FA Cup semi-finals in 1993-94. Signing professional for Luton in December 1992, he netted 11 goals in 54 League games before sold to Arsenal for £2,500,000 in January 1995. He scored in the 1995 ECWC final, moving to West Ham for £3,200,000 in February 1997. Leading marksman in 1997-98, he joined Wimbledon for £7,000,000 in January 1999 and had a spell with

Coventry City prior to joining Celtic in August 2001. He starred in their 2001-02 'treble' triumph and joined West Brom for £500,000 in July 2006, gaining a total of 51 caps.

PAUL DICKOV

Luton Town's former loan striker Paul Dickov was capped times by Scotland. Signing professional for Arsenal in December 1990, he was loaned to Luton in October 1993 and scored once in 15 League games. A member of the Gunners' triumphant 1994 ECWC squad, he moved to Manchester City for £1,000,000 in August 1996. Starring in three promotion campaigns, he joined Leicester City in February 2002 and was leading scorer in their 2002-03 promotion success. He then appeared for Blackburn Rovers, Manchester City again, Leicester again and Leeds United, since managing Oldham Athletic and Doncaster Rovers.

PAUL ALLEN

Former England U-21 midfielder Paul Allen had a loan spell at Luton Town in 1994-95. From a notable football family, he signed professional for West Ham in July 1979 and was the youngest FA Cup finalist at 17 years 256 days in their 1980 Wembley triumph. He moved to Tottenham Hotspur for £400,000 in June 1985 and was an FA Cup winner again in 1991. Joining Southampton for £500,000 in September 1993, he was loaned to Luton in December 1994 and made four League appearances. He moved to Swindon Town in October 1995. He later played for Bristol City, Millwall and Purfleet and currently works for the PFA.

MATTHEW UPSON

Former Luton Town central defender Matthew Upson gained 21 England caps. Signing professional for Luton Town in April 1996, he made his only League appearance for the Hatters as a substitute in their 1-0 win over Rotherham four months later and joined Arsenal for £1,000,000 in May 1997. He featured in their 1997-98 Premier League title campaign and was a member of the 2001-02 'double' winning squad. Loaned to several clubs, he moved to Birmingham City for £2,000,000 in January 2003, then joined West Ham for £6,000,000 in January 2007. He has since played for Stoke City, Brighton, Leicester City and MK Dons.

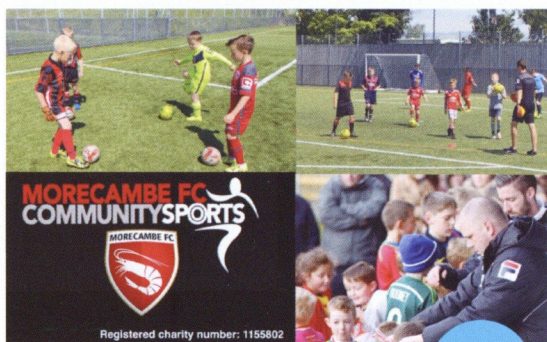

Luton just about shade things so far with three victories to Morecambe's two with two of those wins coming last season when the Hatters did the double over the Shrimps.

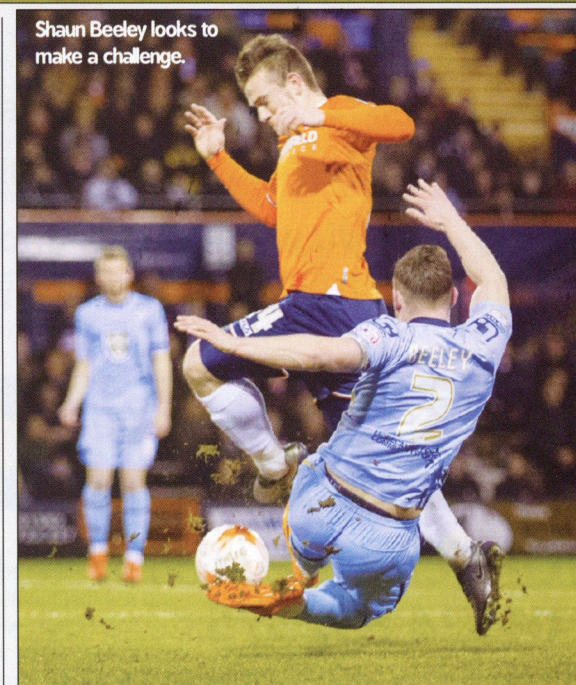

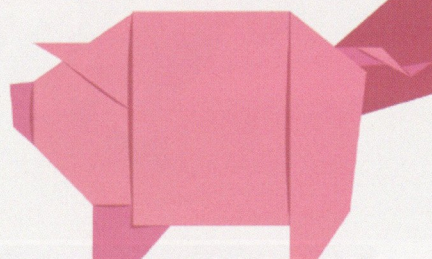

ALAN GOODALL

As you will see elsewhere in the programme Eric Morecambe is without doubt the greatest link between the two sides.

