





YOUTH TEAM BEAT PRESTON IN FIVE-GOAL THRILLER

THE YOUTH TEAM WON 3-2 IN A FIERCELY CONTESTED LANCASHIRE DERBY AGAINST LOCAL RIVALS PRESTON NORTH END.



Jack Newton's header gave Ciaran Donnelly's side the lead before Michael Howard's low shot levelled things up for North End.

In the second half PNE went ahead through Kian Smart but The Seasiders mounted a comeback thanks to Rowan Roache's double, ensuring the bragging rights and all three points.

Blackpool started the game well and came close to scoring through Roache when the striker found space on the edge of the box, but his shot went just over the bar.

It was the Republic of Ireland youth international who provided the first goal early in the first-half with a great delivery from a free-kick that Newton headed into the back of the net.

Chea came close twice to doubling the lead, with his first shot going wide of the post and his second strike forcing Callum Roberts into a great save low down.

Just before the half-hour mark, Will Dunne's header was denied by an excellent fingertip save.

Chea came close to scoring once again when he beat the keeper with a shot, but it was cleared off the line by Tom Stead.

Just a few minutes later, PNE equalised through Howard's low shot. The goal rejuvenated The Lilywhites and they created a great opportunity on the stroke of half-time, but Harry Garstang's shot from close range was saved well by Jack Sims.

Preston started the second-half well and took the lead for the first time in the match after Smart headed in from Josh Earl's cross.

Despite going behind, Blackpool's heads didn't drop and they continued to press their rivals.

Roache had a turn and shot saved just before a penalty was awarded for a foul on Chea. It was Roache who stepped up to take the penalty and he kept his composure to score from 12 yards out.

Both sides pressed for a late winner but it was Blackpool who got the final say when Roache was slipped in through on goal and the striker made no mistake when one-on-one with Roberts.

INTRODUCING LUTON TOWN

Determined to make up for lost time in the English Football League, Luton Town's sights are set firmly on promotion to Sky Bet League One.

The Hatters, who ended a five-year wait to bounce back from the Conference in 2014, now want to get back to the division they were last in back in 2008.

That task has fallen to former Brighton and Hove Albion first-team coach Nathan Jones, who has made a positive impact since being appointed 18 months ago.

Jones' side currently sit fifth in the table and, like Blackpool, find themselves in the third rounds of the Emirates FA Cup and the Checkatrade Trophy, as well as the play-off positions.

On 32 points in Sky Bet League Two, The Hatters have won eight, drawn eight and

lost four of their 20 league fixtures so far – with the split of those results being equal at home and away.

Leading the way in the goalscoring stakes is former Oxford United striker Danny Hylton, who has hit 14 goals in all competitions since making a summer move to Kenilworth Road. Cameron McGeehan has also been in fine form, notching nine times from midfield.

This will be Luton's first trip to face Blackpool at Bloomfield Road for 11 years this afternoon. The Hatters recorded a 3-1 victory on their last visit.

Ironically, a Potts and a Vassell could be set to line-up for both sides in this fixture, with Dan and Isaac featuring in the Luton first-team. Neither are related to their Blackpool counterparts, though.

The Gaffer | Nathan Jones

Age: 43 | Born: Rhondda, Wales

Having learnt the trade during seven years in coaching, Nathan Jones saw January as the ideal time to try his hand in management with his former club Luton Town.

Jones has held positions as high as assistant manager at Yeovil Town and Brighton & Hove Albion, and guided Luton to a top half finish during his opening five months in charge.

As a player the defender made almost 400 combined appearances for Yeovil and Brighton, who shared his best years between 2000 and 2012.

Now he's back at the club he signed professional terms with in 1995 and has The Hatters competing in the top seven of League Two after a strong start to the season.

Home | Kenilworth Road | Opened | 1905

Luton Town moved into Kenilworth Road in 1905, replacing their former home Dunstable Road, and have used it for EFL football almost continuously since 1920.

Plans are in place to move into a new home in the future, however for now Luton remain settled at Kenilworth Road, which can fit 10,356 supporters, all of whom can be seated.

The stadium's record attendance came against Blackpool in 1959, when 30,069 supporters packed into Kenilworth Road for an FA Cup quarter final replay, which Luton won 1-0.

It's not been without controversy however, with the venue claiming negative headlines for its artificial pitch in 1985 and the Kenilworth Road riots with Millwall in the same year.

BLACKPOOL | 1950-1956

APPS: 158 | GOALS: 68

Allan Brown signed for Blackpool for £26,500 from East Fife, making him a record transfer for a Scottish club. The forward played his part in the club's 1953 FA Cup success, although missed the final due to injury and earned a place on the Hall of Fame.

LUTON | 1956-1960

APPS: 151 | GOALS: 51

Brown joined Luton from Blackpool in 1956 and went on to score against his former club to help Luton to the FA Cup final three years later. Like at Blackpool, he went on to manage Luton too and won the Division Four championship when in charge in 1968.



LUTON WELL PLACED GOING INTO 2017

Knowing what it takes to win promotion from League Two, Johnny Mullins insists this Luton Town squad has all the attributes to be playing a division higher next season.

The experienced defender won promotion from this level with Oxford United last season and is now looking to repeat the trick with The Hatters.

Luton sit inside the play-offs heading into the Christmas period and Mullins is looking forward to watching Town continue to push towards the same achievement come May.

Johnny, how does this Luton team compare to the Oxford one which won promotion last season?

The quality in our dressing room more than matches what I had at Oxford last year. There's quality in every position and everyone's trying to start, so hopefully we have the

same result. I said when I first joined that I wanted to get promoted and we've got a great shout so that's still the objective.

Manager Nathan Jones has regularly rotated his squad to good effect, how much does that show the strength in depth?

We've got a really strong squad. You don't know who is going to be in the match day squad from week to week so everyone's training to a high intensity. Everyone's pushing each other and fighting for each position, which is only good for the football club. Hopefully we'll reap the rewards at the end of the season.

Luton sit fifth, seven points off the automatic promotion places, how do you assess the season so far?

Unless you're at the top you always want better but we're in with a shout. We're pleased but you always want more and we'll look to kick on from where we are now. The way we're

Last week's draw with Carlisle United kept you in the pack, how important was that point?

Well, I think we deserved to win it, we had the better chances but they're a difficult side to play against. They pose a big threat from set pieces but I feel we stood up to it and felt we should have won the game. We can take confidence from it and look to go again on Saturday.

Your 19 goals conceded is a division best, how important is it to continue that form?

We pride ourselves on defending well, from one to 11 and all the substitutes. We want to not concede goals to give us a chance of winning games. Football's a funny game and it's a long season so we've just got to make sure we keep winning games and come the end of the season hopefully we'll be in a top three position.

It's the manager's first full season in charge at Kenilworth Road, what has he been like to work with?

He's got a different way of working and we're always trying to better ourselves, he's really enthusiastic. You only have to listen to him talk football for a couple of minutes to know how much he wants to win football matches.

Finally, you're at Bloomfield Road this afternoon, what are you expecting from Blackpool?

We know Blackpool are a really good side on a strong run. They're in close proximity to ourselves so they'll want to beat us on their own patch. They've got some good players so if we're going to get three points we'll have to be at the top of our game.