On the field there are not too many who have played for both sides with Alan Goodall the most recent. Born in Birkenhead Goodall joined League of Wales club Bangor City in the summer of 2001. In his first season at the Farrar Road club, he played in the Welsh Cup final picking up a runners-up medal in the defeat against Barry Town at Park Avenue, Aberystwyth.

He was part of the team that lost narrowly in the 2002–03 UEFA Cup against FK Sartid and 2003–04 UEFA Intertoto Cup losing to Gloria Bistria. In 91 League of Wales appearances for City, Goodall scored 10 goals. Towards the end of the 2003–04 season, he spent time on trial at Wrexham A.F.C., before joining Rochdale in the summer of 2004.

At the end of the 2005–06 season, Goodall's second at Spotland, he had made 74 League Two appearances scoring five times and from there he signed for recently relegated League One side Luton Town in June 2007 on a two-year contract. He then scored on his debut in a 2–1 victory over Hartlepool United.

Goodall signed for Chesterfield on a two-year contract in August 2008 following his release from Luton Town. He scored his first goal for the club on 6 September 2008, with a 94th-minute winner against Rotherham United at Saltergate. On 31 July 2010 he rejoined Rochdale on a six-month contract.

On 4 November 2010 he joined Blue Square Bet Premier side Newport County on loan and returned to Rochdale in January 2011. On 31 January 2011 he



joined League 2 side Stockport County making his debut for the club on 5 February against Torquay United.

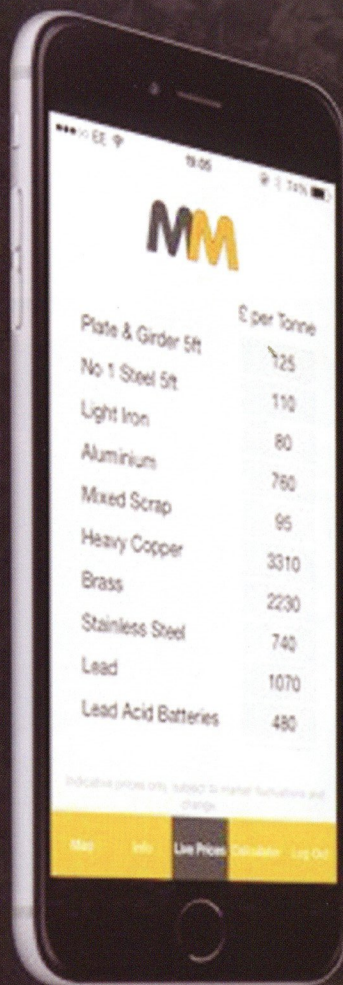
In May 2011 he was informed that he would not be offered a contract by the club for the 2011/12 season. In Summer 2011 he joined Fleetwood Town and helped them to win promotion to League One but on 15 July 2014 he signed for Morecambe F.C. on a free transfer due to his release from Fleetwood Town F.C.

After two seasons with the Shrimps he was released in the summer and joined Altrincham.

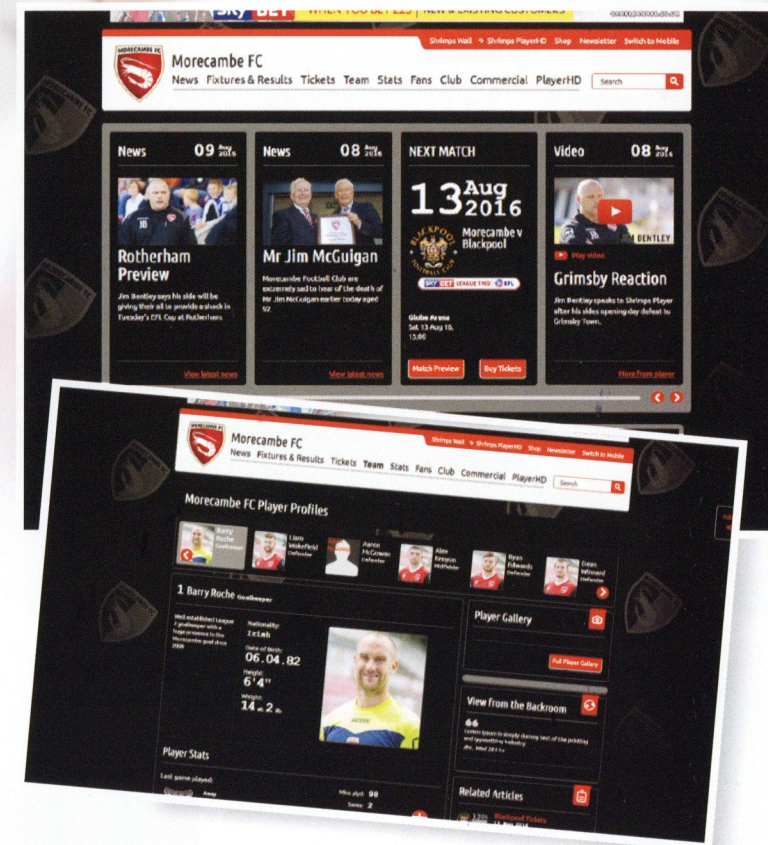
**TODAY is another game against one of

northern!!

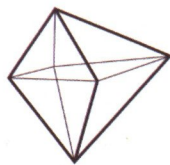
Finally, farewell to Tom Barkhuizen,

commentary.

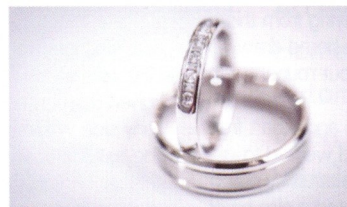
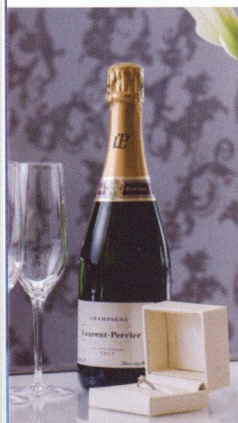

Morecambe looked a threat down both wings in the early stages and they took the lead after just seven minutes when a 60 yard pass out of central defence found the outstanding Steven Yawson who controlled the ball and knocked it past the Hyde right back in one movement before outpacing him and cutting onto his right foot inside the box, firing an unstoppable shot past Joe Hardcastle in the Hyde goal.

This sparked Hyde into action with Niall Maher making a good save from Hyde captain Sam Leadbetter and an even better block from Spencer Jenkinson when he looked sure to score.

Hyde had been unlucky to still be a goal down, but this changed on 23 minutes when the referee awarded a penalty for a push in

the box allowing Lewis Haydock to step up and score his 6th goal in the competition.

The remaining 20 minutes of the game were competitive with no more goals.

The second period saw Morecambe fly out the blocks, going more direct and playing to their strengths using the pace down the flanks.

The second goal came from another 60 yard diagonal out of defence to Yawson, who knocked it past the Hyde defence and cut into the left hand edge of the box firing a low cross to the back post for Luke Jordan to run onto and side foot home from 5 yards.

Yawson then added a superb third on 57 minutes when he collected the ball 40 yards out, before beating his man and firing a fantastic right foot shot into the top corner of the Hyde goal from the edge of the box.

On 70 Minutes Morecambe wrapped up the scoring and the game with Olly Box scoring their fourth to seal a second round derby clash with Accrington Stanley.

DEREK QUINN TALKS TO THE POPULAR MIDFIELDER ABOUT HIS CURRENT INJURY AND HIS HOPES FOR THE REST OF THE SEASON

**How frustrating has it been for you to be out of action?**

It's been very frustrating I must admit. I hate being injured and I've had a pretty decent record injury-wise to be honest and I'm glad because I hate missing any game, no matter how many I've missed now.

I've gone to most games home and away because I just want to be in and around the lads. I wouldn't know what to do if I was sat at home and not involved in any way.

I actually think that would stress me more than the injury itself. At this moment in time I am the only one injured so if I hadn't have travelled with the lads to Wycombe last week I would have been the only one not involved in any way and that would have killed me. I want to be in and around the lads and having a laugh with anyone.

What was the injury and where are you now in terms of coming back?

I injured my medial knee ligament against Stoke. I was initially told it would be 12 weeks with the injury that I had so I was gearing up for a return then. I had a brace on for five weeks but that came off last week and I did some running last Friday and Saturday and everything felt OK to be honest which was brilliant.

I saw the specialist on Monday this week and he has said it is strong and given me the all clear to do some more running in straight lines so I did that before the game at Coventry in midweek so there is definitely some progress.

I said to the gaffer a few weeks ago that I wanted to be back for the game at Newport away but Fanny (Simon Farnworth) thinks that because of the way I have recovered I might even now be looking at the Checktrade Trophy game at Scunthorpe which would be fantastic although the Newport one is the most realistic.

You are not a player who seems to have had many injuries in your career are you?

No I haven't to be honest and that is why this has been all the more frustrating. I've had little knocks here and there like everyone else but nothing major and I've always wanted to play even with those knocks. Today will be the seventh game

that I have missed and I have never had to go through that before and it's horrible.

How do you think the lads have done while you have been out?

I think they have done OK to be honest. We were all disappointed to lose at Coventry on Tuesday but the only game where I think we have struggled a bit was at Wycombe last week. It was one of those games that became a bit of a battle — one of the sort of games I love to be honest — and the match just didn't get going.

Having said that we were denied a clear penalty for handball. I was right in line with it and it was well in the box and if that had been given things may have been very different. The last two games have really impressed me though and we have to take some heart from those. We played some great stuff against Coventry and should have won the game and I thought we were excellent against Bradford as well and deserved the win.

We have to now look to continue that home form and get a win at home because we need one. It won't be easy as Luton are a top team in this league but I have been here long enough now to realise that we often get great results against the top teams and that will be the aim today.

We all know the recent issues about wages. How did the players respond to that?

It was stressful I must admit but the reaction from the lads was brilliant. We all stuck together and we all dug in deep and we all helped each other out and that is why we have a great team spirit. I have been here for four years now and team spirit is something we have always had in abundance and that has really helped us.

What are your aims now?

The first goal obviously is to get fully fit and be able to fight for my place again. I know it won't be easy because we have a lot of competition for places in midfield and some good players who have all been doing well. It will be tough to get back in but the sooner I can get back training and playing again the sooner I can stake a claim to get back in the side.

The two games and the Gary Neville night made it a hectic few days but again everyone pulled together and provided their usual superb service. It is not the first time the club has faced problems financially.

I remember when I was putting together the Light at the End of the Tunnel book when some of the players told me about their threat

to not play against Rotherham in an FA Cup replay in the 1970s. After a Christie Park draw the team was on the way to the game but forced the coach to stop at Hartshead Moor service station to say they wouldn't play unless they got their bonus. Apparently there was a bit of a stand off between players and directors before common sense prevailed and they went on to play, only of course to lose the game at Milmoor.

Another really worrying time was when Don Cubbage was manager and he told me about how he used to go round town with people like Ken Ormrod with bucket collections on Friday nights just to raise any money they could to save

the club which fell on really hard times. The efforts that people like Ken put in over the years, and no doubt people before him as well show that the club will always survive because there will always be people who will do all they can to make sure it does survive.

I never forget the time we moved to the Globe that one of the first things myself and Rod Taylor spoke about was how we must not forget people like Ken for what they did to keep the club alive in bad times. Without their efforts years ago there may not even be a club so when times are bad, as they have been over the past couple of weeks, take a quick look in the mirror and make sure you are someone who, like Ken, can take pride in that you always did your best to follow the club when it needed you most.

WALKING FOOTBALL

Football Foundation

A slower version of the beautiful game You may have seen the Barclays bank advert about walking football and are now wondering how to get involved or you may want more information about this new game.

Walking football has become increasingly popular. It's exactly what it sounds like a standard game of football where players walk instead of run.

It's designed to help people get fit or maintain an active lifestyle no matter

what their age and fitness maybe, as well as offering support to help people get back into football if they have given it up due to age, injury or medical reasons.

Participants of the new game have seen many benefits: lower heart rate and blood pressure, less fat and muscle increase and improved mobility.

It's not just health benefits that walking football offers also there is the social element. Participants can meet new people, avoid becoming isolated, and interact with individuals and small groups.

The love the game brings people together and it's one sporting activity that is suitable for all.

Rules of Walking Football

- The game is for over 50's (If you are younger and have an injury or health condition stopping you from playing football you can enquire about joining a walking football session)
- Teams can include male and female players.
- No running with or without the ball. A direct free kick is awarded to the opposite team if caught running.
- Each team is allowed one "TIME OUT" per half, which lasts one minute. The game is then restarted with an indirect free kick.
- Players are restricted from entering the goalkeeper's area.
- Players can not shoot in the goalkeeper's area.



In the Community



- Kick-ins are used rather than throw-ins.
- The ball is not allowed to go above head height.
- Every third player who is caught running will be sin binned for 2 minutes.
- If a player is shown a blue card for breaking a rule they will be sin binned for 2 minutes.
- Goalkeepers can throw or kick at any time but only from inside their box.

GET PREPARED FOR PANNA

The Community Sports team have started a new football session PANNA! Panna is a one v one or two v two game developed in Holland.

A time limited game where you face up against your opponent to try to outscore him either by going for goal or by giving him a panna (nutmeg). A panna automatically wins the game.

Game are usually timed for 2-3 minutes or the first to panna or score two goals. Keeping the ball is key and players tend to show an array of skills whilst playing. Futsal is an exciting, fast paced small sided football game.

The nature of the game places a large emphasis on technical skill and ability in situations of high pressure. Futsal links in well with Panna as it encourages a high

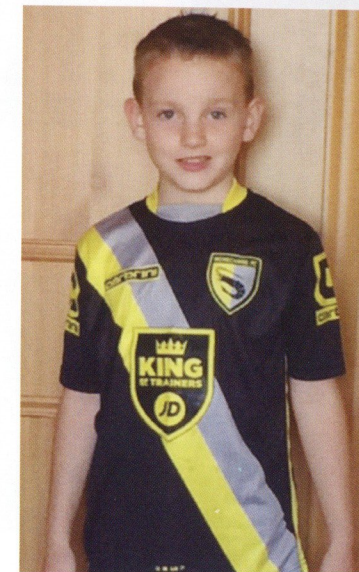


level of ball mastery to enable possession in tight spaces.

The sessions currently take place on Mondays at Lancaster & Morecambe College 6-7pm. At the sessions there is continuous Panna games inter linked with Futsal which is key to develop ball manipulation in one v one situations this helps players to learn how to control the ball using different ground moves.

The Community Sports team have put together some basic ground move tutorial videos that we believe are going to open up a whole new range of skill sets which include: using the players' weaker foot, balance, co-ordinator, quick decisions making and brain training. Moments later and a fine counter-attack led by Tom Barkhuizen ended with Burge out quickly to block Cole Stockton's shot for a corner. That corner, taken by Michael Rose, struck the woodwork with Barkhuizen's follow-up cleared off the line. Wildig also curled an effort over the visitors' bar as little was seen of City as an attacking threat in the opening 45 minutes.

SECOND HALF

City started the second half on top. Marvin Sordell's shot was deflected behind for a corner from which Jordan Turnbull's header was smuggled away. Sordell also struck the crossbar and McBean's header was easily gathered by Barry Roche, all within the opening dozen minutes of the restart. At the other end and Burge kept out Wildig's shot with Stockton unable to turn home the rebound before the deadlock was broken. Stockton headed a corner across goal and Winnard stole in at the far post to convert from a couple of yards.

Roche used his feet to deny Coventry's Andre Wright but was powerless to deny Sterry on 72 minutes when the full-back cut in from the left-hand side before curling an effort across the keeper and in off the post. Morecambe could have secured victory soon afterwards but Burge kept out Stockton's effort and Barkhuizen somehow headed wide from close range. The Shrimps ended the game on top and forced a series of corners but could not breach the visiting defence for a second time.

FIRST HALF

Morecambe started well and were the first to have an effort at goal with Lee Molyneux's early sighter pushed behind by City keeper Rouven Sattelmair. A more routine save from Fleming followed and Stockton headed off target as Morecambe had the clearer of the first-half opportunities.

Mullin and Stockton both tested the City keeper but Bradford set a few hearts fluttering seven minutes from time when Vuckic bent a free kick past Nizic. Despite four minutes of added times the Shrimps held out for a hard-fought victory.

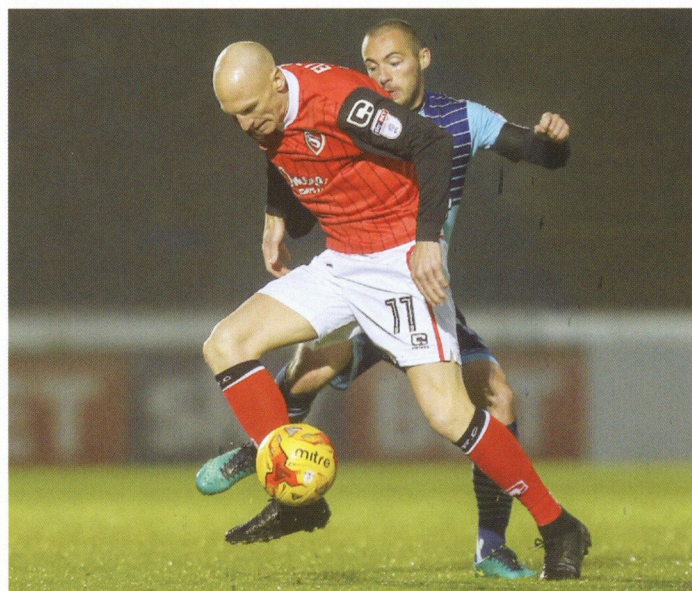

FIRST HALF

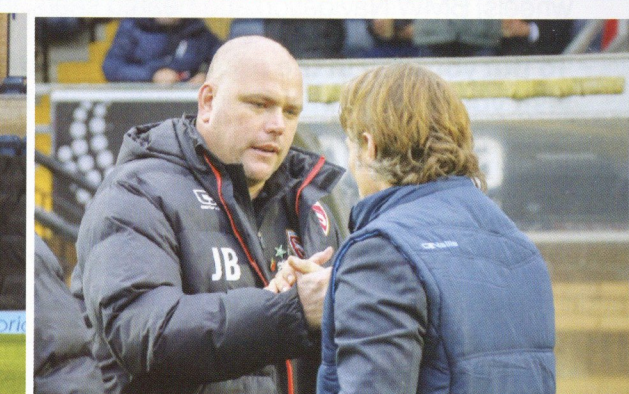
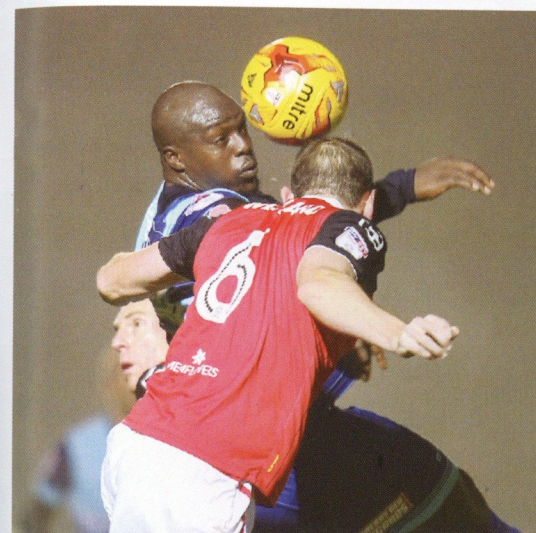

My guess would be that he might have visited Morecambe and eaten some shrimps, looked at his statue and had a pint with his cousin "Wiggy" Threlfall at his old local, The New Inn in Poulton Square. Coming from lovely Morecambe which still retains its magic, was it any wonder that this naturally gifted funny man would one day make his mark publicly and end up setting a record viewing figure of 28 million people along with his comedy partner, Ernie Wise? Eric was a comic genius, still is. Voted comic of the century. He has never been bettered and never will be.

I can remember the excitement on hearing the familiar "Bring Me Sunshine" theme, knowing that Eric would be walking on. It's only when researching about his life that I appreciated how much hard work went into him getting where he was.

There wasn't any X Factor back then, you didn't become famous overnight. It was hard graft to make yourself known, more so when you were a northern comic. They reached the top of the ladder and couldn't have gone any higher and that has to be admired.

Don't just take my word for how great a comic he was. The ultimate accolade was surely the statue of Eric first of all being erected in his memory and secondly and more spectacularly being unveiled by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth

II. On the eve of the statue unveiling we organised a show in tribute to Eric, and we could have sold the tickets three times over.

My thanks go to Dave for remembering an iconic figure of our time, a comic genius who left us nothing but laughter. The theme "Bring Me Sunshine" is still played at the Globe Arena, Morecambe before every football game and brings a

smile and sometimes a silent tear to the eye. I only ever met the great man once and that was coming out of a shopping mall in Florida where I greeted him with the words, "Good afternoon Mr Bartholomew, what a lovely day".

Needless to say he stopped and chatted and couldn't quite believe that we were from Morecambe. Very few people would be recognised wearing such an impenetrable disguise but we are talking about the comic genius of the century.

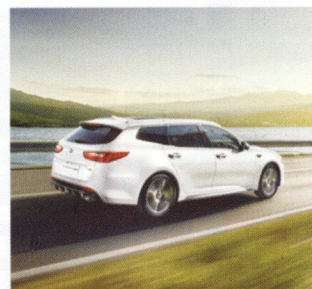

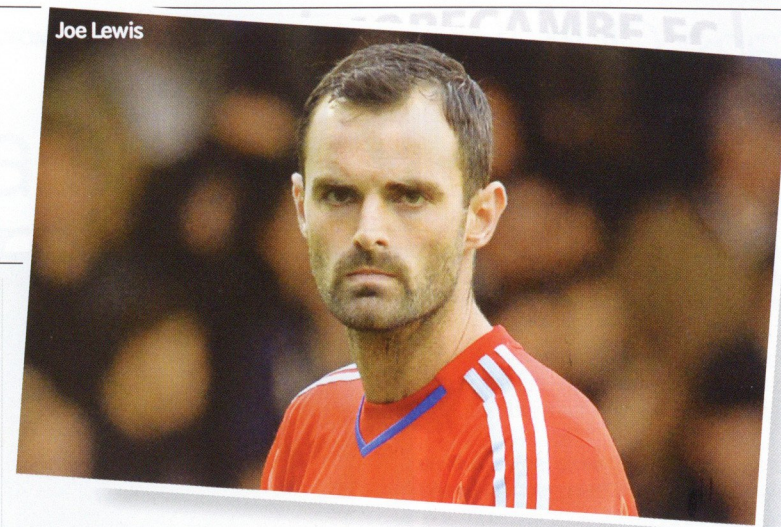

Aberdeen manager Derek McInnes believes goalkeeper Joe Lewis is a massive asset to his team in pursuit of league and cup success.

The 29-year-old former Cardiff City goalkeeper has conceded 15 goals in 20 appearances this season, keeping eight clean sheets. The Englishman produced a man-of-the-match performance against Celtic on Saturday, although he was unable to prevent the Hoops leaving Pittodrie with maximum points thanks to Tom Rogic's winner.

McInnes is delighted with the way Lewis has quickly settled to life with the Dons after his summer move to Pittodrie and said: "I have got a very good goalkeeper. I have been saying for a while how confident I am in him.

"The work he does every day with Gordon Marshall and Neil Alexander helps him be ready for big games such as Saturday when he was a bit busier than normal.

"He has a good presence and he made some good saves at the right times. "He brings an air of assurance to our defence. I was pleased with his performance against Celtic but he wasn't the only one who played well. We had several good performances but I still think we can improve."

PADRAIG AMOND

Craig Hignett admits that Padraig Amond is finding it tough to adapt to a new role in the Hartlepool United forward line.

Despite his five goals in 15 games for Pools so far this season, the Irishman, a summer signing from Grimsby Town, has come in for some criticism in recent weeks. It is not his prowess in front of goal that has been called into question, it is more to do with his seeming inability to hold the ball and relieve pressure when Pools are under the cosh.

The fact that fan favourite Billy Paynter has been twiddling his thumbs on the sidelines has not helped matters, also. But Hignett has revealed that Amond, who netted a remarkable 37 times for Grimsby last season, is having to adapt on the job.

And the gaffer says that while playing in a lone striking role has been hard for the 28-year-old, he has been impressed by Amond's contribution. "It is tough for him as he is playing a new role," said Hignett. "He is used to having a big man alongside him to feed off but he hasn't got that here.

"He is adapting, learning and getting better in the role.

"As a player he is too honest at times. "He chases absolutely everything and you just can't do that when you are up front on your own.

"I have been pleased with him so far. He is learning with every game. He is getting better and better."

CARL BAKER

CARL BAKER is hoping to smash the 10-goal barrier this season.

But Portsmouth's attacking midfielder admitted confidence can soon ebb on the back of missed chances.

Baker has four goals to his name this term after making his summer move from MK Dons. The 33-year-old has broken double figures in six seasons throughout his career. That included bagging 15 goals in League One in 2012-13, and 13 efforts in

2009-10 in League One and the Championship Baker has confidence he can go beyond that landmark again this term. He said: "I've set myself targets until the end of the season. It's usually private – just in case I don't reach it!

"I always like to get minimum double figures. I'm on four so far so, by my tallies, that gets me to double figures safely.

"Hopefully, I'll chip in with a few more than that. But, as I say, we have to keep going. Hopefully, we'll keep creating chances.

The challenge for the Blues is to find a ruthless nature in front of goal which has been missing of late. And Baker knows how confidence can ebb and flow so quickly in front of goal.

"It's winning games and confidence," he added.

On the flip side, if you are losing, you can't get a penalty or everything hits the woodwork. It's just the way football is. It's better to be going into games with confidence.

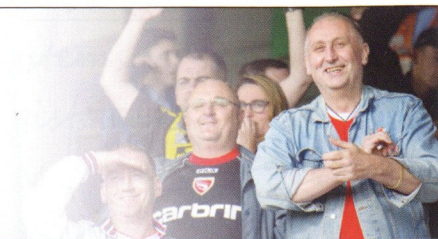
"It comes from the fans, too. If you are scoring three or four the fans expect it.

Bignot, whose ban was suspended pending an appeal, attended a personal hearing on Wednesday and had denied the charge.

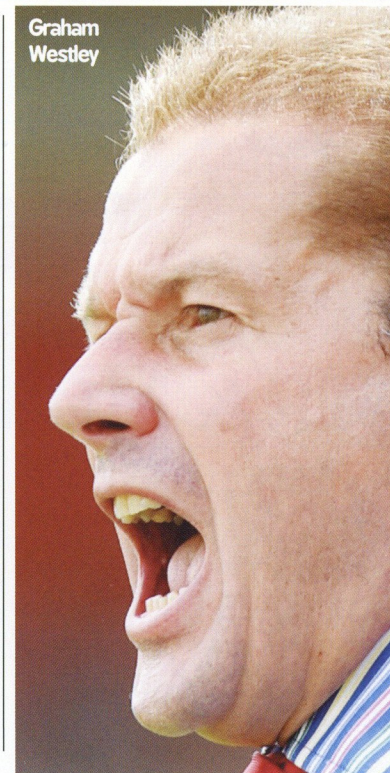
Newport's Joss Labadie was banned for six months for biting last year, when he played for fellow League Two side Dagenham and Redbridge.

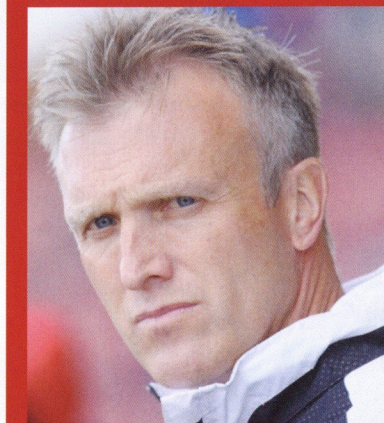
Both players made their debuts for Newport in their 2-0 EFL Trophy victory over AFC Wimbledon.

THEY MUST BE FINDING IT VERY DIFFICULT TO SAY THE LEAST, BUT ON THE PITCH JIM HAS GOT THEM GOING IN THE LAST TWO GAMES AGAINST COVENTRY AND BRADFORD, SO WE FIND OURSELVES STILL IN THE TWO CUP COMPETITIONS AND AN EXTRA TRIP TO SCUNTHORPE IN THE EFL TROPHY.

The sale of Tom Barkhuizen will no doubt be a massive loss and we are in a position now where we need some valuable points on the board.

We travelled down on Friday morning, having booked a cheap deal in Beaconsfield, 2 nights for £85. The town is in two parts – the 'old' and the 'new'. Being on the outskirts of London, it is like a different world from being up 'North' and the locals certainly know how to dress and live it up at the weekends.

There are some really nice pubs and restaurants to choose from, but you need to be prepared to book in advance. High Wycombe is just six minutes away on the train and it was noticeable how the town centre has been refurbished and anyone who

likes shopping needs to give it a visit. A nice late breakfast in the Falcon with a good choice of beers at £2.25 instead of the £4.75 near our hotel was welcomed, then a five minute taxi ride up to the Hour Glass near Adams Park, to meet up with fellow Shrimps and Sardines.

Something to note for visitors down here, is that a booked taxi has a minimum charge of £7. If you get one from the bus station it was on a meter which is cheaper.

The Landlord always gives us a welcome here and there is a pool table and TVs for entertainment. Good to see the fellow travellers from Morecambe that had been to the England v Scotland game at Wembley the night before, had come along to support Morecambe too, even if they weren't impressed with the Wembley atmosphere.

Fifteen minutes walk through the houses and the industrial estate and you will find Adams Park at the top of the hill, set in some lovely scenery where red kites usually hover around, but with the dull and dismal conditions, they were not to be seen

on this occasion. Thankfully we were behind the goal, unlike sometimes when we are down the side near the corner flag. There is plenty of room in the all seated stand and it offers a great view.

It was certainly noticeable that the home areas had a lot of empty seats, compared to seasons gone by, when they have been challenging near the top. The last post and a minute's silence, in memory of our fallen heroes, was well respected and the game got under way. The first half was a damp squib, with very few chances, Mullers had a chance saved which was our only one on target, but we were quite happy to go in at the break at 0-0

Second half we were playing towards the 70 or so travelling Shrimps. We had a massive shout for a penalty, the handball was given, but a free kick was awarded on the edge of the box. If the players were 10 yards from the ball I would have eaten my scarf! The result was we hit the post and quite honestly this was our only shot on goal I can remember.

We gained a succession of corners, but Wycombe were there to spoil it as they often do and the referee seemed happy to oblige to help them along too. The gloom surrounding the floodlights had clearly made itself known on the pitch.

A very disappointing performance all in all, but there is really no need for some of the language and songs constantly resonating from the stand – it sounds rubbish to say the least!

Back to the Hour Glass, met up with the Shap Shrimps who were staying in London, but cut their journey in half to spend a nice evening with us – a real 'never let the football spoil your day' moment. Onwards and upwards, we will certainly need to up our game for Luton and Plymouth in our next two home games. Enjoy the Eric Derby

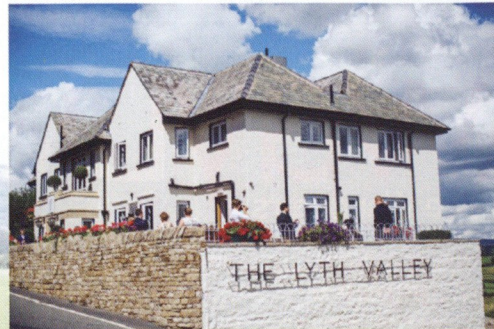

BY ROAD AND WHERE TO PARK

Leave the M6 at Junction 16 and take the A5020 towards Crewe. Follow this road right into Crewe. At the roundabout junction with the A534, Nantwich Road, turn left. Gresty Road is down past the Railway Station on the left. Just before you reach this island on Weston Road, you will see a sign pointing to the right, which displays; 'Away Supporters On Street Parking'. This directs you to an industrial estate on the right of the road (you will also see the Volkswagen dealership, L C Charles on the front of it). It takes about 15 minutes to walk to the ground from here. Otherwise at the ground behind the Main Stand is a pay and display car park which holds 560 cars and costs £3.50 for the day. Obviously this fills up quite quickly on matchdays.

THE AWAY END

Although the football ground is officially known as the Alexandra Stadium, it is more widely referred to as Gresty Road, the street which it is located on. The opening of the £6m pound Main Stand in 1999 changed forever the look and feel of the ground. Before, it had always been small and homely, but the addition of the Main Stand has drastically changed the overall scene. The stand, which sits proudly along one side of the pitch, is a single tier cantilever holding just under 7,000 people.

It looks huge compared to the other stands and is probably three times the size of the old Main Stand. It is simply designed, sits well back from the pitch and has windshields to either side. Considering that the overall capacity of the ground is just over 10,000, one can understand how the Main Stand dominates Gresty Road, accounting for 70% of the available seating. The other three stands are roughly of the same height, covered and all seated, but are rather small

when compared to the Main Stand. So much so, that balls are regularly kicked out of the ground during a game. The newest of these smaller stands is the Gresty Road End, which is the home end of the ground. This replaced a former open terrace and seats around 900. Opposite is the Wulvern Homes Stand, which was previously known as the Railway End. This has some executive boxes at the rear, but the seating area is only opened for the bigger games.

Away fans are housed in the Whitby Morrison Ice Cream Van Stand at one side of the ground. The whole of this stand is given to away supporters and houses 1,680 fans, though if required the Wulvern Homes Stand can also be allocated to away fans. Entrance to the away stand is by ticket only, (no cash is accepted at ironically some of the oldest turnstiles I have ever seen at a League Ground). Tickets need to be purchased from the ticket booth next to the supporters club at the entrance to this stand. Please also note that alcohol is not available in this stand.
